OU will find my text in John's Gospel, chapters fourteen, fifteen, sixteen and seventeen.

A friend of mine, a student of the Book, a man who not only knows the Book in the English language, but who is also familiar with the Old Testament Hebrew and the New Testament Greek, told me that in some of the older Greek manuscripts the fourteenth chapter of John's Gospel is placed after the seventeenth chapter. I do not know whether that is a fact or not, but I would like to call your attention to the teachings of the Lord Jesus in these chapters on the subject of the Holy Spirit as if they were placed in that order. In these chapters is recorded Jesus' last heart-to-heart talk with His disciples before He was crucified.

THE COMING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

HE SHALL TESTIFY—YE SHALL BEAR WITNESS

Let us look at them in the above named order. The first would be found in the fifteenth chapter and the twenty-sixth verse and the first clause of the twenty-seventh verse. "But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the Father, He shall testify of Me: and ye also shall bear witness."

I am going to suggest three words to take the place of that one little word "when" and yet not change the meaning of the word. I would suggest "at the time," because "at the time" means exactly the same as the word "when." "But when (or at the time), the Comforter is come, He shall testify of Me." "He *shall* testify of Me and ye also shall bear witness." The time of this text of Scripture calls for two distinct, different, and individual testimonies to be heard from the lips of every individual who receives the Comforter, the Holy Spirit, as a person to dwell with him: "He *shall* testify and ye also shall bear witness."

One of these testimonies must of necessity be divine, supernatural, heavenly in its origin, because it is a testimony of the Holy Spirit. The other one will be natural, human, earthly in its origin, because it is our own witness. "He shall testify"—"Ye ... shall bear witness."

Now the Gospels contain chiefly the record "of all that Jesus began both to do and to teach, until the day in which He was taken up." When you come to the Acts of the Apostles you at once find yourself in a different kind of book. It contains records of the acts of the Apostles after the Holy Ghost came. the acting-power, read the Acts of the It would not help us very Apostles. much in this case to go away back to the book of Genesis, because that is not the book of action; it is the book of beginnings. It tells us of the beginnings of all things. Neither would it help us to go to the book of Revelation, because that is the book of endings. It tells us about the final consummation of all things. But one little book in the midst of all the different books of the Bible tells us how people act when the Holy Spirit comes in. I thank God for these records of no uncertain sound.

We are going over to the book of Acts and we are going to find out if the record of what took place when the Holy Ghost came is in harmony with the teachings of Jesus with reference to the coming and work of the Holy Ghost. "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:1-4.

In London, Canada, not long ago, I was preaching on this very subject, and I quoted from the second chapter of Acts. There was a Greek student in my audience who, after the meeting was over, took me to task for quoting the King James version. He said, "A very poor version, brother, and I am going to give you the literal rendering. It ought to read like this, "And they all overflowed of the Holy Ghost." said, "That sounds good. They got so full of the Holy Ghost that they overflowed." I like that very much: "And they all overflowed of the Holy Ghost and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance."

When this was noised abroad the multitude rushed to the scene. Some

were amazed and said, "What meaneth this?" And others actually accused them of being drunk with wine. It became necessary for Peter to refute the erroneous things that were said. He said, "These are not drunken as ye suppose, . . . but this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel"; and then he started talking to them about Jesus. "Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by Him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know: Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crucified and slain. . . . This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses." Witnesses!

I want you to see how wonderfully the words of Jesus were fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost, as recorded in that second chapter of Acts. The Holy Ghost came and they were filled and overflowed with beautiful heavenly language. In other words the Holy Ghost testified Himself; and they who had received the Holy Ghost bore witness.

You will find the same story all through the Acts of the Apostles. In every instance on record in the Acts of the Apostles of individuals or groups of people receiving the Holy Ghost, the Comforter, to dwell with them, it states positively what the manifestations were. We read, "They spake with tongues"; and there was also another witness according to the records.

THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

HE WILL CONVICT OF SIN

Let us return once more to the teachings of Jesus in John's Gospel, placing the chapters in that particular setting. The next we would have on the subject would be in the sixteenth chapter, the seventh verse. "Nevertheless I tell you the truth; it is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unJu; but if I depart, I will send Him by you. And when He is come, He reprove the world of sin, and of ateousness, and of judgment."

I want you to notice that that little word "when" occurs the second time. When He, the Comforter, the Holy Spirit, comes, He will not only testify, but He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness and of judgment.

These are the teachings of Jesus; and I wonder if the teachings of the Lord Jesus on the subject are in h.rmony and keeping with what is recorded with reference to what actually happened when the Holy Ghost came. We left off with the second chapter of the Acts story, of the people receiving the Holy Ghost witness. Then we find, continuing the story, that the people came under great conviction and they cried out, "What shall we do?" And Peter said, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Cbrist for the remission of sins and

"I receive the gift of the Holy tot." Listen what comes next. "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls."

Notice the first thing that took place according to the teachings of Jesus and the Acts of the Apostles' record was a beautiful, heavenly, divine, supernatural testimony. The two things that took place were Holy Ghost conviction and Holy Ghost reproof. The teachings of Jesus and the Acts of the Apostles record are in complete harmony and unity.

HE WILL GUIDE INTO ALL TRUTH

Dropping down now to the thirteenth verse of the sixteenth chapter of John we read, "Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will shew you things to come." You notice that little word "when" occurs for the third time. When the Holy Ghost, the Comforter, comes, He will not only testify and reprove, but He will guide you into all truth, and He will show you things to come; He will glorify Jesus.

