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The Need of a World-Wide Revival

WANT to refer my readers to the striking words of Isa. 59:19: "When the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the Lord shall lift up a standard against him (margin, shall put him to flight)."

The Revised Version-both English and American—reads more like this, "For he (the enemy) shall come as a rushing stream which the breath of the Lord driveth away."

In this verse two things are clear,

- 1. The fact of Satan's coming with great power.
- 2. God's sweeping him back with an overwhelming display of His power.

When the enemy! This word enemy is from a Hebrew word meaning to cramp, to get into a tight, narrow place, to be crowded by an opponent; and has reference to a time of special distress and anguish.

"When the enemy comes in like a flood"-a word which refers to a rushing stream, a tumbling torrent of destruction. Surely this is a true picture of this our day! Witness the inroads of Spiritism, Christian Science, Modernism, Evolution, blatant Atheism, etc. Surely if ever Satan defied the armies of the living God, he is doing it today. But we are encouraged to believe by the truth of Isa. 59:19 that this is just the time when we may expect God to mightily reveal His power.

When everything from a personal, ecclesiastical and rational standpoint is as dark as it can possibly be, then God comes with power and sweeps back the enemy provided He can find intercessors, who will persistently "stand in the gap"; plead with Him until the plague of lawlessness and sin is stayed.

At the very time when Satan comes

in like a flood "the Spirit of the Lord will lift up a standard against him, or put him to light."

everything seemed to be going to the devil, that the Reformation broke out, and that Martin Luther and other great Reformers went like flames of fire through the land. Just before the great Methodist Revival which revolutionized Christendom, the churches were "twice dead, plucked up by the roots." But when John Wesley and his coadjutors marched through the land, thousands flocked to the feet of Jesus and the wilderness became a fruitful field, and the dry land became springs of water.

Before the breaking out of the Welsh Revival the churches of Wales were dying of "dry rot"; but God put the spirit of prevailing prayer upon Evan Roberts and others with the result that one of the greatest revivals of modern times broke out.

The great Pentecostal Movement to which we are privileged to belong, came at a time when the saints of God were tired of spiritual dearth and formality, and pleaded with God until He mightily poured out His Spirit according to the pattern of the Early Church. We know that in a few years the truths of Pentecost spanned the world and circled the globe, and "the end is not

And now in these days of awful apostasy, and God-dishonoring compromise, the need is urgent for another world-wide manifestation of His power. Let us then ask largely and believe.

In Psalm 119:126 the Psalmist gives a definite reason why it was time for God to work, "for they have made void thy law." The word void means to break up, violate, frustrate, disannul,-make of none effect. The Modernists are doing this very thing. They (Continued on Page Fifteen)

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Praying Through for Revival

L. Moody once heard a man say that the world has yet to see what one man, fully surrendered, can accomplish for God. Moody said he would be that man, and he wrought great things for the Kingdom, and moved two nations Godward.

A New York business man has paraphrased that statement that stirred Moody's

soul, and has applied it to the realm of prayer. He says: "It yet remains to be seen what great things GOD WILL DO, in answer to the prayer of faith of any of His children!"

The same principle of the unthinkably great results that can be achieved by the believing intercession of a single individual was recently expressed by Samuel Chadwick, Principal of Cliff College England. He said: "The fervent supplication of one soul moved of God is an immeasurable force."

One of the most striking examples in the Christian era of the immeasurably great and far-reaching effects of persistent, long-continued prayer is found in the history of the Moravian Church. Soon after the memorable outpouring of God's Spirit at Herrn-hut, Germany, in 1727, they began a prayer-meeting which continued day and night for one hundred years. In speaking of the prayer-meeting and its results, Bishop Hasse says: "Was there ever in the whole of Church history such an astonishing prayermeeting as that which beginning in 1727, went on one hundred years. It is something absolutely unique. It was known as the 'Hourly Intercession,' and it meant that by relays of brethren and sisters prayer without ceasing was made to God for all the work and wants of His Church. Prayer of that kind always leads to action. In this case it kindled a burning desire to make Christ's salvation known to the heathen. It led to the beginning of modern foreign missions. From that one small village community more than one hundred missionaries went out in twenty-five years. You will look in vain elsewhere for anything to match it in anything like the same extent."

Bishop Hasse has only touched the fringe of the results that flowed forth from this hundred-years-long prayer meeting. The Moravian missionaries went forth as flaming, Spirit-filled messengers, seeing multitudes born again in the American colonies and in other lands. And it was the Moravian missionaries in England that led John and Charles Wesley into the full gospel of grace, and so had a very real share in the revival that swept

over England, and saved her from the horrors of the revolution that deluged France with blood.

Recently there has come to my attention a somewhat similar prayer movement in Latin America that is already producing glorious results. It was originated at San Jose, the capital of Costa Rica, in connection with the work of the Latin American Evangelization Campaign founded by Mr. and Mrs. Harry Strachan. The movement was started by an urtutored native evangelist, who was wholly consecrated to God, and filled with the Holy Spirit. It has now spread to other republics of Central and South America.

One of the missionaries of the Latin American Evangelization Campaign who has returned home on furlough, gives this description of the Prayer

"The plan of the prayer league is that each of its members shall spend a least one-half hour daily in the reading of the Bible and prayer for the speedy evangelization of the lost in Latin America, as well as for the spiritual growth of those who have taken Christ as their Saviour and Lord -this half hour to be given early in the morning if possible, or at any convenient time during the day. Weekly cottage prayer meetings are held in the various sections of the city, where three or four families gather for an hour to two. Then once a week they all meet together in the house of God and spend the entire evening in united prayer. Also on Sunday evening before the service a group meets at the church to plead for the salvation of souls in the evening meeting. God has marvelously answered, and their hearts have been encouraged to continue asking."

