The Coming Judgeship of the Saints

D o ye not know that the saints shall judge the world?" 1 Cor. 6:2. "Do ye not know?" It is as though the Apostle would say, Is it possible that you have forgotten this truth? Is it possible that you have overlooked the fact that this wonderful destiny is in store for you—the rulership of the world? What would Paul say I wonder, if he came among Christians today? In that wonderful passage, Rom. 8:17, Paul, speaking by the Spirit says: "And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ." The saints of God are to be rulers with Christ, administrators under Him, of the affairs of this world by and by. Oh, what a prospect that holds out to us!

Possibly you have heard the story of Queen Victoria, when she was a child. There came a time when her parents felt that it would be wise for her to know that possibly she might some day be Queen of England. Her governess, the Countess Lehzen, therefore, was instructed to make that fact known to her: so she inserted in her history a list of the Hanoverian kings, at the end of which she wrote the name Victoria. When in her study the Princess came upon the insertion her governess watched the effect closely. The Princess read down the page, and finally her eyes came upon her own name.

She conned it very attentively. Then looking up at the Countess she said, "Can it really be that I am to be Queen of England?" The Countess replied, "Yes, in all probability that will be true." After a moment's pause the Princess said, "Then I will be good."

She had not been an apt scholar before; she had rather rebelled against the tedium of study: but now that she realized how absolutely necessary it was that she should qualify herself to be the Queen of England, it was no hardship, and she began to apply herself with all her power and ability. Would to God we could all get that same inspiration! If I could only impress upon you the fact that God is calling you to be kings and queens! If I could only make you believe it, it would transform many lives. It would make us all far more zealous than we are, and would give us a deeper interest in the things of God. It is a fact that God is calling us to this high destiny; therefore let us seize the opportunity and prepare ourselves, qualify ourselves by His grace to share in it. heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ: if so be that we suffer with Him, that we may be also glorified together." There will be no glorification and there will be no ascent to the throne; there will be no crowning and there will be no kingdom for us unless we do suffer with Jesus Christ.

The easy modern ideas of the present day are not calculated to bring about such

a wonderful consummation; and Christians today are content to take things very easily. I cannot help thinking, beloved, that we are in the eleventh hour of the parable that speaks of the bacars of the size

of the laborers of the vine-yard. The eleventh hour is not the usual time for a husbandman to go out and engage laborers; and if it were not that the work is tremendously pressing, no husbandman would ever do such a thing. I believe the Lord is very near, and I believe He is calling many whom He never called before into His service. I believe the reason is the urgency of the time. The Lord wants us to be sharers in His work; and it will be those who are willing to share in it, upon whom this wonderful privilege will be bestowed. It is quite pos-sible to be saved without reigning with the coming King; but the salvation that we should desire and seek after diligently is salvation

with glory. Let us read on: "It is a faithful saying: for if we be dead with Him, we shall also live with Him: if we suffer, we shall also reign with Him: if we deny Him, He also will deny us." Without the suffering there

will be no reigning. No cross, no crown. Look at the type given in David. He was crowned no less than three times. First of all he was anointed king at Bethlehem secretly, in the days of King Saul. Nobody knew of the fact except his own immediate relatives; and even they probably did not realize definitely what it all meant. Later on, he was anointed and crowned king over Judah. His own tribe, his own peo-

Now the question arises, Who will reign? It is a very solemn question. It should be a most searching question, and I pray that God will enable me to impress it upon His saints because, beloved it will mean so much to you individually if you will only think of it and act upon it. Who are to reign with Jesus Christ? All the saints? Oh no, by no means. Let us turn back again to that eighth chapter of Romans, looking now at verse 17: "And if children, then heirs;

"I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance. Matt. 3:11.

I believe, my friends, that there is a letting down on the preaching of old-fashioned, Holy Ghost repentance. There is too much hedging and equivocation; too much trying to get people into the church, when we need to get God to grip hearts until they want to be delivered from sin. To hear some people preach on sin and hell today you would think it was a health resort.

Repentance is one of the most outstanding and fundamental doctrines in the Word of God. It is one of the foundation stones of the city of Zion, and when it is left out people do not know the realities of God's eternal salvation. When I was seeking God the preacher preached on hell and I thought I heard the angels sing. He preached the first night on hell, and I was afraid to look down. I heard the General Superintendent say in our Bible conference, "Cursed be he that keepeth back his sword from blood." Jer. 48:10. We have too much of the ministry that caters to somebody. I believe God called us, as He did John the Baptist, to preach the eternal Word and let the world go by.

There is need in this day for God to get down in our midst. Oh, for God to move in His own way. God said to a certain man, "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before Me." The Bible says he rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He found a ship going to Tarshish, and paid the fare thereof. Now God has promised to provide for the man that will go where He sends him, but when you go against the plans of God and follow your own path, remember, my friend, you will pay your own fare. Jonah had not gone very far until a tremendous storm arose and the life of every man on the ship was in jeopardy. They began to take an inven-tory. They said, "There is something wrong around here." Finally, they found this fellow, and he was so far away from God that he could snore in the midst of God's judgment all about him. The men woke him and said, "What is your name? and what is your country?" he said, "Throw me over-board." This they did, but God had mercy on him, and he landed in the first submarine I have ever read about. The big fish started to take him into the depths of the sea, but Jonah cried out to God. Then the fish made for dry land, and threw him up. Jonah took a straight course for Nineveh and preached what God had told him to preach in the first place.

They repented. That message brought all the inhabitants of that city to their knees. We can lecture all we please, my friends, and preach Mussolini and Hitler all we please, but it will not be effective. We need to preach the Word until God comes on the scene. I can see Jonah walking into the city. He cries, "Yet forty days, and God will overthrow the city, unless ye repent." My, what a message! I tell you, friends, repentance goes beneath the collarbone, down about your fifth rib, and the Holy Ghost performs an operation. It will be more than joining the church, being baptized in water, taking the communion, giving assent to certain church premises. When the Holy Ghost works an old-fashioned conversion in the heart, you will know it.

In 2 Cor. 5:17 we read, "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are pased away; behold, all things are become new." You will not need to go down to a movie and look for him tomorrow night. He will not tell you tomorrow afternoon that Chesterfields satisfy. I am sure when some of these painted-face sissies experience Holy Ghost repentance they will not say the next day, "I would walk a mile for a Camel." Some of you cannot go twelve hours without filling your stomach full of drink. Get what I am talking about tonight and God will open the heavens and fill you so full that you will sing.

"In those days came John the Baptist." He preached on the banks of the Jordan under God's canopy of blue. Somebody came along and said, "John, we have been watching you for some time. You are having great crowds, and something is going on. We should like to talk this over with you, and if it be possible we should like to become one with you." Somebody said one time, "That fellow

Somebody said one time, "That fellow Wilson is such a crude backwoods type!" Well, John the Baptist was such a type. He did not say, "Now, ladies and gentlemen, fellow citizens, fellow believers of a like precious faith." He said, "O generation of vipers, what stirred you up?"

Some people once said to me, "Come and preach for us. We do not have services here." I said, "I will be out Sunday afternoon at three o'clock." When I arrived the place was filled with folk standing around. There had not been a service there for years, the neighbors told me. I preached there three Sunday afternoons, and then went half a mile up a road into the woods, and put up a tent. I was organist, choir leader, prayer leader, preacher, everything. About two weeks later a woman came to the altar, and the devil took possession of her. I had a lady go and bow with her and when she



bowed down this woman reached out and took this worker by the hair. I had never witnessed such a thing. I felt the spirit that nailed Jesus to the cross! I cried out, "If you know how to pray—pray!" We laid hands on that woman and prayed and somebody touched God. She fell to the ground as limp as that handkerchief.

