One evening one of the young ladies in the choir at Minneapolis asked if she might give a testimony about a marked healing that had taken place the night before through a blessed handkerchief. The pastor, Brother Lindquist, gave permission for her to speak, and so she spoke.

The Baptism with the Holy Spirit

Floyd L. Hawkins at the Springfield Assembly

"John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence." Acts 1:5.

We should like to discuss briefly the what and the why and the how of the Baptism with the Holy Spirit—what it is, why it is necessary, and how it is received.

In many of our Full Gospel meetings when we preach about the Baptism we so construct our sermons that they will not sound too elementary to those who received the experience fifteen, twenty, or twenty-five years ago. These older saints have heard many sermons and read many articles and books upon the subject, and we endeavor to preach so that what we say will still interest them. However, we must not overlook the fact that constantly there are coming into our midst people who know little or nothing about the Baptism, and it is to such friends that this message is directed.

The Baptism with the Holy Spirit, is much like water baptism. To have this experience simply means that you have come to God and have become so wrapped up with Him and so lost in Him that His Spirit is within you and above you and beneath you and you are completely submerged, immersed, in the Holy Ghost. That is what we mean by the figurative term, "Baptized with the Holy Ghost." You are simply swallowed up in God.

There is a tremendous need for this experience on the part of every Christian today. We are engaged in a spiritual warfare. We do not wrestle against natural enemies or physical foes. Our battle is "against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." You cannot envision this warfare with your natural eye, and who could think of engaging in such a war without spiritual equipment?

"The weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds; casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ." I fear that the weakness and failure of the people of Christ down through the years is due to the fact that they have attempted to go out to battle in their own strength. It is folly to preach or teach or to engage in Christian work of any kind without the supernatural power of God inasmuch as ours is a spiritual warfare.

There is a close relationship between the word "power" in Acts 1:8 and the word from which our English word "dynamite" comes. Did you ever consider what would happen in the natural realm if there were exploded in one of our meetings a stick of dynamite? The place would be blown to pieces. Do we not need similar power in the spiritual realm in order to overturn and defeat and uproot and crush the forces of evil and the power of our spiritual enemy? We need the mighty dynamite of God, the power that He has promised us through the Baptism with the Holy Spirit, to replace the indifference and lethargy and other disabling human characteristics produced by sin. They are so formidable that no natural power can cope with them. "Ye shall receive power (dynamite), after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." Oratory is not sufficient. Fine music is not enough. We need something greater than fine choirs and large buildings. As a church and as individuals as well, we need the power

There are persons of a naturally retiring disposition, slow to respond to the things of God. They are afraid to testify for fear of their own voices. For some of these I have compassion, but with others I have little patience. Some are silent because they do not have the victory in their souls that they should have, and such are a burden and hindrance to the work of the Lord.

I once watched a freight train puffing past my window, making a great noise. The big engine was snorting and blowing with the utmost strain. After it had passed the window I watched the awkward, lumbering box cars dragging along behind. It looked as if they were doing all they could to stall the old engine. There seemed to be an endless stream of them, and I thought how much the train was like some churches I have known. A few people in the church are working hard—praying, testifying, teaching, singing, and doing all they can to promote the work—but hanging on behind are many others, a dead weight keeping the work from going ahead. They get on the gospel train and do not care whether they move or not. They simply drag their feet and make no spiritual contribution whatever.

I like people to either get into the work or get out of the way. I prefer that they get into it, but if they are going to be mere hangers-on, I prefer to see them leave.

A lot of people are genuinely backward in their disposition, however. I am glad to say that the Lord can change such a disposition. I have seen people who before their Baptism could never give a testimony or say amen or pray in public, vet when God baptized them with His Spirit they became veritable firebrands, ready to do anything, and shouting the praises of the Lord without fear of any one. The apostle Peter was transformed in that manner. Previously he had denied being one of Jesus' followers. But you will remember that he repented, and then on the day of Pentecost when he received this mighty Baptism with the Holy Spirit, it was he whom the Lord chose to preach that notable sermon that led three thousand into the church at

Some people are naturally more gifted than others, but I believe every one should be able to testify and lead in prayer. I believe God can transform you into a worker of great boldness. Do not let the devil deceive you. When it comes to drawing back, I think the men are worse than the women. They claim that they are busy all day making a living and that it is up to the ladies to read the Bible and pray and work for the Lord, as they have more opportunity. I do not agree, for the Lord is able to give every one of His children a mighty Baptism with the Holy Spirit that will give boldness and courage. I do not say that you will be made a preacher—an Apostle Paul, a Phillips Brooks, or a C. H. Spurgeon—but God will make you a witness. "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me.'

One of the most powerful evangelists I have known was a lady who encouraged me to get started in the work of the Lord. Although she was ignorant and unlearned, she would go into a town with no organization to back her, and no money of her own, but relying upon God alone. If she could not get a building she would build a brush arbor or get a tent. When it came to preaching and to platform ability she was a complete failure. But she had God in her life. My first revival meeting was held in a moving picture theater which had been closed through that woman's meetings; the manager of the theater had been saved and had turned it into a church. Such fasting, such seeking God, such agony in prayer, I had never seen, and oh, how God used that soul!

Old-timers know about such workers as Sister Woodworth-Etter. How God used that old soul! I suppose that in Dallas, Texas, there are as many Pentecostal people as in any city of its size in the world. In the beginning of this Pentecostal outpouring God sent Sister Woodworth-Etter to Dallas to hold a revival meeting for Brother Bosworth. The whole city was turned upside down through the way God worked. There was much opposition, but in spite of it all God sent great power and anointing and miracles to sanction the work. Friend, you may not be gifted in a natural way, but God can take a humble soul and transform him into a mighty power for His service.