The most striking feature of the League of Prayer, and the part that most closely resembles the one-hundred-years' prayer-meeting of the Moravians, is called "The Everburning Lamp" (La Lampara Encendida). The twenty-four hours are divided into periods of fifteen minutes each. All the members of the League who wish to have a part in this continuous intercession pledge them-

selves to take a specified fifteen-minute period some time during the day or night! And they do this in addition to the half-hour devotional period in the morning. The number of those that keep these quarter-hour prayer seasons at Costa Rica is so large that in many of the periods there are several praying simultaneously. There is

no special room in the church set apart for these fifteen-minute prayer periods, but the people observe in their own homes the specified times of intercession that they have chosen.

The missionary from Costa Rica declares the League of Prayer has already revolutionized the lives of those who have been faithful to their pledge. She says: "Needless to say, the League with its ever-burning lamp of prayer has revolutionized the spiritual life of those who have been true to their pledge and have faithfully prayed day by day. They have found His promises to be true, their faith has been strengthened, they have been able to lay hold of the power of Christ for spiritual victory in their own lives, and they have had the joy of seeing the work of the Holy Spirit in the salvation of relatives and friends. One cannot come in contact with these children of God without knowing that they have been with Jesus, because their faces shine with His peace and their testimony rings with His joy."

It is all the more significant that this "Ever-burning Lamp" of continuous, persistent prayer should flourish in Latin America. The people of these Spanish-speaking countries are proverbial for taking up a thing with enthusiasm for the moment, and then dropping it just as suddenly. But God's Spirit has laid hold of these believers and their persistent and importunate intercession puts to shame the lukewarmness and fitfulness in prayer of many of us living in colder climes where we are supposed to be more persistent in our pledged purposes.

If ever there was a time in the history of our nation when continuous persistent, prevailing prayer was needed, it is right now. I fully believe there are thousands of God's children who are sorely grieved over present day conditions; and who will gladly join in taking time for daily persistent intercession for the United States and Canada; for our schools and colleges; for our pastors and churches; for multitudes who have forgotten God; for unsaved relatives and friends; and for full surrender and revival in our hearts and lives.

A plan of persistent daily prayer for revival in the United States and Canada has just been started in Philadelphia. The method is somewhat similar to that of the "Ever-burning Lamp" in Costa Rica. Each person who enlists endeavors to spend at least

fifteen minutes daily in prayer for revival. It may be found helpful to set apart a particular period for daily intercession such as 6 A. M. or 9 A. M. or 3 P. M., but often the duties of the day will make the time of prayer vary according to circumstances.

While there is no pledge of thirty minutes daily of Bible reading and prayer in connection with this plan of intercession for the United States and Canada, yet we know that unless our souls are fed daily upon the Word of God and we take time to commune with Him, we shall have little power in our specified period of intercession for revival and for an outpouring of God's Spirit.

May I suggest that each of you who reads these lines should get alone with the Lord, and ask Him very definitely to show you His will for you in this matter. If you decide that you would like to enlist in this plan of daily prayer, send your name and address to The Million Testaments Campaign, 1505 Race Street, Philadelphia, Pa.

It is further suggested that those who are praying through for revival in a certain church or community should meet together weekly for intercession whenever it is found practical or possible.

There are a number of prayers in the Bible that will guide us and quicken our faith in praying for our lands that have so largely forgotten God. Read Exodus 32:7-14, and see how Moses prayed when the Children of Israel had disobeyed God, and how the Lord hearkened to the voice of one individual and saved the nation from destruction. Read Nehemiah 1:4-11, and see how Nehemiah cried to God for the

remnant of the captivity in Jerusalem that were in affliction and reproach, and as a result of his prayers and labors the walls of Jerusalem were rebuilt, and the reproach was lifted from his people. Read Ezra 9:5-15 and see how this man, that loved the Word of God, and was so grieved over the

apostasy of the people, confessed to God the sins of the leaders and of himself, and how conviction of sin came upon the people, and the evil that would have ruined the nation was put away, and the people were brought back to God.

Let us each one humble ourselves before God, and confess and forsake our own sins and the sins of the nation, and cry mightily to God and claim by faith the promise in 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face,

and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

It was when hundreds of missionaries in India banded themselves together to spend thirty minutes daily in intercession that a great revival

came to India a number of years ago; and so as hundreds and thousands in the United States and Canada cry unitedly and continuously to God, may we not expect to see the windows of heaven opened, and gracious out-pourings of God's Spirit in the near future?

It is suggested that one begin the daily prayer period with the following prayer, or one somewhat similar, for cleansing and power in one's own heart and life:

Heavenly Father, I confess my sins, and by Thy grace I will forsake them. Forgive them all through the precious blood of the Lord Jesus Christ.

By Thy grace and power I fully surrender my life to Thee to be used in Thy service as Thou dost guide and lead.

Fill me anew with Thy Holy Spirit, and teach me to pray with believing faith.

The following topics may be found helpful in guiding our petitions during our prayer period:

Pray for government officials and employees in the United States and Canada, that there may be conviction of sin, and confessing and forsaking of sin, and multitudes turning to God.

Pray that teachers in public and high schools, and professors in colleges and universities, may be convicted of sin by the Holy Spirit, and that large numbers may repent and accept Christ as their Saviour, and be born again into the Kingdom of God.

Pray earnestly for the students in our schools and colleges. Ask that those who are standing firm in the faith may be filled with the Holy Spirit; and may witness valiantly for the Lord; and that great multitudes of the unsaved may be

brought out of darkness into the glorious light of the Gospel.

