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# "The Trend Toward Armageddon"

Three international volcanoes on the surface of this trembling old world are showing alarming symptoms of imminent eruption, thus spewing their lava of destructive international war and death over mankind. The three danger zones are:

1. The Far Eastern Situation. Japan's new invasion of China, the Chinese determination to resist by force of arms; the attitude of Russia toward this new Japanese policy of aggression, and even the concern of the United States and Britain, who are both sending war ships toward this zone of trouble.

2. The Near Eastern Situation. The bitter internal conflict now going on in Palestine, between the Moslems or Arabs, and the Jews. A virtual state of war exists, Britain is sending 8000 new troops into Palestine, also sending several warships into the Mediterranean, preparing for the inevitable. Britain in the persons of Stanley Baldwin and Anthony Eden, is openly charging Italy and Mussolini with the responsibility for this threat. Mussolini positively desires Palestine, as part of his Roman Empire. The Vatican wishes to see him obtain it. Many influential Jews prefer to see Mussolini hold the Palestinian mandate, rather than England. England, this past week has directly blamed Mussolini for the Palestinian and near Eastern unrest. She claims that by radio propaganda, and by directly paying armed men fifteen dollars per day to incite the Arab to insurrection, Italy is attempting to seriously embarrass Great Britain, causing her the possible loss of territory and control of the Near East. Britain further charges Italy with the responsibility of the Egyptian revolution and that Italy, having grasped Ethiopia, will not be content until she has annexed Egypt. Two weeks ago Stanley Baldwin openly warned Italy that it would mean war if one further hostile move were made on the Egyptian frontier, where British and Italian troops are facing each other. Britain further blames Italy as being the cause of the unrest in India, via the channel of radio propaganda and secret agents. In fact, all through the near East and far East, the Mohammedans seem to be united in open resentment against Britain's rule and influence. There is wide spread unrest, threatening to burst into open warfare, against Britain through most of the Arabian Moslem territory. England directly blames Italy for this. To verify these statements consult "Time" issues

of June 1st and 8th, also *Literary Digest* issue of June 6.

3. The third danger zone is the tense situation in Europe. The growing hostility between Germany and France. The virtual break up of the League of Nations, which is one of the things Mussolini set out to do when he warred on Ethiopia. He knew the League would not dare to impose the only kind of sanction that would cripple Italy, namely an oil sanction. He has successfully separated Britain and France, he has disorganized the League of Nations, so that he can realize the further expansion of his Roman Empire by making his next move among the Balkan nations, uniting five or six nations into one state over which he will have the protectorate. Veteran commentators on European affairs declare this is his next step and that when he has realized it he will no longer be called Dictator but "EMPER-OR !" See the American Review of Reviews, issue of March-April 1936 to verify this. Thus on the African and European-Balkan sides of the Mediterranean, we see the old Roman Empire rapidly shaping up.

How this should thrill the heart of the Christian, who obeys Christ's exhortation and studies "The Signs of the Times." Matt. 16:1-3. For as we see the Roman Empire assuming its end-time shape, we recall Daniel's prophecy: "In the days of these kings (the revived Roman Empire) shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed." Dan. 2:44. Thus the more positive the form the Roman Empire assumes, the more positive can the Christian be that "the coming of the Lord draweth nigh." Hallelujah!

Any one of these three mentioned danger spots, could be used by the prince of this world, Satan, as the spark, which could start the Armageddon conflagration, the premise which the writer wishes to establish is this-the battle of Armageddon will not take place until the end of the Tribulation time. The Tribulation will last for a period of years. But remember Armageddon will be only one battle, the final one, in a prolonged world war. Remember also that the last world war lasted four years. Thus, it may be possible to see in this present threat of world war, the development of world conflict which will lead on to Armageddon. The Battle of Armageddon will be ended supernaturallyby the literal, physical, personal appear-ance of Jesus Christ from heaven. Is

this His appearance in the Rapture? No, positively no. Zechariah mentions and so does John that when Christ comes to end Armageddon's slaughter, "the Lord my God shall come, and all the saints with thee." If the saints here come "with" the Lord, "out of heavens" as visioned by John, then it logically follows that He must have secretly come "for" them sometime previously. The great majority of Spirit-filled saints believe that He shall come "for" his saints, before the Tribulation is allowed to break over the earth. Zech. 14:1-5; Rev. 19:11-21.

"When these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh." "Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man." Luke 21:28, 36. Therefore, if we determine that the nations are trending toward another world conflict, toward Armageddon, and every states-man and world leader believes this to be inevitable, if Armageddon is looming over Time's horizon when the Lord shall come with His saints, then how imminent, how very near-must His com-ing be for His saints, who have His promise that they shall escape all these things that shall come to pass, escape them, not by being preserved from them on the earth, but "to stand before the Son of Man" where Stephen saw Him standing, in heaven! Surely the next great event may be the Rapture! God make us ready!

Armageddon is an actual locality in Palestine. "He gathered them together *into a place* called in the Hebrew tongue, Armageddon (Mount of Slaughter)."

Read carefully Rev. 16:12-16, we shall use it as the basis for our study of Armageddon. Also read Zech. 14:1-7. Notice Jerusalem, and the mount of Olives are specifically mentioned. Also Joel 3:2, "The valley of Jehoshaphat," part of the environs of Jerusalem. Old Testament students will recall that Gideon fought a battle on the plains of Megiddo or Armageddon. Also the Maccabees in resisting the Grecian conquests of Palestine fought the invaders on this territory. The great Napoleon, at the time of his march through Egypt, visited the Holy Land and, surveying the plains of Megiddo or Armageddon from the heights of Mt. Carmel, ex-claimed, "What an ideal site for a great battle!" If the reader will look at a flat map or projection of the Eastern Hemisphere, he will note that Palestine is in the very center, connecting the continents, of Europe, Asia, and Africa. What a strategic position this is.