You need the Baptism with the Holy Spirit. Get hungry for it. Your receiving depends on your hunger to a very large extent. If you are anxious enough for the Baptism you will seek God for it, in spite of your natural timidity. Those of you who are married or engaged to be married will remember how backward you were, perhaps, when you fell in love. You did not know how to frame your sentences to ask your sweetheart the question. However, you knew you wanted to say it, and the desire got stronger every day until finally you just popped the question. You hardly knew what words you were saying, and you cannot remember them now, but you said it.

That is the way with seeking the Baptism with the Holy Spirit. There is no formula that man could frame by which to seek, but in the words of the Lord Jesus Christ I declare to you, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." If you will get hungry enough after God, no one will have to tell you how to press through to Him. You will dare to believe God and He will come in answer to your cry and will meet your need. He is infinitely more anxious to fill you with His Spirit than you are to receive Him. "If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him?" No parent begrudges giving to his children, and the Lord is anxious to give the Holy Spirit to you if you have become His child. You must ask Him to do so, however. He gives the Spirit to them that ask

As James writes, "Ye have not, because ye ask not." You must pray. What were the disciples doing in the upper room when they were tarrying for the Baptism with the Holy Spirit? They "continued with one accord in prayer and supplication." What was Saul of Tarsus doing as he waited for the infilling of the Holy Spirit? He had been fasting for three days and was praying. What happened before the people of Samaria

received the Holy Ghost? The apostles came and prayed for them. If you want to receive, pray. Pray clear through until you reach the place where you love to pray—where prayer is easy and natural and spontaneous. We have never prayed enough until we feel it is glorious and sweet to be waiting in the presence of the Lord.

When you have prayed through to a place of victory, I believe you ought to look for God to baptize you with the Holy Spirit, and so you should praise Him and thank Him and rejoice in Him. Many think the Baptism is a mysterious experience in which you are carried clear out of your head and lose all consciousness. Such is not the case. God wants you to be aware of the thing He is doing in your life. You will not be unconscious of your surroundings when God baptizes you with His Spirit.

It matters not whether you are standing up or sitting, or what your position may be when you seek the Lord. On the day of Pentecost we are told they were sitting. However, I do think it is very uncouth and undignified for people to stretch themselves out on the floor in order to seek God. The Lord is so majestic and glorious that we should be reverent in our worship of Him. I am glad to see God "slay" people with His power if He so chooses. I have seen people by the score prostrate under the mighty power of God. However I feel that the idea of some people, that they must lie down on the floor and get in every one's way before God can baptize them in the Holy Spirit, is silly. advise seekers to get in a comfortable position so they can get their mind on the Lord and forget themselves, but they should not be entirely careless.

Ask the Lord to baptize you with His Spirit. Pour your heart out to Him.

Then praise and glorify Him. Exalt Him, magnify Him, make love to Him, worship Him, adore Him. Jesus is so wonderful, so real. He is your Redeemer, your Lord, your Baptizer, all you need. As you praise Him you will find He becomes more real to your heart, and the consciousness of the presence of God will increase until you are swept out into a mighty and glorious Baptism with the Holy Ghost.

After all, it is impossible for any one to lay down any formula to be followed in order to be filled with the Holv Spirit. I know this from personal experience. I went to the altar every night we had service, to seek the Baptism. If those who were praying with me told me to say, "Praise God, praise God, praise God," I did so. If some one else came and told me to say, "Glory to God, glory to God," I said it and said it. If they said to me, "Put your hands up; the Lord is up, not down," then I raised my hands. I obeyed all they told me to do. Often it was very confusing, for on one side they were telling me to do one thing while on the other side they were telling me to do the opposite, but I tried my best to do it all. After all, I believe it shows the right attitude when you follow the advice of the Christians who are trying to help you at the altar. It shows a humble, willing and obedient spirit.

Perfect Peace in Troublous Times

"Help, Lord; for the godly man ceaseth (literally, has ceased to be)." Psalm 12:1. This is an utterance that came from the lips of David—at the time, doubtless, when the apostasy of Saul and of the nation of Israel was daily becoming more apparent.

Elijah voiced a somewhat similar cry as he saw the terrible falling away in his day: "The children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away." But upon the mount of God he received a revelation that all the godly had not ceased to be. The word came from the Lord: "Yet I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal."

Our precious Lord foretold of last day conditions, "The sea and waves roaring." To what did He refer? Undoubtedly to the ungodly; for the inspired prophet tells us that "the wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest, whose waters cast up mire and dirt." Isa. 57:20. The danger with so many of us these days is that we have our eyes on the mounting waves, on the mire and dirt everywhere manifest, and our ears are ever open to the roar of the sea, instead of having our eyes constantly on our lover Lord, and our ears ever attentive to Him. Like Peter when he attempted to obey the word of the Lord and walk on the water, we get so taken up with the boisterous winds that we begin to sink, and we have to receive the rebuke of the Lord, "O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?"

When the disciples saw the billows surging and the waves roaring in an unprecedented storm on the lake of Galilee, they were filled with terror. Surely the boat would go under and they would all be drowned. They went in alarm to the calm, restful, trustful One who lay peacefully asleep on a pillow in the hinder part of the ship. They cried, "Master, carest thou not that we perish?" Did He care for them—and for us? Assuredly. He arose, and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace, be still." The wind ceased, and there was a great calm. Then He turned to the terror-stricken disciples and said, "Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?"

Today, amid the turmoil, the sea and waves roaring, He who sitteth in the

heavens is undisturbed. He has heard the word from His Father, "Sit thou at my right hand until I make thine enemies thy footstool." He is awaiting His Father's time, when He will arise and come forth to make war upon the ungodly. He will still the restless, roaring waves of wickedness. His disciples need not fear, for He will make "the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still." inquiry of the Lord. The Lord's word was reassuring. It always is. "Pursue: for thou shalt . . . recover all." David was obedient. The word of the Lord proved true. night I took faith and said, "Right now." And in two minutes' time the Lord had come in His fullness and had baptized me with His Spirit. We receive the Baptism by faith—as Ben Hardin says, not taking it and believing we have it and going away without it—but reaching out in faith. You will never be filled with the Spirit as long as you believe God is going to do it. You must believe that God does it right now, as you yield yourself to Him.

