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## THE SPIRIT OF ANTICHRIST

Are the Post-Millennialists Anti-Christian?

John had a double message, that of the coming of antichrist and that of the coming of Christ. The message of that "spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world" (1 John 4:3), and the message of "the revelacion of Jesus Christ, which God gave unto him, to show unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass" (Rev. 1:1)!

The revelation of the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ synchronizes with the going forth, the unloosening, of the spirit of antichrist, denying that Christ had come in the flesh. This spirit wanted to give and did give the lie to the fact that Jesus Christ ever came in the flesh, and therefore it was a matter of impossibility for Him ever to come again in glorified flesh. "Kill the first error," the enemy says, "and you prevent a worse one."

Read Matt. 27:62-64 and 28:11-15 and see one of the first inceptions of the "That deceiver spirit of antichrist. said!" The chief priests and Pharisees said that He was a deceiver and not the Son of God. "Command therefore that the sepulchre be made sure until the third day, lest his disciples come by night, and steal him away, and say unto the people, He is risen from the dead: so the last error shall be worse than the first." They thought that they could get the people to believe that He was a deceiver, and that they could deal all right with the second matter of guarding the tomb. They did their best to prevent His resurrection, and their clumsy best to suppress the truth of the resurrection.

### Overcoming the Spirit of Error.

His enemies never saw Him after His resurrection. Spiritual eyes only saw the spiritual Christ. Christ also spoke to John in the Revelation of the things which must shortly come to pass. "Behold, He cometh with clouds: and every eye shall see Him." John also warns us of the error of a contrary spirit, an antichrist spirit, going forth, and that this error will run parallel with the truth

of the Lord's coming and the fact of His coming again. That He had never come first and therefore it is self-evident that He can never come again,—that is the message of antichrist.

Satan tries mostly, chiefly, to inculcate, to teach, that Christ has not come in the flesh, and he does not trouble about the second coming of the Lord so much. He wants them to disbelieve the first statement—that Christ has come in the flesh—rather than to believe the second, because the last "error" will be greater than the first and more terrible to contemplate.

And so he has a band of discounters or scoffers. "Where is the promise of His coming? It is the same spirit animating the priests and scoffers, and from the same master—antichrist.

But the word went forth to John that He was coming again. The truth, the statement, the fact, that He is coming, came with the Holy Ghost emphasis, "Behold, I come quickly." God's truth in the world to counteract the spirit of antichrist, denying His coming in the flesh and denying He is coming in glory!

Man's Reconstruction Programs.

There is a revival of the antichristian spirit, of materialism, of false security. Men are saying, "Where is the promise of His coming? all things continue as they were." "We are on such a solid basis; things continue and will continue. And if they show signs of weakening, we'll reinforce, we'll strengthen, and if necessary, we'll reconstruct."

God, on the other hand, is working on the hearts of His people and they are holding conferences on the Lord's coming. Literature on this subject is being poured forth from the presses. There is even controversy on the subject at the ministerial convocations. The subject is debated, and by some rejected, yet the truth is being disseminated that the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

Spiritual perception is being quickened, illumination supplied, and hope revived in the hearts of God's true children. What is it? It is the Spirit, the

Spirit in advance, heralding the coming of the Lord.

The sap rises in the trees early in the spring, even when the snow is on the ground, and some time before the bud bursts. The tree has been secretly revived before the outburst of leaf is manifested, and so God is secretly reviving His people. But the leaf will burst, the manifestation of the sons of God will take place, for the Lord will be revealed, and we shall be changed, even by the Spirit of the Lord. A change now, secret, unobserved, prior to that sudden change, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye!

The saddest part of the whole thing is that men who profess to be teachers of truth are so far led astray, have so unconsciously imbibed the spirit of the world and of antichrist, that they do not see, do not believe, and some actually preach against the coming of the Lord as recorded in the Word.

Have Any of the Rulers Believed?

It is not a question of pre or postmillennial, but a question of believing the clear statement of the Son of God, the Christ of truth, who sent and signified by His angel unto His servant John the things that were shortly coming to pass. Some are wilfully ignorant of these things, and they will be beaten with many stripes. Some will be beaten with few. It does not matter to what "school" they belong, or what they call it, they have the plain word of God, and they will be judged, condemned, and will suffer grievous loss in refusing to take heed to what is set forth and proclaimed therein.

To be a blind leader of the blind is a serious, sad, terrible condition to be in. And they boast they are in the post-millennial school or line of thought, and they boast of the intellects they have on their side.

We do not read that there were many in the days of Christ's flesh who did not consent to the counsel and deed of the rulers. The rulers and leaders

# -:- The Virtue That Heals. -:-

"And he came down with them, and stood in the plain and the company of His disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed of their diseases. they that were vexed with unclean spirits; and they were healed. And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him and healed them all" (Luke 6:17-19). When Jesus was here in the flesh walking among men, there were multitudes about Him almost all the time thronging Him. There were multitudes healed. Yet there were thousands all about Him that were sick and blind, and leprous, and halt who were not healed.

That word virtue here means power. Salt is preservative. If the salt has lost its savor of what use is it? The savor is the power in it. If it has lost its power it is good for nothing but to be cast out. How much power has the Son of God? Somebody answers, "all power." We say that, but God wants us to do more than say it. God wants us to do more than have our catechism well learned so that we can be examined and confirmed. If you ever pass the catechism before God, and you are confirmed by almighty power it is because you have the savor of the thing. Because the power is in it.

There were many lepers in the days of Elisha the prophet. That is a sad thing. God's people were lepers. God had said, "If you walk in My ways and keep My statutes I will not put any of these diseases upon you," and yet there were many lepers. Of the many lepers in the days of Elisha the prophet, none were made clean save Naaman. Only one came to be healed and he came through the faith of a little girl. She had said, "If he were with the prophet of God He would recover him of the leprosy." He said, "I will go." Only one man went to the man of God. When Jesus came down here he was in God's stead. There was power in Him. I suppose most of us believe that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and The very same almighty Christ is present with us, before us and in our midst.

"They brought unto Him many blind and He healed them." In this He fulfilled God's word to us, "Himself took our infirmities." If you insist upon holding on to them after He took them, you are robbing Him. You are not only trying to carry the burden He carried, but you rob Him of the glory. He carried your burdens in order to get glory to Himself and to God's grace. If you carry them you don't give Him any glory in the matter.

