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(6)HE NEW YEAR is here, a time when many will look to the Lord for some verse or promise for the year before us. How would it be if each were to pledge before God that he would, in future, adopt as his motto "Lord help me to do all I can to encourage others in the ways of righteousness?" Criticism is usually destructive, encouragement is constructive.

When Abraham Lincoln was nineteen years old he hoped to better his poverty by ferrying across the Ohio River. His first passenger came, from whom he expected to receive a quarter. What was his surprise and encouragement when instead he was given a dollar! Can you imagine what this meant to a youth in poverty who was trying to earn an honest living? One wonders how much the encouragement of that hour may have meant to the future of this man who later became such a benefactor to mankind.

One of our faithful missionaries writes, "Write something on encouragement. Of late I have been thinking so much about giving out encouragement, for such helps so much. In Isaiah $41: 6,7$ we learn, 'They helped every one his neighbor; and every one said to his brother, Be of good courage. So the carpenter encouraged the goldsmith, and he that smootheth with the hammer him that smote the anvil, saying, It is ready for the sodering.' To help is not hard. It is not difficult to say to a weary fellow worker, 'Be of good courage'; but how much such words of cheer mean in these days of testing and trial. Just a letter from one in the homeland, just to be told someone is praying for us, means so much. One
cannot do another's work, and one may not understand just why another does his work in the way he does. One may be the carpenter, the other the goldsmith, but working in harmony will bring the needed results. We are all

workers together with God and helpers together in prayer. If one can do nothing more than to stand and hold up the hands of others as Aaron and Hur did those of Moses, it means so much." We all know there are times when one must stand alone and encourage oneself in the Lord. Such was the lot of David when he returned to Ziklag and found it burned, the women and children, flocks and herds, all driven away, while his own men took up stones ready to stone him. What heroism and faith the trial brought out in David, who "encouraged himself in the Lord his God." It is no easy test when one faces awful odds alone, yet facing such has made many the illustrious persons they have become. But even these would likely have failed had they been driven repeatedly and continually to stand the shocks alone. One may meet one shock or crisis alone like a hero, but continued discouragement would beat down the fortitude of any, for after all we are all but human and humanity is frail and has its limits of endurance.

Moses faced discouragements as great and many as any man, and one might expect that he would become unsympathetic and hardened. But meeting tests in the spirit of our Lord does not harden; it tenders. The tender heart of Moses was fertile soil on which the Lord could write His tender regard for others as He said, "But charge Joshua, and encourage him, and strengthen him." The nobleness of ripened experience is its ability to encourage rather than to discourage and criticize.

# Ghy Gaddest Thou $\mathcal{F}$ bout? 

A Message for the New Year

Jer. 2:36, "Why gaddest thou about so much to change thy way?"
1 Cor. $15: 58$, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord."
"Why gaddest thou about?" The word gaddest occurs but this once in God's Word, and yet the word is strikingly significant of the attitude of many today, even among believers.
It brings out the opposite thought of what we find in 1 Cor. 15:58, "Be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord."
One is stedfast, firm, strong, with a good moral and spiritual backbone. The other pictures a fickle, insipid, jellyfish kind of creature.
Let us look carefully into the contrast brought out in these two texts, and I am sure we shall find therein some useful and practical lessons for the New Year upon which we are entering.
The year 1934 is adjudged by many students of prophecy to be a year big with possibilitites and tremendous happenings. This conviction is not only felt by the Christian world, but astrologists, Spiritists, Theosophists, and even Mussolini shares in the belief that great and vital happenings may be expected during 1934.

In view of this general belief and conviction, what should be our attitude as to the future that lies before us? Surely it ought to be an attitude of deep solemnity and of careful walking before God and man.
The question of Jeremiah 2:36 ought to call a halt on all activities that are not centered in Christ. "Why gaddest thou about so much?"," says the prophet "to change thy way?"