There were some fellows outside the tent who came and said, "Mr. Wilson, when you get ready to leave, we will go in your car. We are going in front and these men are going behind you." They knew I would need protection as a crowd of fellows were angry. I went back to my meeting the next night and preached on Heb. 1:1. I said to myself, "I am not going to have a testimony meeting tonight. I am going to ease this off tonight." God said, "Have a testimony meeting." I said, "Well, if anybody wants to say anything, Lord, I will do so."

This woman stood up and said, "Neighbors and friends, I have been born and raised in this neighborhood, and I am of the Catholic faith. All of you know me. I know what I did last night, I was powerless to restrain myself. But, bless God, I was in the midst of folk who knew how to pray for deliverance."

Well, the fire fell that night and God baptized five of my schoolgirls. Oh, I tell you, my friends, John the Baptist said, "Ye generation of snakes! I warned you, how does it come you are here? Don't come around trying to join yourselves to the crowd by handing in your name, and joining the church. Get down on your prayer bones and pray through, and give me some evidence of true repentance before I have anything to do with you." Wouldn't it break our hearts if some evangelist came to our church and fired that gun? Why, John loaded it with divine dynamite and fired both barrels at once!

I want you to grasp this—this is one of the most profound thoughts to me when studying this glorious doctrine of repentance —that man had not been preaching to that audience long until he changed his message and said to them, "Just a minute, friends. Listen everybody, men and women, boys and girls. Give me your attention, please. Everybody look this way—Behold the Lamb of God. Here He comes. Here He comes!" "Here is God's Lamb that makes atonement for the whole world."

I declare to you, my people, tonight, that none of us will preach real old-fashioned Bible repentance long until the same Lord that walked on the sea, who made a personal appearance to the congregation of John the Baptist, will be walking up and down the aisles of your church and mine.

When my Lord was baptized by John, the Spirit descended upon Him in the bodily form of a dove, and God the Father spoke from heaven, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Immediately the Spirit led Him into the wilderness, where He was tempted of the devil, but He came out wearing a victor's crown, and the Scripture says, "Angels came and ministered unto Him." Then He came back to the people and brought the same message. Somebody said, "You ought to be very careful and not preach what anyone else preaches." Jesus preached the same sermon that John preached: "Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Oh, hallelujah!

Somebody said, "Brother Wilson, what is repentance anyway? Does it mean that you are going to turn over a new leaf in life's history?" No. "Does it mean that on New Year's Day morning you are going to gather your family together, and make a New Year's resolution that you will be a better man?" No. "What is repentance anyway?"

Well, the Greek word for repentance eans "to have a changed mind." The means resurrection power of God through the Holy Ghost can lift us out of the miry clay, and set our feet upon the solid Rock, Christ Jesus. Connected with the word "repentance" is the popular belief that a man will weep and mourn and pant and sigh. I tell you, when they come around the altar and begin to seek the Lord, they do not have to do like you or I; I am not setting forth any certain way. But I like to see evidence of life. Hallelujah! I tell you, I have seen them gather at the altar and weep and pant and sigh and cry and sob, and I have known men go to the altar every night for a week or ten days before they could get to God. That is not necessary. You can be saved That is not necessary. You can be saved the first night; but if you are not, God bless you! come until you are saved.

A man said to me, "Brother Wilson, why do you invite people to come to the altar? Why do they cry and sob after they do come?" I said, "It is for the same reason that children cry when they have been doing something that their parents have asked them not to do, and told them they would punish them if they did do it. The Spirit makes them know they are guilty, and the Holy Ghost makes the love of God so real that they weep their heart out because of their stubborn will and rebellious heart."

You remember, in Luke 13, some people came to Jesus and told Him of the Galileans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. Jesus said, "Suppose ye that these Galileans were sinners above all the Galileans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." Listen, friends. You may not be a "boozehead" tonight; you may not be a liar. There are lots of good men who are not saved. They are not liars nor drunkards; they are as fine in principle and character as they will be after they have been saved. But let me tell you something -your honesty, your trustworthiness, your truthfulness, your high position in the community, the respect you command of the general public, how you provide for your family, and climb up the rungs of the ladder to fame will not save you; you will never enter the kingdom of God unless you repent.

A man said to me at the office the other morning, "Mr. Wilson, I cannot believe there is such a place as hell for the punishment of humanity." I said, "That so?" He said, "That's so." He went on and talked for awhile.

After a bit he brought out the fact of his wife's being one of the finest women, kindly in her disposition, lovely in her character, pure, spotless in every way of her life.

I said, "I am happy to know about your



wife. Do you remember hearing about the man who at three o'clock in the afternoon took a little seven-year-old girl and killed her; and at seven o'clock the officers of the law found him in bed under the influence of liquor?" I said, "Should you want your good wife, with her beautiful character and spotless life to be in the same place, to spend eternity by the side of that man?" He said, "No, I should not want that." I said, "No, you wouldn't." I said, "I tell you one thing, my friend: there is one place for the whole crowd unless they repent."


You are not going to be saved because of your intellectuality, because of your good works, or because your father may be the best man you have ever known—you will never be saved unless you as an individual repent and get right with God.

Let us turn to the Acts of the Apostles and see Peter as he preached that marvelous sermon after the outpouring of the Holy Ghost. The people felt convicted in their hearts and cried, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" Peter did not have to hunt up the Encyclopedia Britannica or the Minister's Manual; he did not even have to get a textbook, nor turn to the concordance in back of the Bible to find out. He said, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

You remember when Peter was addressing the Jews and telling them they had crucified their Lord. He said, "Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord." He does not stop at that, for in 2 Peter 3:9 he says: "The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."

I believe with all my heart that every one of us needs to repent once in a while. I love to see the hand of God move in the midst of men and women until we keep a tender spot in our hearts. Irrespective of how long we have been saved and filled we need to repent of our sins—sins of omission and commission—foolishness, and a thousand and one things.

Somebody said, "Repentance means to be sorry." Brother, hell is full of sorrowful



people tonight. We can preach that Jesus is coming soon, that the trumpet soon will sound and the congregation will rise up with a shout, but friends, I am wondering sometimes if we shall all rise up with that kind of a shout when He really comes? You say, "Preacher, you are taking all the joy out of my life." Oh no, I am getting you ready for the joy.

A friend of mine told me a story. He said, "Brother Wilson, I was one of the most hard-hearted men that ever lived. There never could have been a man like me. I hated everybody. If a man crossed me it put murder in my heart instantly. I went to attend a Pentecostal meeting and God brought me under conviction. The preacher preached on repentance three consecutive nights. I went to the altar to give myself to God and God said, 'I cannot save you." I said, 'Why?' He said, 'You know that man you want to murder. He is the father of four young children and the husband of one wife, and you have it in your heart to kill that man and leave that family penniless and that woman without a husband. You go first and fix things up with that man, be reconciled.

"I went to that man's home. He came to the door and begged me to go away. I said, 'I am not here to cause trouble. I have been going to church. I want to be a Christian and God cannot save me until you and I come together and I am reconciled to you.' That man met me and we got everything straightened out, then I went back to church that night and God gloriously saved me."

He said, "Brother Wilson, I went out that night after church, and I walked two miles to my home and could never detect the fact that my feet touched the earth. I fell asleep the moment my head touched the pillow. It was not long until I was awakened and found my room was filled with light. I lifted my head and looked up into the heavens, and somehow or other, without warning, praises to God! the Almighty poured forth through me in a language I had never heard in all my life." The next night that man put his arm around the other man and brought him down to the same old-fashioned altar and through the same way of repentance by which that man had been brought to God.

