IN THOSE DAYS there was no king in Israel." These words occur four times in the last five horrible chapter of Judges. There was no central authority that could keep in check the lawlessness" of that era, but "every man did that which was right in his own eyes." I believe those last terrible chapters to be just as much inspired as John 3:16. Those horrible conditions were actually prevalent at that time: lawlessness in religion, lawlessness in the state and lawlessness in the home. God has not caused these terrible things to be written for our entertainment. Behind the story, behind the historical, is a spiritual lesson, and these things are written for our admonition, for our learning. 1 Cor. 10:6; Rom. 15:4. In these five chapters is recorded

the story of rival worship, lust, corruptimon, violence, crime, civil war. They depict the conditions soon after Joshua's death. The Book of Judges records the failure of the redeemed; a sad book, indeed! Sin, apostasy, rebellion, Bolshevism! Although Judges is the reventh book of the Bible, and seven in the Scriptures is the number of completeness, of fullness, yet here we see fullness ending in chaos.

You will note in Judges 17 that a man named Micah of Mount Ephraim set up a little religion all his own. He was just a common Israelite, but he had 1100 shekels of silver (\$680) and he presumed to start a rival worship. He built some kind of structure, a temple or tabernacle, and provided a sanctuary, and ephod, a terraphim and a priest. It was not a house of God, but a house of gods, for he had in it graven and molten images. He mixed up God's things with idolatrous things, and consecrated one of his sons to be a priest. Here was a new sect, a break in the unity of God's redeemed.
"See that thou make all things according to the pattern showed to thee in the mount," was God's word to Moses. Yet Micah's tabernacle was not according to the "pattern." Micah wanted to be independent in things pertraining to the worship of God. If God was so particular about the shadow of things to come, will He be any less particular with us in our dealing with realities?
"Every man did what was right in his own eyes." Will you start a new assembly within sight of the old one? Will you aid in division, in starting new assemblies and sects? People think they can do what they please, like Micah.

The vital need today is authorityin the church, in the state and in the home. This authority is vested in our precious Lord, and in His blessed Word. The Holy Scriptures constitute the rule of faith and conduct for all who name the name of Christ. "To the law and to the testimony." Isp. 8:20.
A wandering Levite came along and Micah hired him for the service of his tabernacle. Now the Levies had been set apart for God's service in the tabernacle in the wilderness. You will find their duties outlined, and the method of their cleansing and ordination, in Numbers 3 and 8 . They were supported by tithes. Sometimes this support was neglected (Neh. 13:10, 11), and it was probably at such a time that this wandering Levite became disengaged. Micah offered him a job with a stipend, clothes, and victuals. He hired him as a priest at about six dollars a year! For money this Levite consented to be consecrated, inducted into, and ordained to a false worship! He failed to rebuke Micah's false worship because it was his living. He sinned against the foundation of the Mosaic faith, for all this to which he consented was contrary to God's will plainly declares.
And all $t \mathrm{~h} \mathrm{e}$ time God's sanetuary, ark, and priest were at Chiloh. Shiloh means peace bringer. Joe(See Page Four)


# Are You Eternally Seoure?

The extreme so-called Eternal Security teaching, boiled down to its final analysis, is to the effect that it is impossible for a person once saved to fall away, to the extent of being finally and eternally lost. A minister of my intimate acquaintance, in his zeal in defence of the said position, declared publicly that he could murder a man and, even though he were to die the next moment, it would be well with his soul. The Scriptures nowhere warrant the making of such ridiculously heretical statements. Such a position is wholly out of harmony with the plain and unmistakable teachings of God's Word. Can a Christian be finally lost? We hold in this regard, on the one hand, the maximum possibility; and we hold, on the other hand that, providing the convert is subjected to proper Scriptural teaching, the probability is reduced, because of: (a) the Lord's chastening of His own, and (b) the intercessory work of the Lord Jesus Christ at God's right hand, to a minimum.

John 10:27-29
"My sheep hear my voice . . . and they follow me: and I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand ... no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand." This text does not, as some would contend, teach an unconditional security. To whom does Christ give "eternal life?" To whom is the promise made, "they shall never perish?" Of whom does Christ say, "Neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand?" Concerning whom are the words spoken, "No man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand?" Those who not simply and only "hear my voice," but who also "follow me." All those who hear His words and continuously follow hard after Him are entitled to confidently claim all the comfort and security that this precious passage of Holy Writ offers.

