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# The CHALLENGE of the Empty Chair

### A MISSIONARY writes from India:

"I sat on the little veranda of my mission station, Amniapet, in India, and looked off to the HILLS OF DEATH. As I looked, I prayed: 'Lord Jesus, grant that some day I may be able to go there with the Gospel!' The opportunity finally came. I shall never forget that day. We reached the summit just before dawn and cast about for a camp. I went a little way ahead of the party, and rounding a rock, came upon one of those unexpected mountain villages. There, on tiny hut verandas, men were still asleep, muffled in their white turban cloths—a weird sight in the half-light of the early morning.

"One old man came out to greet me and asked me to come out and sit on his veranda. He disappeared into the hut to bring out, I thought, a mat for me to sit upon. But to my surprise he reappeared with a good European chair, and in his hand was a broken, dirty, paper-covered book. 'Six years ago,' my host began, 'a man spent a week, two weeks, three weeks with me. He went away, and he gave me this chair as a present. I have been praying ever since that another missionary would come and live among my people and teach us more about the Jesus of these pages. We have waited for six years, but you have come. I will get a hut ready for you, for you have come to stay, haven't you?"

"I had to tell him that that was an utter impossibility. I pointed to the plains 7,000 feet below. 'Down there,' I said, 'is my work, the work of two men.' He came close to me, the tears running down his old cheeks. 'Why,' he said, 'I may not be here when you come again.' 'Yes, I know,' (I admitted, with a stab of pain at my heart). Then, solemnly, determinedly, he took the foreign things—'Pardon me,' he said, 'for seeming rudeness, but no man shall sit on this chair until he can stay and tell us about the Lord Jesus Christ.' That was ten years ago, and no man has gone !

"Jesus never fails, Jesus never fails; Heav'n and earth may pass away But Jesus never fails."

Many a child of God passing through this wilderness sojourn has been inspired by this divine melody, even though they may not have known the tune or the actual words of this excelsior of the life of faith. This may sound paradoxical, but it is none the less literally true. The sentiment and experience is universal to the Christian life of faith though the words of this hymn are the composition of a particular child of God in the British Isles. The Chinese martyr in the yellow continent, the Negro saint in darkest Africa, the gentle Hindoo in India, emancipated from the shackles of priestcraft, have all sung the selfsame hymn in ages past, and will continue to do so in ages to follow, TILL HE COME, but the language has been and will be dif-ferent, and the words will flow out of heart's experience. "The life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself for me." Gal. 2:20.

A young Hindoe student, sitting at the feet of the great Doctor Duff in the early part of the second half of the nineteenth century, had the shock of his life, when one morning in t h e course of the usual short opening service before the regular class work began, the veteran Doctor pronounced, in no measured terms, in his usual downright style, the utter futility of stocks and stones to save any human soul or even to save themselves. He likened them to the very asphalt on the "The hall floor. Hindoo god" said he, "is no better than the asphalt on which I stand.' This led the young Hindoo student, then in his teens

(about sixteen), to think furiously. In after life, when questioned what led to his conversion, his cryptic reply would invariably be, "The uncompromising bigotry of Dr. Duff."

He began to study about this Saviour of Dr. Duff's who alone could save and save to the uttermost and none else. When fully convinced that there was no other way of escape from eternal death and damnation, he was eager with the impetuosity of earnest youth to confess Jesus as his Saviour openly and publicly before his fellow countrymen. Here he met with strenuous opposition from his Hindoo relatives. His father was not prepared to lose his then only son. He entreated, threatened, and cajoled in turn. He was then prepared to get his son baptized secretly in Benares, so that no friend or relative would know anything about it and he could live with the family as before. When everything failed, as a counsel of despair, the irate father shut up the refractory son in a room in his garden house in the suburbs of Calcutta, and had him fed twice a day on rice, salt and water to break down his "stubborn spirit."

This continued for a week or so. But the young man had found Jesus, had learned to love Him, and had experienced His saving grace in his innermost soul. So he stood fast to Jesus, and Jesus stood fast to him.


"But what to those who find? Ah this Nor tongue nor pen can show; The love of Jesus, what it is None but His loved ones know."

One day when his guards were rather somnolent, he escaped from his prison house. He had only rupee 1-4 in his pocket and the clothes he stood in, at the time. Cast on the wide, wide world with no means of support whatever! He lost no time in confessing Jesus openly and publicly by going through the waters of baptism on March 13th, 1864. JESUS NEVER FAILS. He never failed this young man up to the very last when he entered his eternal rest on the 11th of October. 1922, at the ripe old age of 77. He had his trials and testings no doubt. But what son is ever without chastenings? "If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons, for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not?"



