Picture III. The Prophetic, Priestly and Kingly Anointing. 1 Kin. 19:16; Ex. 29:7; 1 Sam. 16:13.

2. The Priestly Anointing.

One of the ceremonies recorded twice over with the utmost detail in God's Holy Word is the anointing and consecration of Aaron the first high priest, with his sons who were to assist him in the priestly office. I would ask my readers before going further, to read carefully, asking for the Holy Spirit's illumination and interpretation, chapters 28 and 29 of Exodus, and also Leviticus 8 and 9. In this article I do not propose to speak of every detail of that wonderfully typical ceremony, but only of the one point which specially prefigures the baptism of the Holy Ghost. "And he poured of the anointing oil upon Aaron's head, and anointed him, to sanctify him." It was by this anointing with oil that Aaron was set apart as high priest; and in Psa. 133:2 we read that the precious oil from the head poured down to the very skirts of his garments, a beautiful picture of Jesus, our Head, and our Great High Priest, receiving the priestly anointing, and that holy oil becoming available for every member of His body, the church. "Therefore, being by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, He hath poured forth this." Acts 2:33.

There is a two-fold aspect of the work of a priest, as given to us in the Scripture. First he was God's representative to man, and in this his chief work was teaching the people the need of sacrifice for their sin, and proclaiming to them God's acceptance of their sacrifices when offered in faith, and their subsequent pardon. Secondly, he was man's representative before God, and as such his chief work was that of intercession. The priest occupied the position of a mediator—for the people to Godward, and for God to the people. "Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth" (Rom. 10:4), that is, all the types and shadows of the Mosaic ritual were fully and perfectly fulfilled in HIM, the one great High Priest, Mediator and Sacrifice for our sins. Not one of us can ever take the place of mediator in the sense of making atonement for sin; and vet, as workers together with Him, there is a very real sense in which we are called unto the fellowship of our Master in being priests unto God; to take His message and be His ambassadors to men, and also to be their representatives before Him, in lives of intercessory prayer.

Beloved, how much have we learned of this priestly anointing, since receiving the baptism of the Holy Ghost? Has the Spirit been able to lay real travail for souls upon us? Or have we been too busy to spend whole days or nights in intercession? If there is one thing more than another which the Lord seems to be seeking in these last days, it is for a host of real prayer-warriors, those who are so humble and so utterly yielded to the Spirit that He can intercede through them just when and where and how He will. Then, in addition to the intercession, see some of the sacrifices which we are to offer in Heb. 13:15, 16; Phil. 2:17, and 4:18; Rom. 12:1 and 15:16. Note also the song of the redeemed in glory. Rev. 1:5, 6, and 5:9, 10. May the Lord make His Pentecostal people in these last days to be indeed "a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God by Jesus Christ." 1 Pet. 2:5,9.

3. The Kingly Anointing.

"Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren; and the Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward." I Sam. 16:13.

In the song of the redeemed in glory which we looked at a few moments ago, the two titles are mentioned to-gether, "kings and priests." When we become children of God we are made members of the Royal Family of heaven, and the Father desires that His children should show forth His nature in the world, living and acting before men as becomes their kingly race. There is an old proverb of the French-"Noblesse oblige" (nobility obliges), which teaches a deep spiritual lesson. The real nobility are above the mean, petty actions that smaller men might indulge in. Their royal blood obliges them to live lives of rectitude, justice, honesty, purity and benevolence. And if this is true of earthly royalty, how far more true is it of God's kings-members of the Royal Family of heaven? God's children must live lives worthy of their kingship: they cannot stoop to worldliness, selfishness, anger, pride or impurity. If a child of God leans on the arm of flesh, has recourse to worldly methods in his work, or compromises with the world in any way, he disgraces his royal lineage.

And the power to live the kingly life is the baptism of the Holy Ghost. In His last words to His disciples, as He was going up to heaven, Jesus said, "Ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you;" (Acts 1:8) and we see in their changed lives after the Holy Spirit came, the proof of that promise coming true. Where is the coward Peter, who shrank before the scornful sneer of a servant girl, and denied that he had ever known his precious Saviour? Gone forever: and in his place see the fearless man of rock, standing up boldly before the very Jerusalem which had crucified His Lord, and bringing their sin home to them. Hear him boldly testifying before the great council of his nation, in the face of stripes and imprisonment, "We ought to obey God rather than men." "Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye: for we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." Acts 4:19, 20, and 5:29. See him proclaiming the Gospel to the Gentiles, and working for his Lord in one country after another-destitute, persecuted, beaten and maligned -and finally laying down his life on a cross, like the Saviour he so faithfully served. What changed him? It was the promise of the Father, the enduement with power from on high, poured forth on the day of Pentecost.

Dear reader, have you received this baptism of the Holy Ghost? If so, pray that it may be manifested in a life of overcoming, a life of constant victory in the little things of life. The real test as to whether we have received the kingly anointing does not come in great crises, but in little things: in the friction and tiny rubs of contact with others, especially those with whom we live or work. Many a saint would gladly give his life for the truth and be burned at the stake if that test came; but he allows himself to feel a little hurt if not asked to speak in a meeting, or at some fancied slight in the intercourse of daily life. The only real overcomer is he who overcomes in little things: even as a king who could break down great castles of the enemy, would not dream of flight before a party of skirmishers. God grant that we may all become overcomers before Jesus comes again; that we may obtain the promise "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with Me in My throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with My Father in His throne." 3:21.)—Alice E. Luce.

JESUS CHRIST THE LORD.

Therefore, to confess Jesus Christ as our Lord, and to sing the victorious song of His power, and to proclaim His dazzling Majesty in our life, is to be filled and controlled by His will, which is the normal citizenship of heaven. Yea, the heaven of which Jesus Christ is King.

The Glorious Benefits of the Lordship of Jesus Christ. (Read Isa. 32.)

