The Holy Spirit and the Scriptures

INCE the world began the Holy Spirit has ever been present. In the earliest account of creation "the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters." Gen. 1:2. Since then throughout the Old Testa-

ment His presence has been revealed as "coming upon" the prophets for utterance, and upon servants of God for ability to execute judgment, or to equip them for triumph against their enemies.

In New Testament times the activities of the Holy Spirit have not been difficult to trace. It was His activity that brought about the incarnation of our blessed Lord. Luke 1: 35. It was His anointing that equipped our Redeemer for His ministry among men. Luke 3:22. At the baptism in Jordan, "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him." Acts 10:38.

In the early Church it was the Holy Spirit who afforded power to witness, confirmed the message, and wrought transforming miracles in the lives of men.

That which is of greatest interest to us, however, is to learn and experience what the Holy Spirit might be to us today. Recently reading a brief account of the Renaissance period, when Europe emerged from what often has been spoken of as the dark

ages, three things were emphasized by the author as bringing about this new period in the history of Europe. They were (a) an awakening to the past, (b) an inward awakening to the possibilities in the present, and (c) an

awakening to the world field of opportunity. In its awakening to the past, the Renaissance roused to the fact that there had been in history a time when splendor and luxury were enjoyed. Also, that splendor and

luxury were the portion of peoples even then living in the Orient. In the awakening men of Europe began to see that they too might enjoy such splendor and luxury. The world was theirs as well as it had belonged to others. Exploration and commerce boomed, architecture and the fine arts rose to dazzling heights, and earthly achievements of our own modern day are but the further development of that period of rousing from a long slumber.

In spiritual things the truth relative to the Holy Spirit is similar. The modern trouble is not that the Spirit is not, or has not been. The trouble is that the Church has largely slumbered concerning His importance in Christian living. The Scriptures have been plain that He is the life of the Church, yet the Church has run on depending on its ritual and its forms instead of rousing to the consciousness that it is the Spirit of God who begets spiritual life. The ten virgins slumbered and slept, and were not awakened until announcement was heard "Behold, the bridegroom cometh." Today there is need of heralds to cry aloud and (Continued on Page 13)



ATCH therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. . . . Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as

These are the days of the great apostasy when the love of many is waxing cold, and when professed Christians by the thousands are indifferent to the soon-coming climax of the church age, the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. "But ye, brethren," Paul says in 1 Thess. 5:4, "are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief." And so let us ask God to put the soulvibrating hope of His soon return into every Christian life that His children may meet Him with confidence and not with fear.

From the Old Testament we have four great pictures which preview that great advent for which we are longing and praying.

I. The Translation of Enoch

"And Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him." Gen. 5:24. From the dimness of earth's early ages we have this terse but altogether forceful record. It is said of the other men of this pre-Noahic race that they died; but of Enoch we have the unique fact recorded that "God took him." Evidently, then, his translation was granted as a reward for a distinguished life.

Now the name "Enoch" means "separated." While the barrier of

holiness was being broken down between the formerly godly Sethites and the ungodly Cainites, Enoch remained separated from the life of his time. No doubt he was invited many times to their parties, their dances, their orgies of sin, but each time the enticements of a pleasure-mad world were met with a decisive refusal. So must the Church, if it is to be translated in the air, preserve the atmosphere of holiness and separation in its midst.

Many have walked "before the Lord," but Enoch was in a still closer place; he walked "with God." Unbroken fellowship of a spiritual Eden continued for many years, until God said, "Enoch, come up higher; I want you with me in heaven.'

Do you suppose that Enoch was afraid to go? Most certainly not! He had been walking for so long in a transplanted heaven-on-earth that he felt quite at home when the Lord received him unto Himself. How different is the death call of the sinner! Queen Elizabeth, in her dying hour, cried out, "Millions of money for an inch of time!" Henry IV, when the dreadful fact that he was a leper was made known to him, wrote in his will, "I, sinful wretch, by the grace of God, king of England and of France, and Lord of Ireland, bequeath to Almighty God my sinful soul and the life I have misspent . . ." A great deal of a contrast, isn't it, from the old-age words of Paul, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith; henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day."

II. The Preservation of Noah

"Noah, what are you doing?"

"I am building an ark."

"An ark? But where are you going to float it? There is no water around here for miles."

"God will take care of that," was the confident answer, "God has said that the end of all flesh is at hand. Wickedness has mounted up to heaven like a mountain, and God's Spirit shall not always strive with flesh. A great destructive flood is coming, and the Lord has told me to build an ark that I might be safe in that day. And if you will turn from your unrighteousness, you too may enter in and be safe."

Ill-concealed smiles were upon the faces of the gathered crowd. One of the knowit-all class even tapped his head significantly. Had they not heard that old story before? Had not their fathers

also heard it, and even their grandfathers? Why, Noah and his ark had long years before become the stock joke of the country.