He was beaten and spat upon when out in the villages preaching. On one occasion he was beaten so severely that his assailants left him for dead. It was their intention to kill him because he was drawing their young sons to Christ by the score as Headmaster of a High School. But God ruled otherwise. He did not die. Jesus had further need of his services.

The father of this young man, on his conversion, d i s i n herited him. How often and often the young convert used to testify w i t h praise on his lips and thanksgiving in his heart: "When I was baptized my earthly father made

out his will, and wrote 'my eldest son having embraced Christianity I give him nothing,' but my Heavenly Father wrote over it completely obliterating it, 'I give him everything.' PRAISE HIS HOLY NAME. "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?" Rom. 8:32. It was his constant testimony that the Scripture promise that "Everyone that hath forsaken houses.... or father or mother for my Name's sake shall receive an hundredfold and shall inherit everlasting life," had been literally fulfilled in his case.

Two incidents from his life the writer remembers vividly:

1. He had a passion for preaching, though in Government service, and utilized his holidays and spare hours to that end. In those early days of the E. I. R., he had traveled to what then was the railway terminus, to carry thither the message of God's wonderful love. Many years after he came on a visit to that very place to the writer (his son), who was the magistrate of the place. As usual, all the respectable gentlemen of the locality came "to pay their respects to" the magistrate's father, and this, in brief, is what he told them about God's faithfulness to him:

"Years back when this place was the terminus of the E. I. R., I had come here preaching the gospel. After the day's preaching in the bazar and the neighboring villages I came back to the town and asked for a night's shelter. All that they would and did offer, and that most reluctantly, was a corner in a cattle shed on the outskirts of the town. The stench and the filth was abominable, and sleep was impossible because of the many insects both in the string-bed and in the allotted corner. Now you see I am an honored guest in that very place in the home of the first magistrate of the land. My JESUS NEVER FAILS. 'Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.'" Matt. 6:33.

2. While going along Lower Circular Road (Calcutta), one evening, a man suddenly fell flat on his face at his feet, and made obeisance to him. When asked the reason of this extraordinary conduct, the man replied somewhat like this: "I took part in the murderous assault on you that night in Cachar. God has punished me severely. I have lost all that made life worth living. I have been searching for you all these years to ask your forgiveness. The man who had plotted against you, and had taken an active part in the assault became a leper soon after you left, and died a miserable death." How careful we must be to do nothing that we know to be in-

consistent with the will and the holy character of God. "Now therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts. Consider your ways." Hag. 1:5.


On page eleven of this Evangel there is a special letter we want all to read. In it our Missionary Department ask that 2,000 friends contribute \$1.00 a month beyond what they are now giving, to help us do our part in fulfilling the command of our Lord-to get the gospel to every creature. Some can do better than this. Many an individual and many an assembly can give \$10.00, \$20.00, or even \$100.00 per month extra. The sum of from \$12.00 to \$20.00 per month will support a native evangelist. At the present moment our Missionary Department has application from three different missionaries for support of additional native workers.

We now have in our Council work in different countries fourteen Bible schools for the preparation of converts, and our missionaries in Mossi Land in West Africa desire to open the fifteenth one shortly. The purpose of all these Bible schools is to train native workers to evangelize among their own people. Every missionary has learned that the best way to spread the gospel is by means of the native ministry.

When Brother James Salter was in Springfield he told us of a native from a far-away swampy district, where no European or American could live, coming and hearing the gospel and returning with it to his district. Later one of their missionaries passed through this district and found a great company not only saved but also baptized and speaking in tongues as the Spirit gave utterance. This revival resulted entirely from that one native's testimony. In like manner Central America is now being evangelized by students of the Bible School there, of which our Brother Ralph Williams is principal. The Word is a Book of sacrifice. Its theme is Christ, whose extreme sacrifice at Calvary on our behalf is our one hope of salvation. As we become partakers of His nature, His disposition, His mind, will it not be our joy also to sacrifice? Our missionaries learn to sacrifice their all on the field. Amy Carmichael, who has labored for fortyfive years as a missionary in South India, says: "It is wonderful how many things can be done without. Our fear is rather lest we should have too much ease in a world that had thorns for Him and a smiting rod and a cross."

If we caught the vision, how many things we could do without for His sake, who left all His riches in glory to come down to earth and became so very poor that He had not where to lay His head.

