## -:- BACK TO PENTECOST

Pentecost Essential to Christianity.
The baptism of the Holy Ghost was the final proof of the Divine Mission of Jesus Christ, but it was more: it was the very substance, the chief distinguishing feature, of Christianity. The Day of Pentecost was the real Birthday of Christianity, which on that day first appeared in the completeness of its true nature, and the depth of its essential significance. The religion inaugurated by Jesus Christ would have remained incomplete without it.

John the Baptist had foretold the advent of another Baptist mightier than himself. "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear; He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire." John could accomplish much, but the Mightier One would accomplish more: it was a privilege to have a part in John's Baptism; it would be a higher blessing to have a part in the far grander Baptism of the Coming One.

Here are two central points, around which all the teaching of the New Testament may be grouped: the preparatory work of John, and the more advanced work of Jesus. John begins, Jesus completes. "I baptize with water

He will baptize with the Holy Ghost and with fire." Both water and fire are purging agents, but fire is much the more powerful of the two. Dig up a piece of ore from the earth, and there will be found adhering to the metal two kinds of impurity: the earthy matter which can be washed off. with water, and other impurities which can be purged away only by fire. The first are more loosely attached and more easily removed; the second are more firmly attached, and water is of no avail to separate them. Fire is requisite to this end.
To the true, characteristic Christian experience, therefore, the gift of the Holy Ghost, originally bestowed in its fullness on the Day of Pentecost, was essential.

Repentance, and even remission of sins, were only preparatory steps to it. The connection between these different blessings is stated very clearly by Peter in his great word to the assembled multitudes on the Day of Pentecost: "Repent ye and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, unto the remission of your sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

The same thing under another aspect is set forth in the parable of the Prodigal Son. As soon as the father had embraced his penitent son, as soon as the
kiss of peace was on his cheek, the word went forth that the best robe must be brought forth, a ring for his hand, and shoes for his feet. Here, again, is the same order of thought: repentance, forgiveness, enrichment.

Now, the Gospel message is often identiffed with the proclamation of the remission of sins. The Lord Himself summed it all up in saying that "repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name among all nations" (Luke 24:47). Paul in his first recorded sermon, used these words: "Be it known unto you, therefore, brethren, that through this man is proclaimed unto you remission of sins" (Acts $13: 38$ ).

But are we not in these days in danger of forgetting that the forgiveness of sins is not a solitary blessing ending, as it were, in itself?

Are we sufficiently awake to the Divine plan, that when a man goes out free, he shall not go out empty? It is impossible to be too thankful for the forgiveness so freely offered in the Gospel, but it is possible to overlook other blessings associated with it in God's merciful purpose toward us. First, forgiveness; then enrichment; first, remission of sins; then the gift of the Holy Ghost: and the two so closely associated that everyone who experiences
the one should aiso experience the other. For a man to experience forgiveness of his sins and proceed to Hve out his life unenriched by the most precious oi all gifts, is a course not contemplated by the Divine wisdom, nor fin hatmony with the Dtvine mind.

In fact, the forgiveness of sins is to be regarded as the removal of a barrier. A $\sin t u l$ course is a barrfer to blessing. No true blessting can come firto a matn's life till he turns away from his iniquities. Therefore it is said that Goci ralsed up His Son Jesus and sent Him to bless men, "in turning every one of you from his iniquities" (Acts $3: 26$ ). But when anyone turns from sin to God, when he confesses Jesus Christ as his Lord, belleving in his heart that He is really a Living lord (having been raised from the dead), then the barrier is gotle, the flood-grtee of blesoing are opened; nothing that is good shall be withheld from him.

People believe in the forgiveness of sin: but do they Delieve in the gift of the Holy Ghost? And if they do, do
they not put it far away, as if it were not even a distant relative of forsivemoses

Why are not these two things closely linked up in our thoughts and our experience

The falth which brings the one should bring the other too.
"Received ye the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the heaxing of faith?" haked Paill of the Galatians. His ailswer was: Ye received the Spirit "even fas Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned unto him for righteousness"; fand he proceeds to argue that, similarly, upon the Gentiles might come the blessing of Abraham in Christ Jesus; "that we might receive the promise of the Spirit (i. e., the promised Spirit) by faith" (Gal. 3:14).

What Goil hath joined together, we have no right to put asunder. The gift of the Holy Ghost in the Pentecostal sense is a part-a most important part - of the Cospel itself. The good news is incomplete without it.

## Is Speaking With New Tongues An Essential Sign?

Since 1906 this great Bible question has been stirring the religious world. Just previous to that time many saints felt a great need, and began to pray for a revival and a greater enduement of power or a fuller baptism of the Spirit. The result was, God opened the heavens as on the day of Pentecost, and marvelous signs and wonders again appeared in the midst of His people. The news of this mighty visitation quickly encfrcled the globe, and since then hundreds of thousands have been filled with the Holy Ghost with the accompanying sign of speaking with new, or other tongues, as recorded in the book of Aots.

