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# From the Stage to the Puppit <br> The Personol Testimony of Anno Larssen Bjorner, formerly one of the leading Actresses of Denmark 

gN THE YEAR 1907 the Pentecostal Movement came to Denmark. A Norwegian, T. B. Barratt, formerly a Methodist minister, was instrumental in God's hands in proclaiming to Christendom in Denmark that God baptizes with the Holy Ghost in the same way today as at Pentecost.
This message proved a blessing to many, among whom was my mother, who moved in a circle outside the State Church. Meantime I lived my life in the world, and on the stage, but my mother and the congregation were offering up heartfelt prayers for me.
I went with my mother to the meetings, and heard the heartburning testimonies. Not only did I hear, but I saw it demonstrated. I saw how the people tottered when the Holy Ghost fell upon them. I saw when they left the meeting, how they had to hold on to a lamp-post to save themselves from falling. Thus I got a lively illustration of what is said about the 120 on the day of Pentecost, that they were "full of new wine."
Then I came into that good, but nevertheless painful, state of conviction. I woke up to the realization that I was a sinner; and that is very painful, for there is no peace, no rest anywhere. But it is a much to be desired state, compared to that of those people who live their lives quite different to spiritual truths.

One day a bookseller from Argentina sent me a Spanish translation of Marie Corelli's book, "A Romance of Two Worlds." That was the finishing stroke causing me to make full surrender to God. That book did not lead me into the way of salvation, but it made the love of God so real to me that when I had finished reading it, I got down on my knees and surrendered myself fully
to the Lord, accepting salvation through Jesus Christ. I was accepted of the Lord, accepting salvation through Jesus Christ. I was accepted of the Lord in that same moment. It was God who worked in my heart through the Holy Ghost.
I sprang up, laughed and cried for joy, clapped my hands, went up and down in my room praising God, saying, "I am saved! I belong to Jesus Christ! I have no need to ask other people, for I know that I am a child of God. I know it, I know it!"
That was in the spring of 1908. On the 12th of December I heard Pastor Barratt preach in the Methodist church. His sermon left no impression of fanaticism, such as the newspapers had spoken of, but rather one of authority and of the sanctifying grace of the Holy Ghost. At once I had faith in this clean, honest personality, who spoke with such an authority upon divine truths.

The same day I had an interview with Pastor Barratt at the home of the family where he lived, and the first thing he asked me was, "Are you saved?", "Yes, I am. It happened many months ago." "Then you have testified to your friends at the theater?" "No, that I have not. I dare not. They would not care to listen to such a testimony, and would only laugh at me." "You should let God baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and then the testimony will come of itself."

We knelt down on the spot and prayed, the dean's wife, Pastor Barratt and I, and in a moment the Holy Ghost fell upon me. My whole body shook; it was like waves of fire going through me, over and over again, and my whole being was bathed in light.

The Holy Ghost had come upon me, as Jesus had promised them who believe on Him and who follow Him in

prayer and obedience. Oh, it is not strange that a small, weak human being trembles and shakes when being filled with God's mighty power!

While I lay there under the power of the Spirit, the clock struck half past three. In half an hour I was to be upon the stage. Had I been able to remain in prayer before God then, the same thing would have happened to me as happened to the early Christians, I would have begun to speak in other tongues. But now the work of the Spirit was broken off.
That day I was more in heaven than on earth, while I was playing my role. I began to testify to my friends. I invited them home to my villa and begged Pastor Barratt to come and speak to them. They came and were very much interested, but some of them were offended.

Mrs. Anna Lewini, one of my friends on the stage, was gripped by the Word, and went home from the meeting convinced that she was a sinner. Before eight days had passed she was saved, and

# Soul Anchors for Faith's Crises

A source of great grief to the Lord Jesus was the fact that His mission was misunderstood by the people in general. He came as Deliverer from sin, but they were looking for a Deliverer from Rome's bondage. The crisis came after the feeding of the multitude, when the excited Galileans tried to make him king by force. John 6 .

While the Lord's heart yearned for the salvation of all, He wanted none to come to Him with false hopes or wrong motives. He determined therefore to sift the mixed multitude. This He did by preaching the sermon, on The Bread of Life, in which He told them plainly that He had not come as a political ruler to restore their political life, but had come as a sacrifice to bring. them spiritual life. By eating His flesh and drinking His blood they would have real life.

The sermon produced its intended effect. Like a fan it separated true from false disciples; like a winnowing breeze it blew the chaff away, leaving the wheat behind. "From that time many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him."

