I glanced up, the waiter was still waiting patiently. I smiled apologetically. He understood and smiled reassuringly. "I think I had better take another glass of milk and some bread and butter with it, if you please," I said as I looked again at the menu.

Such a meal I had never eaten, yet so simple. When I had finished I started to shove back my glass and plate, and fold up my napkin, when to my astonishment, I found myself gently closing the lid of a beautiful Bible.

As the days went by I ate many such meals; and finally some meat. I joyously called to many sin-sick souls who were traveling the same road I had been on, and gave them the menu card. Some were so hungry they wanted to order every thing on the bill of fare the very first meal. Some had no appetite and declared they could not eat without condiments. Others wished to buy the food and take it back into the world with them. A few longed for the garlic and leek and would not be comforted until they had departed for their home-land. However there were many grateful hearts who prayed "Give us this day our daily bread," and partook freely of the water, and the milk. These were the only items I ever checked on their menu.

I knew I was unfit for work and tried to recuperate by sleeping longer hours; but that only made me languid. I was losing my appetite too. Fearing they might think me an unprofitable servant I nerved up and worked all the harder, but I soon grew irritable and troubled. I could not understand why my fellows should be so serene and unmoved under all conditions. At that moment, I received a summons to appear before the proprietor. I 'was frightened. I knew I had not been doing my work well lately. I had been avoiding **His presence lest He** should discern my condition; but O, I did not want to be dismissed. What was I to do? Again I felt a hand upon my arm. I was tremblingly led into the presence of the same white-clad Being who had so graciously received me that glad day of my arrival, the same who had been my proprietor during my period of service which I feared was about to end. I was speechless, weary, undone. To my surprise He reached out His hand, saying, "Come ye apart and rest awhile." "There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God."

Then I cried, "Lord, You don't understand. I have been unfaithful. Others have kept on joyously doing the right thing just at the right time, saying the the right word in the right way, but I have blundered, and bungled, and bothered when I could have helped. I can't understand. I tried so hard to be a faithful servant, but I have failed. I did with a will whatever I found to do; but I failed. I've failed! O, if I only knew the secret of their wisdom, their calm efficiency, their poise, their tireless energy. their joyous buoyancy." I stopped short, aware of a tender, joyous light in His eyes. His tones were so tender as He spoke: "I have been waiting long for this. I will tell you the secret. 'He that is entered into his rest, he has also ceased from his own works.' Then He asked what seemed to me an irrelevant question. With a searching look, He seemed to take a spiritual diagnosis of my case as He asked, "My child, do you still drink nothing but milk?" "What else is there to drink that is not harmful to me?" I asked dreading the thought of the stimulants.

Then as though musing, I heard Him "Whom shall he teach knowledge? sav. and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? them that are weaned from the milk. I had been exhausted before, but now my strength utterly failed me and I fell prostrate at his feet. Still I heard the voice. 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TRIUMPHANT TOGETHERNESS

God's Word declares that "none of us liveth to himself" (Rom. 14:7). It is equally true that none of us sinneth to himself. The distressing feature of today is the demoralizing and degenerating effect of derogatory influence. If men could sin apart (from other souls) and their moral insanity not involve others, one of the most threatening menaces to a forward spiritual movement would be negatived.

The prince of darkness, who is the god of this world, is mustering his men in the fields of sin. He is a firm believer in unity. It spells strength to him in prosecuting his pernicious program. The decisive desire of Diabolus is a tremendous togetherness of evil. Paul expresses it: "They are together become unprofitable" (Rom. 3:12). The Psalmist says: "They are together become filthy" (Psalm 14:3). There is no isolation in iniquity. It stalks the land, tainting the pure atmosphere by its hell-laden breath. The lepers were bidden cry: "Unclean! Unclean!" when coming within sight of human form or dwelling, and were compelled to keep their distance. Such a command today in relation to the leprosy of sin, if obeyed, would rouse all God's children to a life of purity.