Pray that the funds for the full million Testaments for the students may speedily be secured; and that the Testaments may be carefully and prayerfully given to the students, and that

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The Editor's Notebook



The Need of Revival

Said a thoughtful writer of a New York daily paper recently, "There must come a great spiritual awakening or civilization is doomed." It is good however to remember that there have been gloomy periods before the days in which we are now living, and that in those dark days some godly people felt the pressure of sin around them and prayed until God sent awakening. A most timely book has just been published entitled, "Old Time Revivals" by John Shearer,* which tells of some sixteen revivals that have occurred during the past three hundred years. There is nothing that will stir us up to pray for revival more than the story of how God answered prayer in sending revivals in days gone by.

A Great Day in Scotland

One chapter in the book tells of the day when young John Livingstononly 27 years of age-stood before a great congregation in the churchyard of Shotts. There had been a great day at the kirk. "Many formed themselves into little companies, and spent the whole night in fervent devotion, in praise and supplication. The young preacher was in one of these praying bands." On the day following, with great fear and trembling that young preacher stood before a vast audience in the open air. "Burning thoughts and burning words filled his heart and lips. For an hour and a half he preached to a people who seemed rooted to the ground in a great stillness. Then when he thought he must close, again the Spirit filled him with a fullness that must be outpoured, and for another hour he continued with a melting of heart and liberty of utterance. Five hundred men and women, some from the high ranks of society, some poor wastrels and beggars, were

converted where they stood, and lived from that day as those who had indeed received a new heart and a new spirit. The memory of that day has never died, and the very telling of its story has proved a fount of revival." May God send us many of such nights of prayer and days of blessing.

A New England Revival

A chapter is given to the great awakening that came to New England under the preaching of Jonathan Edwards. It is written of Edwards, "As a preacher he was entirely destitute of the art of oratory. His pulpit manner indeed was in the furthest degree removed from that of a 'revivalist' in the popular idea. His voice was weak. His sermons were written, and closely read. His sight being defective, he was compelled to hold his manuscript up to his eyes! Yet these sermons, thus painfully delivered, were so filled with the burning passion of the man's heart-there was such an awe upon his spirit while he spoke, as of one in the immediate presence of God-that men listened spellbound, and sometimes leaped to their feet and gripped the pillars of the church lest they should fall into the pit that seemed to open beneath them!" It was obviously a work of the Spirit taking the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty. "As the fruit of the revival, almost the whole adult population of the town of Northampton, Mass. joined the church. Ministers from other parts came to witness these wonders of divine grace. When they recounted them to their people, the Spirit used their testimony, often in a remarkable way. The fire spread thus from town to town and from county to county. Edwards entered upon a glorious ministry of itineration, and his famous and awful sermon, 'Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God,' was preached at Enfield, marking the beginning of an awakening there. But the good news spread not only throughout New England; it passed to other lands."

David Brainerd's Ministry

The story is told of Brainerd's ministry among the Indians: "He had little success in his first setting out. His station was at Kaunaumeek, 'a most lonesome wilderness,' where he lodged on a heap of straw. The Indians were indifferent or suspicious, while the white settlers bitterly resented his presence. His health began to decline rapidly, and after a year of unremitting toil and hardship, he was forced to retire from the field. He was soon invited to the pastorate of several New England churches. The temptation to settle in East Hampton was especially great. Here, in a lovely country, amid a wealthy and kindly people, he might recover his strength, and spend happy and useful days. The tender tie of a pure affection for the daughter of Jonathan Edwards also constrained him to stay. His experience at Kaunaumeek had clearly shown him that the Indian wilderness held for him certain and speedy death, and what fruit had he to show for his labor? Surely then in this sweet clime, where health and love and delightful service awaited him, he should cast his lot. But as Brainerd hesitated, literally between life and death, he heard from the far-off woods a pathetic cry. It was the wail of 'his poor Indians.' No man cared for their souls!"

Burning Out for God

Out he went in "constant journeyings among his poor Indians, covering more than 3,000 miles, through pathless forests, over dark, dangerous mountains, in fierce rains and freezing cold. His body was reduced to a pitiable state of extreme weakness. But as his strength ebbed his compassion grew, grew till it became a great hunger that would not be denied. Whole nights were spent in agonizing prayer in the dark woods, his clothes drenched with the sweat of his travail. Suddenly—how often

must that word be used in the history of revival-suddenly, the Spirit was outpoured upon the whole region of the Susquehanna. His first audience there had consisted of four women and a few children. Now there came streaming in upon him from all sides a host of men and women, who pressed upon him. The woods were filled with the sound of a great mourning, and beneath the Cross every man fell as if he and the Saviour God alone were there. Gradually as the missionary spoke, there came to them, one by one, the peace and comfort of the gospel. As the days passed he had full proof that a heaven-sent revival had come. A passion for righteousness possessed the converts. They became themselves ardent missionaries of the Cross. The light spread through all that dark region, and a strong Indian church was established. Brainerd's work was done. His body, utterly exhausted by his labors, was quickly mastered by disease. But what mattered that? It had been the means of a triumphant work of faith."

How "Sodom" Was Changed

A special chapter is given to Finney's revival and we quote the following to show how Finney was led of the Spirit. "Once he was asked by an old man to preach in a village where religious services were unknown. On reaching the place, he found the school house filled with an audience of wildlooking men. After the singing, or rather bellowing, of a hymn, he cast himself upon his knees in prayer. There God gave him his text: 'Up, get you out of this place, for the Lord will destroy the city.' He rose, and told them the story of Sodom and its one righteous man, Lot. As he spoke, they cast furious looks upon him, and small wonder! Their village was known as Sodom for its great wickedness, and the old man who had brought Finney was nick-named Lot. Of this the preacher was ignorant. The Spirit had given him the needed word, and now he used it as a twoedged sword. Suddenly an awful solemnity came upon them, and then before two minutes had passed, almost the whole congregation fell upon their knees or their faces, and began to cry out for mercy, while old 'Lot,' sitting in the midst, looked round in utter amazement! That meeting continued until next morning. Finney himself had to leave to keep an appointment, but the old man had the unspeakable joy of directing wounded souls to Jesus, and in this case Sodom was really saved through its one righteous man!"