1. Why gaddest thou about in fleshly activity when it is thy privilege to walk and work continually in the Spirit? Why be controlled by thine own or other people's notions, when thou canst by meditation and prayer get the very mind of God as to thine every move?
"The meek will He guide in judgment: the meek will He teach His way." Psalm 25:9.
It is mere waste of energy to gad about here, there, and yonder at the behests of thy fleshly mind. "Take time to be holy, speak oft with thy Lord." Listen to His Word to thy soul, "Be still and know that I am God." Jesus loved solitude. He
stole away from "the maddening crowd"; and even from the fellowship of His own chosen disciples in order to get and keep in touch with His Father. He never made a move only as His Father made known to Him His will. In fact Isaiah intimates $(50: 4)$ that in the early morning hours He received from the Father the program for each day's service. The text referred to reads: "The Lord God hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth my ear to hear as the learned."
2. Why gaddest thou from mission to mission and from assembly to assembly finding no rest for the soles of thy feet when God would have thee abide in the place of His own choosing where thou canst not only be fed thyself, but also stand in the gap on behalf of others, and thus help lift the church or assembly to a place of real victory and conquest?

Some are always aching for a new face and a new voice when what is needed is to push the battle in the place that God has ordained for them. There is nothing more discouraging and distressing to a true pastor than to see his flock running here and there to see a new face and hear a new voice instead of "staying by the stuff" until God comes forth in power. Let us stop our gadding here and there, and get down to real and systematic toil and labor.
3. Why gaddest thou about so much to "change thy way"? Why this fickleness?

There are some characters that we find it hard to analyze and fathom. They are always changing their ways, their notions, and their ideas. They cannot be depended on. If they make a promise, you are by no means sure they will perform it. They remind me of a few good souls whom we have met at different times. They have said to my wife and me, "We are going to have you for dinner some day." Days pass into weeks, and when we meet them again they are quite profuse in their desire to have us for dinner. Weeks pass into months, and they continue to express themselves most freely that they are going to have us for dinner sometime. But as months and in in some cases years go by without their bringing the matter to a head-well we finally give up the idea of ever sitting at their dining table.

Others have profusely promised to write us, and in some cases have said they would surely send us a little money once in a while. But years have rolled by and both letters and money have failed to put in an appearance. Such folks are given to change, and they evidently cannot help themselves.
"Why gaddest thou about so much to change thy way?" The latter part of this verse would indicate that Israel had changed its ways to going after Egypt and Assyria. Israel, like many of God's children today, had changed their allegiance from the true God to the false gods of Egypt and Assyria. (In this connection read carefully Isa. $30: 1-3$ and 2 Chron. $28: 16,20,21$.

Gadding about, and going hither and thither in search of some new thing usually ultimates in a change from absolute reliance on God to reliance on the arm of flesh. This of course results finally in spiritual suicide. May God deliver us from such an experience and calamity!

How refreshing now to turn to our second text. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord. In this Scripture we have three inspiring words-

1. Stedfast. Moffatt translates it, "Hold your ground." Literally the word means "to sit." This reminds us of Luke $24: 49$ where we read, "Tarry until ye be endued with power from on high," which literally reads, "Sit down, until ye be endued with power from on high." The word carries with it the thought of a settled and fixed determination to go through with God.
"Be ye stedfast." Psalm 78:8 speaks of "a generation that set not their heart aright, and whose spirit was not stedfast with God." There are many of that class among us today. Heb. 3:14 tells us that we are made "partakers of Christ if we hold the beginning of our confidence stedfast unto the end." And in 1 Peter 5:9 we are told to resist Satan "stedfast in the faith."

Surely in the perilous times we are facing in the new year we need to set our faces like a flint to go through with God.
2. Then we are exhorted to be unmoveable. We often sing with great gusto, "I shall not be moved." But are we really standing immoveable in God? It is a wonderful place to be. But are we there?

The Psalmist tells us $(125: 1)$, "They that trust in the Lord shall be as Mount Zion which cannot be removed, but abid-eth- for ever." If we would be immoveable our trust must be in God, and not in man. Let us not think we shall be able to stand in the shock of battle which may be ours before 1934 comes to a close, if we are not able to meet and conquer the foes we are now facing. It is
only by having on the whole armor that we can win the day against the tremendous forces that are coming up against us.

How often the words of Jeremiah 12:5 burn their way into my heart. "If thou hast run with the footmen, and they have wearied thee, then how canst thou contend with horses? and if in the land of peace, wherein thou trustedst, they wearied thee, then how wilt thou do in the swelling of Jordan?"
3. "Always abounding in the work of the Lord." Jesus said (Luke 19:13), "Occupy (or trade) till I come," and Paul said he was "in labors more abundant." 2 Cor. 11:23. "Always abounding." These words literally mean to super-abound both in quantity and quality, or superabundant in quantity and superior in quality. It is to go "over the top" in our zeal for God until we can say, as Jesus said, "The, zeal of thy house hath eaten me up."