It commands the Mediterranean. It links three great continents. Across this

narrow neck of land (the Arabian peninsula, including Palestine) a European emperor, could entrench his troops and check an invasion from Asia or Africa. Such internationally known writers as F. Britten Austin, and Lathrop Stoddard in The Rising Tide of Color, etc., warn us that Europe must be prepared for just such an invasion. Jan Smuts, of South Africa, recognized as one of the world's ablest statesmen, also warned, that the seizure of Ethiopia from the helpless black man, by an arrogant white nation will provoke a racial war inevit-ably, in which the brown, black, and yellow races will unite against the European white man. Austin and Stoddard draw pictures for us in which they de-pict China's 450,000,000 yellow men, India's 360,000,000 brown men, Africa's 110,000,000 black men, all possibly led and incited by Japan's 60,000,000 warlike yellow men-a mass of substantially a billion of the undertrod races of Asia and Africa, for years smarting under the yoke and the spoilation of the White man of Europe, rising en masse one of these days to throw off the yoke of the white man, invade his territory, and conquer him as did the Saracens of old.

Let no one laugh at this. It may happen, it may be one of the contributory factors to Armageddon. With this threat ever existing, do you see how strategically placed Palestine is? Whoever commands Palestine, can endeavor to effectually check the hordes from Asia and Africa, from flowing into Europe. Do you wonder that Mussolini is lusting for possession of it? He must have it to successfully protect his Roman Empire, once it is fully formed. That is why Palestine will be the scene of the Battle of Armageddon. It is no secret that the German Kaiser wanted Palestine had he won the war. He realized it was the key position to the Near East and Far East. To Africa, he intended to make it a great commercial and railroad center, running his railroads from Europe down into Asia via Palestine and the Arabian peninsula. He also realized that it would make a splendid maritime and aeronautical center, commanding the surrounding three continents. The reader is urged to read Hillaire Belloc's latest book entitled, The Battle Ground-Syria and Palestine, and he will appreciate in a new way how rapidly the nations are marching on toward Armageddon.

When will the Battle of Armageddon be fought? A reading of Zech. 14:4-5 and Rev. 16:15 clearly states it will be fought at the end of the Tribulation (the Day of the Lord, see Joel 2) just before the coming of the Lord out of heaven with His saints.

Will the United States be involved?

Scripture says, "The spirits of demons, working miracles shall go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world to gather them to the battle of the great day of God Almighty." Rev. 16:14. "I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle." Zech. 14:2. Yes, the United States will not escape. But the church of Jesus Christ everywhere, has the promise of escape. Luke 21:28 and 36; Rev. 3:10.

What seems to provoke the war? There is such a thing as a "war spirit." Read Rev. 16:13-14. "These are the spirits of demons, working miracles which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty." Before the last world war, many of the American clergy loudly clamored for peace. Once America was in the war they just as loudly clamored for the defeat of the enemy. The War Spirit had seized them. The same thing is re-occurring today! There is something distinctly demonic about the war spirit even as the Scriptures here state. In August of 1914 an American missionary within the Tibetan border was one day accosted by a group of heathen Tibetans, led by their medicine man. They surrounded the missionary and the medicine man began to advance upon the missionary, lunging at him with a knife, thrusting the weapon toward the missionary again and again, without hurting him. In effect he said these words as he continued his threatening motions, "Missionary, this is what your white brethren, the countries of the white men, are doing just now to one another. They are cutting and fighting one another, having declared war upon one another. We know this to be so, because all of our strongest spirits have left us here and gone to the countries of the white people to incite them to war.' It was not until many months later that news from the outside world reached this missionary informing him that the world war was being fought. What an illustration this is of the passage in Rev. 16:13-14.

Shall we name these three unclean demons? Shall one be called *race hatred?* As Smuts, Austin, and Stoddard point out, race war is threatening the world today. Then there is the race hatred as encouraged by Hitler in Germany boasting of the superiority of the Nordic race—persecuting the Jew. Then too, there is the terrible spirit of Anti-Semitism which is rearing its head in many parts of the world today, notably in Poland and Germany. Witness the fighting now going on among the Jews and Arabs in the Holy Land.

Shall we call the second war spirit *greed?* The spirit of commercial supremacy. The spirit that demands more ter-

ritory? The spirit that actuated Mussolini in seizing Ethiopia, Japan in seizing Manchuoko and now further Chinese territory, the spirit firing Germany today as she demands African colonial territory again? This spirit of greed will actuate the nations as they converge on Palestine for Armageddon. Read Ezek. 38:12-13. Palestine is a valuable land. The chemical riches, that are recoverable in the Dead Sea, for instance, would make her a coveted prize to any nation. Dr. Thos. H. Norton, technical editor of the New York magazine called, Chemicals estimates that the money value of the potash, bromine, salt, Gypsum Calcium choride, Magnesium choride, amounts to \$1,267,000,000,000.

As for the last of this evil trio of demons, that provoke war shall we call it the Spirit of Godlessness? Of rebelliousness against God and everything godly. The spirit of godlessness and the hatred for everything godly which possesses individuals today, also possesses nations. Witness Russia, and remember that Russia today influences with her Bolshevistic godless doctrines, fifty other nations, or countries according to A. C. Gabelein. A former Prime Minister of France, aptly quotes the attitude of the nations today that are possessed by this demon of godlessness, "We have driven Jesus Christ out of the army and navy. the schools and the hospitals, it only remains to drive Him out of the State altogether." Does this not make clear the meaning of Rev. 17:14? "These shall make war with the Lamb, but the Lamb shall overcome them." Overcome them as mentioned in Zech. 14:3-5 and Rev. 19:11-21. Overcome them when He comes with His saints, to end the Tribulation and terminate the Battle of Armageddon. The reader should also read Psalm 2 in the light of this thought. "Why do the heathen rage, and the people imagine a vain thing? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His anointed?" Brethren. the best preventive against being seized by the war spirit, is to keep filled with the Holy Spirit!

