Joy in shame and scorn and sorrow; Glorious is the prize! "Quench not the Spirit" (1 Thess. 5:19), neither of which things is the sin against the Holy Ghost, because both grieving and quenching the Spirit would be included in such resisting of the Spirit as Stephen spoke of.

Some people say that only those who heard Jesus Christ and saw Him in the flesh could have committed the unpardonable sin, while others say that only a few can or have committed that terrible sin. However there are vet others who torment themselves half to death, crying and weeping, some even having to be sent to the insane asylum because they think they have committed the unpardonable sin. The religion of the Lord Jesus Christ does not drive anybody insane. It is the sanest thing in all the world, and insanity is of the devil.

In a certain Nebraska city a man came to me crying and weeping, saying "Brother Klink, I am afraid I have committed the unpardonable sin." I told him it was impossible for him to have committed the unpardonable sin. If he had committed it he would not be crying now. He wouldn't be coming to church or asking people to pray for him. If he had committed the unpardonable sin, for which there is no forgiveness in this world or in the world to come, he would have been careless and indifferent and the Spirit of God would not be striving with him any more. LL SINS shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme ; but he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation; because they said, He hath an unclean spirit. Mark 3:28-30.

In speaking about the unpardonable sin we discuss a very unpopular subject. People do not like to hear about the unpardonable sin, and for that reason many preachers never preach a sermon on it. It is an appalling thought that we can so sin that we shall never have forgiveness in the life we are now living, nor in the life that is to come.

To find out precisely what this terrible sin is, let us first ascertain what it is not. Paul writes of himself, "Who was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious : but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief." 1 Tim. 1:13. So the unpardonable sin is not something that one does ignorantly. Stephen said, "Ye stiffnecked and uncircumcised in heart and ears, ye do always resist the Holy Ghost: as your fathers did, so do ye." Acts 7:51. Resisting the Holy Ghost is not the unpardonable sin, we know, because at least one who was thus denounced by Stephen and who was guilty of such resistance, Saul of Tarsus, was afterwards saved and baptized in the Spirit. We have also, "Grieve not the Holy Spirit of God" (Eph. 4:30), and

The Manifestation in Tongues

Joseph Petrelli

The author of this article has a remarkable testimony. He comes from a wealthy Italian family. His mother was a devout Catholic and dedicated her boy to the Lord's service, hoping he would become a priest; but he studied law and became a successful lawyer who was noted for his brilliancy. He heard the gospel, received salvation, and was baptized in water in the Baptist church. He then came to America and entered the ministry, pastoring a church in New York City for eight years. After this he became enlightened on the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, and after receiving the promise, went into the Italian Pentecostal work. Brother Petrelli edits an Italian Pentecostal paper and has published several books. The article printed below is one of a series he wrote on the Pentecostal experience, and is translated from the Italian by Ernest J. Scalzetti of Philadelphia.



ANY would not have occupied themselves with the gift of tongues spoken of in 1 Corinthians 12; nor with the order of worship in 1 Corinthians 14, except for the move-

ment that has again put tongues in evidence. 1 Corinthians 14, that teaches the order in divine worship, and the wise use of the gifts, confirms, rather than denies the fact that there are tongues. 1 Corinthians 13, that admonishes us that unaccompanied with charity tongues are nothing, (as also would be faith and zeal,) does not say that there should be no tongues, but that they must be accompanied with the charity of Christ.

The 13th chapter of the first epistle to the Corinthians exhorts that the gifts be joined to charity, and the 14th Chapter warns that they must be accompanied with wisdom and understanding. But to read these chapters and then declare that there are no gifts would be ridiculous. For example, how useless it would be to go to great length in giving minute instructions as to the order in which you wanted your food set on your table, when actually you had no food to put on your table. There can be order only where there is something to set in order. Prophesying with order, speaking in tongues and then interpreting with order is possible only where there are these gifts. But in these last years something ridiculous has come to pass; that is, many have discussed the gifts and order while they do not have any of these gifts in their assemblies to set in order.

Every step forward, every advance toward the restoration of the church to the apostolic stature, costs suffering, persecution and is accompanied with re-

proach. Every conquest in the field of the holy doctrine has cost the church suffering, from the first centuries until today, and will until the end. We know of the mockery that Arius and his followers employed, even with songs, against the believers who affirmed the Deity of Christ. In all ages and in all religious strifes, nicknames have never been lacking to fight that which is holy and true. How many blasphemous exaggerations were made by the Arians, bantering on the word Son of God. And through the ages every great revival has had the opposition of hypocrites and formalists.

The assault is yet fresh against justification by faith, as though its supporters encouraged sin. The nickname "Methodists" was used against the holy men that preached with zeal and constancy the love of God and the following after holiness without which no one shall see the Lord, and so on. And now it is the turn of another people, against whom is flung the title of "Holy Rollers," "Tongues Movement," etc. It is true that there have been exaggerations, there has been a medley of strange things. So it has been in every revival. The greatest enemies of the truth have always been the fanatical, and the exaggerators in the movements themselves in all of God's great revivals.

