IS YOUR HEART RIGHT IN THE SIGHT OF GOD?

Elder Hugh Cadwalder, Chairman of the General Council in Canada

Brother Cadwalder, whose sermon is reported below, asks our prayers as he sails for Egypt for special Council work. His address during the text eight weeks will be Care of Pastor Doney, Shubra, Carro, Egypt.

"Then Philip went down to the city of Samaria,

and preached Christ unto them" (Acts 8:5).

I am glad that God has never commissioned or asked anybody to preach anything else but Jesus. am glad that that is all that is necessary to preach to a lost, dying world. The Lord Jesus Christ is our only hope, but He is all-sufficient. He is all that we need. I'm glad that Jesus is in the lifting business. It does not matter what condition the heart may be in, if the Lord Jesus undertakes the job He is going to complete it before He leaves it.

So when Philip went down to the city of Samaria he preached Jesus Christ. There was something very peculiar took place. There was a man there exercising preternatural power and doing great wonders. The people had looked on him as a great man of God. But none of the outward demonstrations wrought by that man had ever moved them to seek the face of God or called them to repentance. Nor had these outward demonstrations caused one man to go down and be baptized as a testimony that he had died to sin and the world and had taken on the Lord Jesus Christ. But the moment Philip began to preach Christ, something took place. I want to tell you that if you will preach Jesus there is going to be something take place in the hearts of the people. They are going to fall in line with the will of God. Sorcery never moved the people to seek God, but the moment they heard about Jesus something happened. They were so tired of sin, and they loathed it so, they wanted to get washed

When the Lord Jesus comes into your heart one of the first things you want to do is, forget the past with all its uncleanness. And when you do that you want to get far away from your sins; you want to go down to the creek and be buried and let the new man

When Philip began to preach Christ to them it had a peculiar effect on them. There was something about Samaria that I like. Somehow or other I wish God would give me one or two more opportunities of getting into a community like Samaria. Because when Philip came and preached Jesus Christ they all with one accord gave heed to the things he told them. I have been in places where lots of people have given heed, but have never been in a place where they all gave heed. It must have been a glorious feeling. They gave heed and repented of their sins and got converted and baptized.

The news spread and first thing we know it had reached headquarters at Springfield—no, Jerusalem. Something had to be done. That young fellow Philip, who was nothing but a deacon anyhow, had not had much experience, and they thought they ought to send somebody down. There was a reason for it. I am glad that we have this really peculiar experience and record, that as soon as the disciples heard that Samaria had received the Word, had been convicted of their sins and been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, there was a mighty stir and they felt something ought to be done about it; with the result that these people all received the Holy Ghost.

Not long ago I was in the presence of a man who said, "I do not intend to preach the Baptism of the Holy Ghost the first time I go to a place. preach salvation and get their confidence and friendship, then six months later I will go back to preach the Baptism in the Spirit to them. By that time they will have enough experience to understand, and I will be able to land them right into it." But the apostles had a different idea about the matter. They thought that while their hearts were in white-heated love, it was the time. I am glad they were working in cooperation enough to agree together to go down to Samaria.

Some people might say, "The work going on down there is good enough, leave it alone. People are getting saved and healed, and devils are cast out, and wonderful signs are wrought, let it alone." It does look as though it was a waste of time and money for Peter and John to go down to Samaria to get folks to accept something more. But the apostles had just come off the altar. Just a short while previous to this they had received the Holy Ghost themselves and knew what regeneration was and what a glorious experience this Baptism in the Holy Ghost was. And they wanted others to receive the same blessing. And if Peter and John and James and all the other apostles at headquarters felt that way about it, I don't think I am such a criminal if I feel that way about it,

I notice that there was something out of the ordinary when they received the Holy Ghost. Previous to this there had been devils cast out, the palsied and the lame were healed, and there was great joy in that city. But it was something exceeding the casting out of devils, exceeding the healing of cripples, that stirred the hearts of everyone, even old Simon the sorcerer. This was the reception of the Holy Ghost. I remember going into a Pentecostal meeting where there was a man possessed with a devil. The evil spirits were cast out of him and it is very vividly fixed on my mind how he screamed. Yet, all alone on the prairie, just kneeling down in the presence of God, the precious Holy Spirit came into my heart. It far exceeded anything I had ever had before. If you enjoy the clear, distinct experience of salvation, God wants to give you the Baptism in the Spirit, too.

Up until the time that the people received the Baptism in the Spirit, Simon had been able to get by. He came along and said he believed (and the Bible says he believed) and wanted to be baptized, and he was baptized. There is nothing bad about a man's record that says he believes the preaching of the Lord Jesus Christ and is willing to be baptized and tell the world that he believes. But everybody that says he believes, and does believe, is not always right in the sight of God. The devils also believe, and tremble. It takes more than just ordinary preaching to stir up a man who will go as far as to declare that he believes and will be baptized. But as soon as Peter and John came and they received the Holy Ghost, Simon was exposed.

The Holy Ghost certainly does expose a man. If your life and heart is not right in the sight of God and you don't want it to be, you had better stay away from a Pentecostal meeting. If there was anything down in my heart that I did not want anyone to know, you could never get me in the door of this building. As soon as the Holy Ghost began to fall, something took place and exposed that man's heart. Simon pulled the wool over Philip's eyes but he could not deceive the Holy Ghost. You may be able to deceive your wife and children, but you cannot hide anything from the Holy Ghost.