## 2 Peter 1:4-15

"If ye do these things, ye shall never fall." What things? "Add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity." It is gloriously possible for the saved person to, at all times, enjoy a reasonable measure of the feeling of security. Security is here said to be a mathematical problem-the application of the addition table in the matter of "these things" in the every day walk. But neglect "these things" and,
then what? Such a one "is blind," and "cannot see afar off," and "hath forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins." Moreover, "these things" are not simply to be present in a measure in the life, but they are to abound; otherwise we become "barren and unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lorl Jesus Christ."
Hebrewe 6:4-10
impossible ... If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance." The writer here regards the possible retrogression of Christians with dismay. He sees the danger of an entire, continuous, weilful and irrecoverable apostasy. He beholds them on the very brink of a precipice and lifts his voice with vehement, yet loving earnestness, warning them against so fearful an evil.; They had "tasted the heavenly gift." What gift was that? I hear a voice, which we know well, speaking from Sychar's well, and saying: "The water that I shall give him (namely, the Gift of God) shall be in him a well of water springing up unto everlasting life." It is the life of God in the soul. It is Christ Himself. And yet they stood in danger of falling away. They also "were made partakers of the Holy Ghost." And to what else can this refer other than to the mighty and wonderful Baptism with the Holy Spirit as on the day of Pentecost? And yet they stood in danger of falling away. What is it to "fall azeay?" It is evidently something more than to "fall" as David fell, or as Peter fell. They were able to repent. To "fall away" is to go back, not temporarily but finally. This particular warning does not refer to some isolated sin committed at some unguarded moment, but to a protracted and habitual condition of mind; to the neglect and disbelief of truths once recognized and confessed. It places before us the awful result of willful rejections of spiritual influences and privileges. We know, from observation, as well as from the Holy Scriptures, that true Christians are not exempt from the danger of serious, protracted, and final apostasy.

## A Precipice Is a Precipice

How ridiculous to try, as some do, to explain away the fearful warnings of the Bible! A precipice is a precipice and it is folly to deny it. Those who advocate unconditional eternal security are like unauthorized traffic-officers on the highway opened up to humanity by means of the Saviour's sacrifice on Calvary, which road leads from earth to glory, and crying: "Travelers on this highway are unconditionally secure. They need pay
no attention whatsoever to the many danger signals erected here and there along the way. These were erected for the benefit of certain Hebrews who lived about nineteen hundred years ago, when the road was first thrown open to the general public. They do not apply now. The dangers that existed then, do not now exist. Those who ignore the warnings are just as secure as are those who give to them their strictest attention." But, my friends, travelers on the King's highway, until authority, equal to the authority that caused these warnings to be first posted, authorizes their removal, we shall be well advised to give heed to them. For my Bible reads : "All Scripture," including the admonitions of the Hebrews letter, "is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness."

## Reasonable Security

Providing that we do give heed to the warnings, we shall be able to make the journey safely all the way home, with a reasonable degree of security in our breasts at all times. But let those who are ignoring the warnings and telling others that they can disregard them and still be eternally secure, beware: for do we not find, strewn along life's highways, a countless number of individuals who, through failure to take heed to the warnings at the danger points, have made wreck of the faith? The New Testament positively states that it is possible for a child of God to "fall"; to get into a condition described as "fallen from grace"; to "fall away" to the extent where recovery is impossible.

## 1 Cor. 11:29-32

"For he that eateth and drinketh (at the communion) unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation (judgment) to himself. . . For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves (put away our sins by way of confession), we should not be judged. But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord that we should not be condemned with the world." That it is possible for a Christian to be lost is cevidenced by the words "condemned with the world." The "chastening" is for the purpose of reducing the probability. The real meaning of the word "chasten" is to "childtrain." Weymouth, in his translation of the New Testament, uses the word "discipline" instead of the word "chasten."

## Hebrewe 12:6-11 (Weymouth)

"The sufferings that you are enduring are for your discipline. God is dealing with you as with sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? . . . Our earthly parents used to discipline us and we treated them with respect, and shall we not be still more submissive to the Father of our spirits,
and live? . . . He does it for our certain good, in order that we may become sharers of His own holy character. Now, at the time, discipline seems to be a matter not for joy, but for grief; yet it afterwards yields, to those who have passed through its training, a result full of peace-namely, righteousness."