Let us get alone with Him, meditate on His love, on His sacrifice, on all the benefits with which He daily loads us. Let us seek to get the vision that Count Zinzendorf had when he stood before a picture of the crucified One, and read the words under the picture: "All this I did for thee; what hast thou done for me?" Zinzendorf returned to his home at Herrnhut and the vision remained with him. The result was the gracious Herrnhut revival. Every one in that revival caught the heavenly vision and cried to the Master, "What wilt thou have me to do?" They saw they must be obedient to His word to pray for the thrusting forth of laborers. A prayer meeting started that continued day and night for over a hundred years, and as far as we know is still con-



tinuing. They saw too they must be obedient to the heavenly vision and go into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. A hundred missionaries went forth from that one village to the uttermost parts of the earth. What sacrifices were theirs! One went to Jamaica and sold himself as a slave —to be able to preach the better to the slaves. It was one of these Herrnhut missionaries who led John Wesley to the light of salvation.

As we wait before the Lord to consider what He would have us do for Him at this time, let us remember His word to us in Psalm 76:11, "Vow, and pay unto the Lord your God: let all that be round about him bring presents unto Him that ought to be feared."— S. H. F.

### VILE LITERATURE

Said Joseph A. Frayne, Chairman of a Child Welfare Committee: "Among the factors contributing to the deplorable increase of youthful criminals is the reading of the indecent literature now being circulated, without restriction, throughout the country.

"Simultaneous with this unrestricted publication and distribution of indecent literature we have had a wave of sex crimes, so repulsive that decency forbids their further discussion."

### SEED SOWING

Four years ago a German Catholic Bible Union was established in Stuttgart for the distribution of the Word. Notable results have followed. Over a million copies of the Roesch and Keppler Bible have been sold, and tens of thousands of Bible calendars have been distributed among the people. Also of late 150,000 Bible letters have been sent out.

Pray that a great awakening shall come to thousands in the Catholic church throughout the world.

#### WAR PREPARATIONS

Military authorities have disclosed the fact that 48 nations now have, ready for war, 55,000,000 trained soldiers, or 35,000,000 more than in 1914. For 1937 the number of aeroplanes planned by the nations was 28,500, four-fifths of which are for war, at a cost of \$1,850,000,000. At this moment England is spending \$5,000,000 a day on armaments. War (as someone has said) is now "the use of wholesale, indiscriminate wounding and slaughter by organized lethal machinery, in order to force the enemy to do what, it is assumed, he would not otherwise do." And all this only twenty years after the greatest war recorded in history, which cost the lives of 10,000,000 young men, and \$25,000,000, spent in slaughter.

### PERSECUTED FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS SAKE

Herald of Holiness reports that recently a colony of Hutterain Brethren were exiled from Germany, the only crime being that of opposition to war. They were allowed one suit of clothing each and were compelled to leave all their possessions behind. They were given twenty-four hours to leave the country. This sect closely resembles the Moravians, and they are a religions, peace-loving people.

### A NEW NAPOLEON

Are we witnessing the rise of another Napoleon? Hitler, now the most dominant figure in European politics, is moving forward, taking what he wants. He has taken Austria; Czecho-Slovakia is within his grasp. But this is only the beginning. Poland has a strip of land running through Germany, ceded to her during the last war. Will Poland be next? And if Hungary agrees to union, and Roumania falls into his hands, Hitler will have an empire reaching from sea to sea. Then will he move eastward against Russia as he has so often hinted he might do?

Napoleon and the emperor of Russia once sat down before a map and proceded to divide Europe between them. Will the time come when Hitler, king of the North, and Mussolini, king of the South, and Japan's emperor, king of the East, gather round a table and divide the world between them? Time will tell. In the meantime Armageddon is much nearer than when our Pentecostal evangelists first began preaching on the "Signs of the Times."

The Bible Training School has opened for the new year with thirty-one students enrolled. The accompanying pictures show some of our promising students and faithful workers for whom we have no support. 


### BIBLE-READING CLUBS

We learn from *Herald of Holiness* that a movement started in Portland, Oregon, called the "Miracle Book Club," has grown to generous proportions. In 1936 there were eighty chapters; in 1937 there were 800 chapters and now the figure exceeds 1,000 groups. It is mainly on the Pacific Coast and has for its objective the reading of the Bible. Groups are kept in touch with each other through a monthly paper called the *Conqueror's Calendar*. It is the means of transforming many lives and is becoming quite active among the high-school groups.

