"He Must Increase, I Must Decrease"

Jesus Christ our Lord must have the supreme place in everything. John the Baptist recognized this fact and when the temptation came to self-exaltation, he took his proper place. John found from many years of breaking, under the ministry of the Holy Ghost, when alone in the wilderness, that whatever service might be given to him it was for one end, that Christ might be glorified.

After all we have nothing which we have not received. How far have we fallen that we should seek to exalt ourselves! All who really see God are brought into the dust before Him.

Not only the world but we who are God's children have strayed far from the Lord when we seek honor one of another, our hearts are in darkness because we serve the creature rather than the Creator.

It is written concerning Jesus that He is the Creator of all things. Col. 1:16. This being so it is only our reasonable service that we present our lives to His control and give Him in all things the pre-eminence.

It is the decree of God that John gave expression to, when he said "He *must* increase."

God's laws and purposes sometimes seem to move to their fulfillment very slowly but they are sure and in perhaps a shorter period than we imagine it will be manifested to all that He must increase. To some it will bring fear and trembling, to others joy and rejoicing. If we want to be in the latter company, now is the time to yield to the Lord.

In rank Christ is the first-born. We endeavor to elect those who appear as most competent in our estimation for the administration of our affairs nationally or otherwise. These however at the best are but poor makeshifts and substitutes for the rightful Ruler.

Jesus is the one whose right it is to reign, for He is highest in rank by choice not of man but God.

His words were such that it is written "never man spake like this man." His character was blameless. "Who did no sin neither was guile found in His mouth." His power was irresistible. His beauty is as the altogether lovely. He was born to be a King. John 18:37. "Thus God has declared that in spite of the counsels of the ungodly He has set His King upon His holy hill of Zion and He will reign until He hath put all enemies under His feet, for He must in-

crease," and every other power and dominion must be subject to Him.

David prays in the Holy Ghost— "Let the whole earth be filled with His glory."

If only it were universally recognized that Jesus is the rightful King, how very soon would He respond to an invitation to come back to earth and reign!

In Isaiah 9:7, we read: "Of the increase of His government and peace there shall be no end."

Whatever plans the nations make, whatever alliances for peace and prosperity may be formed and whatever seeming success or failure may for the time appear as a result of these plans and alliances, one thing remains sure, that His government will increase, for it must be so by God's decree. In the second chapter of Daniel we have the vision of the stone that crushes all existing forms of government and fills the earth, prefiguring the time when the kingdoms of this world will have become the kingdoms of our Lord and His Christ and He shall reign forever and ever.'

"He must increase."

It is not a matter of choice. God is seeking the highest good of the race in appointing one who is able, better than any other, to govern this world in righteousness. He could not allow any but the best to ultimately reign and still be the God of love that He is.

"Jesus shall reign wher'er the sun, Doth his successive journey's run."

Jesus will reign in spite of resistance and rebellion, opposition and unbelief. Men must yield or be broken before Him.

As it is in respect to the nations so it is true in individual lives. "He *must* increase."

We must bow before Him as Lord and Saviour or be broken beneath the rod of judgment when He comes to rule with the "rod of iron." It cannot be otherwise. "He must increase."

I wish this truth might be burned into our hearts.

In order for Him to increase in us our part is to decrease before Him. I must decrease.

God is working in our individual lives that which later on He will manifest to all creation. He is breaking the yoke of self and sin and the devil and in its place is giving the glory and joy of His presence.

Judgment begins at the house of God and we shall have to bestir ourselves to realize that He must increase and because of this we must decrease.

"Whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath he cannot be my disciple."

How we should welcome anything which brings us down before God and humbles the natural man.

After all we have nothing in which to boast save in the cross of Christ our Lord. God is our salvation, not experiences or blessings. "He only is my rock and my salvation."

It is not written, I ought to decrease, but I must decrease. Necessity is put upon us. Have we heard the call? Do we welcome anything or anyone who helps bring this about?

"Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God."

If we fail to do what God commands we must surely be humbled at His presence when He shall come in power and great glory. We *must* decrease.

great glory. We *must* decrease. Since man listened to the devil's lie, "ye shall be as gods," man has seated himself upon the throne, thinking himself capable of government.

However, without exception, all have failed and come short of the glory of God. Jesus came as our Representative. He took the place we ought to have taken, making Himself of no reputation, wherefore God hath highly exalted Him. If we are expecting glorification with Christ, our life must decrease and His increase. We must make ourselves as the Master in His humiliation, of no reputation. Not seeking our own; not caring what men think of us whether we be praised or blamed, that Christ alone may be exalted.

We must take the lowest seat; to learn of Him, and what we are to learn is this: that He is meek and lowly in heart. As we allow this secret to govern our lives we shall as surely find rest to our souls.

Supposing however we shrink from this way and feel we cannot go, the truth of God will remain nevertheless unchanged. He must increase and I must decrease, and the day cannot be far distant when this will be manifest by every knee's bowing before Him and acclaiming Him Lord to the glory of God the Father. We may do so now as to our Saviour and Lord or do so then as to a Judge.