Now, the scriptures apparently teach that this sign is essential. No assembly can have real New Testament Church order that ignores the sign of speaking with new or other tongues, or that ignores any of the gifts. Jesus, in His parting message to His discip'es, said in Mark 16:15-20, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved . .. "" Nearly every professing Christian believes that scripture, and if so why not believe verse 15, where Jesus said, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; (notice, 'them that belleve'), they shall speak with new tongues... Iay hands on the sick," etc., ete.? The Apostle Paul also said, "Tongues are for a sign to the unbeliever." If we are indifferent and fail in these, may we not be like Israel, who terribly failed God because they failed to recognize the sign given them?

## Israel's Sign.

Therefore the Lorde himself shall give you a sign, Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call His name Immanuel" (Isa. 7:14). This prophecy given to Isaiah was truly ful-
filled in the birth of Christ (Matt. 1:21, 22). Israel, as a people, failed to recognize this sign, and so, failed to recognize Christ. As a result, they terribly failed God.

When Jesus was looking over Jerusalem and saw how Israel had failed to recognize the sign given them, and that that meant they had failed to recognize Him, He wept, and said, "The things which belong to thy peace are now hid from thine eyes." Yea, they had gotten so far away from God, they knew not the time of their visitation (Luke 19:4144), and because of this, He turned to the Gentiles to take out of them a people for His name (Acts $15: 14$ ).

## Church Order.

"And God hath set some in the church, first apostles; secondly prophets; thirdly teachers; after that, miracles, then gifts of healing, helps, governments, diversities of tongues" (I Cor. 12:27-28). These were all placed in the Church by the Lord Himself, and are sure guides to go by.

Let us especially notice what Paul said in 1 Cor. $14: 21,22$, about tongues as a sign: "In the law it is written, With men of other longues and other lips will I speak to this people, and for all that they will not hear me, saith the Lord." Are there not many like that today, who refuse to recognize these scriptures, and as an argument quote verse 23 where Paul said, "I would rather speak five words with the understanding than ten thousand words in an unknown tongue," evidently failing to see that Paul referred to the use of the gift of tongues in the church before unbelievers, which gift could be used at will, and that it did not apply to those receiving the Holy Spirit with speaking in other tongues as the Spirit
gives utterance, or to an assembly of saints. For in verses 26, 27, he clearly proves this. Here he instructs the brethren how to worship when they come together, saying, "Every one of you hath a psalm, hath a doctrine, hath a tongue, hath a revelation, hath an interpretation." Both here and in verse 5) we see he does not minimize the speakIng in tongues, or interpretation, In fact tie exhorts and encourages the use of these gifts, he shows their value, and gives instruction how they are to be
Now the speaking in tongues as the Spirit gives utterauce, accompanying the baptism of the Spirit, apparently is for all (Acts 2:4, 10:46, 19:6), while the gift of tongues which can be used at will, was given as other gifts, "to one divers kinds of tongues, to another interpretation or tongues," etc. In 1 Cor. 14:22 we read, "Tongue's are for a sign, not to them that believe (it follows believers) but to them that believe not."

Specially Note Here.
Even though some will not accept speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance as the initial evidence of the baptism of the Spirit, no one can get away from the fact that verse 22 teaches that tongues are given as a sign to the unbeliever. If God's people fail in these dark days to give the unbeliever this sign, who will give it to him?

When Paul said, "I would that ye all spake with tongues," it must have been possible for all. He did not say, "I would that ye all had the gift," for the gifts were divided to every man severally as God willed. (For instance, the gift of prophecy for some, 1 Cor. $12: 10$, the spirit of prophecy for all, Rev. 19: 10.) But he did say, "I would that ye all spake with tongues," then he added, "but rather that ye prophesied: for greater is he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues except he interpret." Note then, prophecy is not greater than speaking with tongues when interpretation is given ( 1 Cor. 14:5). If the Church does not have interpretation it is because we fail God in not praying for it (verse 13). God's Word is sure.
The Baptism of the Holy Ghost with the Sign Following.
Now, what sayeth the scripture in the first Bible record of anyone receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost in Pentecostal fulness?. We read in Acts 2:4, "And they were all (note; 'all') filled with the Moly Ghost and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." The speaking with tongues here was really the first sign given to the newly formed church after the Holy Ghost came on the one hundred and twenty, and was given to them before the multitude came together, see verse 6. A question may arise as to who this multitude was. Verse 5 clearly tells us they were Jews, devout men out of every nation under heaven. Many fail to observe that these Jews evidently understood their own language, as well as the languages of the different nations from which they had come, for on
that very day 3000 of them were brought to Christ through Peter's message. The speaking witi other tongues, on the day of Pentecost was a sign following the believer (Mark $16: 17$ ), also accompanying the baptism of the Holy Ghost (Acts $2: 4,10: 46,19: 6)$, and a sign to the unbeliever ( 1 Cor, $14: 22$, Isa, 28:11).