"They were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them ut-

terance." Acts 2:4. Notice that it was they who began to speak with other tongues. I do not believe in presumption and attempting through natural means to speak in supernatural utterance. However, too many hesitate and very nearly refuse to let go and launch out in faith. It is your place to yield your voice to Him, as well as your heart and mind and all, and believe that He comes right now and baptizes you. When you dare to fully believe, that instant you will be speaking with other tongues. Do not be afraid to launch out and yield your tongue, for it is you that does the speaking as the Spirit gives utterance and directs.

The Baptism with the Holy Spirit is an experience that is received subsequent to regeneration. Speaking with other tongues as the Holy Spirit gives utterance is the initial physical evidence of the experience. There are many other evidences that come into a person's life when they have been baptized with the Spirit-holiness of life, a white-hearted love for God and for the souls of men, the fruits of the Spirit, and so on. God will put all these evidences in your life if you yield to Him and let Him fill you with Himself. Ask Him to fill you. Praise Him and worship Him with real faith and joy in your heart. Do not expect Him to take all year to do it, but say, "Jesus, I believe you do it right now," and the Lord will come and give you this glorious experience immediately.

THE GOSPEL IN FOREIGN LANDS

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Ninety-Seven Baptized in Harbin

Mr. and Mrs. A. Wingard write from their station in Harbin, Manchuria: "Having returned to Harbin once more we began to make ready for a baptismal service. We began on Sunday night and finished on Tuesday night, baptizing altogether thirtyone believers. Having previously immersed sixty-six earlier in the year, this brings the grand total to October up to ninetyseven. While we are glad indeed for the increase in numbers of believers added, we feel to cry out to the Lord Jesus for a reopened fountain in our midst. For about three months no souls have come through to the Holy Ghost Baptism at this station. We must see a break. Please pray for a fresh revival outpouring.

"Early in October we went out to assembly 'C' to baptize in water those who had already been saved. While there we gave Christian baptism to eighteen believers. The Lord Jesus Christ was there to meet hungry hearts and He baptized six with the Holy Spirit, while a number of others were refreshed."

A PECULIAR COINCIDENCE

Some of our missionaries in Peru have taken advantage of a rather unusual means of placing Scripture verses before the people. Jane Collins has written several times about their going out along the roads with a supply of black stove polish and white wash, painting short verses on prominent rocks or other flat surfaces where they can be a witness to passersby. Another letter has just been received from Miss Collins with the following unique incident related:

"A few days ago we were out painting along the roads when we came to the airport, so we asked the officer there if we could paint a nice big text on the tin roof of the hangar. He thought it would be a good idea, so in a few days we re-

turned with two of the brethren who climbed to the roof and painted the e words, 'God is Love' in letters twelve feet high by three and a half feet wide. It can be read at a disrance of a mile and a half.

"The next day four priests came out, and seeing this and other texts, told the officer in charge that he must have the merased. 'But, father, those are beautiful words. You would not want to erase

the name of God from the people!' 'No, but those evangelicals have done this and it must come down!' After much persuasion, they sent a boy to begin scraping the letters off. He had hardly gotten started when the young officer said, 'Now, suppose there came a terrible wind and storm; then it would be God punishing you for erasing this.' 'Oh, God is not in such as that,' the priest replied.

"Within ten minutes God honored the young man's faith, and there came such a violent wind and storm that it turned up the sheet metal of the roof and blew down four light poles near the priests. Needless to say they were a bit nervous, and as soon as they could safely leave the place they got away, leaving the text there.

"The next day we went out there to paint the other side of the roof and the young officer was exceedingly happy about it because God had answered his faith. He is in a good place to give his heart to God as is also his wife. Please pray for them. On the other side of the roof we printed 'Christ Forgives and Gives Peace.'

"Will you also pray for the doctor of the Peruvian Marines? He was apparently dying with pneumonia when in answer to the prayers of the church the fever left instantly and he is well. This has been undoubtedly for his salvation. Two others have been saved recently and it is blessed to see them grow in the knowledge and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ."

them grow has been our greatest joy of the past months. With increased interest in the coming baptismal service came greater interest in the study of the Word and deep heart searching.



To enter a new place with the gospel is not as easy as it would appear. We might use the words of the Apostle Paul, "A great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries." It means that there is much opposition. It does not mean that the people of this

country are irreligious; on the contrary they are very religious, but not after godliness. For centuries they have been told that they are the true Christians while we Evangelicals are "heretics" and "sons of Satan." Their bitter hatred toward our faith has often been manifest in open persecution, and they imagine that they do God service thereby. The priests, having heard of the triumphs of the gospel in other lands, seem to have determined that it should not be received into this country.

Consequently, to enter a new place with the gospel means that we are not wanted no more desired than a bad case of smallpox. In view of this situation we marvel that whole towns and villages during these last two months have turned out to hear the gospel message, many inquiring concerning the way of salvation, and hungrily receiving our gospel literature and Bible portions.

We Enter a New Town

Let us in imagination make a trip together. We must go by horseback along a very precipitous trail, plod through mudholes and cross innumerable streams swollen by five months' rainy season. We are accompanied by a native worker and his wife and their little ten-year-old daughter who all sing sweetly the gospel message. Then follows another native worker carrying our accordion on the saddle in front of him.