Heaven is a place of joy and divine pleasure. Why? Because the Ruler of it is God and its Prince is Jesus Christ. We read that there is coming a day for this world, which is a day of a thousand years long. That thousand years is the reigning of Jesus over this present sinful, sorrowful, wicked, tormented world. (Rom. 8:19.)

princes shall rule in judgment, and a man shall be as an hiding place from the wind, and a covert from the tempest, as rivers of water in a dry place, as the shadow of a rock in a weary land. And the eyes of them that see shall not be dim, and the ears of them that hear shall hearken, the heart also of the rash shall understand knowledge, and the tongue of the stammerers shall be ready to speak plainly....and the work of righteousness shall be peace, and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance forever." Why? Why? Why all this? Because Jesus, that King, shall reign in righteousness with His princes (His saints) ruling in judgment.

Dear reader, God has promised us abundant peace, joy, rest, quietness, victory in the face of the devil, in the midst of this crooked and perverse generation, in spite of the multitude of trials and temptations in our daily life. We can obtain this in our present life with persecution; but the full glory of it will be when we shall see Him face to face.

Reader, who is your king; under whose control are you? Have you got the nature of Jesus in you by which God rules your life? Are you a member of the free family of the heavenly Father, and Prince Jesus, or are you still naturally-minded, unconverted, a nominal Christian? Can you, with truth of heart and life, looking into the face

of Jesus, say: "My Lord and My God?"

God help us to answer this solemn question. For if you stay under the control of Satan in the old life, you will be forever with him, who has already been judged, and preserved for everlasting chains of darkness, and unquenchable fire of torment throughout eternity. But if you turn from sin and Satan to God, through Jesus Christ, accepting Him now as your Saviour and your Lord, you shall be delivered from sin, Satan and hell to enjoy the glorious freedom under the rule of the Righteous King of kings and Lord of lords—Jesus.

WHAT IS TRUTH?

In ten thousand ways, and tones, the above question is being asked all around us. One might gather from that fact that people were really desirous of having the question satisfactorily answered, but in the large majority of cases, those who ask the question proceed to answer it, by giving their own views and opinions, which when they are analyzed do not even satisfy those who maintain them. But there are those, who if they once stepped upon solid rock concerning this question, would find themselves so settled, and established, strengthened, and comforted, that no hurricane of opinions, and doctrines, and views, and ideas, would ever dislodge them.

Man was made by God a thinking, and a reasoning creature, but he must have the truth for foundation, in order to think the truth. Otherwise his thinking and reasoning, however good it may seem, can only be speculative.

The young folks in our family adopted the following plan-If any word was used, as others thought out of its meaning, or incorrectly pronounced, it was challenged, and a certain agreed dictionary was appealed to, and whatever it declared was the spelling, pronunciation, or meaning of that word, was accepted, and was an end of all controversy, there being no further room for ideas, and opinions. It was counted as being the truth, on that matter -the debate was over, and nothing left to do, but to practice it. This was a very simple matter and answered well. Had the children of God done the same thing concerning their disputations, there would but have been one sect only today, and they would have been known as Christians-Christ's people.

We hear it said frequently-"Back to Pentecost"-"Back to Calvary," but far better still to be back to the Word,—Christ. Pilate was confused on this question, and asked "What is Truth?" The Lord Jesus had just told him, that to this end He was born, and for this cause He came into the world, "to bear witness unto the Truth." In our Lord's Prayer, immediately before this, He had declared "Thy word is Truth." Here we have a plain simple declaration, and unless we are willing to believe those four words, spoken by our Lord in Prayer, we may search diligently all the rest of our lives for truth, and

never find it.

Settle it once for ever in your heart before God, that as for you, you will receive that declaration, and risk all your earthly and eternal happiness and well being upon it. That is the rock to put your feet upon. And be assured that though heaven and earth shall pass away, that Word shall never pass away. Having done this, we will ask, what is the Word of God? Had we been able to receive all God desired to communicate to us in one word, there is such a word that He could have used. That word is "Christ," but in order for us to get a glimpse of that wondrous Word, He has used all the words from Genesis to Revelation, to unfold to us Christ, the Wisdom of God, and the Power of God. Thus we see the Scriptures are the Words of God, to reveal His WORD. It is the whole of Scripture that makes the Word.

Now if all God's real people would appeal upon every question to His Word, and let Him settle it in His own words, as our family did the dictionary, there would be an instantaneous cessation of disputation,-God would be honored, and all that His people have longed for, and praved for, and yet themselves have hindered, would be done! It is perfectly wonderful how the Scriptures deal with every phase of life in simple language which can be understood by a child. The main difficulty is, so few Christians ever know where to look, in order to find what they want. How is this? There has been no reverent, regular, reading of the Word. No pains taken with it. It is used more as a scrap-book than a Guide, and the eternal principles of God are lost sight of. On the other hand, by the present day (so-called) Bible students, it is made of private interpretation, that is, it is divided, and sub-divided, and distributed, so much to the Jew, so much to the Gentile, and so much to the church, so much to the past, and so much to the future, that simple souls are bewildered and discouraged and cheated out of the Living Water and Rich Pasture prepared for them by their Good Shepherd. There is no doubt a certain amount of truth in some of this overdone dispensational way of carving up the word of God, but on the whole we are far better without any of it, because in studying it, or having one's mind upon it, one overlooks the eternal principles which are laid down in these very passages, and which apply to us, as much this moment as they ever did, or ever will to any one.

Whatever God says, is the Truth—Christ Himself is the Word, the Truth of God.

The Scriptures are the written Truth. Christ Himself the Living Truth, who by means of His Birth, Life, Crucifixion, Death, Burial, Resurrection, and Ascension, bore witness unto the Truth of the written Word.

Now the point is, how to get the Truth of God into ourselves. Perhaps it will make it very simple, by looking to

see how the lie of the Serpent got into mankind.

There came a day when the Serpent came and talked with the woman. He uttered words. And those words were "the lie," and the woman listened and believed the words, and received them into herself and acted upon them, thus showing that she believed them. And by so doing she received the nature of the Serpent, which is "the lie" into her being. It was very simple. She took in the words of the Serpent and then the lie was in her. Just so, by taking in the words of God, His nature is received, and His truth is in us.