Gentiles Receive the Spirit.
Looking at the first Bible record we have of the Gentiles receiving the Holy Ghost, we see in this case also, the same accompanying sign, speaking in other tongues. This sign caused Peter, who brought the first message to the Chureh, and the six Jews who came with him, to take it as positive eridence that the Gentiles also had received the Holy Ghost

## How He Knew.

He said, "For we heard them speak with tongues and magnify God." (Acts $10: 44-46,11: 15)$. May we not take it as an evidence today?

## Paul's Ministry.

The first Bible record we have of any one receiving the Holy Ghost under Paul, who came specially to minister to the Gentiles, indicates that they likewise spake with other tongues (had the same sign). See Acts 19:6.

## Early and Latter Rain?

If the baptism of the Holy Ghost accompanied with the sign of speaking in tongues constituted the early rain, why not the same accompany the latter rain? The falling of the early rain came just before the terrible tribulation to the Jews; the latter rain is now falling just before the great tribulation sweeps over the earth.

The coming of the Lord, and the latter rain are inseparably connected;
it is distinctly prophecied that the falling of the latter rain, which is now sweeping over the earth, is to herald the coming of the Lord (Jas, $5: 7,8$ ).

Wonderful Bible signs, gifts of the Spirit, visions, healings, miracles, divers kinds of tongues, and interpretation are accompanying the baptism of the spirit. Dear reader, "Have you received the Holy Ghost since you believed?" If not, why not?
We do not aim to put more stress on signs, gifts, etc., than the word of God toes; neither do we want to fall God in these, for nothing He bestows is of ilttle value. Every gift from above is good and perfect. Surely Paul was very grateful when He said, "I thank my Ged I speak with tongues more than ye all" (1 Cor. 14:18) ; and he warned the Corimthlans (verse 39), "Forbid not to speak with tongues!’

## Bible Standard.

The New Testament or Bible standard of a Christian, is a holy and Spirit-filled life, with not only the signs following, which are essential in their place, but the fruits of the Spirit must also be manifest in God's true children.

We need to look for Bible Church order, and to see greater manifestation of God's mighty power and the signs following. The same faith that caused the Word to be confirmed with signs and wonders (Heb. 2:4) at the beginning of this age, if exercised now, will bring like results. Even though God spoke plainly in His Word to Israel, many of their chief elders and rulers in the Synagogues failed to recognize the sign given them. God has also spoken plainly to us. Let us not fail! Remember He said, "Thus it is written!" -A. H. Argue, Winnipeg, Canada.

## The Promise of His Coming.

The things of God are hid from the wise and prudent and revealed unto babes. "Where is the promise of His coming?" The wise say that. But the babes listen to the angels' talk. "This same Jesus shall come in like manner."

Where is the promise of His coming? It is where you look for it. If you look for it in the Word you can find it. If you look in the world, you cannot. The whole plan is in the Word, the whole likeness, "in like manner," how He is to come.

Jesus opened up the Scriptures conserning Himself; He went as far as they could go, and He will open up the Scriptures as far as you can go. He took them to the resurrection which was as much as they could stand, and He will take you to where you want to go. But you can never go beyond the Scriptures, and He will not take you beyond. We read that He would have gone further but they constrained him to stay. If He wants to go further, will you let Him go? Do not be afraid of breaking a Sabbath day's journey. Do not cut short your walk with Him, He has so much to tell you. Do not cut Him short at the resurrection story only. He wants to tell you of His coming. Let
him tell you all. He vanished out of their presence. Retain Him when you have the opportunity.

In like manner! The details are hidden in the Word. He, who can make dark light, can also enlighten one sentence from His Word to enlighten you. He says ye are not of the night, but of the day, not of darkness but of light, and you are entitled to the light on the Word so that day does not overtake you as a thief.

Was He not in the boat all the time when the storm was raging? He was asleep, but He was guiding during His sleep. The calm was there all the time because the calm was in Him. He saw calm and He spake calm. And though it may be midnight, and though there may be storm, look to Him and though He may be sleeping He will awake and He will speak the calm, and everything will be smooth and plain. He holds the key. Jesus held the key of the journey and at the right moment He spoke. And He will speak at the right moment. If He seems to be asleep, trust Him, have faith in Him for He is in the boat. And if He is in the boat there is calm, He is within and there must be safety. And when sudden destruction came
upon them, the squall that may have sunk the other little boats, just manifésted Him in their boat. And when the squall comes upon the world, it will only awaken Him within you, and He speaks, and all is changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye. "He spake and it was done." This time it will not be "let there be light," or "peace, be still," it will be the trump of God. We do not know the nature of it, but we are being tumed to ansiver the trumil). They said it thundered when they heard His voice; they understood nothing, but He interpreted it. Deep answercth minto deep, deep within us will answer to the deep of God.

The dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up. Altye, not hale dead! Not those who have a name to live and are dead, neither hot nor cold, half dead; they that are alive, alive to Him. Some are allve to the world and they think they are alive to Him. Gively stones He wants, not decayed ones. The stones of the Temple were all approved and fitted and finfshed before they left the quarry. They were lively stones, sound throughout. They that are alive shall be caught up. Are you allve? Pray God your whole spirit, soul and body be preserved blameless. The stone was alive throughout; no decay in the interior. We must be alive throughout. They that are alive will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air, the rejected Corner Stone meeting the living stones and they fit one another and so become one perfect Temple, and God is not ashamed to dwell therein.

Wherefore he that hath this hope in him purifieth himself. Like must beget like, like must' become like. "We all with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord." And those parts that may be defective can be quickened, made alive, by the Spirit. Faithful is He that hath called you, who also will do it. He wants to do it for you, dear reader, and for every one. Spirit, soul and body preserved! He has done it and He will keep on doing it; having begun a good work He will perfect it unto that day.

To the ordinary man it is an ordinary leaf having no meaning. Christ saw the fig tree full of leaves, and He saw the lesson when nobody else saw one.

If he plants his thistles, they may scatter over the whole of the heart. The last patch has to be given up to Him who owns the heart so that the whole heart brings forth fruit unto righteousness. When he is driven outside he will still be over the hedge. But God can treat you as He did Job and put a fence, an unclimbable fence, round you that he camnot get over. But it is a transparent fence, and he sees the heart from time to time and he is atways at the gate for you to open. It is then you have to take the name of Jesus with you, the Name that is infinite in its power, in its extent and in its glory. The devil listens for the Name and he has a way of evading it, but it is to be hurled at him so that he cannot escape. If he turns one way meet him the opposite way. 872. Is it recorded anywhere in the Bible that evil spirits when commanded by Peter or Paul to come out of other persons, came out of such persons and leaped on Paul or Peter, or any clean child of God? Is it scriptural to teach that in commanding spirits to come out, if you forget to say "I cast every evil spirit into the pit of hell," that these evil spirits will come upon God's clean children of upon small children? Does Acts 19:16 mean any such thing?

No such case is recorded in the Word of Peter or Paul or any other clean child of God. In Acts 16:18 Paul said to the spirit in the fortune-telling girl: "I command thee in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." It does not here record, nor anywhere else in the Word, that the Apostle commanded the spirit to go into the pit of hell. We have no right to add things to the Word of God. The persons on whom the evil spirit leaped, as recorded in Aets 19:16 were unbelieving Jews who tried to imitate Paul's work of casting out an evil spirit, and God would not let them do it. Even the evil spirit recognized the authority of Jesus and of Paul, but he defied the authority of these unbelievers. Nobody except saved people and people Who have faith in God and know that the power of the Lord is with them, should uncertake to cast demons out of a demon-possessed person. If they do, the man in whom the evil spirits are, is liable to jump on them, and give them the thrashing which their foolishness deserves. But notice that even in this case it is not said that these unbelievers became possessed by these evil spirit. It was the man that the evil spirit caused to wound these unbelievers. No clean child of God need have any fear of evil spirits if they obey, the Lord.
873. Is it right for a man saved, sanctified and baptized in the Holy Ghost to belong to a Labor Union? Is it right to deny a person so related membership in a Pentecostal Assembly?

I do not know of any issue having been made among us over this matter. It is usually considered hurtful and wrong among us for the saints to belong to oath-bound secret orders, where the saints are bound by oath to protect sinners, even when they are in the wrong. While seeking the baptism I came out of all three secret orders to which I belonged before that time. I could not conscientiously go back into any of them now.

If you can belong to a labor union, and simply stand in a righteous and Christian way for just wages to the laborer, this is one thing; but, if you have to stand by the union, and support it with your money and influence, when through the yote of worldly members they make unrighteous demands, and adopt violent and un「awful methods, then I cannot see how you can square thris up with righteousness, and with su-
preme allegiance and obedience to Jesus Christ. Personally I could not belong to any society and be bound by oath or pledge to it, which is ruled and dominated by ungodly and worldly men, whose dictates I would have to obey. You must decide this for yourself. Each Pentecostal Assembly is responsible to God for its stand on such matters. We do not dictate to them. Even in scriptural matters we can only give advice:
874. Are afflictions and sickness of the devil?

Much of it is. We read that Jesus went about healing "all that were oppressed of the devil." Many of our afflictions and diseases come upon us on account of our sins. Satan takes advantage of our getting out from under the blood to put these afllictions upon us, either to torment us while we live, or destroy our bodies altogether. Satan has the power of death, and the last enemy that shall be destroyed is death. Death is not regarded in the scriptures as a saviour, but as an enemy that has come upon us as a result of $\sin$.

