EHOLD the Lamb of God, revealed? he exclaims, as he describes which beareth the sin of the world." John 1:29, margin. "And when they were come

to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified Him." Luke 23:33. The hour had come! The Lamb slain

from the foundation of the world was now to be slain before the eyes of the world. By picture lessons and prophetic voices, for centuries before, God had been foretelling this dread hour; and He has been directing the world back to it for nearly two thousand years.

Calvary is the very pivot of the world's history. All prior things pointed forward to it; and all subsequent things point back to it. Even the future rests upon it, for the redeemed in heaven find it the center of heaven as they behold a Lamb in the midst of the throne, "standing as though it had been slain.'

Seven hundred years before the Man Christ Jesus was led to the place called Calvary, the prophet Isaiah, inspired of God, foreshadowed the Cross; and gave such a word picture of the Saviour of the world that none but blinded hearts could fail to recognize Him when He came

to earth, when "the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us."

The Foreshadowed Lamb of God. Isaiah 53:1-4.

Isaiah foresees the questionings which would fill the minds of men as they heard the marvelous story of that which was told him from God, seven hundred years before it came to pass. "Who hath believed?" and "to whom" is it


the Christ growing up before the Father "as a tender plant; and as a root out of a dry ground." Very precious to God must have been the tender plant; the Branch that should "bear fruit." Isa. 11:1. For the choice vine of Israel,

He, who was the precious, tender plant to the Father, would be despised of men. He would be a "Man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief"; therefore they would reject and forsake Him, for suffering and sorrow are not attractive to men. To Jehovah, His righteous

> Servant would be "exalted and lifted up," even "very high"; but to men He would be as One from whom they would hide their faces with astonishment, for His face and His form would be marred "more than the sons of men." Isa. 52:14. How marred must have been the face of the holy One of God from His crown of thorns! How lacerated the form of His sacred body from the scourging of the soldiers, for the scourges were made from hundreds of leathern thongs, each armed at the point with an angular bony hook, or a sharp sided cube.

> "Look at yonder pillar, black with the blood of murderers and rebels. . . . Look at the rude and barbarous beings who busily surround their victim." See them "tear off His clothes, bind those hands, . . . press His gra-cious visage firmly against the shameful pillar," binding Him "with ropes in such a manner that He cannot move

or stir." See! The scourging lasts a full quarter of an hour! The scourges cut ever deeper into the wounds already made, and penetrate almost to the marrow until "His whole back appears an enormous wound." So Krummacher describes His sufferings. A purple robe is then thrown over the form of the agonized Sufferer, and the twigs of a (Continued on Page Nine)

been demonstrations of power, but the people have lost sight of the essential to power, the love of God. Unless we see a crucified and, strange to say, he may even take advantage of our use of power.

The greatest of power is divine and sacrificial love. If you keep that as an uppermost thought you will be preserved unblameable in holiness before our Father. When Jesus was led as a lamb to the slaughter, yet opened not His mouth, He was giving a demonstration of power such as had never before been seen. Before it Pilate marveled. Unless this spirit of Christ dwell in our hearts by faith we may fail in becoming what our Lord would have us to be.

Why do divisions arise among spiritual people? Largely because of "the accuser of the brethren." Our greatest power is our ability to resist his temptations, and show forth the love of Jesus which gives us dominion over our own spirit and desires.

A letter was received a short time ago from an evangelist who had been very successful until recently. We sought to point out some things that he had permitted to find a place in his life, that we thought had hindered him. He confessed that they were so, then told us of the hard life from which he had been saved, and how compliments and

applause of his ministry had given him an overestimated opinion of himself. He had sailed on the crest of these, growing shallower in his soul every day until he had been brought up with a sudden check, with popularity shattered.

Quite in contrast with this is the testimony of the apostle Paul who said, "Though the outward man perish yet the inward man is renewed day by day." Paul was concerned about the internal realities of grace. He warned against those who sought to glory in their flesh, then declared, "But God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

When we were across the waters we had the privilege of visiting the ancient Jewish Wailing Wall on a Saturday morning. I cannot tell you how those Jews looked with their long lock of hair falling twisted before their ears. They thought it to be conformity with the place in the law where it says, "Thou shalt not shave thine head nor round the corners of thy beard." It is not the outward that we are seeking to cultivate, but the "hidden man of the heart." God judges us according to our inward worth in His presence. But be sure that he who has the inward marks of the Lord Jesus, is not going to dress or act like a dude or a flapper. God on the inside brings the outside into proper conformity.

These who sought to glory in outward rites or ceremonies tried to bind the early church to forms and customs of the law. Against them Paul declares his glory in nothing other than the cross. At times Paul had to resort to other glorving in order to match those who gloried in the flesh, but when he did so he did it with apology. "I am become a fool in glorying." If they were He-brews, so was he. If they had suffered, he had suffered more, in shipwrecks, stripes, imprisonments, hunger and thirst, cold and nakedness. But of what worth did he count all these things. "I count them but refuse that I may win Christ." Christ in the inward man was all he wanted here, and Christ as Bridegroom, when he went to meet the Lord in the skies.