The symbolic drying up of "the great river Euphrates . . . that the way of the kings of the East might be prepared." Rev. 16:12 seems of startling significance to the writer in the light of the past fortnight's news comments on the Near and Far Eastern situation. "Time" comments on the "awakening of race consciousness among the Moslems throughout the East." In ancient days, the Euphrates River seemed to be a natural barrier which kept invading armies of the Far East from invading the Near East. Many such Far Eastern invasions, seemed to be turned back at

# In the House of the Interpreter

"Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth."

This text is slightly different in the Revised Version, viz., "Give diligence to present thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, handling aright the Word of Truth."

This morning we shall not concern ourselves with the first part of the text, although it is highly important that every workman labor so that he shall be approved or commended for the quality of his workmanship. Neither shall we concern ourselves with the second thought in the text, the unashamed workman, who does his task well and knows he does, and therefore is unashamed. But we shall concern ourselves with the latter part of the text, "Rightly dividing the Word of Truth," or, as the Revised Version puts it, "handling aright the Word of Truth."

Many Christians have quoted this text freely, as though in the very quoting of it, they may be able in some way to attain to the ideal—be good interpreters of the Word of Truth. But the quotation of this passage of Scripture freely does not guarantee that the one using it will be able to handle aright the Word of God. It takes much more than that.

To handle aright the Word of Truth, one must first become acquainted with the author. How can we in reality know the book without having first-hand acquaintance with the Author? And so, if we would know the message of the Bible, let us come to the Author thereof and let us pray, "Teach me Oh Lord, the way of thy statutes, Give me understanding and I shall keep thy law."

There is a book which is almost as familiar as the Bible itself, and that is Bunyan's Pilgrims Progress. You will recall that when Christian had really started on his journey to the City of Zion, the first place he visited was the House of the Interpreter. The Interpreter, of course, is the Holy Spirit, and if we are to know the message of the Bible and to handle it aright, we need the aid of the heavenly Interpreter, the precious Holy Spirit, who has promised to lead us into all truth.

Of course you have no other thought but that the Spirit of God is the Author of the Bible. In no other way can we explain the harmony of the whole, the clear testimony to righteousness which runs clear through from the beginning to the end. It is the marvel of the ages that a collection of sixty-six books could be written, by many different authors,

who lived in different ages, covering about 1600 years altogether, and yet the message of these united books be the same. There is no deviation from the truth found in one book in any of the other books, none whatever. All the sixty-six books contribute their part to the message of the whole. In no way can this be explained apart from the fact that back of all these authors is the Holy Spirit, who inspired men to write, as they were moved upon by the Holy Spirit.

And there is no book in all the world which has inspired the writing of so many other books. Here in Springfield at the Gospel Publishing House, we have a library, filled with books written about the Bible. And yet all these books are but a small fraction of the books which are in the world, written on this one subject. Bible commentaries, Bible dictionaries, Bible Encyclopædias, Bible Texts illustrated, prophetical, devotional, exegetical, analytical, etc., etc. Thousands upon thousands of them, and more coming off the press every day.

The Bible still is the best seller of all books. Publishing houses devote their entire output to the printing of the Bible, the New Testament, and Scripture portions. No other book in the world has such a distinction. The proof is overwhelming for the inspiration of the Scriptures, that the Holy Spirit is the author thereof, and therefore the only reliable interpreter of His own book

reliable interpreter of His own book. When the young Christian first approaches the Bible he finds much that he does not understand. He soon discovers that the Bible is divided into two portions, known as the Old and the New Testament. Then he discovers that the Old Testament contains books of history, law, poetry, and prophecy. It would be well that he did not lose himself in the intricacies of Jeremiah and Ezekiel first of all, or turn to the Book of Revelation and become mystified by the picture of seals, trumpets, and beasts. These portions can wait a while until he finds out what the Bible is all about.

Then he may become mystified by the Old Testament story of the establishment of the tabernacle in the wilderness, the giving of the law on Mount Sinai, and the details of the Mosaic Covenant. He must learn that much of his reading in the Old Testament Scriptures needs interpretation. If there be no interpretation, one may acually be led astray into the acceptance of teachings which are out of harmony with the message of the New Testament.

How important it is that we come to the Author of the Book for help. Pray over your Bible reading and the Holy Spirit will open your eyes to truths that will amaze you. And best of all, there is no end to the possibilities that lie before you. A lifetime spent with the Word of God is not sufficient to fathom its depths nor to exhaust its resources.

The ability to handle aright the Word of Truth can be described in simple language. If we try to unroll a ball of twine we must look for the end of the string. If we start wrong, tangles are sure to result, but if we can find the end, in the very center of the ball, how easily the twine comes out without any tangles until the entire ball is unwound.

This is an illustration of the need of correct interpretation of the Bible. Without the aid of the Holy Spirit, the Genesis account of creation and the fall might well be a fable, the story of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, just a life story of three old patriarchs who are dead and gone long ago. And when we come to the deliverance of the Children of Israel from Egypt, the setting up of the Mosaic code of laws on Sinai, the erection of the tabernacle in the wilderness, etc., the question might well come, "But what has all that to do with me?" Where shall I go to find help? Where are the findings of the divine Inter-preter to be found? Will I find them in the Acts or in the first four books of the New Testament?

Even the Gospels and the Acts are historical books, and while the teachings of Jesus Christ of Nazareth are found therein, and are sublime in their purity, yet Jesus Himself, in all His teaching, gave us little to help us to a correct understanding of His death and resurrection. He told us He would die and on the third day He would arise from the dead, but He did not interpret the full significance of His passion. He did, however, tell us that He was going away and He would send another Comforter, even the Spirit of Truth, and when He is come, He will lead you into all truth. The promised Interpreter came as He was promised, on the day of Pentecost. He began His work immediately, so that when Peter arose on that memorable day and preached the Word, he took the Old Testament and interpreted the prophecies of David, showing their fulfillment in Jesus Christ, who both died and rose again according to the Scriptures, ascended into the heavens and received the promised Holy Spirit, and poured out this which was seen and heard, the gift of the Holy Ghost. The Interpreter had come. Now all that had gone be-fore became plain, and a design was discovered in all the record of the Old Testament, which finds interpretation in the light of the New.

