## Life, and Life More Abundant

OSES said to Israel, "The Lord thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto him ye shall hearken.' Deut. 18:15.

God gave witness in the holy mountain concerning this Prophet, declaring: "This is my beloved Son: hear him." He is a Prophet with a greater message than Moses and Elijah, and therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the word He brings. What does He say? "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10.

When Moses brought God's holy law to the children of Israel in the wilderness they said, "All the words which the Lord hath said will we do." Were they obedient to His law? No. Why not? Because of the frailty of their flesh. What service is there then in the law? The law reveals to us our sinfulness and makes us realize our need of One who will save us from our sins. The law is our schoolmaster to lead us to Christ our Saviour, to Him who came to save His people from their sins and also give them life, and life more abundantly-eternal life, His very own life manifested within.

Listen to this Prophet as He eats the last passover with His disciples. He takes the bread, blesses and breaks it, saying, "Take, eat; this is my body." He gives thanks for the cup, saying, "Drink ye all of it; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins." Wondrous symbols and pictures of His broken body and shed blood -the bread of life broken for us to receive, the blood in which was His very life (Lev. 17:11)

given to us that we may partake of the same—the very life of the Son of God.

Those symbols of His broken body and poured-out blood speak to us of Calvary, where He bore our sins and the penalty due to us for the same, and where He took us and our old fallen nature and disposition to be crucified with Him, that the body of sin should be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. And He Himself, the Giver of life and life more abundant, will come within us and will enable each one of us to say, "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I that live, but Christ liveth in me: and

that life which I now live in the flesh I live in faith, the faith which is in the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself up for me." Gal. 2:20, R. V. Look to Him to make this an experimental reality in your life.

You ask, How can I receive this life, and the nature, the mind, and the disposition of Christ? Says the Apostle, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus." A kind friend comes to your home, bringing with him a gift-one that you sorely need. You say, "Welcome, friend; many thanks for your coming and for this wonderful gift that you bring." You do not resist his coming, but you unbolt and un-

bar the doors of your house, you fling them wide open and let him come in together with his bountiful love gift. In like manner, offer no resistance to your greater Friend, the Lord Jesus Christ. Unlock, unbar, and open the door of your heart and let Him come in bringing with Him His gift of life, and life more abundant, bringing also with Him His grace, His meekness, His lowliness, His wisdom, His righteousness, His holiness, and the fullness of His redemption.

What will He do when He is allowed the full right-of-way? He will remove all that is objectionable. He will turn out the money changing spirit, the spirit of covetousness, of pride, of vanity, of foolishness, of fretfulness, of fear. He cleansed the temple in Jerusalem of all that should not be there, declaring, "Is it not written, My house shall be called an house of prayer for all nations?" Mark 11:17, margin. Not a den of thieves, as the covetous ones were making it! He will make of you a temple—a temple for unceas-

## Following the Leading of the Holy Spirit

There is one thing that is very important to every Christian, and especially so to everyone who preaches the gospel, and that is to know that he is led of God. Having the leadings of God in our spiritual work is very wonderful. That is the foundation for good progress and victory. When we commit our lives unto the Lord, then He will take care of us and lead us on. He will lead us in everything. We often hear of people who have such a battle in order to get into the will of God, but if we are fully yielded to God our lives will be like a continuous chain in the will of God. God wants to do that for us, and that is the real joy of living.

When we think of preaching, for example, we know that we need to be led and guided. To preach is really not so wonderful. If you are used to speaking and somewhat talented you will always be able to give a sermon, and if you keep on for several years you will be able to make a good speech. But the real test is whether we see results. That is the great question. We often notice that very good preachers have very small results in their work and we wonder sometimes why it is. I believe it is because they are not led and guided by the Lord. You can preach a wonderful sermon and yet accomplish nothing. Perhaps the people it is fitted for are not in the meeting at all. The real secret is that we must find out what kind of a message the people need at the particular time we are to speak. You will notice that there is alway a special need in every meeting. There is always some individual in every meeting that God wishes to speak to, and it is because of this that we need the guidance and leading of the Lord. The Lord knows who is coming to the meeting, and He will give you the right message, and it is that message that will work. It isn't that your sermon is so wonderful, it is because it hits the heart. It strikes the right person. It has often happened to me. People have come to me after the service saying, "You told all about me."

