"Keep Yourselves in the Love of God"



Formerly a Modernist, now a Pentecostal Preacher

Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick, pastor of the Riverside Church in New York (considered the champion of Modernism), returned to his pulpit recently after a nine month's sickness, and used as his subject, "Beyond Modernism." This sermon was printed in The Christian Century, December 4, 1935. I am especially interested in this article because, having entered the ranks of Modernism in 1917, I carried a letter of introduction to Dr. Fosdick when I went to New York for Seminary training. On that occasion, as we went out to lunch together, he told me that it was either Modernism for him or no religion at all.

Under four heads Dr. Fosdick declared that Modernism has failed to meet the new age in which we are living, because:

(1) "It has been too much occupied with an intellectual approach to religion."

(2) "Modernistic Christianity has largely eliminated from its faith the God of moral judgment."

(3) "In the third place, Modernism has even watered down and thinned out the central message and distinctive truth of religion, the reality of God. . . . And because I have been and am a Modernist it is proper that I should confess that often the Modernistic movement, adjusting itself to a man-centered culture, has encouraged this mood, watered down the thought of the Divine and, may we be forgiven for this, left souls standing, like the ancient Athenians, before an altar to an Unknown God."

(4) "Finally Modernism has too commonly lost its ethical standing ground and its power of moral attack."

Now having dealt with the mistakes of Modernism in the past two generations, Dr. Fosdick tells his hearers that it is essential for present day Modernists to go "beyond Modernism" and present a Christ who can challenge this generation and all generations. We shall deal with this point later.

However in spite of its failures, Dr. Fosdick gives his testimony to the value of Modernism to him in the following words: "Fifty years ago, a boy seven years of age, was crying himself to sleep at night in terror lest, dying, he should go to hell, and his solicitous mother, out of all patience with the fearful teachings which brought such apparitions to the mind, was trying in vain to

comfort him. That boy is preaching to you today and you may be sure that to him the achievements of Christian Modernism in the last half century seem not only important but indispensable."

What an opportunity is here presented for Dr. Fosdick to state precisely the Modernistic truths and "achievements" which can dry the tears of those who are crying themselves to sleep under conviction of sin; but not a word of counsel is given and no way out is pointed to the soul weighed down by the consciousness of its guilt. On this point I am glad to relate the following experience: About three years ago I heard a boy, not much more than seven years of age, crying in the night. I went to his side and said to him, is the matter, Son?" He said, "Daddy, I am lost. I am not saved." It was my privilege to point him to that middle cross and the seven bleeding wounds from which flowed the precious blood of the Lord Jesus Christ as an all sufficient remedy to lift the awful sense of guilt resting upon his heart. By faith he took Jesus as his personal Saviour, and soon his cries of anguish were turned into expressions of rejoicing. I heard him say, "Praise the Lord! Thank you, Jesus!" while his face was lit up with a smile as the Holy Spirit witnessed the reality of salvation to his soul. Oh, if someone had only pointed the lad, Harry Emerson Fosdick, to the Lamb of God. who taketh away the sin of the world, that night when he cried for fear of going to hell. How soon the Lord Jesus would have kissed away those tears. It is just at this point that Modernism commits its eternally fatal sin and blunder. This perverted gospel is booking passengers for the good ship Abundant Life, but fails to furnish a gangplank with which to get aboard. Since Modernism fails to preach deliverance from the guilt of sin through the blood of Calvary's Cross and the risen life of God's Eternal Son, the expression, "Beyond Modernism" can have no real meaning for a hungry soul which is seeking both a New Testament experience of Christ and an effective ministry of service in His name. How do I know this?

About seven years ago a Congregational minister was doing his utmost to put over a Modern program in his community. How that word "Modern" fascinated him. In a Sunday Afternoon Club which he organized he selected

outstanding public speakers of national reputation, representing Jewish, Catholic, and liberal Protestant faiths. At his suggestion their respective subjects were: "The Faith of a Modern Jew"; "The Faith of a Modern Catholic"; "The Faith of a Modern Protestant." He was acclaimed in the town as a progressive A District Governor of the Rotary Club of which this minister was local secretary and treasurer, offered him an increase in salary if he would branch out and be a community worker of the town independent of all church connections. This minister came to see by faithful and honest experiment that the Modernism in which he believed was spiritually bankrupt as a religious faith to transform character and to produce Bible experiences of fellowship with Jesus Christ. Ten years before, as a Senior in college, he became a Modernist. Now, disillusioned regarding its pretentious claims, he was standing at the cross-roads. Which way should he turn in order that the coming years of his life and ministry might be more fruitful than the last decade? He remembered a little Mission and the time when, kneeling there as a penitent, God, for Christ's sake, lifted the burden of sin from his heart and he arose, a new creature in Christ Jesus. He also remembered the amazing transformation which God wrought in his life and the soul-winning passion which characterized the early years of his Christian walk. He retraced his footsteps back to the reality of a know-so salvation. Glory to God! Truly this is as far "Beyond Modernism" as Heaven is above the Earth. This is step number one along a new and wonderful way which the I ord was to lead me. Two more beautiful experiences were yet to follow.