Consider the oft recurrence of the words "father" and "son" in this portion. The Lord is speaking to His own sons-members of His own family-the "household of faith." Up yonder is the homeland and the glory; down here is the suffering. Wonder of wonders! The Lord is even overruling the suffering to "child-train" or "discipline" His own for the glory. What sweetness flows from this much misunderstood passage when invested with its more literal meaning.

## When Sheep Go Astray

"The shepherd of the Orient carries a number of small stones in his bag and sometimes, when the wandering sheep refuses to come back, one of these painful messengers is flung from the shepherd's sling and the wounded animal limps back to the fold a sadder, but a wiser sheep. It is said that a shepherd once pointed to one of his flock that came limping to him with a broken leg and fed from his hand; explaining to the one that was standing with him: 'You wonder, perhaps, how that sheep broke its leg, and you may be surprised to know that I did it. It was the most wilful and untractable sheep in all my flock. It did not love me. It would never follow in the pathway that I was leading the flock. It wandered to the verge of many a perilous cliff and dizzy abyss. And not only was it disobedient itself, but it was ever leading the sheep of my flock astray. Therefore, I had to wound it and make it helpless and dependent upon my love and care. Now you see how it comes and follows me everywhere and is the model sheep of my flock. No other sheep hears my voice so quickly. No other follows so closely by my side. Instead of leading its mates astray, it is now an example and guide for the wayward ones; leading them in the path of obedience at my call. A complete transformation has come in the life of this once wayward sheep. It has learned obedience through its sufferings.'" It is verily possible for a Christian to be lost -maximum possibility. But what a contribution does suffering make in the means the Lord employs in reducing, to a minimum, the probability of final and eternal apostasy!

## Our Great High Priest

Wherefore He is able to save them to the utermost that come unto God by Him, seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them." Heb. 7:25. ". . . And if any man (Child of God) $\sin$, we have an Advocate with the Fath-
er, Jesus Christ the righteous. And He is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also the sins of the whole world." 1 John $2: 1,2$. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9. It is well for us that we have such a representative in the courts of heaven; for we have, in the person of the devil, an untiring adversary, who is said to be the "accuser of the brethren." Just let one who is a child of God, deviate one step from the path of uprightness and how quickly will Satan hurl the fact, as an accusation, into the face of God. But, let us remember that Christ ever stands ready to meet every such accusation. He pleads our cause, on the ground of the merits of the ever-efficacious propitiation. Jesus Christ is the propitiation for post-conversion sins, as well as for preconversion sins; for the sins of the saints, as well as for sins of the sinners; for "our sins," as well as for "the sins of the whole world." Forgiveness of sins committed after conversion and the cleansing of the defilement resultant therefrom, namely, "all unrighteousness," is conditional. Only the confessed sins are forgiven sin. But, thanks be unto the Lord Jesus Christ, because "He is faithful and just," when once we have faithfully fulfilled the condition prescribed, we can rest assured that we are both forgiven and cleansed.
Thus, according to my understanding of the teachings of the Word, it is possible for a person once saved, to fall away to the extent of being finally and eternally lost; but the probability is reduced by means of the Lord's chastening of His own, plus the work of our great High Priest, the Lord Jesus Christ, at God's right hand, in our behalf.
"Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory

Other funds have been made available to meet the expenses of these deputational visits.

Brother Ernest S. Williams is now at Headquarters and has deemed it advisable to cancel some of his engagements in order that he may be able to act as counselor of the many departments here.

## No King in Israel

(Continued from Page One) sus Christ is our Shiloh. Shiloh was situated in the very midst of the land. But Micah set aside God's way and order of worship, and introduced human inventions and man-made ceremonies. Even today, some think themselves free to do as they please in matters of worship. No authority. No king. Confusion! But there is no confusion in heaven. When we pray, "Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven," remember God is still on the throne in heaven. His will is done there.