Once in Stockholm a woman came to me after the service and she gave me a downright scolding. She asked me why I stood before the whole congregation and told all about her condition. I had never seen the woman before, nor had I heard of her. It was the first time she had ever been in our meeting. A good friend of hers had brought her to the meeting, and she thought that her friend had told me all about her. But I had not heard a word. She said, "You have told just how things are in my life." It was during the depression, and I was talking to the people about how some folks conducted their business. She was a business woman and had done the very thing that I said, and she was very much pricked in her heart.

The result of a sermon hinges so much on this very thing—that you get the right message for that particular meeting. One Sunday morning I was getting ready to go into the pulpit. I had a subject to preach on that morning that I had studied much about. But just about an hour before the meeting a word from the Lord came to me, and I began to weep. I wept until the meeting began. The word the Lord gave me was for backsliders, and I lost everything I had thought about before this. I could hardly speak I was so touched by the Word. At the close of my message that morning I said, "There is someone in this congregation for whom this message is meant, and you can come and make yourself known." When the service was over a lady came up to me, and she wept a long while. She told me she had once been saved and happy. She had been in some church and had met a young man there who had deceived her, and she was in terrible need. She was ready to take her life she was in such anguish. She had walked all night beside one of the streams that flows through Stockholm trying to get up courage to throw herself into the water, but she had not been able to do so. She had thought about her saved mother and father, and when morning came she thought of our church and decided to attend the morning service. At that service she had heard the message the Lord had laid upon my heart, and she gave herself to the Lord and was wonderfully saved. Not so very long afterward she was baptized in the Holy Spirit. She was given speaking in tongues and interpretation, and the spirit

of prophecy was upon her. She has served in our church ever since. That was more than twenty years ago. She is one of the most wholly sanctified and consecrated sisters in our assembly.

I have seen this happen again and again, that we are led of the Lord when it comes to preaching. It is remarkable, but it all hinges upon the wonderful leadings of God. That is the spirit of prophecy, the spirit of revelation; and it is the very thing we need. This is something of the supernatural or divine side of our work.

It is also very important that we be led of the Lord when He sends us on different errands. When He opens the way, it is not hard at all, and wonderful things may happen. At one time Brother Ekberg and I were contemplating a visit to one of the islands, and we had decided to go in the month of June. Early in the spring it was made clear to me that I could not go at that time. I wrote to the church, and they said, "Come in May." We went in May, and when we landed on the island we met a few of the brethren, the pastor and one of the elders of the church.

I was told of a couple then on the island who had contemplated going to Stockholm with their sick daughter. But they had heard the day before that we were coming, and they were quite surprised about it. The daughter had been taken out of the hospital the day before, and there had been quite an argument between the mother and the doctor. The mother belived in divine healing, but the doctor didn't. The relatives were told that the daughter was to be taken to Stockholm to be prayed for, and when this family heard that we were coming to the island it greatly strengthened their faith. When I heard the story it greatly strengthened my faith, too, and I knew the Lord was in it. We anointed the young girl with oil and prayed for her, and she was instantly healed. She had been sick for months with a ruptured appendix. There was quite a bit of pus in the sore, and the doctor had said there was no hope. But the Lord healed her instantly and as we walked out of the house she got up and dressed. Her mother telephoned for the girl's brother, who was up in the country, and asked him to come in with his car so that he might take the girl home. The brother said over the phone, "I suppose we had better get the ambulance." "No," replied the mother, "bring the passenger car." And when the brother came to the house where his sister was at the time, and she came out of the house fully dressed and walked to the car, her brother, a big, heavy, ungodly fellow, started to weep. A little later we passed the home and the girl was well and strong, and the whole house was filled with praise and singing unto the Lord.

There had been much opposition on that island in regard to the Pentecostal work, but it was wonderful what this case of healing did. The news traveled all over the island-it is a large oneand everywhere we went they would speak of this wonderful happening. The next Sunday we had a large meeting in the open air, and this girl testified to her healing. Many people gave their hearts to the Lord. In another place on the same island we found one who had been in the same hospital, and she knew this girl. When she heard of this girl's healing she came right to the platform and quite a few others came with her. There was quite a stir because of this miracle.

In the jail there was a fellow who was in for about eight days. He had been a member of our church in Stockholm for many years, but had become a backslider. I went to visit him, and he was saved.