In three passages of the Scripture it is clearly stated that tongues were spoken: in Acts 2; 10; 19. In Acts 8 they are not mentioned, but commentators who have had no bias toward the speaking with tongues say that that which attracted the attention of Simon Magus, was undoubtedly the speaking with tongues. Notice that Simon did not request to be empowered to do miracles, but wanted the authority that by his hands the gift of the Holy Ghost might be received. And why this? When the Lord bap-tizes with the Holy Ghost, he who hears that mystical tongue, that is inexplicable to the mind, cannot help being moved, for he touches in a mysterious way the depths where Spirit speaks to spirit. Simon the Sorcerer, although a venal man, understood that he was truly before the great power of God.

The apostle Paul, who so occupied himself with tongues, in an effort to correct the abuses, tells us that he himself spoke them. He does not say when he began, but he must have begun to speak them some time; and it is not arbitrary to suppose that it was when the scales fell from his eyes. It is the method of the wisdom of God to tell us some things, and not to tell us others, in order that we might learn to know the written Word, and that not written. An example will, in part, clarify our thought:

To many Christians it is clear that the baptism of water is performed only by immersion. Yet not every time that baptism is mentioned is it stated that there was an immersion. John the Baptist baptized Jesus by immersion we know because it is written that He went up out of the water. It is also clearly recorded that Philip and the treasurer went down into the water (Acts 8:38, 39); but to our knowledge there is no other such record in the Scriptures. How they were baptized in the jailer's house at Phillipi it is not stated; but we are of the opinion that they were baptized in the same way that Jesus was baptized, because there cannot be many forms of baptism, and it is prudent not to construct theories upon doubts and exceptions. Why, therefore, do many who are well established on the truth concerning baptism of water doubt and resist the truth concerning the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, stumbling at the manifestation of tongues? Why not accept it as it is recorded that it was received the first time? Moreover there are three clear records that it was received with tongues, and not one example that it was received otherwise. The statement that as yet He was not fallen upon any in Samaria, although they had been baptized in water, indicates something extraordinary and powerful was expected.

On the Day of Pentecost tongues were used to speak of the wonderful works of God and to praise Him; and Jews from various parts of the world heard them; and then the message that brought conversion was given in the tongue known to all. The speaking in tongues was the sign that attracted the attention of the hearers. However, in the house of Cornelius (Acts 10) tongues did not serve to speak to any strangers.

While Peter preached Jesus Christ, who went about doing good, declaring that "through His name, whosoever believeth in Him shall receive remission of sins," as he said these words, the service was interrupted; for suddenly, as from a fountain that opens irresistibly and from which comes forth living water, there gushed forth words in a mystical tongue which no one understood. "The Holy Ghost

Have you ever heard anyone say, "My life was wrecked by sin; I was a hopeless, wretched inebriate; but after I began to study arithmetic and learned the multiplication table, my life was transformed; I was freed from the power of the drink habit and became a happy, self-respecting citi-zen"? No, you have not. But how many times have you heard a testimony like the following: "I was lost, and in the depths of despair. But since I began to study the Bible and to worship the God of the Bible, my life has been changed, and I am a new person. Now I am as happy as the day is long"?

No one is so foolish as to think that the study of medicine will produce a scientific farmer or that a knowledge of astronomy will make a preacher. The way to heaven was not discovered with the aid of a telescope. Every branch of knowledge has its own sphere of usefulness and cannot be transferred to any other sphere. For mental development we all know that the three R's, "readin', 'ritin', and 'rithmetic" are essential. What, then is the foundation of moral and spiritual development? Since "out of the heart are the issues of life," we need a book that will reach the heart, and that book is the Bible. This Book shows men the way of success and happiness in this world and also the way to attain life and eternal peace and joy after death. Millions have found this to be true, but millions of others, disregarding this thrilling fact, try to find some other way to satisfy the heart.

The world smiles today at the foolish attempt of the ancient inhabitants of the land of Shinar to reach heaven by means of a lofty tower. From our knowledge of the shape of the earth and its movements, we know that a road to heaven could never be built of brick and mortar. Yes, we are living in an enlightened age; many things that were entirely unknown to the world a few centuries ago are now common knowledge. But what is the nature of our boasted knowledge? Is it not altogether earthly? Has modern education made any discoveries in the heavenly realm? We fear that modern enlightenment knows less about heaven than did the men of Shinar, for they admitted there was such a place, while today we are told that death ends all. Modern Babels are being erected by the score, inviting the world to rebel against God and "climb up some other way." Mighty towers of human reasoning have been built upon the premise that a God of love could not send men to hell, and therefore, all will go to the place called heaven. Magnificent structures are these "doctrines of demons" dedicated to the exaltation of humanity to a place where no Saviour is needed. Yes, this is the age of increased knowledge, but it is also the age of multiplied Babels and supreme confusion.

How strange it seems that Confusion should stalk upon us in the wake of a great intellectual awakening! But it is the sad truth. And what is the reason? Something has surely been overlooked, or things would not be as they are! Is not this the trouble? In our zeal for the training of the mind we have neglected the heart. We have made the grievous, fatal mistake of supposing that the soul could be fed and nourished on the dry fodder of intellectual learning. Our children are being fed on husks. The highest source of true wisdom and knowledge is neglected while the "shrewd" guesses of men are substituted for the authority of God's eternal Book. The moral training of our children based on the unsound psychology of behaviourism, instead of on the principles set forth in the Bible, has produced a genera-tion of ungodly law-breakers. It would be interesting to know how much of the present crime wave is the natural result of education without God, a costly experiment that threatens to wreck the world.