Yet there are places where afflictions are represented as being put upon us by the Lord. The Lord said to ancient Israel that if they would obey Him "I will put none of these diseases upon thee which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the Lord that healeth thee."
In this passage the Lord represents Himself as putting afflictions on people when they disobey Him, and as taking them off of people when they obey Him. It matters little whether Satan or God puts them upon us, if the Lord will always take them off when we obey His voice.

## 875. Will there be a literal, burning

 Hell?The Gehenna translated in the gospels the "hell of fire," and "the lake of fire" mentioned in Revelation, into which the beast and the false prophet and Satan and all the wicked are finally to be cast, are one and the same place. It is a real, burning lake of fire, and all who do not want to go there should hastily repent of their sins and beliqve with all their hearts in the Lord Jesus Christ. It is a matter of small concern to us whether such place exists now or not. If it does not now exist, the Lord will prepare it in due time:
876. Do you think it wrong for a Christian girl to go to cellege? I am a Christian, and want to do what is right.

No, it is not wrong to secure the best Christian education which we can get, to be used for the glory of God. But we should be very eareful about what college we attend, and to be certain that we are taught the truth and not taught radical criticism and infidelity instead of the word of God.
877. Does anyone receive the Baptism of the Holy Spirit without speaking in tongues?

No doubt the Spirit is present with glory and power in the lives of many who have not spoken in tongues, but we belfeve from many scriptures, too numerous to discuss at this place, that when the finishing touch is put on the baptism of the Holy Ghost, by the Spirit completely controlling our bodies, down to the last unruly member, the tongue, that He will cause us to speak in tongues as the Spirit gives utterance.
878. Please explain Matt. 24:20, where Jesus says: "Pray that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day."

This passage deals with conditions when the City of Jerusalem is surrounded by adverse powers and about to be destroyed. It would be hard to get out of the city on the Sabbath day when the Jews always kept the gates closed. If we had to flee on that day and could not get out of the city, we might perish in the city on that account. If we have to flee penniless, shelterless, and without food and clothing in the bitterness of a cold winter, the hardships would be terrible. God allows us to pray that this may not be the case.
879. Do the seriptures teach that Satan knows our thoughts?

I do not remember any thus saith the Lord specifically on this matter. But from the very beginning the record of Satan's actions indicates that Satan knows all about us, just about as much as God does. He seems to have known all that happened between the Lord and Adam and Eve, and came with a reply ready to cause Eve to doubt the Lord. Again Satan seems to have known all about Job, his thoughts and God's dealings with him, yet Satan misjudged Job and wrongly accused him, as he does all the rest of us. He does not love to tell the truth, though he may know fully what the truth is. Modern experience with the powers of darkness, spiritualism and such like, seem to indicate quite clearly that the demons are all about us, and know us and our lives thorough1y. By such knowledge they often deceive people into belleving that these demon voices are really the voices of their departed loved ones. But there is nothing in this that should worry any child of God. God is greater than all the powers of Satan, and the angels of the Lord encamp round about them that fear Him.

## A. Pastor's Confonsfon.

## Dr, Ben Cox Thells His Congregation He Has

 Been on the Wrong Trail for Many Xears in Ministry.on accopunt of the marvolous results that have attended the services conducted by Warren Collins at Central Baptist church, the pastor, Dr. Ben Cox, Sunday was fmpelled to make a statement in which he declared that for 25 years he has been on the wrons trall.

During the brief time the services have been conducted more than 400 conversions have been secured and about 100 have joined the Central Baptist chureh; to say nothing of the number that have joined other churches.

Dr. Cox says that during the years of his pastorate he has been running after the people and now they are running after him, and the church seems to be on the eve of greater things. The statement made by Dr. Cox to his congregation was as follows:
-On account of the very radical stand I have taken recently, I feel that it is due my Memphis friends, both in and out of Centiml Baptist church, that I make a very frank statement.
"For a number of years I have been more or less interested in the passage of scriptures in the last chapters of Mark and James, and other places, but have either lacked elearness of conception or courage of conviction enabling me to step out on the promises of Goa. I am frank to confess I rebelled, as many others do, against the idea of putting a few drops of oll on a person's forehead when having prayer for the slck. I could see nothing in it.
"A few months ago I attended the noon prayer meeting at the First Baptist church, Fort Worth, Texas, which meeting was being conducted by Warren Collins, who is now here. After the service one day he anointed with ofl a woman that was sick and had prayer. He offered me the bottle of oil and said: Brother Cox, you anoint her; I said, 'Excuse me please, Brother Collins. The fact of the business was I didn't know how. It was the first time I had ever been in such a service, The next experience $I$ had was in Washington City, when I had gone there to tho Southern Baptist convention, and after my sermon nt the Centennial Baptist church the pastor, G. H. Swem, who had been preaching in Washington thirty-flve years, called some of the preachors present into his offico for a similar service. It happened that three of us preachers there were classunates at the Southern Baptist seminary,

1896 and 1897. The third experience I had was when I was requested by a member of our church to anoint her daughter. I still had a good deal of rebellion against. it, but thank God, I had grace enough to submit, and did anoint the girl, praying with others, and the ford glorlously healed her in answer to prayer. This was the first time I had ever done this, I am sorry to say.