So Simon came round and said, in substance, "This is a wonderful thing. I see a chance to make a little gain. I'll split with you. You give me this power and I'll be a rich man in a short while." I want to tell you that if there was a man in the world who could bring about the manifestations that the Holy Ghost can, he would be a millionaire in a short while. Fortune tellers would have to go out of business. There is no man or woman that will ever be able to operate on the heart and soul and bring it into fellowship with the great, eternal God. But the Holy Ghost does.

Peter said to him, "Thy money perish with thee." I suppose there are some people that would use this scripture to get out of the idea of giving the Lord any money. They say the Lord does not need any; the cattle on a thousand hills, the gold and the silver, all are His. It was not because Simon offered money that he was rejected, but it was because his money was offered to purchase the unspeakable and precious gift of God. Not only will money fail to purchase it, but there is not one thing you can do in your own self, your own carnal self, that will ever purchase you one bit of the gift of God. This is only obtained by your receiving it as a gift.

Some one said to Paul one day, "What shall I do to be saved?" The answer came, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved." That is all God desires of you. You can never reform. You can never bring yourself into a place where you will be ready for God's blessings. There is only one way, and that is by receiving the gift of God, His own Son.

And so Peter said, "Thy money perish with thee." All that you can work, all that you can do and say and give, will perish with you because you thought the gift of God could be purchased with carnal works. But a broken and a contrite heart He will not turn away. When you come to God with a broken heart, with your sins rolling up like mountains before you, and your faith reaches up and catches a glimpse of Calvary with Jesus suffering there for you, the gift of God comes into your own personal life.

"Thou hast neither part nor lot in this matter: for thy heart is not right in the sight of God." I notice two reasons why he did not have part nor lot in this matter. First, his heart was not right in the sight of God. Second, he thought he could purchase the of God. Second, he thought he could purchase the gift of God by carnal means. Simon believed. I want to tell you that is quite a step nowadays. The world is full of unbelief. But here we find a man that the Bible says believed the things that Philip had preached concerning the Lord Jesus Christ. Because you believe a part of the Bible, or the theory of the Bible, that is no sign that your heart is right with God. There are other things required besides just believing as a head theory. Paul tells us that when a man believes with his heart and confesses with his mouth, he shall be saved. And John says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.' So it was not a case of unbelief with Simon; it must have been something else. It was not a case of unwillingness to stand the reproach of being among those peculiar people. No doubt the whole country had heard the peculiar things they were doing; how they were going down to a hole where there was some water and a man was ducking them under the water, and when they came up they praised the Lord and made an awful noise. Such things were in circulation, but somehow Simon did not care. He believed and was baptized. He was willing to identify himself with the Lord's people.

Are you willing to identify yourself with those who are identified with Him? Some people think that the Christian life is only just a kind of an idea that originates in the mind. But when you identify yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ you take on yourself all the reproach and all the shame and humiliation of the cross of Calvary. A religion that does not bring any reproach to you never came by the way of the cross of Calvary. If you have identified yourself with the people who are bearing the reproach and the shame of the cross of Calvary, and yet there is something deep down that tells you your heart is not right in the sight of God, the Scriptures say you will have no part nor lot in the matter. It is a question of whether your heart is right in the sight of God.

The real thing in the heart of Simon that made his heart not right in the sight of God, I believe, was unconfessed sins. If there is anything that the blood has never covered, or that you have never taken to the foot of Calvary and left with the Lord Jesus, then your heart is not right in the sight of God, and the Word of God declares you will have no part nor lot in the matter.

A few years ago we took my mother to her grave. My father, still unsaved, stood with me at the head of the grave and I remember how badly I felt. He said, "Hugh, I would not cry if I were you, for you are the only one that has any hope of seeing her again." But before the Lord took him he got the hope, too. Some of these days the trumpet is going to sound and we shall be caught up to meet the Lord. The saddest thing that can happen to you is that, your heart not being right in the sight of God, you will have no part nor lot in the matter. Your little girl, who is trying to serve God and live for Jesus, will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air, but you will have no part nor lot in the matter. Your wife, whom you have been opposing time and again and making it so hard for her, will go up, but you will have no part nor lot in the matter for your heart is not right in the sight of God.

No matter what the condition of your heart is right now, what sins have crept in unawares and entangled themselves around your heart until you cannot break loose or deliver yourself, there is power in the blood and in the name of Jesus to break every fetter and set you at liberty and your heart can be right in the sight of God.

My father lived until the age of seventy-nine with his heart not right in the sight of God. When four of us older children were saved he drove the three oldest ones away and compelled us to stay away. A few months later when mother received the Holy Spirit he made it very hard for her. Being a well-educated man and having the ability to press his point, he was able to do lots of damage to God's cause. But just three years before he left this old world, with health gone, body broken and unable to do anything much for God, he came to God and the Lord made his heart right and he went up to meet God. Regardless of your standing in the world, you can come and have your heart made right in the sight of God.

THE BIBLE SCHOOL

In coming to you through this article I want to take the opportunity at the same time of a little personal greeting as we talk things over.

I wish I were more capable of expressing in writing in an intelligent manner my thoughts and feelings concerning different matters. I am sure I should then be able to paint you a word picture that would be pleasing indeed. But alas! I am not a word artist, so I must be content to stumble along and trust God that you will get some sense of the spirit of this little

When a person gets hold of anything good from the Lord he at once desires to tell the other fellow. That's the "spirit of the gospel." Then again when a person sees something worth while he desires to call attention of others to it.