That our civilization may be about to totter and fall is a thought that is occupying many thoughtful minds. H. G. F. Spurrell, an eminent English scientist, believes that another return to barbarism will be the outcome of present day tendencies-barring some great and immediate change for the better. A textbook in the University of Kansas entitled "Better Schools," by Carlton Washburn and Myron M. Stearns, contains this paragraph: "It is a desperate race between the new education and man's tendency to use for his own destruction the powers which he possesses. If we have one or two more world wars, our civilization is as surely doomed as were those of Egypt, Babylonia, Crete, Greece, and Rome. But if we can train up a new generation before such a cataclysm comes, a generation that will be made up of individuals more fully developed than we, more nearly aware

of their dependence upon one another, we may avert the catastrophe."

(Continued from Page Two) fell on all them which heard the word. (Oh to hear speak of Jesus!) And they which believed, that were come from Jerusalem, were astonished, because that on the Gentiles also was poured out the gift of the Holy Ghost, for they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God." It does not say what tongues they spoke. They spoke alternately words in other tongues and words in the common tongue, with which they glorified God. The Holy Ghost gives glory to God and enables us to give Him glory.

When later Peter was called to give account for going to the Gentiles, he related the vision and how he was called, and added: "And as I began to speak, the Holy Ghost *fell* on them, *as* on us at the *beginning*. (Oh, to know that which they had at the beginning!) Then remembered I the word of the Lord, how He said: John baptized with water, but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost. For as much as God gave them the like gift *as* He did *unto* us . . . what was I that I could withstand God?"

It would be folly to deny the form of the baptism in Cornelius' house, and it is arbitrary to say that it was for that time only—for that beginning among the Gentiles. The prophecy spoken by Peter concerning the promise being to "all that are afar off," must not be limited to the time of the early church since God has not limited it.

The apostle Paul asked certain dis-ciples in Ephesus, "Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed?" They told him that they had not heard whether there be any Holy Ghost. They had been baptized with the baptism of John. Then they were baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus (and the apostle would not have baptized them if they had not believed). "And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came upon them, and they spake with tongues and prophesied." No dispensation was being opened, because the Jews and the Gentiles had already received the Holy Ghost. This third precise testimony is recorded then, for a purpose -to tell us that the Baptism with the Holy Ghost is promised to all Christians, and is until the end, and to show us how the Holy Ghost manifested Himself when He came.

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
Laying Up Treasures H. G. Desha, Jr.

The Spirit of the Times

Religious leaders of all churches, though disagreeing on doctrinal matters, seem to be unanimous in recognizing the critical condition of world affairs.

Says an Episcopalian Bishop: "We are living in a time of tremendous change, in intellectual matters, in political affairs, in economics, in human relations. It seems at times as if the bottom had dropped out of things."

Dr. Robert E. Speer, president of Presbyterian Board of Missions: "The good news of Jesus Christ is denied by modern literature. Unbelief and skepticism in the possibility of decency and fineness characterize today's thought. This whole spirit can best be understood in the French phrase, which, translated, means "Homesickness for the muck."

A prominent New York Modernist: "Everything is a problem-business, education, politics, internationalismso that people become excessively problem-conscious, until all life appears as a tangled puzzle. In consequence, insanity increases, suicides mount, nervous break-downs multiply, and even normal people lose the faith and morale to solve the very problems they worry over." These words are a good modern commentary on Luke 21:25, 26, which tells us that just before the Lord's appearing there will be, "upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and waves roaring; men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth."

Christians Tortured in Russia

Erastus, a Russian missionary, continues his terrible unveilings of the condition of things in Russia. He says, in the "Friend of Missions":

"In Leningrad, in the secret department of the G. P. U. there is an official very fierce against the believers, who persecutes all preachers of the gospel. Many have been exiled by him. Once he wanted to prepare a false document, but a certain real Christian would not agree to any falsification, nor listen to his proposals or threatenings. So he used the vile method of the Spanish Inquisitors, and drove iron nails under the finger nails of that man to make him sign the document. Such things happen frequently here in the country of Freedom where the peasant government is ruling.

"In the Siberian Far East a preacher was taken out twenty-three times and threatened to be shot if he would not sign a certain document. They tortured him so much that he lost his reason. Then he was set free, and died soon afterwards.

"Another well-known brother in Caucasus died in prison, after being tortured and tormented. Also a wellknown Christian worker in the district of D— was persecuted. How he suffered! A bullet was shot into his mouth which passed through the jaw bones, leaving a big wound in his cheek. He was afterwards tormented so much that, losing his reason, he passed away into eternity."—Elim Evangel.

Have Faith in God

It is the province of Satan to instil doubt. It is the province of the Holy Spirit to instil faith. Herod put John the Baptist in prison, and when, through the instrumentality of Satan, he was put in prison, he doubted. And he sent two of his disciples to Jesus with the question, "Art thou he that should come, or do we look for another?"

John had seen Jesus Christ without the miracles. He had seen Him with the Holy Spirit descending upon Him. But he had not seen Him work miracles. And today, as God's Spirit is being outpoured, His people are saying, "Art Thou He, the real Holy Spirit, the same who came to the apostles, or do we look for another?" The answer is the same today as Christ gave of old, "Go and shew . . . those things which you do hear and see: the blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the gospel preached to them."