While spending my vacation in Joliet, Ill., Evangelist F. F. Bosworth was conducting revival services in that city and a friend of his presented me with a copy of his book entitled, "Christ the I had been instantly healed years before when alone in my home without any teaching on Divine Healing and recalled the precious spiritual enrichment which came to me out of that experience. As I read Brother Bos-worth's messages God quickened faith in my heart and I said to my wife. "Mother, I believe Jesus is going to heal me now." We were in our room together and as I dropped on my knees by the side of our bed the Lord graciously healed me. Praise the Lord! What a flood of wonderful blessing came to me as God lifted my life to a new plane of spiritual fellowship and reality. Space forbids going into details on this point except to say that I determined to add the ministry of healing to my salvation testimony. I tried to secure an opening where I could branch out of the Congregational Church into this deeper ministry, but doors seemed to close up. I was to know the Divine reason soon why the Lord did not give me the opportunity of proclaiming this message which was precious to my soul. He was holding me there for the next step "Beyond Modernism."

A group of Pentecostal people came to our town and began to hold revival services about a half mile from the church which I was pastoring. I did not like them. They called on me to pray one time and then all began to pray so loudly that no one could hear what I said. This nettled me, The more I attended the services the more my dislike grew until I went to my study one day and wrote a petition to the owners of the building that these meetings stop. My petition began like this: "Seeing that this denomination is not a contribution to the spiritual life of our community," etc. However, although I was sure that this could be easily done, the owners said, "Reverend, we don't feel that we ought to stop a religious meeting in the town"; and in spite of all I could do to persuade them they refused me. Feeling much defeated, I walked down the street meeting a sinner woman whom I had been unable to reach for our church. Her face was lit up with the glory of God. She had been converted at the Pentecostal Revival. As we talked together something began working on my soul. Conviction deepened. I did not want to see or talk to anyone. Filling my car tank with gas I rode from one country road to another and the more I rode the worse I felt. I was made to see that I had been fighting God and His cause in seeking to close up a Pentecostal meeting. For a while I thought my soul was lost. The heavens seemed brass above me as I prayed. I could stand it no longer and with clenched fist I struck the wheel of my car and cried, "My God, open to me. I am knocking. Soon I heard a voice say, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any man will hear my voice and open the door, I will come in and sup with him and he with me." "Come in, Lord Jesus!" How wonderful was that witness of forgiveness! I apologized to the Pentecostal folks, knelt at the altar and God gloriously baptized me into the Holy Spirit. Soon I was speaking a language I had not learned. Beloved, God had taken me another step "Beyond Modernism." Hallejulah!

Truly there is a "beyond" here and now, not only for every Modernist who will humble himself and begin at Calvary, but also for every soul in the conventional church who wishes to have fulfilled in him that blessed promise of the Lord Jesus Christ: "Ye shall re-

ceive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." Acts 1:8.

transgressed against the Lord thy God . . . and ye have not obeyed my voice, saith the Lord. Turn, O backsliding children, saith the Lord; for I am married unto you." Jer. 3:11-14. Married unto you! Is there any closer relationship than that of marriage? He bids thee come home to Himself.

It is written of the Son of God, "Having loved his own . . . he loved them unto the end." "But, Lord," you say, "look at their thousand failings, their continuous unbelief. Don't you remember that night when they came to you, when you were tired and asleep in the boat, and rebuked you saying, 'Carest thou not that we perish?' Don't you remember how Peter rebuked you when you told about the cross that was ahead, saying, 'This be far from thee, Lord.' Have you not seen their constant disputes as to who would be first? Don't you remember when you asked them to pray with you for an hour, they all went to sleep? And at the most critical hour they all forsook you and fled. And Peter, who seems to be the foremost among them, even denied you with curses. How can you possibly love such a crowd?"

But, risen from the dead, He gave the angel a message to deliver: "Go your way, tell his disciples (He still calls them disciples despite the fact that they had forsaken Him) and Peter (who thrice denied Him) that he goeth before you into Galilee." And when He left them He blessed them, commissioning them at that time to preach His Word, and He

said: "Lo, I am with you (despite all your failings and frailties) alway, even unto the end."

Look at that Pharisee, breathing out threatenings and cruelty against the saints. He has been largely responsible for the death and martyrdom of the holy Stephen. And now he is on his way to Damascus to destroy some of the saints there. Surely there is no hope for such! But He that "delighteth in mercy" has grace and forgiveness even for the "chief of sinners." And this one who gave himself that title, testifies of His grace saying concerning Him, "who loved me (despite all my waywardness and sin), and gave himself for me (showing His personal love for such an unloveable one)." And it is this "chief of sinners" who puts the question, "Who can separate us from the love of Christ?'