How wonderful was the leading of the Lord. I had thought to go to the island in June, but the Lord changed my plans and I got in touch with these two wonderful cases. If you are led of the Lord everything seems to come vour wav and works with you. Everything seems to adjust itself. Everything seems to serve you. - And that is the secret of a fruitful life as a servant or handmaiden of the Lord. There is nothing so needed and important as just this, that God be given a place, a full place in our lives. If we give Him room in our hearts He will work wonders through us. There is nothing so wonderful as to be really and altogether yielded to the Lord, and guided and led by Him

I have been preaching the gospel for more than thirty years, and my testimony is this that it is getting better right along. It is more wonderful to me now than it ever has been before.

After visiting the United States twelve years ago, I met with great difficulties when I returned to Sweden. Just previous to this I had built a new church, and it was too small for us. It was during the war and it had cost us a

good deal of money, and then when it was ready we found it did not suit our work. My people were quite discouraged. But I said, "We can always remedy that. We can fix it so that the church will be large enough. It is the blessing of the Lord that makes us too small, and you will have to put up with that." So I tried to comfort them. As long as I was home everything was all right, but while I was away the discouragement increased among the people. The leading brethren came into opposition with the city authorities and the police spaced off certain parts of the church, and when I came home I found the balcony of our small auditorium had been closed, and in the large auditorium they had closed one of the side balconies. I did not know just what to do at the time, but after awhile I prevailed upon the city to change their decision and we were able to take in more people. But the church proved too small anyway, and it was only three years old. I did not dare to talk about a new building. If I chanced to mention it, they only laughed

During that time I felt quite an urge to come back to the United States. Then another thought came to me. I might quit my pastorate and travel in Sweden. I thought the work had got to the place where I couldn't do anything more. I was having a great battle, and one day while I was alone in my room I threw myself upon my face before God and said, "God, you must do something so that I may know your will." Two or three days later a man came to me and said, "There is a man in the city who wishes to speak to you. He has some money that he wants to give to the cause of the Lord. He was a million-aire. This man said, "After making my will leaving each of my children



their share, I have about fifty thousand dollars left, and I have thought I might give it to you. I have heard that you have been contemplating going to America. If you stay home I will give you twenty-five thousand dollars at once, and perhaps you will get the rest later on." That was my answer from the Lord. In this way the Lord opened the way for us to build a new church, the largest in all Scandinavia. Since then the work has doubled and tripled. How wonderful it is to have the leadings of the Lord in our life. I see now if I had left that work in Stockholm it would have been the worst thing I could have done.

I would like to say to you, "Wait on the Lord." Wait for His guidance and receive His revelation. When you find it hard and difficult just wait on the Lord, and He will do wonderful things. Not because you are so wonderful but because you are so small and insignificant. It is His work. When you stop, He gets a chance to do something for you.

I do not often speak of the work in Sweden, but many in America have asked me to do so. But I feel that I have had nothing whatever to do with it. I have just been in it and I have seen it. I am just a witness to what the Lord has done. If we leave ourselves in the hands of the Lord He will do wonderful things. Give your life into the hands of the Lord. We read in Psalm 25:9, "The meek will he guide in judgment: and the meek will he teach his way."

I am so happy that I can be in the work of the Lord and just stand still and see the wonderful things God is doing. If we yield to Him, He will work, for it is His work.

## A Prayer Conference in the Eastern District

In his book on promoting and conducting a successful revival, Dr. R. A. Torrey, internationally known Evangelist and Bible Teacher said:

1. "First of all, we must recognize our need of Him," that is the Holy Spirit.

2. "In the next place, we must take our eyes off men."

3. "We must surrender absolutely to the Holy Spirit's control."

4. "We must pray."

5. "We must furnish someone for the Spirit to work through, and something for the Spirit to use."

We can say that these conditions seem to appply to prayer conferences just as much as to revivals. However is not a prayer conference a spiritual revival meeting in the truest sense?

For the glory of God I write to tell you something of our latest Eastern District prayer conference at the Lighthouse Church, Brooklyn, N. Y. on January 13-15, from which we have just returned.

It was not our purpose to aim at putting something across in the shape of a definitely set program, but to humbly and earnestly seek God and trust the Holy Spirit to lead at every step. The results later demonstrated two important facts: (1) God will really visit and bless His people in an extraordinary manner when conditions are met. See Joel 2. (2) Persistent humbling, confessing, praying and obedience to the Holy Spirit will bring results.