The Irish Revival of '59

Space is given to the revival of 1857 in this country when thousands met daily to wait on God. The revival spread to Ireland in 1859. It began with a prayer meeting of Sunday school teachers. The Spirit of God was poured out mightily and men were smitten with conviction in the streets. 'Sin was felt as a crushing and intolerable burden, and men and women often fell to the earth and continued for days in a state of utter prostration. Others were suddenly pierced as by a sharp sword, and their agonized cry for help was heard in the streets and in the fields. Here, for example, is a farmer returning from market in Ballymena. His mind is wholly intent upon the day's bargain. He pauses, takes out some money, and begins to count it. Suddenly an awful Presence envelopes him. In a moment his only thought is that he is a sinner standing on the brink of hell. His silver is scattered, and he falls upon the dust of the highway, crying out for mercy.'

Among the Children

"One day the schoolmaster at Coleraine observed a boy so troubled that he was quite unfit for lessons. He kindly sent him home in the company of an older boy who had already found peace. As the two lads went on their way they saw an empty house, and went into it for prayer. While they knelt the painful burden lifted from the boy's heart. He sprang to his feet in a transport of joy. Returning to the school, he ran up to the master and, with beaming face, cried out, 'Oh, I am so happy! I have the Lord Jesus in my heart.' The effect of these artless words was very great. Boy after boy rose and silently slipped from the room. In a little while the master followed and discovered his boys ranged alongside the wall of the playground, everyone apart and on his knees! Very soon their silent prayer became a bitter cry. It was heard by those within and pierced their hearts. They cast themselves upon their knees, and their cry for mercy was heard in the girls' schoolroom above. In a few moments the whole school was upon its knees, and its wail of distress was heard in the street without. Neighbors and passers-by came flocking in, and all, as they crossed the threshold, came under the same convicting power. Every room was filled with men, women, and children seeking God. The ministers of the town and men of prayer were sent for, and the whole day was spent in directing these mourners to the Lord Jesus. That

school proved to be for many the house of God and the very gate of heaven."

Spread Into Scotland

This revival spread to Scotland. Just as the Lord used an ignoble and feeble instrument—the jawbone of an ass-in the mighty hand of Samson to overthrow the host of the Philistines. so in this '59 revival in Scotland a very feeble instrument in the mighty hands of God brought great consternation to the ranks of the enemy of souls. James Turner, a Peterhead cooper, was an instrument that God used. "He was devoid of learning, and had no gift of utterance, and when his great task commenced he was a dying consumptive whose days were nigh numbered. He was little in stature, his voice was feeble, his eye deformed by a squint. But this frail, broken, disfigured vessel was filled with a passionate love to Jesus Christ, an intense hungering compassion for souls, and an invincible faith in God. He could pray! Therefore God was able to lift him up, out of weakness made him strong, and in two crowded years of glorious life, He used the dying consumptive to win for Him eight thousand souls!"

A Night of Reaping

"From village to village he went, and everywhere along the seacoast his course was marked by a trail of the divine fire. As he went on, the blessing increased. His coming was awaited with intense eagerness, and then, as happens when revival reaches its flood tide, a wave of great joy passed over the people. They thronged around him and marched in a body from town to town, singing as only those can sing who have drunk 'the royal wine of heaven,' the joy unspeakable and full of glory. In this way he at last reached Banff, and the night of March 10 is one much to be remembered by the church there. It was found impossible to dismiss the people, and through the whole night a great reaping went on. Many of the most notorious sinners in the town were saved, and many who first saw the Lord that night went forth to declare His glory in all parts of the earth."

A Call to Prayer

The book terminates with an appeal for fervent prayer for another outpouring of God's Spirit. A definite systematic "circle of continual intercession," is suggested where believers pray definitely for revival in fifteen minute "watches" throughout the day and night. A preacher once said to the writer, "There is no such thing as unanswered importunate prayer."

Remarkable Movings of God's Spirit In and Around Cawnpore, India


You will rejoice with us in the continued blessing of the Lord here in Cawnpore. We have just had a week of real glory, and the fire is spreading. Two weeks ago the Indian Christians of Lucknow sent a message over, asking that some of the Cawnpore folks come and tell them about what God was doing in this city, and two of our young men went, one just a school lad but mightily filled with the Spirit. They held three services, and at the night service spoke to over seven hundred Indian Christians, three Churches uniting to give them a good attendance. Hearts were deeply stirred, and we are praying

much for Lucknow. This week we have had a case of one actually raised from the dead in answer to the prayer of faith. Dr. Daniels, a very fine Indian Christian, was in his office Tuesday morning when sud-denly a large electric fan broke loose and fell from the high ceiling, striking Mr. Daniels on the head. He was carried to the hospital where he lay unconscious from nine in the morning until after seven at night. and at that time the doctors pronounced him dead. At seven the Chota Jhund, or

Little Flock, as they love to call themselves, gathered together for prayer and laid hold of God for Mr. Daniels, and suddenly God spoke to him and sent him back! He arose, and went home, and last night in our service he was present, with a testimony none of us will ever forget, giving back to God in fullest consecration the new life given him. Oh, hallelujah, we worship One Jesus, the same, yesterday, today, and forever! Would that all the world knew Him.