Let us have an interview with a fish. "Little herring, are you satisfied with the limitations of your lot?" "Limitations! The vast Atlantic and the huge Pacific are my home, and beyond that I have tens of thousands of square miles of the Indian, Arctic and Antarctic oceans. I do not desire to come into the world of which you boast, for the seas are the element in which I live. Were I to attempt to come and live for one minute in your vain world, it would prove my death, for that is not my element. I am quite content with the vastness of the oceans in which I live. They are enough."

Little saints, the Lord bids you, "Keep yourselves in the love of God." Does that limit you? Are the oceans of His love not sufficient? That is the element in which you alone can live and thrive. If any who have been begotten of Him whose name is Love, seek to live in this present evil world which is at enmity against Him, it will bring them death. This vain world with all its corruption and sin is not the element of the twiceborn soul, who is admonished in the Word to "keep himself unspotted from the world." Said the Apostle of love, "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death. . . . Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love."

"Let us endeavor to commence every enterprise with a pure view to the glory of God, continue it without distraction, and finish it without impatience."

"... and with Fire"

In their records of the striking prophecy of John the Baptist concerning the mighty One coming after him, who was to baptize in the Holy Spirit, it is remarkable that Matthew and Luke both add the words "and with fire."

Many and various have been the testimonies to personal experiences on the line of this "fire"; and equally diverse have been the attempts to build up a doctrine around it.

Some have even taught that there is a separate "baptism with fire," subsequent to the baptism with the Holy Spirit. This we unhesitatingly reject as a doctrine, even though we may accept some isolated personal testimonies. We feel that these passages plainly and simply refer to two features of one identical experience. There is no record in the New Testament of disciples ever receiving any such "baptism of fire" subsequent to Pentecost, or distinct from the various occasions recorded of the gift of the Spirit. It was on the Day of Pentecost that "cloven tongues like as of fire sat upon each of them," and that experience was simultaneous with the descent of the Spirit. We shall always look with justifiable suspicion upon any doctrine of an essential crisis in a believer's experience after the baptism with the Holy Spirit. Some have gone astray into all sorts of dangerous pathways on that line.

Our good brethren in various sections of the Holiness Movement (God bless them!), have also taught a doctrine of a sanctifying fire connected with these words, and bring us their own peculiar doctrine of a "purifying baptism." Once again, and much more heartily this time, we can gladly accept individual testimonies, even though we reject what we certainly consider to be an unScriptural doctrine. We have no contention whatever with "purifying fire," and earnestly desire, with Wesley, that refining fire may go through our hearts and purify our souls. Our only disagreement is with confusing this with the Baptism with the Holy Spirit. There is no suggestion whatever in Acts 2 that the Pentecostal Baptism purified the waiting believers; on the contrary our Lord has plainly said to them *before* Pentecost "Now are ye clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." John 15:3. Christ never taught that the purpose of the Promise of the Father was to purify His disciples; but He did make it perfectly plain that the divine purpose was to give

them power to become His witnesses. Acts 1:8. The hearts of Cornelius and his company were purified by faith in the Lord Jesus, and the gift of the Holy Spirit was God's witness to an accomplished fact, not God's method of accomplishing it. Acts 15:8-9.

The question now remains, however, what was the "Fire" that should accompany the Baptism with the Holy Spirit? And what is it?

If any passage can supply a Scriptural answer it must certainly be Acts 2. Fire did literally appear in the Upper Room, and the prophecy "and with Fire" was fulfilled then—or never. An examination of that glorious chapter seems to us to make it clear that the "fire" which ac-companied the outpoured Spirit was the prophetic fire. Peter affirmed that Pentecost fulfilled Joel's prophecy, and the predominant manifestation of the Spirit therein predicted was that "they shall prophesy." They did prophesy in that Upper Room, though the age-long miracle of inspired utterance then took the form of speaking with "other tongues," as God's new sign for a new dispensation. But the inspiring Spirit (verse 4) was identical with Him who gave the inward fire to the former prophets, and caused Jeremiah to say "His word was in mine

The leading of the Spirit is not arbitrary; but is suggestive. Unless we are sensitive to this we are not sure of God's will. He does not MAKE us do things but ENABLES us to do them.

The things of God are foolishness to the natural man. God has His particular purpose behind every manifestation that He performs. The proof of the manifestation is the fruit which it bears. Our walk proves our experience. heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones." Jer. 20:9.

It was the fire of inspiration. Now the great result of receiving the prophetic fire was that it filled the recipient with God's message. God's prophets were always essentially the Lord's messengers with the Lord's message (Hag. 1:13); and such a message is a burning thing, glowing with heavenly fire, whether in love or anger, pity or contempt, comfort or courage. Peter was filled with just such fire when he preached on the Day of Pentecost, and the same latent fire was burning in the hearts of the eleven who stood with him. He was at that hour supremely a man with a message. He was inspired. His soul was ablaze with it. He had been baptized with the Holy Ghost and with fire.