There is a "triumphant togetherness" of which we would write. An invisible copartnership that is the basis of all spiritual togetherness. Christ is no sleeping partner. His **invisibility** may not serve to prove His **invincibility**. .His bodily absence does not in the least infer inertness or indifference, He works His sovereign will in redeemed souls by imparting His own resurrection life.

A FOREMOST TOGETHERNESS.

"For we are laborers together with God" (1 Cor. 3:9). All pure service springs from this primary togetherness. The character and quality of our labor will suffer if we misinterpret relationship. The strongest link must ever be between us and our Master. It is wrong to substi-tute for in place of with. It is substitution that minimizes the majesty of its Working together with God meaning. spells infinitely more than working together for God. It would infer independent action rather than a joint service that God enjoins, and that we may enjoy. All abiding work is accomplished in accompaniment with Him. The labor always flows from the union. It must never precede it. What a triumphant togetherness. If the apostle had said ye are laborers together for God, the whole sense would have been changed; the link would then have been between one another. The question of our unworthiness is simply effaced before the mighty truth that it is according to His grace. That is the bridge that spans the distance between our exceeding unworthiness and His exceeding love.

A FRUITFUL TOGETHERNESS

A FORMIDABLE TOGETHERNESS

All that believed were together (Acts 2:44). Faith in Christ, federates men. If unity precedes Pentecost, it will most certainly follow, it. A universal Pentecost would produce Christian togetherness such as this dispensation has never known.

Its lack has led to distressing divisions and sad schisms. From every denomination and section of society, those who have had an upper room blessing of power are joining hearts and hands, adorning themselves with the priceless jewels (the gifts of the Holy Spirit) preparatory to the return of the Pridegroom.

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SHADOWS OF COMING EVENTS Daniel 11:36 to Daniel 12:13.

We have come at length to the last of these Young People's Lessons on the Book of Daniel. While in the preceding chapters of this book the end time has been referred to, the portion taken for today's lesson has to do directly and circumstantially with the end of the age. The activities of "the king" (Verse 36), called also the Man of Sin, the Beast, the Antichrist, are here very plainly set forth. The signs of his appearing on earth given in the Bible are now being made manifest in such great numbers that multitudes are a-tiptoe with expectancy. It was thought by many that Lenine was to be the Antichrist, but Daniel indicates to us that he was to come out of one of the four parts into which the empire of Alexander the Great was to be divided, in their last day reappearance. But Russia, the home of Lenine, was not in Alexander's empire.

Many are now looking for Mussolini to be assassinated and then by the power of the devil have his "deadly wound" healed and his dead body occupied by the Spirit of Nero, whose name alone conforms with the number given by God, 666. However this may turn out, it must be granted that Mussolini has thus far played his part faultlessly if he is to become the incaration of the devil, the "son," in the Satanic counterfeit trinity, of which the devil will be in place of the Father and the False Prophet in the place of the blessed Holy Ghost. We surely live in tremendous times.

This Man of Sin shall greatly exalt himself and prosper, even being given power to fight against the saints and "overcome them" (Rev. 13:7), until God has done punishing the Jews and His indignation is "accomplished" (verse 36). After the Antichrist shall have had his day of the most tremendous wickedness and rapacity that the world has ever known he shall "come to his end" (verse 45), at the same time that Jesus comes back in His glory bringing with Him all the saints, whom He, previously in the Rapture, shall have caught up to Himself into the air (Rev. 19:20).

These tremendous times of the Antichrist, the Great Tribulation, the Second Coming of Jesus, in which Jesus shall set up on the ancient throne of His father David, the kingdom of righteousness in which He shall rule the whole world for one thousand years, are just before us. This is indicated in very many ways. The little straws by their movements show the presence and the direction of the mighty wind. We have time to mention just a few of these "straws."