Brooklyn Lighthouse Church under the able leadership of Pastor and Mrs. M. Wells whole-heartedly co-operaated with about eighty ministers, missionaries, their wives and friends, besides members of local congregations, to make the prayer conference a great spiritual success. Services were held at 9:30, 2:30, and 7:30.

The first meeting on the 13th was given entirely to prayer and waiting on the Lord. There was no effort to make things go. God met us and we did some real praying. We went to lunch about 12:30 and at the 2:30 service it was our intention to bring a message from God's Word. However the Holy Ghost led us to take up prayer requests and we had a prolonged season of prayer. Afterwards we opened the meeting for testimony to answered prayer as we had no liberty to preach. This might appear to have been a weak

Note the words at the foot of the article: "May we humbly suggest that if District Prayer Conferences of a similar character could be held throughout the fellowship, great good would be accomplished and true revivals would develop in consequence." Let all District officers take this splendid recommendation to heart.

The Eastern District Council commences its annual camp meeting with three preliminary days given to prayer. As a result, there is always great blessing in the camp. Other Districts would do well to follow them in this sure road to spiritual

meeting, but God was there and the Holy Spirit was getting a grip on things. It was a spiritual meeting. At the evening service special prayer and anointing for the sick was followed by District Superintendent, Flem Van Meter's bringing a very timely message on prayer. We followed this with an altar service.

The morning of the second day, we began with hymns of worship and had much of the Lord's presence. Brother Byron Jones brought a simple message from the recorded prayer of Solomon at the dedication of the Temple and illustrated with some personal experiences. Another veteran, Brother Thomas Twiss, followed with a testimony of a prayer life in which for years he had given 6-8 hours each day, and sometimes all day to the ministry of prayer and this with amazing results. Yet withal

there is no appearance of strain or spookishness, but a simple, loving and almost breezy manner that is very pleasant. We then went to prayer. God was with us and we had lots of real inspir-

The afternoon service opened with a lovely atmosphere prevailing and we rejoiced in the privilege of spiritual worship. Prayer was offered by someone present, and then W. Lloyd Shirer, a missionary from the Gold Coast, gave a heart stirring talk of practical experiences in the prayer life, and forcefully presented the needs and opportunities of the foreign field. He was followed by the writer in a talk from Joel 2, to which the Spirit witnessed, and we then rallied around the altar for a blessed season of

At the evening service, following the preliminaries, Brother Wesley R. Steelberg gave a tremendously impressive talk on pleasing God, bringing from the Scriptures both the acceptable and the unacceptable in worship, life and service. Our after service was held in the basement where we could be undisturbed by those leaving early. I think about all the ministers and many others besides went down for a great time of deeper consecration and seeking God. We were pressing in for the fuller realization of His power and grace, knowing we should need it later.

The morning of the third day, which was truly the greatest of all in point of depth, anointing and manifest blessing, Brother Ewald of Elizabeth, N. J. brought a truly great message on intercession. It was bread from heaven with much oil upon it. How we rejoiced in the presence of God. We felt like the disciples on the Mount. This was no ordinary day. God was there in power and we called seriously upon Him. We felt we were getting somewhere.

It is a proven experience that to fully enjoy and profit by these prayer conferences one must be willing to make sacrifices and come to stay throughout.

"Prejudice against persons or their ministry can blind one altogether to any good in them." Have you ever heard of what well-seasoned saints in earlier days called "living the detached life"? It is a very real thing, particularly after one has had "clinging fingers" for various earthly objects; and God has tenderly but firmly loosened the grasp from those very objects however dear to the heart. Perhaps you still hold them, but more loosely now, with a heart centered in Him, remembering those words of Paul, "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above. . . Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God."

There is a story of the tiny lad whose hand was caught in a priceless vase belonging to his mother. Anxious to preserve the vase the mother gently tugged at the little hand in an effort to release the prisoned member. All to no avail! Finally she said, "Sonny, are you holding your fingers out straight when I pull?" "No muvver," came the answer, "I tant, or I'll lose my free pennies." Clinging fingers and three pennies were that laddie's price of liberty. But the situation understood, mother soon solved the difficulty for all concerned. Do not God's children ofttimes lose the fullness of their glorious blood-bought liberty in a very similar manner?

Did you ever hold an object so tightly that you left the impress of your fingernails in the palm of your hand? This very thing can happen to your heart also. You can hold a treasure—friend or object—so closely that you will only hurt yourself. You will become blinded to the real value of living, and the balance of true consecration to God. Pressing the natural so closely will cut the sweetness and closeness of communion with the only One who ever loved you enough to die in your stead—Jesus.