But now another scene presents itself. Rain is coming down in torrents; streams are overflowing their banks; water is standing in the valleys and plains.

"Noah, let us come into your ark," comes the cry from a thousand lips. Beatings and knocks are heard upon the door, but the only response is the mocking of the storm. Entrance into the ark is now refused, for the Lord had closed the door.

The storm doubles and redoubles in fury. The waters rise higher and higher. People are now climbing to the tops of the mountains and to the high places. A few are hastily lashing together logs and boards into rude rafts. The ark rises higher and higher. The storm of judgment has no effect upon it but to bring it nearer heaven. Finally the last cries for mercy are heard, and the last mountain peaks are covered with water, and the last breathing creature has been overcome with fatigue, only to sink into the turbulent flood.

That was long years ago; but today the lengthening shadows of an approaching judgment are already falling upon a godless and confused humanity. The "days of Noah" are being re-lived, and judgment rethreatened, but hear the word of our Lord ringing steadily across the earth, "By me if any man enter in he shall be saved, saved, SAVED!" Oh, sinner, backslider, cold church member, enter into the Ark now before the door is closed.

III. The Deliverance of Lot

While the coming of judgment is always announced, the falling of the hand of judgment is usually unannounced. So we are told in the Word that while we may be acquainted with the season, the day and the hour of the coming of the Son of Man, and of the subsequent Tribulation, is not to be revealed to us. But God has given sufficient indications in prophetic Word to let us know that the time is at hand. Let us take heed to these warnings.

Perhaps some of you remember the terrible eruption of Mount Pelee on May 8, 1902. The little island of Martinique in the West Indies, where the volcano was located, was a lighthearted place. The inhabitants of this tropical paradise lived at ease. After sending forth its warnings for about a month, the restless mountain trembled and shook as the result of an internal explosion. This was on April 30. These were warnings to be heeded, and yet the gay life of the little city went right on. Les Colonies, the chief newspaper of the city, even advertised an excursion to the summit of Pelee "if the weather be fine." Finally, on May 8, the whole mountain exploded with deafening detonations, and in a few moments of time thirty thousand dead bodies lay in the streets of the ash-covered town.

Were Sodom and Gomorrah warned of their overthrow? Did God, who is merciful and just, give the cities a chance to turn unto Him?

I believe so. If you will turn to Genesis 14 you will see that the kings of Sodom and Gomorrah had held conversation with Abraham, the friend of God, and with Melchizedek, the priest of the most High. Furthermore, just Lot had spent some time as a resident of that region and was known as a God-fearing man. The citizens of these cities had every chance to learn of the ways of the Lord.

Jesus said, "But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom, it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all." Travelers tell us that the barrenness of the region of these cities bears mute testimony to the Bible story. It is the presence of the Church in the world today that is holding back the impounded floods of the wrath of God; and in "the same day" that the Church receives her glorified position in the heavenlies, the world will fall under the judging hand of an outraged God. What an incentive we have to press on and win souls for that everlasting kingdom!

IV. The Ascension of Elijah

"Elijah was a man subject to like passions as we are . ." James 5:17. What a wonderful and comforting thought! Many times the Tempter, in order to discourage us and turn us from following the Master, whispers into our ears, "Do you think that the promise is for you? Do you think that you are good enough to be translated when Jesus comes? Do you really think God will permit you in heaven?" Then we can answer back, By

grace I am saved through faith, and that not of myself; it is the gift of God. Not by my works, lest I should boast, for I am but the workmanship of His hands. Eph. 2:8-10.

Elijah—a man possessing all the weaknesses and shortcomings of fallen humanity, and yet the recipient of the grace of God in translation! And so we know that all who will humble themselves before the Lord in heartfelt repentance and contrition may be prepared for that great ascension.

And after all He is the only one who can prepare us. Suppose that you were on a ship, and you saw that it was headed with all speed toward a great reef. What would you do, call the crew to scrub the decks? Or would you go below and put on a clean change of clothing? "Why no," you say, "I would tell the pilot to change his course." And so we need Jesus to change the course of our lives. It is not a higher standard of morality that will save us, or a more rigid living, or a broadening of community spirit, or an interest in the welfare of others. These things are well and good in their places as a part of our Christian equipment; but the all-essential to preparedness for heaven is a change of course from self, sin, and Satan to the cross of Calvary. God, at the submission of our will, will create a new heart and renew a right spirit.

In the days when communication between nations was slow, a dreadful battle was once fought after the treaty of peace had been signed by the commissioners of both parties. What a terrible casualty would have been averted had the opposing armies only known of that peace treaty! And so many men and women today are going through terrible struggles in order to fit themselves for heaven, not knowing that "Jesus paid it all," and that it is by trusting in the Victor of the cross that our battles over the opposition are won. He must do the work of preparation in our lives.