2 Cor. 1:20. "For all the promises of God in Him are yea and in Him Amen." What is yea? It is yes. All the promises are in Him "Yes." God

has already said His yes. I hear people constantly say, "I would come to God and get healed if I knew it was God's will." Christ is God's yes. Christ put to death is God's yes. Christ on the cross is God's yes. Christ risen and seated on the throne is God's yes. Praise the Lord!

Yea and Amen. Amen means "be it so." God has said it. There is an indication in the Greek that I am to say Amen to God's yes. The thing is accomplished, for God put all the promises in Christ.

I have found out from God's Word that Christ was my burden bearer, that Christ was my sin bearer, that Christ was my disease bearer. Oh, was He not that? He bore away sin and "by His stripes ye were healed." He did that thing for me and God says it is so. I come up and say "God, can you heal a man?" God says, "Yes, I put the healing in Christ for you," and I say "Amen" and the Holy Ghost executes it.

Rom. 8:11. "But if (the 'if' here means 'since') the Spirit of Him that raised up Christ from the dead dwells in you, He will also quicken your mortal body through His Spirit that dwells in you." As quick as I say "Amen" God will say to the Holy Spirit, "Do your brooding" and when the Holy Spirit brooded over this world He brought order out of chaos.

It is His health. You get this by means of the promises. God has projected Himself toward you by means of His promises, and God draws you right up into Himself, into Christ, into His fullness. It must come through Jesus. If it comes through Jesus I must somehow reach Jesus.

God expects you to get to Christ yourself. I see so many people who are impotent. I am sure that is why He gives us that picture of the impotent man to show us man's deadness. Jesus had to do this for you. He came and found you dead and He raised you up into life. He said to that impotent man, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." That impotent man represents the dead sinner. God tells us that we are to go out and lay hands on the sick and they shall recover,—unsaved people. It was only those who were not able to get to Christ, that were brought to Him.

You remember the Syrophenician woman, when she brought her request for her daughter to Jesus, and called out to Him, "Thou son of David," Jesus paid no attention to her. Again she called, "Thou son of David, have mercy on me," but Jesus just went on about His Father's business. His disciples besought Him to send her away. (They were getting to be quite a respectable company.) Jesus answered her, "You are a Gentile and I was not sent except to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." She being an outcast, and not under the Covenant, He did nothing for

her when she called Him "Son of David," for a Gentile had no claims on Him as a Son of David, but when she said, "Truth, Lord, yet the dogs eat of the crumbs that fall from their Master's table," then she got the thing her faith claimed. She had called Him "Lord," and thus took her true place, but I believe she could have gotten healing for every sick woman in Syrophenicia that day, for Jesus said to her, "Be it done unto thee even as thou wilt." That was unlimited.

John 15:7. "If ye abide in Me and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." Oh! the freedom we have if we believe that. How we could walk out with God in victory.

Jesus died for all men, but it is only those who touch Him by faith that get the salvation of God. Salvation flows from God when faith touches Christ.

John 1:4. "In Him was life and the life was the light of men." We ought to let our faith grasp what God said, "In Him is life."

John 5:26. "For as the Father hath life in Himself, so hath He given to the Son to have life in Himself." He gave Himself to me that I might have life and have it more abundantly.

Matt. 9:20. We have the account of the woman who pressed through the throng until she touched the hem of His garment, and she felt immediately that she was made whole, and Jesus turned around and said, "Who touched Me?" And Peter said, "Why, Master, you see the throng and how sayest thou who touched Me." Jesus replied, "Somebody touched Me, for virtue is gone out of Me." And the woman came and fell down at His feet. She had spent all her substance on doctors and was no better, but rather grew worse. (I don't know whether Luke was one of her physicians or not.) In that awful condition she had heard about Jesus. Jesus had probably announced in her hearing that He had come to give life and to give it more abundantly, and she had said within herself, "The next time He goes down the street I am going to touch Him, for if I can but touch the hem of His garment I shall be made whole." It was her heart that touched Him. Why? That virtue might flow

God says over and over in His Word that Jesus healed all that came to Him. She had all this throng of people around her but in spite of them all, she went through those thousands of people, worked her way up to Jesus and touched Him, for she said in her heart, "If I can but touch Him I shall be made whole." This opened the channel of blessing. The only way this channel can be opened is by getting through and touching Jesus.

Jesus said that the Father hath life and He gave the Son to have life in Himself. God put all the promises in Christ before you were born, before you ever had that bunion or boil or cancer. God put all these on Christ on the cross and accepted Christ for you, for He secured your release from all these before He

could be raised up from death, and now we declare this good news to you.

What will you do? Just take from Christ. Let your heart touch Him today. Suppose you have been healed once, but the enemy begins to attack you again, just keep the channel open that virtue may flow. Just say "Jesus" and that opens the channel. I came near having the sick headache last Wednesday, but I just said "Jesus" and that was all. It was gone. Faith touches Jesus. Faith is in your heart. She said "in her heart." When you press the electric button, is that asking the folks back in the mountains at the power house to make some electricity? Where is that electricity? It is in the wire

When your heart touches the heart of Jesus the connection is made. God says that all the promises in Him are yea and amen, to the glory of God the Father by us. We must pass through the crowd of our circumstances, weaknesses, inability, our husbands, our wives, our thoughts, everything, and touch Jesus and the mighty power of God will flow.

Some one says, "I cannot believe." Who is it you cannot believe? Do you say you cannot believe God? Is Jesus able? Is He the same yesterday, today and forever? Is He present? Is His virtue here today? How do you get that virtue to flow? Touch Him.

Many times God's servants pray for the sick and nothing is done. The sick one was looking at the servant. You must get through to God and touch Him with faith for yourself. When your faith reaches God you are healed. Are you hoping to touch Jesus today? Say yes to God and He will be glorified in His Son.—J. S. Norvall at Bethel Temple, Los Angeles.

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### GREATER THINGS.

Two people look at God's kingdom from different angles. One says: "Can God?" and the other says: "God can."

The children of Israel asked: "Can God furnish a table in the wilderness?"

Moses stood on God's side. He spake to the rock and the waters gushed forth. Paul had the same attitude. He declared: "My God shall supply all your need, according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." He knew that God could supply the need of the individual and of the church, for He had supplied Paul's own need.