### GAMBLING IN THE CHURCH

A sign in front of a New York church, says *Literary Digest*, reads: "Bingo every Thursday night in the Holy Spirit Room." Several churches in various parts of the land have been making similar anouncements; thousands of Americans sit down in church weekly to try their luck in this national craze. Movie exhibitors and others are protesting.

The argument of some church officials is that, if wealthy churches can raise money by bridge, why should not the smaller ones play beano or bingo, only costing thirty-five cents a prayer? One has pointed out that church bingo parties are a healthy substitute for gossip teas, lovesick movies, and liberalminded lecturers.

But *Presbyterian Guardian* has rightly protested: "The church can never adequately carry on its God-given function of preaching the supernatural gospel if it tries to accomplish its task by improper methods."

### "LOOKING FOR THAT BLESSED HOPE"



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



An old proverb says that a fast nickel beats a slow dime. "This reminds us of the Parables of the

### A SERIOUS INJURY HEALED

September, 1935, I fell, injuring my spine and dislocating the bones of the pelvis. After fifty-eight days in the hospital I was sent home, able to walk but crippled. The medicines became ineffective for relief, and I suffered agony from pressure upon the nerve. I all but went insane from the pain. I was yet a sinner, but the Lord was thus drawing me to Himself. In February, 1936, I heard of Divine Healing, called the minister, promised the Lord if He would let me get up I would attend church. He took me at my word, and in a few days I was hobbling around. 

had no control of my body, rolling on the pillow, my hands beating on the bed, and kicking with my feet. After two and a half hours of praying I called for my bathrobe and got up, walking the floor and praising God. 
### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

In such cases as when one has a small property, or a farm, ought one to tithe all one's income, or ought one to deduct such expenses as taxes, interest, etc., and tithe the net income?

Concerning tithing in the Old Testament, beside the tithes there were other responsibilities. In addition to the tithes Israel was to bring the first-fruits of the harvest, the

first-born of their flocks and herds; also they were to bring sacrifices of sin offerings, peace offerings, trespass offerings, and whole burnt offerings. In addition the men were to give of their silver as atonement money. They were also required to assume support of the national government besides. It was because Israel felt that Rehoboam was taxing them too severely that they sought lower taxes and rebelled when such was not granted. When Jesus was on earth Israel was taxed to support the Roman government. When asked if they should continue to pay their taxes to Rome Jesus answered "Render unto Cæsar the things



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that are Cæsar's and to God the things that be God's." At the same time that Israel were paying heavy taxes to Rome they were still fulfilling their tithing obligations to God. The Pharisees said, "I give tithes of all that I possess."

If a farmer, or a city person, has "business expenses" as for example, buying feed for stock, hiring help, etc., it seems reasonable that he ought to be permitted to deduct such items and pay tithes on the actual earnings. He ought not to deduct family living expenses etc., however. The merchant who has heavy store rent, large outlay for employees, goods, etc., could not be expected to tithe every cent he took in as most of such might be spent out for running expenses. He ought to tithe his income above such things. The farmer who raises all he feeds his stock ought to pay tithes on all since he has had no financial outlay in producing. Let tithing be a matter of grace, of liberality from the heart, if you wish to be blessed in your giving.

### AN INDIAN APOSTLE

A remarkable preacher, according to World Dominion, has appeared in Western India. He is referred to as a young Sikh, who was converted through what he read during a trip to Canada. His work has caused the sale of Bibles to rise from 500 to 12,000. The magazine named says of him: "He has all the fire of an apostle. He preaches Christ and Him crucified, and tells Christians that they must themselves be convicted of all sin if they expect to see the non-Christian so convicted. He is roving the churches of the Punjab as Sadhu Singh used to do. How he lives is a marvel. He never asks for money and refuses it, except for his railway fares, and he has no collections at his meetings. He tells simply how Christ brings into His life joy which he vainly sought as a Sikh."

### WORLD CHURCH UNION

"Late in May representatives of 130 denominations with 350,000,000 members in 21 nations met in Utrecht, Holland, to lay plans for the world council of churches," reports *Revelation.* "Further conferences are to be held and it is thought that it will take two years to get the organization accepted by the various bodies it is supposed to represent. We need not point out to discriminating readers that the whole thing is indicative of the tendency clearly marked out in the Word of God that will ultimately bring all ecclesiasticism under the leadership of Rome and the Antichrist."

### ROMAN EMPIRE

Dr. Melamed, a Jewish scholar, states that Italian attacks against Zionism, Italian propaganda in Palestine, Mussolini's friendship with the Moslem world—all reveal "aspirations to the restoration of the Roman Empire. ### THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

The Cost of True Christianity Lesson for October 16, 1938. Lesson Text: 2 Cor. 10, 11.