The religionists of Elijah's day, fearful lest the Spirit might have cast Elijah upon the rocks, instituted a search for the ascended prophet. But all in vain. God has done so much for us already that we are confident that the work He has begun in us will go on to perfection, and that He will take us all the way. Praise His name.

One writer has pointed out the three great attitudes held toward the Second Coming, as expressed by Scripture. The scoffer says in his unbelief, "Where is the promise of his coming?" The formal Christian says in his coldness and backslidden state, "My Lord delayeth His coming." But the child of God, living the life of

victory, cries out with joy, "Even so, Lord Jesus, come quickly!"

Till then, Lord God,
I'll watch and pray;
The path He trod
Must be my way—
But, Morning Star, arise.

The Editor's Notebook



An Old Legend

One time there came to the cell of an old monk, a stranger of lordly look and princely attire. "Who art thou?" asked the monk. "I am Christ," was the answer. There was such a kingly air and commanding tone that some might have been deceived by such a statement. But the monk gave his visitor a piercing glance, and quietly asked, "Where is the print of the nails?" The visitor who was none "Where is the print of the other than the prince of evil, confused by the test question, quickly fled from the old saint's cell. Dr. J. R. Miller, commenting on this legend, says, "There be those who would have us lay aside the old faiths and accept new beliefs and interpretations, but how shall we know whether or not to receive them? The only true test is that with which this old monk exposed the false pretensions of his visitor, 'Where is the print of the nails?' The gospel without a wounded, dying Christ is not a gospel. The atonement lies at the heart of Christianity."

False Philosophies

A few days ago we were given a pamphlet in which we were told that salvation comes through right thinking, that true thinking is "the Christ." But as we perused the pamphlet we saw nothing concerning "the print of the nails in His hands." There seemed no place for the cross of Calvary in this "new gospel" which was no gospel at all. Man will never be saved by his own thoughts. The thoughts of the unregenerated are all wrong. The Spirit of God says, "The Lord knoweth the thoughts of man, that they are vanity." In the 119th Psalm the Spirit of God says, "I hate vain thoughts," and if you look carefully into this verse you will see that the word "vain" which is in italics has been inserted, so that the original reads, "I hate thoughts." The Spirit of God hates the carnal reasonings of

man which are opposed to God's revelation. The unregenerate man exalts reason and tramples down God's revelation-His Word, His holy Scriptures—because they are not in absolute harmony with his own carnal reasonings. But the man who is truly born of God, born of the Word, reveres the revelation of God and exalts it to its proper place, and he finds his regenerated reason is in absolute harmony with the revelation God has given. A varicolored plaster, flavored with aromatic spices and perfumed with attar of roses, may cover but will never cure a cancer. There is only one remedy for the cancer of sin, and that is the efficacious, all-blotting-out blood of Jesus Christ, God's Son.

The Blood of the Cross

All false cults-Christian Science, Spiritualism, New Thought, Unity, et al—ignore the fact of sin. Without a right conception of sin there is no realization of our absolute need of the remedy—the shedding of the blood of the only begotten Son of God on the cross of Calvary. God knew the aw-fulness of sin, He knew the penalty necessary for it, and He provided the remedy—His only begotten Son giving Himself for sin, yea, even becoming sin, and receiving the curse of God as He hung on the tree to give Himself a ransom for all who had sinned. At the parliament of religions held in Chicago in 1893 Dr. Hale appeared for Unitarianism, Swami Viva Kananda for Hinduism, and Dr. Joseph Cook for the Christian faith. After the first two had spoken, telling the beauties of their religions, Dr. Cook arose and advanced towards his audience, saying, "I want to introduce Lady MacBeth." Then turning to Lady MacBeth." Then turning to Dr. Hale he said, "Have you, sir, anything in your religion that will wash away her sin?" A cloud passed over Dr. Hale's face but he said nothing. Cook put the same question to

the Hindu, but there was no answer. Then Cook went to the front of the platform and with a loud voice declared the only remedy for sin, "The blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all sin."

Paul's Glory

Paul sensed the awfulness of sin; and the longer he lived under the blessed influence of the Spirit of God, the deeper his sense of sin became. Writing to Timothy he said, "This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief." And he gloried in the remedy provided for sin. To the Galatians he wrote, "God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me and I unto the world." He was running contrary to the current thought of all men around him, for the message of a crucified Messiah, was a stumbling block to all Jewry, and it was foolishness to all the Greek philosophers. But through the revelation of the Spirit he had learned that the cross revealed alike the wisdom and the power of God. Away before the foundation of the world had been laid, God in His wisdom foresaw the fall of man and provided in His purpose a perfect plan of redemption, a costly plan indeed, but one which revealed His love and mercy, and one by which His justice would be vindicated. In the person of His Son, crucified in the flesh, a full atonement would be made. And as the full revelation came to Paul in the power of the Spirit, he gloried in the fact of a crucified Messiah.