The woman demonstrated that she did believe the words, for she acted upon them. We may always know when we believe the words of God, for we too will be pre-

pared to act upon them.

If souls were "born again" not of corruptible seed, (the word of man), but of incorruptible seed, that is by the Word of God, which liveth, and abideth for ever, there could be no groaning over the falling away of converts, because by so receiving this incorruptible word, the nature, the life of God, would come into that soul, and re-

Words are seed, and they have the germ of life or death in them—The receiving of Satan's words produced death, for in that day the man and the woman died to the

Truth-God,-and lived to the lie-Sin.

Christ urges us to take heed how we hear, and to take heed of what we hear for He understood the awful importance of Words, and how they reproduced themselves.

Think for instance of an agitator holding forth at an open air gathering.—Think of some nice bright boys and girls sauntering up to listen to what is being said, and they hear an earnest, forcible, though one sided oration upon the wrongs and oppression, of that class to which their parents belong. Up to that time they had never considered themselves ill done to. But now they have taken in without reserve, all that this man has been saying, the seed of hatred, and distrust towards anyone better off than themselves, has been sown in their hearts, and begins immediately to spring up and bear fruit, or rather, weeds. Whatever words we receive whether of man, Satan, or God germinate, and bear fruit after their kind.

Words which are rejected, are manifestly not planted in the Soul, whether they be good or bad. Hence, if

we do not receive the words of God, although we may hear them, and read them, we reject them. And so, though we may be able to recite them, yet they are rejected until they are believed in such manner, that we act upon them, as did Eve upon Satan's word. In Hebrew 4:2 we are told that the Gospel was preached unto Israel, but the Word preached did not profit them, because it was not mixed with faith, that is, that though they heard it, they did not receive it into themselves. So it did not reproduce itself in them.

Dearly beloved, settle it for ever in your heart, that the Scriptures are the Words of God, and whatever you need,

or lack, go to His Word, and find the very words that are suitable for your need, and plant them in your heart, and your life will become a delight to God, and His Peace will garrison your heart and mind, keep you in perfect rest, notwithstanding all the turmoil around you. You will have no perplexities about the inspiration of Scripture, nor the perfect, sufficient, atoning work of Christ on Calvary, nor the baptism of the Holy Ghost,—nor Divine Healing,—nor the second coming of our Lord, nor why this, that, or the other is allowed. THE CHRISTIAN AND WAR. IS IT TOO LATE?

No! It's not yet too late for us Christians to consider our relation to this war question.

Yes! It is too late for the Pacifists; for their weapons, being merely political, have failed, as everything human is bound to fail.

Yes! and the Socialists have failed too, having repeatedly scorned and rejected true Christian standards for those of a stupid and godless materialism. True, we have admired their devotion and zeal for peace. For the last two tragic years their burning enthusiasm (in America at least) has put us poor sleepy (though "professed") followers of the Prince of Peace to shame! But they are now bidden to "forever hold their peace," and that's the only brand of "peace" they are allowed to hold on to; for whatever is not built on "Christ the Solid Rock" is left to the fate of "sinking sand."

But what about us? Yes, us Christians, who have been preaching this Gospel of LOVE, JOY, and PEACE so loud and so long? Now that it has come to practicing what we preach, now the fiery test will be applied—are we willing to go through with Jesus? Are we ready to "go forth therefore unto Him without the camp, bearing His reproach?" (Heb. 13:13.)

Should a Christian Fight?

Let us examine carefully and prayerfully the principles of our Holy Faith, which principles we but yesterday rattled off so glibly, but which now mean so much!

The subject is so vast, and the space allowed so small that I shall confine myself to answering some of the popular objections to Christian Non-Resistance. However be it clearly understood that the matter is treated from the Christian standpoint only, and addressed only to Christians, the arguments being based solely on the authority of God's Holy Word!

Question. If war is wrong for the Christian, why did God Himself in the Old Testament lead Israel into battle and into victory against their enemies?

Answer. The Jews were then living in the age of Law and Judgment; whilst

we dwell in the Dispensation of Grace and Mercy! Right here is where there is an appalling amount of thick ignorance among God's own people, resulting in this everlasting muddling up of O. T. and N. T. teaching, of Law and Grace, of Judgment and Mercy, of War and Peace,—all through failing to "Rightly divide the word of Truth." We find recorded in the 17th verse of the 1st chapter of John's Gospel that "the Law was given by Moses, but Grace and Truth came by Jesus Christ." God ordered Israel to wipe out in direct judgment the morally rotten Canaanites: but find me in the New Testament where Christ ever sent His followers on such a mission? On the contrary He sent them out to save men-not to butcher them like cattle. Again Jehovah openly declared himself on Israel's side, by startling miracles, both at Jericho and with Gideon, as well as at many other times and places. What nation now in the bloody mess can produce such proofs of its being in the right, or of God being on its side?

No! as far as the Christian is concerned, the "eye for an eye" system has given place to the "Turn to him the other cheek also" of Matt. 5:39-44. The reader is urged here to compare the following passages in order to realize the wide difference existing between Israel and the Church of Christ!

Question. Oh, it's all very well in theory. but suppose a brute in human form attacked your wife and children. Would you stand by and allow it? (and having fired this broadside the patriot awaits the answer with an air of triumphant finality, while I'm supposed to rush blindly into the favorite trap. But praise God, he who is in the habit of receiving "tips" from heaven soon gets wise to such tricks; and now is for the

Answer. In the first place the illustration does not fit the case at all, for the murderous individual tries to assault my family of his own free will, whereas in this war poor harmless people are driven like cattle and quite against their will by godless governments into butchering each other. A more fitting picture of the situation would be found in a Spanish American cock-fight, where the poor benighted birds scatter each other's blood and feathers at their owners' pleasure—these latter together with the "neutral" spectators reaping all the profits!

In the second place, to substitute facts for wild supposition, thousands of humble Christian homes have never yet been broken into by a criminal of any sort: God protecting His own according to their faith; for they put their trust in Him rather than in the police.

