# Blood in the Holy Place

was the most sacred spot in the sanctuary. Only once in the year could the holiest be entered and then only by the high priest "not without blood, which he offered for himself, and for the errors of the people." There, upon and before the mercy seat, he sprinkled atoming blood as he confessed the sins of himself and of the people. Sprinkling the blood was a confession of the sinfulness of the people and a testimony that through the sprinkled blood atonement was made for their sins.

Now we find that Christ, after having shed His blood upon the cross, "being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands...neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by His own blood He entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption."

It is well to see by the eye of faith our Lord Jesus shedding His blood upon the cross, to meditate upon His agonies there, and to contemplate the importance of His words, "It is finished." But we must see beyond the cross. He who shed His blood to make an atonement for the soul, took our place in death on the cross. But He did not remain in the place of death. He arose and ascended to the right hand of God. There He is alive forevermore. And for what purpose? To plead the merits of His blood in our behalf. If one sees only the human Saviour on the cross, one's religion will be that of dead worship. He must be seen as One who is alive again, alive forevermore. Because He lives we live also. At Calvary He was "delivered for our offenses." In His resurrection He "was raised for our justification." He lives as our great High Priest who has passed into the heavens. There He ministers at the altar and before the mercy seat of which the altar and mercy seat in the Jewish temple were a type.

At the mercy seat on high the blood of Christ pleads effectually. It pleads for the pardon and sanctification of all who believe in Jesus. And it pleads against all the accusations of the accuser of the brethren. Satan will tell us that we are unworthy the favors of God, and will accuse us before the Father because of our lack or shortcomings. Can we overcome him like the Pharisee, by saying, "Lord I thank thee that I am not as other men"? All our righteousness are as filthy rags. There is nothing in self that can command the favors of God. We overcome him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of our testimony. *First, last, and altogether we are saved through the merit of Christ alone.* There on the mercy seat His blood "speaketh better things than that of Abel's." It pleads for pardon and for power.

Often we feel weak. Consciousness of weakness need be no barrier to us. We are accepted in the Beloved. His blood that ever speaketh, tells of our need of divine power, pleads that out of weakness we may be made strong, and urges that to us may be given power over all the power of the enemy. If only we saw better the value of the blood of Christ in our behalf we should live in a more glorious freedom and serve our Father more fully in Spirit and in truth.

It pleases God when we enjoy communion with Him, when we walk in the tranquility of peace, and when we serve in faithful labors triumphantly. But that which pleases God displeases Satan. He therefore is constantly seeking to retard our progress, to separate us from communion, and to hinder our service. As we look to self or to feelings we at times feel discouraged. The place for us to look is to the mercy seat on high. there to see the sprinkled blood and Him who shed it in our behalf, our Great High Priest who ever liveth to make intercession for us. We must see Jesus.

Some, we fear, have a wrong understanding concerning the blood of Christ. A woman came to a prayer meeting and was saying something that sounded much like a noisy gurgle. The pastor went over and asked her what she was doing. She answered that she was pleading the blood. Pleading the blood is more than rapidly repeating the word. It is beholding what Christ has bought for us and the position which He has provided for us through His redemption. The living creatures and the four and twenty elders had full appreciation of the blood when they sang, "Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof; for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us unto God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation."

In thinking of the blood sprinkled on the mercy seat on high, we must ever keep in mind that it has been sprinkled there by the same Jesus who died upon Calvary, now our ever-living High Priest. We, like the people of Israel, are unworthy to sprinkle the blood on the mercy seat. We need an advocate, one who can do this effectively for us. He who is worthy to do this is our Lord Jesus. He lived sinlessly while on earth. He fully obeyed the will of the Father. He gave His life a ransom on Calvary, and He has been set down at the right hand of the Majesty in the heavens. He, the perfect priest, pleads before the Father the efficacy of His own blood in our behalf.

Some years ago I was in a court room in Philadelphia. A woman was there seeking wages which she said were due her from the estate of a man who had died and whose

estate was then being settled. As she stated her case before the judge, he asked if she did not have an attorney to represent her. She answered that she did not have, that she was a poor woman and could not afford it. The judge said, "You ought to have an attorney." She insisted that she could not afford it. It surprised me for I felt the judge could listen to her case without one to state it and plead in her behalf. But not so. After a little the kind judge called an employee and instructed him to go to another part of the building and secure one to plead her cause. This was done without cost to the woman. We need one to help us, One who can lay our case before the Judge of all in the way most fitting. We have such in our Lord Jesus. He does not plead our righteousness or the justice of our cause in itself, He pleads what He has done for us. The blood of Christ speaketh better things than that of Abel's.