It is not beyond the bound of possibility that some of us may have to face during 1934 something of what our Russian brethren have had to endure in that sin-cursed land. In view of these tremendous possibilities, I would that we might catch the spirit of Wesley when he wrote:

I want an ever strong desire,
I want a calmly fervent zeal
To save poor souls out of the fire,
To snatch them from the verge of hell, To turn them to a pardoning God,
And quench the brands in Jesus' blood.
Let me ask in closing, What class are we in today? Are we among those who are "gadding about," utter strangers to that "rest in service" that is the heritage of every true believer? Or are we among the stedfast, immoveable ones, who possessing both the lion and the lamb nature of Jesus, are invincible in God, and who "in labors more abundant" are going "over the top" in their zeal for God and souls?

May God help us to search our hearts and see where we really stand!

ing courage when, like David, he had to "encourage himself in the Lord his God" as "at my first answer no man stood with me, but all forsook me." Yet Paul could not well endure long seasons of lonesomeness and discouragement as his own record shows. We see him at Athens as he "reasoned in the synagogue every sabbath day, and persuaded the Greeks." He is holding on, but he needs a fresh touch of encouragement to fire his message with fresh boldness and enthusiasm. This came to him in the coming of Timothy and Silas from Macedonia, when the caution with which he
had been laboring gave way before the fire of fresh enthusiasm and "Paul was pressed in the spirit, and testified to the Jews that Jesus was Christ."

How many of God's faithful ones are faithfully declaring the Word, but need the extra push of fresh encouragement to fire them with fresh zeal needed to make their word a proper success.

At another time when Paul needed fresh courage in his labors Titus came to him bringing him good news from Corinth, and we hear Paul's appreciative words concerning the event, "Nevertheless God, that comforteth those that are cast down, comforted us by the coming of Titus; and not by his coming only, but by the consolation wherewith he was comforted in you." Then later we see him on his way to Rome, having already suffered two years of imprisonment at Caesarea, met by the brethren at Appii forum and The Three Taverns. There is no record that these brethren even spoke to him, although most likely they did, but the record does say that when "Paul saw, he thanked God, and took courage." Just the thoughtful coming out of the brethren to meet the weary prisoner, without necessity of speaking a word, gave him fresh heart.

What little things often encourage. A cup of cold water may revive not only famishing lips, but a famishing heart. A kindly word, a smile, a kindly deed, a letter written in which is expressed encouragement and hope may lift a burden greater than a mountain. It was only a smile from one of the faithful fathers of our fellowship given to the writer in his earlier ministry at a time when a smile was greatly appreciated that meant worlds to him. That smile has never been forgotten. How little we realize how our contacts with people are impressing them for good or for


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ill. This came to the writer so forcefully recently when he visited for a few days of meetings a section of the country where he had had very little ministry for a number of years. Young people, now the strength of the work, reminded him that he had baptized them years before when they were yet little else than children. They had grown out of his memory, but their remembrance of him remained, and years ago he had made an everlasting impression on their lives, hopes for good. But whatever it was, it is still there and will remain.

Everywhere there are discouraged hearts which might be infinitely blessed by just a word, or a kindly look. Can we not put away all harsh and unkind criticism and encourage one another? It is said that Thomas Edison was regarded as a rather stupid boy until finally being told by a teacher at school that he was too stupid to learn, the little fellow with broken heart reported the matter to his mother, who immediately responded by saying indeed it was not so, her Thomas was a bright son who could learn as well as any. This encouragement from mother put new life into him and from that moment he was a changed boy.

The writer remembers that as a boy it seemed impossible for him to understand grammar until one day, the whole class being unable to define a certain word, he ventured, upon being asked by the teacher, that he believed the word to be some kind of an adverb, to which the kind teached answered that it seemed to her like "some kind of an adverb" too. From the encouragement received fresh interest came to him and with it an entirely new insight into the subject. What a power was the encouragement! We may be but a little flower along the highway of life, but if we carry fragrance and bloom to brighten some weary traveler we have not grown there in vain.

We have an adversary without, and sometimes a carnal self within, to suggest that we pass remarks of criticism, envy, or doubt. He is a great man who has sufficient nobleness to put down such elements of smallness. It may seem a little thing to radiate cheer, courage, and faith, to say when others are crying "giants" "we be well able to go up and possess the land," but it expresses the difference between defeat and success. Exalting Him who is our Saviour and Lord may we make plentiful use of His words, "Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid."