But it remained for one man to bring the greatest light of all upon the Scrip-(Continued on Page Five)

# At Central Bible Institutes

# School Activities Continue Through Summer Months

Ordinarily there is a great calm in the corridors of Central Bible Institute when Commencement week has come and gone. When the voices of three hundred students are no longer heard, the few workers who remain are fairly oppressed with the silence that reigns everywhere; in the class rooms, the chapel, the corridors, the dining room and the campus. Not a sound anywhere.

But this year there is an exception. A goodly portion of the faculty members remained behind to care for the incoming students who had enrolled for the Summer Bible School. Instead of dead quiet, now can be heard the sound of praying voices, and the tapping of eager feet as students move through the halls to chapel, to class room or to the dining hall. School is still on. Students are being prepared for a better understanding of God's Word and a more effective life of service. C. B. I. is extending its usefulness.

In the rear of the building can be heard another new sound, the clack, clack of the new pump, which lifts water at the rate of seventy-five gallons per minute, one hundred feet in the air to the new An adequate supply of water tank. water is now available. Students on the third floor who had started to take a shower, and then suddenly the water supply failed, leaving them waiting, waiting for the water that would not come, will never have this embarrassment any more. When the rush hours come in the morning, at noon and in the evening, there will be water for all, an inexhaustible supply of excellent water, pressed through the pipes to every floor. What a blessing!

There are other sounds at C. B. I. To the west of the main building, and a little to the rear, just over on the north of the old tennis courts, the walls of a new building are growing steadily. A beehive of workers is carrying brick, placing heavy timbers, mixing mortar, etc. Slowly a new building, equal in size to the main building, is rising from the ground. It was a triumph when the basement walls were completed. Now the walls are reaching to the floor of the second story. It is quite a way to the top, but it will not be long until we are ready for the roof. And when this building is completed, accommodations will be found for approximately two hundred and fifty more boarding students, besides rooms for storage, dining hall, the kitchen, study, etc.

And what about the funds available to complete this new building? They are inadequate. The brethren felt, however, that they should go just as far with the erection of the building as the funds will warrant. If they can get the walls up and the roof on, then the inside can be finished as funds are forthcoming, without damage to the interior from exposure to the weather. And so the work is cheerfully going on, day by day. Hope is high that the God who inspired the establishment of Central Bible Institute, will make it possible for this increased number of students to receive training for their life work for Christ.

And so the sounds now blanketing the campus and buildings of C. B. I. are pleasant ones. All the workers who remained over from the school year just closed are smiling in anticipation of the new term that is coming. Increased facilities mean less strain. More space means more students. And they are coming too. Early in the season applications are being filed by new students who want to come to school next year. Only a limited number can be accepted. Saul of Tarsus, a Jew, brought tures. up at the feet of Gamaliel, and taught in all the perfect law of his fathers, was chosen of God to be an interpreter of the Scriptures with which he was so familiar. He was stopped on the Damascus road. He saw the Lord Jesus. His whole life's course was changed. Without consulting with others, he sought God diligently for himself. He says that he went into Arabia and returned again into Damascus and did not see any of the Apostles until three years after his conversion, and yet, when he did see them and communicated unto them the gospel which had been revealed to him, they had nothing to add to the revelation which he had received from God concerning Jesus Christ. Later he says he was caught up to the third heaven and had things revealed to him which it was unlawful for him to disclose. This accounts for his marvelous epistles. He has contributed no less than fourteen of them to our New Testament. Three

of them are decidedly doctrinal and one is amazed at the extent to which he interprets not only the Old Testament but the gospel records as well.

Paul alone interprets Adam and contrasts him with Christ. He alone gives us the details pertaining to Abraham and shows us the significance of the statement that Abraham believed God and it was counted to Him for righteousness. He is the one who interprets Sinai as the Old Covenant and contrasts it with the New Covenant. He alone takes the Levitical Priesthood and the tabernacle in the wilderness and shows us their spiritual significance. So in our reading of the Old Testament books, they take on new and significant meaning when viewed through the eyes of Paul.

At last I have found the key to the Scriptures. Christian doctrine is found in the epistles rather than in other portions of the Bible. I do not go to the Old Testament to find an explanation of the New. No! I go to the New Tesment to find an explanation of the Old. I have come to the house of the Interpreter and I sit at His feet and marvel as He points out to me the life of faith that pleases God, the Lamb of Calvary, hidden in the Jewish sacrifices, the significance of the tabernacle and the various pieces of furniture that graced it. Here I see Jesus Christ in all His fullness, pictured in type and shadow, and the Bible becomes a new book to me.

And I have discovered something else. I can avoid falling into error if I keep close to the house of the Interpreter. Doctrines that seem to be significant, if found elsewhere, should be held lightly unless they have apostolic sanction in the epistles. When doctrines are clearly set forth in the epistles, then we can turn to the rest of the Scriptures and find a wealth of illustrative and elucidative material to back up our doctrinal position. They all fall into line, for the Interpreter is able to harmonize and establish all truth.

If you have not discovered this secret, if you have not yet entered the house of the Interpreter, then I trust that from this moment on you will begin to rightly divide or handle aright the Word of Truth by His help.

The Only Work That Counts Organization and plan, how well devised, will utterly fail except the Eternal Spirit of the Living God direct and lead and further and prosper. The best laid schemes of men utterly fail and crumble, but work wrought by the power of the Holy Ghost will abide for ever. Its foundations cannot be shaken.