The Golden Text. Let us study the golden text first, today. "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." What does it mean to bear the cross? No better definition could be given than the passage taken here from Paul's autobiography. Read it. 2 Cor. 11:24-33. It means suffering, persecution, misunderstanding, tribulation. Many young Christians suffer under the mis-

apprehension that there should be no trouble in the Christian life. Therefore they take trouble, when it comes, to be a sign of the Lord's disapproval; even thinking, perhaps, "The Lord has forsaken me!" Nothing could be further from the truth. "Whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and He scourgeth every son whom he receiveth." Let us never forget that our Saviour was a "Man of sorrows," and acquainted with grief. Do not be surprised or aggrieved when trouble comes knocking at your heart's door. "In the world ye shall have tribulation (trouble): but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." God has promised His child something better than immunity from trouble. "I (the Lord) will be with him in trouble. I will deliver him." Psalm 91:15. "When thou passest through the waters, I will' be with thee; and through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee." Isa. 43:2. The three Hebrew Protestants, in Nebuchadnezzar's fiery furnace, had the Fourth, who was "like the Son of God," with them in the furnace. Daniel 3. When Paul went through the last heavy

trouble of his life, he said, "At my first answer (before Nero) no man stood with me, but all men forsook me." Deep, deep trouble. But then he cries, "Nothwithstanding the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me." (2 Tim. 4:16, 17). Blessed promise, "I will be with him in trouble."

The Lord of Hosts. Some years ago a Christian missionary in the heart of Africa received warning that a savage chieftain and his warriors were marching toward his mission compound to burn it down, and kill the missionary and his family. Earnestly he pleaded the promise of the 21st Psalm. Soon he heard the approach of the savages. The throb of their war drums, the blood curdling cries of the warriors, sounded in his ears. He looked out and to his joy saw that the savage mob had stopped at the edge of the Mission compound, with hesitancy and fear written on their faces. Then,

they turned and slunk away into the jungle. Later, that savage chief became friendly, and upon the missionary's inquiry, as to why he refrained from attacking on that day, the chieftain replied, "We were afraid of all the soldiers you had guarding your place." Then the missionary realized that his wonderful Lord had "been with him in trouble," sending the heavenly hosts to encamp round about him and his; for no human soldiers had been near the place.

A Crucified World. In connection with cross bearing, let us take another great text of Paul's and apply it to today's lesson.



"But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world." Gal. 6:14. Three crucifixions are here. Christ is crucified; Paul, the believer is crucified; and the world is crucified. In our lesson, the 10th and 11th of 2 Corinthians, Paul sets us the grand example of (1) Reckoning himself crucified with Christ and bearing the cross daily; (2) Reckoning Himself dead, crucified to the world's good or bad opinion of him, its flatteries and its calumnies; (3) Reckoning the world dead, crucified, and therefore of no importance to him, in his Christian progress.

Dead Men Do Not Wrangle. Notice how they mocked and criticized his "outward appearance" (10:7), his "weak bodily presence" (11:10), his "contemptible and rude speech" (11:6, 10). Evidently Paul had no great outward charm. Some even think he was physically deformed. Evidently he was not a flowery and eloquent speaker, in the natural; but he had died out to men's criticism along this line. He was "crucified unto the world, and they unto him." And dead men can't hurt each other. One hears no quarreling or wrangling among the inhabitants of the cemetery. "Ye are dead, and your lives are hid with Christ in God."

"How Great Things He Must Suffer." Notice the physical suffering Paul endured, in "bearing the cross." 2 Cor. 11:24-33. Five times receiving stripes, thrice beaten with rods (look at your American dime, and see the bundle of rods and the headman's axe —the Roman Fasces." They were called "lictor's rods." Perhaps that's where we get our word, "licking"). He was stoned, thrice

shipwrecked—"a night and a day have I been in the deep." Brethren, when one is in the heaving ocean, with nothing but a sliver of a plank between him and the deep, deep sea, what a chance he has to sing, "On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand!"

Paul continues by mentioning the perils which he endured among robbers, among his own countrymen, among false brethren. He cites the weariness, the painfulness, the cold, the nakedness. He reckoned it all a part of "bear-ing the cross." And in reviewing it elsewhere, he could cry out triumphantly: "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril or sword? . . . Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him that loved us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."—Rom. 8:35-39.—Harry J. Steil.