It is the Christ of the cross whom we worship and adore. When at Jerusalem we were shown a cave in a portion of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where it was claimed that the very cross on which Jesus had been crucified had been found. Suppose that very cross should be found what virtue would it now have? It is not the cross, but the Man on the cross who made atonement for the soul. When He had finished His work the cross became but a matter of wood. It did not give virtue to Him, He gave virtue to it. Now He lives forever and seeks to be reincarnated in our hearts.

Nothing must come between our Lord and us. Not even our sacrifices or consecration. If we would keep the freshness in our hearts, our holiness and consecration, our trustworthiness and good, we must continue to rely on the Christ crucified. "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us." It is He, His righteousness, His life, His power that will give us right to the paradise of God.

If we would find our proper place in Him we must become acquainted with His cross. John saw a book waiting to be opened and he wept much that no one was found worthy. Then he saw a Lamb as it had been slain, and heard a voice saying, "Weep not, behold the Lion of the tribe of Judah hath prevailed to open the book and to loose the seals thereof." Who was this mighty Lion? A slain Lamb. He was worthy and triumphant because He had given His life up to death on the cross.

When Paul received the vision of the cross and saw what it meant in human experience it brought the right sort of yieldedness to God. If he were to trust in the flesh he had much that was gain to him. But as he saw the value of the cross he "counted all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus our Lord." Self-sufficiency gave place to Christ's sufficiency, the righteousness of the law fell before the righteousness of the cross. Self-righteousness and self-ambition he counted but refuse. Paul turned his back on all that he could glory in according to the natural man.

There is but one way by which we can please God and have a worship which will be acceptable to Him, ascending as



a sweet savor to the Father. That is to see that the Rock of Ages, cleft for us, is our only standing place, and to glory in Him and in His cross. This is our only safe hiding place from the stormy wind and tempest. He is our great Sacrifice completely meeting the requirements of a holy God and perfectly meeting man's need. Depend on Him in temptation and in every circumstance of life.

When we see the cross in its proper light we see that by it "the world is crucified unto us, and we are crucified unto the world." I have been perplexed as to what is meant by the world. It cannot mean the air we breathe, the water we drink, or the food divinely provided for our good. It must be that atmosphere and soil out of which is produced the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye, and the pride of life. We must watch lest we be carried away through worldly desires and worldly habits which separate us from holiness, from communion with God, and from the anointing of the Spirit.

As we see the redemption in Christ and continually depend on Him, the Holy Spirit will confirm His life in us. May we have a beautiful vision of the redemption in our Saviour, and may nothing take our hearts from Him. "God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me and I am crucified unto the world."

The Cross in Daily Life

A severely tried Christian was pacing to and fro in a botanic garden when he observed a fine specimen of pomegranate almost cut to the stem. Replying to his query the gardener said, "Sir, this tree used to shoot so strong that it bore nothing but leaves, I was, therefore, obliged to cut in this manner, and when it was cut almost through, then it began to bear plenty of fruit." By this illustration he understood, like many another person, the reason for the wounds of his own bleeding spirit. That element in human nature known as "self" may grow luxuriantly, even under the impulse of religious enthusiasm, into branches and leaves without fruit. It must be ruthlessly trimmed, either with the knife of self-denial in our hands, or the knife of suffering and chastisement in God's hand .--- Myer Pearlman.

The Sunday School Lesson

Ruth, the Faithful Lesson for July 24. Lesson Text: Book of Ruth.

Ruth's Choice. "And Ruth said, Intreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God: where thou diest, will I die, and there will I be buried: the Lord do so to me, and more also, if ought but death part thee and me." Ruth 1:16, 17. Naomi's life, Naomi's character, and Naomi's God as

character, and Naomi's God as her mother-in-law presented Him to the young Moabitess, all had so deeply twined themselves around the roots of Ruth's heart, that were they now to be torn away, she felt it would mean her death. And in giving expression to her inner feelings, she has given us the immortal words above. Let us analyze them. They convey the thought of:

(1) Personal Identity, "Where thou goest, I will go";

thou goest, I will go"; (2) Circumstantial Identity, "Where thou lodgest, I will lodge":

(3) Racial Identity, "Thy people shall be my people";

(4) Religious Identity, "Thy God shall be my God";

(5) Lifelong Identity, "Where thou *diest* will I *die.*"

Like begets like. Nobility of character, in the older woman, served as the mold in the development of like character in the younger woman. Ruth made a noble choice. The Moabites decended from Lot, who made a wrong choice and lost his all in Sodom. Naomi and Elimelech left the land of Promise and went to Moab, and like poor Lot, they became ultimately bankrupt. They lost their all. "He that seeketh to save his life shall lose it."