# HEALED OF BLOOD CLOTS AND COMPLICATIONS

During the fall and winter of 1933-34 I tired so easily. I was tired when I arose in the morning was exhausted by night. could do very little and was unable to walk very much. March 4, 1934 a blood clot formed just below and under the right knee. I was at once put to bed to remain six weeks, the limb done up in hot steam packs. I was told to lie quietly and was warned that if the blood clot loosened it would be instant death for me. At the end of six weeks I sat up only to be put back in bed a few days later with another blood clot. For nearly a year, again and again the clots formed. The doctor could give no relief. All of this time I grew weaker until I could hardly walk from one room to another.

For months previous to the first blood clot I had suffered from gall stones. After the first blood clot the doctors said it was too dangerous to operate, that another blood clot would form as soon as an incision would be made. For a whole year doctors tried to find a reason for the blood clots. After many examinations and tests they found the kidneys were drying up, and allowing 15% of the waste matter to remain in the body, gradually poisoning the whole system. There was also an obstruction of the intestines, which caused hemorrhages of the bowels. Also I had a tumor in the left side.

In February, 1935 it became necessary to operate on the gall bladder, although the doctors told me I had but one chance in a hundred to live. On Wednesday night before I was to go to the hospital on the following Monday a few dear children of God gathered around me in prayer. While prayer was being offered one dear brother laid his hands on me. The power of God fell on us and we all melted in submission to Him, and to His perfect plan. Glory!

The following Saturday a final X-ray was taken to show the exact location of the incision to be made. This X-ray brought forth a picture of a perfectly whole, healthy body. Every growth and obstruction was gone, and every organ has been in perfect health up to and including this December 29, 1935. Hallelujah! When I told the doctor what had taken place, how God had healed through prayer and faith, he said, "I thank God, for I didn't want to operate on you. You wouldn't have lived anyway."

Today though, I can truthfully say, I am a perfectly healthy woman, able to do all of my housework, and I seldom get tired.—Mrs. John Mautner, Watertown, Wis.

the Euphrates region. As you know, the Euphrates bisects the Arabian peninsula, the land of the Arabs. And the news dispatches of the day mention that the Arab, the Moslem everywhere, in Arabia, in Turkey, throughout Asia Minor, and even into India, is awakening after a thousand years of quiescence, into racial and religious unity against the Jew and against British power in the East.

The way of the kings of the East is being prepared. How marvelous has been the rise of Japan. Today she is the third strongest military and naval power in the world. She holds the same ranking commercially. Eighty years ago, she was a blissfully slumbering archipelago of peaceful happy people pursuing agriculture and fishery. Drawing her strength from the soil and her suck from the Ocean's generous bosom. Thus, she had been for centuries till that fateful day when Perry knocked at her doors and demanded admission. After thousands of years of slumber she has leaped into the saddle of Far Eastern leadership, crying, "Asia for the Asiatic, clear out foreign, white domination, we shall rule ourselves." The European nations will not readily give up their "spheres of influence" in Asia. They will one day have to fight Japan if they insist on holding those spheres. All indications are that that day is not far off. The original rendering of the above mentioned verse is "The way of the kings of the Sun Rising." Is this not suggestive of Japan's national emblem, a full orbed rising sun, with its blood red rays reaching to every part of the compass? Is Japan not called "The Sunrise Kingdom?" Are these things a mere coincidence? Surely the world is marching on toward Armageddon.

A reading of Rev. 9:14, 16, 18 reveals the fact that from this Eastern direction in the Tribulation day there will come a horde of destructive cavalry 200,000,000 strong, by whom the third part of men are to be destroyed. Taken literally this could mean that the number of the slain in this end time warfare may mount up to 600,000,000 people, one third of the earth's population. This may seem preposterous until we quote one of the leading "thinkers" whose opinion is accepted by the man of today, H. G. Wells. Says Wells, "It is practically all over now. There will be hell to pay east of the Suez. The red flag will advance to the Rhine, possibly to the Atlantic. Down will go Europe in one awful smash. Anarchy will seize the doomed United States. Mankind will return to the caves.'

Before his death Thos. Edison stated that the U. S. Chemical Warfare Department had developed a poison gas which could wipe out London in three hours. London has a popu-lation of 7,000,000 souls. It took the last war four years to kill off ten million. A year after Thos. Edison's death, the writer read an article in the Forum for November, which quoted a military official to the effect that now, the U. S. Chemical Warfare had perfected a gas which could kill every inhabitant of New York City in twelve minutes time (6,000,00 souls) and that overnight they could destroy all life east of the Mississippi (some 60,000,000 souls.) As one considers these statements made by military men of today, we should hesitate very much to say that the above mentioned passage in Revelation 9 should

not be taken literally. A godless world is preparing to commit suicide like Judas Iscariot of old, and for the same reason, for having betrayed the Christ of God.

A while ago, in a weekly magazine, Geo. Sylvester Viereck, internationally famous news correspondent, reported an interview which he had held with an official, high in military circles of the U. S. Army. This official is a noted airman and has invented many of the features of the modern airplane. Viereck quoted him as saving that it is now possible for an enemy country to subjugate the U. S. overnight, by attacking from the air. That a fleet of airplanes could rain down in one night sufficient death and destruction to wipe out the eastern half of the United States. He made one very significant statement. Said he, "The attack would come unexpectedly, the enemy attacking first and declaring war afterward. It will strike like the lightning." How this reminds us of the passage in 1 Thess. 5:1-9. "When they shall say peace and safety, then sudden destruction cometh upon them."

Reports have it that the British Government is adequately prepared for this "sudden destruction" from the skies. That she has prepared huge underground chambers and quarters, in which her leader, executives, etc., can take refuge when the war is on. Safely underground, her military men and strategists can direct the movements of planes and tanks, equipped with machine guns shooting six thousand bullets per minute (Read Nahum 2:3-4 for a Bible prophecy concerning the war tank), by means of radio activity while safely underground, immune to bombs, immune to poison gas, immune to explosives and bullets.