## A New Year's Greeting

It is a pleasant thing to receive from our friends their best wishes for a happy New Year, but how much more delightful is it to receive such a greeting from our loving Father in heaven. In Psalm 128:2 we have this word from Him, "Happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee!" I wonder if it was not this beautiful promise which so tremendously gripped that godly Shunammite woman who lived in Elisha's day. For when the grim angel of death stalking through the land struck down her only son, she declared, "It shall be well!" When the prophet inquired of her, "Is it well with thy child?" she declared, "It is well." Her child was in the hands of Him who had declared, "It shall be well," and she believed that her faithful God would remember His Word on which He had caused her to hope, and would give her back her boy again. She took the prophet to the room where the dead child lay, and her faith was rewarded by his being raised to life. I don't think we should attach much blame to that good mother if she were guiilty of shouting a good deal in meeting that night. And the God who wrought that miracle says to you and me at the beginning of this new year: "Happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee!"

## Walking in God's Ways

Let us look at the conditions attached to this promise, "Blessed is every one that feareth the Lord; that walketh in His ways." Psalm 128:1. Scofield states that the Old Testament expression "the fear of the Lord," means reverential trust. When we fully trust the Lord we will walk in the way that He has prescribed. Our prayer will constantly be, "Order my steps in Thy Word." Psalm 119:133. As I look up into the heavens at night and see all the stars and note that each one moves in its ordained orbit, I find a prayer in my heart, "Dear Lord, keep me moving always in the orbit of Thy perfect will." He has declared, "The steps of a good man are ordered of the Lord." And, thank God, there is a highway where the Good Shepherd leads the redeemed, of which it is written. "The wayfaring men, though fools (and that describes most of us perfectly) shall not err therein." As the child of God traverses that narrow path which leads to life he has the promise of detailed guidance-He will keep the feet of His saints. 1 Sam. 2:9.

## The Book of Ditections

It is the Word of God that indicates the road which He would have us tread. David tells us how he kept out of wrong ways, "By the word of Thy lips have I kept me from the paths of the destroyer." The Word of God is the declaration of the will of God. And if this year 1934 is to be a happy one in which it will be well with us, we must give diligent heed to what God says in His Word. Early each morning get alone with God and with His Book. Don't fail to give Him the first hour. He will not fail to speak to you out of His Word, and cause you to know the way in which you should walk. You say, "I cannot take the time." You cannot afford not to take the time. Wesley rose at four each morning and gave his first hours to God. A world-wide revival was the result.

## Why Men Fail

I believe that ninety-nine per cent of failures in the Christian life can be traced to a neglect of a setting apart of the early hour for prayer and "eating" the Word of God. God desires to meet with you and to speak to you through His precious Word. His plaint against Israel was: "Oh that my people had hearkened unto me, and Israel had walked in my ways! I should soon have subdued their enemies. $\qquad$ He should have fed them also with the finest of the wheat: and with honey out of the rock should I have satisfied thee." See Psalm $81: 10-$ 16. You may be a nobody, like the writer of these lines, and so could never get acquainted with any of the great of earth; but, God be praised, you can have a daily audience with the Maker and Upholder of the universe. O what condescension, that He should delight to have fellowship with such worms of the dust as we are! And what a privilege is ours to be able to meet with Him in blessed communion!

## Yielding Wholly to Him

In order for us to maintain this reverential trust in the Lord and this holy walking, there must be the complete yielding of our lives to Him. Frances Ridley Havergal revealed the secret of her victorious life when she said, "It was in December, 1873, that I first saw clearly the blessedness of true consecration. I saw it as a flash of electric light; and what you see you can never unsee. There must be full surrender before
there can be full blessedness. God admits you by one into the other." In her last hours this gifted hymn writer said, "God's will is delicious; He makes no mistakes-I have peace, but it is Himself I am longing for. Ever since I trusted Jesus altogether I have been so happy. I cannot tell how lovely, how precious He is to me. God's promises are so true. Not a fear!"

## Exceeding Joy Ahead

There will be testings in the year 1934, for it is written, "Many are the afflictions of the righteous." We can, however, be happy also in the assurance that "the Lord delivereth out of them all." After the chastening He bestows on those He loves, there will be an abundant crop of the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who are exercised thereby. Said Peter, "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you . . . but rejoice, inasmuch as you are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy." If He lets you move into the valley of the shadow, do not forget that He personally accompanies every pilgrim, and remember that at the end of the road there is eternal gladness and exceeding joy.