Ruth, on the other hand, left the land of Moab for the land of Promise, for Bethlehem, the House of Bread. She accepted and worshiped the God of Israel; she cast in her lot with God's despised chosen people; she chose God; therefore God honored her and placed her name on the immortal honor roll of those who are the ancestors of David and the illustrious Son of David, Jesus Christ, the Lord. Read Matt. 1:5, 6.


The Power of Choice. Some one has said that three great choices come to every one in the course of his life time.

1. The choice of work. What shall my career be? how shall I invest my life?

2. The choice of love. Who shall my wife be? A Christian girl or a "flapper"? a Ruth or an Orpah? a pretty face or a beautiful character?

3. The choice of God. Shall I make the Lord my God, or shall I make Mammon my God? Shall I strive for divine approval and thus temporal obscurity, or for human approval and success and turn my back on God?

Choosing the Best. Ruth made all three choices. But because she first of all chose God, He honored her and blessed her in the other two choices. Parents and pastors need to instruct their young folks these days regarding the right choice of a career. Many a young person has lost out spiritually because of choosing the wrong kind of career. And how many thousands lose out every year because they make a wrong choice in a hasty



marriage! "They marry in haste and repent at leisure."

God First. A certain successful manufacturer was once asked by his pastor the secret of his success. He took his pastor to his private office and pointed to a motto hanging on the wall. It read: "God First. Family Second. Business Third." Here we see demonstrated three great choices, the choice of God, the choice of love, and the choice of work. Notice that this man put God first. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and all these things shall be added unto you." "Pastor," said this man, "I have never varied the order of these three. I have always kept God first in everything. I believe it is on that account that God has so honored and blessed me."

Our Choosing Reveals Our Character. How much we need the Spirit's leading and guidance in making life's choices. How certain we need to be that the choice is not actuated by a selfish motive. In every choice we make, little or big, we need to test its integrity with the question, "Am I putting God first in this matter? Am I striving to please God or self in this thing?" The power of choice is a tremendous responsibility. "I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live." Deut. 30:19. Thus spoke Moses to Israel as he gave them God's final warning. From childhood on, we make our choices, either for right or wrong, for blessing or cursing, for eternal life or eternal death. How important that we give the children the right foundation, that we plant right spiritual principles within their hearts, so that, like Ruth, they will choose aright. Then the Lord may say of them as He did of His dear friend at Bethany, "Mary

hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her." Choose riches, and a sudden reverse of fortune's wheel can make a millionaire a bankrupt. Witness the case of the New York millionaire who recently was sentenced to ten years in prison for embezzlement. For years a successful millionaire, scion of a family of millionaires; today a bankrupt, a convict. Choose a butterfly, a pretty face, and the ravages of time will dull all the pretty color, will wrinkle the satiny skin, "for all flesh is as grass," and like the grass it withers quickly. But like Ruth and Mary, when we choose God, the Lord will say, "Child, you have chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from you." Neither time, nor age, nor depression nor adversity, can take away from you what you have chosen in God.

Effect of Our Choice Upon Others. Many of us remember the story of Ethan Allen and his Green Mountain Boys, who in a Colonial victory captured Fort Ticonderoga, at the south end of Lake Champlain in the Revolutionary War. Our history books tell us that he commanded the British to surrender "in the Name

of the Lord God Jehovah and the Continental Congress." The fact is that Ethan Allen believed in no God; he was an atheist, and very likely if he used the name of God at all on the occasion, he misused it, as soldiers so often do. But human historians have a way of glossing over their heroes' defects, so that young children may think only the best of them. Ethan Allen had an only daughter, whom he loved passionately. His wife had died while their daughter was still a child. The wife had been an earnest believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, much to the annoyance of her husband. In the course of time, the lovely young daughter took fatally ill with tuberculosis. She knew that her days on earth were numbered, and that her anxious father realized it. One day she called the rough old soldier to her bedside, and took his great hairy hand in her fragile pale fingers. "Daddy," she said, "we both know that I

THE CROSS IN HEAVEN

(Twenty-eight times in the Book of Revelation Christ is entitled "the Lamb," presenting our Lord in His sacrificial aspect and constituting, wherever the title is used, a direct reference to the Cross.)

1. The Cross is our only title to heaven. Rev. 7:14, 15. "Have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore are they before the throne."

2. The Cross is the center of heaven's government. Rev. 5:6. "In the midst of the throne . . . stood a Lamb."

3. The Cross is the source of heaven's life. Rev. 22:1. "Water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb."

4. The Cross is the brilliance of heaven's light. Rev. 21:23. "The Lamb is the light thereof."

5. The Cross is the scene of heaven's worship. Rev. 21:22. "The Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it."

6. The Cross is the theme of heaven's song. "Thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood . . . "

7. The Cross is the incentive of heaven's service. Rev. 22:3. "The throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and his servants shall serve him."