The Sword of Vengeance

In my old home we had a picture of a heedless throng, rushing on their way to destruction. Some in this throng were animated by the love of money, some by the love of fame, some by the love of pleasure; others by the love of the various things of the world, the flesh, and the devil. Above were very heavy clouds; and as

you examine the clouds you saw an angel just about to unsheathe his sword and bring judgment upon that throng. As you looked at this picture you were reminded of the verse in Ecclesiastes, "For all these things God will bring thee into judgment." I would like to suggest that an artist paint another picture; a more solemn one indeed, but one that is in harmony with God's revelation. In the vision given to him, Zechariah saw Jehovah Himself unsheathing His sword. Upon whom was this sword to descend? Listen to the words of the revelation, "Awake O sword, against My Shepherd, and against the Man that is my Fellow, said the Lord of hosts; smite the Shepherd." This was a foreview of the grim reality of Calvary. When God's sword of justice fell upon His spotless Son, ah, I deserved that sword, I, a sinner; it came down upon Him who had never sinned. He took that sword thrust in my place.

The Very Same Jesus

When the Lord Jesus made Himself known to John on the Isle of Patmos He revealed Himself as the Man of Calvary, "I am he that liveth and was dead; and behold I am alive for ever more." It was He of the wounded hands and side, He who was wounded in the house of His friends. As He dictates His seven "love letters" to His churches He reveals Himself as still the suffering One. Those of the church of Ephesus had left their first love. In Pergamos they were holding to false doctrine. At Thyatira there were abominations taking place. In Sardis there were many who were not watching. In Laodicea they had become lukewarm. Just as in the vision of Ezekiel we see the glory of the Lord departing from the temple, so we here have in these seven letters the revelation of the receding Christ, until we find Him outside the door. And as He stands outside the door He knocks and gives a loving invitation, "Behold I stand at the door and knock. If any man hear my voice and open the door I will come in to him and will sup with him, and he with me."

His Provision

The ecclesiastics of this present Laodicean age have rejected what they sneeringly call "The gospel of the shambles." They are preaching a so-called gospel which to their unregenerated minds is superior, a social gospel, a gospel that does not mention sin and its consequences and the judgment that will fall on those who reject the Saviour's sacrifice for sin.

But we must leave them alone, they are blind leaders of the bind. The invitation of the Saviour is to "any man." As you open the door and let Him in He will be made known to you in the breaking of bread. As He breaks the bread to you, you will see the print of the nails in His hands. He will say to you, "This is my body, broken for you," taking you back to Calvary. And as He holds the cup He says, "This is my blood, shed for you." Oh, wondrous provision! It is enough for every sinner. It is a satisfying portion for every saint. The Saviour gives nothing less than Himself.

A Transforming Vision

Some years ago I read a book that made a deep impression upon my heart; A. J. Gordon's book, When Christ Came to Church. In it Gordon told of a dream or vision which had transformed his whole life and labors. In this vision he noticed a Stranger coming into his church and taking a seat beside one of his deacons. He was arrested by the look of the Stranger, and wondered how he would like the music of his paid choir when they sang. He noticed that the Stranger was interested in the gifts placed in the collection, in those who gave, and the spirit in which they gave. After he had preached he wondered what this Stranger thought of his message. After the Stranger had passed out he asked the deacon, "Who was that one in our midst today?" The deacon replied, "Did you not know that was Jesus, and that He always comes to meeting?" The thought went home to the preacher. He was impelled to dismiss his paid choir which he felt was not singing for the glory of God, and trust God for singing inspired by the Spirit of God. He was impressed that there must be more consecrated giving in his assembly, and soon that church was supporting a large number of missionaries. But what about the sermon? He thought, "I was preaching Christ and Him crucified, but was I preaching Him in a crucified manner?" Ah, there is the rub. Our theology concerning the atonement may be perfect, but do we know in a practical manner the deep fellowship of the cross and have we become partakers of the nature, the disposition, the character of Him who was crucified upon it.

Through the Eternal Spirit

The question arises, How can we know the power of the cross so that we may glory in it even as the inspired

apostle of old? We can only know this in an adequate way through the revelation of the Spirit of God. It was through the eternal Spirit that Christ offered Himself without spot unto God. Before He left His disciples He promised them that this same Spirit, this Spirit that was leading Him to Calvary, should be given to them. He even said it was better for them that He go away so that they might receive this Spirit, this blessed Spirit who would take of the things which pertained to Him and reveal them unto them. After He had been crucified and was risen again He told them to tarry until this blessed Spirit should be poured out upon them. On the Day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit came, and it was under the power of that precious Spirit that Peter proclaimed salvation through Him who was crucified at Calvary. "Let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ." The result of his preaching in the power of the Spirit a crucified and risen Saviour, was that three thousand souls were swept into the Kingdom. And Peter was able to tell all his listeners that they too, if they would but repent, and be baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus for the remission of their sins, could receive this wondrous