The blood of Christ pleads not alone for our passing needs. It pleads "that we may be perfect and complete in all the will of God." There is character in the blood of Christ. Let him who thinks he is sharing the benefits of that precious blood without developing character take heed. "This is the will of God, even your sanctification." The Lord would "present us faultless before His presence with exceeding joy." Christ "gave Himself for the church, that He might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water, by the word." The righteousness of Christ was imputed to us as our faith as guilty sinners saw Him dying on the cross. He also wishes that righteousness imparted to us, touching the every action and desire of our life that He might "present us unto Himself a glorious Church, not having spot or wrinkle, or any such thing."

The Holy Spirit works in harmony with the blood of Christ. They always work together. What the blood of Christ pleads for from the mercy seat above, the Spirit pleads for in the sincere heart "with groanings which cannot be uttered." Never will they cease their pleadings until we have safely passed from this world of Satan, temptation, testing, and trial with an abundant entrance into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Depend ever on the atonement of Christ. Mingle it with your worship, with your service, and in your life. Separated from it we become as branches of the vine cut off, gathered together to be burned. "The blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, cleanseth us from all sin."

# The Life Also of Jesus

In THE fourth chapter of Paul's Second Epistle to the Corinthians we have twice the expression, "The life of Jesus" used, once in the 10th verse, and once in the 11th verse. At once we are interested, for we know that we are so identified with Christ that any reference to His blessed life applies in some way to us. But how amazing to read more closely and see that the life of Jesus here spoken of, applies not to our spiritual but to our bodily needs. Note the expression in the 10th verse, "That the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body."

"Yes," says some discouraged sufferer, "I know that some glad day when I have passed from the painful scenes of earth I shall know His life in my body."

But the blessed Word does not leave us in doubt as to the time when we may begin to have in our bodies this precious experience; therefore, when the expression, "that the life also of Jesus," is repeated in the 11th verse it adds, "might be made manifest in our mortal flesh." Oh, the joy and blessedness of it, to have the life of Jesus made manifest right here and now in "our mortal flesh"!

When the final change comes to our bodies at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, we shall put off mortality and be clothed upon with His immortality; but it is our glorious privilege now to have the life of Jesus "made manifest in our mortal flesh." Moreover, it is not to be a hidden life but a manifested life, shown forth, demonstrated, and made apparent as it flows forth, not in acts of self-seeking pleasure, but in loving ministrations to the Lord and to His little ones. Like Peter's wife's mother who, when healed by a touch from the Lord Jesus, arose and ministered unto Him and His disciples.

There is a wonderful spiritual experience spoken of in this chapter which seems to go before and prepare the way for this manifestation of the Lord's life in our body. The first verse refers to having "received mercy," for Paul never failed to realize that all good gifts came to him through the mercy or grace of God who bestows undeserved blessings even upon the unworthy. He says, "We faint not." Paul was kept from fainting by the mercy of God as He went on in his ministry.

But there had been a great renunciation (verse 2) of things indulged in by some others: "Hidden things of dishonesty," "walking in craftiness," "handling the Word of God deceitfully," and God was manifesting His truth through Paul in such a way that he could use such words as these: "Commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God." How completely must He who is "full of grace and truth" have dominated and shone forth through Paul's life!

The sixth verse says: "God...hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." Paul not only knew the riches of God's grace but also the riches of His glory. He knew in his heart a continued manifestation of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. This is the "treasure" to which he refers in the next verse, but he calls himself and other weak ones who are partakers with him of this glory "earthen vessels." Why was the treasure put into earthen vessels? "That the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us."

Then follows a description of the kind of life Paul lived: "troubled," "perplexed," "persecuted," "cast down," and yet no real defeat through any of these conditions, because this very condition of "always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus" caused the life of Jesus to be made manifest in Paul's body.

What was the life of Jesus that Paul knew in his "mortal flesh"? It was a foretaste of the resurrection life of Jesus, and the more Paul tasted of the Lord's sufferings and death, the more he was able to realize His resurrection life.

But you say: "Perhaps it was only for Paul, and not for me." No, you may read further of this marvelous life for the body in Romans 8:11: "But if the Spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by His Spirit that dwelleth in you." We see here that it is for all who have the Spirit of Him that raised Christ from the dead dwelling in them. It is the indwelling Spirit Himself who quickens (Gr. makes full of life) the mortal body, thus making manifest the life of Jesus.