They became, as promised, witnesses to Christ. The essence of Peter's burning Pentecostal so-called sermon is all contained in its climax—"God hath made that same Jesus whom ye have crucified both Lord and Christ." All the others who on the Day of Pentecost, and on subsequent occasions, received the promised Baptism also became burning witnesses to a crucified, risen, and exalted Saviour. Their witness was always Personal; it was about the Lord Jesus Christ. They possessed undoubting convictions about Him, and found themselves constrained by an ever deepening love for Him. Out of this came the irresistible urge to speak to others about Him, and to "preach the gospel to every creature." The deepest motive was a passionate faith, hope and love centered in Jesus as both Lord and Christ. We believe that our doctrine of the Baptism with the Holy Ghost and fire does not fully arrive at the revelation of Scripture even when it emphasizes producing a passion for souls; its first-fruit has to do with our attitude of heart and mind towards Christ Himself. All else should come from that.

What shall we say to these things? "The fire shall ever be burning upon the altar, it shall never go out." A so-called Pentecostal testimony, whether individual or collective, that loses the fire is no Pentecostal testimony at all. The sacred flame lit at the Pentecostal altar must never be confused with mere great zeal in service; it is the heavenly fire of divine inspiration continually fed by beholding the Lamb of God. A baptism with the Holy Spirit without expression through inspired utterance is not the baptism spoken about in Matthew and Luke: and a Pentecostal testimony that ceases to experience the inward fire of prophecy is not "that which was spoken by the prophet Joel." We preach a Christ who baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with fire.

TELEPHONES AND BIBLE LANDS

RECORD SALE OF BIBLES

The British and Foreign Bible Society announce record sales of the Bible for this year. "The most striking advance," said a member of the staff "appears to be in countries where there is the greatest unrest."

HEBREW MUSEUM

Palestine Post reports that a wealthy Jew has left a fund "for the purpose of founding or contributing to the Hebrew section of an Archaeological Museum of the Hebrew University for the collection of Hebrew records, relics and all matters and things of Hebrew origin and interest."

"THOU SHALT NOT KILL."

According to a writer in the Living Church, Every year in the United States there are an average of 11,000 homicides, 23,000 suicides, 36,000 autocides, 4,000 maternal deaths through abortions, and 700,000 aborted lives. All this is achieved despite the law of the state as well as the commandment of God.

BIBLE HISTORY ACCURATE

According to Dawn, Prof. John Garstang, of the Institute of Archæology of the University of Liverpool, said at a dinner given in his honor in New York that recent excavations in Palestine have proved that there is not a flaw in the Biblical narrative of the campaigns of Joshua, and that they can now be traced with absolute topographical accuracy.

OIL AND PROPHECY

Mr. Naish, well known writer on prophetic subjects, makes the following statement: "We read in Hosea 12:1, 'They do make a covenant with the Assyrians, and oil is carried into Egypt.' Or, as it is literally, 'oil is caused to flow into Egypt.' The oil is forced by pumps through the pipes, and thus is exactly 'caused to flow.' Whilst Kirkuk, the source of the oil, is in the ancient country of Assyria, now called Iraq, and by arrangement or covenant with the King of Iraq, the oil is caused to flow across the Holy Land, and delivered to Egypt and many other lands."

LOTTERIES

"The news reports that Mrs. Oliver Harriman, Chairman of the National Conference on Legalizing Lotteries, is advocating that lotteries should be conducted for hospitals, charities, and other movements and institutions receiving voluntary aid, under strict governmental supervision," reports *Religious Digest*. "These 'other movements' undoubtedly would include the church and the Christian colleges.

"Bert H. Davis tells in *Advance* of his conversation with a lawyer who said that 'some lottery plan is bound to come, and I believe the realistic type of church member could well throw his weight with the plan of Mrs. Harriman's committee."

It is evident that the devil is attempting to sugar-coat the gambling spirit and make it legal and respectable.

THE GATHERING OF THE DISPERSED

Of a total of 171,000 Jewish immigrants into various countries during the past three years, 136,000 went to Palestine and 35,000 to other countries. During 1933, 32,000 went to Palestine and 10,000 to other countries principally Canada, America, South Africa and South America. In 1934, Palestine absorbed 42,500 Jewish immigrants and other countries 13,000. The 1935 figure for Palestine rose to 61,500, with under 12,000 to other countries.

A VAIN HOPE

Mr. Eden, young foreign secretary, tells England modern conditions are "dreadfully" like conditions before 1914. England must arm herself to the teeth and have, for final objective, "a world-wide system of collective security which embraces all nations in an authority which is unchallenged and unchallengeable." That final objective mentioned by Eden can only be brought about by God. Arthur Brisbane rightly observes: "That might be done by two or three countries closely united, although the airplane makes everything in war uncertain. It might destroy a capital city, and an alliance in one morning, as a pistol destroys the strongest man."



Please explain Deut. 32:29, 30.

Briefly, God is warning Israel against the folly of backsliding in verse 29. In verse 30 He shows that the gods of the heathen (spoken of as "their Rock") were feeble, otherwise two could not put ten thousand to flight. In verse 31 He shows that Israel's God (likened to "our Rock") is not the feeble deity that is worshiped by the heathen, "even our enemies themselves being judges," or acknowledging this to be so. See also verses 15-18.