The Place of Grace and Glory

It is this same blessed eternal Spirit who took our Lord Jesus Christ on to Calvary who will take us back to Calvary. He it is who will bring us into living union with the crucified One, making us so one with the crucified Lamb that we too will be as lambs, every ready for service or for sacrifice. The longing of the apostle was to know the Lord fully, to know the power of His resurrection, the fellowship of His sufferings, that he might be conformed to the likeness of His death-and that meant crucifixion. He longed to be, as A. J. Gordon longed, a crucified messenger of a crucified Saviour. Andrew Murray once wrote, "We need to be led by God Himself into the mysteries of the cross through a life crucified with Christ." We are to participate in all that the cross and its death implies. Our share in the atonement of the cross is to be tested by our fellowship with it-our delight in sharing its disposition. Calvary is the innermost sanctuary in the life of Christ; His death the gate of glory." Trust the Spirit of God to take you into this inner sanctuary and make you a partaker of both the grace and the glory found therein.

was appointed as a missionary to Japan through the co-operation of her home assembly in September 1921. She sailed for the country of her calling in October of that same year.

Sister Straub had under her charge at the time of her death about thirty orphans and was training them with the object in view of finally making them teachers and preachers of the gospel. Others who have been with her have left the home and are standing true to God in other localities. Village meet-

ings have been held by the older students and some very encouraging results have been obtained. One young woman from Sister Straub's school obtained employment with a certain company but was dismissed because she would not misrepresent things for the benefit of the company. Later on she was re-employed because of her absolute reliability. This surely is an evidence of a work of grace in a heathen heart.

Our Sister Straub is now happy in the presence of her Lord but the responsibility is ours to continue the work.

Let us pray that God may provide for the lambs of the fold she has so tenderly watched over by raising up some other under-shepherd to lead them into His truth.

The Boundless Grace of Our God

In my prison services I have met several murderers. I know how they feel. One had killed his wife, they gave him twenty years. Another one had killed his mother, they condemned him to be electrocuted. After due process of law, he had been tried in the courts of the land before a jury of his peers, and after fair and impartial trial he had been found guilty of murder in the first degree and he was sentenced to death. He appealed his case, but the judgment was affirmed, the supreme court upheld the verdict of the jury in every respect. The death-sentence stood! Was there anything yet the poor condemned man could expect? According to the natural conception of right and according to the Word, that he who uses the sword shall perish by the sword, the criminal had no right to expect anything else but the electric chair. Now he appealed to the last resort, to the highest resort of the people: GRACE. Only one thing could save him from death: GRACE. He was not entitled to it, he had no moral, no legal, no human claim to the commutation of the deathsentence. He had-and I wish to emphasize that—he had absolutely no right to expect any remission of the terrible punishment, which he so feared that his teeth chattered. The only thing that could help him was grace, which means something, he did not deserve, to which he was not entitled, something he had no right to demand or to claim. He had no right to appeal to any human sentiment; if he did it nevertheless, he did it from despair and last resort, as his last attempt to preserve his forfeit life and to be saved! And his sentence was changed.

Thus we have to understand the tenor of the meaning of grace. God owes us nothing! If you think that God owes us anything you do not know what sin is! And you don't realize how foul and dark it is! Grace is something that falls to our share without our being worthy of it. Whenever we speak of the grace of God and whenever we want God to give us peace of heart, salvation of soul, eternal life and citizenship in the kingdom of God, we must fully understand that we have not the faintest right on our side to ask for it; that we have neither judicial nor moral nor religious right to expect for us the grace from God. Grace means: To find help, where it

is without prospect to have help; it means to get saved when there is no salvation in sight; grace means to be overtaken by the life-ship of God! Grace means that God gives us something for nothing.

But, if you think that because you do something you do penance, you do charity, you do good works; if you think that you are doing something which God is under obligation to consider; if you come to God and say, "Yes, Lord, I am a sinner, but look, I am not quite so bad, I can't be so altogether lost; this and that is in me, and because of my goodness you'll grant me your goodness," —then my dear friend, you don't know yourself and you do not realize the depth of sin. God owes us

And now, they come and say, "Can I be held responsible for being a sinner? I was born into sin. I was brought into existence by my parents without my consent. Now shall I be thankful that I was born into this sinful condition that brought me nothing but doubt and misery? They want to hold me responsible that I am in this sinful world!" When someone comes to me with this argument, I always say, "I understand you very well! But what does it help you to complain over the fact that you came into being without your wish and that without your co-operation you were born into this condition of sin-what does your complaining help you? YOU ARE IN IT. That is all. Accuse your parents before God, accuse God that He permitted your existence; accuse God, He can stand it, go ahead. But consider also how often-your knowledge concerning this notwithstanding-you said passionately "yes" to your own life and as a parent brought other children into existence -your own! How about complaining now? Consider also that for all that you are a being of free will. Don't forget that from the day of your birth the love and grace of God was for you without reserve, and worked on you and wooed you. Did you hold still? Don't forget all that when you stand accusing before your parents and your

A great violinist ordered a manufacturer of violins to make him the best instrument possible. He told him to use the best material, take as much time as he wished, and use all his skill in its construction.