The anointing which Jesus Christ had, fitted Him to do the works of His Father. The anointing which the children of God has received, has commenced to fit them, and the Holy Spirit will continue the work of fitting them to do the works of the Father.

If John had been out of prison and had seen what Christ was doing, he never would have doubted. Ask the

Lord Jesus to deliver you from the prison of unbelief and doubt, and you will hear Him say, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on Me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do." John 14:12. John was cut off in his prime; but our Lord Jesus Christ is going to see that *His* children do the greater works.

Satan was going to cut off Peter. Christ said, "Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat." The onslaught of the servant maid nearly swamped Peter. But the Lord Jesus used him to do the greater works, and to do them through the power of the Holy Ghost. Don't look for another, but for greater demonstration of the power of the Holy Ghost. Jesus Christ saved Peter that he might do the greater works: "They brought forth the sick into the streets, and laid them on beds and couches, that at least the shadow of Peter passing by might overshadow some of them." Acts 5:15. God is able to do the same today, and He will, preserving His people to be His mouthpiece, as Peter was on the day of Pentecost, and to do the greater works.

These examples in the Word are for our encouragement. He who ever liveth to make intercession says, "I have prayed for thee that thy faith fail not," that we may have faith for the greater works that will bring glory to God. He can raise up Peters, one hundred and twenties, and great companies. Have faith in God and His Word.

Is Religion Opium?

Recently an anti-religious pageant was held in a Russian town, in which a communist, dressed as a priest, held up a cross on which were inscribed these words, "God to the Discard." A picture of this was in the Literary Digest. Why this attitude toward relig-ion? The Soviet government answers, "Religion is opium, because it lulls the people to sleep with fair promises and makes them indifferent to their real welfare." But this has not been the complaint against real Christianity. When Paul preached in Thessalonica, the complaint was not, "These men are drugging the people into insensi-bility," but "These that have *turned* the world upside down are come hither also." True Christianity is a spiritual agitator, producing, not insensibility but spiritual revolution in the lives of sinners.

As warm milk is fitter to nourish a babe than that which is cold, so the Word of God delivered by a lively voice hath greater suitableness to the work of grace.—Spurgeon.

Topics of the Times

The New Freedom

We are witnessing today in our country a revolt, especially on the part of youth, against the morality of the Bible, and against so-called "Puritanical standards." This is to a large extent the result of anti-Christian teaching in many of our educational institutions. The teaching is as follows: "The greatest happiness does not come by suppressing our natural desires, because whatever is natural is beautiful; true liberty comes as we freely express ourselves, and ignore the 'taboos' of worn-out religions." This attitude, and its results is interestingly set forth by Dr. Sheen:

"Imagine a railroad engine endowed with consciousness, so that it is able to read, to think, to speak; and supposing that one day it picked up with its pilot one of the modern books on the morality of self-expression, such as one of Mr. Bertrand Russell's (One of America's outstanding philosophers), in which he rebels against obedience to traditional moral laws, and the authority of Christian teaching. Suppose that then with its great single eye, it reads the pages of this liberal thinker, and becomes so impressed with its plausible, but empty arguments that it whistles to itself: 'Mr. Russell is right. What do the engineers who designed me, and imposed their laws upon me know about my inner impulses? Why should I even obey the authority of an engineer who is constantly limiting my pressure to one hundred pounds per square inch, when I have the vital urge to make it one hundred and fifty pounds? And, furthermore, why should I submit myself to the authority of railroad officials, who fifty years ago, laid the tracks upon which I should run? Why should I not be permitted to choose my own directions, and make my own tracks? From now on I am going to be self-expressive.' Well, suppose that the steam engine did become selfexpressive. It would soon learn two things: first, refusing to obey the laws concerning steam pressure, it would no longer be a steam engine, because in asserting abnormal pressure it would burst its entrails; second, in refusing to keep on the track it would no longer be able to run. If the engine did jump the track, and burst its boilers, it would not hurt the engineer who designed the track; it would hurt only the engine itself. So, if a man disobeys God's laws, and dashes his head against them, as against an eternal

rock, the rock does not suffer—it is only the head of the man that suffers." Wars and Rumors of Wars

Under this heading James T. Gerould, professor at Princeton University, discusses the possibilities of war. It is interesting to note that he uses Scriptural language in the title of his article. He raises the question: "Is another great war just over the horizon? The question is not fantastic, nor can the problem it propounds be dismissed by a negative answer engendered by faith in paper guaranties or our heavy armament. Probably no nation wants war: memories of 1914-18 are far too vivid. But apparently none of them is intelligent enough-or willing to shape its policies so that the causes of war may be removed. That is the situation and it may as well be faced."

United States and Japan

"For a good many years, in military and naval circles at home and abroad, there has been talk of the inevitable conflict between the United States and Japan. During recent months war rumors have been flying about Washington. That the policies of the two nations with respect to China are squarely opposed, is evident. The Japanese military men are deeply incensed over the 'loss of face' incident to their withdrawal from Shanghai," and they are not very pleased over the fact that the United States has refused to recognize the new Manchurian government (which is the tool of Japan).