"He will guide you into all truth." One time I was in a certain place and there was a great controversy along some doctrinal line, and one good brother said, "You do not mean to tell me that the teaching I am holding is not true, because when I got my Baptism I was holding this teaching, and do you think God would have baptized me if what I was holding as truth was not truth?" Brother, sister, God does not baptize you in the Holy Spirit because you are in possession of all truth, but He gives you the Holy Spirit to guide you into all truth. And many folks who are all right down in their hearts are all wrong up in their heads. But when the Holy Chost comes, He does not stop at the head; He comes right down to the heart. He comes to abide and after He comes He will get you all straightered out and guide you into all truth as it is in Jesus, if you will let Him.

HE WILL SHOW THIN'S TO COME

When the Holy Ghost comes He will not only testify and eprove of sin and guide you into all tath (and sometimes it is harder to unlern than to learn, but the Holy Ghost is faith 4ful and will guide you into all trath). He will show you things to come. You show me an individual, or a group of people where the Holy Ghost has been poured out, and I will show you an individual or a group of people who are looking for the coming of the Lord. And then it goes on to say, "He shall glorify me:" or glorify the Christ. 1 love to get in the midst of a group of Spiriz-filled people, who, when you firow the meeting open for testimonies stand up and talk about, not the good things they are doing, but about the Lord. What is the secret? The Holy Ghost has come,

In Winnipeg a man stood up in a meeting and said, "I am a professor in one of the colleges. I heard about your claims, how you professed to have the Holy Spirit the same as they had Him in the days of the apostles; and I made it my business to investigate. I attended your meetings in Germany and in England, and then I came across to Canada and attended them here. 1 want to confess that these people who claim to have the Holy Ghost like in the early apostolic days certainly know how to glorify Jesus Christ in a way that nobody ever glorified the Lord Jesus Christ before in my presence."

I said, "There is one more evidence to the fact that what we have is exactly according to the early apostolic pattern. When I see an individual going down in humility before the Lord and seeking His face for the Holy Ghost, and notice a power coming upon that individual so that probably he shakes a bit, and I hear a beautiful language coming forth from his lips, there is good evidence that this individual has been filled full of the Holy Ghost. I watch that life a little closer and notice it moving out producing conviction, and causing other folks to turn to the Lord and to the truth because of the conviction. I say there is another evidence that that individual is filled with the Holy Spirit. And when I see that individual letting go some of his wrong teachings and twisted doctrines held heretofore, and taking up the Book and studying it

intil it opens up to him, there is another evidence of the filling of the S1 "it. Praise the Lord! When I see that individual shaping his life in control with that of Jesus, because he believes Jesus is coming soon, there is another evidence that the Holy Spirit dwells in that life. To watch closer and see him glorify the Lord Jesus, see that the whole trend of his life is to glorify Jest is, and there is still another evidence that he has received the gracious infolding of the blessed Holy Spirit.

HE WILL ABIDE

I believe the best-teaching on the subject of the Holy Spirit that can be found anywhere is in the last heartto-heart talk Jesus had with the disciples before He was glorified. Come with me just for a moment to the fourteenth chapter of the gosp-1 by John, sixteenth verse:

"And I will pray the Father, and H shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever, even the Spirit of truth."

Sometimes I hear folks speaking about the Holy Ghost, and they call Him the "Heavenly Guest." I do not like that term, because when the Holy Ghost comes He comes, not as a guest to pay a visit, but to take up His abode within you, to dwell and abide forever. He cannot come and move into rented property, neither does He come and dwell in property that has not been purchased, nor fully paid for. Bless the Lord, He moves into property that has been fully paid for; and the price that was paid was the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. He comes to abide forever.

HE WILL TEACH

Let us read one more verse, the twenty-sixth of the same chapter, "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in My name, He shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you."

I remember a short time ago a young man got wonderfully filled with the Holy Ghost and friends tried their best to turn him away from this new experience, but he was not to be turned. As a last resort they invited the pastor to come down and talk to him. His mother said, "We have tried to help you, so we have asked the pastor to talk to you." The pastor was a man who studied other kinds of books than the Bible. Well, that young man floored the pastor. Do you know why? Because he was filled with the Holy Ghost, and when he read the Bible he believed everything he found therein. He just told the preacher what he had found in the Book.

Undershepheres

"Lovest thou Me? Feed My sheep." Here is indicated a most important relationship of the pastor to the church, that of a shepherd. Jesus, the "chief Shepherd and Bishop of our souls," addresses Himself to one who is soon to easter a flock. "Lovest thou Me, Peter? Then feed My sheep."

Three things are outstanding in the above text. First, the pastor must be possessed of a deep, strong love for the great Shepherd. It was not the love born of human impulse that Jesus challenged in Peter. Peter had already expressed that, and it had utterly failed to support him in the crisis which he faced at Pilate's judgment hall. Such a love could never carry him through the great responsibilities that God was about to lay upon him as an undershepherd. It was not because he did not have love that he failed, but it was because he did not possess the right kind of love. The love that Jesus asks for is not fondness of heart. It is a deep, divinely-inspired, all-absorbing passion for Christ, a passion that puts Him first in everything. "For I am determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and Him crucified.'

Second, the pastor must recognize that as an undershepherd, the flock over which he exercises care is not his but the Lord's: "My sheep." Hence, his responsibility is to administer his charge as unto the Lord. "Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock." How many pastors give indications of having a sense of personal proprietorship! After one has labored hard, bringing in new converts, and building up the church, it is but the natural thing that he looks upon the church as his. Such a ministry is not without its rewards, but how much greater the results when the ministry is entirely motivated by divine love. Consecrated human love may lead souls within the door of the fold, but only the love of the great Shepherd Himself, within the heart of the undershepherd, can lead the convert into deep fellowship with Christ.