If you are here unsaved tonight, you are lost without God. There is only one way to strike the fountain of God's eternal glow, and that is to come like a man. It is a business proposition. You don't have to come down here all excited and worked up until you do not know what you are doing, any more than if you go to the bank tomorrow to borrow five hundred dollars to open a business or supply the needs of your family. You do not go down to the bank and fool around, you go in and say, "This is what I need, and this is what I have to offer you." You do business in a businesslike way. And God has a businesslike way of coming to deal with you.

How many people in this building know without any question of doubt, that right now, if death reaches out and takes hold of you, or the trump of God sounds and the rapture takes place—you are saved, a child of God?

The preacher gave an earnest altar call to which many responded.

Miracles in Men and Money

A True Story Retold by Charles Elmo Robinson

"All right, then, Suto," we said half in fun, "if you are sure it is God's will why not *take* it from Him? Don't ask *us* to do it. Take it yourself." Sutton answered, "I'll do it."

The home office force of the Worldwide Evangelization Crusade, which had taken up to enlarge and carry forward the missionary work started by the late C. T. Studd, had been extremely cramped for room. Leslie Sutton, a member of the group had expressed it as his opinion that the Lord wanted them to enlarge their quarters by building. There was no money in hand and none was obtainable by human means. A fixed principle of the group was never to go into debt, even for the milk and bread left day by day at the door by the milkman. Consequently, when the beautiful threestory modern brick building had been finished at a cost of \$20,000, and all furnished appropriately for the use of the mission, it stood as a striking illustration of what can be achieved by praying in faith.

Without their asking anyone but God the necessary money came in, a contractor undertook the work without pay, and men who volunteered for missionary service were found to be skilled in all the different branches of the building trade needed for putting up the structure. So it was erected by these missionaries while they were in training, without cost. The contractor however, was not a missionary volunteer, and to make him willing to turn from his own profitable contracts and undertake this work without pay, the Lord had to strike him down helpless for a week in bed. In this time he became willing to obey God by putting up the building. After the building was completed it is worthy of record that this contractor was so prospered that instead of the fifteen workers he was employing when God called him to turn aside and build the mission, he had to employ two hundred. God is faithful to those who work for Him.


When the news of the death of C. T. Studd in Central Africa came, his daughter Pauline, and her husband Norman Grubb assumed the responsibility of continuing to carry on the work at the home end. They had been carrying on this work before Studd's death, and it had been customary for them to start the day's work with a half hour of Scripture reading and prayer. Then followed the real business, letters, interviews, and committees. They decided to change the emphasis. The reading and prayer were made the real business of the day, and the other things were made to fit in as they could. Their primary occupation was no longer to exercise their minds, but to ascertain what was the mind of God. This they discovered made an overwhelming difference. Inquiring insistently, "What does God say?" they decided that as God had

called them to evangelize the world—"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations"—He being God must have made available for them the men and resources with which to do it, and they felt that He challenged them, saying, "Now, *will* you believe?"

Waiting thus day after day before God they came to the conclusion, they scarcely knew how, that they were to ask Him for ten new workers to go as missionaries together with all the money needed to send them out, within one year of C. T. Studd's death. Having decided this they prayed for the ten and the necessary money. Having done so they deliberately thanked God for what they had then received. They never asked Him again for the ten, but daily reminded Him of the prayer. Their daily prayer meetings were turned into daily enjoyment meetings, possessing and enjoying their possessions in the invisible, before they had them in the visible.

The first two of the ten came quite easily and soon sailed. But then they saw that one who really believes, is ready to make public acknowledgment that the things he has received by faith are his, although he has not obtained them in fact. According to this principle Joshua commanded the Israelites to prepare three days' victuals, telling them they were going to pass over Jordan. although how they could do this Joshua did not know. In like manner these home workers wrote to the field representatives saying they could expect ten new workers within the year.

I cannot tell it all here, for Pauline and Norman Grubb spend many pages in telling the story in the thrilling faith-tonic book of 185 pages, "After C. T. Studd," but the ten new workers *were* supplied together with all necessary money within the year.



In like manner the next year they waited on God and He said, "Fifteen new workers this year." They prayed and the fifteen were supplied. The next year they repeated the waiting on God for guidance, and God said, "Twenty-five this year." These also were supplied with necessary funds. Every one went out as a faith missionary, with no promise of any certain allowance, expecting to obtain what they needed to live on and for carrying on the work, by faith.

The next year as they were waiting on God for guidance as to what He would have them ask for, a stranger came among them to inquire the secret of the Spirit-filled life. He remained some days and took part in the praying. In this way he discovered that God had said for this year, "Fifty new workers," and he joined with the others in praying for the fifty and the five thousand pounds sterling (about \$25,000) necessary to send them forth.

After he had gone home he kept on praying for the fifty and the money, but that is a dangerous thing for anyone to do who is not completely resigned to doing God's will. God inquired of him, "Are you Mine?" "Yes, Lord." "Is all you have Mine?" "Yes, Lord." "Then send them the money," God instructed. He wrote his check for six thousand pounds, five thousand for the necessary expenses of sending out the fifty, and an additional thousand pounds to be used "as the Lord might lead."

This brings this amazing story down to the year 1939. Of course missionaries obtained and sent out in such a miraculous manner would naturally be expected to accomplish similar wonders on the field, and they are doing so. But in the space I have I can only give a fraction of the story of how the many thousands were converted and the many self-supporting churches established, by quoting as follows:

"Alec Thorne" one of the missionaries sent out, "therefore was able to concentrate on the southern half of the colony, and made several journeys of investigation in search of the best center among the Okaks, the largest tribe in the south. In his ignorance of methods of building in the tropics, or of choosing a suitable site, he made another unusual request of God-for a readymade mission station. He wrote: 'On the basis of John 15:16, I am tremblingly putting it on record that I have asked the Father in Jesus' name, not only to show me where He wants us to live, but to have the house ready. An impossibility. I have been trying for days to pluck up courage to commit it to writing, but now it is done. He must keep His word.'

"Weeks followed. Invitations were received from various villages, but no offer was made of a house, so he refused them. The test became more fierce as the hut of which they had a temporary loan from a trader was unexpectedly needed by him. He wrote: 'We have to go from here, and where we are to go I have not the faintest idea. That God will guide us I have no doubt.'

"Two days later an invitation came from a town three days away, called Akurenan. Mr. Thorne visited it, and both he and Mrs. Thorne were impressed that this was the place of God's choice. He returned to say

it was suitable, but 'there was nothing that could possibly be taken as the Lord's guidance.' However, so confident were they that the guidance was coming that they 'prepared the things for shifting.'

"Mr. Throne then went another ten-day trek, which included Akurenan on the return journey. This time the whole aspect of affairs was changed. He wrote, 'I heard that the one white man who lives at a shop here is going to Spain in a hurry because of his daughter's death.' It turned out that he was glad to sell the place for a mere song, 'and it was only finished last December.'

"Within a few days the Thornes had entered into possession of the house, including a shop which was later turned into a meeting room, three native houses and a large garden well planted with fruit. 'Our hearts are filled with praises to our loving Father (he wrote). In all probability I should never have asked for the seal of a house ready for us if I had known beforehand how things are done here, for of course none ever thinks of doing anything but build his own house, except evidently fools of faith missionaries.""