I wrote you of the young Moulvi who recently brought in two Moslems from his village for baptism in Bettiah. These three baptisms have stirred a great deal of hatred and enmity in the hearts of the Mohammedans of that village, and this week

Moulvi Hafiz came to spend two days with us in Cawnpore to talk over a new problem with me. According to the Mohammedan religion and the Mohammedan law, the conversion of either husband or wife to another religion automatically divorces any Mohammedan couple, and the moment Hafiz went into the waters of Baptism at the Mission House, he was divorced from his young wife, and he knew it. But she had expressed herself as wishing to come out to be a Christian with him, and we have been holding on in prayer, hoping to be able some day to reunite them in Christian bonds, at a Christian marriage. But now, with the coming out of these last two Moslems, the father of this girl has written Hafiz that the girl is to be married to another Mo-

hammedan man this month, on the 27th; that they are keeping the little son, and are also going to take all of the property belonging to Hafiz, to pay the girl two thousand rupees as a divorce gift. We went to a Christian lawyer here in Cawnpore and talked the problem over with him, and he said if the girl wished to come and join the young man who is the father of her child and has been her husband for years, we have every chance of winning her and saving the property by putting the matter in the courts. After we had talked it over there, Moulvi Hafiz and I came here to pray about it before taking any definite steps, and sitting here in the office that young convert from Mohammedanism gave one of the sweetest testimonies I have ever heard of the power of the gospel. He said, "Miss Sahib, I cannot understand the spirit that is within me. In the old days if anyone tried to take but a stick that belonged to me, I was ready to fight for my own, but now I find no fight within me. If the Lord Jesus wishes to separate me from everyone I ever loved, if He wishes to strip me of everything I have ever owned, I have set my face to go through in His way. If I go into the courts to fight my people, how then shall I be able to tell them of the love of Jesus? If my Lord wishes, He can give me back my wife, even on her wedding dayif not—! I cannot fight, let it all go." And then and there we committed it all to the Lord, and he went away with a smile on his face and a song

in his heart. Oh, Hallelujah indeed to the One, Chiefest among ten thousand, who can thus change the hearts of men.—M. Marguerite Flint.

We feel that here we are on the eve of an outpouring. The air seems to be filled with expectancy that at any time it might take place. So many times the Lord has taken charge of the meetings in a different way to what we had planned. One day

we sang the opening hymn "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" which was followed with a real season of praise and worship to our Lord Jesus, King of kings and Lord of lords. Another time, during testimony meeting the Lord commenced to have His way in two lives so that the remainder of the service was given to prayer, some coming very near the Baptism. Again yesterday, one after another praised God for something definite that God had done for them recently which ended with a season of prayer and praise. On and on I could write how God is dealing with souls here, proving to us that He is about to do something real for us if we continue to pray on, trust and praise on. When, praying for Mossi land, please pray

that the Lord will teach these people how to yield to His Holy Spirit.

We are praising God for a real touch of healing He has given one of our Christian women. While in the field working, she had a severe hemorrhage and lost an enormous amount of blood as the result of strenuous coughing. In some way she managed to walk home over three miles but before deliverance came she had five more hemorrhages, although not quite as serious as the first one. Now she is slowly regaining her strength. Everyone knows that it is only God that helped her, and the Christians are full of praise over this heaiing. Her faith in God was so sweet and simple, and one time right after coughing so hard. she said that she knew of a truth that God's power was greater than that of the medicine men whom she had served years ago, and that she was willing to trust her God no matter what would happen. It was so encouraging to us to see her faith in a time of severe testing. She has been saved from heathendom about four years only.

Recently we have been buying leather, cutting and making new books, etc. It is some job and takes up so much time, yet it is one of the "necessary things." It pleases us to see how pleased the natives are with their new possession, and how eagerly they are plunging in to read all of its contents.

Chinese Christians Witness for Christ

Brother and Sister Andrews write: "The Lord has been laying on my heart the need of using the young Christians to witness for Him. They are saved, and saved to serve Him. The condition of their salvation is, faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; but the result of that salvation should be to show forth His praise and do all in their power to win others to their Saviour. During the yearly market at Likiang I called on a number to give some extemporary talks, and to testify for the Lord. I was surprised to see the good effects on the congregation, and resolved to continue it each week. Many beautiful thoughts were expressed, and some very original ones, while others were full of zeal for the kingdom. The most original in thought is a Mr. Lang, who used to beat out lead and make false silver used in worship of the idol. Perhaps it would be well to give you some of his illustrations. It will surely give you an idea of what they were, and what they are by the grace of God. He says:-

"We people of the world are like a crooked and bent post, useless, and before we can be of any use we must be made straight and upright. Now look at the carpenter. He takes a rough, crooked post and the first thing he does is to give it a "Hsin-meh" (Heart line). Then he measures from this line outwards all he requires, and chops away all the rest until the post is straight. It is so with us. We must have a heart line, and by this line we must be made straight. Now this is what the gospel of Jesus does for us. It makes us upright and straight."

Sometimes his illustrations are seemingly funny. There certainly is no belief in Mr. Lang that there is a divine spark in man, and that man is a God in the making, but rather on the other hand, man without Christ is a snake and cannot help but go crooked. To quote again:

"Why is it that a snake cannot go in a straight path? It is because it has thorns in its stomach, and each time it moves the thorns prick his sides, and to escape one thorn he falls victim to another, hence his zigzag path. Now are we not the same? Sin is a thorn in us and it pricks us as we go. We may go this way and that way, do this and that to escape it, yet for all that it still pricks us. We must have the SIN-THORN taken out of our hearts before we will be able to go in straight paths."