After a few hours along the way rain begins to pour down. The native workers do not have rain coats and soon become soaked to the skin. With the horses slipping, sliding and wading through mud we make painfully slow progress. Were we tempted to

slow progress. Were we tempted to complain, we should immediately think of the merchants who make the same trip every week to sell whisky.

Should we be well received? Should we be able to find lodging and a place for the workers to dry their wet clothing? Would there be a place for the services? Feeling strangely helpless we bow our heads and pray to the Lord who had sent us, and tell Him our need.

A bit below us on the side of the mountain with a large Catholic temple in the center plaza we see the town—our destination—and give thanks to God. As is our custom we report immediately to the civil authorities to inform them concerning the object of our mission, and discover with joy that they are friends of previous acquaintance who had befriended our mission on other occasions, and gladly offer to uphold

our rights of religious liberty such as is guaranteed by the law. We are soon able to rent a small house for lodging and to secure the largest unoccupied house in town for the services. After making a few seats from boards and boxes we announce the services throughout the town.

Will They Come and Be Converted?

The hour comes for the first No one ventures to meeting. enter. Alone we begin to sing and a few children come in. In a few minutes they leave. We continue singing and soon they return bringing others. Finally thirty gather and listen very attentively to the preaching, and accept several Gospels and tracts. The next night sixty come out, the following night a hundred and twenty. From that time forward the people open their hearts and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. Within eight days twenty-five souls are saved, and they begin to learn to sing and testify. One of them offers his house for the meetings and the people begin talking about building a meeting house. The enthusiasm becomes so great that it is necessary for the native worker to stay and continue the (Continued on Page Eighteen)

PALESTINE PRODUCE

Ernest Gordon writes that "in 1926 Jewish farms in Palestine produced 150,000 eggs annually; in 1937 forty million. The value of Jewish industrial products jumped from 5,352,000 pounds in 1926 to 9,109,000 pounds in 1937, in spite of the disorders and uncertainties of the time."

CRIME

The New York Times in a recent editorial stated that as a person walks down the street, one out of every 37 people he meets will be a criminal, and one out of every 650 will be a murderer. It adds that the cost of this criminal population amounts to fifteen billion dollars yearly, or about \$115 to each individual in our population.

REBUILDING JERICHO

The ancient biblical town of Jericho is to be rebuilt and modernized according to the Watchman-Examiner. A Planning Commission is arranging a residential community of medium sized homes. The present site of Jericho was rebuilt by the Crusaders. It lies 250 meters below sea level and has a population of 1,700. It is a popular winter resort, having a warm climate and healthful sulphur springs which are not developed. In the southeast part of the town is a building with a tower, by tradition reputed to be the house of Zacchæus.

SOME STARTLING FACTS

Advent News states: "The Higher Critics have formulated over 700 different theories since the year 1850. Second fact: Each of these theories claimed to be endorsed by up-to-date science and to be the product of the latest scholarship. Third fact: At the present time over 600 of these theories are exploded and abandoned, owing to deeper and wider knowledge. Fourth fact: The remaining hundred theories are rapidly becoming untenable, from the same cause. Fifth fact: Notwithstanding all this, these discredited Professors still loudly assert their ridiculous claims."

THE SCAPEGOAT NATION

Writes Joseph Taylor Britain in The Presbyterian: "There are those who seek to make the Jew the scapegoat for all our religious, political and economic ills. Jaroslavsky, head of the Society of the Godless, has declared that atheism in Russia is now in the last stage of its struggle against religion. The year 1942, he says, will mark the jubilee of the Soviet Union and the great festival of the victory of atheism. By 1967, after half a century of Communism, he predicts that the 230,000,000 population of Russia will be completely godless."

The Pre-eminent Christ

Lesson for December 18, 1938. Lesson Text:

Colossians 1 and 2

The Colossian Error. "Let no man beguile you of your reward in a voluntary humility and worshipping of angels." Col. 2:18. The Colossian Christians had been led to embrace the erroneous idea that Christ was revealed to man, through a graduated angelic evolution, from one rank of angels to another, so that the Christ, could gradually, and in angelic form, be revealed to mankind. This of course made Christ the Creator to be a mere

creature. Paul points this out. Angels are creatures. Christ created them. He is not their "fellow He is their Creator. creature. "For by Him were all things created, that are in heaven (the angels), and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him."

Peter's Similar Misapprehension. Peter verged closely upon a similar error upon the mount of Transfiguration. "Lord," he said, "it is good for us to be here: if thou wilt, let us make here three tabernacles; one for thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elias." Lord, let's put you on an equality with men of the law and the prophets-Moses and Elijah. That is the sin of Modernism. Christ was a great prophet, they say. He was a great teacher, a great law giver—as great as Moses, as great as Elijah but no greater-human, and only, human just as are they, but divinely inspired. Poor Peter almost became a Modernist—a Unitarian—but God cured him. In terrible awful majesty God descended upon that group on the mountain top and thundered. "This is my beloved Son: hear him." While the poor disciples, including Peter, were prostrated under the

awful splendor of the glory of God, the Lord removed Moses and Elijah. "And when they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no man, save Jesus only."

Christ as Creator. "For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible." During His earthly career, the Lord indicated in many ways that He was the Creator. When He healed the maimed, those from whom members were lacking, He created anew just what these needy ones required. He rebuked the wind and the waves, and there was a great calm, indicating that He was Lord over the elements. He rebuked and cursed the fig tree with His word, and it withered from the roots up, showing He was Lord over the vegetable kingdom. He bestrode the unbroken ass's colt, which meekly carried Him, showing His lordship over the animal kingdom. In like manner when the disciples had toiled all night and had caught nothing, He com-

mandeered the very fish of the sea so that when the nets were cast "on the right side of the ship," 153 great fish were caught. The demon spirits did obeisance unto Him, thus acknowledging His lordship. He raised the dead. proving that He was the Creator, the Giver, the Sustainer, of life. When the Pharisees asked Him to silence the plaudits and praises of the happy disciples as He entered Jerusalem, He indicated that He could make "the very stones cry out," showing His creative ownership of even the inanimate world. The lordship of the Rock of Ages over the rocks!