Thirdly, if it should come to actual violence—Matthew 5 and Romans 12 would still remain true, and God's Word would still have to be obeyed, (cf. the case of the Three Hebrew Children. Daniel 3:16-23.)

Of course I have not included the many religious persecutions which down the ages have been the inevitable accompaniment of every new and powerful movement; and yet these very persecutions have set the seal of God's approval in the most striking way on the doctrine of Christian non-resistance. Those early non-resisters, mind you, were the same martyrs, of whom, in these days of inherited religion, the boast is so often heard, that "their blood was the seed of the church!" Their sublime endurance under the most exquisite sufferings should not only draw tears from stones, but silence forever our contemptible excuses for crawling cowardice!

"And he said to me, These are they which come out of great tribulation * * * therefore are they before the throne of God * * * They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more * * * For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of weders: and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes!" (Rev. 7:14-17.)

THE ALL-BLOTTING-OUT BLOOD OF CHRIST.

It is not our actual and our particular transgressions only; it is not our crimson and scarlet sins only; but our very best actions cry continually for the blood of Christ to be sprinkled upon them. Our sermons and our prayers, and our praises; our holiest and our most heavenly-minded exercises; all our "righteousness," as Isaiah ha, it; they all call aloud for the blood of Christ: Let but the Holy Spirit begin to dart in His holy light upon the motives and the movements of our corrupt hearts, and, like the prophets and the psalmists, we will always see stains of sinfulness, even in our tears of repentance, and selfdisplay in our pretended praise of God. And thus it must be that, even as Moses in his early day sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry, even so must it be, and much more so, in our New Testament day. For, under the Gospel, there is a far deeper, a far more inward, and a far more heart-searching and heart-breaking sense of sin that demands nothing less than the heart's blood of the Lamb of God Himself. "If our hands," says Hooker, "did never offer violence to our brethren, yet a bloody thought doth prove us murderers before God. If we never opened our mouth to utter any scandalous, offensive or hurtful word, vet the cry of our most secret cogitation is heard in His ears. If we did not commit the evils which we do commit daily and both in deeds and in words and in thoughts, yet, even in the good things that we do, how many sinful defects are intermingled." But even so, blessed be the name, the But even so, blessed be the name, the blood of Christ cleanseth from all sin: from outward and inward sin, from sensual and spiritual sin, from legal and evangelical sin-in short, from all sin, past, present, and to come.

Now, at this point, take this word of warning on this whole matter from a great authority. John Bunyan, that great authority in all these matters, tells us that as time went on with him he came to see that the very worst way to take off guilt was to let it die away of itself. "Though I was thus troubled, and tossed, and afflicted with the sight and the sense and the terror of my sin, yet I was afraid to let that sense and terror go quite off my mind. For I found that unless my guilt of conscience was taken off the right way-that is to say, by the blood of Christ-I grew worse rather than better for the loss of my trouble of mind. Wherefore, if my guilt lay heavy upon me, then I should cry that the blood of Christ should take it off. And, if my guilt was going off of itself, and without the sprinkling of Christ's blood, then I should also strive to bring my guilt back again upon my heart and upon my conscience." "And, here," says our own Halyburton also, "here, in my opinion, is one of the greatest secrets of practical godliness, and one of the highest attainments in a close and continuous walk with God-that is to say, to know how to come, daily and hourly, to the fountain opened, and kept open, for sins and for uncleanness. Never to be for long, or indeed, ever at all, for so much as a moment, away from that fountain—that, that is the only safe and sure way to keep off guilt."

And to all that of Hooker and Bunyan and Halyburton I will urgently add this: Always get your new guilt taken off immediately. Even before your new guilt is well on, get it taken off that moment, and on the spot. Suppose it is a sinful word that you have suddenly, intentionally or inadvertently, spoken—well, before that sinful word has arrived at the hearer's ear, before it has had time to enter his heart, and before the recording angel, with all his alertness, has had time to get his pen into his inkhorn against you, be you beforehand with him. Be you back at the cross in the twinkling of an eye. Be you prostrate

before the mercy-seat that moment. God is said greatly to love some of our adverbs—and no adverb of ours more than the adverb immediately, unless it be the kindred adverbs vicariously and believingly. Well, then, that moment you fall into any sudden sin of thought or word or deed, go to God about it, and go vicariously and believingly and immediately. It was an old belief that when a murderer was arrested, and was brought into the presence of the murdered man's body, the blood of the dead man began to flow afresh, as if the murder had been committed that moment, I think that old belief must have had an evangelical foundation. Only, in the evangel, the ever-flowing blood of Christ speaks far better things to the arrested man than did the warm and loudly accusing blood of that old belief.

But powerfully realistic as all that is, at the same time no possible realism can come near that of the apostle who reveals to us that very heaven itself is already sprinkled, and will all be found to be sprinkled with the blood of the Lamb when we enter it. Not the penitent sinner only, and not the saint only, and not the throne of grace on earth only, and not the book of judgment at the last day only, but very heaven itself, and especially the places prepared for us, will all be found sprinkled with the all-purchasing and all-preparing blood of the Lamb. That so precious and so prevailing blood has opened for us all our doors of grace and of all other goodness on earth, and its diverse virtue will not come to its full strength and final end till it has ushered us into our purchased possession, to go no more out. Without the full assurance and the absolute seal that Christ's blood will then give us, no one of us could ever take the boldness to set a foot of ours within the heavenly glory. But, when we are taken by the hand at the golden gate, and when we are led up to the place prepared for us, and especially when we see our own names written in His blood on our own lintel, and on our own doorpost-

> "Then Lord shall I fully know; Not till then how much I owe."

My brethren, the Lamb of God will get His proper place among all His redeemed people then. They will all be sound on the doctrine of the atonement then. They will all be believers in the Godhead of the Redeemer then. They will all be forward to subscribe to Paul's Gospel of imputation then. And to Augustine's doctrine and experience of original sin then. And by that time we will all hang together in one golden chain of the truth as it is in Jesus.