On the whole they did well and gave splendid reasons for the hope that is in them. They showed great possibilities within their reach as future workers.

A Cry from Cuba

Can Backsliders Come Back to God?

J. J. Schaumburg

If backsliders could not come back, God would not invite them to return, nor promise to "heal" their backslidings.

But some one refers to Heb. 6:4-6: "For it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost, and have tasted of the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come, if they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance."

It is easy to see that this rises far above the ordinary Christian experience, and includes this: "Tasted of the . . powers of the world to come.' Such experiences were many in Paul's day, judging from a careful reading of the New Testament. They are very rare today. He or she who would repudiate such a wonderful experience as that would forfeit salvation. This would be far more than a case of backsliding, it would be apostasy. A backslider returns to his sins truly, but an apostate not only returns to his sins, he denies and repudiates the Christian system, and the entire Christian experience, that is, as it is often spoken, he denies the faith. These "powers" were powers to work miracles. Not many today have such an experience from which to fall.

But others use Heb. 10:26: "For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins . . . who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing."

But Paul doesn't say, "there remaineth no more repentance." He says, "there remaineth no more SAC-RIFICE for sins." Christ is the only true sacrifice; and when He is repudiated and "trodden under foot," no other sacrifice can avail or save. He who rejects Christ can and will be forgiven, IF he repents. So these scriptures do not teach that backsliders cannot be forgiven or return to God.

John the Baptist was a pioneer. He feared not to face the ostracism of the social elite, the animosity of the intriguers, or the malice of the hypocrites. This is the spirit the Lord is looking for in our young people today. They may not have to reclaim deserts, clear forests, or discover new worlds; but they are faced with far greater tasks in the spiritual realm.

Zacchæus was a little man, but his handicap proved only a spur to him. "The very obstacles that discourage weak men arouse in others the conquering spirit." Let your own weakness and insufficiency cause you to climb the sycomore tree of vision, that you may see Jesus, receive Him into your heart and home, and be saved by Him for time and eternity.

The rich young ruler was earnest and lovable, truly sincere in desiring the way of life; but he failed to get that salvation because he did not pay the price Jesus demanded—a full surrender of self.

What was the secret of the Macedonian Christians' great liberality? They gave up to their power, yea, beyond it; they besought Paul with much intreaty to accept their generous gifts for the poor at Jerusalem. The secret of it all was that they first gave their own selves to the Lord.

The Bible is the most *hated* book in the world, because it does not flatter man, but shows him his own condition as in a mirror—a lost sinner needing a Divine Saviour.

The prodigal son in the far country was *lost*: and his other sufferings—poverty, hunger, rags—were merely the accompaniment of that condition of separation from his father. "I will arise and *go to my father*" gives the only secret of lost man's salvation: a return to his God.

Though the prodigal arose and returned, he did not go all the way. His father was watching for him and ran to meet him. Thus God in his infinite love and compassion meets every sinner who starts on his return journey, and assists his faith by the enablings of His Spirit. "Draw nigh unto God, and He will draw nigh to you."

No one is too rich and no one too poor to be saved. Neither the wisdom of the learned nor the ignorance of the illiterate qualifies them to enter Mercy's door. "The Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." Your very need and helplessness is your qualification.

"To whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little." If you find your love to Jesus waning, go back to Calvary and see what He bore for you; then think of all your past sins, of how much He has forgiven you—and your love and gratitude will spring up afresh

"I Wanted a Pentecost"

Man-made union and the unity of the Spirit are two distinctly different things.

In Great Britain there has recently been brought about the union of the Wesleyan Methodists, the Primitive Methodists, and the United Methodists, who now form one great Methodist church. This union is hailed by the press as a great triumph of unity.

The "Primitives" were those who long stood for old time salvation and the things of early Methodism, but there has doubtless been a letting-down and a letting-out or they would not have consented to this union with the other branches of the Methodist church, which have long since been contaminated with the loathsome leaven of Sadduceeism to which they give the high-sounding title, Modernism.

One of Great Britain's leading journalists, James Douglas, who thinks for himself, gives us his reaction to this union:

"I watched the Methodist hierarchy and the Methodist lawyers as they ratified the Deed of Union in the Albert Hall. The machinery was well oiled, but machinery is not going to save the world.

"Where was the old Methodist flame? Where was the old Methodist fire? I wanted a Pentecost, but I got our old friend, Mr. Legality

our old friend, Mr. Legality.

"I longed to hear the Methodist singing the old splendid Methodist hymns, but they were frozen out by the ice of formality and respectability and convention.

"If John Wesley had been there he would have breathed life into that valley of Dry Bones. The world is going to hell, and bureaucratic organization will not save it. A union of dead churches is no substitute for a living Church. The Methodist Church is a dead Church which needs a baptism of fire."

A "Pentecostal" Methodist

Dr. W. C. Hoover of Chile, South America, into whose Methodist church at Valparaiso there came an old-time Pentecostal revival, said at one time to the editor of the Evangel: "At the beginning, when the Spirit of God was first outpoured in our church, I was reading John Wesley's journal. I was struck with the fact that we were seeing in our day the same extraordinary phenomena that characterized the early days of Methodism. So I sent an article to our Chile Methodist paper telling, from the pen of John Wesley, of supernatural phenomena that he saw so frequently in his day. But the Methodist paper refused to print these extracts from the writings of the founder of Methodism."

Dr. Hoover eventually separated from the Methodist church of Chile. Believing, however, that he was still in harmony with the principles of early Methodism he considered himself and those that were with him still old time Methodists. When they organized they called their church the "Pentecostal Methodist church."

