The Desire of My Heart.

In coming into the office of editor, I find in my heart a real desire and strong leading to make the paper a helpful visitor to every home into which it may come, not so much as a forum for the settlement of differences, but as a medium of fellowship by which all may be held in a blessed bond of unity based upon those things of truth which we hold in common. Somehow I feel that there is enough to occupy the pages of the paper in which all may be interested without feeling the sting of opposition or strife. This does not mean that we are to try to please all readers of the paper everywhere. Nor does it mean that we have no definite convictions of what is truth, but rather this, that we feel that a paper which accords with, and represents the spirit of the General Council of the Assemblies of God, should hold as closely as possible to the spirit and letter of the Constitutional resolution to which we all subscribed and which was reaffirmed and emphasized by the saints in Council at St. Louis upon so recent a date. In this we have declared our purpose to accept the written Word (the Bible) as the one all-sufficient rule for faith and practice, and have promised to neither add to or take from it (see Preamble of Resolution 2nd Heading). This does not mean to me that we are to hold only such things as we may have known as Biblically true lest we add something to the Word, but rather that we may freely accept and hold any new meaning which may be shown us by God the Spirit. We may expect a development of understanding unless we be spiritually deaf and dead, and I, for one, rejoice in this that we are freed from bondage now in respect to believing and enjoying any new light or truth. Many of us have in other days been under restraint on this line because of the power of sectism and were hindered in knowing the truth of the Word. Now we are free, let us remain free.

On the other hand this purpose to not add to or take from the Word means to me that we are to carefully watch and prayerfully look to God at times when there appears what may be light and truth, and may be only the result of private interpretation, for no scripture is subject to such, lest we find ourselves accepting error. So let us be careful enough to be right and yet not so slow as to miss God. 'He that believeth shall not make haste," but indolence and indifference engender unbelief. Conservatism is a part of righteousness but "fear hath torment." After many years in which I have had many and varied experiences, I have become a conservative in these matters-a burned child fears fire.

Your Co-operation in Prayer Needed.

Brethren pray for me that I may have and hold a correct view of my place in the body of Christ and of my ministry in this new relation; and pray together with me that God may guide us together through the tangle of varied and often distracting matters which arise in these days. Only God can save us from error and fanaticism and keep us free from formalism and deadness. We may never see eye to eye in all things this side of eternal glory, bit, thank God we can go on together till Jes :s shall come if we truly and lovingly "consider one another to provoke unto love an l good works" and not to strive one against another. With much love for all men.

THE BOY JOASH CROWNED KING.

Lesson Text-2 Kings 11:1-20.

Golden Text-The house of the wicked shall be overthrown; but the tent of the upright shall flourish. Prov. 14:11.

Leading Thought - The fulfilling of God's word to David. 2 Sam. 7:16

1. Joash preserved and protected. vs. 4-11. Rightly speaking this lesson begins with v. 1 of the chapter. He was preserved by divine appointment for a definite service and yet God made use of a human agency. We are in what is said to be the last period of Israel's national decline; and Jehoshaphat, one of Judah's best kings is largely responsible for this ruin through his unfortunate mistake in joining affinity with the wicked Ahab. The devilish Athaliah. a daughter of Ahab and Jezebel was also Jehoshaphat's daughter-in-law. 2 Kings 8:16-18; 2 Chron. 20:35-37. See also parallel account of lesson in 2 Chron. 22: 10: 23:15. Children of God need to watch very carefully in their forming alliancessocial, business and ecclesiastical. 2 Cor. 6:14-18. "And he was hid with her in the house of the Lord six years," v. 3. What a safe place for the young child destined later to become the king. He was but a babe of one year but the sole link in David's posterity and the prophesied lineage of Jesus Christ. Gen. 49:10; Num. 24:17. God is never slack concerning His promise (2 Pet. 3:9); never allowing "one word of all his good promise to fail." 1 Kings 8:56. What care He took in this matter, and is he not just as interested in us individually? Why then our needless concern and strivings lest God fail in accomplishing those things He hath promised to perform? Hallelujah for the God who never forgets (Isa.49:15,16)--who neither slumbers nor sleeps. Psa121. It will be interesting and helpful in considering the youthful Joash to refer to the boy-hood of Moses (Ex. 2:1-10), of Samuel (1 Sam. 3:1-14), of Daniel (Dan. 1:3-20), of Jesus (Luke 2: 41-52). Were there more children hid in the house of the Lord, there would be more men to serve and act for God in later places of responsibility. It was the safest place Jehoshaba had to hide him in: it is the safest place for parents today. Six years elapsed-time enough for the people to weary of the bloody queen. They were probably glad for any change, particularly the restoration of the rightful heir. Jehoida the true man of God sensed conditions and with divine wisdom and authority brought it to pass. First he revealed the young Joash to a company of trusted men. v. 4. These men were bound by a solemn covenant, and to them Jehoida made known his carefullylaid plan or protecting and establishing the young king. vs. 5-8.