Third, possessed of a deep love for the great Shepherd and conscious of His proprietorship of the fold, the pastor will exercise the greatest of care and wisdom to feed the sheep and lambs even as the great Shepherd would. As a good shepherd he will go before his sheep, seeking the best of pasture. His own desires will be laid aside in his great desire to feed the sheep as Christ Himself would feed them. An assembly as a whole cannot rise higher in spiritual power, blessing and usefulness than its pastor. The quality of spirituality manifest in the lives of the people therefore depends largely upon the kind of spiritual food they receive from him. He will only be able to feed them in proportion to the degree that he himself has been feeding.

How important then it is for a pastor to be brought by the Holy Spirit to a realization of his true and sublime relation to the Lord Jesus Christ and to the church, as an undershepherd. It will clear his vision and deliver his heart from the subtle perversion of spiritual power into human effort. "For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who coramanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in earthern vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us."

"And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away."

OSSIBLY one of the greatest elements of perfection in the faultless character of the Lord Jesus Christ was the consummate balance which He maintained in every situation.

When temped of the devil to cast Himself down from a pinnacle of the temple He gave the significant reply, "It is written AGAIN" (Matt. 4:7); and saved Himself by a balanced use of the Scriptures that refused to be rushedinto an act of fanaticism by the quoting of an isolated text.

While fully sharing in the joy of the seventy disciples because they had discovered that even the

demons were subject to them through His Name, yet He quickly sensed the danger of an excited exultation through the flush of success, and deftly turned their joy into the more sober, yet safer channel of rejoicing because their names were written in heaven (Luke 10:20).

In teaching He shows the same element of perfect equipoise. The negatives and positives are always presented in a balanced proportion. For the Son of God there can be no blurring of moral issues and future destinies: life is running along one of two roads, either a broad or a narrow way, and the end is either life or death, heaven or hell. His longest recorded discourse ends with a balanced picture of two men, one building on sand and the other on rock,-one negative, the other positive. All is clear.

Not only are His logical faculties entirely balanced in their functioning, but the emotional side of His nature is equally perfect in its poise. Take for instance the intense emotion displayed in that terrific crescendo of "Woes" in Matthew 23, consummating in the blazing utterance of verse 33, "Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell?" Yet this is no unbalanced raving of a disappointed enthusiast. Immediately He drops into tones of exquisite tenderness, and in all literature there are probably few gems to compare with, Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!" Even in strong emotion the balance is perfect.

Incidentally it also reveals that balance does not necessitate insipidity. Burning zeal and enthusiasm only become the more irresistible when guided and controlled by a steady hand. Balance must ever be one of the essentials of true greatness.

What of ourselves? Balance must always be one of the deepest necessities of men and women filled with the Holy Spirit, otherwise the very intoxication of Pentecost may ruin their usefulness. (a) Spiritual Gifts.

Balance is needed here. The old unbalanced love of the Corinthian believ-

pressive, but actually the least edifying of the supernatural gifts of the Holy Spirit has usually shown itself once again wherever His presence is manifested openly, and in power. There is the old tendency to place "Tongues" above "Prophecy"; and then to rank "Prophecy" even above the "Word of Wisdom" or the "Word of Knowledge"; and in general principle to admire and value gifts of eloquence and of sensational appeal rather than ministries that appeal more directly to the will.

But where prophetic ministries, whether by "Tongues" or otherwise, have been indulged in overmuch, and to the despising and neglecting of other ministries, there has always come and there always will come, a swing of the pendulum to the other extreme so that the Spirit is quenched, and from having too much of this form of ministry and manifestation assemblies swing to the opposite extreme of never having it at all. The old word of wisdom in Prov. 25:16 is fulfilled again, "Hast thou found honey? Eat as much as is sufficient for thee, lest thou be filled therewith, and vomit it." This is ex-actly what has happened. Yet a balanced observance of the inspired suggestion of 1 Cor. 14:27, "two or at the most three," would probably have maintained this beautiful manifestation of the Spirit of God in the Assembly in a profitable and inspiring counterpoise with other ministries in the Spirit and thus fulfilled the will of God.

(b) Doctrines."Teachers" are just as prone to lack of balance in their own line of ministry as are the "prophets" in theirs. The easiest thing in the world is to "prove" (?) some line of personal doctrine by appealing to a few scattered texts up and down the Bible that all look one way,-and conveniently ignoring scriptures that present an opposite side of truth. The depth of such a nauseous method is reached when the so-called teacher becomes dogmatic!

Truth in the Bible is largely contained in apparently contradictory statements; and the searcher for a truly balanced presentation of doctrine must prayerfully and humbly, in utter dependence upon the Holy Spirit, learn the painstaking art of comparing Scrip-

ture with Scripture antil he has seen the subject of light streaming upon it from absolutely opposite angles of divine revelation. In the process he will probably lose mos of his dogmatism, but gain much in humility, reverence and love.

(c) Ministries.

The Lord's gifts to His church for her ministry consist of "some ers for the outwardly showy and im- apostles and some prophets, and some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers" (Eph. 4:11), and taken together these constitute all that we need for a well-rounded growth by which the whole body is compacted by that which every joint supplieth. Yet how prevalent is over-emphasis on some favorite line of ministry,-usually either the evangelistic or the doctrinal, and occasionally the inspirational. Such over-emphasis becomes still more serious when it is accompanied by a downright despising of other types and lines of God-given ministry.

Some assemblies, usually gathered around a leader who is a teacher, and who together love logical and thoughtout methods of ministry, become little more than Bible schools, and have no time for the aggressive evangelist, whom they dub as a mere "sensationalist" and look upon with a superior disdain!