On the other hand it must not be supposed that such determined strides of conquering preachers could be taken into the devil's territory, without his being aroused and flinging clouds of fiery darts. He did just that; but God was there, and the faith missionaries knew how to contact Him, finding Him a very present help in trouble as David did.

ple, were ruled over by him; and it was not until some time later that he was crowned king over the whole of Israel.

The Lord Jesus Christ is to be King, and He has already been anointed as such. He was anointed secretly, as it were, at the Jordan. It was there that the Spirit of the Lord came upon Him, and He was anointed as the Messiah, the Prophet, Priest and King of His people. The world did not recognize Him as King, any more than they recognized David as king; but you remember there came a time a little later on, after David had been anointed as king, when people did flock to him, when people came and joined him when he was flying from King Saul. Who are recognizing Jesus as King today? The world does not do it. He has no visible kingdom as yet; but He is reigning in the hearts of His own true people, and there are those now who are giving their allegiance to Him, who are really acknowledging Jesus as Lord.

What did David do with the faithful in the cave of Adullam? 2 Samuel 23. These men who had gone to him in the hour of his distress, in the day of his rejection, were willing to suffer with him, willing to do anything for his sake, willing to confess him before men. When David came to the throne these were the men on whom he bestowed the high positions near his throne, and to whom he gave the administration of his kingdom. So will it be when Jesus comes.

For the apostle compares (1 Cor. 3:9) our life work to a building. He says we are all builders, building every day of our lives. He tells us that when the building is completed, there will come a great inspection. All our life-actions will be brought under review in the presence of God. I fancy the fire which is to try every man's work is just the presence of God. Our God is a consuming fire; and when we stand in the light of the Holy One, and that light searches us through and through, it will reveal the actual



character of everything we have done, thought, and said. Everything that is not according to the will of God will then wither away; and it will be only what remains that will be rewarded. Upon that our positions in the kingdom will depend.

There are thousands of Christians who are only doing dead works today. Much. very much, I might almost say by far the greater amount, of our church work is simply an accumulation of dead works, not producing the fruitage God wants. What then are the wood, hay, ard stubble? They are all dead things. Wood is dead tree, hay is dead grass, stubble is dead grain stalks. When Christians are led by the motives of the world, the flesh, or the devil-for it is quite possible for them to be led by the devil, just as Peter was-then their life structure is only built of dead works, and when Jesus comes, all will be exposed, and those works will pass away. Oh, what a terrible thing it would be to get into glory, and to be found naked before Him! Saved as by fire, with no reward! But what reward may be ours today if only we will give ourselves wholeheartedly to Jesus Christ, and begin to live with all our powers for Him!

Finding Christ in Prison

"When Thy judgments are in the earth, the inhabitants of the world will learn righteousness," said the prophet Isaiah.

When G. H. Lang was in Baalbek, Syria he was told this story by the son-in-law of the proprietor of the hotel where he stayed.

"When I was only engaged," he said, "I kept a room in this hotel that I might have a place whenever I came to see my fiancee. After Turkey entered the Great War an enemy of my father-in-law here, wishing to harm him, wrote him a letter which was wholly a lie, to the effect that he was happy to inform him that, on account of the great services he had rendered to the Allies, if

they won the war the British intended to reward him in such and such ways. The letter being opened by the military authorities, as the writer knew it would be, they at once visited him. But he was too old and respected a resident to be really suspected. However, in searching the hotel they found in my room a book against the Young Turk Party, then in power. I was at once arrested in Damascus and questioned. I could only protest that I never had taken part in politics, was not a member of any secret societies, and that the book had been sent to me from Egypt, but I had never even read it. I was not believed and a court-martial condemned me to be shot.

"I was then taken from the house, where I had been confined, and placed in a dungeon in the castle. A terrible despair seized my soul in the darkness, and I considered if there was any way by which I could take my life, but no plan opened. But that night, in this fearful situation and state of mind, God brought to my heart two texts from the Bible, by which I was comforted, and *came* to know Christ in reality.

"Just at this time a dear friend of mine called at my hotel to inquire for me, and learned from my servant my position. He was the editor of the principal Damascus newspaper, and, as the Government was using it to disseminate official news, he had access to Jemal Pasha, then ruling Syria. To him he at once went, and appealed for my release, assuring the Pasha, from long acquaintance with me, that I was unquestionably innocent. The Pasha rang up the president of the court and ordered my release in two hours, which was done."

What the Men's Class Can Do Pastor Earl Hanson Fife

It is the custom of wild animals that travel in herds, when danger approaches, to surround their young with a solid circle of males ready to lay down life for their protection. Recently I saw a picture of the far North, showing a band of musk oxen surrounded by a pack of wolves. The calves of the oxen were in the center. Next, the cows, and outside stood the males with heads lowered ready to give battle.

Why should musk oxen have more judgment than human beings? Religious education experts, ministers, and teachers have long prated about "the child in the midst," but too often there hasn't been any "midst." The children have been the whole thing. The "wolves," for more than a generation, have taken seven out of ten boys and girls who have enrolled in Bible schools. The protecting circle of parents, especially males, has been thin or not there at all. The way to keep children in the Bible school and save them to the church is to surround them with a wall of parents. The solution rests with men. Get a man and you get his family and everything else he has. Establish a strong, live men's Bible class in your school and see if this coming Bible school year will not be one of the most outstanding in your church .-- Reprinted from The Lookout.

What is prayer? It is the dependent one coming to Him who alone is the source of all power and all help. "Men ought always to pray." Why? To teach man his dependence. Man is always going from God naturally, and God always wants to draw him back to Himself. Prayer is the medium by which man confesses his dependence upon God and receives from God.

"In Him we live and move and have our being." That is the scriptural definition of our dependence. Man's definition is, "I live unto myself. I can paddle my own canoe." Prayer denotes dependence.

The prayerless one is the seemingly independent one. Saul of Tarsus was an independent one. He superintended the murder of Stephen. He sought to bring the saints from Damascus bound to Jerusalem, but when he met Christ he said, "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?" He had to be taught how dependent he was. When he had to be led by the hand, he saw how blind he was spiritually and physically. When Ananias came Saul received sight, remission of sins, and Baptism in the Spirit.

What effect did this have upon Saul or Paul as the Lord renamed him? He said, "I live. No, no, no, not I, but a greater than I—Christ liveth in me: and the life that I now live is a borrowed life, a dependent life, a maintained life, I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

Did Paul pray? Read his epistles. He who formerly breathed out threatenings and slaughter now breathed out prayers. He prayed for all the churches, for a long list of converts. He prayed for Israel. He prayed thrice for one thing and he would have prayed on for deliverance if the Lord had not advised him otherwise.


"Men ought always to pray and not to Is not once praying sufficient? Look faint." at Jericho and at Joshua going around that city six days, and on the seventh day seven times. "Lord, what is the use? If we have the ram's horns blowing and the procession formed exactly as You state, and if we go around in faith, is not that sufficient? What is the use of going around so many times? It made Rahab pray and repent. It gave Israel faith in Joshua, in their priests, in the power of the blowing of those sacred horns, and in the word of the Lord. They might have said, "Let's go round seven times, seven is the complete number." God chose the incomplete number-thirteen times. "But there are only twelve tribes." But the angel of the Presence was with them. There were twelve apostles and the Lord. They had to be reminded of the invisible Presence.

You pray, and pray, and pray, and you will be reminded of the invisible Presence; and the invisible Presence on the thirteenth time, or the thirtieth time will break down the walls of your Jericho, Rahab will be rescued, obstructions will be removed, and a clear passage will be made for the children of Israel to go on into Canaan.