At last, the manufacturer asked the violinist to come and try the violin. As the artist drew his bow across the strings, his face became clouded. Lifting the violin, he smashed it to pieces on the table, handed the price to the manufacturer and left the shop. The manufacturer gathered the pieces of the instrument and put them together. After he had remade the violin out of the broken pieces he sent again for the musician. This time the cloud was not seen; as he drew the bow across the instrument, he told the manufacturer that he had succeeded, at last, in making just the kind of violin that he wanted. "What is the price?" asked the musician. "Nothing at all," was the answer. "It is the same instrument that you smashed to pieces some days ago. I put it together, and out of the broken pieces and fragments, this per-fect instrument has been made."

We were sold under sin; we sold ourselves for nothing to the devil, we were broken to pieces in the hand of Satan; God was under no obligation to us whatsoever; but He took the fragments of our shattered lives and, by His grace, put them together so that, under the touch of His Holy Spirit, there can go forth music good enough for earth and heaven!

O, the boundless Grace of our God! It is as with the murderer in his cell: he really had no right to claim anything, and the only thing that he could expect was the electric chair. Nothing could save him, but grace. We are in the same condition, friends; when we really and truly understand our case before God, we understand that nothing in the world or out of the world can help; we cannot lay claim to anything to help us.

In some kind of pictorial magazine I saw the picture of a vessel adrift, an old battered body, on a raging sea, with threatening flashes of forked lightning shooting across the darkened sky. It was a reproduction of Stanfield's painting called "Abandoned." No canvas ever spoke its message with plainer words. I might narrate it; I might remark on it. But down underneath the painting is a verse that tells the whole, pathetic, weird story:

"Storm-beaten, torn and tossed By night and day; Lone, lorn, lamented, lost, Drifting away."

Look at that old vessel and you'll say, "It's not worth saving." The vessels of our humanity weren't worth saving, but the impossible, the unbelievable, the unheard of, the altogether

The Testimony of an African Convert

(Told in his own words)

"I, John Tobey, of Cape Palmas, Liberia and of the Kroo Tribe. All the people of my tribe recognized me to be their priest in all their native worship, such as idols, jujus, etc., being the son of the ex-chief of said tribe, who was their interpreter, and who taught me all the secrets of the said worship. I was obedient to the worship of my father and trusted in all these things till I became very sick. During all this time I was under the control and power of Satan. I was wicked enough to be called an angel of his. While under this wicked influence I told my father I could no longer remain with him and I wanted to go somewhere else to start a business for myself. I came to Freetown (Sierra Leone) and started this same wicked work. I made all different kinds of charms and sold them to the people for a big price. These charms were supposed to give them long life, good luck, big name, etc., and the idols were for gods to worship. Sometimes under the influence of Satan I would cut my wife with a razor or knife. No police or judge could have me prosecuted because of the use of Satan's power. One Sunday morning my sister said to me, "John, will you go with me and pay a visit to the Pentecostal Church?" I said, "Yes." When I heard that preacher he preached altogether against my business, which he said was contrary to our Lord and Saviour, and that the wages of such sin was death. After we returned home I asked my sister how did that preacher know all about my work. "Don't you think someone told him of my doings?" Sister said, "No, John, it was the Spirit of the Lord that spoke through him, and which knows your doings." I said, "If there is anything called Spirit, I will see about it." So next Sunday found me back at the church. That time it was worse than before. He preached till it went through my very bones. At once I was convicted, and on Friday of that same week I was converted. So I gave up all my jujus and idols except one which was like a rope, but sometimes would turn to a snake. I was afraid if I gave that up I would die and if I did not hold God strong and confess to have this thing I really would die. But one night when I was in a deep

sleep the power of God came upon me and commanded me to give it up. If I did not obey I would lose my life, so I see by the Word these things can't harm anyone when given up in the name of the Lord, so I gave all up and confessed all and was set at liberty. A week later I went to work on the ship, New Toronto, and while there I was baptized in the Holy Ghost. Now I am standing for the power of the gospel of Jesus Christ. I can say now to anyone that since I have passed through the gate no one will be rejected. Simply have to believe and let go all your doings when you are told to do so."

Note: This man who is said to be one of the most wicked of his tribe was converted just before we came back to the field. He returned from this ship after we came. I asked him to write his testimony for the Evangel. -Mrs. Shakley.