2. Joash proclaimed king. vs. 9-12 Jehoida's word carried weight, without doubt because of God's presence with him and the men "did according to all things" that he commanded. v. 9. On their obedience rested the safety and establishing of their king. They became embued with the same resolute spirit that filled Jehoida. There was a place too for them to use their weapons and they were charged with dispatch in doing so, v. 8. It is significant that David's weapons were to be used in defending David sons. So are we to use Christ's weapons in

establishing His kingdom. Eph. 6:16, 17 "The guard stood, every man with his weapons in his hand, round about the king." Another faithful Gideon band! One vacancy might have meant the complete failure of the whole plan. So might one traitor. And how our Lord Jesus has suffered thru vacancies and traitors. Along with his dispatch, Jehoida used a quiet delibe .ation. He waited till all was in readiness and then "he brought forth the king's son," v. 12. Verily the Husbandman hath long patience"---our God has waited long---but truly all things most ready and our hearts beat high in expectation of the swift approaching of our king's crowning day. "Put the crown upon him and gave him the testimony"-the crown, sympolic of power, the Law or testimony, symbolic of wisdom. Then comes the blessed symbol of the Holy Spirit's seal-the anointing. No wonder "they clapped their hands" and rejoiced till the very Athaliah was filled with dismay and cried, "Treason." vs. 13, 14. The false was deposed and the true established. "God's man is always a prepared man, and is crowned in spite of human plot or plan. -ALICE R. FLOWER.

Please write us at once and let us know whether you were ordained as an Elder, Evangelist, Minister or Missionary, the date and place of your ordination, date your Certificate was issued, whether you are now engaged as a pastor or evangelist, and your permanent address where mail can always reach you.

This information is quite important. Be careful to not miss sending this information at once if you desire your name and address to appear in the General Council Minutes which will be presented to the Clergy Bureau for 1916.

DAYS OF REVELATION

The Sunday Evening Sermon, at the General Council, was delivered by Bro. Rickard with much Power.

(Acts 2:4.)

I love the word "suddenly." There came a sound. It was not noise. It was sound from heaven as of a rushing, migh y wind. It was not wind but it sounded like it and it filled the house where they were sitting and there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire. It sat upon each of them, the women as well as the men. "Now when this was noised abroad -that is the way Pentecost was advertised. It is not human. It is Divine noise from heaven. It is the sound of the going in the tops of the mulberry trees. The multitude came together. That is generally the first effect upon people. Bccause they heard every man speak in his own language. That is the thing that is confounding them today. They were amazed.

I love to see people now-a-days confounded. They marvelled. That is blessed. They said "behold are not all these which speak Galileans, and how hear we every man in his own language whereia we were born." And then a list of these languages in which they spoke was given. Some say this is all of the devil. Peter said this is that spoken of by the prophet Joel.

A Supernatural Power.

In His day He was doing wonderful miracles through the power of the Holy Spirit. The religious people said in His day He was doing it by the power of the devil. Jesus turned and said that was a sin against the Holy Ghost. There is no forgiveness for that. Once more Jesus is doing such things and the people say it is of the devil. It is a supernatural power and every honest man will be compelled to say it is supernatural power because he cannot do it himself. Just as soon as he is informed he is compelled to believe that this thing is really surernatural because men, women and children are speaking in languages that they have not learned. Therefore it is absolutely miraculous.

Well then, what power is it? We do not have to conclude that it is all God because it is miraculous. It may be of the flesh but that is not the devil. We may be sure that these manifestations of speaking in tongues are not of the devil because people are praising God and are happy and living clean and pure lives, and the devil cannot do that.

He would if he could. The devil does not make people praise God and make them happy. Everyone that has known God will know Him the next time he meets Him.

Heard the Voice of God.

When my brethren in the ministry were fearful as to my intellectual as well as spiritual welfare after I had received the baptism, I said to them: "Brethren, I have known God too long to be deceived and I know this is God.' His sheep hear His voice and they know the difference between night and day. It This is not of God, I never knew God. 1 praise Him that He puts His stamp upon things. I have never had a moment of uncertainty or hesitancy or fear that this was not Pentecost. God has put a stamp upon it. You say, "But we see so much---" Yes, the devil is very much in evidence. but God is in evidence! When we see God and hear His voice we know Him.

derstood the wonderful obligation God has put upon us, the wonderful and glorious privileges that we enjoy in the last days.

Praise the Lord for the power after many, many centuries of deadness spiritually. God has been made manifest in a great many directions. What is this wonderful manifestation of God in these days? It is a manifestation of God in inspiration. We are experiencing something of what the Holy men of old did who spoke as the Spirit gave utterance.

Just Worship Him.

God has come in such marvellous fashion in human flesh that I have not felt like doing anything else since but worship Him.

