THREE QUESTIONS

1. Can a baptized child of God get
demon possessed, and then be deliv-Answer-There is not much in the Scripture on this subject, but plainly donable sin, namely, the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost. Back-sliding and getting demon-possessed is not s a terrible thing, it is true, but the nothing in the Scriptures to indicat that if such people repent they can not get back to God. The guilt of $\sin$ is in reased in its effect upon us in a Many with little light can commit great offenses, as we see it, and ye easily get back to for one who knows he will of God, to $\sin$ in the face of ight, Such always have to do some sore repenting in great humility be fore God and cry mightily unto God and sometimes for a long time before they can get back to God. It may be that their consciousness of having sinned in the face of light is so strong that it is practically impossible for them to believe that the mercy of God great enough to receive them back again. If they look at God in this way, this would be a hindering ele ment in getting back to God. Again it may be that God demands a very going down before Him in such earnthat they are truly weaned from sin Whatever be the possibilities of God's grace it is always a dangerous thing o commit $\sin$, and very much mor dangerous to commit a wiful sin, an will not take any risk on this line
2. After God has forgiven a per-
son and baptised him in the Spirit, does He then compel such perso through the gifts of the Spirit to con-
fess his back sins which were for-
given? Please give chapter and verse.
Answer. It will take a great deal
of space to go through all the Scrip-
tures on this question. We only have
space to answer in accordance with
the principle of God's dealing with
men as outlined in the Word, rather
than to give a detailed explanation of
each verse which bears upon this sub-
ject. It seems in accordance with the
Word of God that all sins must be
confessed to God. If our sins have
been principally against God, and we
confess them to Him, giving up all
sin and yielding ourselves wholly to
Him, God will forgive us all sins in a
lump. On the other hand, if we sin
against men and wrong them the
principle of restitution requires us,
even though God has forgiven us, to
confess our sins to them. Our con-
version has done little for us, if we
are not willing to do this. If we have
wronged people and right when we have a chance to do s
they will have no confidence in our religion. But what God has once for
given it is His rule not to bring up imes things that are not in them
selves sins, we have done them in al honesty of heart in accordance with
the light that we have had, and God
may baptize such a person and then throw on the light and show him the

with forgiveness, when such punishment is necessary to vindicate the righteous dealings of God before men