I do not think it profitable to consume time contending for the need of Bible Schools especially to an intelligent company of God's people as found in the Pentecostal Assemblies. We all grant that the need is great and are thankful that the Lord has laid it on the hearts of His children to erect a building at Springfield, Mo., where young men and women may be trained for effective service.

The things one sees and feels, when one steps on the grounds of the Bible Institute, are such that one is impelled to have a camp meeting right on the spot. It is because God is in the move, and His presence covers the entire place so much so that we do not have to be coaxed, when someone suggests a trip out to the Bible School grounds. I remarked to Brother Welch on my first trip out to the grounds, that I wished all of God's children could come out here, see this building and get the blessing I am getting. I said, "Do you feel any particular blessing when you look this proposition over?" He said, "David, I feel like shouting every time I come out here." I said, "I believe if everyone of the Lord's children could come here and look this building over and see these grounds we would have such a shout it would be heard all over the countryside.

I am coming to you in this article to say that it has been revealed to me that this is not impossible, I mean the shout that can be heard afar off. I know it is impossible for you all to get here, so I suggested that it might be possible if we prayed earnestly, that God would let us send you something in the paper and trust God to give you the vision and shower down upon you the blessing that is attached to this Bible School project. So we have started. Brother Boyd, the principal, wrote you at the time the picture of the building was published in a recent number of the Evangel. Now we are giving you a picture of the

present student body, who are quartered in the building of the Local Assembly here. To say the least, it is far too small to accommodate this hungry company of students. I am telling you that had we the room, this company would be three or four times larger than you see it now. But the other applicants have been held up until the New Building is finished. Can you look into the faces of this company and not receive an inspiration and a blessing? Can you think of the great work that is going to be done by this trained band of preachers and missionaries and then not desire to have a part in their education?

At this writing the Holy Spirit has been falling upon the class and a blessed spirit of fellowship is manifest among this student body. To hear them pray is a great inspiration. In a recent time of prayer it was necessary to suspend the school order and continue before the Lord at which time one of the students received the Baptism of the Spirit. These and other manifestations of God's presence are to the faculty a gracious seal of God's approval on the work, for which we are all glad and do heartily give thanks.

If you still have the Evangel containing the picture of the New Building, I would suggest that you cut it out, and do the same with the picture of the student body herewith; hang them up in your bedroom, and begin to have a real part in this work by earnestly praying for it and them. As you pray earnestly, God is going to bless you and make it possible for you to help in many, many practical ways. Thus we shall be "helpers together by prayer." I suggest this because I know, and so do you, that it is the praying people who do things for God. Do you know that the business men of this community got together and purchased the acreage of the Bible Institute and gave it outright to this General Council? Do you know that when this building was authorized and the committee here were told to go ahead and build, that there was not one dollar in sight with which to begin the work? Do you know that the workmen are now covering this building with the roof and that up to date there is not one cent of debt on it, and that it has not been necessary to get loans to cover it with a mortgage?

That, I say to you, is the result of prayer. This matter has been prayed about and every step is the result of definite prayer and faith in God. Prayer is the main factor responsible for the atmosphere which hovers over the Bible school grounds. That is why the blessing comes on one as lie enters its sacred premises. Blessed be our God! He is there. He is managing the affairs and will carry it on to completion. He may be looking your way now and considering taking you into the plan and giving you an interest in the undertaking. The rewards will be great.

The further progress of the building depends largely on our continued fellowship and cooperation in the supply of funds, as the committee are making a strong endeavor to meet the bills as they come due. Whatever you may be led to do at this present time will be greatly appreciated by the committee.

The blessing of God has been on all those who have come up to the help of the Lord thus far, and I am sure there is great blessing in store for all those who are yet to join us in bringing this building to a completion for the October term of the coming year. May the blessing of the Lord be greatly upon you all as you help Him and help us. I close with Hag. 1:8, 13, 14;

"Go up to the mountain, and bring wood, and build

the house; and I will take pleasure in it, and I will

be glorified, saith the Lord.

Then spake Haggai the Lord's messenger in the Lord's message unto the people, saying, I am with you, saith the Lord.

"And the Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua, the son of Josedech, the high priest, and the spirit of all the remnant of the people; and they came and did work in the house of the Lord of hosts, their God."

There is only one thing that can make your heart right, and that is by receiving Jesus Christ Himself. So many people are like Mary and Joseph when they had been up to Jerusalem to worship and had started home supposing Jesus to be in their midst. So many have been under the influence of the Holy Spirit and have been brought into the presence of someone who has been in touch with God, and they have made up their mind to live a better life, but they are not Christians. If Jesus the Son of God is not in your heart you are not right in the sight of God. He that hath the Son hath life. He that hath not the Son hath not life. The question is—is Jesus in your heart?

THE SPIRIT OF GOD UNCONQUERABLE

AN ENCOURAGING WORD TO PENTECOSTAL PEOPLE.

Samson was a Nazarite, separated unto God, an Israelite out from Israel, distinct from the other brethren, who were envious, jealous, disbelieving in him. And they were prepared to hand him over to their enemies. Three thousand men of Judah went to the top of the rock Etam, and said to Samson, "Knowest thou not that the Philistines are rulers over us? . . . We are come down to bind thee, that we may deliver thee into the hand of the Philistines" (Judges 15:11, 12). This is how they treated their would-be saviour. They bound him, incapacitated him, and in that state, the Spirit of God came mightily upon him, the cords that bound him were snapped, the entanglements loosened, and through the divine Spirit of God in him he wielded the jawbone of an ass to the destruction of a thousand of the enemy (Judges 15:15).