It is plainly stated that our body is the temple of the Holy Ghost. Does the Holy Ghost dwell within us? Then He makes our mortal body full of life by His indwelling. If our body is full of His quickening life, then it is not full of weakness and disease.

How are we to apprehend this? By feeling? No, by faith, for "The just shall live by faith." We shall certainly feel this heavenly quickening life and be as conscious of it as we are of the natural life; but we are first required to believe that it is ours on the authority of the Word of God.



A Spirit-filled person may take this position: First, I am filled with the Spirit that raised Christ from the dead. Second, My body is presented as a living sacrifice unto God (Rom. 12:1), and is His temple. Third, Therefore, according to God's Word, the Spirit makes my mortal body full of life (Rom. 8:11). Fourth, I do not feel it, but I believe it, and I will keep praising God. It is true because He says so, and that is better authority than any of my feelings. Fifth, Since my body is full of Christ's life, weakness and disease are cast out, and I will and do believe this on the authority of God's Word.

God's way is faith first, and feeling afterward. What this blessed quickening life is like when faith turns into sight is beyond description. Taste and see! But it is constantly maintained by a simple faith that counts upon the faithfulness of God.

Isaiah 40:28-31 has a beautiful portrayal of this life of God which is far beyond the natural strength of "youth" or "young men." In fact it is not our earthly life at all, but a heavenly, and it is shown forth by the picture of mounting up on eagle's wings. If the foretaste which we have here of this heavenly life for the body is so wonderful, what will it be when we know it in its fulness? Down here we can only know it with limitations.

In the midst of mighty uplifts and ethereal breaths which sustain and rejuvenate our bodies so that we are constantly upheld for the most strenuous duties, and girded for spiritual conflict, we have many reminders that our bodies are still more or less earth-The Scripture calls this the perishbound. ing of the outward man, but we are also assured of the renewing of the inward man day by day. 2 Cor. 4:16. Each day as the smoke of battle clears enough to let us see new responsibilities and greater dangers, "the inward man" is renewed and undergirded and uplifted, and each day we fead on new manna, and find "grace for grace."

How precious to know this not only for our souls but also for our bodies! And how blessed the provision for our threefold being implied in First Thessalonians 5:23, 24: "And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it!" Amen and amen.

#### He Made It Again

A man working for Faraday, the great French chemist, accidentally knocked a splendid silver cup into some fluid and was astonished to see the silver rapidly disappear. The workmen gathered around and were greatly dismayed, deploring the loss of such handsome workmanship. When the chemist was informed he poured æ small quantity of fluid into the basin, and gradually the silver dropped to the bottom. Carefully pouring off the liquid, he took the silver and sent it to be remade at the silversmith's who had designed the cup. In a few days the cup was even more beautiful than at first, cleansed in the acid, and remade faultless.

Jeremiah tells us of the marred vessel he saw in the hands of the potter, that he took the clay and "made it again." Are you marred? Put yourself in the hands of the Heavenly Potter.

# When Christ Comes as a Thief

S EVEN times over in the second and third chapters of Revelation we have the warning, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches."

No community, no church, no individual can hide from Him whose eyes are as a flame of fire. Christ is still searching out the condition of the communities, of the assemblies, and of the individuals.

The Spirit marked out the church at Sardis for special rebuke. They were told to watch, and they were at fault in not being watchful. They had received the word from Christ which told them to watch, and should have listened to it. But here the Spirit had to bring the same call to watchfulness home again. Having heard the word of Christ's warning, "What I say unto you I say unto all, Watch," the church at Sardis should not have needed this subsequent warning.

The principal sin of the individuals in the church at Sardis was indifference to the near approach of Christ. They were living carelessly. Peter condemns those in the world who say, "Where is the promise of His coming?" The individuals in the church at Sardis might not have said this, but they acted in the same way as the worldlings and mockers who reject the Scriptures concerning Christ's coming back again.

Christ says, "I know thy works, that thou hast a name that thou livest, and art dead" —works that are hay, wood, and stubble, but every effort is made to preserve a good name before the world! But Christ sees deadness and need of revival in the church. There are many who have their names on church rolls who are living in pleasure and are dead while they are living. To such Christ gives a solemn warning here.

He continues: "Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die." It is a call to wake out of a spirit of lethargy and lukewarmness. It is a call to seek the Lord's face, and to seek afresh the life and life more abundant that He only can give. It is a call to revive the old-fashioned family altar and the oldfashioned prayer meeting, both of which are about ready to die.

about ready to die. He continues: "I have not found thy works perfect before God." Some of our works may be grand and beautiful before men, but how imperfect they are in God's sight.