Only the Twelve stood with Him now. What a test it must have been to see the crowd leaving, and how hard to keep themselves from being carried away with the popular tide. Yet they stood loyally by His side. But the Master was not through with the sifting. He asked, "Will ye also go away?"" Then Peter answered and said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God."

These words describe the three "anchors" that helped the apostles ride out on the storm: first, earnestness and sincerity; second, a clear understanding of the alternatives before them; and third, devotion to their Master.

1. EARNESTNESS AND SINCERITY
The apostles as a body were thoroughly in earnest. Their supreme desire, was to know the "words of eternal life." Their concern was not about the "meat that perisheth," but about the higher heavenly food.

They meant "business" with God and their sincerity helped them safely through the crisis. Thus shall we, too, ride safely every storm. Earnestness in love (Deut. 6:5), obedience (Psalm $119: 2$ ), trust (Prov. 3:5), prayer (Jer. $29: 13$ ), and repentance (Joel 2:12) will
take us a long way in spiritual things.
There are some things in Christ's message that the apostles could not understand. They did not quite understand how they could eat the flesh and drink the blood of their Master or receive Him as the Bread of Life. But according to their light they prayed, "Lord, evermore give us this bread."

There are in the Scriptures "things hard to be understood" and which for a while may perplex or even tempt to doubt. What shall we do? Jesus said: "If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine." That is: "Set your will on God's side. Try to do what you believe to be His will and God will give you light as fast as you are willing to walk in it." On the other hand, no amount of evidence will convince a man whose will is set against God, or against light. If a man will not do, he shall not know. "Ye will not come to me, that ye might have life."

Horace Bushnell was one of the most brilliant preachers of the last generation. As a teacher at Yale he was an agnostic; he did not know whether there was a God. An interview with an evangelist lead him to face his doubts. He asked himself: "Is there no truth that I do believe? Yes, there is a distinction between right and wrong. Have I ever taken this principle of right for my law? Have I ever thrown myself upon this principle? No, I have not. Then, there is something for me to do. Here then I will begin. If there is a God, He is a right God. If I have lost Him in wrong, perhaps I shall find Him in right. Will He not help me, or perchance, even be discovered by me?" I dropped on my knees and there prayed to the dim God asking for help that I might begin a right life. My soul was borne up into God's help. I rose. The whole sky was luminous about me. It was the morning, as it were, of a new eternity.

It was Horace Bushnell who wrote "The Character of Christ," one of the best books on the Deity of Christ for those who are in doubt.

There was another man from the same college, who, when asked to become a Christian, answered: "I do not believe in Christ. This faith is all in your imagination and emotions." His fellowstudent made the challenge: "Are you willing to give up the sin which you admit you are living? If you are convinced that the Jesus way is the right
way will you follow Him?" He hung his head and counted the cost. At last he said: "No; I will not. I will not give it up for Him, nor for anyone." His heart hardened, his mind darkened, and within a few years his life was a wreck.

What was the difference between Bushnell and this man? The first meant business with God and the second did not. Whatever the crisis, let us keep our hearts right, for "every cloud will wear a rainbow if your heart keeps right."
2. A CLEAR UNDERSTANDING OF THE ALTERNATIVES
"To whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life." They honestly faced the issue: We want eternal life. Where shall we get it if we leave Jesus? From John the Baptist? He is dead. From the scribes and Pharisees? No, there was no going back; it was Christ or chaos. He has the words of eternal life. He alone has the saving message; He alone has the saving name. Acts $4: 12$. Rejection of Him means death. He is the way, the truth and the life.
"Without the Way there is no going; Without the Truth there is no knowing; Without the Life there is no living."
To whom shall we go? The religion of Nature? But can we ask nature, "Nature, please pardon my sins and comfort my heart"? To Science? But it knows nothing of origins, deals only with what can be observed, and cannot touch the reality of things. To "modern Thought" whose theories will be out of fashion in a few years? No! The only hitching post for mind and heart is found in the Christ of God!

Perhaps some have been shaken from their allegiance by getting their eyes upon themselves or upon others. A farmer was once showing a boy how to plough. "O that's easy," said the boy carelessly, and set the plow in motion; but to his surprise it wobbled all over the field. "What were you looking at?" asked the farmer as the boy brought back the plow for a fresh start. "Well, myself mostly," he answered. "You will never plow a straight furrow that way. Lift up your eyes and look away from yourself; look straight ahead and see how you get on." The boy tried once more, but again with absolute failure. Wobble, wobble, wobble went the plow. Again the farmer said: "Did you do what I told you; what were you looking at that time?" "Well, you told me to look straight in front of me," said the boy rather sullenly, "so I looked at the old cow in front over there."