These men stood on God's side and saw God's dealings with His people and with His church.

Aaron sided with the unbelief of the people. "As for this Moses, we wot not what is become of him." Aaron acquiesced in the cry: "As for this Moses!" Moses was with God, getting God's mind and seeing things from God's standpoint. Aaron was so low that he could not get higher than the top of the golden calf. Moses was so high that God had to say to him, "Get you down."

God wants people to get His viewpoint today. He can send revivals. He can send conviction on the people. He can transform blasphemers to men of prayer. God can make great merchants humble disciples and cause them to spread their wealth at the feet of the disciples.

The man of God says: "God can." God can bring Pauls out of Sauls. He can make tender nurses out of Philippian jailers. Men who have been brutes can be so transformed that they will delight to wash the stripes of God's saints.

God's people need to change their platform. Don't look at revivals from man's point of view, for if you do, you despair. Get God's point of view. Men are as grasshoppers. He holds all in the hollow of His hand and He can control and move on them as readily as He moves on the stars.

Change of platform gives change of viewpoint. It changes "Can God?" into "God can." All things are possible to him that believeth.

The Holy Ghost was sent to make men witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and the uttermost parts of the earth. When you see local revivals, think of Jerusalem and Judea, but expect revivals in the uttermost parts of the earth to be the complement. Pray for, believe for and expect God to send great revivals all over the world. God only can put you from one platform to the other.

Moses saw more of God in the desert Pharaoh's palace to Goshen to release his brother Israelites, thought he would be a deliverer. He failed, and he thought God's promise had failed. When he got on God's side and saw from God's point of view, the deliverance of the children of Israel was speedy and complete

Moses saw more of God in the desert than he did in Pharaoh's palace, more of God's majesty, purposes, and resources. He moved up on the platform of faith. And there is room on that platform for you.

#### ANOINTED EYES.

"And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do?" (2 Kings 6:16.)

There are prophet's eyes and servant's eyes. The prophet sees the immaterial, the spiritual; the servant sees only the material.

Your vision depends upon the point of vantage from which you look. The servant saw the material, the hosts and chariots, and said: "Alas, how shall we do?" He should have spoken for himself, not for both. Elisha knew what he was going to do. The prophet saw the other side, the spiritual, and he answered, "Fear not; for they that be with us are more than they that be with them." The heavenly eclipses and outclasses the earthly every time in numbers, in quality, in power and in resources.

There is a spiritual realm, but to the servant and to the ordinary being it is very remote. God has His prophets, His Word and His Spirit to try and make man see the other side, that which is apart from the material.

And Elisha prayed, and said, "Lord, I pray Thee, open his eyes, that he may see." And the Lord opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw, and, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.

The world is realizing there is something more than a material realm, and the devil is opening their eyes and they are seeing hosts, not of light but of darkness. The Spirit of God is causing the heavenly realm to be unveiled to spiritual people, and at the same time the veil is being removed from those heavenly places that are the realm and region of spiritual wickedness.

There is a great gulf fixed between the two; but the world says there is none. They mistake darkness for light because their master transforms himself into an angel of light.

God wants people with a vision, for where there is no vision the people perish. "Open their eyes," is the prayer of our heavenly Intercessor. "It shall come to pass in the last days, saith God. I will pour out of My Spirit, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men dream dreams." There is a pressure of spirits of wickedness coming down on the earth in these last days, and God wants to give revelation of spiritual forces and spiritual realities as never before. And therefore He is pouring out His Spirit and manifesting Himself upon the bodies of His saints, giving them the sign of speaking in an unknown tongue, and equipping His people as at the beginning. Bodies are worked upon by the Spirit of God and the very countenances of the saints are changed.

There is an angelic realm, a spirit realm, a realm of ministering spirits sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation. Have you recognized them? Elisha recognized them, but he did not worship them. It gave him a calmness, a sense of security, an absolute indifference to the great host of Syrians.

The least perturbed man in Dothan was the one the Syrians were after. He was surrounded by hosts, the horses and the chariots of the Syrians, but they did not disturb him at all. And his servant's eyes were opened to see the horses and chariots of fire. God wanted to teach him a lesson, to show that He had an adequate remedy, a corresponding remedy, similar weapons to those of the Syrians, only they were in the heavenly realm.

And the apostle in writing to the New Testament churches says that we have the weapons-not carnal-but spiritual, for the pulling down of the strongholds of the enemy. Take unto you the whole armor of God. Not a chariot this time. A personal equipment. The chariot of fire was the most necessary thing for that servant to see. A complete armor -material armor-for the prophet and servant would have been of little avail. God equips you and fits you with the weapon, with the armor, most suitable for your condition, your trial and your difficulty. He does not provide Saul's armor for David. David was best equipped with the shepherd clothes, the pebbles from the brook and the sling. Then after the pebble had done its work, the sword of the giant severed his own head.

God can make the wrath of man to praise Him. The very weapons of hell will come back upon themselves. Judas' biggest blunder was when he betrayed Christ. Satan overstepped himself. For they "overcame him — Satan—by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony."

They that be for us are more—yea innumerably more—than they that be against us. The trouble is that the eyes are closed. Let this be your prayer, "Open Thou our eyes that we may see wondrous things out of Thy law and out of Thy heavens!"

# The Faith of Abel or Works of Cain.

What Are We Presenting to God?

"Self likes to be served. Love delights to serve. So we in Christ, whilst we are on earth now. When we are in glory, He girds Himself and serves us."

Redeemed first, washed first, joined first to the High Priest, is the order of God. Work first, service first, redemption and forgiveness the uncertain attainment at last, is the order of man.

Is it not a strange feature of modern Christianity that, more than ever, service rendered by man to man, apart from faith in Christ, work, the result of simple, natural kindness, is supposed to give to him who performs it the claim to be a Christian?

"We shall not be asked," said one, "what we have believed, but how many cups of cold water we have given."

Do we want peace? God has said Christ made peace through the blood of His Cross. Man has said, let us daily collect the ingredients for making our peace, self-denial, consideration for others, unselfishness, and then we may reasonably expect to have peace at last. One, indeed, has said that as we collect the ingredients for making a cake, and finally have the cake, so finally may we have peace, if we thus provide the materials for it.