If you really give Him first place, hold precious the trysting time with Him in prayer and His Word and honor His claim on time or strength above any other—you will find yourself more perfectly adjusted to the other relationships of life. You will be a better friend, employee, daughter, sister, lover. Like discovering the key to a puzzle, perplexing combinations will be simplified and adjusted when He is considered first. The very fact that you are seeking His glory will make you self-forgetful and conscious of others' welfare.

Some have clung tenaciously only to find the treasure wither in their clasp, and one day the clinging fingers relaxed to reveal only ashes. We often doom the very idol, or treasure by clinging too closely to it. It has been said, "What we hold we lose; what we give we keep." It sounds strange, but it is true. Do you cherish that friendship, that alabaster box? Loosen from it your feverish, overeager fingers. Ask God to hold the treasure at His own wise disposal; then rest in His love and find how beautifully He keeps that which you have committed unto Him against that day.

No more worry lest you lose the treasure, for it is in His keeping; no more divided heart and double vision, for He is first; no more grieving over idols torn from your clinging fingers, for whatever comes is His appointment and there is no disappointment in His precious will. This is "the detached life"—good for old and young

The barren bearing. Rebekah, like Sarah before her, was barren. But Isaac prayed, and God answered his petition. In Isa. 54:1 there is a call, "Sing, O barren, thou that didst not bear!" Israel as a nation, severed from the Heavenly Olive Tree, bears

no fruit. But, thank God, a day is coming when this desolate, barren nation, of whom God speaks, "Thou that didn't not travail with child," shall have children in abundance. Isa. 54:1-13. The apostle Paul, who bids us follow him as he followed Christ, tells us, "My heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved." Rom. 10:1. Are you praying for barren Israel? Read the wonderful promises of blessing and restoration that God gives to Israel in Ezekiel 37, and note what He says, "I will yet for this be enquired of . . to do it for them." Ezek. 36:37. "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem," says the Lord to us, stating further, "they shall prosper that love thee." Psalm 122:6.

Two types. Rebekah bore two children. As they grew up, how diverse in temperament and character they were. Esau, like Nimrod before him, was a hunter, a man of the fields. He was one whom the world would call "a good sport." It is good to get out into God's great open air and enjoy the fields, for bodily exercise does profit for a little while. But there is something more important that must not be neglected—the cultivation of godliness, which has profit not only in this life but

in the life to come. Jacob, like his father and grandfather, was "a plain man, dwelling in tents." Like them, you will find him a man of tent and altar. The natural man admires Esau and despises Jacob. Esau was self-sufficient and independent. Jacob, full of frailty, became very dependent on God—the God who wondrously transformed him, changing him from a supplanter into a prince. You may be as full of meanness as an egg is of meat, but there is One to whom you can come who will give you a Peniel experience. Gen. 32:24-30. By His Spirit He will change you from glory to glory until you become like Him who is altogether lovely.

The birthright. It was a most important thing to be the owner of a birthright, for the elder son always had a "double portion"—twice as much as the other sons. It was for him to carry on the inheritance of his

father. Elisha wanted a double portion of the Spirit that was upon Elijah. He counted this of inestimable value and would not be denied this boon. O that men today desired the fullness of the Spirit in the way Elisha did, and were as earnest in seeking God for the same as he was. Jacob knew that this birthright was a worthwhile thing to have. He esteemed it highly. Did he need to go about getting this boon in the way he did? No. The Holy Spirit is given

to those who ask, not to those who scheme. It was in the purpose of God to give Jacob this boon anyway, for His word of promise to Rebekah (Gen. 25:23) could not be broken.

A mess of pottage. Esau did not hold the birthright to be of any great value (as many these days esteem the new birth and the anointing with a double portion of God's Spirit). And so, when he was very hungry and Jacob bargained to purchase this birthright, giving in exchange a single meal of "bread and lentil pottage" (according to the Septuagint Version), he sold out at so small a price. In the New Testament we are warned of the danger "lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright. For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for

he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears." Heb. 12:16, 17. There was no changing the decision of that day. How solemn. The Spirit of God strives with many, but they choose the temporal rather than the eternal, and the day will come when they will lift up their eyes in hell like the rich man did, and find no place of repentance.