The farmer laughed. "Of course the plow wobbled as the cow moved. You
must have a straight object to look at ; now fix your eyes on that tree standing up in the hedge straight ahead, and don't take your eyes off it." And this time the furrow was ploughed straight.
Let us keep our eyes off self and others and keep them on the Master! 3. CONFIDENCE IN THE CHARACTER OF THEIR MASTER.
The third anchor whereby the apostles were enabled to outride the storm was confidence in the character of Jesus. "And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God." They knew His life, and were convinced that He was the Holy One of God. Their intellect might be perplexed but their heart remained true; hence, while others left in disgust, they continued by His side. Such a Friend and Guide was not to be parted with for a trifle! "We believe and are sure." Yes, they believed because they knew Him personally. For the moment they might not know what they believed about eating His flesh and drinking His blood; but they knew whom they believed!

Christianity is more than doctrine, more than ethics; Christianity is Christ ! A student once came from a stirring but difficult lecture on psychology by Professor William James, and said, "I didn't get much of that stuff, but I got him!", Some doctrinal expositions may go clear over our heads-but we can get Christ! That must have been the sentiment of the Jewish soldier boy who came to his rabbi after hearing a Christian chaplain, and said, "Say, Rabbi, when our Messiah comes what will he have on Jesus?"

When critics come with their objections against Christianity we can point them to the Christ and ask, "What fault do you have to find with Him?"

Dr. W. B. Riley passes on the following story: Some years ago, outlaws murdered Governor Stuenburg of Idaho, William E. Borah-now a conspicuous Senator-was the prosecuting attorney, and Clarence Darrow-the uniform friend of criminals-was the defender.

On a certain afternoon, in connection with the trial, Darrow usurped some hours in a tirade against religion, against government, against home, against everything that good men are accustomed to regard as desirable, and wound up with a string of abuse against Christ and the Bible.

Borah sat like a statue through these hours.

At last the defense rested, and the great lawyer-statesman stood up and walked directly in front of the jurors. He looked at Darrow for a moment; he looked at the face of the judge, and then turned to the waiting crowd in the courtroom. Turning from them to the
jurors, he said: "Gentlemen, when I heard the attorney from Chicago uttering his sneers at your religion and my religion, there came back to me, as there must have come back to you, the recollection of the time when, as a little boy, I stood at my mother's knee and heard her read from our Bible."

Then with a swift, sweeping gesture of his mighty arm at Darrow, his voice rang out through the courtroom:
"Too late; too late, after two thousand years to cry 'fraud' to the Godman of Calvary! Too late, too late, in the dawn of the twentieth century, to write 'impostor' on the brow of the Figure on the Cross!"

We shall be able to ride the fiercest storm of life by carrying the three anchors: Earnestness in our attitude toward God; a calm consideration of the alternatives; and contemplation of the matchless character of Him who is our Lord and Master.

## A Call to Faith

See Peter and John together at the gate Beautiful, talking to the lame man who is asking them for financial assistance. "Silver and gold have I none," said Peter. He did not seem to be the least disturbed by this admission. He may have thought back to that embarrassing moment when the taxes for himself and his Master came due, and there were no funds on hand. It is Matthew the tax collector who tells us this story. The Master said, "Go thou to the sea, and cast an hook, and take up the fish that first cometh up; and when thou hast opened his mouth, thou shalt find a piece of money: that take, and give unto them for me and thee." He who had supplied that need then could be trusted to provide now.

But Peter of the empty pocket had something better than funds. He had faith in the name of Him who had said, "Go . . . preach . . . lo, I am with you alway." He said to the lame man, "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk." "And he leaping up stood, and walked, and entered with them into the temple, walking, and leaping, and praising God."

The financial was by no means the first consideration in the early Church. Yet love-constrained hearts, blessed with all blessings in the heavenlies in Christ Jesus, sold their possessions and lands, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, and laid them down at the apostles' feet. But the apostles soon learned that it was the mind and the will of the Lord that other qualified ones should take care of the financial end of things, and they said: "We will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the Word."