Almighty God, has chambers of refuge for His blood bought children, but they are not down, underground, they are up, above! May



Is being born of the Spirit (John 3:3) the Baptism with the Spirit?

We believe not. One must be born of the Spirit before one can be baptized with the Spirit. One is born of the Spirit when one takes Christ as one's personal Saviour. "His Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are the sons of God" then. The Baptism with the Spirit is an enduement of power upon the life of one who has been born again. The disciples at Samaria had received Christ as their Saviour and received great joy before Philip baptized them in water. Acts 8:8, 12. It was later that they received the Baptism with the Spirit. See vv. 14-17. See also Acts 19:4-7; Eph. 1:13.

Does Rev. 20:4 teach that Jesus will catch His true Church away before Antichrist rules? Rev. 20:4 shows the redeemed reigning with Christ in His millennial kingdom. The church age is that period of time which continues between the sixty ninth and seventieth week of Daniel 9:25-27. At the beginning of the seventieth week Antichrist makes a covenant with Israel which he later breaks. Since the Church is a New Testament mystery coming in between the sixty ninth and seventieth week the Church must be caught away to meet the Lord before the seventieth week begins. See Eph. 3:3-6.—E. S. W. the reader prayerfully read Isa. 26:20-21, "Come my people enter thou into thy chambers, and shut thy doors about thee, hide thyself as it were for a little moment until the indignation (the Tribulation) be overpast. For behold the Lord cometh out of His place to punish the inhabitants of the earth for their iniquity, for the earth also shall disclose her blood and shall no more cover her slain." Are not these "chambers" the "many mansions" that Jesus refers to in John 14:1-6? "Let not your heart be troubled. In my Father's house are many mansions. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you unto myself that where I am, there ye may be also."

And to any unsaved friend reading these lines, may we point out to you the one and only path of safety? In verse 6 of the above passage Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no man cometh unto the Father but by me." Have you "come," friend? "Him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." Can you truly sing:

felt conviction that it was God Himself who opened this door of effectual service for us

here in this great land of China where there is such a dire need of a Bible-trained and Spirit-filled native ministry. The dying masses of China who are still in utter darkness of sin and superstition, can after all be reached and brought in contact with the message of light and life only with the assistance of a strong and well-trained corps of native workers.

Years ago, when we were still laboring in the province of Shansi, this great need of training native workers for active service was laid heavily upon our hearts. At that time we opened a small local Bible school at the Ta Ch'ang Mis-sion Station which the Lord graciously blessed. Praise the

Lord, many students were baptized in the Spirit and today they are out somewhere engaged actively in the Lord's work. Even some of them felt the call of God upon their hearts to leave their own people and go out as missionaries to Mongolia where there is such heathen darkness and where surely the light of the gospel is needed.

Just recently, it was my privilege to visit once more the Ta Ch'ang Mission Station, where Sister Stephany and Sister Tieleman are still having the local Bible school. (Miss Stephany, however, is now in America on furlough.) Brother W. W. Simpson had preceded me, giving some fine Bible lectures to the students there and their hearts were well prepared when I arrived. God met with us in a very gracious manner. The secular papers had been full of news of the Reds invading that province and before going up there I wondered if it would serve any good purpose seeing that the minds of the people would be full of anxiety and turmoil because of the unsettled local conditions. The Communists were nearing the mission station and only a day's journey away. Several missionaries from remote places of the province had been notified by

the consular authorities to evacuate and had already left for the coast for refuge. However, a great peace had come into our hearts and the Lord was signally blessing the students in their studies and their seasons of devotion. One afternoon especially the Lord's presence and power were manifested and two were gloriously filled with the Holy Spirit.

# SIDELIGHTS ON LIFE IN LIBERIA



A very interesting letter comes to us from Miss Florence Steidel, one of our newer missionaries to Liberia, telling of some of her experiences during the course of a day, including the ministering to physical and material needs as well as getting into the hearts of Miss Florence Steidel the African people to win souls to Christ.

In her letter she writes:

"Yesterday was Easter Sunday and a very special day for us here. We led up to Easter Day in having a daily Bible lesson on the last week of our Lord. Some of the girls' hearts were touched. One of them said, 'Mama, God is speaking to my heart!' while another wept and said, 'I have not been faithful in testimony.' Yesterday afternoon she praised God, speaking in other tongues. and again in the night service in town the Spirit spoke through her for ten minutes. The heathen were astounded and even Chief William seemed to be touched. Please do pray for this man's salvation. For Sunday night supper he sent Sister Simmons and me palm butter chop and some sweet pota-This was his way of welcoming her toes. here.

"Please continue to pray for the little girl who was so badly hurt when a palm tree fell on her. Her head and the bones in her arm are all healed but the bones in her ankle and foot are so badly crushed that it seems they just will not heal. But we know our God is able. The natives are watching and saying that they will know our God has power if He heals this child.

"I shall always be glad to receive more bandages. Many are used in the clinic work. These may be made from old sheets and sent to the Mizpah Missionary Home, 1003 Summit Avenue, New York City. Miss Kraeger will send them out to me. I should also like to have more Sunday School picture cards; the children treasure them. They, too, may be sent to Miss Kraeger. I brought four rag rugs out with me and when I knew that some of the little girls had no blankets I gave them my rugs to cover themselves at night. They were so happy that they wrapped them around themselves and paraded all over our yard and then they begged to go over in mission town to show them.

"It was a queer and peculiar feeling when I climbed into a hammock for the first trip interior. The hammock is carried by eight men, four at a time. Such swinging back and forth and up and down. Every time we passed through a little town the people would say, 'How do-do-do, are you going to sit down here?' It makes us feel so sad to see so many people begging for missionaries and we wished that we could be several people at the same time. Though the transportation is slow, going in hammocks, it gives us much time to meditate. Suddenly I heard the queerest kind of chattering and asked the men what made that noise and they said, 'Mama, it be monkeys.' On the way I saw many pretty flowers and the carriers seemed to think it very funny that I should admire flowers.

