## "THE TRUTH ABOUT GRACE."

The word "grace" carries the mind out along some lines of very profitable thought. We are all of us ready to agree that grace is the expression of the divine favor to the unworthy, but, after we have agreed to it, hot all of us can avoid getting our ideas of grace somewhat mixed. All admit that we are saved by grace, but it is difficult to hold to the idea that we are saved by grace alone; and yet it is just this that is plainly stated in the Scripture (Titus 3:6), "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us." Rom. 11:6, "And if by grace then it is no more of works." Eph. 2:8, 9, "For by grace are ye saved through faith and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works lest any man should boast." Grace, then, is the gift of God to the unworthy.

## GRACE IS NOT SALVATION.

Grace itself is not salvation; although salvation results from grace. Grace is in God; salvation is in us. Salvation however, is impossible apart from grace. The grace of Gud is extended to all men, while salvation is accomplished only in those who accept it.

## THE DIFFICULTY TO BE MET.

The difficulty we encounter, arises from the fact of our failure to see certain things which are closely related to grace. We are inclined to the position that salvation by grace as a gift, implies that there is nothing required of us but its acceptance, while our experience brings us face to face with much that seems to be required of us, beyond that. The thought of discipline does not, somehow, fit in well with the thought that our salvation depends upon nothing but our acceptance of it as a gift. These things which we feel are required of us, incline us to the idea that salvation, somehow, depends upon ourselves, after all. Just how to reconcile the matter is what confronts us. We cannot do otherwise than hold to the truth that we are saved by grace alone; we must work out the proposition from that beginning. The matter is simple, after all, when we look at it aright, as all of the wonderful work of God is. Grace in the heart of God is the source of our salvation: Divine power is brought into play to accomplish it; works of righteousness on our part have nothing to do with bringing about our salvation. Good works, together with all of the fruits of discipline, result from our salvation and prove the reality of it.

## DISCIPLINE EMPHASIZED.

The bestowment of God's grace does not mean that the children of God are to be pampered and petted, shielded from every rough wind, gently carried over all hard places. It is wrong to rear children in that way, as many things that come under our observation go to prove. Such treatment develops the self-will until the child is unable to overcome it and obey, even when it knows that its best interest is to be served by it. God will not make that mistake He loves His children and wishes them to be strong and beautiful, but to have them so requires their attendance in the rough school of trial-the gymnasium of discipline.

## THREE POINTS OF OBJECTIVE IN DISCIPLINE.

There are at least three points in the object of discipline. The first is correction. The child must be corrected whenever he has done, or said, or thought a wrong thing. Grace demands it; love requires it; God does it. "For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged; But when we are judged we are chastened of the Lord that we may not be condemned with the world." 1 Cor. $11: 31,32$. Here we see why we are chastened, it is because we do not judge ourselves. We are too slack and easy with self; we readily find ourselves wrong and feel the hand of correction upon us.

Purification is another point in the purpose of discipline. Many may well profit by knowing this as their thoughts go no farther than that God is punishing them for some reason, when they feel the Lord's displeasure. It is the dross that is in us that makes the fire of trial necessary. By dross we mean whatever may be there which is foreign to the nature of our spiritual life. All Christians have at least some dross to be refined away. "He shall sit as a refiner of silver and as a purefier of gold." The fining pot is for silver, but the furnace-where the fire is more intense-is for Gold.

## PREPARATION FOR OUR PLACE IN GOD'S PLAN.

In the purpose of God there is an experience awaiting us for which we need certain preparation. When matters have taken shape for eternal continuance, the saints who are now under-going the fiery trial, the chastening, scourging of grace, are to hold a place of great importance in the affairs of God's kingdom. The promise is, "he that overcometh shall inherit all things." Again, "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne." If we are to come into our own, as children of God, really sit upon a throne together with Christ and exercise a right in all things, we most surely need some preparation for the place.

## Article VIII.-Reminiscences of an Eyewitness.

We are indebted to Brother H. A. Goss of Hot Springs, Arkansas for the following lines:

In the fall of 1903, Chas. F. Parham came to Galena, Kansas and opened a tent meeting. I was an infidel and had no concern about religious work; but this meeting was something unusual, so I went once in awhile just for curiosity, and later, when the meeting was moved to a large double store room on Main St., I went oftener with some of my fellow High School students to see the "show" as it was called.

## CONVERSION OF H. A. GOSS.

The Galena Revival was a wonderful meeting; hundreds were saved and baptized in the Spirit, also there were many cases of healing.

The speaking in tongues was a marvel to me, as I did not believe in supernatural power. However, these things soon convinced me that there was an Almighty, so tongues proved a sign to me. I Cor. 14:22.