IS SELF ENTHRONED-OR CRUCIFIED WITH CHRIST?



Truly, by Him were all things created. If He demonstrated His mastery and lordship over creation, in the days of His humiliation, what will be the glory of the manifestation of His power in the Millennium; when the Son of man shall come in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, and sit upon the throne of His glory!

He Is a Christ of Power. We read the promise that the wolf shall lie down with the lamb, that the lion shall lose his ferocity, that the little child shall lead the once savage beasts-all a glorious tribute to the Creator, our blessed Lord Jesus, who has power over nature. We read of the scorpion (cockatrice) and the poisonous adder (65,000 die annually in India from snake bite) losing their venom, so that little children can play near their dens. Daniel, in the lions' den, resting as unconcernedly in the midst of the savage beasts as though he were sleeping with a litter of cocker spaniels, is another picture of the power which the Lord, the Creator, will hold over all his

He Is a Worker of Signs. Was not the Lord demonstrating His lordship as Creator, when He said of the believers in His church, "They shall take up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them"? We are not referring here to the sinful, presumptuous practice of purposely and knowingly taking up serpents, as do certain religious fanatics. "Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God!" Paul's experience on the isle of Melita is a sample of what the Lord meant. A dear old South American missionary, has told us of two brothers in Venezuela, joint plantation owners. One was a Christian, a member of her church, the other a rank unbeliever. The Christian was bitten by a poisonous serpent. He claimed the promise in Mark

16, was anointed and prayed for, and God healed him. The unbelieving brother mocked at the whole experience, and said the brother never had been bitten, as no snake was in the vicinity of the plantation where he claimed to have encountered the reptile. weeks later that unbeliever, while walking through the plantation at that very point, was bitten by a poisonous serpent, and died later in horrible agony. On June 8, 1938, I had an attack of inflammation of the bowels, and discharged blood for about thirty hours suffering great pain. June 9, wife and I read our Bibles and prayed before retiring. Thinking I might

not live through the night, I said to my wife, "Lay your hands on me and pray, as I have great confidence in your prayers." She did so in the name of Jesus, and then went to her room.

Almost immediately I fell asleep and enjoyed my first night's rest in nearly eight years. I slept without waking until wife awakened me about 6:30 in the morning. All my pain was gone and I found myself organically normal. I have continued to be so for more than six weeks. Among the many things He took from me was chronic hemorrhoids of forty years standing. My appetite has been restored. I was seventy-eight years of age yesterday, July 21, and have been engaged in the Pentecostal ministry for almost twenty-nine years.—E. F. Cunningham, 1030 North Plum Street, Mt. Carmel, Illinois.

Ed. Note.—The above testimony is signed by Mrs. Cunningham also. We held the testimony for some time, and then wrote Brother Cunningham. On October 20, he wrote that none of the former pathological conditions have returned, and that he is working full time in the ministry, in more than normal health and strength for one of his years.

AN AMAZING HEALING

Eleven months ago on June 15, 1937, I was healed and raised almost from the dead. I had been sick most of the time for thirty years and in that time had had twenty major operations. It is impossible to tell all that I went through.

My tonsils have been removed (three growths), also I was operated on for serious gall bladder trouble and at the same time had a ruptured appendix. Later the last three joints of my back bone were removed because they were almost tubercular. This time I was in the operating room four hours and I had terrible hemorrhages. Oxygen and other restoratives were given me to bring me back to life, as I had lost so much blood and the shock of the operation was so great. My cousin, who is a wonderful surgeon, assisted in the operation. He told my husband I was gone. But my husband pleaded so hard that they try something else, as he thought I must be still alive. They did try a very peculiar drug. Only a few in medical history have been benefited by Finally they felt a little life. I could hear but could not make a sound or move for some time.

Five years later I had my gall bladder removed. Three years after this, in Niagara Falls I was taken very ill with vomiting and kidney colic. I was so sick it took me a week to get home to Richmond. I was taken to a hospital and operated on for a hernia and adhesions. All my female organs were removed. Previous to this I had had six female operations. On the fourth day kidney colic started again. There was a 24 inch incision in me and no drug could stop the pain. A stone was wedged in the tube between the left kidney and bladder.

This held up the water and burst the left kidney. My left kidney was swollen the size of a baby's head. This awful condition grew worse and after ten years they found a stone as large as a pear in my left tube between the kidney and bladder. The doctor told me I would never walk another step. They cut the tube four times and tried to force the stone down by suction. I had hundreds of cystoscopic treatments (that is running many tiny wires up the tube into the kidney to stretch the tubes), with as many as sixteen hypodermics before I had any relief. Only God knows how many attacks of kidney colic I have had.

Previous to this a double abscess and five tubes were removed from my right breast. At another time when I was operated on my "third stomach" as the doctors called it, was removed. This had either a cancer or ulcers on it. They never told me just what. I only know I was in awful agony with burning pains all the time. This operation was not a success and I did not react as I should. I was once more taken to the hospital and was in a coma for ten days. As I was recovering from this operation, I took a deep cold and went down with double pneumonia, having a temperature of 105 degrees. After this, I promised God I would live and work for Him and began to teach a Sunday School Class. I found I needed to study God's Word so I went to a Bible Training School and graduated. God called me to do missionary work at the colored hospital in this city. The devil hindered in every way possible both with my physical condition and with worry because of financial reverses.