Speaking in Tongues

1 Corinthians 14

Speaking in tongues is not to be despised or forbidden. It is a manifestation of the Holy Spirit. It was encouraged by the Apostle Paul. In the providence of God the people at Corinth were permitted to talk too much in tongues and to make mistakes in order that the teaching made necessary by their conduct might be available for us to keep us from making the same mistakes.

Let us observe from the teaching of this chapter what is the purpose of speaking in tongues.

1. V. 2. "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men but unto God, for no one understandeth; but in the spirit he speaketh mysteries." Speaking in tongues then is fundamentally the exercise of the quickened spirit of man expressing itself to God in utterances unintelligible to man and in nature, mysterious.

2. V. 4. "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself." The one engaged in this exercise then, experiences personal blessing, the lifting up in blessing of his own spirit.

3. But taken together with the fact expressed in verse 2 this expression "edifieth himself" may be understood to mean that the one so speaking to God is drawn in prayer into a state of blessing. Those who have experience in this exercise of speaking in tongues bear witness that great personal benefit comes as they employ speaking in tongues in their private prayer life. It is an aid in coming into God's presence in the true spirit of prayer. God and spiritual things become more real to the soul, faith becomes more active, and fluency in prayer is increased.

4. V. 14. "If I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit prayeth, but my under-standing is unfruitful." Here then is set forth a definte limitation to the value of speaking in tongues. In order to bring profit to others the employment of the understanding is necessary. So there follows verse 15, the setting forth of the correct procedure. He does not advise a cessation of speaking or praying in tongues, but rather a continuance thereof with the exercise of the intelligence added. The reason for this is that those who are in the same gathering may understand and assent to the expressions of praise and thanks. The law of love leads us always to seek those things which edify others. So in verse 13 we read, "Let him that speaketh in an unknown tongue pray that he may interpret." In this way he may pray and sing with the

spirit and with the understanding that others may be edified.

Having seen the purpose of speaking in tongues, let us now note the teaching of this chapter regarding the means provided for guiding us in the use of tongues. In verse 20 we are told, "Be not children in understanding; howbeit in malice be ye babes, but in understanding be men." Here is a direct appeal for the exercise of our intelligence in the employment of speaking in tongues. God has given us brains and expects us to use them. The Baptism in the Spirit should It should make us better thinkers. help us conform, in our thinking, to the will of God. In verses 21 to 28 the believer's intelligence is appealed to as a guide in speaking in tongues.

Babies speak in tongues at the first impulse. Men recognize that the divine energy generated within them by the Baptism and the fullness of the Spirit is to be expended not primarily to make them feel good or to attract attention to themselves but to help others. Oftentimes the inner urge to release spiritual energy is a prompting of the Spirit to engage in worship, praise, or intercession, and not to speak to be heard by others. Sometimes our genuine desire to yield quickly to the Lord leads us to be hurried and to err. And while the Lord does not condemn us for making mistakes while we are babies, He does expect us to grow up. It is always safe to hold steady under impulses of our spirits until we are definitely directed in the expenditure of the divine energy. This calls for the development, through use, of our spiritual senses (Heb. 5:14), that we may learn to distinguish voices, and promptings, and restraints.

Let us now observe that a definite limit is set upon the use of tongues. In verse 22 we are told that tongues (presumably when used in public ministry) are for a sign to unbelievers. That is to say, speaking in tongues with interpretation is intended to confirm the word of God, not to supersede or replace it. (It is not Scriptural to get leadings through tongues and interpretation.) This value of tongues with interpreta-tion, which is the equivalent of prophecy (v. 5), is shown in the contrast of verses 23 to 25. Limitation to the use of tongues in public gatherings in further stated in verse 27. If more than three give messages in tongues in one gathering there might be danger of taking from the word of truth the place and time intended for it. Finally in all this matter of speaking by ecstatic utterance of re-

sponse to inward impelling, "The spirits of the prophets are subject unto the prophets." And all such utterances are properly subject to judgment of others that hear, verse 29, as they test all things by the holy written Word.

Tract Evangelism

The choicest thoughts of the best writers can now be found in tract form, and many a soul has been awakened by one of these silent messengers which God has put into the hand at the right time.

People in sorrow or sickness love to be remembered.

Housekeepers can use tracts to good advantage. Lay them on the parlor table that callers may read them while waiting. Give them to the milkman, the grocer, the postman; enclose them in letters, library books and packages.

Business men have fine opportunities for this kind of work. A man once said, "I cannot speak in meeting, but if you will supply me with choice reading matter I will pay for it and inclose it in the packages which go out of my store."

Teachers can make good use of tracts. Those who cannot talk with their pupils can put into their hands the wise words of others. Old-fashioned tracts will not do for boys. They want something which sparkles with life, which rivets the attention, and which stops when it gets there.