On the other hand there are other assemblies, gathered together by a brother who is an evangelist, who seek to run their church the whole year round as if it were one continual revival campaign, and their assembly sadly lacks some of the most essential and beautiful elements of Christian fellowship which the Lord has ordained for His sheep once they are gathered into the fold. By such folks "teachers" are looked upon as "stodgy" and quite unnecessary, even unfruitful. They measure success by "results" which consist of statistics of numbers of "conversions," etc. Yet the fact is that sometimes such assemblies grow very little indeed, either in numbers or in any other way.

Others again, still unbalanced, erroneously think that genuine Pentecostal ministry must only be of a prophetic type, and would have no ministry but that of direct inspiration coming at the moment. They do not realize that inspiration comes in a variety of ways, and true teaching is as much from the Spirit as prophecy. Some-

The Busy Bee World-Wide Missions Program

It has been my privilege and pleasure to be a General Council Deputational Worker on behalf of the Busy Bee Plan for the past year and a half. During this interval I have traveled from the Gulf of Mexico to Portland, Me., and from the Atlanti Coast to Oklahoma, I have presented this program in eight different districts and to one hundred and fifty assemblies. I have talked at length with district chairmen, home and visiting ministers, missionaries and church laymen and I have been surprised to find out that very few of them understand anything about this plan. The general attitude of all seems to be, "What's it all about?" It is with this thought in mind that I might be able to help some who read the pages of the Evangel to understand better "what it's all about" that I pen the following lines concerning the Busy Bee Plan.

The Sponsors of the Busy Bee Plan

The Busy Bee Plan is not the unexpected offspring of a tired mis-sionary's overwrought imaginative brain, sprung on a credulous Pentecostal people for the purpose of financing any particular missionary field. Nor is it the invention of any particular district which has hopes of exploiting it to that district's personal advantage. Nor yet is it the idea of one particular assembly which hopes to gain help in a monetary way from its usage. Who then are the sponsors of the Busy Bee Plan? None other than the General Council of the Assemblies of God itself! Realizing the need of minor changes in the present methods of financing the work at home and abroad if they were to accomplish all that God had put into their hearts to accomplish before Jesus returns again, sent the official brethren to much prayer and meditation about this matter. The Lord had, at the same time, given a world-wide missionary vision to one of our missionaries at home on furlough. This world vision comprehended the needs of both the home and foreign missionary work, and what is more, included a definite and simple plan for financing the world mission program. This was just what the official brethren were looking and praying for. After much thought, meditation and prayer, the Busy Bee Plan was fur-ther developed by them and presented to the brethren in fellowship with General Council ideals as fast as time and opportunity permitted: Therefore this

plan is one that was developed, sponsored and is now being propagated by the General Council itself. Naturally it has all the influence and authority of the General Council behind it in its presentation.

No one with an honest heart can deny that our present method of socalled "free-will offerings" could be greatly improved in various ways. Only about twenty-five per cent of Pentecostal churches are putting forth any missionary effort worthy of the name and of this percentage only about fifty per cent of the membership are carrying the burden. This is a deplorable state of affairs! Much of this indifference is due to lack of missionary zeal, this lack of zeal is due to lack of proper scriptural teaching or training by those in authority and this lack of training is largely due to the leader's lack of a definite, practical, scriptural plan for their membership to unitedly work together under. The Busy Bee Plan now being offered supplies the outlet for real missionary training and this in turn permits an expression of missionary zeal on the part of all in the assembly whether

they be old or young, male or female, rich or poor, educated or ignorant, white, black, yellow, brown or red!

What Does the Busy Bee Plan Consist Of?

The Missionary Busy Bee Program consists chiefly in a visit to the local assembly by a deputational worker. During the service there will be a song and prayer service, after which the worker will bring a message on "missions," then the Busy Bee Plan will be introduced and, if opportunity be afforded, the meeting can close with a consecration service. It is my thought here to speak only of the plan as the other parts of the service are familiar to all.

Briefly then this plan is this:--to get every one in the assembly to give something for missions even if it only be five cents a week. As the name implies we use the natural bees bringing their drops of honey to the bee-hive to make the honeycomb as an illustration of the children of God bringing their means, whether same be large or small, into God's treasury. A slip is provided each member which reads in part, "I shall honestly endeavor with the help of the Lord to lay aside out of my income regularly as I receive it the sum under which I have marked X." Under these words are a number of squares marked out with such numbers as 5, 10, 25, 50, 75, 1.00, 5.00, etc., printed in them. Directly under these numbers are empty squares. The member marks an X in the empty space under one of these numbers. This signifies that the one marking the X under one of these numbers will endeavor to lay aside that amount each week for missionary work the world over.

Thus a scriptural, systematic, and orderly plan is presented to the saint to work on. To all who take one of these slips a small bank in the form of a bee-hive is given. This is placed in the home and each week the stated amount is laid aside. Once a month the saved-up money is brought to the local assembly and placed in the mis-

sionary offering. This money is then forwarded to the General Council for proper distribution for home and foreign missionary work.

Some Objections to the Busy Bee Plan

Naturally there will be some objections to the above plan (however none that cannot be eliminated with reasoning and prayer) and I list below a few of the more important ones and my answers to them ;- this plan includes a pledge or vow; it takes away our direct contact with the foreign worker; it does not permit us to designate our funds; it makes us too "denominational" and we have our own system which has worked out "good enough" so far. No doubt there are others but these few come to mind now and are typical of the others. Let us consider briefly these objections and see if additional light cannot be thrown on them.