Now note that in Judges 18 are described some further consequences of there being no king in Israel. The tribe of Dan, desirous of more room, sends out explorers to search out the land. These, after spending a night near Micah's temple, consult its oracles. Then they proceed to Laish and return to report to the Danites. The Danites make up an attacking party, pillage Micah's sanctuary, and persuade Micah's priest to go with them. He accepts their offer. It seems to him a "larger sphere," priest to a tribe! So Micah's religion expands into that of a tribe.

Then the startling truth comes to light that this Levite is none other than Moses' grandson! Judges 18:30, 31.
ASV. R.V. And the reason for this appalling state, for such evil days, was, there was no king. There was no authority to curb self-will and to restrain; there was no fixed and permanent government. Every man pleased himself. There was anarchy, disorder, irregularity. This, the only democratic period in Israelitish history, was the worst.
Dent 33.5 Moses had been king in Jeshuran Joshua had ruled for God. They were autocratic rulers-under God, the Theocrat. But now there was no center of authority.

The vital need today is authority, and the decay of authority is a mark of the last days. In Daniel 2, you will note that the head of Nebuchadnezzar's image was of gold, while the toes were a mixture of iron and clay. Isn't there a great mixture today? Chaos and disorder is everywhere. Disorder in the life of the Christian, disorder in the Church, disorder in the state, disorder in the home. There is no secure basis for law and order, and distruction is pending. We are in the Laodicean age. Laodicean means "verdict or judgment by the people." Only the fear of God can hold society together, but today there is utter neglect of God's Word and of divine worship because of selfwill. There is no fear of God or His Word. Paul enjoined Timothy: "Preach
the word, for the time is coming when they will not endure sound doctrine," and that time has come.

The story of the infamous deed of the Gibeahthites (Judges 19) and the measures taken by the Levite to call the nation to judge them, provide other instances of what happens when there is no king. All this was surely bad for a Levite, who should have been about God's business.

Today, too, there is a great let down in the morals of the people. They are greatly corrupted. Wickedness, lewdness, and licentiousness are prevalent. "We have turned every one to his own way." Isa. 53:6. There is no fear of God, therefore there is looseness in liv-ing-even among so called Christians.
The result of the wicked deed in Gibeah was civil war among the tribes of Israel. The tribe of Benjamin was almost exterminated, only 600 being left. There was enmity and strife, bitterness among brethren, the redeemed fighting one another. So there is bitterness and strife today because we do not bow to the Word of God and tremble, having no fear of Bema-the judg-) ment seat of Christ. Shall brother go to law against brother? "Why do ye not rather take wrong?" 1 Cor. 6:7.

Thank God there is a remedy, there is delivering grace! Sin abounds, but grace doth much more abound! The remedy is to make Jesus King of your life. The kingship and lordship of Jesus are not acknowledged by the unbeliever. "We have no King but Cæsar," they cry. "Away with him!" Nevertheless He is the Lord Jesus Christ. That's His full title. Jesus means Saviour, Christ means Anointed of God, Lord means master and owner. He is the blessed and only Potentate. 1 Tim. 6:15. He's my King. Psalm $2: 6$. He is Lord of lords. Rev. 19:16. Let us own His Lordship and give Him undisputed sway, in finance, in friends, in all. Surrender, yield to Him, and let the government be on His shoulder. He is the King of glory." Psalm 24. "Where the word of a king is, there is power." Eccl. 8:4.

Yield yourselves unto the Lord. Crown Him Lord of all. Brother, sister, make Jesus Christ the King of your life.

God's Word is the final authority. "I look, even to him that is poor, and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my Word." Isa. 66:2. Let us hold His Word as our rule and guide.

## WAITING ON GOD

Let every one who would learn the art of waiting on God remember the lesson: "Take heed, and be quiet." Take time to be separate from all friends and all duties, all cares and all joys; time to be still and quiet before God. Take time not only to secure stillness from man and the world, but from self and its energy. Let the Word
will guide you into all truth." John 16:13. See also Rom. 8:16. (b) In conduct: "Led by the Spirit." Rom. 8:14. See also Rom. 8:5.

We have some more good signs painted on rocks, and I want to make a tour of the towns in this part of Peru, putting up handbills and painting rocks on the roads. The roads are long and dreary, and the texts every ten miles or so break the monotony and give the travelers plenty to think about. God's Word will not return void.