We published in the Evangel of July 16 an article on the Pentecostal work in Chile. This was reprinted from World Dominion. There was one part which the editor of World Dominion did not publish which Dr. Hoover has supplied to us. It tells why the Pentecostal church of Chile has kept separate from the other churches. Here it is:

"At another point the experience of this church deflates the prevalent theory touching successful evangelism, namely, that of union or co-operation of denominations.

"By reason of its origin, it was the especial object of antagonism and enmity of one denomination; and by reason of its fervor and intensity (extravagance and fanaticism?) it was shunned by the others; so that, perforce, as well as by choice, it was completely isolated from all contact and association with all other religious bodies. But it grew as none others, and more than all combined; for, after the organization of this church, the others entered into agreements of cooperation in various branches of work.

"Its conviction is that its strength is best conserved, utilized, and increased by utter separation and isolation; thus being able to give its whole attention to the great work of salvation without the waste of time and energy necessarily incident in efforts to harmonize conflicting ideas in committees and conferences about evangelizing. The case is open to all for study."

The Ass and the Lamb

God has in times past spoken by dreams and has promised in the last days, in the days of the outpouring of His Spirit, to give supernatural visions and dreams. Joel 2:28. Sometimes it is His way of opening our ears to the truth. In Job 33:14 we read, "For God speaketh once, yea twice, yet man perceiveth it not. In a dream, in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falleth upon men, in slumberings upon the bed; then he openeth the ears of men." The Lord opened my ears to the truth of Exodus 13:13 in a very real way by means of a dream. Having been blessed myself by the simple truth, I am passing it on thinking that possibly some others may be helped by the same.

In my dream I saw a Jewish farmer with the firstling of an ass. The law declared, "Every firstling of an ass thou shalt redeem with a lamb; and if thou wilt not redeem it, then thou shalt break his neck." It seemed as though the little ass had gotten to understand by some means or other that, being the firstborn, its neck was to be broken, and that it had to be brought before the priest, who was to judge in the matter. The little ass did not appear to understand about the need of a substitute being provided, but it was quite concerned about its future.

We read in Scripture that Balaam's ass spoke to him when that prohet was on the way to Balak, and so in my dream I heard this little ass speak. It said to its mother, "I want you to weave a nice silk ribbon chain to go round my neck, to cover the place where it is likely to be broken." The mother said, "All right, but what color do you want the ribbon to be?" The ass said, "Why, of course, it will have to be red, the same color as the blood of the beasts the priests are continually shedding in the sacrifices." "But why all this?" asked the ass's mother. "Well," replied the little ass, "it will look pretty, and besides being of the same color as the blood and being outside my neck, it will act as a substitute and I will not have to have my neck broken."

Alas, how many today have just an outward form and show of godliness. They may even sing about the power of the Blood, but to them it is all outward. They have no experimental knowledge of its inward cleansing and its mighty power. They are no wiser than the little ass of my dream.

And then in my dream I saw the little ass looking at himself. His coat certainly looked very rough and needed attention, and once more it went to its mother to be fixed up. So the mother began smoothing down its rough coat. Then the little ass looked at its feet. They were muddy. He went down to the creek and stood there till all the mud was washed off. He then walked over to the straw stack in the farmyard and stamped its feet in the straw till the little hoofs were polished. By this time he was feeling quite proud of his appearance, and so he thought he would go and show himself to the farmer.

The farmer inspected the little ass and smiled inwardly. Then the ass asked, "How do I look?" The farmer replied, "Somewhat homely, and your ears are rather long!" And so the little ass asked the farmer to curl up its ears and to fasten them with ribbon. "What color?" asked the farmer. "Why red, of course, to match my neckband," said the ass. This was done and then the little ass said, "Now, how do I look?" "A donkey of a donkey!" replied the farmer. The man meant it in sarcasm, but the donkey thought he meant he was the finest looking of all donkeys.

"But why all these preparations?" asked the farmer. "Well," replied the little ass, "I understand that being the firstling of an ass the law says that my neck will have to be broken, but I am hoping that when I come to the priest he will be so impressed with my appearance and beauty that he will not have the heart to break my neck, and that is the only way I can see out of my trouble." But the farmer said to himself, "The priest dare not break the law of God."

How many people today are like that little ass. They are trying to fix themselves up. They are totally ignorant of God's righteous requirement—redemption by the blood of a lamb. Salvation comes not through fixing ourselves up, not through works of righteousness which we may do. There is one way of redemption only and that is redemption through the spotless Lamb of God that He Himself has provided.

In my dream I saw the farmer setting off one day to the priest leading with one hand the little ass and with the other a lamb. The little ass was very proud of himself and felt sure he would make a good impression on the priest. And in my dream I could see him with head erect, looking with disdain upon the poor little lamb walking quietly beside the farmer—the lamb that did not have all the outward embellishments that he had.

The priest saw the three coming in the distance and said, "Here comes a farmer with a lamb to redeem his firstling." Then the three stood before the priest. He took not the slightest notice of the little ass but was soon very busy examining the lamb. The ass was very annoyed that no attention was being paid to him and stamped his little foot to draw attention to himself—but to no purpose, the priest went on examining the lamb, feeling its legs to see if any bones had been broken, looking to see if it contained any scab, and if its eyes were perfect. At last he turned to the farmer and said, "The lamb is without blemish, and I accept it." Then the lamb was slain and thus the firstling was redeemed.