I remember watching a big Peoria Indian preacher receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit and begin to talk in other languages and shake as if some great machine had hold of him. His whole frame shook for more than two hours, his hands all this time being held above his head. These wonders, with many others, put me on my face seeking God, and after more than a week, God saved me. I had much unbelief to fight through, but, thank God, He brought me out victorious. At once I began to seek my baptism in the Holy Spirit and to read my Bible.

On New Year's Eve there was a watch meeting held which included foot washing and the ordination of twelve people to the ministry. Among the twelve were John James and E. Pierson, a former Quaker ministar. These men are in the Pentecostal ministry today. That was a wonderful night; at six in the morning there were about four hundred people present.

Wonderful altar services were held. I have seen as many as a hundred line up before the platform at a time, waiting their turn to be prayed for for healing. And hundreds found their desire.

After the great revival, the work spread to the surrounding country and to Joplin, Mo. where a great meeting was held. There are Assemblies in these places to this day.

In the spring of 1905 Mr . Parham went to Orchard, Texas to visit some friends, and while there held some meetings. Later, he returned to Galena and held a kind of camp meeting in July. Many people from nearby towns came to this camp, at the close of which Mr. Parham selected about fifteen preachers and workers to take back to Texas with him. They stopped at Orchard again and held another meeting; then with additional help moved on to Houston to open a work there.

Bryan Hall was rented at a cost of $\$ 50$ per week, and in a short time the city was stirred and much people were added to the Lord, healed and filled with the Spirit.

Among the most noteworthy cases of healing was that of a Mrs. Delaney, a woman well known in the city. About two years previous to her healing she had been injured in a street car wreck and had sued the Street Car Co. for damages.

Sometime before the meetings opened, she had a vision, in which she saw Mr. Parham, and the Lord showed her that this man would pray for her and that she would be healed.

As she was being wheeled down the street one day (paralysis and a wheel chair were the results of her accident), she came to a street meeting and saw the man that the Lord had showed to her in her vision. She stopped and listened to the preaching, enquired where the meetings were being held, and after a few days was brought to the hall. A few of the brethren carried her. chair and all, up the stairs. She was prayed for and was instantly healed, and has been walking ever since. This caused a still greater stir among the people.

## THE WORK SPREADS TO BRUNNER TABERNACLE.

As the work spread over the city, W. F. Carothers, who was pastor of a Holiness church in Brunner, a suburb of Houston, invited some of the workers out to his place. Great blessings were upon the work in those days.

After the rivival, Mr. Parham left the work in charge of some of the helpers, and with some of the young Texas converts, came back to Kansas and held a great Camp meeting in Columbus, Kansas, and this city also was mightily stirred.

At this time I had not yet cut loose for the Lord's work, but I knew that God had called me, and others, who felt the same way about it, came to me and asked me to consider getting free to go to Texas, as there was another company arranging to go. I decided to do so, and on October ${ }^{15}, 1905$, a company of twenty-two of us left Columbus on the Frisco 'Meteor' for Texas. I felt that I was really forsaking all to go and do His bidding. I had a great deal of opposition in getting out into the work, my friends telling me that I was making a great mistake in my determination; but I knew that God had called me, and I felt so good to get away from discouragements and obey the Lord.

We stopped at Orchard for a few days and had a blessed time. One of the preachers of our company received the baptism in the Spirit on the train after leaving Orchard. We had to change trains at Alvin, and while waiting for our train we held a street meeting. Many of the citizens were interested and desired us to return and hold a revival.

At Houston the brethren received us joyfully, and we had a few days conference at the Brunner Tabernacle. At the close of the conference several bands of workers were formed to go to nearby towns and hold revival services; about six being in each company.

## ALVIN, TEXAS.

Oscar Jones and myself, with a few others, went back to Alvin; rented the opera house and opened fire on the enemy. Soon there was a great revival on; the power of God was falling, people were getting saved, filled with the Holy Spirit and speaking in other tongues; the sick were being healed and the town was in a stir. About two hundred were saved and one hundred
and thirty-four received the baptism in the Spirit. Some very precious workers came out of this meeting, among them W. B. Jessup, Standley Bennett, Miss Milicent McClendon who became a powerful preacher, Hugh Cadwalder, later a missionary to Africa, and my wife, about a year later. Many others were launched out as result of the meeting.

We had some mighty and wonderful manifestations of the power of God in the Alvin revival and a great work was established.

From Alvin we went to Galveston where, later, we had some trouble with fanaticism, but Mr. Parham acted with great wisdom and corrected it as soon as he found it out. He was very careful to keep the work clean and free from extremes. All through the work at this time we had manifestations of the gifts of the Spirit as recorded in I Cor. 12.