On the train from Caraz to Chimbote I sat on the steps at every station, singing, playing, and preaching. At one stop a young girl wanted to learn one of the songs. She has a Bible and reads it, but when the train pulled out she went over to a post and stood there crying. Do pray for many such lonely souls, hungry for the privilege of having services in their town.

## St. Peter's birthday

Birthdays are always an occasion here. No one works on his birthday, and all his friends come to drink in celebration. Naturally the birthday of the patron saint is indeed a real holiday, lasting three days or more. We had been thinking a special tract was needed to give the people at this time to wake them up, so Miss Jeter wrote one from the Epistles of Peter. The Sunday School boys gave the tracts out on the first day, just as every one was getting well started with the celebration. You should have seen the boys go!

No one escaped a tract from the mayor to the poorest citizen. One boy went direct to the church grounds where every one was eating, drinking, dancing, and fighting. Before the people had time to read the tract through and recover from the shock the boys had covered the town and were safely at home.
Brother Hugh Jeter adds, "The town was stirred-to put it mildly! We were summoned before the governor of the town who most heatedly condemned us and who threatened us with fines or imprisonment. After having to appear before him three times, it now seems the case is being dropped. We feel that much prayer is needed that these people may be led to see the true light and to renounce the hidden works of darkness."

## GOOD NEWS FROM BETONGWE

From one of our Congo missionaries comes the encouraging news that the work at Betongwe station is being especially blessed of the Lord at this time and the work in general is taking on new life. Writing from the Gombari station upon her return from a two weeks' visit with Mr. and Mrs. Griffin at Betongwe, Gladys Taylor says :
"The work at Betongwe is surely encouraging. There the natives are much more friendly than here, seem to have more personality, and respond more readily to the gospel. It has always been a problem here to get the women to come to the meetings, but at Betongwe last Sunday there were about thirty women at the morning service. All were well dressed and nice looking, and many were Christians. We had a real good meeting that morning with a long season of prayer following.
"While we were having lunch a native evangelist came to tell us that a woman
had come to the mission to become a Christian. She had been the wife of a chief but he had died a few weeks before, leaving his wives all free to return to their villages and marry again if they chose. This woman had been engaged in a form of witchcraft before her husband died, so afterward she was supposed to observe some kind of cleansing ceremony to enter another order of witcheraft. While in her village awaiting time for the ceremony she came in contact with a Christian woman who urged her to accept salvation and leave witcheraft alone. This she decided to do so together they set out for the mission-a whole day's walk from their village. Soon after Brother Griffin prayed with them they took the path back home. They came from a section that is almost entirely untouched with the gospel.
"The last Saturday morning I was Betongwe four women came to the station to accept the Lord. One was a very old woman and admitted that she had eaten human flesh. Betongwe is right in the heart of the tribes where cannibalism was practiced before the white man came. This is one reason the work there has been very hard. For years it has been carried on with seemingly little results. Now, however, it seems that the change has come and the Lord is really beginning to work, for which we are very thankful.
"We are having quite a lively time here at Gombari now. The Bible school is on, and the day school is also in progress. Several of the Bible school students seem very promising and they are getting splendid training. I have a full schedule in the day school. I am teaching them singing and sewing besides the regular schedule. The men do practically all the sewing but we are trying to teach the wives of the evangelists to sew so that they can teach the Christians in the villages."

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## Saul's Self-will

Lesson for September 4. Lesson Text: 1 Samuel 13.
Patience. "Thou camest not within the days appointed," complained Saul to Samuel, in excusing his presumptuous $\sin$. $13: 11$. The hardest thing for any human being to do is to wait patiently, but it is especially hard for a soldier to do so. Soldiers are men of action. They fret and fume at delay-it gnaws holes into their very souls. This is typical of the "flesh," of the natural man. The Word of God has much to say about having patience. "Let patience have her perfect work in you." James $1: 4$. Read the whole first chapter of James on this subject of patience. Then read James 5:7-11: "The husbandman waiteth for the fruit of the earth and hath long patience for it. Be ye also patient." "Ye have need of patience." Heb. 10:36. Take your concordance and see how many references there are to "patience."

Patience is one of the chief members of the faculty in God's Bible School. Along with Professor Experience, she is perhaps the most valuable teacher the Christian has. Poor Saul flunked when he had to take his "exam" in the subject of patience. But haven't we all, at some time or other? The Lord is good, and allows us to take the subject over again, until we get a passing mark.
It was impatience at the seeming delay of the Lord's second coming which made the unfaithful steward declare, "My Lord delayeth his coming," and he began to eat and drink with the drunken.