The brethren never saw the Spirit of God come upon him. The invisible Spirit was working with visible results through one of their kin. It was not the abnormal muscle of Samson, it was the mighty Spirit of God, and He chose the despicable instrument of destruction—the jawbone of an ass. That is God's way. The sling and stones for Goliath. The tent peg for Sisera. So still God's Spirit is seeking outlets through the Nazarites of Israel—that is, consecrated, converted people.

The Spirit of God can and does do real, tangible work through human bodies. On the Day of Pentecost a mighty rushing wind came mightily upon the modern Samsons and worked through an instrument which was the laughing stock of the enemies of Christ. The Jews were operated upon. The jaws of the whole one hundred and twenty were worked supernaturally upon. The Spirit of God, instead of doing destructive work, first of all praised the constructive work of God the Father, through the Son, in man's salvation. The Spirit witnesses to the Father and Son of salvation through the objects of this salvation, viz., men and women in the upper room.

Samson slew a thousand with the jawbone of an ass. When the crowd saw the jaws working, and other manifestations of the mighty Spirit of God that were so loosening this band of one hundred and twenty that they were acting like drunken men, some laughed, some were convicted, and three thousand were slain through the mighty operations of the Spirit of God focused and voiced through Peter.

Imagine the ridicule and laughter and sneering of Samson's brethren as they saw him take the jawbone of an ass. Equally interesting it would have been to have heard their comments after he had slain the thousand. Of course he was possessed, but they did not know the nature of the Possessor. It could be truly said of Samson, "Neither did his brethren believe in him." They wanted to hand Samson over to his enemies and their enemies, but the Spirit of God through Samson handed the enemies over to Samson.

Why was it the brethren were envious of Samson? Because they were subservient to the enemy of Samson and of Samson's God. There was a tacit acceptance of the enemies of Israel, the Philistines, being rulers and having dominion over the children of Israel. The Spirit of God did not accept it, and revolted against it through the consecrated, yielded Samson. There was an undercurrent, a union with

the Philistines who were dominating Israel. The enemies of God were mastering and ruling the children of God. And they accepted it when they should have rejected it.

This is the situation today. Despising those upon whom the Spirit of God comes, loathing the instrument—the "jawbone;" and in concern, in consternation, when the enemies are subdued through this instrument. And they would like modern Samsons to be conquered by the Philistines. But the Spirit of God is unconquerable. When Samsons are taken out, then the Philistines can have their full play and power upon those, Samson's brethren, who reject God and His Spirit and His Spirit-filled ones.

THE INTERCESSORY MISSIONARY

Some years ago my eyes fell on the record of a wonderful work of grace in connection with one of the stations of the China Inland Mission, where both the number and spiritual character of the converts had been far greater than at other stations, and yet the consecration of the missionaries at the latter had been just as great as at the more fruitful place.

This rich harvest of souls remained a mystery until Mr. Hudson Taylor on a visit to England discovered the secret. At the close of one of his addresses a gentleman from the audience came forward to make his acquaintance. If we are going to evangelize our apportioned part, men must do the pioneer work."

SOME MISSIONARY LETTERS

BUILDING FOR GOD IN LIBERIA

Brother E. E. Alger writes from Liberia: "God is taking care of us out here. And truly we have reason to rejoice. Mrs. Alger and I have just returned from a preaching trip to the Hooyahtribe. We preached in every town in the tribe but two, and one of them we had visited before.

"Several of the towns had not seen a missionary since Miss Hisey was there years ago. We found the people very interested and attentive to the preaching of the Word. In fact we have never seen the people so attentive anywhere else.

"Two of the towns desired a missionary. I told them how sorry we were that there was no one to go as yet, and asked them how much they would be willing to help, should some missionary or native worker be found to come. Both of the towns offered to build a house for us and give us rice enough to feed the boys that were put in school. They have a fine hill picked out for us at Boyah and there is a grove of timber within fifty rods in which we could find sufficient lumber to build two nice buildings. some of God's people at home would only obey His voice, and come, what a great missionary work could be done here.

"I have now completed our new chapel and we are finishing up the house, trying to get everything ready for the Christmas meeting here. The town people gathered together and helped put the roof on the chapel. They say they are going to make a law that everybody must come to church on Sundays.

"One of our native boys was sick, and not knowing much about how to pray, he crawled out into the bush and prayed 'country way,' 'O God, look me, I am going to die just now, but please, God, I beg you heal me. When you heal me so I can get up and go home, I will kill fowl (chicken) for you. For truly I will kill a fowl, Lord. Oh God, please you must believe me when I say I will kill that fowl, I can't lie about it, Lord, so I beg You to heal me.' It is hardly necessary to say that the Lord healed him, and he has since learned that Jesus was his complete sacrifice. But surely that brand of faith is worth more than theological perfection many times."

AN ENCOURAGING WORD

Bernice C. Lee writes from Uska Bazar, India: "Busy are these days, indeed. I had one lovely month in the hills and on my way down stopped off at Basti to see Miss Gager for a couple of days. And we found her seriously ill with the worst carbuncle you can imagine. Sister Ruth Riggs was taking care of her and then took infection and both were in bed helpless, and I was certainly kept busy waiting on them. Duties in Uska were pressing and I certainly had my hands full since returning. I'm glad to tell you that both Mrs. Gager and Ruth are improving and I trust soon will be

"I have great joy since Brother and Sister Waggoner joined us. The Lord's leading was so very clear and direct in the matter and I find, even more than I dreamed, we are able to work together in real unity.