## THE UNCHANGEABLE PRIESTHOOD Vache Hargis.

"But this man, because he continueth ever, hath an unchangeable priesthood." Heb. 7:24.

The preceding verses plainly state that the apostle is speaking of Jesus, made a High Priest forever after the order of Melchisedec. It is generally asknowledged by opposers of the Pentecostal Movement, that "Jesus Christ (is) the same yesterday, today and forever" according to Heb. 13:8, but they say He is not working in the same way He did in the beginning of this dispensation.

Now we know that the word "Priest" means the man that officiates in the stated office, but the "Priesthoor"" means the official duties of the priest. So then we must ascertain what were the official duties of Jesus Christ, the High Priest over the house of God, immediately after he was inaugurated and took his seat, "not in the Holy Place made with hands, which are the figures of the true ; but into Heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us." Heb. 9:24. If the Priesthood has not changed, the official duties are exactly the same yesterday, today and forever, yea as long as Jesus Christ officiates as Priest.

Here is an eyeopener if you will investigate. Go with me in the Scriptures back to the inauguration of this Priest, whose Priesthood cannot be changed. Acts. 2:32, 33. "This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses. Therefore, being by the right hand of Gord exalted, and having received of the father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this which you now see and hear."

Notice that the High Priest had entered into the Holy of Holies, or into Heaven itself, according to Heb. $9: 2 \mathrm{f}$. for He was at the right hand of God, and had obtained of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, and the promise had also been given to the disciples. Matt. $3: 11$; Mark I:8; Luke $3: 11$ and II:13; John 7:37-40, and 14: 15-27. Now in fulfilling this promise to these expectant disciples, the Priest that had an unchangeable Priesthood, "Shed forth this which ye see and hear." Acts $2: 33$. What did they see and hear? Look at the preceding verses in the same chapter. Acts $2: 4$. "And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance," and they heard them (Acts $2: 6-8$ ), and they saw the manifestation of the Spirit for they said, "these men are full of new wine." Acts $2: 13$. But in Acts $2: 16-19$ Peter denies the charge, and assures them that this is the same Spirit that God had promised by the prophet Joel to pour out on all flesh.

And Jesus fulfilled this promise in the beginning of

His unchangeable ministry by shedding forth the Holy Ghost accompanied by the Bible sign of speaking in other tongues.

Brother, if you haven't "received the Holy Ghost (in this way) since you believed," (Acts 19:2) don't waste your precious time in contending that you have it already, for you certainly haven't the same article they received on the day of Pentecost, for it does not work the same way. But obey God, wait for the Promise of the Father (Acts I:4) which when shed forth by the same unchangeable Priest, will bear you "witness even as he did on us at the beginning (Pentecost). Acts II:15. "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call. Acts $2: 39$.

Notice, seven years after Pentecost, the Priesthood had not been changed, when the house of Cornelius received the Holy Ghost, "For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God." Acts 10:44.

Again, twenty-three years after the memorable day of Pentecost, at Ephesus, "when Paul had laid his hands upon them the Holy Ghost came on them: and they spake with tongues and prophesied." Acts 19:6.

In Acts 2:33, when the Holy Ghost was shed forth, they saw and heard, and every instance afterwards where we have a record, they either saw or heard, the wonderful operation of God in the recipient, for at least twenty-three years-long enough to establish the fact that the unchangeable Priesthood was begun this way. And even in this twentieth century, over five hundred thousand souls have received the Holy Ghost, and without a single exception, we have seen and heard the same sign as on the day of Pentecost.
"It is also written in your law that the testimony of two men is true." John 8:17. How will your single little excuse appear at the judgment bar of God, when "compassod about with so great a cloud of witnesses?"
"For God hath given the Holy Ghost to them that obey him." Acts 5:32.

Dearly beloved children of God that have been washed as white as snow in the precious blood of Jesus: May God help you to see that you will sadly regret it, if you are not filled with the Holy Ghost, when Jesus rides down on a cloud of His glory, and the sleeping saints of all ages arise from their dusty beds, and go forth to meet the Bridegroom, and you have not obeyed God, and tarried until you were endued with Power from on High.

## THE SECOND COMING OF CHRIST.

"Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they also which pierced him; and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him, Even so, Amen." Rev. I:7.

This passage strongly teaches the personal return of Jesus Christ to this earth. The second return of Jesus Christ will be the greatest event that is to take place in this world in the very near future. The doctrine of Christ's second coming is so imminent that the Holv Spirit had it recorded about 318 times in the New Testament. To the question, how do we know that He is coming soon? Christ's answer to his disciples is ours also; viz. the fulfillment of the signs of the times. When his disciples on the mount of Olives asked him, "What shall be the sign of thy coming?" He answered them by saying, when certain signs would take place, then, they were to look for His return with power and glory. The signs he referred to are given in the 24 th chapter of Matthew. We know that Jesus is coming soon because these signs are literally fulfilled at the present time.