Never give away a tract unless you know its contents. Use all the tact you have and pray for more. An old man said to a train boy, "No, I don't want your popcorn; don't you see I haven't any teeth?" "Buy some gumdrops then, nice, fresh gumdrops." That boy had a reserve appeal, and knew how to adapt it to his customers, and so should we. Occasionally select a good tract, printing on it the name of your church or Sunday school, with an invitation to attend the services. Then canvass the whole neighborhood, leaving a tract at every house.

The Discerning of Spirits

Jonah sat on the mount that overlooked Nineveh, expecting the city to be overthrown. He did not weep for them. He did not travail in spirit. But he watched as a callous spectator might watch two angry dogs fighting, interested in the beastly spectacle but with no tenderness of spirit for all the pain that was being inflicted by one animal on the other.

But there was One who looked down from heaven, who had compassion. He sought to teach His prophet a lesson. It was hot upon that mountainside, and the prophet was glad for a gourd under whose shade he was able to rest, sheltered from the hot rays of the sun. But the Lord prepared a worm that began to destroy the gourd. Then He sent a vehement wind which completed the work, and Jonah was left upon the mount under the searching rays of that hot sun, till his whole body was faint with the heat. Then the Lord spoke unto him and said, "Thou hast had compassion on the gourd but thou hast had no compassion upon these people below, who know not how to discern between the right hand and the left."

And that same One looked down upon the multitudes of Judea and had com-passion as He saw them as sheep without a shepherd, not discerning that which was right, not discerning that which was wrong, oppressed by evil spirits, oppressed by him who is the very essence of callousness-the devil, who has no love for those made in the image of God. But this One who has compassion and dis-cerns the condition of those whom He came to save, desires His children who are filled with the Spirit to have discernment that they might recognize both that which is good and that which is evil. There is an express warning given by the Spirit, that many (not a few, many) false spirits are going forth, many false prophets, yea evil spirits that would de-ceive if it were possible the very elect-subtle spirits, and the leaders need to discern, in order to keep the flocks from the wolves.

Paul recognized the danger and warned the elders of Ephesus that in their midst would rise some with a proud spirit, wanting pre-eminence, but there would also come in those who were grievous wolves. He saw behind the outward garb and the feigned humility and the glib words that these would speak, the wolf spirit that would devour the flock. And he warned the overseers lest these wolves come in and destroy those for whom the Shepherd died. The Lord Jesus looked behind the kingly garb and the outward appearance of the pompous Herod, and saw beneath the spirit of the fox, and said, "Go tell that fox." And He would have His own discern the fox spirit, the wolf spirit, the ravenous spirit, the spirit that has no compassion, that would feed itself and destroy the flock.

When the Lord was going through Samaria there was opposition. Those Samaritans had not kindliness toward the Jew, and James and John were disturbed. They wanted a miracle wrought, that fire should come down from heaven and consume these unkind Samaritans. But they received rebuke from the Master. He recognized their spirit and said, "Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of." He did not want the spirit of judgment to be in His own, or a legalistic spirit. The law came by Moses, but He brought grace. He was gracious and compassionate. He was going to Calvary to die for all, and sent them forth to proclaim (not merely to Jew, but to Greek and barbarian) the infinite gospel of His grace, that all should repent. He had a heart of compassion for those of He purposed that Samaria Samaria. should not be forgotten, that this gospel should be preached in Jerusalem, Judea, and in Samaria. He rebuked that narrow, sectarian,

nationalistic spirit; a spirit that is dominant today. And in His new covenant, the covenant sealed with His own precious blood and sprinkled with the same, He hath promised to take away the heart of stone, the stony heart that hates all mankind. Men call themselves patriotic and cheer their own flags, and they hate those who had the accident of being born in other lands. He would take away that heart of stone and give a ten-der heart of flesh. He would take away that spirit which would bring down heaven's fire upon those of other nationalities, and put within the spirit of meekness, grace, compassion, and love. Yea, He would give His own precious Holy Spirit. He wrought a miracle in the hearts of the sons of Zebedee, and they were no longer sons of thunder, but He made them men of love and compassion. And John went down with Peter to Samaria to pray heaven's best instead of heaven's judgment upon them, that they might be filled with the Holy Spirit.

The Lord would have His own to discern the spirit of grace, the meek and quiet spirit, the tender spirit. The disciples were suspicious of him who had been before a blasphemer and a persecutor, but Barnabas discerned the spirit of the Lamb in Saul, and brought him to the brethren who were filled with suspicion, and they recognized the grace that was upon him. The Lord would not have His people filled with suspicion, but He would have them discern His grace upon those He has redeemed, and upon those He has chosen to be vessels unto honor. But He would have them watchful against those who come in with a legalistic spirit to take His sheep from the sweet pastures of grace into the barren wilderness of legalism where they would die for lack of sustenance.