The first and main objection seems to be the matter of a pledge. Personally I favor a pledge for four definite reasons. In the first place I believe it to be scriptural. The Apostle Paul taught his converts to pledge assistance to the Jerusalem brethren when he knew that a famine would inconvenience them shortly (Acts 11:29-30. Note the word "determined" carries with it the meaning "pledged.") There are also other indications that pledges were made and collected a year later, by the early disciples (2 Cor. 8:6, 10 and 9:5). Secondly it is natural to pledge, as witness the numbers of saints who pledge to make monthly payments on automobiles, rented houses, furniture, etc. In the third place a reasonable pledge helps to steady a man, or woman, in his God-given responsibilities as perhaps nothing else will do. A crude illustration of a man before marriage and after will help drive this point home ;---that is, before marriage the man can come or go without a special feeling of responsibility, but after marriage the responsibilities of home life steadies him greatly. True, it is a burden of love he assumes, and so every true pledge made to God is a burden of love. Lastly God's richest blessings seem to abide upon the ones who determine to have a system about their giving. Therefore if this plan embraced a pledge system I should still advocate it. However, note that it reads only that you will "honestly endeavor" to give to God and this means that should anything interfere with your income you need not longer worry about your "pledge" to give weekly. Hence this cannot be called a pledge or vow and no condemnation could come to one unless one backslide to a place where one would not make an honest endeavor to

keep up the good work they commenced in the Lord.

The second objection concerns removing the direct contact already established with the missionary on the field. The reply to this is that it need not do any such thing. The General Council sends money to missionaries all over the world, therefore, can forward your money as speedily and economically as possible. At the time your money is forwarded to the Council just notify the missionary you are interested in that you are forwarding him so much money through the General Council and ask him to acknowledge same. Thus contact with the individual is not cut off in any respect.

The third objection expresses fear that under this plan funds that had formerly been specified for certain missionaries could no longer be sent this way. This is a misunderstanding on the part of many. Funds may be designated for the particular missionary, or missionaries, that the church, or individual, may be especially interested in. The Council will see that all designated funds are faithfully forwarded to the ones specified regardless as to who they are.

The next objection is one voiced by certain true and false brethren alike. The former are dear saints who have come out from under denominational yokes and have experienced the glorious liberties of the sons of God. These people honestly fear slipping back to the old ruts. Such truly have our sympathetic understanding. Yet there need be no fear of denominationalism for this plan still permits our souls to be wide, free and open toward heaven! No bondage, no condemnation, no hard and fast rules about this plan but simply an honest endeavor to do things in a scriptural way (1 Cor. 16:1-4). The General Council is in existence, not in order to make us a denomination, but because a similar method of godly government seemed to be sweetly and harmoniously functioning in the early apostolic times ;---so, too, this present innovation is being offered to Christians, not in order to make them denominational, nor yet to return them to the old wearisome paths they once trod, but rather to restore them to ways and means of financing God's work that Paul and other apostles would heartily approve of were they here to-day! The false brethren mentioned (and Paul had many to contend with in his day) are folks that spread this thought of sectarianism among honest hearts in order to cover up their bent for spiritual licentiousness. Scriptural teaching and methods sacrificed on the altar of selfwill! Rom. 16:17 tells us to "mark" such and "turn away from them."

The last objection, i. e., our own system is "good enough," is a contradiction of history and experience. There is nothing so good that it cannot be improved upon! Inventions that were good enough ten years ago are now obsolete ;---experiences that thrilled our souls a few years ago we now know to be but the gateway to greater things in God :---church meth-ods that at one time worked divinely are now inadequate to handle the situation. As in the business world there is progress, as in nature there is development, as in social life there is an upward trend, as in spiritual realms there is ever a forward movement, so in church methods there is a continual improvement in the Lord! As, perhaps, there was a romantic, sentimental side to the horse-drawn fire engines of last year and none to the present swift, efficient motor engines, so there may not be in this present Busy Bee plan the romance, glamour and heart throbs we found in the old way of giving free-will offerings, yet it is practical, systematic, efficient and scriptural :---therefore to say that the old way is "good enough" when something better has been presented lays the assembly making this statement open to the suspicion of being selfish.

There is another unlisted objection to this plan and that is that some are not able to help financially. However, as the smallest sum is only five cents practically every one could sacrifice some little luxury and put themselves down for this small amount.

And so all reasonable objections can be met and overcome wherever honest hearts meet to find out God's will. Praise the Lord.

The Benefits of the Busy Bee Plan Some one, rather cynically, asked me one time, "Who benefits by this plan apart from the General Council?" freely admit that the Council is benefited by this idea, but offhand I know of others who are also deriving benefit from it, namely the whole mission cause, the local district, the local assembly and the individual himself! Greater financial income to meet the heavy drain on the treasury; closer co-operation between the foreign field and also the local assemblies; simplification of clerical duties as all assemblies unite on one way of forwarding money; etc., are some of the advantages to the Council. A larger income for the many needs; a steadier financial arrangement because of systematic giving and a new confidence that the whole movement is behind them in the place of the former few are some of the good points from the missionaries' viewpoint. Be a thorough Bible student. Study and pray it into your soul, and then give it out. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." 2 Tim. 2:15.

Means of Grace.

Faithfully attend church services and prayer meetings. You need all the help you can get so that you may be strong to assist others. The greatest blessing is to be a blessing, and that is to live for others. "Not forsaking the assembling of yourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another; and so much the more as ye see the day approaching." Heb. 10:25. "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice." Rom. 12:1.

Work.

Don't be a jerker, a growler or a kicker, but be a worker; faithful in all things great or small wherever you are. Be a soul winner. Do all the good you can, in all the ways you can, to all the people you can, and as long as ever you can. "Behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." John 4:35.

Being Practical.

Ask God to guide you in the ordinary affairs of life. Strive earnestly to understand aright what God says to you, and follow Him wheresoever He leads you, where you can be a worker and a blessing; be faithful in whatever you find to do for the Master. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord." 1 Cor. 15:58.

Quickly Arising Again.