By faith the walls of Jericho fell down. The seemingly foolish thing was rewarded. Faith was begotten and faith matured. Some people talk about faith as being an abstract, forced thing, a kind of working up of a belief, contrary to sound judgment. Faith is more real than material substance. It is the substance of things hoped for, and by faith the substantial walls of Jericho went down before the unsubstantial thing of a continuous walk around those walls. God used the weak things to bring down the mighty.

"Men ought always to pray, and not to faint." Joshua was present with the people to prevent their fainting. Listen to his cheery voice as they come around the sixth time on the seventh day. They would say, "What is the use? There is not a crack in the walls. The men are still mocking us. The sun is going down. We are so thirsty." Listen to Joshua, "Cheer up, brethren, this is the last lap. Remember the crossing of Jordan, how the babies and that little lamb beside its mother got through. We all got through safely. And God's word is just as true. Cheer up! One more round and then an extra blast of the trumpets of the priests." So they go around the seventh time. The walls fell down flat and their faith was rewarded.

"Men ought always to pray, and not to faint." The fainting process is generally near the threshold of victory. Don't give up at the commencement of the thirteenth round. Jericho has to go down because of the word of God, and because it is in the road and blocks your progress toward Canaan.



"Men ought always to pray, and not to faint." "Pray without ceasing." Watch and pray, for at an hour when ye think not the Son of man cometh.

Christ was a man of prayer, always in the attitude of prayer. He lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank Thee that Thou hast heard Me; and I know that Thou hearest Me always." The divine pattern will give you divine strength to follow His example. Amen.

The Impending Exodus

The children of Israel were prepared beforehand for the exodus by the word of the Lord through the prophet Moses. Their loins were girded, with staff in hand they had everything packed and ready. If He warned His people of old, do you think He will not warn us of the greater exodus? Rich and poor, there was no difference as long as they were under the blood. The blood spelled the exodus. Loosed by the blood! The most timid was as safe as the most bold.

When Jesus comes, what looks like a big sea ahead will be made a plain path. God prepared a strong wind and dried up the sea. When His Spirit blows there is a way made.

The children of Israel could not see how the relief could come. It came invisibly. They could not see the wind, but they saw the result. And the Lord is preparing a Wind to enable the ransomed to step over into the promised land. Our Moses is behind giving the command of cheer and comfort.

The wind that kept back the waters withdrew and brought destruction to the enemy; and when He who now letteth shall be taken out of the way, "then shall the wicked one be revealed." The same Holy Spirit who makes a way for the redeemed, will bring destruction to the enemy. It will be woe, woe, woe, to the inhabiters of the earth; but the ransomed will be able to sing the song of Moses and the Lamb.

Miriam's song is but a prelude to the song of the redeemed. And as sure as the Lord has taken you out of the land of Pharaoh, so sure will He bring you through the Red Sea. Miriam may take her timbrel and sing, but that song can be eclipsed by the song, "Unto Him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood ... to Him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen."

RUSSIA'S JEWISH POPULATION

In the Soviet Union now are 4,835,000 Jews divided approximately as follows: 3,050,000 in Russia proper, 1,250,000 in Soviet Poland, 200,000 in Bessarabia, and 335,000 in Baltic States. According to *Jewish Chronicle*, Russia now has more Jews than any nation in the world, exceeding America's Jewish population by about 335,000.

THE CHURCHES OF BRITAIN

The impressions of a neutral observer in bombplagued Britain are given in *Christian Century*. The British churches, he says, have not allowed themselves to be overwhelmed. There is a deepening of religious life and "no trace of a Christianity which is merely patriotic." The churches are helping to make the lot of refugees easier and are making an effort to help Norwegian, Danish, Dutch, and French missions. Services oftentimes continue throughout an air raid.

A FALSE CHRIST

Said Dewitt Mackenzie, noted foreign news correspondent, following Hitler's July peacespeech: "There was one passage in Hitler's address which interested me greatly. That was where he said: 'As for myself, I am deeply moved, realizing that Providence has called on me to restore my people their freedom and honor.' We here have a theme which has persisted in the Fuehrer's pronouncements for many years—the idea that he has been divinely ordained to carry out his program. Many of his followers attribute divine qualities to Hitler himself and have cultivated the thought among the German people that he is a Messiah." When speaking of the signs of His second coming, Jesus said, "There shall arise false Christs." Matt. 24:24.

FAITH IN THE FIGHTING FORCES

The following story, quoted by Herald of Holiness, came from a correspondent in Scotland: "A certain officer, though friendly enough with the chaplain, frankly declared that he had little for religion. After some months, however, use he began to come to church regularly and to show an obvious interest. One day the chaplain asked him if his attitude was changing. 'Yes, padre, he replied, 'to put it simply, I've been converted. For weeks past it has been one of my duties to censor the men's letters home; and so many of these men writing to their fathers or mothers or wives have shown a faith that was a living and real thing that I began to feel that I was missing the biggest thing in life. It has changed me for good." There are many, many soldiers who are not saved. Pray that those who do know the Lord will let their light shine before the rest until they too are won to Christ.

HER GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

According to Christian Century, a Dallas newspaper columnist recently published an invitation, written "on paneled parchment printed in gold," as follows: "1890-1940. You are cordially invited to rejoice with Miss M. Moss Richardson honoring the golden anniversary of her conversion at ten o'clock, Tuesday morning, the third of September, 1940. How sweet the time has been !" At the bottom were some Scripture references, written in letters of gold, ending with these words: "For the Lord God is a sun and a shield; the Lord will give grace and glory; no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. O Lord of hosts, blessed is the man that trusteth in thee." Miss Richardson is a beloved teacher of English in a college in Canyon, Texas, and the sister of Admiral Richardson, commander-in-chief of the U. S. fleet. What a beautiful testimony to a half-century of companionship with Jesus!

PESTILENCE AND PROPHECY

On July 24 the mercury registered almost one hundred degrees in the city of Sterling, Illinois, but the city snow plow was brought out to keep traffic open. Four-foot drifts of shadflies blocked traffic over a bridge spanning the Rock River. Trucks with snow chains were unable to move. Fifteen men with snow shovels and hip boots, together with the snow plow, were needed to sweep the piles of insects into the river. Such a pestilence points to Bible prophecy. The Lord Jesus said that in the end-time such pestilences would increase. Luke 21:11.

FRANCE'S UNDOING

According to *Christian Century*, the first newspaper published in Paris after German occupation printed under a six-column headline, "Days of sorrow and mourning," the following: "We are going to pay for sixty years of de-Christianization, falling birthrate, decline into paganism and materialism, decline into political anarchy." It went on to say that during the last war, in answer to France's prayers to the saints, etc. (?) "Providence granted us twenty-five years' respite in which to recover ourselves. We returned to our freethinking, materialistic vomit, to our 'popular front' moral and political anarchy. We have worn out the patience of Providence!"

THE END OF TROTSKY

The murder of Trotsky in Mexico brought to an earthly end a life of inveterate, blind hatred of God and religion. He defied his Creator as have few men in history. Now he has gone to meet Him and answer for his sins, ushered into eternity as brutally as any of the thousands for whose death he, as director-behind-the-scenes of the infamous Cheka, was responsible. Now that Trotsky has been killed only two-Stalin and Madame Kollontai-remain of that original group of fifteen bolsheviks who surrounded Lenin in the revolutionary days of 1917-18. Most have died violent Thus is the Word of God fulfilled, that deaths. the wicked shall "be filled with their own devices." Proverbs 1:31.