The little ass threw a look of gratitude at the slain substitute. Together with the farmer it started for home. When they reached a certain sandy patch, the little ass said, "Will you let me have a little more rope?" The farmer granted the petition and the little ass began to roll as only a donkey can roll. All his anxiety was past. He was free. He soon broke off the useless neck band from his head and got free from those useless decorations on his ears. He rubbed the sleekness off his coat and just became as natural as could be. No fears now of the neck being broken. The law of God had been vindicated. The redemption price had been paid, and now it glad-ly yielded itself to the master who had provided the lamb as a substitute. It yielded glad willing service to him who had provided this means of free-

We read in Job, that man is "born like a wild ass's colt." Job 11:12. We were born under the curse. There is only one hope for us. That hope is redemption through the blood of a spotless lamb. In due time God sent One of whom John said, "Behold the Lamb of God which taketh away the sins of the world." He was a lamb without spot and perfect and God Himself declared, "This is my Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." At Calvary He was offered up as a Lamb without spot and He purchased redemption for us. Believe the glad tidings of the gospel. A Lamb has been slain and there is perfect freedom for thee. The whole of the New Testament is an announcement of this glorious glad message. Believe the message and yield yourself spirit, soul, and body to Him who has provided such a redemption, for whatever service He may will, for the Lord hath need of thee.

A City Without God

"The Society of the Godless, which has the official backing of the Soviet authorities, is reported to have planned to build in Russia, in the vicinity of Nischni-Novgorod, an entirely new city, to accommodate about 30,000 laborers, in which there is to be no trace of religious life," says The Alliance Weekly. "They will begin by eliminating the home and erecting forty immense communal houses. The Posener Zeitungsdienst describes these as being equipped with clubrooms, lecture halls, motion pictures, gymnasiums, libraries, and dining rooms. On each floor there is to be an information bureau to answer questions about the non-religious life. Two periodicals, The Godless and The Godless at the Work Bench, are to be distributed freely. In the meeting rooms a member of the Society of the Godless is to be in attendance at all times for antireligious consolidation. Anti-religious lectures and classes are to be presented every fifth day, thereby banishing the Christian Sabbath."

Fear and the Superman

"Today much of the world is frozen stiff by fear," says *The Christian Victory Magazine*. "Like a paralyzed rabbit before the onflying hawk, the world is smitten; and it cries pitifully for a deliverer. But it does *not* cry, in repentance, for the Deliverer it crucified. How dreadful will be that fear when the very "powers of heaven shall be shaken"? When the actual time for the revealing of the Antichrist arrives, the world will be so dis-

traught with troubles (and the condition will be much worse than it is now) that it will welcome the superman with outstretched arms. Antichrist will not cause and produce the Great Tribulation; but the sinful and upset condition of the world will produce the Antichrist."

Mexico's Controversy with the Pope

Some time ago the Pope's representative in Mexico was expelled by the government, following a papal letter of protest against the action of the Mexican government in curtailing the influence and activities of the Roman church. The following is the religious situation in Mexico: În 1926 the president of Mexico was given power to curtail the activity of the Roman church, by recognizing marriage as a civil contract and by forbidding religious instruction in the schools. Various religious orders were prohibited and ministers were ordered not to criticize laws or associate for political purposes. All church buildings were taken in charge under the government supervision. Recently several states passed laws limiting the number of priests according to the population, one state allowing one priest for every 100,000 persons. The president considered the Pope's letter as defiant and has threatened to convert all churches into schools and shops.

Spain's Invitation to the Jews

In 1492 all Jews were commanded to leave Spain, save those who should embrace the Roman Catholic faith. A number outwardly professed Christianity, but the majority, numbering about 300,000 left the country. A short time ago the Spanish foreign minister invited all Jews of Spanish ancestry to return, promising to do all in his power to facilitate their naturalization. It seems that the new Spanish republic desires to make amends for the treatment of the Jews under the Catholic monarchy.

But the indomitable faith of her little mother would not waver-she brought her from the sanitarium in an ambulance to be prayed for. So weak that morning she had been unable to stand for an X-ray, soon after prayer had been offered, she stood and walked back and forth in front of the church, and sang and shouted the praises of Jesus. The next day her temperature was normal, she has been at home ever since and in three weeks has gained nine pounds, eats and sleeps well, has been X-rayed by the doctors and they say she needs no more 'pneumo-thorax' treatments, and find her condition marvelously improved."

PENTECOSTAL WORK IN THE KENTUCKY MOUNTAINS

Pastor O. E. Nash, Norwood, O., Overseer of Kentucky Mountain work, writes: "We are praising God for the 23 workers now in active service in this pioneer field. Besides the original station at Pence, we have our own missionary cabin at Simpson, Breathitt County, with a comfortable church building right next door. We have a nice new cabin at Wilhurst and another, almost completed, at Bloody Creek. Outside of these four permanent stations where we have our own buildings, the missionaries are living in such homes as can be procured from the mountain folk. Distribution of clothing or other donations sent by freight to Wilhurst, Ky., Breathitt County, in care of Miss Bertha Bennett, are distributed to the other stations in this region. This makes it cheaper than parcel post. The people will be without warm bedding and comfortable clothing except as God provides for them. In answer to prayer a truck has been donated for the distribution of all articles do-

"At Simpson the workers have opened a Bible school, beginning with 8 students; but this number has been increased to a fine group. So many Christians have 2 or more Bibles; could they not sacrifice one of them to this cause? In Magoffin County, where Sister Bird has been working for 2 years, there are 3 stations and 5 workers. They had a remarkable revival this summer. Many were saved, and the whole country round about was stirred. These stations are Tip Top, Carver, and Sycamore. In Laurel County there are 4 workers, 2 caring for East Bernstadt and Viva, and 2 for Atlanta and Green Mountain. A wonderful revival is now going on at East Bernstadt: over 20 have been saved. In all these stations souls are being saved, communities transformed, and hearts made to rejoice in the wonderful salvation of our Lord. We wish to thank all for their prayers and co-operation by which through God these results have been made possible."

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