We can freely talk about God at a distance but when God draws near our hearts are hungry. I stand in the presence of God when I stand in the presence of this wonderful manifestation. It is God speaking with no uncertain sound but with absolute accuracy and authority and command and power to men and women in these last days. You and I get familiar with it after a while and it gets to be not such a profound wonder. I studied languages for as many as nine and ten years but I would not attempt to speak in one of them tonight. If I should do so you would be sure I could not speak. I cannot speak Greek tonight and but a little bit of Hebrew but, listen, God came along and in five minutes did more than I could do in ten years of study.

God actually spoke through me and these languages were understood and 1 have been understood and so have you and other people have understood the languages. There is no doubt about this to one who will get the facts.

Everybody can verify Pentecost who wants to take the pains. Men are so careless about sacred things that they go into wholesale slander toward this movement, and will not take time to inform thenselves as to whether it is the real thing or not, or whether it is what it claims to be or not.

Pentecost is Verified.

Some of us were praying one night for a sister and she was mightily healed and a sister from the neighborhood who was praying had an unsaved, drunken husband who came in. She turned and preached to him in German, (she did not understand German). He knew the language and knew that she was speaking in the power of God. Such a testimony as that would be accepted in any court in the country.

Two and two make four, as we all know, but many people would declare that it makes 19 1-2. Many times in our Assembly people have spoken in languages that have been understood and verified. People have been in the meetings and understood.

God is Speaking.

When God begins to speak He talks about something. We have not yet given Him the place He should have and we have not been serious enough and our hearts' eyes have not been anointed enough sufficiently so that His me sage had its full weight in our hearts.

Whenever God gives a message in tongues and by interpretation, my soul feeds upon that message for days and weeks. There is something about it that unfolds with me and, it will unfold on your hands.

When Jesus spoke on earth a few words they were words which could not be forgotten but unfolded more and more as men thought upon them.

God Spoke to me.

God could not get hold of folks that had heads and he had to take the folks that hadn't any. As soon as some of our little heads can get something we know the whole thing. You can't tell us anything. I have something to say just now (I guess God wants me to say it), I have been very suspicious of councils myself. I could stand a little bit, maybe, not much of it. I have had some problems. I had people in my assembly that got some messages and get revelations and became very much lifted up, especially in the head. They began to get head trouble and they could not learn anything and they would get messages and leadings and everything they would think in the human was right from heaven and you could not tell them it was not from heaven either and they began to carry out these me sages and ideas and began to split and tear up. Well then, what? Well, we did nothing but lie on our faces and cry all night. I was praying and fasting and God came to His servant and gave him a message. God said to me that this lawless, independent spirit is the spirit of the anti-Christ and if you don't get rid of that you will have to suffer the judgments of the tribulation. You will never get into the bride unless you learn how to fellowship and learn how to be subject one to another. Do you know what I felt like then? I felt like getting in this Council somewhere, in some council anywhere, and creep in somewhere and be some little piece and never be found or heard of just so I could be there and be a part of the great, precious body of Christ that expects to be translated.

It is too late to seek place or position but only to be right where God would have us in His body. I praise Him that in the midst of very much of headiness and independence God is giving us revelation and teaching us wisdom and notwithstanding we feel often distressed and confused because our messages do not tally out because we do not see the thing come to pass that we said would surely come to pass, and therefore we feel like turning away from all cf that, but after all God is deepening us and is with His people and when He has drilled us and thoroughly taken us through His training so that we will know His messages, then we will be ready to listen and hear from God and know Him and His leading better. We will later be introduced into the spiritual world and w? will have fellowship with the saints of the church of the first born and fellowship with angels and we will have the privilege of walking side by side with Jesus Christ and having blessed fellowship with hosts of angels and with the saints of old who also received messages from on high. I praise God that He is actually letting us hear the heavenly music and hear the angels sing.



Since coming to Japan we have spent most of our time studying the language, but feel now that God would have us open up definite mission work. We have moved to the interior city of Koga Machi, which has about 25,000 population. There are many smaller villages not far away. We have rented a new brick building on the main street for a mission hall, but the expense of fitting it up is quite high. We are having a concrete floor and some partitions put up besides other changes. When completed we expect to be able to seat nearly 100 in the main hall. Our Sunday school and after-meeting rooms up-stairs will hold about 125 or 150 people.

Koga is a strong Buddhist town and verv conservative. We sorely need your cooperation in prayer and finances, as the Lord leads. It is a problem to secure an interpreter who is at all satisfactory. We are now trying a brother who has had much experience and seems to be hungry for the baptism. As he has five in his family he wants \$18,50 besides house rent. We solicit your co-operation. Pray especially that God will meet us in power, saving and baptizing in the Holy Ghost.

"Speak not evil one of another, brethren. He that speaketh evil of his brother and judgeth his brother, speaketh evil of the law and judgeth the law," James 4:11. "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and evil speaking be put away from you with all malice." One of the most predominant sins found among us today is evil speaking. The command is just as imperative to "speak evil of no man" as the command "Thou shalt not kill," and yet how little it is heeded.