The Falling Away. These things will not take place "except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition" (2 Thess. 2:3). The loss of what older men call. "old-time religion." in the churches

is felt by all; but many have not realized that this loss of religious excellence and the vast increase in the power of Roman Catholicism in the past few years is proof that the "falling away" is upon In the interesting new book, "SOUND THE ALARM" by W. Lamb, much evidence is adduced that many thousands of Protestant ministers are secretly servants of the Pope and are succeeding amazingly well in leading their churches into the lap of Rome. In this book also is the following: "Catholicism is everywhere one of the enormously growing forces of the world... In 1886 Roman priests in China numbered 470, but in 1913 there were 2186; and in 1900 there were 762,000 Chinese Romanists. Thirteen years later there were 1,406,659. Fifty years ago there were 610 Roman priests in Great Britain; today there are 4000. In 1808 there was one Roman Catholic bishop in the United States; now there are fourteen archbishops, 90 bishops, 14,444 priests, and 11,-584 churches." When Rome on every trip of the mother of ships, the Leviathan, carrying soldiers to France, could contrive to have our boys, whether Protestant or Catholic, unbeliever or Jew called every day to prayers, and induce them to stand in reverent attention while a prayer to the virgin mother was voiced, the "falling away" goes on apace.

The Present Occurrences in Palestine. When a country has been without rain so long that its forests, orchards and vineyards, as well as smaller vegetation have vanished, and then after such a drought, lasting in Palestine much over a thousand years, the rainfall/ again becomes the established and expected thing, something wonderful may be argued from that. That is Palestine. It has the more bearing on our subject when you know that when Jesus returns the Jews in large numbers shall have returned to Palestine. The rain was necessary so they could come. The Jews in the last twenty years in ever-increasing eagerness are streaming back to Palestine. "The kingdom of God is nigh at hand" for the fig tree, as the Jewish nation is called, has begun to shoot forth (Luke 21:29-31).

The Things the Prophets Saw at the End, Are Here. In the midst of his prophecy about the days when Jesus shall return, the prophet Isaiah saw men flying, and in astonishment cried out. "who are these that fly as a cloud, and as doves to their windows" (Isa. 60:8)? The prophet Nahum in writing of the battle of Armageddon, with wonderfully graphic pen tells us of the men rushing to battle, and of how "the chariots ... shall jostle one against another in the broad ways seem like torches .. run like the lightnings" (Nahum 2:3-4). He saw the battalion of swiftly-flying, electrically-brilliant, armored-cars running with frightful speed at and against like fleets of

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similar cars coming the other way. But God let the world become six thousand years old before He allowed man to bring out the air-ship and the automobile. The Day of the Lord is close at hand. The prophet Daniel says that in "the time of the end, many shall run to and fro and knowledge shall be increased" (Dan. 12:4). Until the year 1800 Abraham, although nearly four thousand years asleep would have gotten along well if he had come back again to life. He would have found men traveling in sail boats and animal-drawn vehicles, women shearing the sheep or picking cotton off the seed by hand, and with their fingers carding, spinning and weaving it, thus making it into cloth from which they prepared their garments, also by hand. He would have found hurried messages sent by riders on swift beasts; meals cooked over an open fire with no stoves or matches. In fact when he got acquainted with gunpowder and moveable types he would have caught up with a community from which he had been separated for say 3800 years. But in the end, Daniel said, knowledge shall be increased. Because this is the end is the reason changes in everything come so rapidly. If Rip Van Winkle had gone to sleep in 1906 and wakened today he would have had tremendously more to surprise him than would Abraham have had awaking in the year 1800. Yes, knowledge has been increased unbelievably. Take a half hour and try to think how things would be if men still did not know how to build power dams, air ships, submarines automobiles, typewriters, telephones, radio sets, if they still did not know about gasoline, electricity, radium, high explosives, poisonous gasses, compressed air, and the widely diversified chemical wonders that mark this as the most amazing score of years of the world's history.