Is this "unselfish service," then, after all, the means to an end, and that end our own happiness and self-satisfaction? We reckon up our cups of cold water to our own credit—they are to us as the blood on the lintel, which, when the Lord saw, He passed over the guilty house.

Is this our Christianity? Let us, then, plainly and deliberately take our stand upon our own righteousness, and not only base our claim for happiness upon our own good deeds, but understand that they weigh down the scales against false beliefs, against the making God a liar, against unbelief in the record He has given of His Son. Let us assure ourselves that "we shall not be asked" whether we have believed in Christ, or in Mahomet, or in nothing-whether we call truth falsehood, or falsehood truth. Let us persuade ourselves that we fairly come up to the standard by which we measure the character of Christ, and that thus being, as we say, "Christ-like," we are Christians.

Does a Mahometan, then, mean a man whose character resembles that of Mahomet? Or is a Mahometan a man who believes what Mahomet said?

How truly has it been said, "I have not peace in anything in which I take a part, but I have peace in that which Christ acted alone. Man's part in the work which made peace was only stretching out the sinful hands that crucified Him. This is all man had to do with it. Is it, I ask, by any act to be done now that peace is obtained? No, it is simply by the blood that has been shed—the putting away of sin by the sacrifice of Himself." This, and this

alone, can give peace to the soul, through faith in Him—through faith in His blood. "We which have believed do enter into rest," and "he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from His." "There remaineth, therefore, a Sabbath-keeping to the people of God." (Heb. 4:3-9).

How solemn are those words of God, "Without faith it is impossible to please Him." "That which is born of the flesh is flesh," and "they that are in the flesh cannot please God," for "the minding of the flesh is enmity against God—it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be."

But some will say, "We know, of course, that a man must have faith, but he must have works also if he is to be saved." And thus it is related with approval of an old ferryman that in order to illustrate this theory he painted "Faith" upon one of his oars and "Works" on the other. "By using one oar," he said, "I should never get across, but I use both."

When Cain brought an offering to the Lord, he, too, believed he was using both. And he who would paint "Faith" on both oars is rarely found. Yet only so does the boat reach the further shore, and the movement, answering to works, proves the power of the faith that is their cause. And if faith is not their cause and main-spring, the work is amongst those things "highly esteemed among men, but abomination in the sight of God."

Why are works insisted on by the apostle James? Because a proof is needed that a man has faith. vious that any work a man may do, however good in itself, is not a proof of faith if it could be done by a man who has none. An action which could be performed by a heathen cannot be proof that a man is a Christian. Therefore the two examples of good works given by the apostle James are works which have no merit, and, in fact, no justification, except that they were proofs that the man and woman who performed them believed God. A man took a knife to slay his son-a woman betrayed her country to invaders.

And for works performed by faith God gives a sure reward—not because it is due, but because He loves to acknowledge the faith that was the root from whence the fruit sprang. "Shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works." The faith is that which has to be proved. And faith works by love—love to Him that is the object of faith. For he who believes has everlasting life, and fruit will grow upon the living tree—fruit well pleasing to God, because the life of Christ in the soul has brought it forth, and the object of the work of faith is also Christ.

But would it not be well to seek to enlist the selfish, the worldly, the idle, in Christian work, so that they themselves may be the better for this? We little know our own hearts if we have not found out that it is our nature to attach a value to our own deeds, and that to our natural hearts our Sunday School classes, our visits to the poor and sick, our time spent in doing that which we dislike for the good of others, are all counted up to our own credit in our own balance sheets, and the more we find to our balance the farther are we from Christ. That which the apostle Paul reckoned as dung was not his own wickedness, but his own righteousness. may labor on, till at last we reach the point of saying, "I am rich and increased with goods, and have need of nothing," and Christ answers, "Thou knowest not that thou are wretched and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked."

But the work done because we are not our own, but are bought with a price -the work, therefore, for which we can have no credit, though the Lord in grace gives a reward, is not our work, but the work of Him who worketh in us to will and to do of His good pleasure. Because it is not our own work, but from the beginning to the end His and His only, it can never add to the treasure of our own self righteousness; we know that our share in it are the blunders,, the imperfections, the carelessness, the lukewarmness. All that had a value in it is His work, and not ours .- Frances Bevan in The Last Parable of Ezekiel.

#### ARE YOU ON THE RIGHT TRAIN?

While holding special services up in Hornell, N. Y., last winter, one of the brethren, by following wrong directions, got on the wrong train and started in the wrong direction.

As soon as the train started he noticed his mistake, and immediately ran to the door and jumped off. It happened that there were two trains backed up close to one another, both going in opposite directions. In his hurry, he got on the wrong one. It was a good thing he got off, for he had a preaching appointment that day about 30 miles away.

There are two trains on the road of life and they are going in opposite directions. One is bound for heaven, and the other for hell. Which train are you on? If you are in the wrong train, jump off as quickly as you can. "Let the wicked forsake his way." The heaven-bound train has been provided, and Jesus has paid your fare, and He will undertake to see you safely Home. There is a deliverance from your present course through the all-availing, all-prevailing blood of Christ.

The devil does his best to call the saints of God on to the wrong train. He wants to get them back into the world again. It is best not to get on the wrong train, but if you find yourself going the wrong way, be quick and get off and get on the right one again. The same precious blood avails to cleanse, as you confess your error (Isa. 54:7).—H. W. Thomas.

### A SONG OF FAITH.

The Book of Psalms is filled with songs of faith and songs that inspire faith. Many a time when faith is running low have we resorted to this inspired hymnal and gotten a fresh touch from the Lord. "Take heed," Hudson Taylor used to warn, "lest you get your spiritual constitution destroyed by feeding on the imaginations of men rather than on the verities of God." Let us look for a few moments at God's verities in Psalm 27.

The Lord is my light and my salvation. We are grateful that we are entitled to more light than can be gotten from preacher, or assembly, or book, or human helper. Each one of us can have the Lord Himself as our Illumination. His Presence dispels all darkness and will keep darkness away.