Matthew reports a severe rebuke the Master gave to the Pharisees of His day. "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone." Matt. 23:23, 24. Our Lord was not adverse to their tithing. This was right. But it was wrong to put all the emphasis on this end of things and to overlook the "weightier matters." Read the Gospels, the Acts, and the Epistles, and note the emphasis given to these weightier matters. God
will honor His ministers today as they set forth the word of judgment, mercy, and faith. If we preach the message of Calvary, we cannot but emphasize these three things.
George Muller, who has become to our generation a great example of faith, tells us how simple it all was to him. The verses he greatly loved and joyously obeyed were those of Phil. 4:6, 7. "In nothing be anxious; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." He and his coworkers refused anxiety and cast all their care on their Lover Lord, making known to Him their every need. Then they gave thanks. As they did so, their hearts and minds were flooded with peace. And without taking a single collection and without ever soliciting a penny from anyone, Muller was able to build those five huge orphan homes in Bristol, provide for all the needs of 10,000 orphans, distribute tons of Bibles and gospel literature, and send generous offerings to scores of missionaries. He was one God could trust. He died penniless but gave away more than a million dollars to others.

Hudson Taylor as a young missionary in China, seeing what God had done for George Muller, followed in his simple way of faith. Today there are 1357 missionaries on the active list of the China Inland Mission that Hudson Taylor was led to found. They tell us they have never yet had a collection nor have they ever solicited funds for their work. Not that collections are wrong. We see from 1 Cor. 16:1 that they are perfectly Scriptural. There are times also when one may be led of the Lord to make known some special need to others of the fellowship. But the great secret of the China Inland Mission is a weekly prayer meeting where requests are made known unto God, and He never fails to supply their every need. During the depression, at this weekly prayer meeting of the China Inland Mission the request was made for 200 new missionaries. The Lord answered this prayer. In response to their constant petitions they saw, not a decline, but a substantial increase in their income throughout the days of depression.

Before me lies the life story of Bernard of Clairvaux. It was Bernard who wrote that beautiful hymn, "Jesus, the very thought of Thee, with sweetness
fills my breast," a hymn that after 800 years has lost none of its charm. Says his biographer: "For Bernard the Bible was the one Book. He prayed the prayer of faith for many, and "obstinate diseases were cured." Bernard sent his friend Guibert one day to buy some salt. Guibert asked, "Where is the money ?" "Believe me," said Bernard, "I know not the time when I had gold and silver. He is above who holds my wallet, and my treasures are in His hands." "If I go forth empty," urged Guibert, "so shall I return." Bernard replied, "Fear not, my son, go in peace. He who holds our treasures will be with thee in the way and will grant thee all these things for which I send thee." When he got near the place where he was to make his purchases Guibert met a man who took him to his house and gave him half a bushel of salt and a goodly sum of money. When he returned, Bernard said, "I tell thee, nothing is so necessary to the Christian as faith."

Does not the God of Peter and John, of George Muller, Hudson Taylor, of the China Inland Mission, of Bernard of Clairvaux, still live? Is He not pleased when His saints show forth their simple trust and confidence in Him? The scripture that was a blessing to George Muller and others who have lived lives of faith, still lives, "In nothing be anxious . . . let your requests be made known unto God." In finances? Yes. "In everything." And don't forget that word, with thanksgiving.

Shall not we who seek to be wholly scriptural in everything seek to follow this simple standard set forth in the Book? I must confess I have been greatly distressed by the vast number of begging appeals for funds that have come to me of late, and I cannot but have the conviction that the time spent in getting out these begging letters could have been better employed in making requests known unto God, and that the large cost of circulating these many appeals could have been better spent.

May it not be that sometimes the desire for "bigness," a "bigness" not according to the will of Him who says to us, "Seekest thou great things for thyself? seek them not," is back of some of our work and brings multiplied anxieties and the resorting to over emphasis of what we consider financial needs? If we give ourselves constantly to prayer and to the ministry of the Word, we shall be joyously content when He leads us away from the "big" things that we might attempt in the flesh, into the lowly things of His choice. And is not the pathway of His choice always safe and sure and satisfying?-S. H. F.

Sharing" with Christ

From Conybeare's translation of the Epistles of Paul.
I. God's gift of His Son to share our lot. "Since then the children are sharers in flesh and blood, (Christ) ... partook of the same; that through death He might bring to nought him that had the power of death and might deliver all ... subject to bondage." Heb. 2:14, 15.
II. God's call to the sinner. "God when we were dead in sin, called us to share the life of Christ." Eph. 2:5.
III. What salvation really means. "Reconciled to God by the death of His Son saved by sharing in His life." Rom. 5:10. We have peace with God through the Blood of His Cross, for we are reconciled by His atoning death; but His life imparted is the positive power that saves us from our sins, and gives full assurance and deliverance.
IV. How to share in the life of Christ.