We shall now consider these signs as given us by our Savior Himself.

## I. "MANY SHALL COME IN MY NAME

saying I am Christ; and shall deceive many." There are over 40 persons in the world today who claim to be the Christ, so this prophecy is now fulfilled.

## 2. "EARTHQUAKES IN DIVERS PLACES."

In the last three years, every land has felt the tremor of the earthquake so scientists tell us. Mr. Noble, a scientist and a Christian, says, "that the earth has felt 3000 tremors during the past two years. Never before in the history of the world has there been so many earthquakes in so short a period as during the past three years. It is reported that 300,000 persons have lost their lives on account of earthquakes.

## 3. "FAMINES."

Nearly 70,000,000 people have suffered from famines in different parts of the world. $30,000,000$ in Russia, 20,000,000 in India, millions in China and other parts of the world. Several hundred thousands have died on account of famines in the last few years.

## 4. "WARS AND RUMORS OF WARS."

For when they shall say "Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them." I Thess. $5: 3$. Notice, that the present European war began to dawn when Andrew Carnegie begun his "Peace Temple" at the Hague. Ever since that time there have been wars and rumors of wars. About that time, the Anglo-Boer war broke out, which was soon followed by the RussoJapanese war. Soon after that Italy and Turkey were at war. Never in the history of the world were there as many nations at war as at this present hour. Truly Matt. $24: 6$ is literally fulfilled in the present war.

## 5. THE JEWS RETURNING TO PALESTINE.

It is stated that there are nearly 300,000 Jews in Palestine at the present time. With the downfall of Turkey, the Jews will return in unbelief. Now that the latter rain has returned, the country will soon blossom as the rose. According to prophecy, the Jews will soon get possession of Palestine. Surely, "the time of Jacob's trouble," has begun, (Jer. $30: 7$ ). As God is working with the nations, He will drive the Turk out of Palestine and cause his ancient people to take possession of it.

## 6. THE GOSPEL IS PREACHED TO EVERY NATION.

The gospel is indeed preached as a witness to every nation at the present time. Jesus did not say that the world would be converted before He would return, but He said that "the gospel would be preached to every nation and that is being rapidly fulfilled today as a witness, then shall the end come; so according to that statement of Christ we are near the close of this dispensation.

## 7. "MANY SHALL RUN TO AND FRO, AND

 KNOWLEDGE SHALL BE INCREASED."How true is this statement, made by Daniel, realized today in the world. During the year 1914 600,000,000 tickets were sold at a cost of $\$ 13,000,000,000$ in the U. S. In the whole world 2 billion tickets were sold at a cost of 29 billion dollars. These figures give us an idea of the amount of traveling being done in the world today. It is a well known fact, that knowledge has greatly increased in the last fifty years, the world today is amazed at the great inventions which surpass anything in the history of the world.

## 8. THE WORLD IS GROWING WORSE.

The good are getting better, and the bad are getting worse. 2 Tim. $3: 5$, reveals the exact condition of things in the world today. The following figures plainly show that the world is getting worse. During the year 1914 we spent for amusement $\$ 800,000,000$ for dogs, $\$ 200,-$ 000,000 , for tobacco, $\$ 900,000,000$ for liquor, $\$ 2,200,-$ 000,000 , for candy, $\$ 78,000,000$, for soft drinks, $\$ 36$,000,000 , for chewing gum, $\$ 26,000,000$, and only $\$ 15,-$ 000,000 for missionary work in the world. Now notice on the basis that the population of the United States is $100,000,000$ the above figures show that we are spending on ourselves over $\$ 40.00$ per head and only 15 cents for Christ in the United States. All the above figures refer to the United States. Pretty bad showing for a Christian nation. Murder is increasing at the rate of 5 per cent. faster than the population. 50,000 persons applied for divorce in 1914 which was nearly 13,000 more than in the year igIz.

Spiritualism, Christian Science and Theosophy are making great progress and are decGiving millions of people in the world today. If the world was getting better less money would be spent on ourselves and more on Christ. Truly has Peter said, "That there shall come in the last days scoffers walking in their own lusts." There is also a falling away in the church. The denominations of today have the form of godliness but have no spiritual power. The Spirit of Antichrist is permeating the world now. The Antichrist will not be a system but an individual who shall claim to be God. He will be the chief ruler between the Rapture and Christ's coming to the earth with His Saints.