If you should stumble or fall, do not lie there, but get up at once and go on. I recall slipping once on some ice, freshly covered with snow; but when I was down I did not stay down. I got up at once and went on, being more careful as to where I was going. If the devil fixes up some slippery place in your path and you fall, get up at once and *go on*. "Press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Phil. 3:14.

A Clean Life.

Don't follow questionable practices; cut loose from every known sin and every weight; abstain from all appearance of evil; be separate from the world and from worldly things. It pays to live right. "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." Heb. 12:1, 2.

a part of the home mission funds and the knowledge that their district has a solid, workable foreign missionary policy in operation. The increased missionary offerings, coupled with the realization that they are doing things in a practical, systematic and scriptural way should bring blessing to the local assembly. The individual prospers in spirit, soul and body as he earnestly endeavors to walk in the light as God shines it upon his pathway. Everybody and everything lacked woefully under the old method of financing God's work;—with the proper co-operation on the part of all this present plan will help all to have their needs supplied and none need to be in want.

Why I Believe in the Busy Bee Plan

As I said when I first began this article, I have had the opportunity to see this plan presented under every kind of circumstance, therefore, I think I am somewhat qualified to testify that I have the utmost confidence in the Busy Bee Plan, providing it is given any kind of a "break" by the saints. If I did not have this confidence in it I would cease to be a deputational worker at once. I believe in this plan because it is scriptural, systematic and practical; it stimulates missionary interest; it brings the saints to a fresh sense of responsibility; it seems to bring new spiritual blessings to those who adopt it; it increases, rather than decreases, the local church income; it enables every one to do something even though not much; it unifies our efforts for God; it brings fresh supplies to the missionaries and it glorifies the Christ! Some doubt its workableness but I do not. When a Chinese engineer of a railroad train in China was asked by a rather credulous country farmer whether or not that tiny locomotive could haul that great, long, heavy train, he nonchalantly replied, "Can do." So when a doubting Thomas wonderingly asks me if I really believe a simple little plan like the Busy Bee Plan can do the wonders I claim for it I, too, like the Chinese engineer, laconically reply, "Can do." And it can too for it has God's seal of approval on it and anything that God approves cannot fail. The Busy Bee Plan has worked, is working and will work! Give it a chance.

Spurgeon once visited a friend who had built a new barn, on the weather vane of which was this text of Scripture, "God is love." He said to the man, "What do you mean by putting that text of Scripture on the weather vane? Do you mean that God's love is as changeable as the wind?" "Oh, no," was the reply. "I mean to say that God is love whichever way the wind blows!" It will be well to remember this when the next gale of adversity sweeps down upon you.— Gospel Message.



To do as above described is entirely a work of the flesh, and an abuse of a precious gift, and it is most doubtful that either the languages or the interpretation of the same would be at all correct.

259. What is the meaning of broidered hair in 1 Tim. 2:9?

Broidered means braided, but I am sure it is not meant to forbid presentday braiding of the hair, but was a rebuke to worldliness and personal adorning not consistent with Christian sobriety. It does not forbid braiding the hair, but forbids considering braided hair an adornment. Christians are to depend on their meek and quiet spirit for their adorning.

times this error is pushed to an extreme where all the affairs of the church are run by so-called "prophets," under a delusion that in this way the mind of the Lord is received in unmixed purity. How little they have noticed 1 Cor. 14:29, and that the human mind can inject itself quite as much into "prophesying" as it can into teaching !

No, we need *all* the ministries the Risen Christ has given to His church. They counterbalance each other, they complement each other; they are all equally honorable, and to be desired. Without any one of them our progress is lopsided and questionable.

In the balance of infinite variety, and even of apparently conflicting elements we see the divine wisdom for the meeting of the diverse needs of the whole human race; while in the balance, by divine grace, of our own souls we lay the foundation for an ordered progress which is building for eternity "Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ" (Eph. 4:13).—D. G., at C. B. I.

HOW TO HELP EVANGELIZE INDIA

It is generally recognized that one of the best ways of reaching a people with the gospel message is through the testimony of those who are of the same language and nation. Paul had this principle in mind when he said "unto the Jews I became as a Jew that I might win the Jews." In order, therefore, to follow the Scriptural injunction and be followers of Paul as he was of Christ, we are endeavoring in every way possible to encourage native evangelism. That is to say, we are desirous of helping equip the Africans to become preachers to their own people, the Chinese to theirs, and the Indians to the people of their own nation also. It is reasonable to believe that people will listen to one of their own race and tongue more readily than they will accept the testimony of a foreigner.

God has graciously saved a number of fine young men and women in India who are all on fire to preach the gospel, but at present they are untrained and untaught in the truths and practices of the Scripture, so that our missionaries in that land are appealing to the home field that help may be sent to establish a Bible school for the training of these young people whom God has called to preach the gospel. The location for the school has already been decided upon and now our missionaries are praying earnestly that the necessary funds may be forthcoming to build. Native preachers can be trained and equipped at considerably less expense than a foreign missionary, so that from the natural standpoint this would seem to be a way in which to get quick return for money invested.

Perhaps individually we do not feel able to do much, but if every *Evangel* reader would purchase a brick for the new Bible school at the price of one dollar, we should have the building and fittings paid for and everything in readiness to do business for God. Let us pray over this need and do what we can as the Lord prospers us in a material way so that the Bible school for India may become an established fact.

GOOD NEWS FROM PERU Lief Erickson

There are a few words, spoken by our Lord Jesus, which have ever rung in my heart since first I looked upon the whitened harvest fields of Peru. The words are these: "I must work the works of Him that sent Me while it is day," and these words burn in my heart with the greater vehemence because of the words that follow and which so intensify the meaning, "For the night cometh, when no man can work."