Too late. A merchant was opening a store. His stock of new merchandise had arrived, and he was busy unpacking. It was a Saturday. An insurance agent came in. "Too busy to see you today," said the merchant. "Come around Monday and I'll get you to write me a policy." That night his store burned and he lost his all.

Many are making the same mistake, neglecting to close in with God's offer of mercy. They will have plenty of leisure time in hell to regret their decision to put off their acceptance of God's free pardon.

Jacob's deception The 27th chapter of Genesis tells of Jacob's stealing the blessing that Isaac purposed to give Esau. Rebekah had a large part in this deception. Both Rebekah and Jacob had to suffer for this. Esau was so enraged because Jacob stole his blessing that he purposed to kill him, so it became necessary for Jacob to become an exile. Apparently Rebekah never saw him again, for there is no mention of such a meeting. My dear mother used to say, "There is no truer law than this, that what a man sows he shall also reap. Tacob deceived his father, and later his children deceived him." "With what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again," is a law that applies to evil as well as to good.

Isau's choice. Although Abraham and Issac had lived lives of complete separation, Esau despised their godly example, becoming unequally yoked in marriage with two women from the idolatrous Hittites. This was a grief to his parents. Isaac said

to Jacob, "Thou shalt not take a wife of the daughters of Canaan. Arise, go to Padan-aram . . . and take thee a wife from thence of the daughters of Laban thy mother's brother." Jacob obeyed, and God blessed. God calls us to complete separation and we find that as we obey this call He surely blesses us.

Obadiah's prophecy. The spirit of hatred that Esau had in his heart towards Jacob was later manifested by the seed of Esau against the seed of Jacob. And God's judgment came against them for this. God spoke through the prophet Obadiah: "For thy violence against thy brother Jacob shame shall cover thee, and thou shalt be cut off for ever." What they sowed in violence they were to reap, for the Lord declared, "As thou hast done, it shall be done unto thee: thy reward shall return

### DECEPTION OF THE DEVIL DOCTORS Mary E. Martin, Liberia

Tua was born in Baklaka, a town about an hour's walk from our station at Feloka. Before his birth a woman devil doctor told his mother that her child would be a devil doctor. When Tua was quite young he was taken back to this woman and his training for office began.

When he came to young manhood he was taken to a devil doctor in Cavalla where he was taken into the forest and taught about the various herbs for making medicines, which they believe will protect them from witches. Soon after this he went to Ganaju town to see the most powerful devil doctor in the tribe. This one cut off his hair and then began the supposedly supernatural. He told him to sit by the fire, then to shake himself and go around in the hut and break all the pots and dishes, to show the people he had supernatural power. He succeeded in deceiving the people but he said later that he knew all the time that it was only he and no supernaural power.

Then came the day for his initiation. During this ceremony a chicken was killed and its head hidden under a drum. While the people were hiding it the big devil doctor took Tua away and told him where to find it. When he came back and went immediately to where it was hid, the people acclaimed him as a true devil doctor.

Some time later he was returned to his home town for final initiation. Many people gathered for the ceremony and feast. A dog was killed and its head hidden outside the town in the bush. Tua was to find it. Again the devil doctor told him where it would be; consequently he returned from the bush, bringing the dog's head. Then the happy people began to dance through the town. From this time many people came to him to buy jujus, medicines, etc. For the next ten years he carried on in this manner, knowing all of the time that he was just deceiving the people.

#### True Light Comes

In the spring of 1931 a mission station was opened at Feloka. Soon a blessed revival started in many towns. Great numbers of people were saved and hundreds of idols were burned. Churches were built by the converts in forty or fifty towns. The revival came also to Baklaka, and a church was built on the site where the town people had gathered for the initiation of the proper devil doctor many years before

young devil doctor many years before.

Tua's children attended Sunday School and Church, learned the gospel songs, and would also witness about Jesus at home. One day Tua was lying on his mat in his house when a number of children came in singing gospel songs. The devil doctor heard a strange sound from heaven, a bright light shone around him and he was blind until about midnight. The Lord dealt very definitely with his soul, and the Holy Spirit

revealed the way of salvation very clearly to him. The power of God shook him. His family did not know what was happening to him, so called one of the faithful Christians. When he came he told Tua to give up his idols and upon asking him how he then felt in his heart he received this reply, "All my life I do this work and when people sing in my house it make me angry. Now the Lord save me, too." Immediately he wanted to burn all his jujus and medicines and brought them to the chapel. The church was crowded for all the people had heard of his conversion. What a wonderful testimony he gave! His ebony face shone with the glory and blessing of God. He confessed to the people to whom he had sold jujus all those years that it was all a fake, and that from that day on he was going to serve Jesus. Together with his means of idol worship many others burned theirs, for many turned to follow the Lord

Several years have passed—he has suffered much persecution from his people because he no longer makes money for them. He is now a leper, having lost some of his fingers and toes; his body is thin and he is poor in this world's goods, but his faith is rich in God. Please put him on your prayer list that he may remain true to God and have an abundant entrance into the city of God where there will be no sickness, sorrow, or want.