All students of prophecy agree that we are now in "the time of the end;" "the times of the Gentiles" are fulfilled. There is today in the world distress of nations; the sea is roaring; the great powers are being shaken and thrones are crumbling. The world is rapidly preparing for the "Man of Sin," the Anti-Christ, whom the world will worship. Everything is getting ready for him. The world will soon $b=$ in his grasp and under his dominion. The great tribulation of the last three and a half years of Daniel's week (Dan. 9:27) will be such a time of suffering as the world has never seen. Everything in church and state, the fulfillment of the signs of the times and the present war, indicate that he will soon make his appearance. Beloved, let us take heed to the words of our Savior recorded in Luke 21:36 and be "watchful and prayerful that we may be accounted worthy
to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and stand before the Son of man."
"Since the storm clouds are gathering, the tempest begins to rage, and the awful night of judgment on a Christ-rejecting world is about to set in. Let God's people look up, "for their redamption draweth nigh." We may soon see the Lord Jesus "coming in the clouds of heaven."

His coming back to earth will be a personal one. We read in Acts i:1I. "This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." He will first meet his saints in the air, for we read in I Thess. 4:16, 17, "that the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout with the voice of the archangel and with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first; then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord."

## J E S U S

"Thou shalt call His name Jesus for He shall save His people from their sins," so the angel told Joseph before ever the child was born. Matt. I:2I.

Very early in the Christian era there arose a sect who taught that Jesus was God, but who denied his humanity. Later a sect arose who denied His divinity and taught that He was merely a man. Unitarians teach this until this day. But the Bible, and in fact, Jesus Himself, is very clear that $H e$ is divine and also human.

The diety of Jesus need not be proven here, for all Christians believe and admit that, except Unitarians, but I desire at this time to examine a few of the sayings of Jesus Himself, as to His humanity, and trust that we will be enlightened.

Jesus said to His disciples. "If ye loved me, ye would rejoice, because I said, I go unto my Father: for my Father is greater than I." John 14:28. In what sense could the Father be greater than Jesus? And we answer, first, because the Father is omnipresent, while Jesus (while on earth) could only be at one place at the time. The weeping Martha said to Jesus: "Lord, if thou hadst been here my brother had not died." John II :21.

Secondly, because the Father knows all things from the beginning, while Jesus admitted that there were some things that he did not know. "But of that day and that hour knoweth no man, no not the angels which are in heaven, neithor the son, but the Father." Mark 13:32.

Thirdly, because the Father has reserved certain things unto Himself. Listen what Jesus said to the mother of Zebebee's children: "But to sit on my right hand, and on my left, is not mine to give, but it shall be given to them for whom it is prepared of my Father." Matt. $20: 23$.

Then again, the Father is a Spirit, and they that
worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth. Jesus said: "Behold my hands and my feet that it is I myself. Handle me and see, for a spirit has not flesh and bones as you see me have. And when he had thus spoken he showed them his hands and his feet." Luke 24:39, 40.

Jesus constantly referred to himself as the Son of man, and when Stephen was stoned to death, he cried out and said, "Behold I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing on the right hand of God." Acts 7:56.

Jesus evidently arose from the dead in his bodily form and then took his body to heaven with him, and he will come again and every eye shall see him. The angels said: "This same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." Acts I:II .

Paul tells us: "That God has appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he has ordained, whereof he has given assurance unto all in that he hath raised him from the dead." Acts 17:31.

When John received a revelation of Jesus on the Isle of Patmos, he describes him thus: "One like the Son of man, clothed with a garment down to the foot, and girt about the paps with a golden girdle. His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were as a flame of fire, and his feet like unto fine brass as if they burned in a furnace, and his voice as the sound of many waters." Rev. I:13, 14, 15.

Paul tells us in I Cor. 15:24, "Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the Kingdom to God, even the Father, when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. For He must reign till he hath put all enemies under his feet.... and when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him, that put all things under him, that God may be all in all." I Cor. ${ }_{5}: 28$.

I am glad that my Savior is a man, who was tempted like I am, but without sin, that He is touched with a feeling of my infirmity. I am glad that he emptied himself and became obedient unto death and that God has given him a name which is above every name. I am glad that all power is given unto him in heaven and among men. I am glad that he, the man Christ Jesus, will come again in his glory and all the holy angels with Him and will judge the world in righteousness a thousand years. I am glad that I can reach Jesus and that he intercedes with the Father for us. More anon, if the Lord wills.-A. J. Benson, Broken Arrow, Okla.