"I am my Beloved's,
And my Beloved is mine;
He brings a poor vile sinner
Into His house of wine.
I stand upon His merit;
I know no other stand,
Not e'en where glory dwelleth
In Immanuel's land.

The bride eyes not her garments,
But her dear bridegroom's face;

COMPULSORY MILITARY SERVICE

An English Conscientious Objector's Testimony.

Early in March, 1916, compulsory miltary service was forced upon the country and I at once put in an application for total exemption from military service as a conscientious objector. I had been thus minded ever since the war started and wondered what I should do if compulsion actually came. I had prayed very much and my parents and brothers had been praying too, for we all had the same attitude towards war, believing that from New Testament teaching that a Christian could not go to war.

I went up and appealed on Christian grounds. I stuck to the Scriptures and gave my objection from a Scriptural standpoint. They questioned me very closely and I answered their questions by quoting Scripture. They told me that they did not want me to preach to them but to simply answer questions. They all hung their heads as I gave my objections. At last one of them asked what I would do if an enemy came to my home and was about to kill my mother. I told him I would pray. However, they proved that my objection was sincere, and that I did not give various foolish reasons as many of the socialists and others had done, but stood on solid ground, so they granted me exemption from combatant service and put me in the non-combatant corps.

At that time I could not see my way clear to even enter the non-combatant corps, so I appealed again to the Tribunal Court, but after reconsidering it, and comparing my stand with the Scriptures, I found that I could take up with the work that the Tribunal had granted me and would not be condemned in my own mind. And I knew that if I still objected I would be put in prison for perhaps a number of years and made to do work that I would object to as a conscientious objector. So I took the work.

About six weeks later I was sent to the Recruiting Office at My name was taken and in the afternoon I found myself marching to the railway station on my way to It was quite a new thing to me to be under an officer, but I soon found out that I had to be in subjection to those in authority. That night I slept in a hut on some straw with some very rough looking material for sheets and a couple of blankets. The next day was medical examination, and so I was taken into what is known as the N. C. C. (Non-Combatant Corps).

The thing that surprised me the most

was the corruptness of the men I was mixed with. Men who had come from good homes were absolutely corrupt in their conversation. I had never seen anything like it before. I was the only Christian there. Amidst the cursing and swearing of that gang of men I finally fell asleep—my first night in the N. C. C.

Surely if anyone is to live a Christian life in the ordinary barrack room he can only do so by the grace of God. But, thank God, it is possible. Paul says: "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit ye like men, be strong." If ever there was a place were the young man needed to watch, stand fast, be a man and be strong, it is in the barrack-room.

The next day I was sent to another place, and to my surprise I found I was in company with many other C. O.'s, and ere long some very interesting conversations took place. I found that many of these men were Christians. What a change from last night! I also had a better place to sleep and I was so delighted to think that the Lord had worked things out so well. Our work here consisted of moving stores, handling food stuffs, hospital work, farm work and other little duties. We did not handle firearms or ammunition. It was interesting to see clerks and men of all trades handle a pick and shovel for the first time, but like me, they had to do many things for the Lord's sake and to obey those in authority if they did not go beyond what we believed to be the promise of the Tribunal Court.

We were a mixture of different religious beliefs in this corps: Church of England (Episcopal), Roman Catholic. Wesleyan. Baptist, Methodist, Strict Baptist, Peculiar People, about four kinds of Plymouth Brethren, Congregationalists, Presbyterians, Seventh Day Adventists, Pentecostal, and many other kinds, besides Socialists, Agnostics, etc., all of us objecting to war.

I remember when I first came into contact with so many doctrines I had to make sure of my stand and see whether I was securely founded on the Rock. But bless God for the strength He does give those that put their trust in Him.

I might state that the reason I took the stand that I did as a C. O. I could not see any other stand to take as a Christian who is measuring his walk by the Word of God. Others may not see as I do and may be quite sincere in their stand as a combatant, but to me, according to the Word of God, it is quite wrong for a Christian to fight. Let every one be persuaded in his own mind, for the time will surely come when everyone in this old world will have to fight it out and prove where they stand and it will be seen whether their objection is sincere or not. Surely the time is short, and let every man be found doing the things that would please the Lord when He comes.

I praise the Lord for the way He has answered prayer and kept me out of war. For the last several months I have been far away from the battle fields of Europe. I have been stationed in Ireland. I have been doing all kinds of work and not much of it has been very war-like. I believe that the Lord will undertake to the end. Pray for me that I may be found faithful until Jesus comes.

Bro. James Harvey sends us the above testimony, which he received from a very dear friend of his in England. We publish it, believing it will help many of our young men in the stand they will take at this time.

WHAT IS HAPPENING TO PALES-TINE.

A correspondent sent to the Prophetic News a description of a lecture on Palestine. "Mr. Schor, the lecturer, is a Jew, and had lived amongst and visited the places he talked about. He belongs to the London Jews' Society. As the map of Palestine was next to be shown, he pointed out it was only the size of Wales, and so could not contain all the Jews that were going in great numbers to the land given to Abraham by God; so they would occupy the desert of Arabia, and thus fulfil the prophecy of Isa. 35:1, 'The desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose;' also Jer. 31:28, 'Behold, I will bring them from the north country, (Russia), and gather them from the coasts of the earth.' He said the old orthodox Jews were giving up their old belief, as it did not satisfy them at the present time, and it rested with us whether they embraced Christianity or turned into infidels. The question was, what were we going to do with the Turks? Kill them, as the Israelites did the Canaanites? No. For every hundred Jews going into Palestine, thousands of Turks are emigrating into America and other places; thus God was providing homes for His people the Jews, making way for their return. which is very near. The great difference of the place to what is used to be was shown in the picture, where were a large number of nice houses, all occupied, instead of the cramped-up streets as formerly, with the land cultivated. The Sea of Galilee, he said, abounded with fish, so that they could sit on the coast and make up the sardines without number, and the Dead Sea was full of chemicals, which would add to the industry of the people. Likewise, new streams of water were springing up in places where there had never been any before, and railway stations were built near them, so as to work the machinery. All things were thus being prepared for the return of the Jews to the promised land. The climate, Mr. Schor added, is so good, and the soil so fertile, that everything needful for food can be grown."