There are some who come to believe the gospel, who would affiliate with the people of God, but they are not set free from the spirit that dominated them in the old days. Such was Simon the sorcerer. He believed the message of Philip. He was baptized and was one in the community of the saints in Samaria. But there was still that old proud dominating spirit, a spirit full of ambition that dominated him in the early days when men said of him, "This is the great power of God." But Peter discerned the spirit that dominated him, and the sorcerer asked for prayer. There is deliverance for those who have been dominated by a wrong spirit, who will humble themselves and ask for the prayers of God's saints. But there is an evil spirit that remains proud and unteachable, that will pile up arguments that it is all right, a spirit of pride that esteems its own opin-ion better than that of others, a spirit that despises the counsel of old and mature men of God, a proud and haughty spirit that is destined for a great fall.

Moses discerned the spirit of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram, and knew the judgment that would come. He warned those who were innocent to keep away from them lest they be partakers of their judgment. And God sent judgment upon those haughty, unteachable spirits; the earth opened and swallowed them. The Lord delights in the humble and meek spirit, but the proud He knoweth afar off. He who thinks himself highly spiritual and is unteachable, is dominated by a spirit of spiritual wickedness that God will judge. He will drag down the proud from their seats. Spiritual pride is a most subtle and damnable thing in His sight, and he who yields to it shall be abased; judgment will come on such. God's overseers, His rulers, need to watch against a subtle, proud, unteachable spirit that would get into the ranks, and should warn the people against having any part or lot with such, lest they share the judgment that comes upon such who have part and lot in the gainsaying of Kore.

Many false prophets! How necessary it is that there should be that manifestation of the Spirit—the gift of discernment—to recognize these who are disguised as ministers of righteousness, who are false and filled with a lying spirit,

who speak not the things of the lowly Lamb, who lead not in the paths of righteousness, but lead into that way which seemeth good unto mankind, but a way that endeth in death.

The true prophet of God will ever be despised, will ever be meek, will ever be lowly. He will not seek filthy lucre. He will not seek the praise of men. He will seek to be true to the One whose messenger he is. But false prophets seek to exalt themselves. They seek to

feed themselves. They seek to clothe themselves. They are not filled with a deep compassion for the flock. Watch, for by their fruits ye shall know them. For good trees bring forth good fruit, and evil trees bring forth evil fruit. If thou dost look to thy Lord He will show thee that which is good, and that which is evil. And thou shalt choose, and cause others to choose, that which is good. Thou shalt cause the saints to refrain from and hate that which is evil.

Poisoning the Unborn

The following item discloses one of the effects of the tobacco companies' campaign to "nicotinize" the womanhood of this land. "A physician in a medical clinic recently stated that mothers who smoke when they wean their babies have to put a pinch of nicotine in the cow's milk to keep the babies quiet."

"Earthquakes in Divers Places"

Formosa, the large island about 100 miles off the southeastern coast of China, largely inhabited by Chinese but now ruled by Japan, reported (April 22) a severe earthquake in which some 2,500 people were killed, nearly 7,000 homes were wrecked, 250,000 people are reported homeless, and much other damage was done. This is one of twenty-five great earthquakes of the present century in which 290,000 people have lost their lives.

War Clouds

"This week, from a half a dozen capitals, events piling up with stark realism, pointed inevitably to war between Italy and Ethiopia by September," comments Literary Digest.

We are witnessing the revival not only of the ancient Roman empire but of the ancient Roman land-lust. Mussolini wants Ethiopia for Italian expansion, and will have it regardless of rights or treaties. No wonder Daniel saw the world empires pictured as wild "beasts." Daniel 7.

A Coming Mass Movement to Palestine?

The Jewish Missionary Magazine passes on the following item: There will be 1,200,000 Jews and 1,600,000 Arabs on both sides of the Jordan by the year 1945, according to the present rate of immigration, in the opinion of Jacob De Haas, veteran Zionist. However, Jews must strive for an annual immigration of 120,000 to Palestine, and if that pace is reached by 1936, there will be 2,000,-000 Jews in Palestine by 1945. Asserting that the majority of the Jews must and will leave Europe, De Haas declared that "we think of Zionism in terms of such a mass movement settling in the Orient."

Rabbi's Son Baptized in Spirit

Gospel Call of Russia reports that "Three believers this month received the Baptism with the Holy Spirit, among them the son of a Jewish rabbi. Not long ago he was led to Christ. Persecution, our seemingly constant companion, forced this brother to move to the city of Sliven, where living among the believers he received their comfort and encouragement and also enjoyed more freedom. While there the blessed Paraclete came to make His abode within him. He is still there, growing spiritually, strengthening himself in the faith of his fathers."

A Court Decision on the "Protocols"

A libel suit was brought in Berne, Switzerland, against those circulating the spurious "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," a document purporting to reveal a Jewish world-plot against the Gentiles. On the basis of findings of an impartial expert the judge declared the Protocols was a forgery, a plagiarism, and came under the description of trashy literature within the meaning of the laws of the canton of Berne.

The Jews as a nation have many serious faults that merit just condemnation. But we must remember the command, "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor."