8. The Cross is the basis of heaven's triumph. Rev. 12:11. "They overcame him by the blood of the Lamb."

9. The Cross is the subject of heaven's rejoicing. Rev. 19:7. "Rejoice . . . for the marriage of the Lamb is come."

10. The Cross will be the terror of heaven's enemies. Rev. 6:16. "Hide us from the ... wrath of the Lamb."

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Will innocent children be taken when the Lord comes?

We believe so, on the same basis as they are now saved were they to die. Where there is no law there is no transgression. Since innocent children are not yet responsible under the law of awakened conscience, they are without condemnation. Such is the general belief.

If children are born during the Tribulation will they, because of this, be lost?

It is probable that they will be treated as innocent children are treated in this day of grace. "The Judge of all the earth will do right."

THE PRAYER LIFE

"THE PRAYERS OF ALL SAINTS" Rev. 8:2-6

Remember, that the Lord Jesus is to have the kingdoms of the world for His possession, though at present they are under the sway of "the prince of this world." There will come a moment when all the prayers we have prayed for the destruction of the devil's works, and the depositing of the powers of darkness in the pit, will be answered. It is a good thing, sometimes, to say: "I say Amen to all the prayers of the Lord Jesus, as High Priest of His people," and you can say "Amen" to all your past prayers, and all the prayers of the saints which have been inspired by the Holy Spirit. Every prayer counts.

Suppose you go to buy a pound of sugar, and the grocer has plenty of time, so he puts the grains into the scales one by one. The grains pile up, but nothing happens to the scale! But by and by he puts in one more grain—and down the scale goes. Which grain

of sugar moved the scale? The last one, you say? No, the first he put in was just as important, and so was every single grain that followed. The last grain weighed no more than the rest, in itself. It took them all to bump the scale down. So do not be discouraged in prayer, if nothing happens immediately. Every prayer prayed in the power of the Holy Spirit, along the line of the will of God, is piling up againt the Hinderer—and the day of his complete defeat is coming.

HE FAMILY ALTAR

Although He was in the most crucial moments of His life's work-saving the world, the Lord Jesus, as He hung in mortal anguish on the accursed tree did not forget His family obligations. No doubt Joseph had died, and Mary's other sons did not believe on Him. Now He must of necessity leave her. Some one must be provided to take His vacated place in her life. So He sent her to live with John, "and from that hour that disciple took her to his own house." As John tenderly led her away from the ghastly scene of agonizing death, leaving Him to die alone, we who are fathers catch an enlarged view of what we must do for our families. Nothing that will benefit them must be considered too hard or too onerous for us to do.

It strikes me with extraordinary force that you and I as fathers are placed in homes for the purpose of representing there the Lord Jesus. I am thinking about John during those desperate three days in which the body of the Lord Jesus lay in the tomb. He would be comforting Mary's breaking heart with a full and detailed account of all Jesus had said and done during the hours next before His passion, familiar to us as the thirteenth to the seventeenth chapters of John's Gospel. Apparently she had had no chance to hear any of these wonderful things.

John was to take the place in Mary's life

that Jesus had occupied. Is not that what you and I are to do in our homes to our aged mothers and fathers, our trusting, clinging wives, our growing, inquiring children? Is it not the thing to which we are definitely called to let the light of His life shine on their pathway? Jesus said, "Ye are the light of the world." He urged us to let our light shine before men so that, observing us, they might know how and feel moved to glorify God.

Where else is our obligation to let the light which Jesus is shine forth through us to others so great as in our own homes? Where else are we so privileged to be the means in God's hands of guiding faltering steps by our Christlike example?

"The Chinese Christians are doing valiantly for the Lord and making good every opportunity to reach their own people with the message of salvation. The Chinese have shown fine traits of character during this trouble. There has been much prayer for China and certainly we see wonderful answers to these prayers in the soul hunger of the people.

"From our station in Ningpo we receive reports that as the Bethel workers visit the villages in evangelistic work it is amazing how people are accepting the Lord Jesus Christ. We are kept busy supplying the workers with Pentecostal song books, Bibles, and New Testaments. Whenever there is a revival spirit there is a demand for the song books and the precious Word of God.

"Here in Shanghai there are estimated to be 200,000 refugees crowded in refugee camps within the International Settlement. The gospel is being preached three times daily in some of these camps and workers from all churches are engaged in this work. God is saving souls daily among these dear people who have lost all their earthly possessions in the war, but they are now having the opportunity to accept Jesus Christ and all that He possesses."

DOES WITCHCRAFT REALLY WORK? IF SO, HOW?

A fascinating description of the operation of African witchcraft, upon which the people must pin their faith and by which they are governed.