The Seeming Delays of the Lord. Peter warns us that impatience is closely akin to unbelief. Read 2 Peter 3:3-9. "In the last days," says Peter, "there shall arise scoffers, saying, Where is the promise of His coming?" "We're getting tired of hearing the same old warning, 'The Lord cometh, the Lord cometh,' and He doesn't come!" Here we see two sins blended to make a potent spiritual poison-the $\sin$ of unbelief and the sin of impatience. Why does the Lord delay His coming? Why does it seem that, like Samuel, "He comes not within the days appointed"? Peter explains it. "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to usward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." 2 Peter 3:9. The Lord delays His coming in mercy and longsuffering; He wants to see a few more souls saved, "snatched as brands from the burning," before His coming ends the day of grace. For example,

ask your pastor next Sunday night to request all of his congregation present who have been saved within the past ten years, to raise their hands. Whenever we make this test, from thirty to fifty per cent of the audience raise their hands. Then if our blessed Lord had come ten years ago all of these dear people would have been left behind, lost, unsaved, and very likely would have perished in the tribulation judgments and warfare! But because the Lord has tarried these ten years they are gloriously saved, safe within the Ark of safety, their names written in the Lamb's book of life.
been through the centuries, how longsuffering!
God's Time vs. Man's. Martha fretted, like Saul, at the seeming delay of the Master in not coming to the bedside of her fatally sick brother. Notice John 11:6: "When he (Christ) had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still in the same place where he was." Meanwhile Lazarus died. And dear Martha, like ourselves, thought her prayer should have been answered sooner. She fretted at the delay, and when the Lord did appear, "belatedly" by the time table of the flesh, she chided Him, saying, "Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died." John 11:21. Paraphrased, she meant, "Lord, your delay is responsible for my brother's death. Why didn't you come sooner? Why didn't you answer my prayer immediately?" We all know the glorious sequel -Lazarus was raised from the dead, in the Lord's own time.

Years ago we had a friend who, being a farmer, greatly resented the new system of daylight saving time. Whenever we asked her the time she would say, "Do you mean the Lord's time, or man's time?" Reader, what time do you keep-the Lord's time or man's time? "The Lord is not slack (God's time) as some men count slackness" (man's time).
"Dad, what time is the sun due to set tonight?" asked a little boy, who had just received a new dollar Ingersoll and was immensely proud of it. "Sunset is at $6: 36$, Son," called the father from the depths of the evening paper. Sonny, standing on the porch, watching the sinking sun, called back importantly, "Well, the old sun had better hurry up or it's going to be two minutes late according to my time." Ah no, except for Joshua's one-day use of special "daylight saving time," the sun has never been late. Neither has the Lord. "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and com-

His "tarrying," His seeming delay, has a twofold purpose. In addition to testing the patience of the saints, it tests their perseverance, their endurance. "Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord.
Stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh." James 5:7-8.

An Example of God's Patience. Years ago an atheist stood on a New York City street corner, vomiting his blasphemy into the ears of passers-by. "If there be a God," he challenged, "let Him prove it to you and me by striking me dead within the next two minutes." And very dramatically he drew out his watch, and counted the seconds, while a few horrified old ladies gasped at the daring of the wretched old fake. Of course he lived. The next day someone recounted the incident to a famous gospel preacher, who smiled and said, "Did that poor fool think he could exhaust the patience of God in two minutes time?" How patient God has
eth down from the Father of lights (the Lord of the planets), with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." James $1: 17$. Men set their timepieces by these "lights," or planets. God is the Father of lights, the Creator of the planets. He has never been behind time, neither has He ever been ahead of time, but is always on the dot. True children of God also should conscientiously endeavor to be punctual, always on time, "redeeming the time, for the days are evil."