Japan and Soviet Russia

"A casus belli exists between Japan and Soviet Russia, because of the conflict of interests in Manchuria. Obviously, neither is looking for trouble, but with Japanese armies operating all along the lines of the Chinese Eastern Railway, 'incidents' are difficult to prevent. If the fires are once lighted, it may become extremely difficult to put them out." The Christian Hearld of England informs us that "newspaper reports indicate how definitely Russia is preparing for an eventual struggle with Japan. Troops and war material have been taken to Eastern Siberia in large quantities. Regiments are being formed consisting of Chinese and Koreans, wose hatred of Japan Russia intends to exploit. It appears that fortifications are being strengthened in the region of Vladivostok. Airplane and seaplane bases are being constructed in this region, and submarines have

been transported in parts and assembled there. The preparation include the purchase in Canada by Russia, a great wheat producing country, of big supplies of wheat to be transported to Vladivostok, a Russian naval station. A Soviet general, stationed in Siberia, declared that 'jets from the flame of real war' were beginning to jump on the Soviet Eastern borders. It is stated that Russian troops already concentrated in Southern Siberia number several hundred thousand."

Edgar Furness, writing in Current History, says "The increasing tension of Soviet relations with Japan has produced an outburst of war spirit throughout Russia. The combined trade-unions of the country at their ninth all-union congress pledged their membership of 17,000,000 to military service, and their organizations to the spread of preparedness among the nation's wage-earners and peasants. The officials of the government and the leaders of the communist party have aroused the people to a pitch of patriotic fervor seldom seen in a country not actually on a war footing." This outburst has relation to more than one country, for it has revived the old question of the Soviet war power as a factor in the international affairs of the future. It cannot be forgotten that Communism is in essence a militant movement, dedicated to the destruction of the existing national organization of the world by forceful means. Its members would be renegades if they did not hold themselves bound, when the time is ripe, to spread their gospel with the sword."

The European Situation

Mr. Gerould says, "It is in Europe even more that the danger of war lies in almost every direction." Concerning the report of the Arms Conference, the same writer informs us: "That they are disappointing to those who have hoped for tangible results as a consequence of the conference is putting it mildly. It is obvious that the delegates to the conference had been instructed to protect the interests of their respective countries first of all, and to agree on disarmament after that protection had been assured." The heading of a New York Times editorial aptly describes the situation-"Hard to disarm."

It is difficult for the nations to disarm or to decide on what arms to use or not to use—whether or not to use gas and germs in war. Commenting on agreements to refrain from the use of certain implements of war, a great French statesman once said sarcastically, "They might as well command the soldiers to plunge their bayonets in their enemies' bodies only to the depth of two inches!" Nebuchadnezzar once saw the Gentile world powers under the form of a magnificent image. Daniel 2. But God sees them in their real character—as wild beasts. Read Daniel 7. Yet He is the One who can tame wild beasts, so that the wolf will live with the lamb, and the leopard lie down with the kid.

War and the World's Economic Problem

The New Testament predicts an economic crisis that will precede the appearance of the Lord. See James 5: 1-6 and Rev. 6:5, 6. The inspired writer does not give the details, but simply mentions two features: the hoarding of wealth by the few, and the oppression of the working class. For further and fuller details we shall consult the daily papers.

Mr. Jahncke, assistant Secretary of the Navy, is reported to have made the following statement: "Never in the world's history have conditions been so chaotic. The struggles of the Argonne have been succeeded by the struggles of economic conflict. Out of that international struggle for trade termini the world seems to have spent itself, to have collasped everywhere. . . . History teaches us that whenever nations, ancient or modern, become competitors for the control of any trade they will either consolidate their interests or fight. In the last analysis war is merely competition continued to its sharpest point."

Says Mr. Gerould, "National poverty may make for international amity, but it may, on the other hand, be an incitement to conflict, as in modern Japan. Every country, moreover, has its munitions lobbyists and those who, still finding glory in war, belittle its horror and tragic waste. . . . Should the present economic stress be prolonged, a state of mind may evolve which regards war as a welcome relief. It is a natural human impulse in troublous times to shift the blame to someone else rather than to assess it against our own stupidity-to strike out blindly, regardless of the consequences of the blow. In our present abnormal mental state, international controversies which could in better times be adjusted without great difficulty are magnified and become dangerous."

What does the Word of God say about the settlement of the world's economic problem? The details of the Divine method are not given; but we know that, by the time the Lord has handled the situation, "they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree; and none shall make them afraid." Micah 4:4.

who think they have committed the unpardonable sin, but they have not. Whenever you have a feeling in your heart that you want to get right with God this is proof that the Holy Spirit is doing His office work in your heart, from which of course you know that you have not committed the unpardonable sin.

Once in Times Square, New York, standing on a soap box at midnight, I was arguing against the existence of a personal God. A great crowd of peo-ple were around me. I said, "Now I am going to prove to you that there is no God. If there is a God, I give this God the privilege to kill me in two minutes, and if I am not dead in two minutes, then there is no God. I will challenge this God you worship to kill me in two minutes. A minute now is gone. I am still alive. A minute and a half is gone. I am still alive." The women started to walk off. They got afraid and thought that sure enough something was going to happen to me. "A minute and three quarters are gone, and I am still alive." Then the men began to hold their arms before their eyes. Two minutes are gone. I am still alive; and there is no God." Even that awful thing that I did years ago when I was a black-mouthed infidel, an atheist, an evolutionist, and an anarchist, was not the unpardonable sin. If it had been, I should not be preaching to you tonight. If God could save and baptize a wretch like me, there is hope for any one of you. Why you reject this marvelous Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, I cannot understand. God loves you and wants to save you and fill you with the Holy Spirit.