## Dazed at Results.

"I was led to invite Brother Collins here because the news had come to me of the marvelous manner in which the Lord was blessing him and his associates in New Orleans. I simply expected that he would be here one or two weeks conducting the hoon prayer meeting and perhaps have a chort service at night. Nobody in Memphis is more thoroughly surprised and dazed than I am at the marvelous happenings we have witnessed the last three weeks. Very many people are coming to me saying: Dr. Cox, this makes me think of the days when Chirist was upon oarth:
"At the beginning of this wonderful revival meeting I saw scarcely anything in the matter except the blessings brought to thie people by the ford heathing the sick in answer to prayer. The tremendous evangelistic feature did not appeal to me I had not thought of it. I am now thoroughily collvinced that Jesus intended these two streams should flow on slde by side, as that great Baptist preacher of Boston, Dr. A. J. Gordon, used to contend. Tradttonalists and materfatists have dammed up one of these streams claiming the days of miracles are past, but they do not seem to be able to show the chapter fand verse which teaches that the days of miracles are past. Jesus plainly says: 'Greater works than these shall ye do because I go to my Father, and as dear Gordon used to put ft: "The force of the stream is stronger because the source of the stream has been raised.'
"For twenty-five years I have been preaching a partial gospel. For twenty-five years I have been going after the people to set them to confess Christ and foin the church. For the past three weeks matters have been reversed. Instead of my going after the people they have been coming after me. The rich feast I have had in being used of God in leading sinners to the Lord and Christians to a deeper consecration in His service and being used in the healing of the bodies of the people, is an oxperfence I shall not forget were I to live to be a, thousand years of age.

## Physical Healing.

"One very wonderful result of the meeting is found in the fact that many Chrlstians seeking and finding healing of body not only find bodily blessing, but a deepening of the spiritual life as they havo anade the full surrender and been baptized in the Holy Spirit.

The other day I went upstairs to rest for a few minutes and after I had been there about ten minutes a friend come up and said: "There are three people down here that want to join the church.' Also many decided to take a stand for other churehes because of this meeting. If the tide of power which is now on in Memphis, in my judgment, such as has never been ktrown in her history, is properly appreciated, utillzed and developed by the churches of this city, God only knows what the result will be. Jesus is knocking at the doors of Memphis churches as never before. Winl He find the door open or closed?

After much prayer, I have reached the deflifte conctusion that if we ifterally
follow God's precepts He will literally fulfill His promises.
"It is clatmed by some that the course I am following is not baptistic. To thls I reply: One of the cardinal tenets of Baptists has always been, We believe the Bible is a sufficient rule of faith and practice: If this be correct then he who most fully preaches and practices the Bible is the most thoroughly baptistic Baptist."

## A Further Report.

Helpful Suggestions to the Sick and Unsaved on Bible Divine Healing.
Warren Colins, Fort Worth business man and Christian, who is conducting datly prayer services at the Central Baptist chureh, where hundreds of Memphians are in attendance each day, yesterday made the following statement relative to Bible healing:

## Bible Healing.

"The highest honor God has paid to the human bedy is the Incarnation of the Lord Jesus. Through His dear Son, God has come to dwell in a human frame. Christ took upon Himself a perfect physical humanity and forever a human body will be the most glorious object in the universe. Such a body is sitting now at God's right hand and will govern all worlds and beings. "A body hast Thou prepared Me," our Lord has said, and the dignity of Christ's humanity forbids us ever to despise the human frame.
"Your prayers and even your efforts will not bring results, until you begin to act your faith and anise from your weaknesp and your fears and begin to go forward counting it done. Then God will meet you in acting. 'As they went they were healed.'

## Our Trouble.

"The trouble with men is this: They do not belleve God nor His word literally; neither do they do literally what "God says to do. God has made everything controlled by natural and spiritual laws, and men do exactly what God says to do with physical laws to get physical results; but forget God has spiritual laws that must be obeyed to get the proper results. The world is full of books and several hundred different creeds, all trying to tell what God says and what $H e$ means in the Blble. The fact is, God has quite as much sense as man and has said in the Bible exactly what He means and what He means He says.
"What God says is so, whatever men may think or say about it. There is only one heaven, one Father, one Saviour, one Holy Spirit, one devil, one hell and one churchthe invisible chureh consisting of all true bellevers in the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus died to save men from the effect of sin in three ways: First, original sin in the fall of man: second, from the power of $\sin$ over the world, the flesh and the devil through the indwelling power of the H 'y Spirit. Third, from the effects of $\sin$ on the bodies of men which produces disease of all kinds that God said would come on man if he continued to $\sin$, and which he has done.