Self-Exaltation. There is self-exaltation in Saul's action of usurping the ministry of the priesthood. God always deals with this sin in drastic fashion. "And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted." Matt. $23: 12$.
We have an outstanding example of this in the case of Herod. Acts $12: 20-23$. Herod gave vent to an orgy of self-exaltation. "And

## THE "DAUGHTER OF ZION" IN THE DUST

The Jewish Chronicle describes some of the humiliations to which Austrian Jews have been subjected. "Jews and Jewesses are still being driven to clean public lavatories, Nazi barracks, the horses and motor-cars of Nazi officials, and the streets, says a Vienna report. In many cases, Jewesses were ordered to put on their best dresses and to scent and powder themselves before proceeding to their tasks."

But there are bright gleams in the picture. For instance: "One Jew reported that, while he was on his knees scrubbing the pavement amidst the jeers of a Nazi mob, a woman suddenly called out to him: 'It is not you but we that need to be ashamed.'" The same paper states that individual German army officers intervened to save Jews from the attentions of Austrian Storm Troopers.

We know that there are many Germans and Austrians who are not in sympathy with the pagan spirit of Nazism, and we thank God for them.

MUSSOLINI AND THE JEWS
After years of tranquillity the Jews of Italy are beginning to feel the iron hand of oppression. Anti-Jewish feeling and activity are increasing. L'Osservatore Romano, Papal organ protested:
"Toward the Israelites we are not only extremely anti-Christian and anti-civil but inhuman. . . . Propaganda against Jews assumes, wherever it is organized and led, proportions unworthy of twenty centuries of Christian civilization!"

## THE SUPREME MAN

In his book, "The People of God," Nathan Birnbaum, Jewish thinker, describes the kind of Messiah he is looking for. "A man must arise, a man who will bring salvation to mankind, a Supreme Man to whom God will entrust the eternal task of world history, one who with unparalleled power will conquer the hearts of millions and those of generations yet unborn, one who will love each one as if he alone existed. And this Man, whom the Most High will send, must have power to deal with the age-long struggle of mankind with sin.'
O that his eyes were open to see that he has outlined the character and mission of Jesus of Nazareth!

## DEFICITS AND SURPLUSES

Figures may have a spiritual significance. The following report, based on official statements, indicates the spiritual trend in our land.
"In spite of an increase of more than $61 \%$ in our national income for 1936 over that of 1932 and with a cumulative increase of $\$ 48,718,000,000$ since 1932, the American public has actually decreased its gifts since 1932 for support of churches by $30 \%$, general benevolences $29 \%$, Community Chests $24 \%$, and colleges $18 \%$. Simultaneously expenditures for jewelry, army and navy, theatres, cigarettes, automobiles, whiskey, radio, and beer have soared to increases varying from $25 \%$ to $317 \%$.

## HISTORY REPEATS

We read of days when rather than pour a pinch of incense on the shrine of the Roman Emperor, early Christians went to death. Today, under the pressure of the pagan nationalism of Japan, Korean Christians are meeting torture for their faith. One writes: "Korea is like a huge concentration camp. Beginning last May, a good many men and women were arrested and investigated, which usually means torture. Most of them were Christians, and let it be known that they would not bow at the shrines. Eventually the number ran up to 200. The Japanese are clever enough to arrest with these people a few non-Christians who would go to the shrines so they can disclaim any persecution of Christians." Comments Presbyterian: "Let these pagan powers remember that the Roman Empire faded while the Cross of Christ marched on."

the people gave a shout, saying, It is the voice of a god, and not a man. And immediately the angel of the Lord smote him, because he gave not God the glory: and he was eaten of worms, and gave up the ghost." When Napoleon planned his invasion of Russia, the Russian Ambassador humbly visited the Little Corporal at his palace in Paris, and attempted to dissuade the Emperor from his threatened plans. Napoleon insolently rejected his overtures, commanding him to inform his master, the Czar, that he, Napoleon, would be in Moscow within a certain time. The answer to Napoleon was: "Sire, man proposes, but God disposes." God didn't require a legion of angels to put blasphemous Herod in his place; He used a few worms. He didn't use His heavenly cavalry in fighting against mad Napoleon; He sent the gentle snowflakes down upon the steppes of Russia, until the conquering battalions of the Little Corporal were smothered to death by their cold, white embrace. Man proposes, as did poor Saul in our lesson of today, but God disposes.

The Golden Text. "The soul that doeth ought presumptuously . . . shall be cut off." Years ago, there suddenly appeared on the Liberian mission field a young man of twentyone, who thrust himself upon the missionaries there, informing them the Lord had sent him.