1. By seeing our share in His death. "With Him . . . we were buried by the baptism wherein we shared His death." Rom, 6:4.
2. By appropriating our share in His life. "If we have been grafted into the likeness
of His death, so shall we also share His resurrection." Rom. 6:5. "Now if we have shared the death of Christ, we believe that we shall also share His life." Rom. 6:8.
3. By faith in the working of God. "With Him you were buried . . y you were made partakers of His resurrection, through faith wrought in you by God . . . and you also, when you were dead in the transgressions and uncircumcision of your flesh, God raised to share His life." Col. 2:12, 13.
V. The practical experience.
4. The sharing of His sufferings. "The fellowship of His sufferings, sharing the likeness of His death." Phil. 3:10.
5. The sharing of His weakness. "I, too, share the weakness of His body; yet I share also the power of God, whereby He lives." 2 Cor. $13: 4$.
VI. The future sharing of His glory. "If children, then heirs: heirs of God, and joint heirs with Christ; that if now we share His sufferings, we should hereafter share His glory." Rom. 8:17. "Giving thanks to the Father Who has fitted us to share the portion of the saints in light." Col. 1:12.

## THE PRESIDENT'S INSPIRING WORDS

In his address before the Federal Council of 'Churches, President Roosevelt said: "No greater thing could come to our land today than a revival of the spirit of religion- a revival that would sweep through the homes of the nation and set the hearts of men and women of all faiths to reassertion of their belief in God and their dedication to His will for themselves and for their world. I doubt if there is any problem-social, political, or economic-that would not melt away before the fire of such a spiritual awakening."

These declarations made by our President are self-evidently words of wisdom. They harmonize perfectly with the gracious invitation and promise of God spoken by the Prophet Joel:

President affirmed in his address. How desperate is the nation's need for healing we all know. But is there anything the people can do which would result in the church's bowing in repentance before God? There is. There surely is. The church is made up of people. If the people who compose the church will gather daily about their family altars, confessing and repenting of their sins, seeking the face of God, praying for the pastor and the brethren, soon the church will take on new life. Soon she will accept the invitation of God as given by Joel. And in this way the church will be again, as she has been so many times before, the Saviour of the nation.

Oh, brethren, let us repair the family altars that are broken down. Let us daily gather ourselves together in family groups and there approach the throne of grace in humility. ## SURE OF AN ANSWER

The highest of all the levels of answer is where the answer is not only delayed, not only disguised, not only apparently denied for a time, but after your praying God seems to preserve an absolute and obstinate silence. I asked Mr . Muller a short time before he

I shall meet them in heaven certainly."

Shortly afterwards he died, and I was preaching in his pulpit in Bristol and referred to this occurrence. As I was going out a lady said, "One of those men was my uncle, and he was converted and died a few weeks ago."-A. T. Pierson, D. D.

## The dunday school Tesson

## Samson's Last Days

Lesson for July 10. Lesson Text: Judges 15, 16; Heb. 11:32.
Why the Strong Fail. Why did Samson fail when he had the anointing of the mighty Spirit of God? Why did he fail when he had been "fore-ordained" to be a deliverer and great man?
He lost his testimony. ch. 16:17, 18. His hair, worn long, did not actually give him his great strength; rather it was his testimony to the Nazarite separation-a separation unto God-that gave him his strength. None the less, when he lost his hair, he lost his testimony, and the devil triumphed. "And they overcame him (Satan) by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony, and they loved not their lives unto the death." Rev. 12:11. Separation must come first. It must be kept first. Then Revelation will follow. Study carefully Galatians $1: 15$. The Unconscious Loss of Divine Power. "He wist not that the Lord had departed from him." $16: 20$. He said, "I will go out as at other times before, and shake myself." Over a century ago the members of a certain religious sect lived a life of such close consecration to God that His Holy Spirit rested upon them mightily. Whenever they came together, the power of the Spirit would settle down upon them, and they would vibrate and shake under the anointing. Consequently they were called "Quakers" or "Shakers." Now, we still have the Quakers and Shakers with us, among the other two hundred Protestant sects and divisions in America, but they no longer shake nor quake. They have the name, the old-time name, but not their old-time power! And the name means naught without the power. In like manner, physical manifestations which orre occurred under the direct anointing of the Spirit, can be imitated, repeated in the flesh, when the Spirit Himself has departed.
The Real Power. Thus Samson said, "I will shake myself as of old." Evidently when the anointing had come upon him, he would shake and vibrate, even as people do today. But poor Samson found out that though he could imitate the "shaking" he could not duplicate the power of the Spirit. In our movement we need to beware of this same fallacy. Let us not mistake "worked up" fleshly manifestations, for the "power of God." Let's not "shake ourselves"; let the Lord shake us! "And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness." Acts 4:31.