About two weeks ago I visited a little village called Yapalsi to give them the Word of Life. They received us gladly, and it is seldom, if ever, that I have seen such eagerness to hear the Word of God. They meditated upon every word that was spoken and it was a pleasure to watch their faces as the expressions changed from amazement to understanding, from sorrow to light as we told of Him who came to help and save.

Since then we have been going there almost daily. One Saturday night I took four of our solid Christians with me. We took with us a strong lantern which illuminated the open space in the village, and everyone came. They gave rapt attention as the Christians were preaching, and after a couple of hours we saw one of those sights which are not easily forgotten, when several dozen men, women and children knelt and asked God for mercy.

#### Pressing on in God

I must mention Brother Adutwun. He is a man who used to be a member of the Church of England. About four months ago he stood up in one of our meetings and confessed before God. It was not a nice story we heard but he meant to go through, and God met him as he made the consecration. A short time later he and his wife were baptized. Soon after that he was promoted in the government service to a position of great responsibility. The Christian government doctor told me that this would never have come about had they not seen a great change in this man.

His heart continued to cry out to God for more and one night he stayed after the meeting to pray. After several hours he went home but being unable to sleep, he returned to the church to pray. Soon he felt the power of God surging through his soul and, as he said to me later, "I began to speak something which I cannot follow, and after that night I have to stop in my work and praise God." It was with great joy that I heard his story, since it has pleased the Lord to pour out His Spirit upon souls in the Gold Coast. Others are now getting hungry and we trust that many more will soon receive.

This week we shall baptize eleven more who have been saved and have received two months of instruction in the Word of God. When these have been received into the fellowship of the church, it will have more than doubled in the last five months. How we praise God for the victory of Calvary!

## The Great Flood #

The newspapers have been filled with the story of "the greatest flood since the days of Noah," as the swollen waters of the Ohio River have pressed their way through the Ohio Valley, past Cairo, Ill., and Memphis, Tenn., and on to New Orleans.

From the very first we have been apprehensive for our own Pentecostal people in the flood area. With all communications closed, only fragmentary reports have reached us but they have confirmed our worst fears. There are many Pentecostal people and several assemblies in Louisville. Three-fourths of the city has been under water. Paducah, Ky., Lawrenceburg, Ind., and many other large cities on the Ohio River have been completely inundated, and the population have fled to higher ground. As we write this report, we learn the flood waters are lapping at the top of the wall at Cairo, and who knows whether the levees will hold and the city be saved.

Brother O. E. Nash, Superintendent of the Kentucky District writes, "We are just about practically paralyzed. Frankfort, Ky., has suffered greatly. We will not know until matters begin to clear up whether there is anything left at Frankfort or not. We have been deeply concerned about Louisville, especially our Brother T. E. Gannon. We do know that many of our people have suffered beyond words to describe. Families are separated, homes swept away, everything gone. Taylorsville, thirty-five miles from Louisville, had to be evacuated. We have a postcard, written hastily by our pastor there, J. J. Humphries and wife, stating that they were fleeing miles inland from the Ohio River. Paducah, from all reports, has suffered terribly. Locally (Cincinnati) everything is paralyzed still. We are not able to have meetings in our own Assembly because of the curtailing of light and power. We are trying to do our best to minister to as many as possible but this disaster has had the most peculiar effect upon one's entire being, indescribable in words. It has been a pitiful sight to see houses and barns, garages and outbuildings going down the river almost continually day and night.'

Herman R. Rose writes from Clay City, Ind. "Our church in Clay City has opened its homes to all the members of the Assembly of God in Evansville. Most of them live in the uninundated section, but the church is flooded with water. I would suggest that the Assemblies of God throughout the United States send relief to our Assemblies along the Ohio River, to enable them to re-establish places of worship.