Increasing Stinginess

In 1933 church members in the United States gave a contribution of some \$16.11 per capita. In 1934 this was decreased to \$12.07 per capita. More for self-less for God. No wonder so many church boards are retrenching on missionary work. But the China Inland Mission, run on faith lines, recently sent out 200 new missionaries, and record the largest missionary contribution in their history. The Heart of Africa Mission is sending out fifty new missionaries this year. Could we not as a Pentecostal people set a prayer goal for fifty new missionaries to be sent out each year? I will mean sacrifice, but it is to this we are called.

Rich Toward God

At the ripe age of 86, after teaching his Bible class, A. A. Hyde of Wichita, Kansas, passed on to be with the Lord. Hyde commenced his successful business career by pledging *one-tenth* of his receipts to the kingdom of God, but during the past quarter of a century, when his success increased, he gave *nine-tenths*, and finally he gave everything beyond frugal living expenses. He gave large sums to missionary work. He considered these his real investments. He was a wise man to lay up his treasure where thieves cannot break through and steal, and where no moth corrupts.

Standing True

"Before the court in Petersburg there recently appeared a whole society of young Christian men, accused of exercising an unauthorized religious influence upon the young. They were asked to recant, but they refused, although they knew that this meant exile. They held fast to their faith and were banished to the far north, where they will have to do forced labor for many years. As far as is known, not one of them has yielded." So says *World Dominion*. Thank God that He still has some young Russians who are obedient to that Word, "Quit you like men, be strong." 1 Cor. 16:13.

Two Jewish Chemists

Prophecy points out that the destiny of the World War from the human viewpoint was largely in the hands of two Jewish chemists. It was a Jewish chemist, Dr. Chaim Weizman, who saved the day for England by a new chemical invention, and he was promised as a reward by Lord Balfour "When the guns stop rumbling, you shall get your Jerusalem."

In Germany there was also a famous Jewish chemist, Fritz Haber, who invented the poison gas which was used in an attack upon the Allies with tremendous "Haber urged the immediate damage. manufacture of a great quantity, and another gas attack at once to bring the war to a speedy close. General Ludendorff said No: he wanted to wait awhile longer and check up more fully the results of that first attack. During the interim of delay the Allies made gas masks and began to make poison gasses themselves. By the time Ludendorff was ready to strike again with gas the Allies were prepared. The Testimony of a Seventh Day Adventist

I was saved at the age of twenty-five in the Methodist church. My father had been converted just before, and the Lord gave him a vision of the risen Jesus; so in my ignorance I thought one could not be saved without a vision. After going to the altar for three months the Lord in His mercy revealed Himself to me through a vision. I saw Jesus at the supper table with His disciples; and I should have fallen to the floor if my husband had not caught me. This was to me the seal of my salvation. From that time I knew Jesus had washed my sins away in His precious blood, and I was filled with joy unspeakable. It was not long however, before we moved to Nevada, where we had no church privileges; and my husband not being saved, I gradually slipped back into worldly ways.

Later on we came to live in California, and I was running a hotel in Los Angeles when we came into contact with Seventh Day Adventism. We saw lectures ad-vertized as "Spiritualism Exposed," and began to attend them. My husband and I both became interested and finally joined the Adventist church. One of my roomers had a table covered with Bibles; so when I saw that, I felt I would like to speak to him on keeping the sabbath. After telling him about it, he told me that his mother had died in that faith, and he had been on the verge of joining it; but after praying all night he went into his library and found a booklet exposing Adventism, the presence of which he could not in any way account for.

This man told me how he had been kept from joining the Adventists and observing the seventh day; and he also gave me a little card telling of healing meetings being held by a Pentecostal evangelist named Manley. About that time my husband became very ill with pnuemonia; so I suggested that he should go to Brother Manley's meetings. Accordingly he struggled out of bed in all his weakness, went with me to the meeting, was prayed for, and healed immediately. He said he felt as if warm oil had been poured all over his body, and the disease disappeared in a moment. For about a year after this we never went again to those Pentecostal meetings, but continued regularly with the Adventists.

One day I got up in the meeting and asked how it was that although we were keeping God's commandments so carefully, we did not have any *power* in our lives. Our pastor replied, "Is it power that you want? Then you will have to

go to the tongues people. They have plenty of power—but of what kind? It is all the power of the devil." From that time my husband started searching for those "tongues people," not knowing that Brother Manley's mission where he had received healing was Pentecostal. One day he came in very happy, saying, "Mother, I have found those peculiar people. Come with me to see them."

That very night we made our way to an upper room where about a thousand people were worshiping the Lord in Spirit and in truth. We had been told it was all of the devil, and we believed it. We thought there could be no shouting, dancing, lying prostrate under the power of the Spirit, talking in tongues, etc., except under Satan's power; and when we saw such manifestations we became so alarmed that I cried to the Lord and said I would never again attend a similar meeting. My husband was calmer than I was, but we both left the meeting feeling sorry for those poor, deluded people, as we thought them to be.