Many run to and fro. Submarines, steam ships, sail boats, air ships, bicycles, motor cycles, buggies, wagons, trains, street cars, horse-drawn, gas-driven, electrically-driven, over-head, surface and subway cars, enable people to run to and fro, and they are doing it. The end is at hand.

Men Are As Paul Told Timothy They Would Be in the Last Days. My time is up, space all used. No time to tell how men's hearts are failing them for fear all over the world, thus showing we are in the end (Luke 21:26). Just a few words about Timothy. Get 2 Timothy 3:1-5 and see how well it describes the people of this end time. Look especially at verse five. Nearly everyone is a church member, but nearly everyone denies the power of God to heal or keep from sin.

"IF THEY DRINK ANY DEADLY THING, IT SHALL NOT HURT THEM"

About two and a half years ago, while we were living on a ranch about four miles from Modesto, Calif., my baby, who was about a year and a half old, was out in the yard. Suddenly we heard awful screaming, and running out we discovered he had climbed up and gotten the lye and had his mouth full of it. He was in such agony it looked as though he would go into convulsions. I was almost paralyzed with horror, having a greater dread of lye than of almost anything else, for I knew of some awful deaths from it. No one will ever know how I suffered, my loving companion having gone home to his dear Lord not many weeks before this; and now this seemed more than I could bear. And it was, but, praise Jesus, He bore it for me.

I had been in Pentecost only a few months, and had no knowledge of divine healing before that time. But God had opened my eyes to these new truths so plainly written in God's Word that a child can understand them. Previous to my child getting the lye, God had one day filled my two sisters, myself and my husband with the Holy Ghost. I had seen some wonderful healings and had heard many testimonies, and had decided I could trust the Lord to the limit. But this kind of healing I had heard nothing of. I knew there was a verse in Mark that said, "If they drink any deadly thing it shall not hurt them." I was tempted to use remedics, and call a doctor, but I knew too well what he would do; and if it wasn't fatal, his mouth would be disfigured and probably he would never talk. I tried to wipe some of it out of his mouth, but the skin and flesh came off badly and it was bleeding. My little girl had gone immediately and phoned our pastor at Modesta Mission, Brother Valdez.

I picked the baby up, carrying him about the place, and we were all praying, and I was saying over and over the verse, "If they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them." In a very few minutes his lips were swoolen almost an inch thick and turned inside out, presenting a terrible sight. I put his head over my shoulder so I would not see his face.

Suddenly he stopped screaming and laughed. I looked at him and the look on his face showed platnly that the pain was gone. I am sure it was less than five minutes when the swelling had also entirely gone away. How I praised God! I don't know whether he had swallowed any, but he was swallowing part of the saliv₂, and the part that ran down his chin left paths with the skin eaten away.

That was about noon Saturday, and he would not eat the rest of that day nor Sunday. He didn't seem to suffer any pain but his lips looked crusted over, and awful places showed inside his mouth and on his tongue. I was further tempted to get a physician when other loved ones came over Sunday, but God gave me grace to stand firm, although I couldn't understand at the time why the Lord didn't erase all signs as quickly as He removed the pain. I found afterwards it was for the glory of God and for a good testing for me.

Early Monday morning he awakened calling for mush, and when I looked at him I could hardly believe my eyes. Only just a small place on his lower lip that was not entirely healed over with new skin, just as soft and tender as though it had never been gone; and the small place soon disappeared, leaving not a scar nor any other effects. 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Agunumum

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Tuesday, August 12. Some of the saints have been attending prayer-meetings at the homes of Brother Heinlein and Brother Fornstone, first at one home and then the other, the meetings not being under my supervision. I wanted to know what was going on so I sent Sister Maggie Apperson over to the meeting a week ago last night.