If we can't do anything else, we can pray.

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THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.



181. Should a woman wear a covering on her head when she prays or prophesies in meetings? 1 Cor. 11: 5-6.

Ans. In the days of the apostle Paul and in the East, it was customary for every virtuous woman to wear a covering on her head as a sign of submission to her own husband if married, or to her father, if single. To go in public without this was to declare herself a free lance and a loose, unvirtuous woman. Women made free in Christ were likely to throw to the winds all customs, shout, prophesy and pray bare headed as much as they pleased. Paul saw, in this, great harm to the good name of Christian women, and to the cause of Christ, so enjoined that after saved they still wear a covering as a sign of submission to one man, and not act as if all men were the same to them. If such customs and beliefs prevailed in our country in this day, women should certainly wear the covering still. But such does not prevail in this country now, and therefore I see no need of it. Paul says even then it was not to be a matter of contention, much less so now when such customs do not prevail.

The parallel today would be for a Christian woman to dress like a woman of the red light district. The pity is that many professing women do today dress in a vulgar, immodest way, in such way as to show as much of her nude body as possible, a way that appeals to the passions of unsaved men. This is a gross violation of the Bible principle which Paul upheld. No virtuous woman should be guilty of wearing immodest dress. God's people should not follow the godless fashions of the world. They can dress neatly and yet avoid this.

182. Is the Adamic nature of sin still with us after we accept Christ? Is this what Paul calls the "thorn in the flesh?"

Ans. This inherited sinful nature is changed when a man is made a new creature in Christ. 2 Cor. 5:17. Yet in some measure, it seems there is danger to the child of God still, from weaknesses still left in regenerated and sanctified mankind, of falling back into old sins that grow out of this old nature. See Gal. 5:13-18. See the warning in Col. 3:5-17. See the promise in Rom. 6:14. Read 6:1-14, 18, 22, 23.

No, the "thorn in the flesh" was not the Adamic nature in Paul. Some believe the thorn in Paul was afflicted eyes that continually distressed him. Paul applies it in 2 Cor. 12:7-10 to all "weaknesses, injuries, necessities, persecutions or distresses for Christ's sake." The thorn therefore has a wide range of application. I am glad I do not know what Paul's particular thorn was, so that I can apply God's promise of all sufficient grace to mine, though it may be different from his. Hallelujah! His grace is sufficient for all the thorns in all of us.

183. Will the same bodies that we now have come forth from the grave, or will it be a different body that Jesus is now preparing for us?

Ans. This is a mystery not fully revealed, but on which we have rich suggestions. John speaking of this says, "It doth not yet appear what we shall be; but we know that when He shall appear, we shall be like Him." 1 Jno. 3:2. Paul says, Christ "shall change our vile body (body of humiliation), that it may be fashioned like unto His glorious body," Phil. 3:21.

This present body is to be related to this new spiritual glorified body like a grain of wheat is related to the living stalk that grows up out of it (1 Cor. 15:35-38), a difference somewhat like the difference between earthly bodies and heavenly bodies (1 Cor. 15:40), like the difference between corruption and incorruption, dishonor and glory, weakness and power. It is the difference between a natural body and a spiritual body, 1 Cor. 15:42-44. Let us believe and preach all the Word says, but not in presumption go beyond it, nor contend over our own human phrases or notions about it.

184. What proof have we that gives the right to say "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus" over and over again to get the baptism in the Spirit?

Ans. We have many examples of calling upon the name of the Lord Jesus. God pours out the Spirit through Jesus. The child of God is perfectly free to use any Scriptural word or phrases in praying for the baptism. If this is used as a shortened petition that Jesus should baptize them with the Spirit, it is perfectly lawful and correct. But if the word Jesus is used merely

as a physical manipulation of the lips and vocal organs which physical manipulation is depended upon to bring the Holy Ghost or to get tongues, then it is worse than useless. No physical manipulation, however good or holy the word used, can be or should be depended upon to bring the Spirit. Repentance, faith, obedience, waiting, prayer, expectance, praising and blessing God, laying on of hands, etc., are the means used in the Scriptures. If these are complied with, any soul on earth can receive the baptism with the Holy Ghost!



SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

May 6, 1917.

JESUS THE SERVANT OF ALL.

Lesson Text.-John 13:1-17.

Golden Text.—"Whosoever would be first among you, shall be servant of all." Mk. 10:44.

Leading Thought.—Christ our pattern in lowly service. 1 Pet. 2:21.

It is the night before the crucifixion. In obedience to the Lord's directions the disciples had found an upper room, made ready the supper and partaken thereof. The supper was ended. Comp. Mt. 26:7-30; Mk. 14:17-26; Lk. 22:14-39. It was just before the institution of the Lord's Supper that the events of our lesson took place.

1. The Love of Christ, V. 1. "Having loved His own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end." It was the last evening Christ would spend with these disciples. He well knew that His hour had come, and with full consciousness of the fact, He still was interested and concerned about those most dear to Him upon earth. His love is an everlasting love. "Get to know the knowledge-surpassing love of Christ." Eph. 3:19. Roth. His love through those three years of close contact had been most true and faithful; and now in His last hours that love wavered not; and more than this would continue "unto the end."

> "The love of Jesus, what it is None but His loved ones know."

How the consciousness of this eternal love should steady our hearts under every condition! His love surpasses all our unlovelinesses; His love grants us the abundant supply of all our needs; His love reaches us in the farthest extremity, yea to the very end of life itself, if Jesus be not come.

"E'en down to old age all my people shall prove

My sovereign, eternal, unchangeable love."

The constant appreciation of His love will transform our hearts; it will control our attitude toward others, and make us gentle and Christ-like. We are to be able ministers of the New Covenant; and love is the very essence of the covenant which God has made with us through our Lord Jesus Christ.