"Brother Waggoner is not only pushing the leper work, but is very aggressive along evangelistic lines, so that we are being able to enlarge our borders in a very real sense. I have not been so truly happy in the work since my dear Miss Baugh went away as at present, and I know you will rejoice. The past was one of the most precious summer of my life. Alone, as far as white companions were concerned, for the most part of two months, in the sweltering heat (the worst I ever remember in India), the Lord came down in such showers as we met in special services for the dear Indian Christians, and some of our young people were saved and baptized in the Holy Spirit. O they were wonderful days.

"Then my months in the hills were so sweet and here God was meeting the missionaries, and those of other denominations were attending and seeking and receiving the precious Baptism in the Spirit. Oh, I am so happy and love India more than ever!"

Sister Nicho's writes from Ningpo, China: "We have cause to give God the praise and glory for His marvelous healing touch in the body of Brother Zakrison who was attacked with a most acute and severe form of dysentery which, but for the touch of God, would have cost him his life. It was indeed a fight of faith but God touched and instantly stopped the dysentery and reduced the fever while we were at prayer. He was too far gone to pray, but as we prayed, the Spirit came upon him like rays of heat over his body. After this he did not have another sign of disease. He is able to be up and around again full of praise to God for His wondrous grace. It was a real miracle. His healing was on Sunday about 2:00 a. m.

"Call unto Me, and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not." "Above all that we ask or think."

Are you using the check book? Are you getting great and mighty things by the Almighty God in answer to your helpless cries? Are you drawing heavily on the bank of heaven for this sin-cursed earth which is swiftly hastening to its doom—the great tribulation? "To every one grass in the field." COMING! COM-In answer to somebody's prayers! YOURS? Or are you going to slothfully let the opportunity slip; are you going to let the asking-hour slip as King Ahab let the mighty Ben-hadad of Syria, the captured prize God put into his hands, "While thy servant was busy here and there, lo! he was gone!" Slothfulness! Oh that horrible sin of slothfulness! Since you were washed in the blood of Jesus have you been always free Are you wholly free from it from it? now? Busying here and there and letting the main thing slip! A slug! A

Quicker than we think, our last hour of prayer-service will be gone, for Jesus cometh soon. He is at the doors. Oh to go in and receive our reward of thirty-fold or sixty-fold when it might have been a hundred-fold fruitage! A hundred-fold-fruit believer, by yielding all our life and our entire being to our precious Saviour to have our full share in His everlasting intercession till the end come. A little while, a very little while, to be all consumed by the Holy Spirit in prayer, see the Spirit out-poured on all flesh, and then go to our reward! Oh that is to be on good terms with our Banker and use our check book well! And if we want it, God is with us to bring it to pass.

There is resource in God to make of each Christian an all consumed prayer-warrior; resource in God to make our life simply a prayer-instrument to God. As the restaurant was large there were many waiters and servants, but the power that built up the business was the superior food served. The actual cooking she alone did. She told me that she went into the kitchen at five in the morning, was out one hour only and that was from three to four in the afternoon, when wet with perspiration she climbed to her chamber, threw an extra wrap around her, and lay on her couch and continued her prayer. At four she returned to her pots and pans and came to her bed at ten in the evening. I speak advisedly, "continued her prayer," for God had so drenched her in the spirit of prayer that she prayed "without ceasing," she told me. She said that often as she stood by the table she was so under the pressure of the Spirit that she could not seem to discern which was the butter and which the sugar, flour and eggs. Yet He, who was going to work all the mighty miracles, in answer to her prayers wrought the contant miracle of letting her make no mistakes in her cooking, and kept for her the banner flying, "Restaurant with the best cooking in the city." She was a member of the church of the sainted A. J. Gordon of Boston, whose ministry and whose church had the very salt of the salvation of those days. She could never go to church. All days were work days with her. But about Friday God would begin to gird her in prayer for the Lord's Day, the church and the pastor; and He would not let up till Sunday was over. But her interests ranged far and wide in the world, and through the blessing of God upon her business she was able to support one missionary in China and one in Africa. The problems in their work were often whispered to her by God, before they reached her by mail. Eternity will show how much she reaped from the home and foreign fields. Perhaps there will be more to her account than those of the pastor and the missionaries. Who made her the praying woman that she was? God did. Could He do as good a job on you if you gave your-self to Him to, AT ALL COSTS, be fully developed in the prayer life? Does He want you for a prayer-warrior? you want to be a prayer-warrior? Such are they who shall turn the battle to the gates in this last hour.

Is that God, who in the awful hour of Armageddon's fierce conflict pours out upon the, till then, resistant Jews, the Spirit of grace and of supplications, not able and willing to pour now upon you, blood-washed child of God, the Spirit of grace and of supplications? ONENESS, LOVE AND POWER

By Pastor G. R. Polman, Amsterdam, Holland.

Acts 4:32, 33: "And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and soul: and not one of them said that aught of the things which he possesssed was his own; but they had all things common. And with great power gave the apostles their witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all."

The faith of the first Christians, after the wonderful experience of the baptism with the Holy Ghost on the day of Pentecost, was no longer an outward faith in the death and resurrection of Christ, not a mere faith through the knowledge of His departure from them in His resurrection body to heaven; although they had seen this truth with their eyes, but their faith was an inner experience in their hearts. They had in reality entered into the redemption which Christ had brought, and therefore gave they witness with great power, of the resurrection of Christ. The word of Christ was fulfilled in them, "He that believeth in Me, out of his innermost being shall flow rivers of living water." They gave witness through the sealing of the Holy Ghost; therefore was their word with power, for it was not the word of men, but of God. The oneness for which Christ had prayed was fulfilled. The many were of one heart.