Previous to this my blood pressure had been below normal. I was really anæmic. But when I went to a doctor for sinus trouble he told me my blood pressure was 190. I began having awful heart attacks, Angina Pectoris, and had them frequently. I suffered agonies during the attacks, and the doctor, a friend, would leave the room saving, "I cannot see her die." Morphine would make me so sick I would often vomit after the hypodermic was given. Sometimes the This condition attacks would last all day. grew worse until I began to spit blood. I went in January, 1937 to one of the best heart specialists in Virginia. He told me I had a growth larger than the largest loaf of bread, caused by the same old kidney stone with twenty years enlargement. This was pressing my heart and also the main valve of my heart was closing. The best surgeons in Richmond X-rayed me. They put me on a diet with no bread or starches for six months. I continued to get worse instead of better, so I was sent to Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. The night I arrived there, I had the worst heart attack of all. All the doctors ran in to see this peculiar heart attack. My blood pressure went to 300 and they had to put nitroglycerine under my tongue. I went blind and almost crazy from the headache. The veins in my temple were swollen like a lead pencil and the veins in my neck and at the base of my brain were clotted. The specialist examined me and found the big old burr stone in my left kidnev and two in the right. For a week I was kept under morphine or other "dope." Finally, I heard them say, "No hope for her, we wish we could do something but she will

die anyway." I begged to be permitted to come home.

After coming home, some friends from a prayer group came to see me and brought two Pentecostal preachers. They said, "You see man can do nothing for you, why don't you take the Lord for your body." I said, "If it is His will He will heal me." They helped me to see there was healing in the atonement, which I had never seen before. While they were telling me of other healings, a heart attack came on. I called on them to pray. While they were praying I saw Jesus standing, healing me. They said, "You are healed," but I would not accept my healing.

I did get out of bed, and at times was much better, but continued taking various kinds of medicine. My doctor kept telling me to come back to the hospital as they must work on my kidneys or I would die. My husband urged me to go. If I had kept my case in Jesus' hands and stood on His Word, I should have continued healed as I was when prayed for. But I went back to the hospital for treatment. I tried to hide this from my new Pentecostal friends, who were praying for me so earnestly. While on the operating table I nearly passed away, having three heart attacks that day. In five days I was taken home as there was no help for me and I continued to get worse. I had convulsions of the kidneys and heart attacks for eight days. My doctor told me that no one had been known to live more than ten days in such a condition.

My friends, Brother and Sister Heflin, came again and said they thought the Lord would take my life unless I trusted Him fully and leaned entirely on Him for healing. I resented this at first. But God made His will plain to me. I became willing to do His will no matter what it meant. I told the Lord, "Though you slay me, I will not take another hypodermic or a dose of medicine." When my friends left, the dope I had taken before they came was taking effect on me. But somehow I staggered to my dresser and gathered up all the various kinds of "dope," morphine, nembutal, pantopen, laudanum, convulsion serum, etc., over \$12.00 worth and threw them away. But there was one I took for chronic constipation that I hung on to for a minute. Jesus said to me, "Can't you trust me for that, too." I said, "Yes Lord," and threw it away too.

That same night I went to the Calvary Pentecostal Tabernacle and gave my testimony of healing and have been well ever since. From June 15, 1937 to May 15, 1938 I have not taken one dose of medicine not even soda. I am doing my own house work and hospital and jail visitation. I took a trip to California by bus and felt just fine while traveling. I could never have traveled like that if God had not healed me. The Lord baptized me in the Holy Spirit according to Acts 2:4 at the Potomac Park Camp Meeting in August of 1937. I can never Praise God enough for His marvelous love to me. —Mrs. W. L. "Arise ye princes, and anoint the shield." Isa. 21:5. This chapter describes in detail the taking of Babylon (Dan. 5) which took place at least one hundred and seventy years later.

Note the besieging Medes and Persians coming as a whirlwind on their camels and mules, the city being delivered over to them through treachery, Belshazzar's horror and terror at the handwriting on the wall, and how the night of his pleasure was turned into fear.

Babylon, like Assyria, is often used in prophecy to typify the coming Antichrist, and its destruction as a comfort and cheer to God's oppressed children in the "last days." See v. 10.

Whenever we read of "princes" or "kings" among God's people, or they are described as "reigning," we may expect to find some special message for the overcomers.

The shield of faith is literally the hand with which we put the Lord Himself between us and the enemy (Gen. 15:1; Psa. 3:3; 28:7; 84:8, 11; 91:4; 115:9-11; 119:114; Eph. 6:16); and while He Himself is the Shield, our use of it and its efficacy for us depend on our faith.

These are days when the shield of faith is liable to become rusty from lack of use, and we need to ask for the oil of the Spirit to rub the rust away.



But the Word of the Lord is: "In Isaac shall thy seed be called."



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
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IN THE WHITENED HARVEST FIELD

SERMON IN MINIATURE

JOYOUS CHRISTIANITY

"Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice." Phil. 4:4.

These words express: (1) Paul's experience in Christ, even though he wrote them from a Roman prison. (2) The experience all true Christians may have under all circumstances.

I. THE NATURE OF CHRISTIAN JOY.

- 1. Joy in experience. "And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple . . . with gladness . . . and the Lord added to the church daily." Acts 2:46, 47. See also John 15:11 and Gal. 5:22.
- 2. Joy in service. "Rejoice with Me; for I have found My sheep which was lost." Luke 15:6. Those who share the Father's quest will share the Father's joy.
- 3. Joy in hope. "Rejoicing in hope." Rom. 12:12. See 1 Peter 4:13 and Titus 2:13.

- II. THE SOURCE OF CHRISTIAN JOY
- 1. Conscious experience of forgiven sin. "There was great joy in that city." (The revival in Samaria.) Acts 8:8. See also Psalm 21:1; Acts 2:41; and Rom. 15:13.
- 2. Union of the soul with Christ. "Abide in Me... that your joy might be full." John 15:4, 11. See 1 Cor. 12:26.
- 3. Complete dedication of life to Christ. "Their joy . . . abounded . . . (they) gave their own selves to the Lord." 2 Cor. 8:2, 5.