About six months later we plucked up our courage and went there again, for I was feeling a deep hunger in my heart for God, and knew not where to get it satisfied. That night we went into the prayer room before the meeting was over, just to see how the people would act who went there to pray. We found the room empty, nothing but bare benches. My husband told me those people said they had the Holy Spirit, and suggested that we should get down on our knees and ask for Him. But I stoutly affirmed that I had it. However I thought if my husband wanted to pray, it would not hurt me to kneel with him. So we both got down by one of the benches, and my knees had barely touched the floor when a wonderful vision opened before me. The Lord drew back a pair of curtains be-fore my eyes, and I saw the meeting of the Seventh Day Adventists. The Spirit said to me, "These are in bondage;" and the curtains rolled together, hiding them from my view.

Next He drew back the curtains again, and I saw the meeting of the Pentecostal people whom I had been mocking and deriding in my heart. The Lord said to me, "These are My people." It seemed then as if I were going through an emptying process, and I must have screamed as I cried to God, for people came from below to see what was happening. The Lord stripped me and I felt as if I were being emptied, until I felt like an eggshell without the egg. All my strong belief in Adventism, the Seventh Day Sabbath, keeping the Law, etc., had vanished; and I saw how *Jesus alone* was all my plea, and nothing but His precious blood was needed for my salvation. "For by *grace* are ye saved, through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not of works, lest any man should boast." Eph. 2:8, 9.

Communism Among Children

The Morning Star states, "The Communists know the importance of making disciples among the young. So, having made some converts among the teachers, they set to work to grasp the children, establishing infidel Sunday schools and scattering infidel literature. A few leagues beyond, they came to the farm of another believer named Herculano. Surrounding the farm-house, they called for the owner and were told he had left that day for a neighboring city. All unbelieving, they searched the place, but in vain. Enraged at their ill-success, they declared they would carry off Herculano's wife, as a hostage for the payment of the \$500 demanded. The poor woman was in a

dreadful way, but just as they were preparing to execute their threat, up rode a young man, a brother of Herculano, also a believer. At once he pleaded with the men and offered them himself in place of the terror-stricken woman.

"Taking him at his word, away they went, carrying him as their prisoner and hostage. As they rode, the young man began to talk to them about the Gospel, and gave them his testimony as to the power of the Lord Jesus Christ. After a while one of the men exclaimed: 'Yes, that's all right, I have a book all about this in my saddlebag,' referring to the stolen Bible. EVANGELIZING IN CHINA

"As cold water to a thirsty soul, so is good news from a far country."

Our readers will doubtless be interested in the report of our Sister Gustavson on a recent evangelistic trip to her two outstations, Yuin E and Ta Yan Teh, the former being located about 145 miles from Pu Tsih, where she is stationed.

Mode of Travel

The journey to Taian is very simple, as it is made by train, but the 45 miles from Taian to Yuin E is guite different-since one has to travel by Chinese wheelbarrow. There are no paved roads or buses except between the larger cities.

Miss Gustavson was accompanied on her journey by Mrs. Chang, her Bible woman. On arriving at Taian, they were joined by Evangelist Chang Wu Gung. Owing to bandit activities in that section of the country, it was not considered safe for the ladies to travel alone. The use of two wheelbarrows and one rickshaw was secured. One wheelbarrow hauled their baggage consisting of bedding, cots, food and cooking utensils; the other was the passenger car for the two native workers. Miss Gustavson rode in the rickshaw, a small two-wheel buggy pulled by a man. Two men are used for the wheelbarrow; one pulls and the other pushes. Such a trip of more than a day would, doubtless, make any one of us appreciate more our modern ways of travel.

Scenery and Sights

Miss Gustavson writes: "Although it was a slow journey to get to Yuin E, I enjoyed the trip as the weather was fine and the country was clothed in all the beauties of spring. We crossed two mountain ranges, passing many fruit trees in bloom and had a grand view of the surrounding country, passing through villages and crossing many grain fields. We saw sights which can only be seen in Oriental countries, such as men hitched to a plow, plowing! Those who have animals will hitch a cow, a donkey and an ox together. The Chinese are good farmers. Very little rain has fallen this spring, so where there are no wells or springs for irrigation purposes, the grain is just about dried up."

Gathering for Convention

The following day they arrived in Yuin E, and that day Christian people arrived to attend the convention which commenced on Saturday, April 6th. There were as many as 120 people who were served meals and stayed right through to the closing day. It was a problem to find sleeping quarters for all. They slept on the mud church floor. Two neighbors kindly opened their homes for as many as they could accommodate. The food served at this convention was millet cooked as a breakfast food and dark steamed bread. The tables were set in the yard, the only dishes used being bowls and chop sticks. The food was served in big, earthen crocks, and everybody helped themselves. I heard no complaining over food or anything. What a contrast to America!