6. Did the Holy Ghost fall on the twelve apostles only, or on the whole one hundred and twenty, on the Day of Pentecost.

Ans. He fell on at least the one hundred and twenty on that day, if not on more. The previous chapter, vs. 13 and 14, mention more than twelve, a little later in v. 15 the number had grown to one hundred and twenty. Then Acts 2:1 says, "They were all with one accord in one place." This "all" could not mean less than the 120 just mentioned. Paul tells us in 1 Cor. $15: 6$ of "above 500 brethren" or disciples that Jesus had before the day of Pentecost, and it is possible that "all" might include the whole 500 who may have come in to tarry by the day of Pentecost. But "all" must mean all of the 120 just mentioned, even if not all the 500 disciples at that time. Note in Acts 10 and 19, the Spirit also came upon others, not apostles, with the same result of speaking in tongues as on the day of Pentecost. See the same in 1 Cor. $1: 7 ; 12: 4-13 ; 14: 1-40$. Being filled with the Spirit was the common experience of all believers in New Testament days.
32. Did the whole one hundred and twenty speak with tongues on the day of Pentecost, or only the apostles?

Ans. Again God answers by our little word "all." Note the result of this outpouring as described in Acts 2:4. The subject is "they all," and two things are asserted in the verse of "they all:" 1st. They were all "filled with the Holy Ghost," and 2nd. they "began to speak with other tongues." Note that they were not only "all" filled, but the same "all" began to speak with tongues because "they all" are the only ones mentioned as the subjects to speak in tongues. The verbs "filled" and "began" have the same subject of "they all." God says, then, "they all" began to speak with tongues, and that settles it, as to at least the 120. No Scripture limits the experience to the Apostles only.
33. Did God make the devil and then make him an evil people to rule over? or did the devil always exist of himself, and just go about seeking whom he might destroy?

Ans. God did not make a devil, but he made a mighty angel who by $\sin$ and rebellion turned into the devil. God made him for the truth, but Jesus says, "He abode not in the truth." John 8:44. Scofield gives the following summary on Satan, which, though not perfect, will make a very interesting study. See Scofield's Bible on Rev 20:10 as follows
"This fearful being, apparently created one of the cherubim (Ezek. 1:5; 28:12-14) and anointed for a position of great authority (Ezek. 28:11-15) fell through pride (Isa. 14:12-14). His 'I will' (Isa. 14:13) mark the introduction of $\sin$ into the universe. Cast out of heaven (Luke. 10:18) he makes earth and air the scene of tireless activity. Eph. $2: 2 ; 1$ Pet. 5:8. After the creation of man, Satan entered into the serpent (Gen. $3: 1$ ), and, beguiling Ere, secured the downfall of Adam, and through him, of the race, and the entrance of $\sin$ into the world of men."

This answers all that is asked in the above question, but is only about one-third of what Scofield gives. See the Scofield Bible for the rest and many other good things. The cheap cloth binding at $\$ 1.50$ has the same in it that the $\$ 10.00$ binding has.
34. What did Jesus mean when He said, "Take up your cross and follow me?" Did He mean a cross made of wood? How can we bear the cross daily?

Ans. No, he did not mean a piece of wood, but He means the thing that the cross stands for. In the time of Christ the shameful death on the cross was used as a symbol for all kinds of sufferings, afflictions, troubles, etc. In this sense we are daily to bear our cross cheerfully, whether it be a burden, a trouble or whatever it may be. When serving God, we are to bear bravely whatever may come upon us in the path of duty. Sometimes the cross stands for the Gospel of Salvation by a Crucified Savior, and we are to stand for our faith in Him alone as Savior whatever shame or affliction or persecution it may bring upon us. Thus we bear our crosses daily.
35. What is meant by the "doctrine of baptisms and the laying on of hands" in Heb. 6:2?

Ans. The Jews had many ceremonial "dippings" or washings; but the blood was always shed for sins. Hence when John came preaching the 'baptism of repentance for the remission of sins" a dispute at once arose between the disciples of John and the Jews about purifying. John $3: 25$. Then Jesus appointed baptism as the initial ceremony in the Gospel of salvation through faith in His name. This was performed by men. There was also the baptism in the Spirit by Jesus only. Now each of these had a doctrine or a teaching as to its meaning, but the writer to the Hebrews regarded all this teaching as elementary, as belonging to the primary department of Christianity, and therefore, since the Hebrews had already been properly baptized, and taught these elements, that they understood this elementary teaching. Hence he determines to press on to other things which his hearers needed.

The laying on of hands was practiced for three purposes, 1st in ordinations (Acts 6:6; 13:3; 1 Tim. 4:14); 2nd, healing, (Mark 16:18; Acts 28:8); 3rd, for receiving the Holy Spirit (Acts $8: 17 ; 9.17 ; 19: 6$ ).