TThe work of the Saviour is three-fold: Jesus saves the soul, baptizes or fills you with the Holy Ghost, and heals the body, for by His blood we are cleansed and by Ifts stripes we are hoaled, as Matt, 8:17 says, 'Himself took our infirmities and bare our sicknesses.' And 1 Pet, 2:24 says: 'Bÿ whose stripes ye were healed.' Psu. 103:1-7 sayting: Thio forglveth all thy iniquitios and who healeth all thy diseases.' There are two great facts about Christ: First, that He came as a Saviour; second. He is coming again to reign on the earth is person, as the Bible states over three hundred times.

James $5: 14-20^{\prime}$ plainly tells us what to
do for the sick: To pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And Mark 16:14-20 also says: "These signs shall follow them that belleve. They shall cast out devils (which is necessary) and lay hands on the sick and they shall recover.' The old saints two hundred years ago always prayed for the sick in this way, but the last century the unbelief of Christians generally, worldliness and godless llving, has so beset the churches that nowadays you can hardly hear the oldtime gospel preached with any power. Men cannot serve God and mammon and get to heaven, neither can they be healed and live vain, worldly, godless lives, for faith without works is dead. Good works won't save you, but if you are saved good works and a godly life will be the fruits of your salvation.
"There seems to be four ways of praying for the sick: Anointing with oil according to James; also praying for one another that you may be healed; also laying hands on the sick; also the gifts of healing mentioned in I Cor. 12, where nine gifts of the Spirit are mentioned.
"God promises to renew your youth like the eagle in Psalm 103:1-7, and the life or health of Christ is the inheritance of Christians given in answer to prayer through the atonement of the cross mentioned in 2 Cor. $4: 10-11$, and in Rom, 8:11. In 3 John 2, we are told the close connection of the health of the body and of the soul, That thou mayst prosper and be in bealth, even as thy soul prospereth.' God only hears the prayer of faith which the Bible sets forth, especially in Heb. 11:6, Mark 11:2226, James 1:1-7.
"All men need to do about everything in life is exactly what God tells them to do in the Bible about that very thing. So when men do what God says to do in the way $H e^{\prime}$ says to do it on the ground on which God has promised it, if it is sickness or anything else, God will do what He promises for the sick. Men can only know that it is the will of God for any person to die and not live when they are dead, and until then the word of God commands men what to do and to claim what resus did on the cross for them when they are sick. It is the will of God to heal the sick as well as to save the soul, otherwise the Bible would not have said what it does.
"The Bible plainiy states that everything God has for men is to be received by faith in His Word, and in the fact that He means exactly, literally, what He says. No doctrine is true unless all the Bible agrees in establishing it. The ministry of the gospel of healing runs from Genesis to Revelation, just as does the gospel of the salvation of the soul, and the work of the Holy Spirit.

## Heart of Unbelief.

The human heart is full of deadly unbelief. People implicitly believe one another, taking what is said at its face value and acting on ft . Without personal, private, public and business confidence the world would go to pleces. In a nutshell what God says is literally true, whether men believe it or not. The Bible is true because God wrote it. Every jot and tittle of it. You cannot prove the Bible by what men say of it. You have to belleve and aet, practioing what God says, to experience it. To tell a man you will believe what he says when you see him do it is an insult to him. So to say when I see somebody healed or be healed myself, I will believe it, is an insult to God's word.
"Men are saved by doing exactly what the Bible says a sinner should do. Men are healed in exactly the same way. When you do exaetly what God says to do and stand firmly on It, God always does what He
agrees to do in His promises eoncerning that thing.
"When you make God as reat as He really is, as real as you really are, as real as things about you, that is real faith in a real God by a real man for a real thing; a real prayer that gets a real result. Nothing else will do. Men forget there is a real devil as well as a real God, a real Christ and a real Holy Ghost. Sick people who are prayed for according to the last chapters of James and Mark may be fmmediately tried by Satan to see if they belleve they are really healed. Often he puts back on them the very disease they Were healed of. But if they will inetantly pray God to remove the hand of Satan, or be prayed for as they were at first, God will cause him to remove his hand and the healing will come, because they are standing on God's promises for that thing.