This vast mountainous country seems to stand as a great fortress against the mercy of God; but one by one God is getting souls for His name. When we entered the warfare we looked for opposition from the enemy, but we didn't go to war at our own cost expecting to use ordinary methods. If we had trusted in carnal methods, though never so clever, we should have been ashamed and confounded long since. But we came trusting in Him who raiseth the dead, and the Lord God has helped us.

If you could get a glimpse of these fields and the thousands that are perishing for the Bread of life, and see the joy that comes to a soul that finds Christ, and the sweet. Christian spirit of those who go on with God, it would stir your heart as nothing else in the world could stir you.

On July 14th we had a baptismal service such as I think is seldom seen, at least in this country. We baptized fourteen converts. The number is not so large, but what we praise the Lord for is that all except one had been previously baptized in the Holy Spirit and fire. As they entered the water the glory of God came upon them and we were all lifted into the heavenlies.

Oh, brethren, pray for us and for the salvation of souls here! Souls cannot be saved without prevailing prayer, and the missionary's strength does not reach far in comparison with the need. Besides we have no end of duties, and it takes strength to teach and preach. Surely many people could throw their lives into the work even without coming here personally—through intercessory prayer. If one will give himself up to God and wait before Him, he will soon have all the spirit of prayer that his physical strength will stand, and God will work accordingly.

REJOICING IN TRIBULATION Grace C. Agar

Mengtse, Yunnan Province, China

We have opened a work in the newgrowing town of Mi-la-ti and my coworker and I take turns in going to the large city of Mengtse for weekend meetings. We have also charge of Amicheo. These three towns are on the railroad. The Mengtse plain is extensive with many villages. Market day at Mengtse is important, bringing to town people from these villages. We have an evangelist at Mengtse. This territory is immense and only two missionaries in it. O Father, work and breathe upon this field!

Last Friday I went by train to Mengtse and the Lord led me to the home of a Christian family there who were very kind. The father told me of the wonderful deliverances he had had three times from robbers during the last two years. He had been attacked and struck with a sword but his thick leather belt protected him; the second blow cut his fountain pen in two; and the third blow of the sword fell upon the thick leather covers of his Bible in his pocket and his life was saved. Later the Lord gave him a dream that so startled him that he left town. A letter came from neighbors congratulating him that he had gotten away safely for robbers had been banging at his door demanding his life. Not long ago, in July, Mengtse had been seized by robbers, who shut the city gates for a week against the soldiers opposing them from the outside. They threatened to burn the city if the soldiers entered. Mr. Heo and family spent the time on their knees and negotiations were made between the robbers and soldiers and the former left. Mr. Heo is full of praise to God for these three deliverances.

On Saturday evening and Sunday our little chapel was packed, and we preached, the evangelist and I, for about two hours during each of the three Sunday meetings. The Christians also gave good testimonies, especially the young blind woman. She said, "It is now ten days since my child died but I have great peace and am so comforted. I could never stand it if I did not have Jesus." Stone blind and bereaved; yet with shining face and bright testimony, she lifts the meetings, and the heathen are touched. She entered into the kingdom through much tribulation. She was often beaten by her mother for attending at the Gospel Hall but she kept on with great joy in her heart. Her mother died but she finally accepted Christ before she died. The blind girl was baptized and has lately received the Baptism with the Holy Spirit.

The enemy stirs up the children outside to whistle, clap their hands and shout while our meeting goes on but they finally leave and we are stirred by this opposition to preach all the more earnestly and pull all the harder for souls.

BACK IN PORTO RICO Lena S. Howe

When we disembarked at Porto Rico the people gave us a lively welcome. There were a good number at the landing. In the evening they had a special service and a number came in from other places. One of the young people gave a message of welcome and also the pastor who comes once a week to take a service. I responded, this being the station I have been working at for some years. Brother Finkenbinder also spoke as he is well known here and much loved. Miss Fomey, a new missionary, also spoke a few words for Brother Finkenbinder to interpret. The blessing of the Lord was on the people. Brother Finkenbinder preached, and while preaching, one woman from a country district was wonderfully filled with joy. There was a message in tongues and interpretation through Brother Finkenbinder. At the close of the service, four sought the Lord for salvation. Sunday night there were some five or more seekers and about thirty for healing.

I am feeling better than I have for sev-eral months and as I see this congregation of from two to four hundred people following on to know the Lord, I have reason to thank God, take courage, and run the race, faithfully till the end. There are a number who have been saved for several years and who know what it means to live a clean life, following after holiness and having the Baptism with the Holy Spirit according to Acts 2:4. These carry on work in some eight outstations. There is a host of younger ones who are following on in the same way.

The poverty here is touching, always worse. So there is poverty in the work. It is trying but I had rather see abundance of grace and scarcity of money than abundance of money and scarcity of grace. Pray for us, for the native church, for the annual convention in January, for our health in soul and body.

OUR NEW BUILDING AT NINGPO Nettie D. Nichols

It is lovely to be really settled in our new quarters (a picture of which appears on the front page of this issue), and have room enough to move about after being so packed in such small quarters as we were. It is such a relief for the children to have good, large, airy dormitories and they are also so happy. What a great difference in the air and how comparatively little we feel the heat in our new building and it is such a comfort to sleep higher up above the ground level out of the dampness! We feel like new people. Praise the Lord for all His goodness to us. Please stand with us in prayer for the balance needed to complete payments so that when dedicated it may be free from debt for God's glory. God has done marvels already and He will complete what He has begun, but there are many adversaries, calling for the united prayer that defeats the power of the enemy and brings victory. All summer despite the heat the Sunday services have been well attended. The Lord certainly is in our midst working in hearts and lives.

