ATtitude of pentecostal whites TO THE COLORED BRETHREN IN THE SOUTH.
"God that made the world * * * hath made of one blood all nations of men fo to dwell on all the face of the earth, and hath determined the times before appoint ed, and the bounds of their habitation (Acts 17:24-5-6)

If our God had intended for men to have only one color, as he did that they should have only one blood, doubtless he would have attended to that in the making of the nations. And his purpose to preserve the racial purity and integrity of the differen nis nans had made is plainly indicated His appointment of the bounds of the habitation. Nor would there ever be any the divine arrangement and live, each nathe divine arrangement and live, each na
tion in his own country, even as each famil should live in its own separate home. There is no race question between the white people of the South and the Mexican -or the Japanese; they are free to din our schabs, atten our schools, churches, etc. When th may be visitors from one nation to another may be visitors from
without any friction

But in the case of the negroes of the South, the white man, for selfish purpose imported practically a whole nation them into the same Country with himselfbroke down God's geographical barrier and in the Case of the Japanese on the Coast-they have done likewise. Not only has friction arose, just as it does whe families get too "thick" but the Hol Spirit also, in a final effort to preserve th integrity of the races, has intensified the racial impulse. This latter is not prejudic nor any other evil intent whatsoever, but merely the Lord's own substitute fo wholesome geographical bounds of separa tion between the races. A proper separa tion of the races, looking to the integrity of each, is no more "prejudice" than is proper separation of the sexes. Both alik are but the dictates of common decenc and of a wholesome regard for the decree of the Almighty. Praise His name
(That there is real prejudice between members of both races who are not saved, hearts, have not the love of God in thei need not be even while observing the most wholesome restraints.)
Let our Northern brethren be assured that the Pentecostal people of the South while conforming cheerfully to the gener ally wholesome regulations made necessar in the South, have not the slightest pre judice or lack of divine love for the colored people, nor is there any lack of mutual in erest in the work they are doing and in their spiritual welfare. bible training schools for mis SIONARIES AND OTHERS.

There are what is called, "Workers Bible Training Classes" in some assemblies, either connected with or independent of th young people's meetings. These have fo their object the training of young Chrio tians and others for general gospel activ ties. Considerable good is thus accomplish ed in soul-saving work. But such classe while very desirable indeed (would to Go there was one in every assembly), do no fully take the place of Bible trainin schools. The former usually meet once week, while the later have one or more ses sions daily, and are under the care of spec ial instructors.

Persons having a divine call to foreign missionary work should by all means at tend a Bible training school, unless the quisite equipment. The same may also be said of home missionaries. Even som ordained preachers of the Gospel have found it quite a benefit to go to such school for one or more terms. Sometime young people, in their enthusiasm to en gage in foreign missionary labors, have a tempted to enter the field before they we ready. They did not understand the rent import of such an arduous and responsible may have included the fact that such institutions usually beget a more than ordinary missionary spirit, for the subject of missions generally recelves considerable at tention. Besides the necessary mental equipment obtained, there is often a heart experience gained which outweighs all mere human attainments.
It is true that much of the knowledg acquired in a Bible training school, ma be obtained by diligent private study. Bu it is often not so systematic and compro hensive. The special benefits of class in struction are missed. At such institution a clearer and broader knowledge of dis pensational truth is generally gained. An this, in turn, gives a more perennial fresh ness and interest to subsequent Bible study It keeps one more on the watch tower of longing expectation and faith as to the stupendous events having occured, still oc curring, and yet to occur, in connectio with the redemptive plans of the Almight One. This phase of Bible knowledge freplently imparis an unwonted glow to the sou And it is more likely to enable one to take the glad flight "to meet the Lord in th air." If one very prayerfully, constantly an as comprehensively as pessible studies th blessed Word of God. he will doubtless b able to say, with a certain great lover n the Bible, "Heaven extracted lies in thee."
