The Desire of My Heart.
In coming into the office of editor, I find in my heart a real desire and strong leading to make the paper a helpful visitor to much as a forum for the settlement of differences, but as a medium of fellowship by which all may be held in a blessed bond of unity based upon those things of truth that there is enough to occupy the pages of the paper in which all may be intereste without feeling the sting of opposition or strife. This does not mean to me that we are to hold Biblically true lest we add something to the Word, but rather that we may freely accept and hold any new meaning which may be shown us by God the Spirit. We may expect a development of understand-
ing unless we be spiritually deaf and dead, and $I$, for one, rejoice in this that we are freed from bondage now in respect to believing and enjoying any new light or leving and enjoying any new light or
truth. Many of us have in other days been under restraint on this line because of the under restraint on this line because of the
power of sectism and were hindered in knowing the truth of the Word. Now we are free, let us remain free.
On the other hand this purpose to not add to or take from the Word means to me that we are to carefully watch and
prayerfully look to God at times when there appears what may be light and truth, and appears what may be light and truth, and
may be only the result of private interpremay be only the result of private interpre-
tation, for no scripture is subject to such, tation, for no scripture is subject to such,
lest we find ourselves accepting error. So let us be careful enough to be right and yet not so slow as to miss God. 'He that believeth shall not make haste," but indolence and indifference engender unbelief. Conservatism is a part of righteousness but "fear hath torment." After many years in which I have had many and varied experiences, I have become a conservative in these matters-a burned child fears fire.

Your Co-operation in Prayer Needed.
Brethren pray for me that I may have and hold a correct view of my place in the new relation; and pray together with me that God may guide us together throurb the tangle of varied and often distracting matters which arise in these days, Only God can save us from error and fanaticism and keep us from formalism and dea ness. but some of the other missionaries came but some of the other missionaries came Bro. Denney has been sick in Sam Shui with chills and fever for about two months and does not seem to get any better. We hope God will deliver soon, for China hes
no missionaries to lose. The Lord has no missionaries to lose. The Lord has
kept me unusually well, considering this very trying climate.
There are numbers of open doors but i don't know now just where I will settle. Over a weak ago I gave my first little pubmore months I hope to be more free in personal work.

EVIL SPEAKING.
"Speak not evil one of another, brethren He that speaketh evil of his brother and judgeth his brother, speaketh evil of the Let all bitterneth the law," James 4:11 and clamor and evil speaking be put away from you with all malice." One of the most predominant sins found among us to day is evil speaking. It is found on every side. Hardly can a conversation be carried on for the space of half an hour, witiz some, without an absent party being spoken against. The command is just as imperative to "speak evil of no man" as the command "Thou shalt not kill," and yet how ittle it is heeded. Saints gather togethe in the meetings and there is a lack of fei prayer. What is the matter? Some perhaps have been guilty of this sin (for pera $\sin$ ), and there is condemnation on their souls and the fellowship is broken, not onl with heaven but also with those they have spoken arainst. it is timese have God's people, cast off the works of dark ness and put on the armor of light.
The Lord Jesus is seeking for Himsel a bride, and one of the qualifications of this bride is "She is all glorious within." Another qualification is found in Rev. 14 5 "In their mouth was found no guile. St. Paul writes to the Church of Corinth saying ( Cor. 7.1) Cleanse yourselve from all fithiness of the flesh and apirit perfecting holiness in the fear of God. Whole assemblies have been broken up by this evil, one feature or being the criti cism of their leader, until the Spirit of God is withdrawn from the Assembly and revival is impossible until the parties re together.

In Matt. 18:15-17 Jesus says: "More over if thy brother shall trespass against thee go and tell him his fault between the and him alone. If he shall hear thee thou hast gained thy brother. But if he will no hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or thre witnesses every word shall be establiothed. And if he shall neglect to hear them, te! it unto the church; but if he neglect to hear the church let him be unto thee as a heathen or a publican. This is the on sure cure for evil-speaking. Don't go and proclaim his sin to the world but go to him in a spirit of meekness, according to Ga 6:1 and tell him of his fault alone. Sho him where he is wrong, according to the Ford. If he hears thee thou hast gaine thy brother. But if he does not hear the take one or two more, that in the mout of two or three winesses every word shat be established.

Let us heed our Master's words. Tell our brother of his $\sin$ with a fervent spirit of love. Not until the first two steps are taken are we to tell it to the church. If he bear the chureh, well. But if not, then let bim be as a heathen or publican. Wis must love him still and not speak evil of him, but we cannot fellowship him as a brother until he repents. God help us as saints of the Most High to be New Testament Christians and have sanctified hearts and tongues. 'Finally brethrer thina are ever things are pure, whatsoever thins are port (not evil report) if there be any virtue. if there be any praise, think on these things." Then there will be no time, no room, thank God for speaking evil of our brother or of judsing him.-Robert Hammond.

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