I called on her the next morning and found that Brother Heinlein and Brother Fornstone, who have long been testifying to being baptized in the Holy Ghost, are saying now that they have the Baptism of fire. They say this puts them as far above where they were when they had only the Baptism in the Holy Ghost, as that Baptism put them above where they were when they were both merely church members, living along without victory over sin. They are exhorting the people who attend their meetings to seek this new experience, and warning them against the pastor and deacons because they are too "hard-boiled" and too set in their back-number ideas to seek God's best. They have been looked upon as good enough men for the deacon's office, but being considered unstable and somewhat unwise, they have never been elevated to that position. The kind of lives they have lived gives them much persuasive power with certain sick sheep. Jesus said His sheep will not follow the voice of strangers, and that is true in Palestine of four-legged sheep generally speaking, but a sick sheep will follow anyone. This curious fact, instead of injuring the force of the parable, makes it the more striking when we see certain under-nourished, deformed or crippled members following off at the voice of strangers. But the shepherd must seek even the sick sheep.

I had an experience in Sparta with some folks who got sanctified as they claimed after they received the Baptism, which, they said, made them much better than the rest of us. They became quite a thorn in our flesh. David was worried with the same sort evidently, for in the sixty-fourth Psalm God inspired him to pray, "Hide me from the secret counsel of the wicked;...who whet their tongue like a sword,...that they may shoot in secret at the perfect." Spiritual pride over real excellencies of character is bad enough and hard enough to deal with, but when you have spiritual pride over what is really a fault but believed to be a grace, then you are at issue with the essence of Satanic sagacity. So I had good reason to move cautiously.

Of course I had no objection to anyone getting what they call "the Baptism of fire." Personally I have not experienced any sensation of physical fire, but many delightful people testify to having done so. Neither do I object to anyone declaring that he has been sanctified since he was baptized in the Spirit. I am not a controversialist, and if a brother is loving and tender, worshipful and humble, constantly seeking for a closer walk with God, he can testify to almost anything in the way of experiences and not disturb me at all. If however, someone claims an unusual experience and shows an intolerant spirit, condemning those who do not see eye to eye with him, upbraiding the preacher for not preaching the new thing and declaring that saints who do not get his experience are failing God, then, if I am the pastor, operations will begin.

I decided not to say a word until God gave me the witness that His time to speak had come. I spent two days in special prayer for these men, that God would not only silence them and disabuse their minds of their error, but save them from making shipwreck of faith. Last night my prayer was much longer protracted, so that at four this morning I was still crying to God. But at that time, He let me know that He had heard my cries and seen my tears and He lifted the burden. When morning came I pre-pared to call on Brother Heinlein. I went in the full conviction that he would crumple up when I talked to him, just as the walls of Jericho went down, before the command of Joshua, given in faith.

After greeting him lovingly in his garage, where I found him, I told him I had come to bring him a very serious message from the Lord, and as it would naturally be very painful to him I wanted him to engage in earnest prayer with me. The Lord graciously gave me a tender, broken spirit in prayer, and he, too, was robbed of all the warlike spirit.

I said, "Brother Heinlein, I have spent many hours in prayer for your soul the past week. God has brought about in me a deep love for you, and a great pity. Listen, dear Brother, for your life. I will bring you a very short message, and then immediately leave you. Tomorrow, after you have had time to collect yourself and pray, I will come to see you again. OUT IN THE WET

First of all,---this is the beginning of the New Year, and in another five months the Monsoons will be upon us. Six of our families are living now in old grass houses that will never standanother rainy season. A few weeks ago the grass house, in which the buffaloes have been sheltered, went down, and the buffalo men and our animals have been sleeping under the trees since then. I hated to put the money into more grass buildings, but this week we have had three heavy rains. The buffaloes have been soaking wet all night and one has a tiny calf, so the buffalo man tells us that we must get the grass house built if we can't do better. The other houses will go down with the first heavy storm, and our Christians will be homeless, unless we do something very quickly. We are praying that we may be able to put up a row of good brick quarters for all that will stand until Jesus comes. They are praying so earnestly and have stood with us so patiently, surely the answer must come soon.