A FALSE CULT

Thousands have been deluded by the Ballard "I AM Movement," whose leaders are under federal indictment on sixteen counts of mail fraud. Assistant U. S. Attorney Norman Neukom, who presented the case to the grand jury, stated that the Movement had collected close to three million dollars since its inception in 1930. Guy Ballard, who died last December although he claimed to be immortal, had claimed to be Jesus. Since his death that role has been assumed by Mrs. Ballard, reports *Prophecy Monthly*. It is hard to understand how so many can be deceived by such teaching, but the Bible says that "in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils." 2 Tim. 4:3.

GENERAL GORT'S PLEA

The head of the British fighting forces expressed personal faith in Christ in an August broadcast. The Christian (London) in reporting his message said: "He declared that the war is primarily a crusade 'for the maintenance of those religious principles which we were taught as children by our mothers,' and that no country can endure unless its life is based on such faith. In particular, we rejoice in his blunt reminder of the importance of the right observance of the Lord's Day. had, he said, as a nation, neglected our religious obligations, and 'in the pursuit of pleasure we filled the roads but deserted the churches." Such a plea coming from a man in his position should carry weight with many soldiers and civilians who would not listen to a gospel preacher.

PRAY FOR THEIR SOULS

As we read the results of one year of waran estimated one million dead or missing—we should feel the urgent need of praying for the fighting men of all the warring nations. Efforts are being made to reach those in the British army, navy, and air force. One million Scriptures have been produced for the troops, reports *The Christian*.

These efforts are not in vain. When the B. E. F. returned to England, many soldiers confessed to having read the Scriptures and having been comforted during their unforgettable ordeal. Many not given to praying, said that like Jacob in his trouble at Peniel, they had cried to the God of their fathers as they stood on Dunkirk beach. One soldier said, "I lost all my kit at Dunkirk but I hung on to a Bible they had given me." Pray for these men who may be ushered into eternity at any time, that they may accept Christ before it is forever too late.

JEWS IN RUMANIA

In Rumania's steps toward the adoption of more Nazi ideals during August, a new law was made concerning Jewish residents, says an exchange. Jews who have "fought for the homeland" in past wars may retain their jobs but may not take any others. All other Jews are barred from public office and from most public businesses, and all Jewish-owned lands will be confiscated. Rumanian Jews are feeling the force of Nazi Jew hatred.

However, a path of escape is now open. According to *Jewish Chronicle*, communication between Rumania and Palestine, interrupted since Italy's entrance into the war, is now possible by sailing from Rumania to Turkey via the Black Sea and then traveling overland to Palestine through Turkey and Syria. The first party which sailed under the new arrangements included 900 Rumanian Jews. So persecution in Rumania is sending the Jews back to Palestine, according to God's plan.

PREPARING FOR THE NEXT WAR

Many observers believe that war is brewing in eastern Europe. Is this of prophetic significance? Perhaps so. When Hitler, in a speech to the Nazi party at Nuremberg, expressed his desire for the fruitful fields of the Russian Ukraine, Bible students at once thought of Ezekiel 38 and the prophecy that Gomer should march under Gog's banner. If "Gomer" means Germany and "Gog, chief prince of Rosh" (R. V.) means the ruler of Russia, as many believe, it will be necessary for Germany to come under Russia's domination. It is considered doubtful whether this will come about without war, and so, many Bible students look for a conflict in which Russia will be victorious over Germany. For the nonaggression pact can be broken !

Events during the past year have swiftly moved in that direction. Russia has taken Bessarabia, Esthonia, Latvia, Lithuania, much of Finland, and half of Poland. This has brought her to Germany's doorstep. Apparently in recognition of the danger of war with Russia, Germany in August announced the absorption of German Poland into the German Reich which does away with the idea of a Polish buffer state and makes it proper for German troops to mass in Poland. Furthermore, the Axis powers have forced Rumania to cede Transylvania to Hungary, a country in which the Nazis can have their own way, so that the boundary of German dominion is set along the tops of the Carpathians -perhaps the best defense line in Europe. The Axis powers have even guaranteed Rumania's re-The vised borders, thus serving warning on Russia that she is to advance westward no farther. And in support of this threat, it is reported that Germany has placed a million soldiers along the German-Russian frontiers.

For these reasons, many students look for an outbreak of war in eastern Europe in fulfillment of their interpretation of this Bible prophecy. If their interpretation is correct, we must be very close to the coming of our Lord.

POOR-YET RICH TOWARD GOD

One of our assemblies, made up of a small group of poor people, recently sent in a missionary offering which was double in amount that of the previous month—and this is the story:

In the assembly there is a devoted Christian couple who have six children. They are extremely poor. The husband is physically unfit but has eked out a meager livelihood cutting timber for mining props from a small strip of uncleared land. Out of their small means they have given generously to the missionary cause.

Just a day or so before the missionary offering was due, this brother had a load of mining props cut and ready for sale. He and his wife were happy in the thought that now they would have the wherewithal to meet a few needs, but God spoke to them very definitely to give it ALL to the missionary offering. Rejoicing that God counted them worthy of this sacrifice, they gladly responded in obedience. The brother who helped to cut the props was touched, and he, too, gave his day's wages. As the incident was related in the church, others were moved to give, also. Thus the church offering was doubled-because of the sacrificial example of one family, poor in this world's goods, yet rich toward God.

From a Missionary's Diary

Angeline Pierce, Belgian Congo

THURSDAY

Gladys (Taylor) and I were up early this morning for there was much packing to be done since we had planned to spend a few days at Adja, our substation. Mr. and Mrs. Lindholm came over about 11:00 to have prayer with Then we started off-our car full of us. bedding, pots, food, and our two accordionsnot forgetting to mention our cook, Yabanga, Tangada, his wife. It was the first automobile trip for the latter-just imagine!

For a time we traveled through Congo grasslands, fresh and lovely at this time of year. Our hearts were filled with joy and gladness, for we were on business for our King. What greater joy is there than proclaiming the news of His salvation to those who need Him so!

Disappointment-His Appointment

After about twelve kilometers we came to the Obo River, only to find that we were unable to cross since they were working on the bridge It was with keen disappointment that we started back over the road we had just traveled. At the cross-roads, about two kilometres back, we stopped the car, had a bite to eat, and after praying over the matter decided to go on down the road, hoping to find a village not too far distant.

After driving some distance through the lovely Congo forest, with its many tall palms, we came to Choga's village, where we discovered a nice rest house for white folks and decided to remain at least one night. Black folk soon began to gather around, brought us two native chairs, helped unpack, and soon we were settled.

Visitors After a while we heard some men coming up the path, singing as they do when carrying heavy load. Gladys inquired whom they were carrying and was informed it was their big chief, Magai; he has about twenty lower chiefs under him and is indeed a "big" man in the eyes of the natives. Magai stopped a few

minutes to greet us, promising to return in the evening. Next came Choga, the under chief, who likewise paid us a short visit and promised to re-Other visitors turn. followed.

About 4:15 we fixed a little lunch, then took a walk through the village. In one mboka (group of homes) we found a number of lepers living-oh, what pathetic They sights! were friendly very and seemed delighted at our promise to return tomorrow and play our instruments for them.

A storm was approaching so we decided to turn back. Down the path a short distance we met Yabanga who had come to tell us that the chief had arrived and was waiting for us. The storm was coming up so fast that we had to run for shelter.

Hungry Hearts

On returning we found several here, and more gathered before the evening was over. We played our instruments, sang, and had a little service-oh, it was precious to be able to tell them of Jesus, our Light and our Salvation. But our hearts are heavy when we realize how tightly they are held in the clutches of Satan. Attention and interest were good.