This oneness among them was the result of their union with Christ, their glorified Head. They had with Christ died, arisen, and ascended into heaven. This had all, through the Holy Ghost, become an inner experience with them, a reality which was manifest in a divine unity; "one heart." The Assembly of Christ is one heart, for it is the "body of Christ," and therefore possesses the heart of Christ. Head, heart and body form the Christ, as Paul writes, 1 Cor. 12:12. "For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of the body. being many, are one body, so also is Christ." The whole Christ, in the together united Assembly.

Where place is made for the Holy Ghost, there divine oneness is born. This is not realized, though men have the same faith, through belonging to the same church or movement. That does not produce oneness of heart and soul. Christ alone is the central point of unity. In Him only are His people made one and that through the power of the Holy Ghost. Pentecost alone unites; but the other is rather a Babylon of confusion, a powerless union from the prince of darkness.

The Assembly for which Christ will return, is an Assembly that has one heart and one soul, of which He is the Head. They have recognized Him as their Head, and so the thought of God is revealed in His body. His Assembly is born of the Holy Ghost and is spiritual, praying in the Holy Ghost, and walking in the Holy Ghost in the heavenlies, from whence they watch for Him. They have put off the things of this world, and are free from all that binds to the earthly, and when Christ shall come, the prince of this world will find nothing in them, for they belong to another world.

Those who make up this Assembly are spiritual men, who live in the Spirit, in a divine element, like the fish in the water, and the bird in the air. Outside the realm of the Spirit men are spiritually dead. A fish can not live long in the Dead Sea. And so it is with believers who are not in the Holy Ghost. and in whom the Holy Ghost is not.

The disunity among the children of God comes from the fact that they are yet fleshly, they have not yet been crucified in their flesh, their own life is not yet broken; and that is the cause of all the division among God's children. Pentecost brings us with Christ into heavenly places, and unites us in one body, so that the world can see, that they might believe. These seek the things that are above, not the things that are upon the earth. They have entered into the unknown, where the Spirit is Lord and by Him they are led into the eternal realities, so that they no longer wander uncertainly, but all things are revealed to them through the Holy Ghost, and apart from this they know nothing. Blessed ignorance, heavenly innocence, where the soul is entered into the obedience of the Holy Ghost. Such. like Abraham, have left all, and have been brought into a land that they know not, in an unknown place where they follow, and go out to meet their Bridegroom, as Rebekah met her bridegroom Isaac.

There where Christ has become all. the oneness is manifested, one heart and one soul, an inner oneness, that is revealed in a wonderful variety; a variety of gifts that the Holy Ghost exercises in the Assembly, whereby the whole body united together develops a full grown man in Christ.

Whenever believers seek this oneness, they leave all other ways. It is in the central point, Christ, that self is lost, and out from this center flows the life. bringing fruit for eternity, much fruit and fruit that remains to the glory of God.

The deliverance from all of our own thinking and will makes us able to know His voice, and to become coworkers with God. Disunity always comes from the fleshly understanding and is devilish. The curse rests upon it. Paul could say, "But we have the mind of Christ."

The unity of the first Christians was revealed in the love, and was manifested in a very practical way. This love is a fruit of the Spirit, which is manifest

in an Assembly where believers are of one heart and one soul. They are freed from the things of time, and yet possess them as not possessing; all is as unto Him in their service, in spirit, soul and body, with all that pertains to them.

A Bible Christian is a true Communist, who does not seek his own, but the things that are for others. This does not come from the principle of self-seeking, but from the offering of Christ. Heavenly mindedness frees from the earth, and what is earthy. Pentecost is not having, having, but giving, giving. Ps. 29 is a Pentecostal Psaim. It begins with: "Give unto the Lord, O ye sons of the mighty. Give unto the Lord of glory and strength. Give unto the Lord the glory due unto His name." Three times, give. And then follows seven times the voice of the Lord. When we give Him spirit, soul and body, our three-fold nature, He manifests to us His seven-fold blessing of the fullness of the Holy Ghost. There is a oneness in the Holy Ghost, spiritual and practical, in the love of God, where rich and poor are all one. The rich are poor, and the poor are rich, and both walk together in the heavenly life, from whence they watch for Him who is their hope. As the heart is, so also is the Assembly.

The unity which the Holy Ghost works is revealed in the love which pro-The love of God vides for all things. is, through the Holy Ghost, poured out in the heart so that no man says that what he has is his own, but all things are had in common. The comradeship was considered of such importance in the first Christian Assembly that those appointed to care for the needs of the saints had to be full of the Holy Ghost. By the spiritual man no difference is made between the spiritual and the material. To him all is holy that has to do with God and The most spiritual man is the most practical man. He who walks in the heavenlies is true to his duty on earth, for it is all one in the Spirit to him.

Love can not be extinguished. It is lighted of God. For this cause the devil hates it. Love is to fulfill all things. Love can make friends even of our enemies. Love is personified in Jesus Christ. Love has the nature of a lamb and the power of a lion. The love which was the mark by which the early Christians were known, could suffer and die, but could not deny Christ. This unity and love was the source of the power with which they preached the risen Christ. They were children of the resurrection, they were raised with Him; Christ was their life. The preaching of the Gospel was accompanied by the casting out of devils speaking in other tongues, and healing the sick. Signs and wonders sealed the preaching of the Word, and prepared the way for the coming or the kingdom of heaven.