## WHAT DENOMINATION ARE YOU?

This is a question we are all familiar with, some of us more than we wish. Wherever I go this is almost the first question asked. When I go to a strange place and tell the people anywhere, everywhere, I am a missionary, the question comes at once, "What denomination are you?" And when I reply, "I am undenominational," the query arises, "To what church do you belong, are you Methodist, Baptist, etc? What denomination ?"

When I try to rent a church, hall, school-house or private dwelling to hold services in, these words are sure to greet me, first of all. "What denomination" are you?" Even if an old brush arbor is asked for, the question is never omitted, "What denomination ?" If I wish to hold street meetings, the mayor replies as he looks one over carefully, "What denomination are you?" Yes, if one wishes to preach in a little dirty alley, the mountain top, the desert plain, or beside the street gutter, they first pass examination, "What denomination are you?"

Am refused admittance many times to places where 1 might do good, because someone does not like the ring of the undenominational note. Once, when invited to speak in a private home where the people did not believe in holiness, I went to the home but was astonished, after all the people had gathered and I was about to begin the meeting, to have the man of the house ask me the old worn question, "What denomination are you?" Some of his people did not wish me to speak, it seems, so he tried to call a halt at a strange time. But on being assured I would preach the Bible only, he concluded I could go on in spite of the "denomination."

It is not only among denominational churches this spirit is shown, but among Pentecostal people as well. When the Pentecostal movement started, God wonderfully blessed it. We had our little assemblies in different places and visited each other often. There was among them a unity of spirit beautiful to behold. Now in many places, the old sad question has come up and divided them, viz. "What denomination are you?" There are actually people in the Pentecostal ranks who will not allow any other Pentecostal person to visit their camp meetings and testify unless they are tagged with their trade mark alone. Again, "What denomination are you?"

True, there is just reason for some of this prejudice. A brother or sister, when they attend services of any kind, should have enough Christian courtesy, to say nothing about love, to remain silent on doctrinal points wherein they may differ from the ones who are conducting the services.

If we attend a church, Roman Catholic or any other, we should have respect enough for God and love for our brother, to sit still and listen. If we do not like what is said. we are not obliged to stay. When will God's people learn, like Mary, to keep some things to themselves and ponder them in their hearts. I confess I am heartily tired of the question, "What denomination are you?"

If St. Peter stands at heaven's door, as some believe he will, I am glad he will think of other words to use to the anxious seeker for an entrance. For heart purity is the condition through which we must gain an entrance. "Sin can never enter there." Are our robes washed in Tesus' blood. The Lord knows His own and will pick them out of all denominations. "Thou hast a few names even in Sardis, which have not defiled their garments. Thev shall walk with me in white, for they are worthy."

Reader. He will never ask us the question, "What denomination are you?"


SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

March 5, 1916.<br>THE DEATH OF STEPHEN.<br>Lesson Text.-Acts 7:1-8:3.<br>Golden Text.-"Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee the crown of life." Rev. 2:10.

Leading Thought.-A triumphant death.