CONCLUSION

(1) The Christian whose religion lacks joy has missed God's normal purpose for him. (2) True Christianity offers the richest joy that life can know.

campaign. The man who rented us the house refuses to take the rent and even offers material to make a dozen benches. Just before we leave we hear him say, "You must not stay away very long. By the grace of God we have come to the light, but are like newly-born puppies that have just opened their eyes. You must come back soon!" It impresses us deeply.

"You must come back soon. . . words echo in our ears as we ride along on our way to another town. A new child has been born into the gospel and we can not leave it to the merciless fire of the enemy -a new church has been raised up and it must be nurtured by the Word and cared for until it shall become established, and the means of bringing Salvation to the villages of its vicinity. Now that we have returned home those words are still coming to us from over the mountains: "You must come back soon." It is the call of many needy, dark places. It means many hundreds of miles of weary travel, hardships and perils of the way, absence from home with its love and comforts. We sigh deeply from the heart by reason of the tremendous unfinished task yet before us. We can only ask of you your continued fervent prayers that God will give us strength and wis-

dom to carry on.

Also please pray with us for our need of

a car. There are many hundreds of towns within easy reach with an automobile. Having our own car would make possible reaching many places with greater facility.

The Dying Thief

There were *two* dying thieves. Let us notice how different was the testimony of those two men. To begin with, they seem to have been cut off the same piece of cloth. That is, they were both malefactors, thieves, evil doers, condemned to death for their crime. They both reviled Jesus, the other evangelists tell us. They both railed upon Him and taunted and mocked Him and called upon Him to descend from the Cross and take them down if He were the Christ.

Notice that these men had had the advantage of religious training. They were not heathen. When the repentant thief, who was yielding as the Holy Ghost was working upon him, turned to the other thief he said, "Dost thou not fear God?" Those words show he was no Roman heathen. The Romans had a multiplicity of gods and idols. But these thieves knew the one true God. Either they were Jews or evidently had been under Jewish influence.

They were suffering right then the most awful death that even cruel imperial Rome could inflict. They were in the last throes of mortality. Yet one thief said, "Don't you fear God?" Not only did they believe in the one true God, but they believed they would have to stand before Him and give an account of the deeds they had done in the body. So they had had opportunities.

I want to point out the great importance of that. They had had opportuni-

ties but failed to avail themselves of them. They had failed to follow the teaching they had received, perhaps from their parents, and from their spiritual leaders, and had fallen into deep sin. But now in this awful moment that spiritual teaching came back to those men. The penitent man received it in his memory and pressed upon the impenitent thief to change his attitude.

How all-important it is that we should carefully instruct our children and all who are under our care and control about the great truths of the gospel. I remember that during the Great War I often felt so distressed at seeing people listen to the gospel and then go away untouched and unrepentant.

I talked to the Lord about it one day, and said, "How can I stand to see people act like this. O Lord, when I have given out thy Word to the people, to the best of my ability, how can I bear to see them turn away?" The Lord answered me, "In these perilous times, when men are going out to the trenches, never to return, they need the gospel message."

How awful it was. We were keeping open house to the soldiers, and holding about forty meetings a week. The Lord said to me: "It is all important that every one you can reach, soldiers and others, should hear the gospel. Although it is a savor of life unto life with some, and of death unto death to others, they all have the right to the opportunity. Furthermore (and I shall never forget this; it is a comfort to my soul) I take some of those men into the cannon's mouth to get them saved, and when they have heard the gospel of salvation through the blood of Jesus Christ, it enters their minds and souls like a flash of light in the moment of crisis and turns them from the path that is leading them right into hell. At that awful moment they cry to the Lord and He delivers them!"

Oh, how that comforted me. I know it is true. We are given the testimony of this dying thief to show that there is such a thing as death-moment repentance. No one need presume upon it, as it is the only incident of its kind in the Bible.

It is not easy to preach the gospel we proclaim. When you preach with sincerity and earnestness it takes something out of you. But I know that God will not let our words fall to the ground. Although we sometimes feel it is useless, God will make use of the words we have given the people.

This dying thief was roused, first to conviction, and also to concern for his companion in guilt at the very last moment, recalling to his companion the teaching he had received in his younger days, and warning him. Then confess-

ing his crimes and vileness, he goes on to say, "And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds. We are only getting what is coming to us"—the most cruel punishment that the Romans could inflict. It was a punishment reserved only for the most degraded criminals, this death by inches, but he said it was what they had earned. He confessed his guilt. He was being moved by the Holy Ghost.

Then the blessed Holy Spirit, after the malefactor had confessed that he deserved to die, turned him away from his sin to behold the Lamb of God, and gave him life. He turned and said, "This Man hath done nothing amiss." The Lamb is without spot and without blemish. The dying thief turned to Jesus. Oh, what a marvelous thing is repentance and faith. May the Lord help us, if we need to repent, that we shall all respond and humble ourselves. If God shows you your short-comings, hasten to take your place at the feet of Jesus in the dust and ask for His mercy.

If any condemnation comes on me I am very simple about it. My brother-in-law one time before I got "simple" as he thinks, thought I was clever. He prided himself on belonging to the intelligentsia. But when I got saved and received the Baptism in the Holy Ghost, and he came to our home, I prayed in tongues. I wouldn't stop by any means, and when I told him he was eternally lost and doomed, then he turned against me and told me I had abbrogated my intellect, thrown it in the garbage. He told me I had disturbed his atmosphere; I wanted it to be so disturbed that he would get into a different atmosphere. He said, "Quit praying for me," but I didn't.