2. The Humility of Christ, Vs. 2-11. After reading V. 3-"Jesus knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He was come from God, and went to God,"-we should very naturally expect to hear of some startling act of divine power to be left as a witness to those disciples whom He was so soon to leave. Fully conscious of His divine power He turns to a service which all those twelve disciples had considered themselves too high to perform. Someone says, "Humility is not a low estimate of one's powers, but a willingness to use them in a lowly service." inseparably united to God the Father, He, whose right was to be served, "laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself * * * and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded." The task should have been done long before, when they entered the house with dusty, travel-stained They would not have sat thus through the supper, but for the pride of each of those hearts. What a blessing would have come to the one who dared to humble himself and serve his brethren; and, most of all, His Lord thus. Neither John with his heart of love, nor Peter with his impulsive desire to please the Lord saw their opportunity. Will we not know some day how many, many blessed joys we have missed through our foolish pride? We have every day opportunities of humbling ourselves in some lowly service for another-and we let our pride hinder, then wonder why our hearts grow hardened and we lose the unspeakable sweetness and richness of His grace. "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth." "The high mountains are barren, but the low valleys are covered with corn, and accordingly the showers of God's grace fall into lowly hearts and humble souls." Would you be truly humble. Then to you Jesus says, "Learn of me, for I am meek and lowly." No heart can draw very close to Him without unconsciously revealing in their lives that rarest flower of earth-Christ-like humility. As He laid aside that outer garment in going about His service, so He laid aside His glory in coming down to this earth for the accomplishment of our soulcleansing. Heb. 13:12. He girded himself-took upon himself the form of a servant. There was no sham nor pretense about His humility. He entered into the service with all the joy and interest of His heart. The whole thing was a rebuke, and yet no word of condemnation had as yet been spoken. Example is ever better than precept. Those disciples had sought to avoid being the least: Jesus sought to be the very least. Wondrous condescension of our Lord! Peter's remonstrance was very natural; I wonder if most of us have not done likewise. We are to accept unquestioningly whatever He brings into our lives. He yields in response to the Lord's admonition: but goes from one extreme to another, assuming almost a dictatorial attitude. Peter has yet to learn submission to His will. But what of the washing itself. Its significance was With His own holy hands He washed those soiled feet. By the offering of His own precious body He hath purchased for us cleansing and deliverance from all the power and soil of sin. "A fountain opened in the house of David!" Hallelujah! There are many streams flowing today-but only that blood-red flow from Calvary's mount can cleanse. It recalls to us the brazen laver of the Tabernacle "Ye are clean, but not all." Christ had made no difference all through these three and a half years in His treatment of Judas. He had cast no shade of suspicion on him, and now washed his feet with the same care as those of the rest. All Judas' association with the clean way could not make him clean. His evil heart was unchanged. The wheat and the tares still grow together. But we don't need to separate them. The Lord will take care of that part.

3. The Mind of Christ, Vs. 12-15. "Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well: for so I am." He who had gone way below them in humility of service now freely acknowledged His The Lord of glory rightful nobility. humbled Himself for us! And now to us comes Paul's exhortation, "Let the same disposition be in you which was in Christ Jesus. Although from the beginning He had the nature of God He did not reckon His equality with God a treasure to be tightly grasped. Nay He stripped Himself of His glory, and took on Him the nature of a bond-servant by becoming a man like other men. And being recognized as truly human, He humbled Himself, and even stooped to die; yes, to die on a cross. It is in consequence of this that God has so highly exalted Him, and has conferred upon Him the name which is supreme above every other." Phil. 2:5-10. "Ye also ought to wash one another's feet." 14. There are some who feel to fulfil this in the letter, and God adds His blessing according to the uprightness of their hearts. But we should not forget that many times it costs us much more grace to serve our brethren in other needful ways, and it is equally, if not far more pleasing to God. There is an inner meaning which the Holy Spirit

will make plain to you if your heart is open to receive it. Someone observes, "One way in which Christians may wash one another's feet is by reproving one another. But the reproof must not be couched in angry words, so as to destroy the effect; nor in tame, so as to fail of effect. Just as in washing a brother's feet, you must not use boiling water to scald, nor frozen water to freeze them."

This altitude of nearly 10,000 feet has been very trying on Mrs. S. and myself, but our great Physician has never failed us. When we did not see where our food was coming from, He opened a way in the desert.

The Lord seems to be laying a children's home on our hearts now. When we think that about seventy-five per cent of the births are illegitimate, and there are hundreds of outcasts who never will know their father and perhaps mother either, we do long to bring them under the power of the Gospel and prayer. When we see the poor Indians pass our door how we long to reach them also, but they can speak scarcely a word of Spanish. Who will go, help, or pray? Jesus is coming soon. The day will soon be over in which to work.

BATTLING WITH CASTE IN NORTH-ERN INDIA.

We praise God for His goodness to us, and, though there are wars and rumors of wars. His promises fail not. Surely Jesus is coming soon. My heart is crying out that when He comes there will be a band here watching and ready. Many times we are down-cast because we see so little results from our labors. I have been having sun-down prayer with a little handful of men or lads who have worked for the mission off and on now for four years. Sometimes it is roof-mending and sometimes watering the garden, and it may have been grass-cutting. There are several of them and their hearts seem open to learn of Christ. But they are so bound by caste.

I was over in the village where two of them live and had no more than arrived when someone began telling me Sam Lal had been beating his mother. I was startled, for Sam Lal is all but a Christian (that is he claims to worship Jesus, yet holds on to old customs too). Well, when I looked at Sam he made no plea of innocence but hung his head. He is a lad, I should judge, sixteen or seventeen years of age, but is married, and, as his father is dead, he is the head of the family. I began telling him that I was surprised to hear such of him. His head still hung low, but someone spoke up with the facts and said "Missi Sahib, if he did not control his mother, who would? Since the father died, the mother has not kept her place and someone has to make her be straight." Sam Lal felt relieved, and I could say very little, knowing the customs of India and that the boy was doing all he could in the way of right as he saw it. Pray for this lad; also for his mother. She came and sat with several others and listened to the little message the Lord gave us.