Ought one without the Baptism with the Spirit be used as a Sunday School teacher when there are those who have the Baptism who could teach?

It is well for all Sunday School teachers to have the Baptism. We ought not, however, to ignore ability. In Sunday School work ability to teach is very important. No one ought to teach who is not in sympathy with our Pentecostal message.

Does God honor and prosper unsaved people who pay tithes?

This I cannot definitely answer, but I give my opinion. My mother always taught me that God would bless and prosper those who paid tithes. I did not begin to pay tithes, however, until I got under conviction, but my business dealings from that time on would warrant my believing that God honored and prospered me. Also I received much blessing in my heart as I did so, although not yet saved. If, however, the purpose of paying tithes were entirely selfish I doubt that God would bless it.—E. S. W.

Karl Barth, one of the world's leading theologians, recently issued a manifesto smuggled into the German churches and published in Latin, in which he says, "Christ as the Holy Scripture bears witness is the One Word of God, whom we hear, in whom we trust and confide in life and in death. HATRED OF THE JEW

The shadows of "Jacob's trouble" are rapidly spreading over the world. Writes Donald G. Barnhouse in *Revelation:* "Indications of growth of anti-Semitism in the United States are more apparent each month to the careful observer. The Editor has had placed in his hands a copy of a confidential report sent out by one of the great business survey agencies of Washington. This is not only filled with anti-Semitism, but gives confidential information of the formation of an anti-Semitic movement in the United States."

HIDDEN WEALTH IN THE HOLY LAND

"In Trans-Jordania is the country that lies to the east of Jordan and which was occupied by Reuben and the half tribe of Manasseh," says a writer in Revelation. "It is under the Palestine administration, but is a native Arab state. It is included in the portion of the land that is promised by God to Israel. YAKO DISTRICT CONVENTION Harold and Margaret Jones, F. W. Africa

The Yako District Convention opened Sunday morning with the power of God felt in every song, every testimony and every word. The heart cry of all present seemed to be:

"Spirit of the living God, breathe now on me; Melt me, mold me, break me, make me! Spirit of the living God, breathe now on me."

Many were present who had never attended a large Christian gathering before, but God's Holy Spirit, which deals with human hearts identically the world around, had so breathed upon them and transformed them that they were truly one of us.

Bible study on the deeper life was given every morning, and teaching on the Holy Spirit in the afternoon. The evening services were evangelistic with different native evangelists in charge.

At the close of the convention we had a precious Communion service. Realizing that the enemy is doing much these days to foster criticism, petty misunderstandings and

differences in the church in order to hinder its power, we prayed much before entering into this service. And "It's just like Jesus to roll the clouds away" for down from heaven came a regular avalanche of confession and blessing. For two hours men, women, and children poured out of their hearts to God in confession of sin, and made apologies for wrongs. As we then partook of His body and blood we experienced the joy of oneness with Him.

The slogan of our convention was "Forward." As hindrances were cleared away God began to speak to the natives, enlarging their vision, showing them just what their duties as soldiers consisted of.

Feeling that they had not been as diligent as they might have been in taking the gospel to the unevangelized territories in this section, the church took up an offering for two volunteer evangelists, thus enabling them to stay in the bush for one month and preach the Word where it has never before been heard. They expect to send two others each succeeding month until the rains start. We praise God for this vision which He has given them, for we know without a vision the people will perish but as they constantly think of others their church will grow.

The native church decided to look after their own food during the convention, and not ask the missionaries on the station to provide food for all; so everyone attending was asked to bring millet flour to last for seven days. Many of the children who attended could not get permission from their unconverted fathers to bring any flour so there was a shortage. When the flour was apportioned to those present, it was found that our convention could last only three days. Believing that God would supply the need if it was His will for us to be together

for a longer period, we opened the convention. Without a word being said God spoke to some the second day and they sent for more grain, enabling us to add another day and a half.

All who attended the convention testified that they had been with Jesus. Between services, far into the night, sometimes all night and early in the morning the cry of hungry hearts, poured out to God in prayer, could be heard from the church. We say in Mossi, "Come closer to God and He will come closer to you." If our native church continues to have the spirit of prayer, we know they can't fail or fall. Oh, that nothing will ever come between them and their Saviour, and may they ever push forward for Christ and His kingdom!



What Is Bolshevism?

Who Is to Blame for Bolshevism?

N. J. Poysti, Redondo Beach, California



The Greek Catholic priests affirm that the liberal movements in Russia had their source in the Masonic lodge, and they insist that all liberal reforms in Russia were forerunners of Bolshevism. They are so conservative that they even think that it was a great evil done by Czar Alexander II, when he liberated the Russian peasants. They say that all Evangelical bodies in Russia are supported by Masons from England. For instance, they think there was great evil done by the British Bible Society, when they opened their branch in Russia, and that the translation of the Bible into the common Russian language was one of the evils done by Masons. Greek Catholic priests were satisfied that the Russian Bible should be kept in the old Slavonian language, which people who are without a proper education cannot really understand.