Then comes a clarion call to repentance: "Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent." It is a call to remember the constant warnings of Christ, His warnings of the fate of the foolish virgins and that of the evil servant who says in his heart, "My Lord delayeth His coming." He calls them to hold fast the faithful


He calls them to hold fast the faithful Word, and to repent. It is a call to every one of us as individuals. Have you failed God? Have you neglected His Word? Have you been unfaithful in your prayer life? He calls you to repent. Yes, to turn from your way of indifference and neglect. Repentance involves turning from all that is evil and turning again to God, to receive from Him His mercy and His grace. Yet another warning: "If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee." The unwatchful and unconcerned will be ashamed before Him at His coming. He warns again and again that He will come as a thief. What does a thief do? He comes and brings consternation, discomfiture, and loss. He takes away the comfortable things with which the natural man surrounds himself. He not only robs but startles!

When Christ comes as a thief, He will take away the most valuable, the most precious ones from His church, those that fear the Lord and speak often one to another concerning Him, those that continually think upon His name. What a call to watchfulness!

The Lord has a word of encouragement, "Thou hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with Me in white: for they are worthy." There were some in the church who were very precious to the Lord. Just a few watchful ones, a small minority out of the numerous self-pleasing churchgoers. God wants that few increased, and so the Spirit is working in every possible manner to stir up, to warn, to entreat, and to shake the self-satisfied, complacent ones in order that that few may be increased. He knows every individual in the church. He knows you.

There is a very solemn word that follows, a word of encouragement and warning: "He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life." The few undefiled ones were called to an eternal priesthood with the Son of God.

But there is a warning here that there is a possibility, even a probability, of the names of some of the unwatchful, the careless ones being blotted out of the book of life. No amount of sophistry can change this message of the living God. It is the watchful overcomer, the one who is undefiled who will not have his name blotted out of the book of life. And He gives faithful warning to all in the church to attain to the standard



of the few in Sardis who had not defiled their garments.

The Holy Spirit inspired the prayer, "Keep back Thy servant also from presumptuous sins." Psalm 19:13. Those who are not watching are often very presumptuous, and because they are so presumptuous they do not watch. But the Spirit entreats and warns in many ways, reminding us of the words of Christ, "What I say unto you I say unto all—Watch." Mark 13:37.

A few presumptuous sheep can lead a lot of other sheep outside the fold. They often quote the words of Christ, "No man is able to pluck them out of My Father's hand," but He will not choose to hold those who do not choose to remain in His keeping. It is possible for the sheep to wander out of the fold of their own free will. Steer clear of the gaps in the fold. See how far away you can keep from them. Keep close to the Shepherd, within the hearing of His voice. His true sheep hear His voice, and they follow Him. John 10:27. Every day listen to the voice of the Shepherd as He speaks through His Word, and every day follow the Shepherd in absolute obedience to His revealed will.

Lot fled away from danger. His wife turned around and faced it. Those who constantly quote the words of Christ, "Neither shall any man pluck them out of My hand," should also remember the other words of the Master, "Remember Lot's wife." The angel of God was sent to deliver both Lot and his wife. But Lot's wife did not want the angel's hand. She wanted the hands of those back in Sodom. And she perished. Related to righteous Lot, yet she plucked herself out of the hand of mercy.

of mercy. "Keep back Thy servant from presumptuous sins," is the prayer that needs to be prayed by many professing children of God today. And they need to pray further, "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer." Psalm 19:14. Amen.

Christ's All-Sufficiency

GF I KNEW that I had but an hour longer to live, and were granted the privilege of converse with those of like precious faith as myself during that hour, I would desire that these three words might be the last to fall from my lips, "CHRIST IS ALL." Col. 3:11.

- CHRIST ... the Creator of all things; ... by whom all things consist.
- CHRIST ... in whom dwells all the fulness of the Godhead bodily;... in whom we are complete.
- CHRIST ... in whom we have redemption through His Blood;...in whom our life is hid.
- CHRIST ... who hath delivered us from the power of darkness;... who hath made us free from the law of sin and death.
- CHRIST ... whose power rests specially upon us in our infirmities ... Our great high priest, who lives to make intercession for us, and is able to save us to the uttermost.
- CHRIST ... the Resurrection and the Life; ... the Forerunner who has en-tered "within the veil" ... "for us," heralding our approach.
- CHRIST ... the Corn of Wheat that fell to the ground and died, that He might bring forth much fruit;...our Bridegroom, who is coming to receive us unto Himself, that where He is, we may be, in mansions of His providing.