It pays to be simple. In the faith life you have to be simple. A child doesn't make all sorts of mental reservations, it swallows the truth whole. When you repent you can believe. I have learned to be simple and repent and believe, all through my life. "They repented not that they might believe," we read. If there is something you are clinging to, it is holding you back from being in the middle of God's will, perhaps it is some idol, some self-indulgence, perhaps something very slight, but if you have anything tucked away that keeps you from being yielded, you will have an awful time exercising faith. Let everything go. Let Jesus have His way, and you will find you can believe the whole Word of God and God can move.

This dying thief confessed, and the Holy Ghost showed him Jesus. He looked at Jesus. He beheld the Lamb of God. Now what did he behold?

I am going to tell you of a painting I saw. I don't know whether I am glad

I saw it, or sorry. It was a realistic study of the crucifixion. I believe from the standpoint of anatomy and physiology it was perfect. I never realized what my Lord went through until I saw that painting. It was painted from a criminal, actually undergoing this awful punishment of crucifixion. The body hung on the cross with every joint dislocated, suspended for hours and hours. It hung shapeless like a rag. It was an awful sight. And the face I can't bear to think of. It had lost all semblance of humanity. Isa. 52:14 says: "Many were astonished at thee; his visage was so marred more than any man, and his form more than the sons of men." The most ghastly, gruesome sight!

When the dying thief said, "This man hath done nothing amiss," and turned

toward Jesus, this is what he beheld. My Lord was hanging like that—like a bloody rag! But the Holy Ghost filled the thief with faith, an all-conquering faith that looked away beyond that appearance on the cross, and saw the Lord Jesus Christ a King. He saw not only the awful sight of the crucifixion, but he saw Deity enthroned on that cross, and he cried to Him, in His awful humility and terrible unsightliness, "Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom." Glory to God, that is faith.

The dying thief was the only one who claimed Jesus as Lord and King while He hung on the cross. Peter didn't; not even John acclaimed Him King.

There are a lot of people in heaven whom I want to meet. First of all there is Jesus, of course, for heaven wouldn't be heaven without Jesus. But we are going to meet a lot of saints up there, and I want to meet the dying thief. I was a dying thief too, and he and I

can have a dance around heaven. Dance in heaven? Yes, I don't think we shall be so very stiff up there. We shall be happy, oh so happy, more like children I think, little innocent children praising Jesus. He loved the children. I seem to be getting more simple and childlike all the time. I just feel so happy I don't seem to need many introductions or letters of any kind; I just seem to walk right in and love my brothers and sisters in the Lord at first sight. Hallelujah, He is real!

I wasn't like that in my past life. But the Lord makes me like that. The dying thief acclaimed Jesus as Lord and King. Look at the power of faith. Knowing Jesus to be Lord and King, and knowing his own awful record, knowing the terrible crimes for which even then he was bearing capital punishment, he turned to say, "Remember me."

What could Jesus remember about the dying thief? Could He recall any good things? None, except that he cried to Jesus for mercy. I wish we would all be bold and cry to Jesus. If I hadn't used some strong crying to God I don't know how I should have gotten free at all. I got out on the 130th Psalm. It is a cry from the deepest abyss. "Out of the depths have I cried unto thee, O Lord." And I cried until He answered. He took me out of the pit, and lifted me from the miry clay, setting my feet upon the Rock and putting a new song in my mouth. He set me going for Jesus.

"Slain for my soul, for all my sins defamed, King crowned with thorns, Yet high o'er the clouds that royal sign I see. Sitting in glory, Lord, remember me. For thy torments for their pardon sue Father, forgive, they know not what they do. When they that pierced—when every eye shall


Thee in thy glory, Lord, remember me. Midst all the throning of thy ransomed dead, With all the light before thee spread Tossed like a leaf from the sea Lord, remember me."

The wonderful thing is that Jesus, in the midst of all His suffering, accepted the repentant thief. Bearing the crown of thorns, with blood streaming down His blessed face, suffering such agony, He said, "Verily, I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in paradise." Jesus never puts anybody off until another day, but says "Today." Wonderful Jesus!

That is just the way I got saved. I remember it as well as anything. I was unutterably wretched, but prayer was made for me, and Jesus spoke peace to my soul and said, "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." Really I hardly knew whether I was in heaven or on

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earth. I was all alone in a hotel room in New York City, where I was doing medical work. I walked up and down saying, "Lilian Yeomans is saved. Lilian Yeomans is saved. Lilian Yeomans is saved." There was nobody to hear me except the trees in Central Park.

I said, "I don't know much about religious things, but I feel I must get among people where I can make a noise. I want to praise the Lord with all my soul. I thought if I could only get a big bass drum and beat it up and down Broadway for the Salvation Army that would be a relief. I haven't left that joy yet, either. "Where Jesus is, 'tis Heaven there." "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise."

Now maybe some people here know that the Holy Spirit is talking to you and saying that you are robbing God, that you are a thief. Remember that it is appointed unto man once to die, so that you are a dying thief.

We are all dying in this vale of tears, even while we are living. How about you surrendering yourself here to the Lord. Look at the advantages you have had. You have heard the Word of God. This is no strange matter to you. What have you done with it? This poor thief had done nothing until he came to this critical moment when he accepted Christ: that was the best thing he ever did in his life. The other thief went out into the darkness of a Christless eternity, with not a ray of light, it seems, to break the unbearable darkness. We can only leave that unrepentant thief with

Some folks say that the penitent thief was a thief to the end. Why? Because he stole heaven. He didn't do one good thing to earn it; he simply stole it. Well, I want to say that he didn't steal it. He took it as a free gift, and that is the only way you and I can reach heaven. Eternal life cannot be purchased with money, nor can it be bought with good works. You cannot earn it; you must take it as a free gift. You can receive this free gift "today"—at this very mo-

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
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