"Now that I am here in Palipo I am trying to do all that my hands find to do-up at six in the morning, breakfast, Bible study with the girls, dress wounds (two days there were so many that it took all the morning). Then dinner, sewing, then school starts at one and is over at four. After that the girls must be supervised in their duties. Perhaps in the meantime someone brings a sick baby to be prayed for or some other need demands my attention-and so the day is gone far too soon. After supper is study hour and prayer. Please pray for me that as I dress the wounds of the Africans, wounds deeper than the skin will be reached and that when He comes many shall be ready from this tribe to meet the Lord in the air!'


# SOULS SAVED IN ALASKA

Encouraging reports of the Lord's blessing upon the work in Ketchikan, Alaska, have been coming to us from Mrs. Josephine Gilmore, one of our ministers, who has been doing missionary work in that city for the past several months. A recent letter brings the following good news of the progress of the work: "A great spirit of revival is moving in our regular services. "The Lord has been doing wonderful things in healing sick bodies. Some very definite healings of scarlet fever, pneumonia, asthma, tuberculosis, heart trouble, and tuberculosis of the bone have been witnessed. How we praise God for His wonderful power that has been manifested here!"

# Christianity Spread by Persecution

Lesson for July 26: Lesson Text, Acts 7:59 to 8:4; 1 Peter 4:12-19.

# I. STEPHEN GLORIFIES GOD

They stoned Stephen. When the Lord Jesus spoke of the violent death Peter should die He was "signifying by what death he should glorify God." John 21:19. It is probable that Stephen accomplished more in his death, like Samson (Judges 16:30), than he had in his We are not told the effect on fruitful life. Saul that Stephen's dying words and looks had but, although we know that Stephen was only one of many of whose death by persecution Saul was the direct cause (Acts 22:4), he himself tells us he recollected the death of Stephen. Acts 22:20. If, when the Lord said to Saul, "Why persecutest thou me?" Saul's mind flew at once to Stephen we may say that Stephen's death was a contributing cause of Saul's conversion. That being so it was a glorious death, in view of the vast work, still going on all over the world, accomplished by Saul (Paul).

Lay not this sin to their charge. It seems to some who are being cruelly, unjustly, fiendishly mistreated, that the example of the Lord Jesus on the Cross when He said, "Father forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34), is so exalted that only the Son of God could reach it. Let them think of Stephen. Grace enabled him to love his tormentors when they were murdering him without a cause-without any cause. What grace did for Stephen grace will do for you. Acts 10:34. But looking abused and seeking pity when being set upon by those who would destroy us is not the Stephen way. When they were hounding him and condemning him in the council they "saw his face as it had been the face of an angel." Acts 6:15. God will enable you to shine, shine, shine under every condition, and this is witnessing in power.

# **II. A DEVIL-STIRRING CHURCH**


There was great persecution against the church. It was not Stephen the Jewish leaders hated, it was what Stephen represented. It was not Stephen the *man* who was stoned, but Stephen the *Christian*. That church was so offensive to Satan that it drew the devil's Jesus said this would be so (John 15:20), fire. and Peter says this makes the people so treated happy. 1 Peter 4:14. Jesus Himself declared that this is so although He uses the word "blessed," instead of "happy." Luke 6:22. This persecution was so severe that men and women were killed or imprisoned or compelled to flee, leaving their jobs and their lands. The present policy of the government of Poland to drive out of Poland all of her 3,500,000 Jews is a modern day example of what the Christians suffered. It was Jews then who were doing the persecuting. I am sure it made the sufferers happy, for they

That, let me assure you, is a kind of witnessing that These scattered Chrisbreaks hard hearts. tians preaching with shining faces got them the reputation voiced in the words, "These that have turned the world upside down have come hither also." Acts 17:6. To witness that way brings vast rewards and results, and is our privilege through grace.

# **III. THE USES OF PERSECUTION**

Ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings. Most people when they read a book want to know who wrote it. If it tells big stories and sets high standards they want to know whether the author has been first partaker of the fruits-does he know experimentally about that of which he speaks? Peter, who wrote these words knew what it was to be persecuted. First under the Jews, and later, when the Roman government realized that the Christian religion was overrunning the world, he saw dreadful persecutions seemingly threaten the destruction of the Church. He says, "Rejoice" in these sufferings. It is said to take eleven tons of pressure on a piano to tune it. One who hopes to get in tune with heaven's choir must expect to suffer. Knowing the purpose of the pressure he rejoices, knowing that "when his glory shall appear' he will "be glad also with exceeding joy." It is such considerations as these that made the Apostle say, "our light affliction which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." 2 Cor. 4:17



Paul's afflictions were very, very heavy but, compared to the eternal weight of glory to which we look forward they were light indeed.

But let none of you suffer-Not all sufferings endured by Christians at the hands of sinners can be called persecutions. A man of my acquaintance who from his pulpit in time of a strike undertook to settle great principles of industrial procedure, was beaten well nigh to death by the angry strikers. He tried to pose as a man persecuted for righteousness' sake. But wise men knew he was but reaping the just reward of his folly in leaving the preaching of the gospel to preach social reform. One will get in trouble plenty if he preaches Christ and Him crucified in the power he should, and this will be persecution. He does not need to go afield and meddle in other men's matters by preaching politics.