God's Presence with Them

"From beginning to end, God's presence was felt, and the convicting power of the Holy Spirit rested on the people. The third day of the convention confession of sin began and continued for three days. My! what dark and gross sins were openly confessed! What weeping and sorrow for sin and failure! We read in the Psalms, 'Weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning,' and 'Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.' On Friday, the day of the baptismal service, there was great joy because many had prayed through. In the morning the congregation marched to the river and twenty-five redeemed, happy souls were baptized. It was the best baptismal service I have witnessed in China. The weather was fine and the presence of the Lord hovered over us. Among those baptized was a lady 82 years While she was being baptized, she reold. ceived healing in her body. The pain in her back, from which she had suffered, disappeared. During the meetings a number were healed and some received the Baptism in the Holy Ghost."

"The meetings at Ta Yan Teh were of the same nature as at Yuin E. There was much confession of sin. Two outstanding conversions were two afflicted people, a man and a woman, who were brought there to seek God's salvation and healing. The lady had terrible running sores on both legs. She could not walk. The man was a cripple. Both of them confessed many sins and both received a bright conversion, and then returned home happy and encouraged to believe God for healing for their bodies. On Easter Sunday, the meetings closed at Ta Yan Teh when we had a regular preaching service in the morning and the Lord's Supper of which about 35 Christians partook. It was a precious meeting.

No Denominational Barriers

"Since these meetings both at Yuin E and Ta Yan Teh were of the nature of conventions there were several preachers present of other denominations who received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit during the Shantung revival. They were all given opportunity to preach, although my two workers and I did most of the preaching.

"Each day of the conventions commenced with a regular morning prayer at 5 o'clock when everybody, preachers included, assembled to pray until 8 o'clock. At 10 o'clock the regular service began. In the afternoons services were held for women conducted by Mrs. Chang and me. The evening services were usually well attended by the village people, filling both church and yard. Deliverance to Demon-possessed

"Our evangelist at Pu Tsih, Brother Lieu, has also returned from an evangelistic trip to near by villages. He brings good reports. God is using him in casting out demons. On this trip there were several cases of demon-possession which were delivered. About two months ago a man, dying with T. B., was instantly healed. He had been confined to his bed for 6 months. His family had prepared his burial clothes, as he was expected to die, but God had mercy upon him and he was healed. This resulted in the conversion of several of his relatives. Yesterday, Brother Lieu called on this man and found him well and still rejoicing in what God had done for him. The Lord be praised!

The Holy Spirit has given us a similar word on this line in the New Testament, "I exhort therefore, that first of all, supplications, prayers, intercession, giving of thanks be made for all men; for kings, and for all that are in authority: that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty." Let us put first what God puts first, making constant prayers for all who rule and are in authority. There is an evil spirit abroad everywhere today which despises government and speaks evil of dignities. We have warnings in Scripture against this outstanding offence in 2 Peter 2:10 and Jude 8.

I. A PURE PURPOSE

A Righteous Resolution. God had let Judah go into captivity, to a land where there were the vilest of idolatries. Daniel, however, with his companions, had a purpose to be true to the God of Israel. In the 119th Psalm he would read, "Blessed are the undefiled in the way, who walk in the law of the Lord." And again, "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word." "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." As Brother Kerr used to say, "That is having a good thing in a good place for a good purpose." We need the continual cleansing of the waters of God's holy Word. Christ gave to His disciples the Word His Father had given to Him, and He was able to say, "Now are ye clean through the word which I have spoken unto We need to have our portion every you." day of the cleansing, purifying, transforming Word of God. Daniel was a man of the Word. He was also a man of prayer and we see him three times a day kneeling before God and petitioning Him, and making his thanksgiving. The man who gives himself to the Word and prayer will receive from God a ministry to the multitude.

There is no doubt that the meat and wine that was given to the princes in the king's household had first been offered to idols, but Daniel and his companions resolved to have no part nor lot in the abominable idolatries of Babylon.

II. A POSITIVE PROOF

God's Infinite Grace. The Lord gave Daniel special favor with the prince of the eunuchs. This man wanted Daniel and his companions to look their best before the king. He knew that the king would count him responsible. But Daniel was counting on the God he purposed to serve, and he asked that he and his companions might have pulse to eat for ten days. Leeser translates this word pulse "vegetables." The prince of the eunuchs allowed a trial of this simple diet, and at the end of the ten days "their countenances appeared fairer and fatter in flesh than all the children which did eat the portion of the king's meat."

Simple Diet. Someone has pointed out that when God feeds His people He gives them a very simple diet. For forty years He provided manna in the wilderness, and the water that flowed from the rock. And how well His people were! "There was not one feeble person among their tribes." His diet for Elijah was simple bread and flesh which the ravens brought him. And then when He took him to the widow of Sarepta he had simple cakes made out of the meal and the oil. It was a simple provision of bread and fish that Christ fed the multitude, and again after His resurrection it was a simple meal of this character that He Himself had cooked that He supplied His disciples.