We left Tamale early in the morning and arrived at the village just when the chief and his elders were in the midst of consulting a witch doctor. The ten-year-old son of one of the elders had been taken ill suddenly the afternoon before. The sickness was so severe and so unusual that the father of the boy called upon the chief and other elders to aid him in consulting the

witch doctor.

The witch doctor was an old man with a snow-white beard. His magic staff appeared to be like any other staff one might see. To one side of the group was his bag which contained the materials used during consultations. They were the strangest things to put any faith in that one could imagine. In a calabash was a collection of beads of various sizes, shapes and colors; some wheels from an old watch; some springs, pieces of grass wound around with colored thread and some cowrie shells. This calabash

with its contents was used at the end of the consultation.

Two smooth brown stones about the size of a hen's egg were prominent during the early part of the proceedings. The chief and his elders squatted on the ground in a semicircle. In front of them were the two small brown stones. The witch doctor would walk away several paces and stand with his back to the group around the stones. The purpose of these proceedings was to find out who was responsible for the boy's sickness. The process followed was that of elimination.

The chief or one of the elders would select one of the stones and tell the others what or whom he wanted it to represent, and then do likewise with the other stone. The witch doctor was then called to come and show them which was responsible. His rod would move up and down striking the ground each time while he was saying, "It has come from this." Finally the rod would strike one of the stones and the people would then know which question was answered. The other was eliminated, so they would concentrate on this new line.

The witch doctor would then go away a few paces again and they would again make the stones represent something or some person, this time confining their suspicions within the circle represented by the stone chosen before. Thus with each succeeding trial the circle was narrowed down.

Many questions were asked but the following examples will show the method used to determine who was responsible for the boy's illness:

1. "Does this sickness come from far away or near at hand?" In this case one stone represented far away and the other stone near at hand. The witch doctor's rod struck the latter stone. Thus they were able to concentrate on people near at hand.

"Does this sickness come from our 2. father's side or our mother's side?" This really means "Does it come from man or woman?" This time the rod struck the stone representing "mother's side." This was a further elimination.

3. "Does this woman live in this town or in some other town?" The rod struck the stone representing a resident of their town.

Now since it was ascertained that a wo-



man residing in their own town was responsible each woman was required to bring a cowrie shell to the chief. The women were then sent away. Two shells were put down in place of the stones. The witch doctor came with his rod but the rod would not touch either of the shells. Therefore, neither of the women represented by the shells was guilty. Two other shells were then placed down until finally the rod struck one. All knew, then, which woman was guilty.

That evening the boy died. There was great lamentation in the village. The young boys all fled to other villages for they feared that the woman who was supposed to have killed their playmate might also kill them. Late that night we went up to greet the bereaved and we found all of the men of the village gathered. Arrangements were then being made to drive the woman from the town. In the middle of the night she was forced to flee with what possessions she could carry. She is forbidden to return to the town. The young boys returned the following day but not until they were assured that the woman had been driven away.

The following day we heard strange things from the townspeople. Two other deaths in the town during the past month were also attributed to the evil working of the unfortunate woman. One man said that he came out of his house one night late and he saw a large vulture resting on top of the house in which the boy had lived. "Surely," he said, "it was the woman turned into a vulture and that she was seeking to kill him them."

These things are being practiced in all of the villages of the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast. Surely, "the dark places of the earth are the habitations of cruelty." Thank God for the privilege of being here to give them the gospel light. It is penetrating this dense darkness and already scores have been loosed from their fears and superstition. Do pray for us that we may have the power of the Holy Spirit to combat the powers of darkness.

A CONVERSION FROM ISLAM By James Modder, North India

We are happy to be able to report victory from our last winter's camping season. Over 1,300 Gospel portions were sold, and a great many villages were reached where a white missionary had never been before. The accompanying picture is Mr. Munshie and his wife who were wonderfully saved from Mohammedanism and brought into the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ in February of this year.

Last winter while we were camping out in the district some thirty miles north of Chapra, we would go out into the villages in the car or on bicycles to preach. One day after we had closed a meeting at a bazar (market) among those who came forward to buy Gospels was Mr. Munshie. He was so touched by the message which he had heard that he was not satisfied with only a Gospel but wanted the entire New Testament. We had no more with us but told him that if he would come to our camp seven miles away we would be glad to supply him with one. Two days later he walked the seven miles to our camp only to find that we were all out again for the day preaching. Nothing daunted, a few days later he came again and received teaching from the Word of God and got his New Testament. From then on, as long as we camped at that place, he came regularly to hear more and more.

The people of his village began to persecute him, and his own parents refused to allow him to eat with them. They made it so miserable for him that he was forced to leave home, so we invited him to come to Chapra with us. This he did, bringing his young wife with him, for she decided to remain with her husband and become a Christian, too.