## Happiness in God

God has the blue prints and has planned the best for you. For some, the past few years have been years of stripping of their possessions, and there may be more stripping in the coming year. But a man's life does not consist in what he possesses. T. P. O'Conner said to Andrew Carnegie, "I envy you your wealth." The multi-millionaire replied, "I am not to be envied. How can my wealth help me? I would give you all my wealth if you could give me your youth and health." Contrast this with the statement of the godly Payson, "God is able to make us happy without anything else. Some imagine that if a dear friend were to die, or such and such a blessing were to be removed, they would be miserable; whereas God can make them a thousand times happier without these. To mention my own case, God has been depriving me of one blessing after another; but, as every one was removed, He has come in and filled up its place; and now, when I am a cripple and not able to move, I am happier than I ever was in my life before or ever expected to be."

I have a prayer on my heart as I enter the New Year, "Lord, let me know Thee better." When we really know the Lord, we can never doubt Him. The greatest and the best that can come to us is to hear Him say, "I am thy shield and thy exceeding great reward." Just Himself!

I am sure the mansions, the crowns, the harps, the golden streets, the trees and all the other things are going to be very lovely, but I somehow think that when we get to yonder city we shall not want to take our eyes off the Lamb.

And this wonderful Saviour is ours now, if we have received the great salvation that He offers, and we can say with one of old, "I am my Beloved's, and He is mine." He is our joy, and the Source of every true pleasure. Continually rejoice in Him in the days that are coming, and then of a truth this shall be a year when "happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee!"

## Swastika Doctrines

Brother G. Kinderman writes to us from Danzig concerning the religious body known as "German Christians," who are endeavoring to control all evangelical bodies in Germany today. He gives a quotation from Dr. Wieneke of Berlin, who is a leader in this new movement: "Many are expecting the government to work out a new creed. The government would not think of it, but rather demands that man should begin to comprehend what was meant by the old creed: I believe in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. In order to understand the Apostles' Creed in the present day, it is necessary to substitute different words for God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, namely, Nature, History, and Personal Life."
"Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith." 1 Tim. 4:1.

## The Soviet Estimate of Life

The following, quoted from Friend of Missions, is taken from an article addressed to young Communists: "If an individual is excessively harmful, if he is dangerous to the revolutionary fight, you have the right to kill him, obeying the order of your legal class organ. In moments of acute danger it is useless to await this order. The murder of an incorrigible enemy of their evolution is legal ethical murder-a legal death sentence, for Communism does not recognize the metaphysical value of human existence."

In other words, human life has no value except in retaliation to the welfare of the Soviet government. This is entirely opposite from Christianity which teaches that God so loves and values each individual that the great Shepherd came to seek even one sheep.

## Awaiting the Inevitable

Discussing the European situation, Stanley High, quoted in Literary Digest, says: "Today the question of war is no longer whether, but when. The event is generally accepted. Only the date remains to be fixed." War preparation may be measured by the activity in aeroplane construction, for aeroplanes will play an important part in the next war. Said Mowrer, one-time news correspondent in Germany: "Recently Russia placed an order with Germany for a certain metal alloy used in manufacture of aeroplanes. The reply was that German factories could not fill the order; they were working on three shifts for home consumption." It may be very soon that the word of Joel 3:9-16 will be fulfilled: "Proclaim ye this among the Gentiles; Prepare war, wake up the mighty men.

Put ye in the sickle, for the harvest is ripe . . . for their wickedness is great."

Far vision is usually associated with the heights of the mountains. Isaiah, however, has discovered a vision that comes in that most lowly place, a deep, deep valley. Isaiah was called upon to pass through experiences that were to rend his very soul. But through the rending came clear visions. Visions of what God is, how high and lifted up. Visions of what man is, unclean and undone. Visions that brought with them a terrific weight of burden-burden for fellowmen, burden for whole nations, great and proud, that were to totter and fall.
"The burden of the Valley of Vision!" he cried. "Look away from me! I will weep bitterly. Labor not to comfort me. It is a day of trouble, of treading down, of perplexity, by the Lord God of hosts, in the Valley of Vision!"

When a storm is brewing, a valley is a better place than some mountain height. Low down in some hidden retreat, away in some unobstrusive dale, the heart again becomes calm and regains its true perspective. In fact the truest vision is found low at the foot of the Cross where, looking up at Christ, the hot teardrops may start.