Let him glorify God on this behalf. The Rev. Ver. renders it. "Let him glorify God in this name." Let him thank and praise and glorify God because of Christ by whose name he is called, and because of whom he suffers. Here is where he will have to resolutely reckon the old man dead. The old man will want to complain and seek pity and sympathy. Here is where he has a chance to deny his self. His natural self is the old man of whom Paul speaks so much (Eph. 4:22), who was crucified with and when Christ was crucified. Every soul that sinneth shall die; but God has graciously and gloriously arranged that we may die by proxy. By accepting Christ as my Lord and Saviour the Spirit of God regenerates me and I am born again. It is necessary to be born again at that time because, having accepted Christ, God considers the old man of me dead, and there must be raised up, of course, a new man, "created in righteousness and true holiness, for me to put on. This new man, realizing the infinite gain he has experienced by the death of Christ in his stead, glorifies God in the name of Christ, nothwithstanding the sufferings that come because of having accepted Christ.

I knew a Christian woman who had a drunken husband. He abused her shamefully for years. One night he pulled her out of bed and put her out in the snow in her night-Barefooted she went to the barn and gown. buried herself in the loose hay. The next morning she went to the house and got breakfast for the family as though nothing had happened. She always rejoiced in the fact that Sol (that was his name) was her husband. She had to suffer because she was Sol's wife, but she gloried in it. She looked ahead. She believed God would save him (and He did), and in anticipation of the great happiness she would then have she rejoiced all along that she had married him. Is that not an illustration of the meaning of the text?

If the righteous scarcely be saved. Worrell renders it a little more clearly, "If it is difficult for a righteous man to be saved." Because all that "will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution," it is difficult for even righteous men to be saved. That is, the way home is thorn-strewn, steep, slippery, and difficult. How far from salvation then is every sinner, and how far from it too will many, very many in the church find themselves at that day. Oh, let us be warned .-- C. E. R.

A billion dollars changed hands during 1935 in horse racing, dog racing, slot machines, etc. The liquor business and all forms of questionable amusements have been booming as never before. This activity, however, has done nothing to improve the standard of living, but rather, has tended to reduce the standard of living."

Tell them we have peace but we also have unrest—unrest because multitudes of our people are lost. Tell the young people of America to come, not cringing and hopeless. Tell them to come without clouds in their eyes. Tell them to come looking at the light that is on the face of Jesus Christ and knowing how to laugh at impossibilities in His name."

The devilish spirit animating the liquor industry can be clearly seen in some of their advertisements, quoted in *The Voice*, a Washington paper.

"Let's make their mouths water," says Brewery Age. "Show the housewives how to serve beer. Instill into every advertisement enough appetite appeal to make their mouths water."

*Spirits*, a whiskey magazine, carried a leading article entitled "Watch Your Women," and among many other things, said, "Arrange window displays definitely aimed at luring the women customers into your shop. . . . Work up practical and home-like suggestions for the average family."

Comments one writer: "In Hungary where it was written, twenty suicides have been caused by it with the result that the government has forever banned it. The following is from the *Jewish Congress:* "How can our rights—the rights of a majority people—get the attention of the distracted globe with a possible Armageddon shaping itself in the near future."

Truly no better language can be found to sum up world conditions than the language of the Bible—which is the language of the Spirit.

# RADIO AS THE TOOL OF DESPOTISM

"The rulers take counsel together against the Lord, and against His anointed." Psa. 2:2.

Writes Keith L. Brooks: "The prophets who envisioned a world confederacy against God in the last days, with the rulers of all nations conferring together and swinging their peoples in line against His anointed, could not have understood how these things could be accomplished. Within the last fifty years, however, "all difficulties in the way of the fulfilment of these prophecies have been removed.

"A recent speech of David Sarnoff, president of the Radio Corporation of America, throws much light upon the matter. Through the progress of our modern communications, nations have been turned into neighborhoods and the vast resources of education and entertainment have been made available to tens of millions previously cut off from such opportunities. Propaganda is now a science. Radio has drawn the most distant places and the most forgotten lives into the orbit of civilization." Says Mr. Sarnoff: "But under the dictatorships of Europe we find a different picture. There, these new and great instrumentalities of communication have been converted into tools of reaction, intolerance, cruelty, and despotism. There the press, from a living and untrammeled force, has been turned into an instrument of blind prejudice; there radio broadcasting, motion pictures, theaters, and the printed word, have only the function of echoing the official propaganda."

# "THERE SHALL BE A TIME OF TROUBLE"

Dan. 12:1.

We learn from *Prophetic Times* that at the National Convention of Hadassah societies in Cleveland, one of the speakers urged "this generation of Jews" to make Palestine the homeland of those of their nation who are being crowded out of the countries. He deplored the fact that the world was suffering from "mass hypnosis" against the Jews, and stated that seventy-five per cent of European Jews are subject to "a regime of bodily violence, inquisition of conscience, and economic boy-cott, which is aimed at the extermination of 9,000,000 Jews."

# THE GREATEST DEFENSE AGAINST INSANITY

"God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. 2 Tim. 1:7.

*Prophecy* passes on the following item: Dr. Cowles of Johns Hopkins University is quoted as saying that "In all the years heretofore insanity has never increased more than 10% in each ten years. Within the past ten years it has increased 20%." This is an alarming increase.

In this connection the following from Sunday School Times should be pondered:

"John Wesley was not allowed to preach in English prisons lest the prisoners should be taken with 'enthusiasm' and then fall into actual insanity. But Professor Schou of Copenhagen tells us that, nowadays, it is the general opinion among alienists that religion, is a protection and defense against insanity. Thus Dr. Hyslop of the Bethlehem Hospital, London, speaking as one who has devoted his whole life to the care of the insane, declares that constant and simple prayer must be given the first place among the hygienic resources that work against mental disorder, depressed conditions, and all the painful consequences of a tortured mind. Professor Oppenheim, in his 'Nervenliedung und Erziehung,' says: 'On the basis of my experience as physician, I consider want of religious faith one of the most regrettable things' (in a patient). Another psychiatrist, Dr. J. A. Kock, declares that the best fortified against mental disturbance are those having a living religious faith.

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