Later . . . They have gone and we are alone nowwriting and reading. Showers of natural rain are falling on the outside tonight, bringing life and refreshing. We trust that showers of latter rain are also falling in the hearts of the people of this village, bringing them eternal life and spiritual quickening. Truly man's disappointments are His appointments. Little did we realize when we started out this morning that we should be here tonight. We did not even know there was such a place-but we feel we are here because He wants us here.

FRIDAY

Very early this morning a large number of natives gathered outside to receive work instructions from Magai. While they awaited his coming, we sang and played and gave them Word-there were at least sixty present. God's After breakfast we walked to the leper mboka to conduct a service. Various ones visited us during the day, and tonight we held another service. God grant that a little chapel may be built here and that someone may visit it at least once a week.

SATURDAY

These days in the bush have certainly made me realize the awful powers of darkness which hold this land in their clutches. There is so much evil talking and vice-one's nature cringes from it. But Jesus died for even these, and His blood can wash the vilest sinner clean.

When we awakened this morning, rain was pouring down. We packed our belongings, but it was afternoon before the ran slackened

enough for us to take our departure. We enjoyed our two days' stay in the village and found Choga quite friendly. Oh, Jesus, do really save that man's soul . . . what an in-fluence it would have on our entire section!

SUPPORT NEEDED FOR NATIVE WORKERS

Anna Helmbrecht has placed before us a definite need for the support of native workers in Moghal Sarai, India.

First, there is Mrs. Lall. She and her husband are being much used of the Lord. Mrs. Lall has been doing voluntary work, but as her husband receives so little and they have five little ones to care for, there is a real need for her support. This would amount to about \$3.50 per month. Mrs. Lall has a strong ministry which is needed in the villages.

Then there is an elderly man named Dipla Rupa (meaning "form of light") who has been a worker in Benares for fifteen years. He came to Moghal Sarai last January and God has been using him in the surrounding villages. His support would would be about \$8.00 a month.

There is also need for a colporteur at Kashi, where the Hindu pilgrims go to melas to bathe. Such a worker could at the same time minister at a railway station about two miles from Kashi. About \$5.00 a month would take care of such a colporteur.

Friends who might be interested in contributing to the support of any of these workers should send their offerings to the Foreign Missions Department, designating the particular worker and also mentioning that it is in care of Sister Helmbrecht.

"KEEP ON THE FIRING LINE"

From Hong Kong, where war clouds hang heavy, where trouble and uncertainty are rife, H. A. Park sends encouraging word: "We are glad to report that all is well with us here. I suppose most of the news concerning this part of the world has been well written up in the papers at home. Really, for a few days we ourselves hardly knew what it was all about, except that a concentration of Japanese had appeared on the border, and a few days later British women and children were compelled to evacuate. Subsequently, American women and children were advised to take advantage of special ac-

commodations provid-ed on two President boats-of course, at their own expense. After interviewing the Consul, most of our missionaries decided that they would re-main until compelled to leave.

"The trouble and uncertainty here affect the workers inland, since all funds and help must come from Hong Kong, but they are still faithfully carrving on.

An Open Door

"We have just received encouraging reports from Chung Shaan, where the attendance has picked up and a greater interest has been manifested. Although that district was lately visited by bombers, the chapel and workers are unharmed. We are praying that God's protection may surround them.

The Coming of the Holy Spirit Lesson for October 13. Lesson Text: Acts 1:12 to 2:13.

Instead of discussing the lesson text itself which is very familiar to most of us, let us consider some questions which very often arise in connection with our text and the subject of the Baptism with the Holy Spirit.

I. What is the value of speaking with tongues? A. Speaking with tongues as the Spirit gives utterance is the initial physical evidence of the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. (1) In Acts 2:4 "they were all filled with the Holy Ghost and (the result was) began to speak with other tongues." (2) See Acts 10:44-46. Peter was astonished to see that God would baptize Gentiles in the Holy Ghost. What convinced him that they were

baptized? "For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God." (3) See Acts 19:1-6. Twenty-three years after Pentecost, Paul came upon some Christians who had not heard of the Holy Spirit. He laid hands on them. With what result? "The Holy Ghost came on them and they spake with tongues." (4) See Acts 8:13-19. Peter and John laid hands on the Samaritan Christians and "they received the Holy Ghost." It is not recorded that they spoke in tongues, yet that they did speak with tongues is proved by the fact that Simon the sorcerer although already in possession of supernatural power, should offer money for the greater supernatural power which he "saw" (v. 18) before him. Had their been no outward supernatural manifestation this magician would certainly not have been impressed. (5) It is not recorded that Paul spoke with tongues when he received his Baptism; but his own later statement proves that he did (see 1 Cor. 14:18). Thus in every instance of receiving the Holy Spirit Baptism recorded in Scripture, speaking in tongues is either mentioned or clearly implied.

B. That men may speak supernaturally to God. 1 Cor. 14:2. Says one writer, "Every believer must have felt at times a consuming desire to open his heart to God in unspeakable communication and adoration inexpressible. There is a deep in the spirit of the redeemed that is never plumbed by mind or thought. That deep finds expression at last in the Baptism with the Spirit, as

unaccustomed words of heavenly origin sweep up to the Beloved from the newly opened well of the human spirit, flooded with the torrential stream of the divine Spirit."

So it was on the Day of Pentecost. The disciples were not, as some foolishly hold, preaching the gospel to the foreigners in Jerusalem in foreign languages bestowed for that purpose. They were simply speaking unto God magnifying Him for His "wonderful works." Compare Acts 2:11 and 1 Cor. 14:2.


C. That we may edify ourselves. "He that speaketh in a tongue edifieth himself." 1 Cor. 14:4. To edify means to strengthen or build up. In preaching and teaching we may edify others, but the Word gives us this special way of edifying ourselves. Why did Paul say, "I thank my God I speak with tongues more than ye all"? 1 Cor. 14:18. Because singing and praying in tongues in his devotional life was a means of receiving great spiritual strength, blessing, and establishment, as well as a means of glorifying God.

D. That our praying may have a supernatural range. "If I pray in a tongue, my spirit prayeth,

but my understanding is unfruitful . . . I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also." 1 Cor. 14:14. To pray with the spirit means to pray in tongues. To pray with the understanding is to pray in one's own language. There is a place for both. However, when we pray in our own language we can only pray for things within the range of our own knowledge. But when we yield to the Spirit and pray in tongues we pray according to the knowledge of the Spirit whose knowledge is universal. Thus, when we pray in tongues we may be praying for someone thousands of miles away, whose need, though unknown to us, is known to the Spirit and we become a channel through which that individual's need may be met.

E. Speaking with tongues when accompanied by interpretation edifies the church. See 1 Cor.

THE FULL EVIDENCE OF THE BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT



14:5, 12, 13, 26. The supernatural manifestation of the gift of tongues strengthens and confirms the faith of believers and testifies to the presence of God among them. And the interpretation of the message in tongues comforts, and encourages, and instructs.

F. Speaking in tongues with interpretation is a miraculous and convincing sign to the unsaved. There are many people in almost every Pentecostal assembly who were convicted of sin or convinced of the reality of God through hearing a message in tongues or interpretation.

G. Jesus Himself placed His approval upon speaking with tongues. "In my name . . . they shall speak with new tongues." Mark 16:17. He did not limit this holy gift to His first disciples. It is for all "them that believe"! Therefore, let us "forbid not to speak with tongues." 1 Cor. 14:39. II. What are the evidences of a Spirit-filled life?