The Russian priests insist that all sectarian movements in Russia were also prompted by Masonic lodges from England. The foundation of the theory was this: they explain that England has an old hate towards Russia, and that it is the British policy to destroy Russia. In their propaganda they are trying to create also a bitter spirit against America, explaining that the American flag is a Masonic flag, and other foolish things. The reason for this is that they know that American people are still very active in missionary work,

even among the Russians. In this way they associate the Evangelical movements with Bolshevism, carefully keeping secret the fact that in Russia more of the Greek Catholic churches are open than Evangelicals.

Even Sherwood Eddy, in his book, "The Challenge of Russia," on page 172 says: "In the beginning the Soviet authorities were hostile to the Orthodox Church (that means Greek Catholic Church) and relatively lenient to the sects, who like themselves had been persecuted under the Czarist regime. The growth and success of the sects has made them reverse this attitude. The majority of the Greek Catholic churches, both in the cities and in the villages, are still open and regularly conduct services as they have ever since the revolution. But most of the sectarian places of worship have been closed." But the Greek Catholic priests outside of Russia now state that the sects have liberty in Russia, while their churches are closed.

Let us take a look into the Russian Greek Catholic church and its religion. The Russian priests are teaching the legend that the Apostle Andrew reached the place where now stands the city of Kieff, the capital of Ukrania, and there on one of the hills of that place he put a cross of huge size. They are explaining to the ignorant people, that that was the real origin of the Greek Catholic Church. Church history gives us the true story of the origin of this Church. The Russian Czar Vladimir was converted to this faith in 988 A. D. and compelled all his subjects to be baptized in this faith in the River Dnieper. In this way the Greek Catholic Church became the State Church of Russia.

At the beginning the Russian Greek Catholic Church was subject to the Patriarch of Constantinople, and later they elected their own. In this way the Greek Catholic Church in Russia became independent. In 1702 Peter the Great abolished the system of Patriarchs, and declared himself the head of this church. When the last Czar, Nicholas II, was dethroned, the patriarch system was restored. The former Russian Empire was divided into 66 bishoprics, which were under three metropolitans, 14 archbishops, and 50 bishops. The monasteries numbered 942 in the year 1909, including 418 nunneries, with about 8600 monks and 10,000 nuns.

We give a little idea about the history, life, and teaching of the Russian Greek Catholic Church, that readers may more intelligently pray for the Russian people. There are two extreme conceptions that are prevailing about Russians among Christian people. One is that the Russians are well informed in the gospel teaching through their former State Church, and that they are not in need of missionaries. The second opinion prevails among many that after the Bolshevik revolution, Russia was punished by God for all her past sins, and there is no more hope for these people to be evangelized. The aim of the writing of these articles is to remind God's people that,

"now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2) even for Russia!

The main point of the heresy of the Greek Catholic Church is that she teaches that salvation is obtainable by human merits; that Christ died for so-called original sin only, and not for all sins, and even salvation by works can not be reached outside the Greek Church, but only in her, and

through her.

Realizing that it is very hard to cover by good works all actual sins of their unregenerate members, the Church had a teaching that the saints can help the sinners. Every true Greek Catholic has his own patron saint, whose name he bears. This saint is always pleading before God in behalf of his continually sinning subject, providing the candle is put before the picture or icon of this saint. The virgin Mary is called by the Church, God's mother, and is an object of much worship, adoration, and prayer. She is regarded as the queen of heaven and special protector of Greek Catholics. (Note God's warning against this idolatry in Jer. 44:17-27.) She is always pleading with her Son, that He should be merciful to the sins of the violators.

The Greek Catholic Church believes in seven sacraments: first, baptism; second, the chrism or baptismal unction; third, the eucharist; fourth, confession; fifth, ordination; sixth, marriage; and seventh, the holy oil or extreme unction. The Russian Church has the black and white clergy. The white clergy are the parish priests. They must be married. They have not so bright an outlook for the future, because the authority of the Church is chiefly in the hands

of the black clergy, that is the monks. These black clergy can advance to be bishop, archbishop, metropolitan, etc. They cannot be married.

The language of the Greek Catholic Church is the old Slavonian tongue. The service books are in this tongue, which is the really ancient language of this country, and it differs so much from the present day Russian language, that for the greater part of the Russian congregation, it is just an unknown tongue.

The outward forms are insisted upon in the Greek Catholic Church. Strict observances of feasts and fasts, the careful wearing of vestments and the way they use the sign of the cross. They emphasize very much the worship of icons, or holy pictures. Some of these icons, Russians believe, have miraculous healing power, etc.

In the cities of Kieff, Nishni-Novgorod, Moscow, and other cities, they had hundreds and hundreds of relics of the bodies of departed saints. The clergy taught the peo-

ple that their bodies are not corruptible, and that they also have some miraculous power.