Backsliders' Manifestations. Babes in Christ are sometimes mystified when they observe someone whom they know to be backslidden "speaking with tongues." We find King Saul when he was backslidden actually prophesying. They need to be instructed in the fact that "the gifts and callings of God are without repentance" (without recall). Thus the backslidden Samson could still shake himself; the backslidden person of today may still imitate the "speaking in tongues," but it accomplishes nothing. It is like "sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal." 1 Cor. 13:1. Only when the gifts are used in the will of God and in
how self-indulgent, how selfish, how carnal he had been. He saw how unconsecrated, how rebellious he had been. He saw how unspiritual and unseparated he had been. He saw far more with empty eye sockets than ever he had seen with his headstrong eyes.
Victory in Trial. Years ago, the specialists informed a young Scotch minisfer that he was about to become blind for life; that he must live in the land of eternal night. He went to his betrothed and told her the dire news, longing to hear her say: "Beloved, your sightless condition will not cause me to love you less, but rather more. You need me more now than ever before. I shall be eyes for you; I shall see for the two of us." But, selfishly, she released herself, by his offer, from her promise to marry him, telling him that she lacked the courage to go through with the contract. He went to his room, and the darkness in his eyes de-
 scended into his soul for a time, until he prayed through to victory. Then God "opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw." God opened his spiritual eyes to see "the King in his beauty and the land that is very far off." And then it was that George Matheson, the Blind Preacher of Scotland, began to sing his "songs in the night." He sang of a love that would not let him go, though his earthly love had forsaken him. He sang of a light that could make even the "flickering torch" of his fast-fading sight seem inconsequential.
"Oh Love, that wilt not let me go,
I rest my weary soul in Thee.
O Light, that followest all my way,
I yield my flickering torch to Thee.
My heart restores its borrowed ray,
That in Thy sunshine's glow its day
May brighter, fairer be."
Regaining Lost Power. "Howbeit the hair of his head began to grow again." 16:22. Some things can grow in the dark.
the Spirit will they accomplish that whereunto they were sent.

Seeing Without Eyes. "They put out his eyes." 16:21. In olden days a Greek mystic deliberately put out his own eyes." When asked why he did so, he replied, "In order that I might see better!" What did he mean? He referred to "inner sight"-the power of "intro-spection." "Oh, would the gods the giftie gie us, to see ourselves as ithers see us," sang Bobbie Burns. And Paul puts it, "Let a man examine himself." Introspection-to look within. At Gaza, poor eyeless Samson, chained to the yoke of the millstone, going around in circles, had plenty of time for introspection, to look within his own heart, to examine himself and discover where first he began to stray from the will of God. In his sightless condition he began to "see himself." He saw

Samson's hair did. His testimony did. He recovered his testimony in the dark room of introspection and repentance. Years ago our family had a canary which lost its beautiful goiden song. The bird-store proprietor advised us to put the bird in the dark. We did so, and soon, under the cover, "Dickey" began to murmur his trilling, rolling song. Gradually we gave him more and more light, and with the increase of light there came from his swelling throat, long liquid outbursts of pure song, praising his Creator with all his "might."

God's Great Grace. Thus God places His children in the dark room, that they might recover their song, their testimony. "He giveth songs in the night." "He restoreth my soul." Thank God for a second chance and a third. But not in the life to come-only (Continued on Page Ten)

The vast fertile acres of Canada are available to any Jew who is prepared to settle on them, according to a statement made by Canadian emigration officials.

## NEW METHOD OF SOUL-WINNING

## DESPAIR

$B^{\prime} N a i$ Brith magazine reports that 2,000 Jews have committed suicide since Germany seized Austria. According to Times despatch: "The number of suicides, especially among Jews, has been sensational. One of the most closely guarded official secrets is the number of burials in Jewish cemeteries. An American correspondent nevertheless succeeded in getting the suicide figures for three days in one week. They were 131, 201, and 205. On a single day last week the number of Jewish suicides alone was 112."

## MOVIE MADNESS

A bill, introduced by Dr. Fuat Unay, influential Member of the Turkish Parliament, would prevent Turkish children under 16 from attending the movies. The bill says, in effect, that films have a detrimental effect on children because: "They distort their brains. They shake their nerves. They suggest adventurous ideas. They make girls fond of make-up, jewels, and expensive dresses. They convey, prematurely, information about love and love making. They inspire violent passions."
Modern people charge criticisms of the movies to "straitlaced Christianity." But Turkey is not a Christian country.