A. Not the ability to speak with tongues. Some who are backslidden in heart are able to speak in tongues and feel that their being able to do so, indicates that they are filled with the Spirit even though they are allowing sin in their lives! Paul suggested the possibility of speaking in tongues being as sounding brass when practiced by those October 5, 1940

whose hearts were devoid of divine love. 1 Cor. 13:1.

B. Not the experiencing of pleasant emotions. One may be able to experience a lot of pleasing emotions and yet be living an inconsistent life. To be able to feel good is no guarantee that one is filled with the Spirit. Even a sinner may weep or be inspired and thrilled when listening to a speaker with a magnetic personality or when listening to certain music.

C. The chief evidences that one who speaks in tongues enjoys a Spirit-filled life are a heart that is free from all sin, a hatred of sin, a love for souls, a joy in service for the Lord, power in witnessing to the unsaved, a love for prayer, a love for the Word of God, a love for fellowship with spiritual people, a will wholly surrendered to God, the presence in the life of the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22, 23), and a passionate personal devotion to Jesus Himself.

III. "Getting the Baptism" versus keeping filled with the Spirit.

Jesus commanded His followers to be baptized in the Holy Spirit. In Acts 2:4 they obeyed that command. And in Acts 4:31 we observe that they also were refilled with the Spirit. We today emphasize the necessity of receiving the initial infilling of the Spirit, but do we see as clearly as we should the necessity of receiving fresh infillings continually? To have been baptized in the Spirit sometime in the past does not necessarily mean that one is filled with the Spirit today! A drink of water today will not take care of tomorrow's thirst; we need to drink daily. In like manner, we need to drink daily of the Spirit if we would keep filled with the Spirit!

> When a person *receives* the Baptism in the Spirit, it means that for the first time in his entire being, body, soul, spirit is 100% yielded to Jesus. If we are to *keep filled* with the Spirit, if the Baptism is to accomplish in us and through us what God intended, then we must *continue to live* in the place of 100% yieldedness and consecration! See John 15:5, 7, 10.—J. Bashford Bishop.

SLAVERY IN POLAND

The German Military Command is speeding up the construction of a strong defensive line on the German-Soviet frontier, reports *Jewish Chronicle*, and has conscripted no fewer than 600,000 Polish citizens, one third of whom are Jews. It amounts practically to slavery. No pay is given to the workers, and food is of the poorest.

THE PRINTED PAGE

It is well to remind ourselves, by concrete examples, of what the printed page can do. As a Swede was landing some years ago in America, a worker of the New York Bible Society stepped up to him, offering him a Swedish New Testament. The Swede stopped, apparently startled, and stared at the worker, saying: "Weren't you here twenty-six years ago? I think you are the same man-yes, you are the same man." The worker told him he had been engaged for twenty-eight years distributing the Scriptures to the immigrants, and giving to each one a book in his mother tongue. "Well," said the Swede, "twenty-six years ago I landed here a stranger, and you gave me a New Testament in the Swedish language, just as you offered me one now. I read it, and through reading it I became a Christian. After a few years I made up my mind to become a preacher, and for twenty years I have been preaching the Gospel in Colorado. It all began in your giving me a New Testament."

GALL BLADDER HEALED

In March, 1938, after suffering a year with gall bladder trouble I gave up trying to trust God gall bladder filled up again and I was having the same colic attacks as before. Finally my home doctor sent me to the hospital again. I would not give up to be operated on for two weeks, during which time I got worse all the time. When finally I was to be operated on the next morning, I began searching my heart in desperate earnestness. I knew people all over Oklahoma were praying for me. The lights had been turned out, except in my ward where they still burned. I lifted my eyes to the light and there in the shade of the lamp I saw the operating table. I thought this was to show me it was right for me to be operated on. I closed my eyes, and then I heard a voice saying, "Why don't you go to sleep? The doctor came in and was astonished. At my request he let me sit up in a chair. Seemingly I had been trusting in the prayers of the saints, and waiting for someone who could pray the prayer of faith. Now I was trusting in God alone. In a few days I went home and I have had no attack since.

This miraculous healing took place on June 8, 1939, and this morning, January 15, 1940, it still holds good.—Laura Cramp, Porum, Oklahoma.

Ed. note—After holding this testimony some time we wrote Mrs. Cramp, and in June, 1940 we had a long newsy letter from Beulah Gaffney, Sister Cramp's daughter, in which she tells of the several operations her mother had had, of her terrible sufferings, and of her miraculous healing as Mrs. Cramp herself detailed it. She says her mother has never had another spell since the day she was healed in the hospital.

A GOVERNOR REPROVES SIN

When Gov. Lauren Dickinson exposed the "high life" of the East, says *The Lookout*, as revealed to him during the national governors' conference, the newspapers with one accord gave the old gentleman the "horse laugh."

It was to them a huge joke that there still could be any one, who was any one, who was old-fashioned enough to believe in "sin." Or, what was even rarer, any one who believed that drinking and lasciviousness and gambling were sins. The "ha-has" were loud and long, and the *hoi polloi* from coast to coast joined in with high glee.

After the tumult and the shouting died, Damon Runyan, well-known columnist, spoke up in defense of the governor—rather belatedly and lamely, but nevertheless he spoke—which is quite a brave thing in these times. And, in part, here is what he said:

"... Any incident that aroused the abhorrence and alarm of a true Christian gentleman, which Governor Dickinson most certainly is, must have been something not to be lightly dismissed with the ridicule that was heaped upon the governor.

"Where we thought the governor really had something was in his general idea that there is sinfulness in the land. He need not have specified the East. He could have taken in the entire United States of America, and plenty of the rest of the world to boot. There is altogether too much sinfulness everywhere and altogether too much of a disposition to make light of that sinfulness which does not happen to come within the purview of the man-made laws.

"Not that we are going to do anything about it, you understand. We have no pulpit and no soap box, nor do we feel any call to go forth and smite sinfulness hip and thigh. We are just a fellow sitting on the sidelines watching what is going on, and what we see going on is a quite general violation of all the laws of the Almighty.

"You have only to read the daily newspapers to see the same thing for yourself. Every form of sinfulness against which the documents of God protest is going on in the world, and the pity of it is that many forms have become so common that no attention is paid to them. Many forms of sinfulness have become so common, mark you, that criticism of them is laughed at, as in the case of the old governor of Michigan.

"We make bold to say that never before in the history of the universe has sinfulness been more prevalent or more lightly viewed than in this year of our Lord 1939...."

God used Noah at quite an advanced age to warn his generation of impending doom. Possibly He is using Governor Dickinson to warn us. The governor should not get too discouraged if the people give his words the same sort of reception that Noah's received.

12 x 12 Equals 144

That's easy, you say. If it is true in arithmetic, it is correspondingly true in the Sunday School. Let us apply it to building a successful men's Bible class.

It may startle you, but I firmly believe it is almost as easy to get 144 men in a men's class as it is to get the first 12 at the start. Of course it will take prayer and thoughtful planning, but it took that to gather the 12.

Why is it as easy to get a large number of men as to get a few? Answer: Suppose you invite a prospect to your class of 12 men. Very likely he will not respond. But, suppose you divide your class of 12 into six teams of two men each, who with the Spirit's anointing approach the same man in this manner, "Mr. Jones, you are not a regular attendant at Sunday School, are you? Don't you think you ought to be? We are from the Full Gospel Sunday School.


The Interstate Camp Meeting formerly held in Eureka Springs, Arkansas, has held its first session in its new home on the