What is the source of all these false teachings of this church? The rejection of the all-sufficiency of the Bible. Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church: Question 10. "Is it sufficient to believe only what is contained in the Holy Scriptures?" "No, we must also believe Tradition." Question 13. "What, then, must a Christian believe?" "A Christian must believe all that God has revealed and the Catholic Church teaches as such, whether it is contained in the Holy Scripture or not. Always firmly believe in the teaching of the Holy Catholic Church, for, believing in her teachings, you believe in the Word of God."

The liturgy, or service of the Greek Catholic Church, is very polished. The church buildings inside are beautified by "holy pictures," usually painted by great artists. The priests sing all the service through, and must have good voices. Choir songs in Russian churches are exceptional. There is very little preaching. The liturgical part of the service takes two or sometimes three hours, but if the priest wants to say something at the end of the service his talk should not occupy more than ten minutes. The people stand all through the services. There are no benches in the Greek Catholic Church.

The lives of the priests of the Greek Catholic Church are absolutely contrary to the teachings of Christ. Most of the priests use much Russian vodka, brandy, tobacco, and most of them have no religion in their hearts, just form. At Easter time, when the priests go from house to house, at every house they visit they are offered brandy. In the evening the Russian people could see their "spiritual shepherds" wretchedly drunk.

Some of the Russian writers, like Leo Tolstoy, began to oppose in their writings the teachings of the Church. Liberal literature of that sort opened the eyes of the Russians, and they began to see the real state of things in the Greek Catholic Church. Many Russians began to read the Bible, and found that the teachings of the Greek Catholic Church contradicted the teachings of the Bible. Russians began to suspect all the miracles, icons, and relics of incorruptible bodies of saints, but in the Czar's time nobody had the right to examine all these relics. At the time of Bolshevik revolution these relics of bodies were exposed to the people. They were made of wax and filled with sawdust!

When the Russians discovered that their official religion was full of fraud, they turned in their blindness not only against the priests, but also against God, and against His Christ. But who is really responsible for this awful anti-religious movement in Russia? Are not the priests themselves?

It was the Pharisees whom Jesus warned

of the sin against the Holy Ghost. It was to the Pharisees that Jesus said: "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against man: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in. . . . Woe unto you, ye blind guides." Matt. 23:13, 16. Dr. Strong, in his Systematic Theology, says that the greatest sinners of the present day may be found in Christendom, not in heathendom. Satan was an arch angel; Judas was an Apostle; Alexander Borgia was a pope.

The masses of Russian people who have now turned their hearts against God are entirely ignorant of the real teaching of the gospel. The priests had the New Testament and instead of explaining and reading in the common Russian language, they sang quotations from the New Testament in their services in an old Slavonian language, which people could not understand. Whom shall we blame? It is clear that there are sins of ignorance and sins of knowledge, and the last ones are the worst. When we know the will of God and do not do it, we may expect the judgment that came to the cities that rejected Christ's message; "It shall be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment, than for that city." Matt. 10:15. "That servant, which knew his Lord's will . . . shall be beaten with many stripes. But he that knew not . . . shall be beaten with few stripes." Luke 12:47, 48. "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." Luke 23:34. "He that delivered me unto thee hath the greater sin." John 19:11. "For as many as have sinned without law shall perish without law: and as many as have sinned in the law shall be judged by the law." Rom. 2:12. "I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief." Tim. 1:13-16.

When Evangelicals tried to spread the gospel among the masses of Russian people, they were falsely accused by the priests in the Czar's time, as Nihilists, and Socialists. I believe that if all these Bolshevik leaders should, in the right time, hear the gospel and accept it, they would put all their ability in the evangelization of their country; and the knowledge of God would be spread in Russia from North to South, from East to West.

Still the door is open to the thousands and thousands of hearts of Russian people, outside of Russia in the Far East, and Eastern Europe. We who know the will of our Master, shall we answer the call, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel," or shall we do as the Greek Catholic priests have done, know the will of our Lord, and not do it? The Lord is not partial! The heavy condemnation can also cover us, because "not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom

The Sunday School Tesson

JESUS INVITES ALL PEOPLE

Lesson for April 5. Lesson Text: Luke, chapter 14.

One Sabbath day Jesus was a dinner guest in a Pharisee's home where there was a poor victim of dropsy. His critics watched Him to see whether He would commit what was an awful sin in their sight—the breaking of the Sabbath by healing the poor fellow on that day. Despite their views on Sabbath keeping Jesus did not fail to perform this act of mercy. Many think a good deal more of the Sabbath than they do of the Saviour. The Sabbath was just a shadow, but Christ is the Substance. Do not miss the Substance and become a shadow chaser.