We are also grateful that we can have a salvation bigger than our experience. That experience gotten ten, twenty, thirty or forty years ago was all right in its way, but David had something better-the Lord Himself as his salvation. One work or two works of grace that many people talk about may be all right, but your salvation is bigger than thatthe Lord Himself your salvation. The marginal version of Psalm 43:5 expresses this same thought, "His presence is salvation." We may argue and divide about our experiences and as to how many we ought to secure, but we can absolutely unite about our salvation when we recognize that it is nothing less than the Lord Himself. His Spirit will bear witness with our spirit that we are the sons of God. To as many as receive Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God.

And since He is our salvation, we have nothing to fear. For there shall no evil happen to the just (Prov. 12:21), and since He Himself has justified us we need fear no evil from any source.

One thing. We make many requests, but David's desires are here summed up in one. So were Paul's. "This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind . . . I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." His goal was God Himself. Have you but one desire? We heard a preacher say that he would like to see Christian folks have blinkers on them like horses, they are so inclined to have their eyes this way and that way and to desire everything they see.

Jesus told Martha, "But one thing is needed." What is that one thing? To dwell in the presence of the Lord. To rest under the shadow of the Almighty. Not for a little while, but always—all the days of my life. The branch abiding uninterruptedly in the Vine. When waiting on the Lord recently the Spirit said: "O seek ye His Presence in preference, in preference to the face and the presence of each other."

The one who learns the lesson of being the best Mary, taking time to sit at the feet of the Master, will become the best Martha, for you will serve all the

better for having been in the Presence of Jehovah's ideal Servant.

But what is back of this desire, David? Why do you want to dwell in heavenly places? His answer is, "To behold the loveliness of the Lord" (v. 4 Leeser). There is something so transcendently lovely about our Jesus that we need to be continually contemplating, looking unto, beholding, considering Him. What effect will it have on us? We shall be changed into His likeness from glory to glory even by the Spirit of the Lord. We shall become like Him!

Sitting at His feet is the place to learn As we enquire of Him, He will teach us all He desires us to know. "For the Lord giveth wisdom: out of His mouth cometh knowledge and understanding." In the Hebrew version the thought is here expressed of being "every morning early in His Temple." Ask the Lord to waken you of a morning and fulfil to you that promise of Isaiah 50:4, "He wakeneth morning by morning, He wakeneth my ear to listen like those who are well taught." We know of nothing more refreshing and more spiritually-renewing than to spend an hour or two in the presence of the Lord before seeing the face of man. I know that these are busy days for most of us, but I would lovingly suggest that the hour or two that is frequently given to extra sleep on Sunday morning should be given to definite waiting upon God.

What is the result of this season of beholding the beauty of the Lord and enquiring in His Temple? Sacrifices of joy—or shouting. Songs of praises! Praises will bubble up spontaneously like the springs in the hills.

We needs must live in the presence of the Lord if we would have Him guide us with His counsel. The literal translation of verse 11 is "Point me out thy way O Lord and guide me on a level path, because of those who regard me enviously." He always leads in the right way, in the paths of righteousness, and when you run the way of His revealed will, you can afford to ignore all the criticisms of the envious.

The words, "I had fainted" at the beginning of v. 13 are in italics, and are therefore not in the original. The Hebrew version reads, "Unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of life—" What a world of expression is in that dash at the end of the sentence. Without faith—we might well faint. Without faith, it is impossible to please God. But diligent hearkening to the word of the Lord will cause faith to spring up in our hearts, a faith that will please Him, and make us like David—a man after God's own heart.

Wait on the Lord. "All our troubles," says Andrew Murray, "come from our not waiting on the Lord." What was the cause of Israel's troubles? "They waited not for His counsel" (Psa. 106: 13). What happens when we wait on Him? "They that wait upon the Lord shall change their strength" (Isa. 40: 31 m.). Divine strength for human! "He giveth to the faint strength; and to the powerless he imparteth much

might (Isa. 40:29 Leeser). We know of one brother who was healed of heart trouble by obeying this verse in Psalm 27. He expected God to strengthen his heart as he waited on Him, and He did.

Wait I say upon the Lord. O that we had a clarion voice that we could reiterate this oft-repeated scriptural injunction to every child of God. It means everything to us. The wastage is so great that we need continuous divine renewings, and this is the only way of receiving them.

The soul who waits on God can never be disturbed about anything. He knows that God is working every thing together for his good, and consequently his heart reverberates continually with the praise begotten by a peace that nothing on earth can ever destroy.

Waiting on God is the one way of being delivered from the counsels of our frequently self-deceived hearts, and as we, in these waiting seasons, hearken to the Lord and learn to walk only in His ways, He will indeed feed us with the finest of the wheat and satisfy us with honey out of the rock.

# Envy the Root of Opposition to Pentecost.

There is a wonderful power in the speaking in tongues under the power of the Spirit of God. "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men but unto God; . . . in the spirit he speaketh mysteries." A close intimacy, a deep fellowship, a wondrous communion, is established between the creature and the Creator. It is a means of building up the saint and of keeping off the enemy, and it is a mighty weapon that God puts in the hands of His people.

God loves to be gracious, but His infinite grace in pouring out His Spirit according to His promise in Joel at this present time is misunderstood and not appreciated by the many.

This spirit of opposition to the ways of God is not new—it is as old as Cain. But God does not consult the prejudiced when He is about to do a new thing. The opposition of those who are not one with Him does not hurt His kingdom. He can go further afield to get His overcomers. He has plenty of centers He can recruit from. There is no forced service in His kingdom.

#### Critics of the Father's Action.

Sometimes the Father does come out and entreat the elder brother, but not always. The immaculate one ignored! The profligate honored! That is the view of the elder brother. His mantle has fallen upon a great many others since.

And the merriment inside the house did not depend on the elder brother. They did not miss him. Things went on swimmingly without him. And that added fuel to the fire.

Let them alone. God's plans are infinitely wider than man's pettiness.

#### A HOLY LIFE.

Madam Adorna had a remarkably clear perception of God, not merely as benevolent or good in Himself, but also as the fountain or source of all goodness. "My mind ran back," she remarks, in one of her conversations, "to that distant period when God may be supposed to have existed alone, without any other being, either men or angels, to participate in His existence. It was then that the mighty principle of holy love, which constitutes the basis of His moral nature, began to manifest itself in the developments and facts of creation; in bright worlds, scattered abroad in the infinity of space, and fitted up for the residence of pure, happy beings.