We must return to Pentecost. Some fear, and oppose the thing that is needed to deliver us from our helplessness and spiritual poverty. But it is only the power of God, the Holy Ghost in (Continued on Page Twenty-One)

QUESTIONS ANSWERED By W. H. M.

Q.-How did Moses get the story of the world up to his time? Was it tradition verified by the Lord, or do you think there was any such tradition existing?

A-It is evident that Moses wrote his account of the creation in Genesis, under God's direction and inspiration, the internal evidence proves this: for many times we read, "And God said."

No doubt there were traditions handed down by Adam's posterity of God's dealings with them, as well as the genealogies. Occasionally pillars had been set up to commemorate special events, as for instance, Jacob's pillar at Luz (Gen. 28:19). Josephus says that Adam and Seth set up pillars giving an account of events in their lifetime. But undoubtedly the Holy Spirit watched over the compilation of the books of Scripture, leading Moses to make a certain selection of matter which had permanent value for posterity. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God" (2 Tim. 3:16).

Q .- When the assembly comes together for prayer, and one of the elders is led by the Holy Spirit to read the Word, then one of the sisters groans and cries so the elder cannot read the Word, is not this the antichrist spirit to hinder the Word from coming forth?

A .- The elders should take this matter in hand and should ascertain the cause of this trouble. It need not necessarily be the antichrist spirit, which is a denial of the Father and the Son. But it is nevertheless quite probable that the devil is trying in this way to upset the prayer

Q.-My husband is very wicked, and wants me to give up the Pentecostal religion, threatens to leave me if I don't. What would you advise me to do?

A.-Never surrender trust in your mighty Lord Jesus. He will be with you and carry you through your troublesome experience. Treat your husband with all kindness for Jesus' sake. We will pray to the dear Lord to convict and save him. Read carefully and prayerfully 1 Peter 3: 1-6, and as you live this scripture before your husband you may confidently expect his soul to be won for Christ. Trust on; joy and blessing are coming. Amen!

Q .- Please explain-"Many that are first shall be last, and the last first."

A.—This refers to the possession of riches. The Lord had been speaking to the rich young man, telling him to sell that he had and give to the poor, but he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. He was one of the "first," i. e. the well-to-do, the prominent, the powerful.

Then Peter said, "Behold we have forsaken all and followed Thee, what shall we have therefore?" And the Lord gave the promise that these who had forsaken earthly prospects for His sake, should sit in the throne of His glory. These were the "last," i. e. poor, weak, despised, of no account in the world's eyes But many that are "first" in this life, shall be "last" in the life to come, and the "last" here can be "first" there (Matt. 19:30).

Q .- Noting 1 John 3:17, do you believe any one can have real victory, regardless of how much he shouts and speaks in tongues, after having the light on tithes and offerings, if he refuses to respond when he sees his pastor wearing patched clothes as he faces the world bringing the gospel message?

A.-No. I think that God's true pastors have a just right to be supported from the tithes and offerings and to be clad in respectable clothes when proclaiming the glorious gospel message to the world. The command is, "Let him that is taught in the Word (i. e. the hearer) communicate (i. e. make offerings) unto him that teacheth, in all good things" (Gal. 6:6). Gratitude should impel us to do this. See also 1 John 3:17. If any one refuse to respond to these commands of God's Word, although he may shout and speak in tongues, he certainly cannot have real victory

Q .- Is it scriptural for all to pray aloud at once?

A .- Yes, there are times when all can pray at once, when they are of one accord. See the united prayer in Acts 4:24. Result: "The house was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke the Word of God with boldness.'

But to avoid confusion, we are also enjoined to, "tarry one for another," as it were, in testifying and prophesying. (See 1 Cor. 14:26-32.) And this might also be applied to prayer. But where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty.

Q.-Can you give the depth of the word "believe"- "Believe on the Lord Jesus" as found in Acts 16:31 and John 14:12 and elsewhere?

A .- To believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, is to rest upon His finished work alone for salvation, as offered to us, by God, in the gospels. The jailer said, "What must I do to be saved"? And the answer was "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved and thy house." And they spake unto him the word of life and to all that were in his house. And while the jailer's belief started with an acceptance of the facts of the gospel, it contained more than just that, it involved obedience to the Lord's requirements, and he made confession by being immersed in water, and doubtless received the Holy Spirit at the same time, as per Acts 19:5, 6. Then his first care was to feed the hungry apostles, and soothe their sore backs. In these ways the man showed that he believed with his heart and not with his head only.

In John 14:12 Jesus was speaking of greater works yet to be done not only by the apostles, but also by whosoever believes on Him, after He had ascended unto His Father and been glorified and had received all power in heaven and on earth (Matt 28:18). We must believe for these very things, and believe through thick and thin, for all Satan's power will be arrayed against us to prevent these works coming to pass, and the tests will be very great. Belief therefore must be a solid unshakable conviction, and must be the sort that carries with it implicit obedience.

Q.—Please explain briefly the parable of the unjust steward, Luke 16.

A.—The lesson taught by this parable is that God's people are to be business-like and seize their opportunities, as do the people of the world in carnal matters.