Then in the School as you know we have but one dormitory and up to date we have made it meet all needs, but there are 84 out there now. We have just taken in 5 new girls this week from the Chapra station, daughters of preachers there, and others are expected. The long dormitory veranda cannot accommodate more than 45 beds at the best, and the 84 are crowded into six rooms, and all classes are held on the sleeping porches. This is all right for the present but we just must have the other dormitory built before the rains break in June, for then no girls can sleep out in the open, and it is not fair to them or the school to crowd them into rooms that are too small.

Then, the old mud cook-house is about ready to tumble down. All of the dear Pentecostal missionaries are uniting with us to make this, our official girls' school, a real success. They are taking their girls and the daughters of their Christian workers out of other schools and putting them here, and it is only fair to them all to make this the very best school we can.

You would hardly have known Bettiah, had you been with us this Christmas, so different was it from the year before when we had the privilege of entertaining our Missionary Secretary through the holidays. We had so many gifts sent in from friends in many lands for Christmas day that all hearts were made glad and there was little disappointment. We were able to give over 750 pounds of rice to the poor who gathered, beside warm shawls, blankets, and garments. For our own Indian Christians, there was a loaded tree, dolls for every child who wanted a doll and bright ribbons for the older girls, useful gifts for all the Christians and helpers, and grateful hearts and very happy faces on every side. We also had a very precious New Year's day-a Watch Night service in

the Mission House, when the Spirit of the Lord drew near and we were melted in His presence. Brother Harry Waggoner and his wife are coming over in February for some special meetings and we are looking to God for a time of blessing. We will be so glad if you will pray for us.—Marguertte Flint, Bettiah, India.

"His name shall be called Wonderful." A prominent minister in Canada relates the following remarkable instance of God's miraculous care over His people. Some time ago on a stormy night I was suddenly impressed to go to the distant house of an aged couple, and there to pray. So imperative was the call that I harnessed the horse and drove to the spot, fastened the horse under the shed, and entered the house unperceived by a door which had been left open. There kneeling down, I poured out my petition to God in an audible voice for His protection over the inmates, after which I departed and went home.

Months after I was visiting one of the principal prisons in Canada, and moving among the prisoners, was accosted by one of them, who claimed to know me. I had no recollection of the convict, and was fairly startled when the latter said, "Do you remember going to such a house one night, and offering prayer in the dark for the inmates?" I told him I did, and asked how he came to know anything about it. He said, "I had gone to that house to steal a sum of money known to be in the possession of the old man. When you drove into the yard I thought you were he, and intended to kill you while you were hitching your horse. I saw when you spoke to the horse that you were a stranger. I followed you into the house and heard your prayer. You prayed to God to protect the old people from violence of any kind, especially from murder, and if there was any hand uplifted to strike them that it might be paralyzed on the spot, and I have never moved it since. I left the place without doing any but am here now for other otharm. fenses."-Sel.

TERRIBLE PERSECUTION OF A KOREAN GIRL

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The children of Christian parents do not know what it costs the children of heathen parents to obey God's Word. The following story will show what it cost one of God's little ones to put Him first in her heart and life.

Chung Ai at the age of thirteen began to attend Sunday School. At fifteen she was born again, in one of the early morning prayer meetings held at the church in Kimhai. Chung Ai loved to attend every service on Sunday, and also the prayer meeting held every Thursday night. She purchased a Bible and hymn book, which she read at home whenever she had the opportunity.

One of the neighbors told Chung Ai's mother that she was too big to go to Sunday School, and urged her to keep her at home until she found a husband for her. Mrs. Kim thought this was good advice, and told Chung Ai she could not go to church any more. And, furthermore, they made arrangements for her to be married to an unbeliever. Chung Ai could not obey her parents in either of these things. She was learning more and more of the Word of God, and she knew she could not be happy with an unbeliever. Neither could she stay away from church, and, even though it meant severe persecution from her parents and eldest brother, she took every opportunity to attend the house of God. Her mother took her Bible and song book away from her and tore them into shreds. Chung Ai secured another, but again they were destroyed. Her mother pulled her around the room by the hair of her head, beat her until she was bruised all over, and then asked her if she would obey her and do as she wished. The girl replied, "No, mother, Jesus has saved me, and I must attend His house and worship Him. You can beat me until I die-then I shall go to live with Jesus forever.'