We of today need the viewpoint of the lowly place. We need the correction of humility. We need the retreat of prayer. We need to search for the source of solace and comfort, that, finding it, we may know how to share comfort with others.

The stately steppings of Omnipotence are heard in the earth. The majestic treadings of the Lord of all the earth are announcing His advent. Behold! He cometh! False measures, insecure foundations, give way at the approach of earth's rightful King.

How strikingly Isaiah perceived such a day! How majestically he stated it! His words are poetry on the event of the ages:
The windows from on high are open.
The foundations of the earth do shake.
The earth is utterly broken down.
The earth is clean dissolved.
The earth is moved exceedingly.
The earth shall reel to and fro like a drunkard Behold the Lord maketh the earth empty,

And maketh it waste,
And turneth it upside down!
It is a day in which we need to see clearly. Christ will not build upon the old foundations. Our civilization would
have chosen only towering heights of success and achievement. A mightier Hand has decreed rather, deep canyons of loss, and ravines where we may seek humiliation. Let us search for the blossoms while in the canyon, and for the green grasses while in the deep valley. On the mountain top we might think we

Then review all the spiritual blessings you have received-how He has forgiven all your sins, washed you in the blood of Jesus, filled you with His Spirit, guided, helped, protected, and comforted you.

Is that all He can or will do? The list of His mercies grows longer and longer the more we meditate on the days that are past. But He says, "Remember not the former things; lay them on one side, and begin to ask Me , to challenge Me , to do even more."

The Lord's purposc in this prolonged financial depression will never be fulfilled until it has strengthened the faith of His children and taught them to look away from all earthly dependence and to anchor their confidence and expectation on Him alone.

The Lord who has given us a new heart, made us new creatures, and taught us to walk in the new and living way, is waiting now for us to ask and receive new souls for Him, new revivals in all parts of the world, new missionaries to send to the ends of the earth, and new supplies of funds to support them.
are something. In the valley we know that we are nothing.

A blessed place is the Valley of Vision! There we taste the sweetness of humility, and the comfort found in lowliness. There we do not attempt to deceive ourselves. There we take our place so gladly, bowing down at the foot of the Cross. There the purifying teardrops all unhindered may freely flow. There, we learn something of Christ's viewpoint, who, though equal with God, took upon Him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men, then humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even the death of the Cross. In the dale of retrospect and meditation we draw the sweetness of honey from the knowledge that the roaring lion, adversary of our soul, really met his defeat at Calvary. Christ has plumbed the deepest depths, and will ascend to the highest heights. He is about to ascend the throne of His father David. He is about to take over the reins of government to rule in righteousness to the ends of the earth.

Let us identify ourselves with Him yet more fully as God's plan unfolds and matures. Christ wept. Let us be willing to weep with those who weep. He prayed through lonely night seasons. Let us pray. He girded Himself with the servant's towel. Let us become as servants of all. There is delight in the lowly valley with Him. There is safety, too. As the shepherd boy sang, in Pilgrim's Progress:

> He that is down need fear no fall,
> He that is low, no pride.
> He that is humble ever shall
> Have God to be his Guide.

What a retreat there is in prayer! What a refuge in humility! Earth's quakings may be a blessing, to prove the solidity of our foundations. Are we founded upon a sure foundation?

Let us go down with those prophets of old into the Valley of Vision, that there we may perceive, as did they, how the earth will receive her King.

## The Invulnerable Christ

They pierced Christ's side at Calvary, but they could not touch Him after His resurrection. Yet after His resurrection and glorification, through the power of His Spirit in His servants, three thousand were pricked to the heart. They pierced His side. He touched their hearts.

The invulnerable Christ could not be touched by His enemies after His resurrection. He can not now be touched by His enemies, but He is touched by His friends. He is touched with a feeling of your infirmities, and He can touch others through you.
"As He is, so are we in this world." 1 John 4:17. He is victor. He is conqueror and declares, "All power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth." As you live in that resurrection power you will be invulnerable, but if your eyes are on the winds and the waves you will sink.

Believe in the invisible Christ for a visible manifestation of His invisible power. That is the need of the Church today. Christ is waiting for the saints to avail themselves of His latent power. The hidden resources of the Godhead are available. God wants to bestow them through the members of His body. The natural body functions when the blood flows. The spiritual body will function when the Spirit flows, and the Spirit will flow when the saints exercise full faith in the atoning blood of the Son of God.