This steward was faced with dismissal, and consequent poverty and starvation. There was clearly not a moment to be lost if he would retrieve the situation. He must act quickly, and make friends whilst he had the power to do so, before the news of his dismissal became publicly known. He did this at the expense of his master by altering the goods invoices, thereby remitting a large part of the debts due to his master, hoping that these same debtors would in time to come, be willing to do him a good turn when he was cast out, by offer-ing hospitality. The steward's master later on discovered the fraud but while, no doubt, angry at the loss he had sustained, couldn't help applauding the cleverness of the scheme. The Lord Jesus in no way condones this man's deceit and treachery, but He teaches us that we have it in our power to make our own future very much more pleasant and happy, by a wise laying out of our money, and making ourselves friends therewith. The poor we have always with us, and there are the multitudes of heathen still without the gospel. If we use our money to help these in their need, when our life on earth is finished we shall find a host of friends waiting for us on the other side and giving us a warm welcome to the heavenly city.

We might be and ought to be making fresh friends in this way, continually, but strange to say, the Lord's people seldom see the possibilities of spiritual investment. In spite of the Lord's command, they hoard money for the moth and rust, and cling to it with all the fervor of worldlings, justifying themselves by the same arguments which the worldlings use. These latter keep investing their money and seize every opportunity to add to their store. We are to lay up treasure in heaven. Christ speaks of money as the "Mammon of unrighteousness," because of its well known power of becoming an idol and tempting people to commit all kinds of sins in order to obtain it. We are to reckon ourselves not the owners of our money, but stewards only. It is "another man's " that is, it, and all we possess, belongs to God, and in our use of the money we get, we are being tested by God as to our fitness to handle heavenly treasures, and occupy positions of trust in the future. 



That even as the mountain peaks are needed for the natural rain, so our hearts must be lifted above the dense fogs and mists of the earth, that only by the uplifted isolation of prayer can we bring down the showers and rivers and floods to sweep on the last great revival that is already rising up in the earth like a mighty river. And like the riches of the Nile, all its banks must overflow to bring in the fulness of the harvest.

God says, "Ask ye of the Lord rain, in the time of the Latter Rain.' says, "If ye ask . . . I will do." Only so can the Lord work. If we do not ask, we limit His power.

And so, shall we not ask, and ask in faith, and ask until we receive, that God will not only make us individually Radio Christians, Christians living out the Radiant life-radiating power-radiating wordless messages from our very presence, living witnesses every hour of our lives: or if we are shut in by Providence, rising up nevertheless, into mountain peaks of prayer. If we feel that we are failures in all these lines, we can "redeem the time" by prayer. And as the blood sweeps over all past failures, and our hearts are occupied only with Him, and His mighty working on the earth-the power will come, not only to pray, but to pray and not to faint, and so to continue instant in pray that it will be our very life, waking or sleeping and that every service we do for Him, will simply be the outcome of that life of

And while we are thus praying, beloved, can we fail to pray that God will multiply every one of His agencies for speeding the Gospel message? If the "wireless" is of God—and did God ever put into the power of man to discover any secret so nearly akin to prayer, and the marvelous swiftness with which God hears and answers our faintest cries to Him, regardless of time and distance? -then if we fully realize this we can pour fourth such a united prayer of faith for the sending forth of the Gospel in clear definite messages from these Radio Stations, to be established all over the land, exclusively for the King's messages. But they will be heard and speeded, not only by His subjects, but by aliens and rebels and those "down and out"-by suffering ones in sick chambers, business men in their offices, and even criminals, not only bound by the fetters of sin, but held in jails and penitentiaries, will catch the joyful sound and as they hear, will believe and will lift up their heads and rejoice. His fullness, with His gifts in power, that will enable us to triumph over the powers of darkness.

The power of God can manifest itself where men have lost all their own power, where they have left off all the works of men in their service to God. The consciousness that they are nothing, can do nothing, and the fact that they desire nothing of their own will, brings the consciousness of divine power, and the experience of His Almightiness. In the giving over of ourselves to the Holy Ghost, lies the secret of preaching in the manifestation and power of the Holy Ghost. Where the Holy Ghost can manifest Himself as He will, His power will be realized.

The spiritual awakening that we are observing in our day should lead to a breaking of the spirit of man and giving over to God, and acceptance of the promises of God, otherwise it will remain in the birth. If God shall be able to do anything new (and that He will do), it will not be possible to put the new wine in old skins, lest the wine be spilled. Many blessings are lost by not being willing to let God do a new work. Men must be willing to lay off all the old, their own thoughts and understanding, when God speaks in another way. When God does a new thing it does not come forth from former experience, but when men lay aside all their experiences and give them over, God will come with new life and revelation in the Holy Ghost. Wherever the Word of God falls in a prepared heart, it brings forth fruit through the power of the Spirit.

Then will also the pure work of God be manifest in souls, in unity, love and power. Oneness in Christ, one with Him in His death and resurrection, one in love, with all things in common, for the upbuilding not simply of the individual, but of the whole Assembly; and this is the secret of the power that was manifest in the first Assembly.

Sunday. "The voice of the Lord breaketh the cedars" (Psa. 29:5).

Think of how we withstood Him! How proudly we lifted our heads in the consciousness of our own strength, of our own righteousness, our own achievements -vea, we were a veritable cedar of Lebanon in our foolish pride. But that was all before God spoke-before His voice sounded in the depth of our being. Then it was the breaking came, and we fell before Him in such overwhelming consciousness of our abject need and weakness. And how we praise Him for the breaking-thus have we learned the sweetness of standing in Him alone for all our sufficiency.

Tuesday. "A blessing is in it" (Isa. 65:8).

"Take the honey from the bee, Never mind the sting;

We all know how the beautiful pearl is formed. What a subtle thing pride is, and only God can discern its hidden workings in our hearts and lives. There is a certain pride which is a God-given, inherent quality with all of us, but how often, how continually, we see its Satanic perversion.