In Korea it is considered an awful disgrace for children to disobey their parents' wishes in this manner, so Chung Ai's parents decided to knock this disobedience out of her, and treated her so cruelly that she almost died. At different times they beat her with ironing sticks, they burned her with a hot iron, they tied her with ropes and pommeled her with sticks, they stripped off her clothing to prevent her from going to church, they locked her up in a barn for a week without food, and the last thing they did was to tie her up to the heam across the ceiling, while father, mother and brother beat her with ironing sticks until she was unconscious, and there they left her hanging. A neighbor came in and found her, saving, "Surely she is dead this time." She untied the girl, rubbed her cold body, gave her a drink and gradually brought her back to life.

After these awful beatings, Chung Ai would run away to church and weep and pray to Jesus. Well may we ask, "How did the girl bear all this?" Listen to what she said in her testimony: "I thought of Jesus suffering on the cross for my sins; I thought of the cruel nails that pierced His hands and feet; I thought of the sword that pierced His side, and the cruel crown of thorns on His brow; and the thought of my suffering Saviour gave me strength to bear every persecution for Him."

Chung Ai was taken to the home of the worker at Kimhai, and her body was so bruised that she could not lie down and rest. The pain caused her to groan out in her sleep. One night Jesus revealed Himself to her in a dream. She saw a figure robed in white stooping over her and touching her wounds gently. Twice this was done. The next morning, although the scars were there, all pain had vanished. Praise the Lord for His saving, keeping and healing power!

After Chung Ai had been away from home a few months, her mother came to see her and asked her to go home with her. She said, "Yes, Mother, if you will allow me to go to church and not urge me to marry an unbeliever." Her mother became furious, called her the most disobedient child, and said she would cast her off forever.

Yes, it costs to testify to the saving power of Jesus Christ, but some day Chung Ai will receive her reward if she remains faithful. Pray for her. She is nineteen years of age now, and is preparing to enter a Bible Institute in Seoul. —Oriental Missionary Standard.

CHRISTMAS CONVENTION AT NEW-AKA STATION LIBERIA, WEST AFRICA

"The Lord hath done great things for us; whereof we are glad." Psalm 126:3.

The daily petition and cry of our hearts had been for months that God would visit His people in a special way at this meeting. Our utter dependence upon God for His Presence and blessing and also for His leading and guiding hand in all the details pertaining to the meetings, seemed to be made more and more real as the time for the meetings drew near. We were not disappointed, for truly the Lord did help us in all the affairs and poured out His Spirit upon us.

We sent word to the native workers stationed out in the different tribes that we were planning to give a short course in Bible study just preceding the Convention and we wanted them to come if they could. Dec. 14 was the date set for the Bible school to begin. They began coming in several days before, while others were a little late getting here. Only one man was unable to come. He wrote and said that he could not come because his wife was sick but his heart was here in the meetings. How eager these native preachers and workers were to learn more of God's Word. There was so much to be crowded into these few days of Bible study that our heart cried mightily to God for a special anointing in teaching the Word and that the Holy Spirit would quicken their hearts and minds, enabling them to understand and retain at least a part of what we were studying. It was a great joy and blessing to teach them and to see them respond with such interest.

By the help of the Lord we expect to continue the Bible school work among the native workers. Plans are being made to send out a simple course of study to each of the native workers.

Then in the month of May they will gather here at Newaka for a review of this work and more intensive study on whatever Bible themes the Lord may lay on our hearts.