1. Stephen's Defense before the Sanhedrin. (Vs. 1-53.) Reread the latter part of the foregoing chapter to gain a more connected view of Stephen's life and ministry. Not a very long one to be sure, but how very effective and pleasing in God's sight. "And Stepher full of faith and power did great wonders and miracles among the people." ch. $6: 8$. That was the start of the matter. Then immediately there arose persecutors who disputed with him. but even these "were not able to resist the wisdom and spirit by which he spake." However the Adversary was not sleeping and he caused them to oitain false witnesses, accusing the faithful Stephen of blasphemy against Moses and the sacred Temple. There was next a sort of trial but as in the case of Stephen's Lord a very unjust and irregular one. Poor justice the child of God may expect from the earthly courts; but we know that the Judge of all the earth will do right. Hallelujal! ! Unfair as the trial was, it gave Stephen a most excellent opportunity to witness. It was the closing sermon of his ministry, the last service of his life. Whether or not he realized this, it made no difference in the clear forceful line of argument which he presented to that body of men so bitterly opposed to all mention even of the new religion which was multiplying so rapidly in Jerusalem. Stephen goes back into history, carefully tracing through God's dealing with the ancient patriarchs working out this very salvation which now he with the other apostles and brethren made so bold to declare unto the people. The very Moses whom
they accused Stephen of blaspheming foretold the coming of this very Savior. v. 37 . Then in like manner he opens to them the matter of the Temple, showing from the history God's attitude in that regard. Notice the similarity of argument in this sermon and those of Peter and Paul. They were continually setting forth the history of God's chosen people and proving from the scriptures the Messiahship of the Lord Jesus Christ. Here was the Word of God preached in the power of the Holy Ghost. Such preaching always has one of two effects-repentance, as in Peter's case; or severe persecution and possible death, as in Stephen's case. The savour of life unto life or of death unto death. The reward is just the same from God's standpoint and the fruit thereof certain though in the latter case most often unseen at the passing time. "Blessed are ye that sow beside all waters." Mark now the last words of Stephen's discourse - the home thrust-hastily made perhaps as Stephen marked the rising indignation of his hearers. "Ye stiffnecked and uncircumcised in heart and ears, ye do always resist the Holy Ghost: as your fathers did so do ye " v. 51. This indicates to us the presence of the Holy Spirit in the early dispensation in some measure at least. He plainly calls them betrayers and murderers, "who have received the law by the disposition of angels, and have not kept it." This would imply that they were the ones who had missed keeping the law and not he as they were accusing him ot doing.
2. The Martyrdom of Stephen. Vs. 5460. They were "cut to the heart," but in a much different way than the men who were "pricked to their hearts" on the day of Pentecost; for "they gnashed on him with their teeth." It would seem as if the very demons of hell in human form had turned loose to wreck their hatred on the one who bore such strong unanswerable testimony to the new faith. But this in nowise affected the man of God who was full of the Holy Ghost. It is not the first time we have heard of his being full of the Holy Ghost. But we
are seeing him now under altered conditions than on previous occasions; yet here he stands with the same quiet composure and confidence in the Lord. A spirit-filled man will be calm under any sort of condition. Look back in the early days of the church and you can trace all down the years men and women who with calm fortitude have faced every imaginable circumstance with heart unmoved, because they were full of the Holy Ghost. It is one thing to be 'filled with the Holy Ghost" back there on some glorious Pentecostal day; quite another to be "full of the Holy Ghost," facing the gravest danger that any mortal can face. And he "looked up steadfastly." They can close about you every door and window; they can bar every avenue of earthly escape but, thanks be to our God, they can never close that upward window through which the hunted, persecuted child of God may ever see the face of their God, filled with loving compassion and concern for His tested one. How the recital of that heavenly vision enraged the already infuriated mob! They would hear no more. But stopped their ears and rushed upon him with one accord (the devilish unity of Satan himself), "and cast him out of the city and stoned him." He was like his Lord who suffered without the camp. Heb. $13: 12,13$. Stoning was the customary Jewish mode of execution. How that last glorious vision of the exalted Christ must have cheered Stephen's heart and strengthened his faith those last awful moments. I believe the sting of death was removed for the servant of God who was thue sealing his testimony with his life-blood. Only God could give him the loving spirit of forgiveness so evident in that final prayer. It was like that which came from his Lord's lips as he hung on Calvary. And such divine victory meant far more than physical deliverance could have ever meant. What sadly distorted views some of us have of victory anyway! There is something greater than deliverance, sometimes.
"He heeded not reviling tones, Nor sold his heart to idle moans, Tho cursed and scorned and bruised with stones.
But looking upward, full of grace, He prayed, and from a happy place God's glory smote him on the face."
3. The Effects of Stephen's Marty:dom. Vs. 1-4. There are two striking effects. There was first the striking impression which was doubtless made on that young man, Saul, at whose feet Stephen's persecutors cast their outer garments. v. 58. While it was true he consented to the martyr's death and

himself proceeded to prosecute the persecution with fresh zeal, still an arrow entered into his heart that day which later helped in slaying the same young man when smitten low by the power of God. Stephen little realized in what way his death was to bear fruit unto life. The second effect or result was the scattering of the Word into outlying localit:es. The young church was becoming too self-centered, and God's plan ever is to "Go forward." So God's purpose was forwarded in the awful storm of persecution which broke over Jerusalem; "and they that were scattered abroad went every where preaching the word." Thus were they forced to fulfill Christ's great commission to them.

They are commencing to love one another (love is something rare in this land so bound by $\sin$, vice and superstition) and for this we praise God.

It is hand-picked fruit, and many times when you think he or she is going on well the devil comes in and they fall of: and go back to $\sin$. ## A SISTER LIES UNDER THE POWER OF GOD FOR FOUR DAYS AT DULUTH, MINN.

Our hearts rejoice in the God of our salvation, for the knowledge that we have that He is moving through the earth today, and that the latter rain is falling. While the work in this city is somewhat quiet, yet there is a mighty stirring going on at our outside appointments. And the Lord is blessing.

A short while ago Brother Morcom and the writer were led to visit a new field west of this city. While there we were invited into the Methodist Church for two Sunday services, and the power of God fell as the Word went forth, inasmuch as we were invited to remain as long as the Lord should lead.