Keeping Well. One who was graciously healed of the Lord and taught the gospel of healing said, "I feel sometimes that I would like to talk on the matter of simple diet to some people who come for healing. They fill their stomachs with all kinds of unwholesome things, surfeiting themselves, and then come for healing. They don't get healed, and I feel the Lord wants them to learn to keep their bodies under. I was on the train with a woman who had a supper of doughnuts, coffee, and pickles. Then she had a big pain in her stomach and asked for prayer. I confess I prayed something like this, 'Lord, please forgive this dear soul for her foolishness and give her better sense. And be merciful and heal her.' The Lord did graciously touch her. But I feel there are many sinning against the light, surfeiting themselves with unwholesome things, and in consequence their bodies are badly poisoned. I wish all the saints would really eat and drink to the glory of the Lord."

Pure Blood. A godly physician once wrote: "The quality of the blood determines the quality of thought, or alters the quality of thought. When the blood is poisoned as, for instance, in a bilious attack, the thoughts become at once of a different quality. They are gloomy and depressed. One meets so many people whose thoughts are extremely poor and bad, because of the quality of their blood and not because of an unsound mind. When their bodies are raised to the normal level, the mind regains its proper balance." This doctor urged the eating of vegetables and fruit for the purifying of the blood stream. In every season of the year the Lord provides us abundance of fruits and vegetables, and we do well to avail ourselves of His bountiful provision. Dr. Arthur Pierson wrote a tract entitled "Holy Care of the Body." He pointed out there are two wholesome fruits which can be had in practically every part of the world at any time of the year-the banana and the orange-and he counseled those who suffered much from sick headache to go without their regular meals at times and just have a simple meal of these fruits. He had

proved in his own ministry that these were God's provision to him when he was not well.

III. A PROPHET'S PORTION

More than meat. While our bodies are an important part of us and we must ever remember that they are temples in which the Holy Ghost dwells, the Lord knows that we also have needs in our minds and in our spirits. He graciously met the mental and spiritual needs of Daniel and his companions. "God gave them knowledge and skill in all learning and wisdom: and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams." Have you ever read through the 119th Psalm, making its seventy-two petitions your own? Have you noted how many times the Psalmist prays, "Give me understanding"?

Visions. God has promised in the last days to pour out His Spirit upon all flesh and the young men shall see visions. He gave visions to Daniel, and He is willing to give them to the young men of today. He is willing to give also the prophetic gift. Joel 2:28. He has caused it to be written, "Desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy." 1 Cor. 14:1. Let us covet the best gifts for the glory of our Lord.

Ten Times Better. The wisdom and knowledge which God gave to these young men made them ten times better than the magicians, astrologers, and wise men of Babylon. Voltaire, the French infidel, was much honored in his day as a brilliant satirist. There lived in his time a godly man, Isaac Newton, who discovered the law of gravitation. Newton studied both Daniel and Revelation, and he recognized that a certain day would come when a new mode of traveling would be invented, and he said that knowledge would be so increased that he believed men would be able to travel as rapidly as fifty miles an hour. This sorely provoked the sarcasm of the infidel Voltaire, who declared, "Now look at the mighty mind of Newton who discovered gravitation. When he became an old man and got into his dotage, he began to study the book called the Bible, and he says that the knowledge of mankind will be so increased that we shall be able to travel at the rate of fifty miles an hour. The poor dotard!" Who was right, the man of God or the infidel? Do you want to get understanding and knowledge? The Psalmist said, "Through thy precepts I get understanding." Psalm 119:104. The man who lives in the Word of God and makes it His own, feeding on its precepts continually, will have a wisdom and understanding ten times better than anything the world knows. -S. H. F.



HEALED OF TUBERCULOSIS

December 26, 1928 I took sick with the flu which went into pleurisy and from that into Tuberculosis of the lungs. I wa's thirty-three years old and weighed about 100. I was up and down until June when X-ray pictures were taken and other tests showed I had Tuberculosis. I was sent to the sanitarium. I stayed there six weeks, and then went to my mother's to be cared for. In September my sister had been to see the doctor and he expressed the fear that the disease could not be stopped. I knew my temperature was rising. I was very much discouraged and my little six year old daughter caught me crying. She said, "Oh, Mother, don't cry, pray." She dropped on her knees and prayed for a few minutes and then jumped up clapping her hands saying, "O Mother, Jesus says, 'I will heal her.' Now. Mother, you are well. O I'm so glad." She never admitted again that I was sick although I didn't step out that very hour and take my healing as I should have done. I

was taking two kinds of medicine every hour. I took only two doses after she prayed (am ashamed I did that) then I got to the place where I said, "Lord, live or die I am going to trust "You." I meant it with all of my being. I gained two and a half pounds the following week, and kept it up until I weighed 148 pounds. I have now been doing my own house work for five years and have worked in the cannery the past three summers. In 1933 the county nurse took me to the State Tuberculosis Hospital for a thorough examination by the State Doctor. He later wrote a letter to the County Clinic saying he could find no trace of Tuberculosis, not even old lesions, and that I was a dismissed case.