What is the unpardonable sin? The only way to find that out is by going into the Scripture. You read your Bible from Genesis to Revelation and you will never read anything about the wrath of the Holy Spirit. It is never mentioned. The Holy Spirit is al-ways pictured as a spirit of love, of We kindness, and of tender mercy. read about the wrath of God in Romans 1:18. We read about the wrath of the Son in Psalm 2:12. But you never read anything about the wrath of the Spirit. How awful then must be that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit.

There is a sin unto death, a sin that brings eternal separation from God. Back yonder in Genesis God said, "My Spirit shall not always strive with men." The Spirit of God left the antediluvian world. They were all drowned and died, except, of course, Noah and his family. Out of the hun-

dreds and thousands of grown-up men and women that left Egypt for Canaan, only two got into Canaan, Joshua and Caleb. You read in your Bible that God had left them and given them up. Then we read, "Ephraim is joined to idols. Let him alone." God sent His prophets and His messengers, and Ephraim killed the messengers of God, and God said, He is joined to his idols. Let him alone.

What a horrible place that soul is in when God says, "Holy Spirit, let that man alone. Preacher, let that woman alone. Conscience, leave him alone. Conviction, leave him alone. He has joined himself to his idols. Do not pray for him. He has committed the sin unto death."

My friends, the day, the hour, the minute, the second must come when God's Spirit will not strive with sinners any longer. We read about Saul. He said the Lord had departed from him and did not answer him any more. It will be an awful moment in your life, if it comes, when God shall depart from you and not answer you any more. It has happened before. It is happening now. It will happen again.

You remember once the Lord excused people. You remember how Jesus spoke the parable about the supper and how they all made an excuse. They all said, "We beg to be excused." Jesus did excuse them. He said that none of those men which were bidden should taste of His supper. They were excused, and none of them tasted of the supper of the King's Son. And some day, some hour, some minute, maybe right now, this very second, God is excusing you too. Be careful, for the Spirit of the living God shall not always strive with you.

not always strive with you. Jesus said, "All sins shall be for-given unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme; but he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness." You read the third chapter of Mark and you will find what this sin is. The Sanhedrin sent Pharisees and scribes after Jesus to watch him. The news of His marvelous ministry had spread and the Sanhedrin in Jerusalem didn't like it. They said, "This will never do. This fellow is spreading a new religion, and all the people are saying He is the Messiah. He is our king. We must stop that." The scribes and Pharisees got into that city and saw how Jesus healed a man with a withered hand, and the comman people cried, "He is the Son of God." He healed the sick and the lepers. He performed other miracles. Folks were saved, and again the common people cried out, "He is the Messiah. He is our Saviour. He is our King. He is the Son of God." Now the Pharisees

had to step in. They were convinced that what Jesus was doing was done by the power of God, and yet they said the whole thing was of the devil, and that Jesus also was of the devil. Thus by maliciously, wickedly, knowingly, and purposely saying that the work which they knew to be the work of God was the work of the devil, they sinned against the Holy Ghost—committed the unpardonable sin. It hath never forgiveness, neither in this world nor in the world to come. It cannot be repented of.

There are other sins that are almost equal to the unpardonable sin in practical consequences, though not quite. The permanent and final rejection of the Lord Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour is such a sin. I John 5:12. However, at least theoretically, this sin may be repented of and so forgiven. The Jews rejected the Messiahship of the Lord Jesus Christ, although many of them were assured that He was the Son of God. Thus they brought upon themselves the awful judgment of all Christ rejecters. Still they could have repented and been saved had they wanted to do so.

You remember Aaron Burr, do you not? He was a brilliant man. When he was about 18 or 19 years of age and attending Princeton University, a revival broke out there. Nearly ev-eryone got saved or was under deep conviction. Aaron Burr was under conviction and a good friend of his came to him and asked him to settle the question about his soul's salvation. Aaron Burr said, "I am going home now for two weeks, and when I come back, I shall give you my decision." When he got home there was an atheist there visiting. He said, "Aaron, that is all excitement. That is all nonsense." After Aaron Burr returned to the university that friend came to him again and said, "Have you settled the question?" "Yes, I have," he said. "I have told Jesus Christ that if He will leave me alone I will leave Him alone." You all know the history of Aaron Burr, how he almost became president of the United States, missing it by but one vote, but finally betraved his country. He lived a dissipated life and went from bad to worse. Years later he made the acquaintance of an English preacher who said to him, "Aaron, I would like to intro-duce you to my friend." Aaron Burr was a gentleman and said, "If your friend is as excellent as you are, I should like to meet him." The preacher said, "My friend is the Lord Jesus Christ." Aaron Burr's face turned ashen, and he said to that preacher, "I settled that question 60 years ago. I told Jesus if He would leave me alone, I would leave Him alone, and

He hasn't bothered me since." That man had committed a sin which, unrepented of, was as terrible in its consequences as the unpardonable sin itself, and you are in danger of doing the very same thing.