## The 〔unday chool Rsson

## Birth and Infancy of the Lord Jesus

## Lesson for Jan. 7: Matt. 2:1-12.

In this quarter we begin the study of the Gospel according to Matthew, which, while addressed to mankind in general, was written particularly to present the claims of Christ to the Jewish nation. The purpose of the inspired writer is to show that Jesus of Nazareth is the Messiah and King promised in the Old Testament. Matthew's Gospel revolves around the two thoughts: God's King and God's Kingdom. The first chapter describes the human ancestry, Davidic descent, and Divine origin of the King. Our lesson text describes how the Child-King was received by the following three classes: (1) Gentile scholars from afar, (2) Israel's king, Herod, and (3) Israel's religious leaders.

## I. THE WISE MEN

The Seekers. "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem." From their name ("Magi" in the original) we gather that the wise men were members of a priestly class living in either Persia or Chaldea, who specialized in the study of the stars and the interpretation of dreams. To this class belonged Balaam (Num. $24: 17$ ) and Daniel, who became ruler "over all the wise men of Babylon." Dan. $2: 48 ; 1: 17 ; 2: 13$. But they were more than scholars, scientists, or magicians; they were earnest seekers after the true God, whose search was crowned with a heavenly revelation. The record of their coming teaches us the following lessons: (1) The same God who prepared the Israelitish nation for the coming of the Redeemer had not neglected the Gentiles. Through the testimony of the Jews scattered among them, and by revealing Himself to their wise men (for example, Balaam. Num. $24: 3,4$ ), He created within the hearts of Gentiles a longing for the appearing of a King-Redeemer who should bring redemption to mankind. Mrs. Judith S. Grant, missionary to Persia, quotes the following from Abulpharagius, an Arabian scholar of the ninth century: "Zoroaster (a religious teacher who lived some five hundred years before the birth of Christ) taught the Persians concerning Christ. He declared that in the latter days a pure virgin should conceive, and that as soon as the child was born, a star would appear, blazing even at noonday with undiminished lustre. 'You, my sons,' said the venerable seer, 'will perceive its rising before any other nation. As soon as you see the star, follow it wheresoever it leads you, and adore the mysterious child, offering your gifts to him with the profoundest humility. He is the Almighty Word which created the heavens.'" This tradition is corroborated by the Nestorians (Oriental sect of Christians) who say that Zoroaster was a disciple of Jeremiah, from whom he learned about the Messiah. (2) The coming of these Gentile scholars is a prophecy of the time when

Gentiles of all lands will accept and adore the Christ.

The Sign. "We have seen his star in the east." Kepler, a German astronomer of the seventeenth century, calculated that about the time of Christ's birth there occurred a most remarkable conjunction of the planets Jupiter and Saturn, which was the next year reinforced by Mars. This triple conjunction was followed by the appearance of a remarkably colored star which later completely vanished. Whether or not this was the exact star the Magi saw we cannot say for certain; but we are sure that what they saw was of supernatural origin. One night as these wise men were attempting to read in the stars God's message to man, the "heavens declared the glory of God" and they saw the remarkable luminary, which they correctly interpreted as the celestial announcement of the birth of the King-Redeemer. Num. 24:17; compare Rev. 22:16.

Practical lesson: Earnest seekers after God will receive that heavenly revelation suited to their needs.
The Search. Their journey and search suggest the following lessons: (1) In order to grasp divine truth in all its fullness we must follow the light we have. If the wise men had spent their time admiring the star or simply speculating about it, they would not have found the Christ. Scriptural light is not something to lazily bask in, but a means of leading to God and godly living. (2) We should deem no difficulties too great to encounter, no sacrifice too great to make in seeking Christ. These wise men must have travelled about eight hundred miles-and travelling in those days was not as comfortable as it is today. (3) In their search for the new-born king they did not neglect natural effort; it is recorded that they enquired of Herod, "Where is he that is born king of the Jews?" Divine revelation does not excuse us from study and intelligent enquiry. (4) We learn that the supreme object of man's search is the Lord Jesus Christ. It is said that Wise Men of old dreamed, hoped, and labored to find the following blessings: First: the Elixir of Life, that would cure all diseases, relieve all pain, and confer a sort of immortality; Second: the Philosopher's Stone, which would turn base metals into gold; Third: the Fountain of Youth, by bathing in which one would never grow old. A Spanish explorer, Ponce de Leon, actually went in quest of this. They all searched in vain. But the Star of Bethlehem leads every seeker to Christ in whom is found the true Elixir of life, the Philosopher's Stone, and the Fountain of Immortality.