It was not for earthly gain that Mr. Munshie came, for he was studying to become a Malvi (Mohammedan priest) and was already respected in his village as a

leader. He has had to learn Persian and Arabic in order to study the Koran, besides he knows Urdu, Hindi, and a little bit of English. At the mosque five times a day he led two hundred men of his village in their namaz or prayers. Their concern, therefore, was great when he failed to come to the mosque and replied that he prayed now in his own home and read the Bible instead. He seems to have a real hunger for the Word and has already started studies with one of our preachers. His wife is also being taught to read and write so that some day she may help her husband to take the gospel back to their own people.

We would like to send this couple to Bible school this year in August at Laheria Sarai for we know that these people, if trained, can do so much more than a missionary can. We are trusting the Lord that their support will be raised. Eight dollars a month will keep this couple in Bible school. We are praying that the Lord will lay them on some one's heart.

HSIANG YANG PU HEARS THE GOSPEL

Pansy Blossom writes from Manchuria: "A few weeks ago Miss Melching and I visited Hsiang Yang Pu-a village which we had been told had never been visited with the gospel message. Before Miss Wang went home she urged us to come to see her, feeling that some would believe if they but heard the gospel. Miss Wang was married shortly after returning home; her name is now Mrs. Li.

"Most of the journey was made by train. At Ta Ling Ho station as we were waiting in a little roadside shanty with our Bible woman, Mrs. Pai, a crowd gathered, giving us opportunity to witness to the true God. Some of them had heard of one called Jesus but most of them were entirely ignorant. They believe in the 'Old Heavenly Master' for is it not He who provides sunshine and rain, and causes their crops to grow? But they do not know Him; instead hideous idols made with hands are praised for His love and care.

"From here we trekked over the country side about ten Chinese miles, finally arriving at the home of Miss Wang's parents, where we were escorted into the home and given a hearty welcome, although Miss Wang, who is now Mrs. Li, had gone to a distant village and could not be reached. In a short time a large crowd had gathered. The Lord anointed us as we sang and spoke to them, and it was wonderful to tell the story of Jesus to so many who knew nothing of the Saviour. After dinner rain began to fall so we held a service again for those who had gathered earlier.

"When we had to leave Mr. Wang graciously provided a cart to take us to the station. It was pulled by an ox, a donkey and a horse. Thus we said good bye to these dear people, some of whom followed our cart down the road. While there we were told that Mrs. Li had not ceased to speak of the 'Good News.'"

SABBATH IN PALESTINE

Tel-Aviv in Palestine has the distinction of being the only 100 per cent Jewish city in the world. Last year, a series of meetings all over Palestine culminated in a conference at Tel-Aviv, during which lectures were given on how to observe the Sabbath in agriculture, industry, etc., according to the Alliance Weekly.

For some time the arrival of the Sabbath has been proclaimed on Friday afternoon all around Tel-Aviv by the blowing of the *Shophar*, or ram's horn trumpet of Biblical days. After dark there blazes from the dome of the synagogue an electric sign, "Remember the sabbath day to keep it holy." The reformers want to see every Jew in the synagogue on Sabbath and private autos put away.

NO LAUGHTER

"A distinguished author visiting Los Angeles, said that Europe has forgotten how to laugh," reports *Los Angeles Times.* "Europe has little enough to laugh about, it is true, yet by a paradox—laughter alone is the thing that might save it. Its laughter has been crushed under armaments and taxes, the twin enemies of gaiety. A red tide has submerged the last faint whisper of humor and hope in Spain. "In three capitals—Berlin, Rome and Moscow—grim-lipped men rule by the power of dictatorship; and the laughter that comes from their people is a hollow sound."

"The mirth of tabrets ceaseth, the noise of them that rejoice endeth, the joy of the harp ceaseth. They shall not drink wine with a song; strong drink shall be bitter to them that drink it." Isa. 24:8-9.

A LAW UNTO THEMSELVES

Said Dr. Alfred Rosenberg, who is in charge of the Nazi party's religious program: "Right is that which Aryan people find right; wrong is that which they reject."

In other words, no eternal standard of right and wrong is recognized and the government decides what is right or wrong. If logically followed such a principle means the dethronement of God and the enthronement of lawlessness. Alliance Weekly reports that "An experimenter in the University of California has discovered a new explosive, which is claimed to have sixty times the power of dynamite, and from fifteen to twenty-five times that of TNT. He has named it RPX. Its original fault, that of being subject to deterioration in storage, has been conquered, and it is claimed that it will not lose its power after being kept for twenty years. It is also safer to handle than either of the above named comnounde"

This will be a new weapon for those who "destroy the earth." Rev. 11:18.

long-spiked thorn bush are twisted into a circle, and pressed upon His brow.

It was thus that His face was marred, and His form more than the sons of men. The prophet Isaiah had even foretold the words of the Man of Sorrows, saying in His hour of agony, "I was not rebellious, neither turned away backward. I gave my back to the smiters, and my cheeks to them that plucked off the hair: I hid not my face from shame and spitting. For the Lord God will help me . . . therefore have I set my face like a flint." Isa. 50:5-7.