"And then I seemed to see the same principle of holy love, whose nature it is to be happy in the happiness of others, operating in the creation of intelligent and sentient beings; beings that were made not merely to dwell in the worlds which were created, but to be the receptacles, as it were, and the reflex images, of that truth, purity, and goodness, which overflowed in the original foun-It was then that God created the beautiful company of angels. He did not make them for toil or for suffering, but merely to perceive and enjoy. He asked of them no other thing than that they should rejoice in Him, and rejoice in His works; and should acknowledge their dependence upon Him in all things. And then, in the process of the mighty development of the divine goodness, men were made, inferior in rank, it is true, but still immortal in their nature; and made also in the same condition of original and continued dependence and with the same privilege, the highest which can be accorded to any being, of enjoying God in all things, and all things in God."

'And we may very properly add here, how reasonable was this condition of their enjoyment of the Divine favor, viz., that for the reception of the Divine benefits, they should merely acknowledge their entire and continued dependence, and be willing to derive all things from Him, who is the true source of life. God, in the exercise of His supremacy, could not require less. The moment that the fallen angels undertook to withdraw themselves from this state of dependence, and to operate in their own way, and in their own strength, in themselves and out of God, they lost all. When they set up for themselves, and withdrew themselves from God, it was a matter of necessity that He should withdraw Himself from them; the life of self took the place of the life of love, and they became evil and infernal, to an extent which the human mind, even illuminated minds, cannot well conceive. And the result will always be the same, when the same course is taken; and we may add, that there can be no more real or terrible hell than to be left of God.

"Let none be astonished at what I say," she remarks in connection with

the views which have just been expressed, "when I assert that it is impossible for me to live with myself. It is necessary for me, however singular the experience may appear, to live separate from the self of me; that is to say, that it is necessary for me to live a life without any self-originated movement, either of the understanding, affections, or will. This is what I must be; and this, by the grace of God, is what I hope I am. If I walk, or talk, or stop, or sleep, or eat, or do anything else, I cannot feel that I do these things, so far as they are voluntary, from a merely human or selfish motive. A regard for God, in distinction from self, has become so incorporated with the inward

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nature, as to be a ruling motive in the most ordinary things. If it were otherwise it would fill me with the greatest sadness."

"By a process of inward crucifixion. so far as I can judge in the case, the natural inclinations, both of mind and of body (that is to say, the natural inclinations, so far as their action originates from the natural, in distinction from the spiritual life), have been gradually consumed within me. My own experience has taught me, quite apart from the doctrine of Scripture on the subject, that it is necessary, indispensably necessary, to undergo this process. terrible to nature as it often is. Such is the malignity of nature that it must be destroyed; and such is the strength of nature, so deeply and strongly is it rooted, that nothing but God's goodness, operating in His own way and means. can destroy it. If God should not see fit to destroy it, and inplant in its stead a new spiritual life in union with Himself, the principles of self would not only continue to dwell in the human bosom, but would reign, and would ultimately develop there all the passions and miseries of a Satanic mind. Against this terrible evil God alone can effectually help us; and He is both able and willing to do it."

It was one of her maxims, in connection with her general doctrine of inward crucifixion, that even good actions, such as reading religious books, attending on religious services, and giving alms to the poor, are of no spiritual value, unless they are spiritually or graciously originated; that is to say, they are of no value in the sight of God, unless they come from God. But this is not all. She regarded them as coming from God, which is the important thing, only when they are inspired and prompted by a motive, which not only contemplates the doing of good to the subject of them, but which involves the vastly higher consideration of a supreme regard to God's will and glory. In other words, nothing can be spiritually valuable, however amiable it may be, and however it may subserve the claims of propriety and humanity, which is not done in God and for God.

conspired to put Christ to death, and the rulers and religious leaders today conspire to put away, to put off, His personal return and glorification.

They are taking from the Word when they are warned not to take from the Word. Thus saith the Lord, "And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life." The Revelation starts with a statement that Christ is coming, and that these things are shortly to come to pass, and closes with a statement that He is coming quickly; therefore they are without excuse.

There is time to repent and seek forgiveness and to proclaim the evangel in its fulness and completeness.



1082. In Rom. 7:14, 24-25 was Paul speaking of his present condition, or of his condition under the law?

Of his condition under the law. His present condition under grace and filled with and led by the Spirit of God is described in Rom. 8:1-14.

1083. Please explain Rev. 17:10-11-12.

The woman or whore in this chapter is apostate Christendom; and the beast she was riding is the political world power that will for awhile support and enrich her. This woman had 7 heads, which are seven mountains or kingdoms with their seven kings. Five of these kings had already been and were fallen, and the sixth one was reigning, and the seventh one was yet to come. The political beast which she rode and who is to head up the world power in the last days, especially to represent the old Roman empire, is to follow after the 7th. which had not yet come and to be of the same origin as the two who had preceded him. The woman also had ten horns, which are the last ten kings who are to reign with the great Antichrist beast for one hour, or a very short time. They will be mere puppets who do only what the great world ruler or Antichrist of their time, of the last days, wants them to do. He will be the real ruler. All these in the end will join this ruler in destroying the ecclesiastical whore, the dead apostate church of that day, so that there will be no power left to restrain the beast who will both usurp the place and power of the church and the place of God and demand the world worship him as God.

1084. A Cambellite preacher recently declared in his sermon that there was no command in the Bible for us to be baptized with the Holy Ghost. Was he correct in his statement?

Even if the man should be technically correct, the conclusion which was evidently sought in the minds of his hearers is totally false. There are many things that scripture teaches us are right and are our duty, and yet there is no explicit command in so many words and under the form of a commana that we must do these things. The Baptism with the Spirit is promised to all believers, and this fact is clearly made known in every one of the four Gospels. God clearly shows it to be His will. One cannot excuse themselves when a thing is clearly set forth as the will of God by mere technical claim that God has nowhere especially commanded this thing. Then, there are other words that are often equivalent to the ones which people are quibbling over, and when this is the case we are in duty bound to obey and not seek to get out of our duty by some technicality. For

instance, I do not know of any passage that says "Be ye baptized with the Holy Ghost." But He does say "Tarry ye until ye be endued with power from on high." Here is a command to tarry for the power, and the power comes by the Baptism with the Holy Ghost. Hence we are under just as much obligation to tarry until we get the power as if God had said "Be baptized with the Holy Ghost." In Luke 11:13 we are taught to ask our heavenly Father and that He will give us the Holy Spirit. Now this asking for the Holy Spirit is the equivalent of asking for the Baptism. Jesus commanded the disciples in Acts 1:4, 5 to wait for the promise of the Father, and explained this as the Baptism with the Holy Ghost. Now, here is an explicit command. The actual word "commanded" is used, and while the first verse shows the command is to wait for the promise of the Father, yet one who is technical and does not really want to obey God might say that He did not command them to wait for the Baptism with the Holy Ghost. Yet all this would be wide of the mark, and no honest Christian who wants to obey God should be found guilty of trying to evade the plain sense of the passage when the very next verse explains the reason for the command is that they are to be baptized with the Holy Ghost. So we might increase Bible teaching on this line, but this should be sufficient.