The Success. The star finally led them to the new-born King. After all, the ultimate test of the reality and genuineness of any leading, dream, vision etc., is its actual fulfillment. Writes F. M. Barton: "A candidate for admission to church membership being required to give some account of his first impressions as to the evil of $\sin$, and the needs of the Gospel, related a dream by which he had been influenced. When he had ended, the
pastor said, "We do not wish to despise a good man's dreams by any means; but we will tell you what we think of your dream, after we have seen how you go on when you are awake."

The Service. When the Wise Men entered the house and saw the babe, they "fell down and worshipped him." Notice the character of their worship; it was-(1) Believing. The tiny babe did not look like a King. But the Wise Men believed the Star. (2) Devout. They fell on their faces before Him. (3) Self-sacrificing. They brought Him precious gifts as an outward expression of their homage and consecration. Rom. 12:1; 2 Cor. 8:5. (4) Intelligent, for they knew whom they were worshipping and why. (5) Obedient, for when warned of God not to return to Herod, they obeyed.

## II. HEROD THE KING

Herod the King was "troubled" when he heard about the new-born King; for this cruel usurper was in constant fear of plots to dethrone him, and this fear led him to do away with any whom he suspected of aspiring to power. True to his nature, he planned to murder the Child and so prevent the fulfillment of the divine plan. But he failed, as all who attempt to fight against God will fail. Joseph's brethren attempted to prevent the fulfillment of Joseph's dreams, but their malicious treatment of him simply paved the way for his ultimate exaltation. See Genesis chapter 37. Pharaoh attempted to destroy Jehovah's people, but his cruel decree finally resulted in the introduction into his palace of a little child who ultimately struck a deadly blow at his power. The Jewish leaders attempted to nullify Christ's claims by crucifying Him, but the Cross became the means of His exaltation. God's enemies pass away, but His plan goes forward.
Notice the people of Jerusalem were "troubled" also. The state of a person's conscience will determine whether the news of Christ's soon coming will trouble him or cause him to rejoice.

## III. THE PRIESTS AND SCRIBES

Herod called a conference of the religious leaders in order to find an answer to the question of the Wise Men, "Where is he that is born king of the Jews?" These men knew their Bibles and gave the correct answer ; but, alas, with all their knowledge, they were not ready for the Christ, and not in the place where God could speak to them. Said one preacher: "Some that are best acquainted with the gospel are practical strangers to it. They are like one who should pore over the map mastering its geography; marking each sea, lake, river; understanding the position of every range of mountains; learning the names of all the localities indicated, but never visiting them." A man who had walked seven hundred miles to see Niagara Falls was astonished to hear a person who had lived all his life within the sound of the falls say that he had never visited them. The Jewish scholars who dwelt only a few miles from Bethlehem did not go to see the Babe; the Gentile scholars who lived hundreds of miles from Palestine were privileged to look upon the Christ and worship Him. It is possible to be near to Christ in privilege and knowledge but far from Him in real experience.

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In order to make it possible for a great
 number of people who, for lack of funds, are unable to subscribe for the Pcntecostal Evangel by the year, and also for those who do not know of the deeper things of God, we have had a neat box made which will hold a number of these papers.

By placing one of these boxes in the church or Assembly room in a convenient place, those desiring these papers can get them each week.

HERE IS OUR PLAN-Any church or assembly ordering 12 or more copies of the Evangel each week for a period of six months, will be furnished with one of these
boxes free. The cost of these papers is two cents each, or 24 cents a week for 12 copies.

An announcement to the congregation should be made, stating that the papers which are placed in this box each week can be had by placing two cents in the small receptacle fastened on the front of box which is provided for that purpose.

Occasionally a paper will be taken from this box by some one who does not deposit the two pennies, but on the other hand it will be found that others will drop in a nickel and sometimes a dime.

We suggest that an Evangel secretary be appointed from the church or Sunday school, who will have the oversight of this box, ordering and replenishing the supply in the box and taking the cash desposited.

As some months have five Sundays we also suggest that the papers be ordered by the quarter. At the end of each quarter a statement will be sent to the Evangel secretary who in turn will take care of the account from the proceeds placed in the box. This makes an easy and convenient way to handle the account for these papers.

There may be some small assemblies that might not be able to take 12 copies weekly, but even if 8 copies are ordered, we will provide the box free.