A letter from Philip Darner of Ottumwa, Iowa, states, "Realizing that there are a number of our brothers and sisters in this great flood zone, I feel led of the Lord to send a check for \$5.00 to start a fund with which the Lord's work can be re-established in that district. We know that these people will be left almost destitute and it will be hard for them to carry on. I believe that many others will want to join in sending offerings for this purpose."

Only a tithe of the story of suffering and devastation has been told and the end is not yet. The flood will be extended down the Mississippi River, and thousands of people will barely escape with their lives as they are being removed from the threatened area. Their homes will be destroyed and their churches ruined. We ought to do something to help them if humanly possible. Offerings for this purpose can be sent to Noel Perkin, Missionary Secretary, 336 W. 

MOSCOW, ROME OR JERUSALEM?

F. W. Pitt, an intelligent writer on prophecy, says: "Moscow, Rome, Jerusalem; these are the three cities specifically named in Scripture as being the center of conflicting powers which in the last days will contend for world supremacy.

"Twenty years ago none of these cities were in the forefront of international politics. Moscow occupied a secondary position in Russia, whose capital was St. Petersburg, but the U. S. S. R., by some mysterious urge, has transferred the seat of government to Moscow. Had it been done intentionally, the requirements of prophecy could not have been more exactly satisfied. God, behind the shadows, works His purpose out.

"Rome was chiefly important as an exihibition of ruins and art pointing back to the vanished glories of the old Roman Empire. So long as its claims to power were divided between the Quirinal and the Vatican, its hope of world dominion was futile. But again as if to meet the requirements of prophecy, the King of Italy and the Pope are reconciled under the hand of Dictator Mussolini.

"Jerusalem, for centuries crushed by the unholy Turk, had no claim to world interest save only as the Holy City of scattered Israel, 'where also our Lord was crucified.' But yet again to satisfy the requirements of prophecy, Jerusalem is rising from the dust of ages, putting on her beautiful garments, heaping up the treasures of the land and thus, so long as she is unreconciled to her God, laying herself open to the rival ambitions of Moscow and Rome.

"The issue is: Shall Moscow, Rome or Jerusalem be the Mistress of the World? The Soviet says Moscow. Mussolini says Rome, but God says Jerusalem."

RESURRECTION OF DEAD SEA

"Popular imagination has called the Dead Sea accursed; but its curse is steadily being changed to a blessing," observes Palestine Post. "The Palestine Potash Company, owners of the great Dead Sea concession, first tore down the eerie and romantic veil that obscured this area, bringing life and activity to its desolate shores. In 1932, the Kallia Resort was established on the Dead Sea shore by the Company of that name, which sought to exploit the climatic, health and scenic qualities of the place. It erected a restaurant, some rooms for visitors, a large verandah for dancing and a few huts for bathing cubicles; it also introduced an omnibus service from Jerusalem, and placed a motor-boat on the sea."

#### ILLUSIONS

The following words of Andreas Nin (italics ours), noted Spanish communist, explain some of the strategy with which Communism attacked Spain:-"We began first with an educational campaign. . . . We undertook to group the masses round the symbols of democracy, such symbols as they could understand, to give the masses illusions . . .

In other words, Communist leaders fool the people with talk of "democracy," "social justice," etc., create a "popular front," ride to power on it, and then show their true colors. It is a method worthy of him whose coming will be "with all deceivableness of unrighteousness." 2 Thess. 2:9.

#### CIRCULATING 5,000 EVANGELS

"We are known as the Johnsville Assembly of God, located at Johnsville, Ohio, and have a membership of 100. During the past year there have gone out from our assembly approximately 5,000 Pentecostal Evangels. We used the Evangel box, which took 30 copies per week, but the greatest number were mailed out. Many of these went to ministers.

At first we divided the community into districts, and on Saturdays the brethren went out and distributed the Evangels. We started with about 50 per week, but found we could mail them out cheaper, so at the present time we are mailing out 74 Evangels per week. This does not include our Evangel box.

Our system for financing the work is as follows: We solicit our assembly each quarter to find out how many Evangels each member desires to mail out during the next quarter. The number has slowly increased during each quarter. One man in our assembly has been sending the Evangel to 15 different homes

In addition to this, we have received approximately 3120 pieces of literature, consisting of Boys and Girls, Intermediate Young People, and Gospel Gleaners.—Leonard Norris, Pastor.