## WAR PREPARATION

According to Revelation: Estonian laborers, recently returned from Russian coal mines where they had been asked to work during the past few years because of the shortage of skilled miners, tell interesting stories in the papers of Tallinn, formerly Revel, capital of Estonia. They reported that numerous freight trains labeled, "agricultural machinery," were filled with war supplies on their way to Siberia. They affirmed that the whole of the Soviet Far-East is in fullest mobilization, convinced that war with Japan is imminent.

## NATIVE WORK IN ETHIOPIA

According to the Evangelical Christian, the gospel cause is advancing in Ethiopia despite the fact that missionaries have been evicted. "The missionaries have sought to teach the native Christians that the responsibility was really theirs, and to keep the worship and organization of the little churches so simple that the natives themselves could carry it on. In most cases the native Christians have been assuming responsibility. Before the missionaries left Wolamo, there were more baptized believers in that tribe than in any other, but more have been baptized and added to the church since the missionaries came away than had been in all the years they had been there."

## CHURCH ATTENDANCE

According to Herald of Holiness: One statistician states that "only 6 per cent of our nation attend services on Sunday morning, and 2 per cent on Sunday evening. About 40 per cent of the American people are on church registers but only 29 per cent ever attend church. Among $13,000,000$ Negroes in America, $7,000,000$ are unchurched. There are 250,000 unchurched people of all races in Pittsburgh; 400,000 in Cleveland; 300,000 in St. Louis; 250,000 in Seattle; 425,000 in San Francisco ; $1,000,000$ in Los Angeles ; 4,000,000 in New York City. The unchurched in New York City alone equal the combined population of Idaho, Wyoming, Colorado, Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico."

## WINNING JEWS

A campaign has been launched for the prayerful distribution of a quarter million New Testaments among Jewish people in various lands. A special Testament is being prepared, in which verses that signify the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies appear in bold-face type, thus showing the Jews that the New Testament is the com pletion and fulfillment of Old Testament revelation, and that Jesus is the true Messiah, and the Saviour of both Jews and Gentiles. A great volume of intercessory prayer is being sought, and efforts are made to enroll a body of 50,000 intercessors. Bible book-marks, containing suggestions for daily prayer, have been printed, and may be obtained from George T. B. Davis, 1505 Race St., Philadelphia, Pa.

## in this life. "He, that being often reproved

 hardeneth his neck, shall suddenly be cut off, and that without remedy," i. e., no second chance the other side of the grave. And Samson in his darkness longed for a second chance, longed for one God-given opportunity to redeem himself. Notice his prayer in 16:28. God gave him the chance that he wanted. The scene in $16: 26-31$ is couched in language which is amorig the grandest in all literature, and around which a mighty opera has been written. God gave him another chance. He did the same for Peter, "When thou art turned again strengthen thy brethren." He did likewise for David, who prayed, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." He will shortly do it for the House of Israel. Ezek. $36: 26,27$.Divine Re-creation. Read again in Jer. 18:3-4 about Jeremiah's visit to the potter's house: "Then I went down to the Potter's house, and behold, he wrought a work upon the wheels. And the vessel that he made of clay was marred in the hand of the potter: so he made it again another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make it." Many years ago an assistant in the laboratory of the great chemist and physicist Faraday reported to the master the loss of a cherished silver cup, which had accidently fallen into a container of corrosive acid. Faraday took the acid, which had apparently destroyed the silver cup, and by pouring in another liquid, under heat, he resolved the contents of the crucible into the component parts. Carefully he poured out the acid into one receptacle and the molten silver into still another. He then poured the silver into a cup mold, and when it had cooled off, took his engraving tools and carved on the re-shaped, recovered cup the design which it originally had.

## From the Stage to the Pulpit

 (Continued from Page Qne) within another eight days she was filled with the Holy Spirit and praised God in new tongues. Today she is a missionary in Ceylon.In the month of June I traveled on my last journey with the show, but none of my companions there suspected that. In the cloakroom Anna Lewini and I prayed to God between the acts of "Cameliadamen."
When we returned home to Copenhagen, God spoke to me through a letter from Pastor Barratt, calling me to leave the stage and go out and tell the people what God had done for me. I sent my notice to my manager at the theater. I wrote that I could not continue, for God had saved my soul and baptized me with the Holy Ghost, so that I must be released from my contract.
Now that was not so easy. I had a contract for several years, and if I broke it I would have to pay a fine of $\$ 5,000$, and this amount I did not have. Then my manager advised me, through my lawyer, to allow myself to be taken to a nerve clinic to be mentally examined. If I were not in my right mind, I should not have to pay the fine.
During two months I was at the clinic, and was kept strictly isolated, not allowed to speak to other people. But they could not prevent God from speaking to me, or me from speaking to Him. One day the professor said to me: "If I am to give you a certificate of your mental condition, it will be that you are the only' sane person here, and that all the rest of us are mad."
In the meanwhile he wrote to my manager, stating that I was in a religious crisis and that he should not reckon with me for the present; it would soon be over. But it never was!