You know that God has given us the members of our bodies for a certain purpose. He has given us our arms to lift weight. If you want to get paralyzed in your arm and lose the power to use it, just take a rope and tie your arm to your body. Don't take that rope off for six weeks and you will find that you will not be able to lift your arm. Why? Because you have refused to use your arm for the purpose for which God gave you your arm. If you want to go blind in your right eye, you do not have to tear out your eye. Just take a rag and tie it around your eye. Keep it there and refuse to use your eye for the purpose for which God has given you that eye, and after a few months you will find that your eye has gone blind. God has given you your heart to give it to Him. He says, "My son, give me thine heart." That is the purpose for which God has given you your heart. Just refuse to use that heart of yours for the purpose for which God has given it to you and the day will come when you will have lost the power and the ability to give your heart to God. You have committed a sin which in its practical consequences is as awful as the unpardonable sin itself; and God have mercy on your soul.

People come to me and say, "Isn't it a curious fact that so few old people get saved?" No, not at all. We know that conversion must be effected by the influence of the truth upon the mind. You reject that truth tonight, and tomorrow night you will have a harder time to accept it. Refuse to accept the truth and your mind will grow weaker and weaker along that line, and the day, the hour, the minute, the second will come when the truth will not affect your mind at all, and you will have committed a sin unto death.

Nevertheless God will save you now if you will but let Him do it. In Hattiesburg, Mississippi I spoke on this subject. A notorious drunkard and gambler came to the meeting. He had married three women but was living with none of them. He had killed a man; his daughter had killed her husband; his son had killed two. That night he saw a ray of light and came to the altar. He prayed and agonized for two and a half hours, and then God saved him. If God would do that for that man He is willing to do it for you.

I was in Kansas City some years ago and heard Dr. Torrey preach. He told the following story. "Before

Moody got converted, he was hoeing one day in a corn field. An old man whom he called Uncle Reuben was helping him. Uncle Reuben would stop hoeing every now and then. Moody went to him and asked him what was the matter. The old man said, 'Well, son, you see that house over there? That is where my mother used to live and now my sister lives there. I was fourteen years of age when I left my mother's home to make my way in the world. My mother gave me a New Testament and told me to read it continually and not to forget Matthew 6:33, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you." I told mother I wouldn't forget it. The next Sunday I went to church in a distant city, and the preacher got out his Bible and read Matthew 6:33, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you." He preached his sermon, made an altar call, pointed his finger at me and said, "You man, give your heart to God." But I didn't. The next Sunday I went to church in another town, and the preacher there read the same text. When he made the altar call, he, too, pointed his finger at me and said, "Boy, come give your heart to God. Seek His kingdom and His righteousness." I went out of the church, found my way to a grave yard and between the tomb stones I had it out with God. I told God to leave me alone, that I wanted to make my way in the world first. Young boy, from that day on I never had any desire to become a Christian.''

Moody was not saved then, but after he was saved he remembered what Uncle Reuben had said. He tried to get in touch with Uncle Reuben and learned that he was dangerously insane. They had him in a padded cell. A month later Moody visited the asylum and asked to see Uncle Reuben. As soon as Uncle Reuben saw him he grinned insanely and said, "Young man, seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness." Moody broke down and cried. He couldn't help it. Some years later Uncle Reuben was discharged from the asylum. He was still insane but was no longer dangerous. Moody again went to see him. When Uncle Reuben saw Moody, he pulled at his hair and laughed insanely, "Ha! ha! ha! Young boy, seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness. Ha! ha! ha! And all these things shall be added unto you." Let me close with two words from

The Gospel in Foreign Lands

Rescuing Souls from India's Zenanas

We were moving about among the throng of heathen worshipers in that ancient sacred city of the Hindus. The Golden Temple was surrounded as well as crowded within. We finally reached the black idol before which the blood of animals flowed to appease the wrath of the "Goddess of Murder."

At one side were numbers of Brahman widows whose hope of salvation had fled with the death of their husbands. Manu, the Hindu law-giver, gave this blessing to woman, viz: that if she die before her husband she may find salvation.

We wound our way to the bank of

the sacred river where masses of people bathe religiously in the vain hope of obtaining salvation. In a prominent place on the bank was a tank dug out of the wall of the river, called the "Fountain of Life." There was only room for a few to descend and bathe at a time, and its shallow water was reeking with the filth from the bodies of untold numbers of dusty, diseased pilgrims.

The Fountain of Life! What a contrast between that and the stream which flows from His wounded side! Yet when He suffered it

was for India's people also that He said, "I thirst." Still they and millions more are unaware of His love. Long Pilgrimages they have made to this filthy fountain; weary miles have been covered, their bodies frequently having been prostrated on every inch of ground which lay between their hut and the templ idol. Wear yand sore, they at length reached their god but now that they had actually bathed, they were none bettered, rather its very waters had left upon them the mingled germs of disease from the multiplied numbers of pilgrims tainted with everything from fever to leprosy who had previously bathed in its scant waters.

Tradition says that even for a widow who bathes in this fountain,

The Death of W. E. Simpson and Latest News of W. W. Simpson Party

Since our last issue of the Evangel we have received further advice from the Department of State at Washington as follows: "In a telegram dated July 6th, the Consul General of Shanghai states that he has received a message stating that Mr. W. E. Simpson was murdered by Mohammedan bandits; that his body is now in Tingshi; and that he will be taken to Minchow for burial."

Minchow is the headquarters of Brother W. W. Simpson the father of W. E. Simpson.