Sam Lal's cousin, Ram Lal, works for us and seems to learn Scripture gladly. If asked who he worships he says, "The Lord Jesus." Yet one day when Mr. VanValen was here, something was said about cutting off his chuti, a little long lock of hair which is allowed to grow longer. The next day Ram Lal did not show up for work; the others said he was afraid his caste lock would be cut. Oh! caste, the mighty binding which Satan keeps these people down with, when will it lift from this country?

Many who I believe are saved go back because they fear the persecution it will bring for them to break caste and take baptism. If they don't take baptism they won't stand boldly for Christ, but try to please two masters. Prayer is the only weapon we have to unlock the flood-gates of glory. "Always laboring fervently in What a picture of a pouredpravers." out life! We are glad for those who realize God's call today to follow in Epaphras' footsteps, and earnestly wish there might be many more to thus stand back of us until the floods of Latter Rain be poured forth upon Japan. We heartily praise God for what we see of the Spirit's blessed work in hearts and lives, but we know God has greater things.

Among others who lately caused "joy among the angels" are three school teachers. One, Miuno San, saved in our home some weeks ago, has been a shining light, testifying to store keepers, boarding house acquaintances and friends far and near. Quite a few have become hungry and one came twentyfive miles last Sunday to hear all day, and be introduced to her Saviour. the "old, old story" was read and explained, her heart was melted and broken and amid sobs and cries she confessed her sins and her need. Joy and praise soon followed in blessed measure. Her cup seemed to run over. She. Tubuhashi San by name, returned early the following morning to teach, but sent us a letter the next day, full of victory and thanksgiving to the dear Lord.

The other teacher, a gentleman, was passing the mission at service time, and upon being urged, entered, heard the Good News, at once repented of his sins, accepting Christ as his substitute and has come regularly for study since.

That day a man, teaching in the country, spent the afternoon at our home eagerly inquiring the way of life, and we trust he too will soon be in the fold, washed in the blood of the Lamb.

This makes fifteen or more teachers who at our home or "deudokwan" have listened to the Gospel, but having been told by those in authority that they cannot worship the Christian's God and teach their scholars to worship the emperor, which is Japanese patriotism, many of them never came back, evidently choosing their position in preference to eternal life. Will you pray?

We have had to close our monthly meeting in the factory of three hundred hands, because of the erection of new buildings and repairing of others recently partly destroyed by fire, but the head man told us a few days ago that they will have a room ready for us again by the 14th of next month.

So far, we have not found a suitable house for meetings in the neighboring town of Koirihashi, so rent a room in a hotel, which is rather expensive.

Last Friday we had service at the station preaching on the train, and arriving there at 4 p. m. Bro. Taniguchi began to teach the children while I walked up and down the street calling to meeting. It was nice to see the little folks coming, carrying their little Testaments that we had sold them.

At 5 o'clock they were dismissed, and we went to the Civil engineer's office where five business men met for Bible study. They are eager to improve their English, so read the Word in both English and Japanese, and as we are eager that they shall understand the Scriptures most of the teaching is in their native tongue.

Then back to the hotel for a supper of unseasoned rice, a small fish, lily root, pickled radish and bean soup. This is their cheapest meal—we chose it for the Gospel's sake. Souls are of greater worth than food.

After eating, we marched up and down the streets singing songs of Zion and calling the people, and while the evangelists began the service within, I stood outside distributing tracts and inviting the people to enter. Most of the congregation were men who listened very attentively. We expect to have a series of special services soon, and trust God to give a cheaper place, and then meet souls in power.

Millions are giving time, money and strength to destroy their fellow men. Who will give their time to "Labour fervently in prayers," money to spread the good news of this glorious salvation, or come and give strength that your fellow man may receive eternal life through Jesus Christ?—Yours in His glad service, F. Beloved, some time ago I made a special appeal for prayer that God would save souls in this dark land. Immediately we saw the results. Prayer in the name of the Lord always prevails. About the time that the printed appeal was sent out, approximately forty yielded to Christ in one meeting, and we have been in a stream of salvation blessing practically ever since. The cream of young manhood in our villages is yielding to Christ. Only an hour ago, about fifteen lads and young men cried to God for salvation on our front verandah. I do not say that all of them received full assurance—though some clearly did. Some are doubtless in such ignorance that, despite our care in explanation, they do not fully grasp the greatness and freedom of Gospel salvation, and are merely hungry without knowing what they desire. But surely the God, who has begun a good work in them, will bring these, in His own time, out into full Gospel-light.

Open Doors, and a Time of Supreme Opportunity.

Now I desire to make another appeal for prayer. There are great, gaping, wide open doors here. To all appearances, in a few months time these doors will be shut for ever. Brother Salter and I have just returned from a tour of inspection and preaching. We have been looking upon the fields white unto harvest. Beloved, their condition is pitiful beyond all description, and all the worse since they do not know their need. Great villages and districts, waiting in darkness, for Christian gospellers who do not come. The Roman Catholics are stealthily steadily claiming village after Their methods consist of village. threats, brutality, bribery, blackmail. They tell the natives that every other Gospel than theirs is accursed magic. There are some of the most thickly populated districts in the Southern Congo, right at hand. Now they are untainted by Catholicism. Wherever we fail to plant the banner of God's grace in Christ Jesus, they will plant their fetishes, image-worship, and superstition.

We have had fine meetings, and in some large villages where no one has ever proclaimed Christ before. On one occasion we had just finished a Gospel service in a village, and were leaving, when a crowd arrived. Another village had turned out en masse to hear the words of life, and so we had to sit down. and with great joy we started our service all over again. One old drunken chief, who rules over many thousands, has offered us land in his village. But we are only four here, and have more work than we can do, right at our doors.

Here, then, is the condition: Wide open doors, comparatively healthy mission sites, waiting heathen in thousands, impending Roman Catholic intrusion, but no gospellers. No one responding to Christ's last command, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature." I therefore tenderly, earnestly send forth my appeal to those who, with us, feel the burden of these heathen souls.

Will you please pray believingly, that God will send forth laborers at once, to enter these open doors. God will do it if you join in believing prayer. He will both send them and equip them.