The Purpose of the Cross. vv. 4-6. "He hath borne OUR griefs." "He hath carried OUR sorrows." "He was wounded for OUR transgressions." "He was bruised for OUR iniquities." "The chastisement of OUR peace was upon Him." are healed." "With His stripes WE

The Holy Spirit leaves no room for doubt as to the purpose, and the cause of the sufferings of Christ. The word substitution is not actually used, but the language is unmistakably clear. This One with the marred face was bearing the "griefs" and "sorrows" of others. "Himself took OUR infirmities, and bare OUR sicknesses." Matt. 8:17. His wounds were for our transgressions, and the bruises upon His body were for our iniquities.

Beholding, as it were, the One thus wounded and stricken, the prophet becomes a spokesman for the whole human race as he cries-"'All we like sheep

have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath made to light on Him the iniquity of us all." Verse 6, margin.

We behold His sufferings, we esteem Him "stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted." We, who have "gone astray!" We, who have turned "every one to his own way." But the Lord God hath laid upon Him-the Holy Son of our God, our iniquity, the iniquity of us all. Thus briefly we have portrayed for us the result of the Fall in Eden, and the cause and purpose of the Cross.

Independence of God is the very essence of sin. To every man "his own ' ends in transgression and iniquity. way' The first "all" includes every human being brought into the world, and the second "all" proclaims the atoning sacrifice of Christ for every one under the curse of sin.

The Death of the Cross. vv. 7-9. "He humbled Himself, and opened not His mouth, . . . a lamb that is led to the slaughter." "A sheep that before her shearers is dumb." "He was cut off out of the land of the living." "They made His grave with the wicked."

Isaiah now depicts the obedience unto death of the suffering One. He sees Him as a sheep in the hands of the shearers, dumb and passive; as a lamb being led to the slaughter. He consented to be "led to the slaughter" as a victim in the hands of men. How literally the prophecy was fulfilled in every detail the Gospels unfold.

The Christ standing before Pilate "when He was accused answered nothing," so that even the Governor marveled. From "oppression and judgment He was taken away" outside the city wall to the place called Calvary, and 'as for His generation"-the people of His own nation and time-"who among them considered" the tragedy that was being enacted in their midst? "Cut off out of the land of the living" in the very prime of life, how few realized that it was for the transgression of His people "to whom the stroke was Isa. 53:8, margin. How many in due." Jerusalem during that awful time "considered," and pondered over, the Scriptures of the prophets, which gave them the portrait of the Man they crucified.

But the Man of sorrows knew! He said every step of His path must needs be "as it is written of Him." As He set His face to go on His last journey to Jerusalem, it was with the words, "All the things that are written through the prophets shall be accomplished unto the Son of Man. For He shall be delivered up," "mocked," "shamefully en-treated," "spit upon," "and they shall scourge and kill Him." He said, "It is written," when Judas betrayed Him,

and when His disciples forsook Him, and again, after He was risen from the dead, He reminded them that when He was yet with them, He had sought to prepare them for His Cross, by telling them that "all things that must needs be fulfilled" which were written in "the law of Moses, and the prophets, and the Psalms," concerning Him.

Moreover, Isaiah not only foretold the sufferings and death of the Christ, but the very way of His burial. His grave would be made with the wicked-a malefactor's grave would be prepared-and He who had been despised and rejected of man, would be with the "rich in His This was literally fulfilled; and the instrument prepared of God to carry out His counsels was found in the wealthy "Joseph of Arimathea, a counselor of honorable estate," who was one "looking for the kingdom of God," and said to be a secret disciple of the Lord Jesus. Joseph had sat in the council that condemned the Righteous One, but "he had not consented to their counsel and deed." Unable to save the victim from His accusers, Joseph did what he could as soon as the sentence of death had been carried out, by going boldly to Pilate, and asking for the body of the Lord, afterwards reverently laying it in his own new tomb.

The Provided Lamb of God. v. 10. "His soul a guilt offering (margin) for sin."

"God will provide Himself a lamb," Abraham had said to Isaac on Mount Moriah, and Isaiah foreshows the Lamb provided by God Himself, to be revealed in the fullness of time. Despised and rejected of men, wounded, bruised, cut off out of the land of the living, this One with the marred face is now plainly described as "a guilt offering for sin" -the antitype of all the guilt offerings sacrificed day by day in Israel, by the command of God Himself.

Hitherto the worshipers had had to bring the sacrifice, but when God should provide the Lamb, and lay upon Him the iniquity of all, there would be naught for them to do but accept the provision made for them.

The Fruit of the Cross. vv. 10-11. "He shall see His seed." "He shall prolong His days." "He shall see of the travail of His soul." "He shall . . . be satisfied."