For several weeks past each night we have been having open air gospel meetings which are also well attended. After this service each night we have a Bible study class for Christians and God is deeply meeting us through His Word and giving a real love for the Word. Praise His Name! During the Sunday afternoon service a children's service is held so that the older folks can

sit undisturbed and hear His Word while on the other hand the children can get more from a service adapted to their ages. Sister Chang and Sister Bloom have the service. Last Sunday they had a testimony meeting and a number of the children testified to God's grace to them. Some were healed in answer to prayer and others for other things gave thanks.

While the building has been in course of construction, He in a wonderful way has been preparing the congregation and saving so many precious souls and setting many others to seeking the way. The fury of the enemy has been terrible but the Lord of hosts is with us to fight our battles for us and He bids us "Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might."

INSTANTLY HEALED BY THE POWER OF GOD

Testimony of Evangelist W. B. McCafferty, 1212 Denver Ave., Ft. Worth, Texas

I had suffered an infection of some kind in the left lung, which had caused considerable pain. This began in a small way sometime in the month of December or January-we will say January, 1915, as that was the month in which it became more noticeable. By February the pain had increased, but I kept on in my ministerial work, praying that the Lord would soon give relief. April and May came with the pain becoming more acute. In June and July I could preach only with difficulty. By August I, could not preach without becoming exhausted. In September I told my wife that it would be necessary to leave the field for a period of recuperation and rest. Accordingly we journeyed to my home in Ft. Worth, Texas.

Arriving at home we prayed earnestly that God would undertake for my recovery. The pain now was very severe and the suffering intense. Like Job, I was filled with "tossings to and fro until the dawning of the day." The enemy of our souls said: "There is no use in praying; you have prayed these many months without results. If God would heal at all, He would do so at your first prayer." But I remembered the lesson which Jesus taught on importunity in prayer, "that men ought always to pray and not to faint." Luke 18:1. We continued to trust and to pray with faith in His Word.

It was at this time that the voice of the Lord came-not audibly, but nevertheless real-saying, "Get thee back upon the field for service and I will heal thee." We tested this call, saying, "O Lord, if this is Thy voice speaking, cause that there shall come a call from the field for our services and we will go immediately." The next day there came a letter stating that in a certain locality the people were crying for a preacher, that they were all ready for a meeting, with a large tent stretched, and that I was wanted there to conduct the meeting. I had never been in that locality before-it was a new field. God had heard and had proved that it was His voice speak-

ing. There was nothing left for me to do but obey immediately,

Packing our trunks we left for our field of labor. This was in the month of November. The pain was even worse than ever before. I could not rest by day or by night, but God had spoken, and I must obey. Arriving at the station I could see the tent across the way. The saints of God were singing. With no time for preparation I launched into the service—preaching with the pain scemingly tearing me asunder.

The next day I kneeled at the altar in quiet prayer (alone in the tent), and prayed thus: "Lord, Thou hast said that on my coming back into service that Thou wouldest heal this affliction. Now, O God, according to Thy promise heal this terrible condition in my lung, and give us a revival in this place." There was no strain in the prayer-nothing seemingly different from the multitude of prayers which I had prayed for the same thing in the many months before, but oh, the result! Entering at the top of the left shoulder a warm wave of power went down through that afflicted lung, and I was instantly healed! Glory to God! From that good hour I have never suffered one moment of pain from that affliction. Truly Jesus is the same "yesterday, to-day and forever."

TRAINING FOR EFFICIENT SERVICE

At each of the District Councils a number of young men and women come forward for license or for ordination as preachers of the Word. Great care must be exercised by our people that in no smallest sense is the leadership of the Spirit defeated, and we have therefore been reluctant to refuse license or ordination to applicants therefor. Nevertheless it is our duty to remember that these young Christians are to be preachers of the Word, and are to stand before a lost and dying world as representatives of Jesus Christ and Ambassadors of God, and to endeavor, strictly through the Scriptures and Scriptural interpretation as led by the Spirit, to persuade men to accept Jesus Christ as their sole and adequate Saviour. The position of a preacher is one of awful and solemn responsibility. Man may deal in the things of life, and the commodities of trade, without a sense of any great responsibility, but when he begins to deal in human souls, the immortal essence that alone shall continue through the unchanging ages of eternity, he should have a sense of solemn duty that should make him weigh each word and measure every phrase before they are uttered.

When applicants for license or ordination consider the duty that is to be theirs, they should make a solemn vow to God that in every way and by every method He makes possible for them, they will study His Word and make its teachings such an integral part of their minds, that when they are presenting their message from the pulpit the great doctrines and promises of the Book of books will be clearly presented to their people. This can only be accomplished by study. And the study should be in a thorough and systematic manner. The Cen-

tral Bible Institute Correspondence School has recognized this need for Bible study among the young preachers, as well as the older ones who cannot afford the expense of a resident course, and has prepared seven different courses for preachers and Christian workers. These courses are offered by mail, enabling the earnest seekers after more knowledge to have the advantage of Bible school teaching, regardless of where they live.

Most of us are very busy and feel that we don't have the time to sit down and absorb a long Bible-study course. We want to study a little at a time-here a little and there a little-between preaching engagements-after work hours-while traveling, etc. To such busy ones the Central Bible Institute Correspondence School should be a blessing. Every pastor in Pentecost should take one or more of these courses and insist that the young preachers and workers in his church also take one or more of them. We live only to serve Him who made us to LIVE. Surely we should be glad of the opportunity to learn more and better ways of serving!

John Wesley once said: "Give me one hundred preachers who fear nothing but sin, and desire nothing but God, and I care not whether they are clergymen or laymen. Such alone will shake the gates of hell, and advance the gospel of the King-dom of God on earth."-Peniel Herald.