After my stay at the clinic I began to teach foreign languages in order to provide myself with the necessities of life; but it was a poor living. Then I traveled in Scandinavia. I would read from beautiful religious books and then give a short testimony. Some people said, "You spoil the reading by the testimony." Others desired that I should give up reading and only testify. It is not easy to satisfy all! I met Mr. Sigurd Bjorner, who was Secretary of the Y. M. C. A. at Helsingor, and we were married.

In 1914 we began to hold tent meetings on the coast. A great crowd of people gathered together, the kind of people who never attend such meetings -real Copenhageners. One man, who had been blessed in these meetings, gave us a sum of money with which to buy a larger tent (instead of using the small
one that was borrowed), and to carry on this work which was taking root so fast. And so we did. Later on this man presented us with a "gospel van," so that we could pack our tent and benches in it, and live in it, thereby saving hotel expenses.

We had a nice time. We drove around from north to south in our country, and preached the "Glad Tidings." One fine day our van rolled into Copenhagen, and the horses stopped on the green meadow at a place called "Trianglen" which extended to a park. We did not stop the horses, they simply would not go on, and so we thought: "Well, it is here that God means we should settle down and put up the tent." That summer there was quite a stir on the Triangle. Crowds flocked to the meetings evening after evening. Many were saved, the Holy Spirit fell, and the sick were healed.

The gospel van stood by the side of the tent. There we lived all summer and the following winter. People who passed by and knew who lived in the van, shook their heads deploringly as they thought of the "poor Bjorners" who lived in a van in the midst of all the snow and sleet of winter. "Fancy, that that should be the end of Anna Larssen." She had not even a roof over her head as proper people had, and she slept in a little folding tent-bed, and her husband slept on a plank under the kitchen table!" Yes, that he did. But what did it matter if we were cramped for space, and had but few comfortsGod manifested His glory in that little gospel van.

One day a mother came and begged us to pray for her little girl who had scarlet fever. The doctor had ordered her to be taken away to the hospital. We prayed for little Lydia with the "laying on of hands," and God made her well immediately. The red rash disappeared in the course of a few hours, and she went to school quite bright. In the course of the following day we were besieged by journalists and school inspectors. The doctor who had diagnosed the case as "scarlet fever" and the other doctor who-after God had healed the girl-declared that she had not had scarlet fever at all, came into conflict with each other in a public discussion about the matter in one of the papers.

The result was that people stood in line the following days to come inside and be prayed for. And God saved, God healed, and God filled with His Spirit. Oh, what a time we had!
One day a large, stout man came and sought salvation for his soul. He was also incurably ill with a tumor in his stomach. God both saved him and cured him on the spot. The next day he gave
his bandage to my husband. It was nothing less than a miracle: a tumor removed by prayer to God!
Then in 1922 a building called "Evangeliehuset" was erected at the Triangle, on the spot where the horses had obliged us to put the tent. The cost of this house was $\$ 27,500$, and all this money came in small sums from the members of the congregation, who were nearly all of them without means.
Strangers have wondered that we have been able to manage without appealing to the public. That we attribute entirely to God's blessing. People's money can go a wonderfully long way when their hearts are right with God. If they give their tenth to the Lord, according to the command of Scripture, then the Lord has promised that the windows of heaven shall be opened so that there will be an overflow.
In 1925 a large public kitchen close by "Evangeliehuset" was burned down. That evening the wind was in the direction of our house, so that the heat caused all our window-panes opposite the "People's Kitchen" to break, and already the fire had begun to spread upon our roof and marquee. The fire inspector sent us a message that we must vacate the church, as it could not be saved.
But the congregation united in prayer to God; the next moment the wind changed to another direction, and then came the message that the house was saved. The rough element cursed and swore because the Christian "rag-tag, bob tail rabble" had come out all right; but inside the house there was thanksgiv ${ }^{-}$ ing to our heavenly Father who had thus miraculously saved our dear community house!