## Faith and Works.

"No one can be healed or keep their healing merely to live a worldly, prayerless, careless, Bible-less life, doing everything that sinners do, except, perhaps, the great crimes such as murder, etc. People who-run to dances, card games, picture shows, Sunday pionics and everything the world does, cannot be healed. 'Ye cannot serve God and Mammon.' 'If any man love the world or the things of the world, the love of the Father is not in him.' 'Come out from the world, be ye separate,' safth the Lord. 'Faith without works is dead.' People who live Godly consecrated, dedtcated llves will be healed of God, and their healing will remain. People cannot eat like gluttons, bringing on all sorts of diseases, and expect to retain their healing. Eating onc-half the usual amount would effect a cure in most cases through the natural laws of God.
"When sick, pray every time, any time, and all the time, is God's command. Genesis, Exodus, Levitious and Numbers should be read to find out what the Old Testament teaches on the subject of healing for the body. The sick were always prayed for by the priests and laws of sacrifices, etc., were laid down telling what to do when sick; directions concerning these matters being scattered throughout the Pentateuch. God told men what to do when sick, and told them plainly that sin always was the cause of sickness. God declared: 'I am the Lord, thy God, Who healeth all thy diseases,' and also told them that if they sinned the diseases of Dgypt would cleave to them, and it did, and does now. Prayer to God is the only remedy needed then, or now, as James plainly states in the fifth chapter and fourteenth verse. It must always be borne in mind, however, that if we regard iniquity in the heart God will not hear us.
"It is not a question nowaday as to whether anyone is healed or not, but who healed you. God or the devil? Many people are healed rightfully through natural laws of life, such as physical culture in some of its forms, and the effect of mind over the body that brings relief from worry and fret and improper living and excesses of all kinds not conduclve to health, but isuch isms as Christian Science, Psychology, Unity, Spiritualism, New Thought, Theosophy, and many others, all of them using a few scriptural truths misapplied and deny practically the fall of man, making their particular ism the thing for man to follow and making men helieve that the Blble endorses them: these cults are not of God. The Bible offers conifort to those in despair, health, foy and rest and healing, if people would just ren? the New Testament and simply do what it says. Christian Science, especially, say a their book is the key to the Bible and insults the Holy

Spirit and the Cross of Christ, misapplying almost every statement of the Bible.

The devil himself heals people through these isms and because prople are healed now and then, they at onee say the doetrine must be right because they got healed, falling thus into the trap the devil set for the loss of thefr soul in the unorthodox ism, whieh they swallow without knowing the Bible, but accept what their ism says about the Bible. Every one of these fall at this point: they donot ask a sinner to repent of his sins, to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, confess Him before men, be baptized, partake of the Lord's Supper, and honor the death of Chirlst by whose shed blood we are saved. A Christian who is sick is asked to follow some mental tsm of thought instead of sending for the Elders to pray for them, anoint them with oll and lay on hands and the prayer of faith casting out the devils of disease according to Mark, the last chapter. Such isms are leading mitlions of peopte to hell everywhere and side-track the fact that all men are children of the devil and not children of God until they are born again by regeneration, repentatice, confcesion of sins and acceptance of the Lord Jesus Christ as their Saviour through His shed blood."

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## THE SECRET OF UNITY

Traveling over this great country, I have seen and others have observed, a growing spirit of love and charity manifested among the brethren as never before. This spirtt of forbearance and pattence was especlally evidenced at the last General Councll, and niso by the one held by our German brethren at Berlin. Scenes were enacted then as have never been known since the "Iattor Rafn" firat foll. Thie brethren were brought together and all divisions vanisied. "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unfty!!

What is the secret of unity? Before the terrible agony of Gethsemane, our blessed Savlour prayed earnectly that सhe disciples might be one even as Fe was One with the Father. This is a high standard and how are we to attain it. Just before this fervent prayer our Lord sald: "I pray not that thou stoultiest taike them out of the world, but that thau shouldest keep them from the evil into the world, even कo meve- I sent them tito the wortd." In other words, unity wilt follow aggression. Christlanity must be on the offenslve or else there will be inner corruption and division.

This was so manifested in the history of the early church. As long as it was contending with the onrushing forces of heathenfism the Clurch was kept pure and united, out as soon as it lost out in this connlet. the warfare, instead of bepug with the outstde forces of evil. whs now within the Chutch's watls. There akose terntble controverstes, such is over Aytanism. The Feumenieal Counehis called for the purpose of peane and unity, brought nothing but atstomer and afsgrace on the name of Christ, by the hatred and dissension manifested there. What was the secret of the unity among the Allies during the war? the common fot, Cctultaly, Bit is soon as the armistice was signed and Germany varguished then eame diguaion among the Allies, the various interests and aspirathons of the combatting nations began to conflict with each other, until the "Peace") conference was turned into a mere farce

Beloved, what is it that will keep us unted in thie greatest conflict in the worlats history? The fact that our all congliening Saviour is leading us on, andi the realization that our common enemy, the davil, is not dend but very much atlve f have been in many places where Pente-
cost had "gone to soed." They had been so busy "setting the other fellow right" and advaneing some pet theme or doctrine that they seamed obltytore to the fact that the Azeh Enemy was nigh, and to the awful destuuction he was causing at their very door. No wonder there was disunion and Alvision Instead of beling on the forward march, they were on the retreat and retreat always, means the scattering of the forces.

As to proving the other fellow to bo wrong, this will take care of itself as we get on the forward march,-Itvang. Erte Booth-Clibborn in "Call from the Rockies."

Springfield. Missouri. The bequest should state how the money is to be used. Every cent will be used for forelgn missions act cording to the requirements of the bequest. If it is intemded that part of the bequest should go for the expense of conducting the missionary department and handting of missionary funds, a clause should be inserted to that effect, otherwise the entive amount will go to the field as per the deamount will go to th
talls of the bequest.