I. AN INVITATION

The Kingdom. A guest at this meal made the remark, "Blessed is he that shall eat bread in the kingdom of God." Isaiah foretold, "And in this mountain (and we know from Dan. 2:35, 44 that the mountain is just a symbol of the kingdom) shall the Lord of hosts make unto all people a feast of fat things." Isa. 25:6. The Jews were looking for an earthly kingdom but Jesus was constantly speaking of a heavenly. All through Matthew's Gospel, especially written for the Jews, you find the expression "the kingdom of heaven." When Pilate asked Jesus whether He was a king He declared, "My kingdom is not of this world." His is a heavenly kingdom. All born-again ones have been already "translated into the kingdom of God's dear Son," but they constantly pray, "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven." The God of heaven will in His own time set up a kingdom on earth that shall stand for ever (Dan. 2:44), and there shall be days of heaven upon earth. Deut. 11:21.

"For Every Man." Heb. 2:9. "A certain man made a great supper, and bade many." The gospel invitation is for all—for the "many" and not for the few. 1 Tim. 2:4 shows the gospel is for "all men." People in an assembly in my native town were very strong on the doctrine of "election." So they preached the gospel with careful reservations, for they were always much afraid lest a very terrible thing might happen in their midst, that some not "elect" might get saved. Their fears, however, were unnecessary, for no one ever got converted by their preaching. Thank God for the "whosoever will" gospel for the many. The "non-elects" are the "whosoever won'ts."

"Come." Not only were invitations given, but at the time of the supper a servant was sent to those bidden to say, "Come; for all things are now ready." When God made Adam, the garden was ready for him. When He bade Noah go into the ark, all was ready. When Jacob was invited down to Egypt, Joseph had all things ready for him. When Christ bade His hungry disciples "Come and dine," He had His coals of fire, His bread, and His fish all prepared for

them. He has a mercy seat all ready to which He bids us come and receive help in every time of need. He who bids the weary and heavy laden to come into Him and rest, has His great salvation all ready to give. Accept it TODAY.

II. AN INSULT

Real Estate. Says Arthur Brisbane, "Buy a piece of real estate in a good town; keep it for a few years, and after that it will keep you." But take warning, it may keep you-from the kingdom. His "piece of land" kept this guest from the supper. At least, that was his excuse. Men get their hearts so set on their great possessions that they have no room in them for Christ. Nehemiah sets us a good example. At the time when the Jews were returning from captivity and there was doubtless a boom in real estate, he says: "Neither bought we any land." Neh. 5:16. "But," you protest, "the prophet Jeremiah did buy some real estate." he did, and it was at the instructions of Jehovah at the time when Judah was being carried into captivity, when every one must have thought him crazy in making a real estate investment. It was to be a sign of what would take place when the Lord restored the captivity. The worldling may go crazy about real estate speculation, but the saint should be more concerned with having an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled, that fadeth not away, reserved IN HEAVEN for him.

Business. The second begged to be excused because he had to try out some oxen he had purchased. "My business occupies all my time," some are saying. Said Spurgeon, "I do not find my friends in the street half dressed; and surely if they have time to dress the body, there is time to put on the robe of righteousness and array the soul." It takes but a moment to lay hold of eternal life, but men refuse God even that

Marriage. The third excuse was, "I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come." Why shouldn't he bring his wife along with him? Alas, many are barred from the kingdom by becoming unequally yoked together with the ungodly. They first become lukewarm, then indifferent, and then drift away entirely from the things of God. Oh, the appalling calamities on every hand caused by disobedience to God's Word, "Be not unequally yoked together with unbelievers." Alas, many in choosing an unbelieving wife or an unbelieving husband have put Christ right out of their lives by so doing.

III. AN INGATHERING

Calling Others. Refusing the hospitality offered was an insult to the one who had graciously sent out the invitation. But he purposed that what he had so bountifully prepared should be enjoyed by some, and so his servant was instructed, "Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the maimed, and the halt, and the blind." Christ's mes-

sage was to all Israel. The rich and covetous rejected it, but the poor heard the gospel gladly. The maimed, and the halt, and the blind also received the benefits of His wonderful ministry. Mary's song is ever being fulfilled, "He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away."

The Regions Beyond. The servant gathered in all the down-and-outs from the streets and lanes and then reported, "Yet there is room." Praise God, there is always plenty of room at the heavenly banqueting table. The master then commissioned the servant to go out into the highways and hedges, and compel those he met to come in, that his house might be filled. Our Lord Jesus commissions us to get the gospel message out to all nations, for there must be men of every kindred, tongue, people, and nation at the great marriage supper He is preparing. "Compel." Said a sinner in a hospital who had been in an accident, "Nurse, reach in my pocket and you will find a tract that I would like to read. I did not want it, but that tract distributer made me take it." Said a missionary to the writer, "I simply will not let folks go until they have pressed right through into the kingdom."

"No Second Chance." Note the solemn word to those who made excuses: "None of those . . . shall taste of my supper." The invitation is now going out to "every one that thirsteth" to come and partake of God's best, without money and without price. Men are making excuses, but God declares that because He was called and men have refused, the day will come when they shall "call upon Me, but I will not answer; they shall seek Me early, but they shall not find me." Prov. 1:28. If you turn your back on God in time, you will find His back turned towards you throughout an endless eternity.—S. H. F.