Some Modern Definitions

Agnostic-Our impression: One who claims not to know whether God exists, whether or not a man has a soul, whether or not there is a heaven or hell, and whether or not the Bible is true, and who is sometimes so proud of his ignorance that he makes no attempt to overcome it.

Atheist—Our impression: A person who has explored the entire universe, and who has exhausted every branch of knowledge, so that he can tell us positively that there is no God.

Intellectual—A member of a growing class of atheistic scholars, who deny that there is any intelligence behind the universe, and so cause us to wonder how a universe without intelligence has managed to produce a creature intelligent enough to question whether there is any intelligence be-

Socialist-An individual, often sincere, who is optimistic enough to believe that there can be heaven upon earth while hell still reigns in men's hearts.

Christian Scientist-A religionist who denies the reality of sin and sickness, ascribing it to an error of the mortal mind, without, however, explaining just how and when we got hold of that error.

Devil-According to the Modernists: A non-existent being, whose existence must be denied, in order that man may be made entirely responsible for all of the deviltry of this world.

Emotionalism—According to some of our conservative friends: demonstrative excitment, perfectly in order on the ball-field and in the political convention, but to be denounced as "fanaticism" when connected with righteousness, and spiritual things.

Evolution—A plausible and fascinating theory that accounts for the origin of all life from a speck of protoplasm and which has but one unimportant thing against it, which is as follows: It is not true.

Fanatic—According to some of our liberals in theology: one who takes the teachings of Christ seriously, and actually lives up to them.

Skeptic—A well-educated person who is continually doubting his beliefs and believing his doubts.

Higher Critic—Our impression: a scholar who is an expert at taking the Bible to pieces, but a poor hand at putting it together again; well illustrated by the following fable: After killing the bird and taking it apart, the Wise Cat said to his old-fashioned friend, "See, I told you that there was nothing to that singing!

Philosopher-A scholar who has spent years studying about God, the universe and man, and who often concludes that we can know nothing about the first, a little more about the second, and a few facts about the third. See 1 Corinthians 1:19-21.

Man-According to some modern philosophers: an infinitesimal speck of organic matter, living on a planet that is a speck of mud compared to the vastness of the universe. This minute speck of lively matter is its own savior, and also the savior of society!

Modernist—A religious philosopher who feels called to the task of revising the New Testament, correcting the Lord Jesus Christ, and explaining to a modern age just what He should have taught.

Narrow-mindedness-According to some pleasure-loving scholars: an attitude of mind that deludes people into the belief that there is such a thing as a fixed moral standard.

Puritan-According to very advanced thinkers: an old-fashioned person who believes that there still exists such a thing as modesty.

Rationalist—Our impression: a person who sets up his own reason as a god, and expects other people to worship it.

Sin-According to the most advanced philosophers: an abstract, mysterious thing or power invented by preachers, who are ignorant and presumptuous enough to believe that something is wrong with human

Pronounced Dead—Raised

Last fall in a severe conflict with a heart affliction that brought on convulsions for many hours I was delivered by the power of God through the prayer of faith. At that time I had been wearing glasses for thirteen years, and those who examined my eyes said I should have to wear them always. Three weeks after I was healed of the heart trouble God healed my eyes and now for six months I have not worn glasses and my sight is good. I feel no need of glasses. However at the time I was healed of eye trouble a small pimple came on my heel. In a few hours it had spread to the size of a dollar, and was excruciatingly painful. Again the saints gathered to pray and the Lord undertook, healing my foot, making it perfectly whole, and covering the place with new skin within five minutes.

A short time after this I was suddenly stricken with a pain in my stomach. For three days I was in the jaws of death. I could not keep even water on my stomach. I took no medicine; but trusted God. Finally they crossed my hands for dead. Thirty minutes passed with no sign of life. In that time I was seemingly parted from the body and having sweet peace in the presence of Jesus. different takes place: God's grace! It is our utter helplessness that attracts God. It is not "like drawing like to like;" but the unlike. It is the unlikeness that constitutes this attraction. The grace of God hath appeared bringing salvation to all men. Jesus is here, the grace of God is revealed. It is true, "The grace of God became flesh." The face of God had been shut off from man's view since the fall, for its glory was too brilliant for the gaze of sinful man. But now the grace of God curtained Himself in human flesh, thus again becoming visible.

The God-man, then, is the gateway between God and man. In Him God has found His way back to man who had been excluded from Him because of rebellion; through Him man finds

his way back to God.

Look to the Cross of Golgotha. It reveals what humanity is capable of, but it also reveals the saving grace of our God. If you really want to know what "grace" is, place yourself under the cross, see the blood flowing from the side of Jesus; see His thornpierced brow, the lacerated hands and feet; see Jesus suffering there and dying for an underserving, utterly lost and worthless human race. To find our full privilege in the gospel, we need to take a reverent visit to the holy Scriptures, there to find what was the glory of the Church when led by the Spirit of God. One of the greatest marvels of the

revelation of God is that He has left on record the great depository of truth, the sacred Scriptures. 2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21.