1085. If children are born totally deprayed, what is the answer to Rom. 5:14, "Death reigned over them that had not sinned"?

You have not quoted enough of the verse. The idea is not that some have not sinned, but that some have not sinned after the same fashion that Adam sinned. Verse 12 clearly declares that "all have sinned," but this does not mean that they have all transgressed after the similitude or likeness of Adam's transgression. It simply means that sin is universal in human nature, and that physical death, which is also universal, is the consequence of this universal sin in human nature, and not the consequence of personal guilt.

1086. Where there is no pastor of an assembly, to whom should the tithes be given?

In such cases the tithes should be sent to the headquarters of the church or denomination to which you belong. They can go for the support of the work in general, and to home and foreign missions. One should by all means do something to spread the faith in which he believes, and to make Jesus Christ known to a lost world.

1087. Is it right for baptized saints to marry those who believe in other churches or not?

One thing that God specifies is that believers should not be married to unbelievers. I never feel like insisting on more than this. But experience is a valuable teacher, and there are thousands of professors of religion that it would be utterly foolish and unwise to link up with. Actual investigation of family life has shown that the more complete unity there is between a man and his wife in their faith the greater happiness they have, and the better the results are in their family life and upon their children in turning to the Lord. History shows that the best results are obtained where both parties belong to the same church, and believe in the same doctrine, and advocate the same things.

If you have the Baptism and are going to live true to God in this experience, and your companion does not have this, and does not believe in it, this will bring a cross between you at once. In most cases such crosses grow bigger as the years go by, and the two get farther and farther apart. They both become unhappy. The children see that father and mother do not agree, and they often do not know which is right, and the result is that they many times turn to infidelity. Better seek one of the same faith with yourself. While we cannot lay it down as an absolute law yet as a general rule there will be more harmony if Methodists, marry Methodists, and Baptists marry Baptists, and Presbyterians marry Presbyterians, and Baptized saints marry Baptized saints.

1088. How did the devil tempt our Lord, was it in the Spirit or literally, as recorded in Luke 4:3-10?

I believe the devil actually did the things literally that are described in this passage. Of course back of the literal fact were the spiritual powers of darkness engaged in a mighty effort to lead the Son of God in some rash act, some unbelief in the goodness of God, or to make some short cut to the kingdom. Any of these things would have put Jesus off Bible grounds. Thank God, Jesus stayed on the solid foundation of right principles and right relations to God the Father. Satan knows how to quote scripture as well as any preacher, but he always makes a wrong application of it. Today he catches many people in the same ways in which he failed on Jesus

The first word the dumb were taught to speak, after their lips were opened, was always the precious name of Jesus. deaf and dumb boys in one family were healed by the same Jesus of Nazareth, who cast out the spirits by His word in the days of old. They stood, as though in a trance for a few moments after their ears were opened, looking first at the great pipes of the Municipal organ, listening as the welling notes of a hymn of praise rolled forth, and then at their mother who stood with hands lifted high above her head, shouting praises to the Lord for their deliverance.

Several lame children left braces and crutches behind, and walked off, straight as reeds. Spines were made to straighten even as we beheld.

One little girl, of about twelve years of age, whose parents had been too poor to bring her, was sent for by a kind friend, who paid all the expenses. The child was deaf and dumb through scarlet fever, contracted in infancy. The Lord instantly healed her, opening her ears and lips so The Lord instantly that she spake and heard clearly. It took three men to get me home, three strong men to take me up to my rooms. Neighbor ladies came in, and took charge of me, as I am all alone; mother, husband, brothers, and sisters have gone home to glory.

I refused to call a doctor. Two days later I was swollen all over, stiff and red as a flame, hot as fire. My tongue cleaved to the roof of my mouth; my lips cleaved to my teeth. When I wanted to speak, some one had to wet my lips and give me a drink of water. For seventy-two hours I lived on one orange and water. God held His merciful hand on my heart and brain. He did not allow old Satan to have right of way there. A doctor was called in, as the neighbors were afraid of the law in case of death, but they instructed him not to call unless he was called by 'phone.

Two weeks passed. Brother Moe, a man who has great faith in God, came and prayed. As he prayed, I had a vision of two feet, about two inches apart, and flames coming up all around them. The flames were not red, but white as vapor; and alongside of the right foot, I saw a large letter A in gold about three inches high; next to it, and the same size, R-I-S-E. I knew what that meant. While the brother was still praying, I said to the girl at my bed, "Kate, get my clothes." "Why, you're not going to get up?" "Yes, get my clothes." She got them. I said, "Now Lord, when you deliver me so I can reach back and fasten my clothes, I will shout and praise you. You will never hear the end of it." So I watched God, and God watched One evening getting ready to go to the mission, I found myself reaching back and fastening my skirt. Oh, glory to God! I shout? Did I praise God? Every one in the mission joined with me in praising Him.

Now, dear reader, I have never broken my promise to God, to witness for Him. I went to the druggist. He looked at me in surprise, and in a loud voice said, "How well you look!" Then I reached out my left hand to him. "What? What medicine healed you?" Ah, now came the test to witness for God. I said, "I'm sorry I can't give you the praise for my healing,"

and, pointing my finger to Heaven, I said, "God healed me and He gets all the glory."
"Well, you certainly look fine, and the healing of that hand and arm certainly is a miracle."