A letter from Miss Claire Merrill dated July 16th at Redondo Beach. Calif., advises us of receipt of letters from a Miss King who was a member of W. W. Simpson's party. She writes:-"The dear ones who know of the home going of W. E. Simpson will be glad to learn that he had first a glad reunion with his father and mother. Brother W. W. Simpson and wife were overtaken by ten bandits armed with machine guns and the el-der Simpson was held for \$100,000 ransom. After accompanying them a few miles they decided to let him go. This happened last May. They were robbed however of \$350.00 although the government has promised to make this good. Soldiers were then sent to escort the party to their destination."

Miss King also writes under date of May 25th: "We hope to be in Minchow by the 3rd of June. Praise the Lord! Due to a breakdown of our car, the party separated, four of us waiting here in Sian; Bertha Roberson, the children, and two blind teachers staying in Pingliang at an inn; and Brother and Sister Simpson going on to get the car fixed. It was on their return trip to gather up the party that they were attacked by bandits, who robbed them of everything they had including watches, cameras, glasses, and even some of the clothing they were wearing. They searched Sister Simpson for any concealed money, but during the whole time she testifies to a consciousness of God's presence and an absence of fear. The Lord gives strength in time of need. Later on when the bandits let them go they met a party of fifteen soldiers sent to protect them, but the Lord had already undertaken. We will now have a military escort to take us through to Minchow. 'All things work together for good.'"

A later word received by Miss King's mother in this country tells of the meeting of Brother William Simpson and his father and of the mail that the son brought to the party from the homeland. They read this together by the light of the car headlights. The son then left in a truck to get the rest of the baggage, and met his death while *en route*.

First Steps in Missionary Work in W. China

Mrs. J. C. Morrison

We surely have been busy the few days since our arrival here, and have had to be "Jack of all trades." For the first six weeks we lived in a crowded room in the head Lisu man's house with boxes all around us until our own building of Lisu architecture was up.

Now we are in our own place consisting of three rooms. One is kitchen and dining room combined. One is our store room for boxes and grain, and the other is our bedroom. It is our desire to add a few rooms, but we shall have to wait until more funds arrive. In addition to our house we have a two-room building for our native workers. One room serves as a guest room, and mission, and the other is used by our native evangelist Paul and the language teacher. We also have a wash shed erected for washing clothes, a stable for cows and horses, a one-room building for Chinese helpers, and a chicken house. Our buildings are very crudely put together being constructed after the native fashion. Our floors and walls are of native bamboo and the roofs of long grass. The framework of the house is of long poles to which the bamboo matting and the grass on the roof are fastened.

The buildings are put up without the sound of a hammer. We haven't been able to get any carpenters to help so we have no doors between the rooms.

The rooms were so dark that Clifford and Mark our language teacher managed to make a window for our dining room. Our table up to a week ago was a steamer trunk, but Clifford and I together made a table with drop leaves. I did a good bit of the planing until my arms ached. Another difficulty was that we did not have a cupboard, but now we have enough boards planed off so that we can make one. Lumber does not arrive all prepared in this country as it does in the States.

Our Lisu work is surely encouraging, as already over 250 Lisu have taken their stand for Christ, and are studying the Word and learning hymns. We are constantly called out to pray with those who want to believe and worship the living God. One of our first steps in such cases is to ask them to take down from the walls all the idols they have been worshiping. A number have come to us for prayer for healing, and in many cases there have been marvelous results.

Open Doors in Mossi Land Ida George and Cuba Hill

While in some lands doors are closing to the gospel, it seems that greater opportunities than ever before are being presented to us on this field. Many open doors are before us as a challenge, but we are limited because of lack of laborers. We want to tell you a little bit about one of these open doors.

Boulsa is a large native town about fifty miles from here, and for some time it had been our desire to go there. We had sent word two days ahead that we were coming, so they were expecting us. Upon our arrival we went to greet the big chief, and were met by two under chiefs and their attendants who escorted us to the chief's reception place which is a place fixed with mats. These two chiefs and their attendants with our native evangelist sat down on one side of the room while we girls standing awaited the coming of the big chief. First his servants and some other followers came in and finally the head chief came-a tall man in flowing robes with a cloth wound about his head and then brought over his mouth. We greeted him, telling him in a formal way that we wished to remain for a few days to preach to his people. The request was repeated by our native evangelist to one of the under chiefs who in turn repeated it to the head chief. Our re-quest was granted without hesitation. There followed a brief silence and then a little confusion at the entrance when in walked a man carrying a big old rooster, and another leading a sheep which were presented to one of the under chiefs who in turn presented them to our native evangelist and he then presented them to us. After thanking him we left. Our same escorts accompanied us back to the encampment where we were going to stay. We were quite a company-two attendants in the lead, then came the two chiefs, followed by us and then all the other attendants with the bleating sheep and rooster in the midst.

Our opportunities for the Lord while there were many. We were privileged to give the gospel to five different chiefs including the head chief and also hundreds of people. One afternoon when the heat was most intense there were between two hundred and three hundred people who came into the yard and sat for a long service, eagerly drinking in what was said. After the service an intelligent looking young Mohammedan remained to enquire further.

We taught them to sing the chorus of "Jesus Loves Me." It amused them to think that they were permitted to sing too. They did fairly well, that is when we shut our ears to the many minor tones that were sung most of the time. However we were glad to be able to get those words in their hearts, trusting God to teach them the full meaning of the love of His Son Jesus.

As we looked out over that immense village with its many mud huts, and visualized the souls that were there

GRACE THAT BRINGS SALVATION