At different times groups of people have risen holding forth that their spoken words were equal to that which is written. Let us beware lest we make a grievous error here. We have every reason for believing that the holy Scriptures are our all sufficient rule for faith and practice, and that the canon of inspired Scripture is complete. Genesis starts us off with the creation of man, tells us of his sin, then of his banishment from God and finally of his subjection to death. Revelation tells us of new heavens and a new earth, of the new creation, of freedom from sin, and of man restored to the glorious presence of God. In Genesis we find the ills of the fall introduced, in Revelation we find all the ills of the fall removed and God in the midst of His people, who, through the majestic atonement of Christ, shall reign forever and ever.

We are thankful that "all scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in right-eousness: that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works." The perfect man is not he who assumes a spirituality above that which is written. The perfect man is he who knows the holy Scriptures, who abides in their truth, and who sacredly receives them as God's rule for his enlightenment and conduct. 2 Tim. 3:16.

The sacred Scriptures are ours, given for all time. Let us diligently search their sacred pages. There we shall find the purpose of God that all His children might be filled with the Holy Spirit and with power, and led into all truth concerning the good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

Ministering to the Deaf and Dumb

Mrs. Elsie R. Peters at the Springfield Assembly

"And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15.

I am so glad to say that thirteen years ago right here in Springfield, Missouri, the Lord gave me my call to preach to the deaf mutes. It came like this. I was sitting down one morning for just a few moments' rest, for I was a housewife with three children and you know mothers often get tired. While I was resting I was just praying a little prayer, "Lord, what can I do for You today?" The Lord answered me, "Go and visit a deaf

I obeyed the leading of the Spirit and went to see a deaf mute and his wife and they were so glad to see me. She got out a pencil and tablet and we wrote back and forth for a long time. I remembered that when I was just a little girl nine years of age I had a deaf mute for a playmate and she taught me the manual alphabet. I told this lady about it, and she asked me to say it for her to see if I still remembered it. I began and I just had two of them all mixed up. I thought "g" was "x" and "x" was "g." She helped me with that and so I began signing right that day to them. It seemed that the Holy Spirit just anointed my hands and that very night she and her husband and her four hearing children visited our home until twelve p. m. I just talked and talked and talked, and told them what the Lord had done for us and what He could do for them. I just had a burning love for them and wanted to teach them all I knew of the power of God. The Lord blessed us and I saw both of them wonderfully saved.

About one year later we moved to Ft. Worth, Texas, and I was not satisfied because I was not preaching to the deaf. But the Lord opened the way for me, and I began preaching to the deaf in Ft. Worth. Three years after I met the first deaf mute I became very discouraged and I fell on my knees before the Lord and prayed, "Lord, take this burden off of me. It is too much. Call someone else. Excuse me Lord, for I am a mother with a family and I have so much to do." I just made excuses, but the Lord gave me a vision. I saw before me my own hands, and it seemed that they were cut off. They were bathed in blood and the blood dripped right down between the fingers.

I cried out, "Lord, what does this mean?" The Lord answered me, "That is the blood of the deaf. Unless you tell them about Me and My power to save, their blood will I require at thy hands." And so instead of the Lord taking the burden away, the burden was greater than before. So I just asked the Lord to help me and the Lord answered, "As I called Moses to deliver the children of Israel out of bondage, so have I called you to deliver the deaf out of darkness into

Six years after my call I conducted the first revival for deaf mutes ever held as far as I know in the history of America. The Lord sent us to Los Angeles, and we truly praise the Lord that He has so wonderfully led. He has given us a beautiful little church right near seven different street car lines. He has saved many of the deaf people. There are two thousand deaf mutes in Los Angeles. Fourteen people have already received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit speaking with tongues just as speaking people do. The Lord said, "In the last days I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh," and I am so glad that He has given His Spirit to the deaf mutes also.

We started without anything but the Lord opened the hearts of the hearing people to give and give until today there has been almost six thousand dollars paid on the church in just a little more

than two years. Do pray that the Lord will continue to open the way. We cannot depend on the deaf themselves to pay for the church, but we know that the Lord is able. I received a letter from our Brother Arthur Frodsham, and he told me that unless the Lord does something wonderful he is afraid we will lose the church.

It almost broke my heart to think that it is the only Pentecostal church for deaf mutes in America and that there was a possibility of losing it. It is the only church for the deaf mutes in all the state of California regardless of denomination. I thank God that He has so honored the Pentecostal people in that He has given us this church. The District Council holds this property as when I felt led to build the church I asked them to please take us under their wings and stand behind us. Pray that the Lord will save that church and that many souls will be saved and filled with the

We have had two years of Bible school now and four of our deaf mutes are called to preach. Right now they are taking my place, with the help of my sister.