#### THE SO-CALLED "SECRET BRIDE" TEACHING.

About two years ago we learned that there was considerable confusion over a teaching going the rounds in India which was said to be conducive to immorality. This teaching was termed the "Secret Bride" teaching. There was so much suspicion and so many were accused of holding views concerning the Bride of Christ which were contrary to sound doctrine, that it was finally decided a statement should be drawn up for the signature of all the missionaries in India, clearly setting forth our views of what the Scriptures teach us concerning the Bride of Christ. This statement was drawn up by the missionaries attending the Council last year in Springfield, signed by each one present and sent to the field for the signatures of all concerned. It was felt that as this statement was to be purlished it would have a tendency to clarify the minds of all the missionaries concerning the attitude of all other missionaries on this vital matter and thus break up suspicion and restore confidence all around. This effect has already been realized. As the paper went the rounds and missionary after missionary added his or her name, suspicion was lifted and confidence in one another was restored.

Only two members of the Council refused to sign the paper. One of these stated that she certainly did believe in a definite experience of union with the Lord, following the experience of the baptism in the Holy Spirit, and that the outcome of this experience leads to an ever deepening separation unto God, an ever deepening holiness unto God, and an ever increasing knowledge of the love of God.

The second missionary who refused to sign the statement wrote a letter of explanation as follows:

"I feel strangely withheld from adding my name. Last year, in reply to a letter from Mr. Harvey, as the Secretary of the North India Conference, I put myself strongly on record as not having and not having had anything to do with the so-called "Bride Teaching" as condemned by all right-thinking missionaries. I went so far as to say that if I should feel to take up any of the "Strange Teachings" of the day I would feel in honor bound to communicate the fact to the Secretary of the Assemblies in America. At present I abide by the Articles of Faith as set forth by the Assemblies (General Council)."

Following is the statement drawn up and signed by the Missionaries of India.

#### Statement.

We, the undersigned missionaries from We, the undersigned missionaries from India and prospective missionaries to India, in attendance at the Fifth Annual Missionary Conference and the Eighth General Council of the Assemblies of God, have met together in special conference with the Missionary Secretary-Treasurer, Brother J. Roswell Flower, concerning certain alleged false teachings which have emanated from India. emanated from India.

Not only have certain rumors come direct from the field to the officials of the General Council, but we missionaries, while General Council, but we missionaries, while going from place to place, have met a wide-spread suspicion on the part of the home constituency toward the Pentecostal missionaries of India, which implicates the whole missionary body of India as being tainted with a so-called "Secret Bride" teaching or otherwise known as "Secret union with Christ" or "Ishi experience." In the first place, we feel there is a most beautiful teaching in the Word of God as to the Bride of Christ. There are only a few scriptures that directly men-

Fourth. We do not believe that we have as yet apprehended all for which we have been apprehended by Christ Jesus. The scriptures clearly teach that there are degrees of position in the body of Christ which shall be revealed at the resurrection (1 Cor. 12:14-18; 1 Cor. 15:40-42). We do not find in the Word of God the description of any spiritual experience that gives tion of any spiritual experience that gives us a definite knowledge of our position in us a definite knowledge of our position in Christ, and when such knowledge is claimed to have been revealed by the Spirit, it is our belief that such a claim is conducive to spiritual pride and the development of schism in the body of Christ. We most positively do not approve of any teaching concerning the Bride of Christ which is not clearly set forth in the scrittures

Dear friend, please remember the sad condition of the girls and women of this land, specially those who live in homes of seclusion, which is just another name for prison. Oftentimes they long for liberty and were it not for their little ones about

and were it not for their little ones about them, would find life unbearable. Such a mother, looking on her little girls, knows that a similar fate awaits them also.

Before I went on furlough I visited in one of these Zenana homes and it was not long before God touched the heart of the little woman and she said, I believe all you are telling me and I think it wonderful.' Since returning to India, we visited her and she tells us that when she prayed, great peace came into her heart. She then asked us to sing some songs about Jesus and His love. It would have made your heart glad as it did mine could you have seen her happy face as she talked about Jesus. I love to visit these women."

Bro. B. S. Moore is still a missionary to Japan, although he is now in the homeland. He writes from Vancouver, "We have no chance to rest as there is so much need. We are helping the Japanese here, visiting among the unsaved, and some are seeking God. We want to hold special services for them. #### THE GIRLS' SCHOOL PROGRESSING

The missionaries in India are in dead arnest in their desire to have schools for earnest in their desire to have schools for the Indian children, where the children can be brought up under Pentecostal in-fluence and trained for workers for the Lord to fill places of trust in the future. They are so in earnest that out of the small pittance which they have been re-ceiving from America during the past few months, they have given in tithes and of-ferings the sum of one thousand rupees (about \$300) towards the first school. They are concentrating on a school for

(about \$390) towards the first school. They are concentrating on a school for girls first, and when that is established, they will undertake schools for boys. They have purposed to give and pray until this school is a reality.

Brother Paul Anderson writes concerning these schools:

"One of the GREATEST problems that a Missionery has to face is "Children"—the

"One of the GREATEST problems that a Missionary has to face is "Children"—the children of today, who will be the men and women of tomorrow; the Indian Christian's children; the Christian Worker's children; the orphan children, as well as many other children entrusted to our care. We have long felt the need of proper schools for these children, not merely for the sake of their education, but more that they might be brought up in the fear of they might be brought up in the fear of the Lord, with their lives founded upon the mighty truths of His precious Word, for which we as Pentecostal people strong-

the mighty truths of His precious Word, for which we as Pentecostal people strongly stand.

"This great need is not met in the various denominational schools, in which we at present are obliged to keep our children. In most of these schools, if not in all, a spirit of worldliness is prevailing, and as a rule, a spirit greatly opposed and antagonistic to Pentecost. The results of sending the children to such schools are plainly seen. On leaving school they have to unlearn a lot of things they have learned before they are of any use to us whatsoever. Thus much time, labor and money is lost to the missionary and his work, while the children also have to go through many things which they might have been spared could we provide for them as we desire, and as we feel God would have us provide for them.

"Our present aim is sufficient means with which to build one most urgently needed Pentecostal Girl's School by the time of our Conference in February, 1922, should the Lord tarry. The immediate cost of such a school, including fand, providing teachers and room for at least one hundred girls to begin with, is estimated

viding teachers and room for at least one hundred girls to begin with, is estimated to be about \$7,000.00. We urge that no regular missionary offerings be used for this purpose.