When we see these precious souls for whom Christ died reaching out their hands for the Gospel and for more of God's Word, truly one does feel repaid for their prayers and offerings and what little sacrifice (if it can be called sacrifice) one may be able to make for the Gospel's sake.

At the close of the week of Bible study the Convention began. The native Christains had gathered in from many different tribes, some coming from distant tribes several days journey away. As we watched the different little groups coming in for the Convention and most of them bringing others with them who were reaching out for the Truth and the Light, our hearts were stirred within us. Truly Ethiopia is reaching out her hands to God.

We do praise God for the revival spirit which began several days before the meetings. One of the girls who had come to join our mission family only a few weeks before was wonderfully saved. Since then, God has spoken to her in some remarkable ways. Also one of our oldest mission boys was baptized in the Spirit at that same service. What a wonderful change has come in his life since he has consecrated his all to the Lord and let Jesus baptize him in the Holy Spirit.

All the missionaries, except Mrs. Neeley and Miss White, who have the receiving station at Cape Palmas, were present at the meetings. We were sorry they could not be here. Miss Eustace and Miss Van Scoit with a goodly number of their mission boys and girls were the first to arrive here at Newaka. They had come from their station back in the Pahn tribe, about a 120-mile journey; it took them four days to make the trip by hammock.

Miss Nygaard and her mission family from Blebo station came next. Since Miss DeGroat returned to America on account of her health, Miss Nygaard 'has been We do praise God for the way alone. He is sustaining her and giving her health and strength for her many duties. Then came Brother and Sister Knoll from Nynabo station, with their native children. Later the same day Miss Erickson and her mission family came from Doyea station in the Hooyah tribe some twenty miles away from here. Our hearts did rejoice and praise God as we listened to her tell of the wonderful way God is blessing the work in that place. Because of a lack of workers she has been alone on that station since it was opened a year ago. We are so glad that Miss Martha Ramsey has come to us from America and is working with Miss Erickson now.

By the time all the native people had gathered in we had about 300 representing many different tribes.

The blessing of the Lord was upon the meeting from the first. How the people did come to the services. They would crowd into the little chapel until it was more than filled. Many hungry hearts sought the Lord, some for salvation, some for the Baptism in the Spirit and still others for their various needs. Truly the Lord was in our midst to meet our every need. Praise His name forever.

Great conviction rested upon some of the unsaved and they would cry to God for deliverance from their sins. I remember one woman especially who came

to the early morning prayer services. The Lord had given us a blessed time in prayer that morning and the presence of the Lord was very manifest in our midst. At the close of the service a few lingered in the chapel. Among them was this woman, sitting in the back of the church near the door. One of our mission boys came up to the front room and asked me to come, that this woman had something to say. Soon she was telling her story of how she had lived in one of the mission towns for several years but had never been saved. She said, "Oh, plenty devil live in my heart. All my heart study every day is to make plenty fuss and trouble." She began to weep as she saw herself such a sinner before God. Soon we were on our knees praying for her that God would forgive her sins for Jesus' sake, and give her a new heart that would want to keep God's law.

On Christmas day the baptismal service was conducted on the bank of a near-by stream. Nineteen were buried with Christ in water baptism. Pray for them that they may be true followers of Christ.

On Sunday morning Dec. 27 we had a blessed communion service. The afternoon message was on Divine Healing. At the close of the service many came forward to be prayed for. Oh, what a blessed sight to see these dear souls coming to Jesus for healing instead of going to the heathen devil doctor to get some kind of witch medicine, as they used to do before the Light of the Gospel shined into their darkened hearts. The offering taken up during the meeting amounted to \$72.00.

Such a sweet spirit of unity and fellowship prevailed throughout the meetings that we were sorry when they closed on Sunday night. But the work of winning souls for the Master leads us out in the highways and hedges where there are many still lost in the darkness of sin and shame. Who will come and help point them to the "Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world?"—Mary E. Martin.