Calvary is viewed now as in harmony with a law of God-the law of sacrifice for fruitfulness. 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

Calvary and the Foreshadowed Cross

(Continued from Page Nine) created after His own likeness, is one of the greatest mysteries in the revelation of the heart and character of Jehovah. "Let us make man in Our image, after Our likeness" (Gen. 1:26), the Triune God had said, when the beautiful earth, created by His word, lay before Him, but with no beings upon it answering to His heart.

"He shall see His seed." "He shall see and be satisfied with the travail of His soul" (margin) reveals the same yearning in the heart of the God-man. Grieved over the fall of the first creation, He gives His life on Calvary for the birth of a new race, a re-creation of those who had gone astray, and had turned each one to "his own way." By his death "making many righteous," through His bearing of their iniquities, He beholds the fruit of His travail, and is satisfied.

This new birth for the fallen children of the first Adam, is by the Lord Jesus Himself, at the beginning of His public ministry on earth, when He told Nicodemus that sinful men "must" be born again, declared to be the fruit of His cross. Moreover, He said the Son of Man "must" be "lifted up" to become the source of life eternal to them.

The Victory of the Cross. v. 12.

"Therefore will I divide Him a portion with the great." "He shall divide the spoil with the strong."

Yet another aspect of Calvary is shown us here. Another one called the "strong" is mentioned, and the language used suggests a battle, and the dividing of the "spoil" won in the fight. Elsewhere Isaiah speaks of the "prey of the terrible" and the deliverance of the "captive of the just" from the "mighty." Isa. 49:24, 25, margin. It is also said that the spoil is given to the Man of sorrows "because He poured out His soul unto death," and "because He . . . was numbered with the transgressors."

Calvary was thus to be, not only the bearing of our iniquities that we might be healed; the guilt offering for sin through which we would be made righteous; the travail for the birth of a new race in the likeness of the Son of God, but also a battle with a terrible foe for the deliverance of those held captive in his power. This accords with other scriptures, for David in vision beheld the ascended Lord leading "captivity captive" into the sanctuary on high, and the inspired apostle writing to the Hebrews says that "through death" the Christ brought to naught the devil, that He might "deliver all them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage."

It is written that He took the spoil from the strong because He was "numbered with the transgressors." In perfect obedience to His Father's will, He accepted and drank the cup of suffering and death! How can we fathom what it meant to Him "who knew no sin," to be "numbered with the transgressors," and "made sin on our behalf"? 2 Cor. 5:21. This view of Calvary may reveal to us one cause of the victory of Christ over the terrible one. The devil had sought to be exalted even as the most High, but the Son of God humbled Himself, and consented to be made lower than the lowest. Therefore God highly exalted Him, and gave unto Him the Name which is above every name; for Calvary in its depth of shame on earth, was exaltation in heaven.

The Effect of the Cross in Heaven. v. 12. "He bare the sin of many and made intercession for the transgressors."

In this brief sentence, we are given a glimpse into the heavens to see the Victor from Calvary within the veil, "before the face of God" (Heb. 9:24) interceding on behalf of all for whom He died. "Numbered with the transgressors," He could make intercession for the transgressors, "touched with the feeling" of their sorrows, having been Himself tempted in all points like as they (yet without sin), and "suffered being tempted" (Heb. 2:18; Heb. 4:15) when He walked on earth as man.

Let us go to Calvary, and in the light thrown on it by the prophecy of Isaiah, behold Him, who for the joy set before Him, endured the Cross despising the shame. The hour had come for which He had entered into this world. Hear the God-man cry, "It is finished!" as He bows His head, and yields up His spirit into His Father's hand. We know now that He is the Father's provided Lamb, the guilt offering for sin. The One who with a visage more marred than any man's, was wounded and bruised for our iniquities, so that by His stripes we may be healed.

Sometime later, after the day of Pentecost had fully come, a man of authority was riding in his chariot in the desert, reading the prophecy of Isaiah. At the moment he reached the words-"He was led as a sheep to the slaughter,' "His life is taken from the earth," certain disciple named Philip drew nigh, and was bidden of the Holy Ghost to join himself unto the chariot. Sitting beside the eunuch, he preached unto him JESUS from the prophecy of Isaiah, the Spirit-given foreshadowing of the Cross, and now again the Spirit-given message to a seeking heart through a messenger taught of Him. See Acts 8:26-35.

Thus did the Holy Ghost bear witness that Isaiah had truly foreshown the Christ of God, and that "He saw His glory, and spake of Him." John 12:41.

Oh, for a Thousand Tongues!

Dr. Sewall, an old Methodist, when dying shouted aloud the praises of God. His friends said, "Dr. Sewall, do not exert yourself; whisper, Doctor, whisper." "Let angels whisper," said he, "but the soul cleansed from sin by the blood of Christ, a soul redeemed from death and hell, just on the threshold of eternal glory—oh, if I had a voice that would reach from pole to pole I would proclaim it to all the world: Victory! Victory! through the blood of the Lamb!"