No wonder the apostle Paul said to the Corinthians, "I determined not to know anything among you save Jesus Christ, and Him cruci-fied."

There was nothing else to know. There is nothing else to know. Every mistake I have made (alas they have been numerous!), every failure, every sin, has come from a lack of realization of the absolute allness of Christ.

Instead of receiving Him in all His glorious fullness, and like John, the beloved, leaning upon His bosom as I supped with Him, and again like John following Him unques-tioningly in the way (John 21:20), I would get busy and try to add to His finished work. It can't be done. You can't add anything to what is finished. And to receive the Lord Lacue Christ you have to the Lord Jesus Christ you have to take Him as your All, and All in all.

Sometimes I forgot that the second of the three words "Christ IS All" is a verb, in the present tense.

Christ is, here and now. Not was, as in the time of Paul and Peter only. He will be when we are caught up together to meet Him in the air, but right now the eye of faith sees Him here.

Peter said to Aeneas, bedfast for eight long years, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ maketh thee whole."

On what authority? The Word of God which declares that Christ Jesus has delivered us from the power of darkness.

So up jumps Aeneas and rolls up his bed.

In the History of the Early Baptists of New Jersey we read of Hannah Carmen, a woman with paralyzed limbs and a bent back, who read Peter's words to Aeneas and said, "Oh, that I had been in Aeneas' place!"

Immediately a voice said to her "Arise, take up thy bed and walk," and she arose strong and well.

Never forget that it reads, Christ IS All —is . . . *is* . . . IS . . . *IS* !

But you may ask, "Is it not according to your faith? The Lord Jesus Himself said so."



#### "Carest Thou Not?"

The greatest tragedy in life that can come to any man is the conviction that he is no longer needed. Only the tender care and sympathy of loving friends can tide one safely through that trying period. When one has labored and sacrificed and given of time and strength in the service of the Lord, and then to find every door closed against him, the realization of his plight may be bitter indeed.

Those who have known the Lord have had many precious experiences of God's tender care in the past. As the evening of life is approached, they still have the promises of God, "I have been young, and now am old: yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread." And yet God does use human means when caring for His own. It was a profound conviction which led the brethren to consider the need of our older ministers, and it was a prompting from the Lord which caused them to take steps to provide for those of our older brethren who, because of old age or infirmity, can no longer continue in active service.

Twice a year this need is presented to the members of our fellowship, once in the spring, near Memorial Day, and once in the fall, near Thanksgiving Day. All will want to share in this obligation. Praying Down Revivals

Charles Finney, America's great revivalist, once said, "There never will be a revival until somebody makes particular effort for this end. Opposition does not necessarily kill or prevent revival. If Christians are thus driven to prayer, why revival will speed on. The great revival in Rochester, N. Y., began under the most disadvantageous circumstances that could be imagined. The three churches were at variance. One had no minister; one was divided and was to dismiss its minister. An elder in the Third Presbyterian Church had brought charges against the Pastor of the First Church. But in Rochester there were a few remarkable cases of the spirit of prayer that assured us that God was there and we went on, and the more Satan opposed, the Spirit of the Lord lifted up the standard higher and higher until finally a great wave of salvation rolled over the place."

"Men ought always to pray." Everywhere in Scripture words to this effect give to prayer a paramount place in the Church's machinery of world evangelization. The whole gamut of Christ's doctrine of prayer is not to make prayer auxiliary to Christian work but pre-eminently its motivating force. "How few," exclaims Cortland Myers, "ever enter into the positive, practical power of prayer. It is the mightiest force in the universe but the Christian world is blind to the fact."

In her age-long conflict with the world and the devil the only advances the Church has ever made have been on her knees. Today the only force powerful enough to defeat the enemy in this last awful attack is the force of united intercession. Nothing can long withstand the power of sustained and united prayer in the Saviour's name. "All the progress of civilization has been brought about by the activities of minorities. By the time the majority has arrived the fighting has already been done."

Whenever the Church is aroused and the world's wickedness is arrested someone has been found praying. D. L. Moody once heard a minister say that if God could find one utterly believing soul the history of the world would be changed. D. L. Moody resolved in his mind to be that utterly believing man. The whole history of the world was changed through the faith and perseverance and daring of Martin Luther.

"I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge and stand in the gap before me for the land that I should not destroy it: but I found none." Ezek. 22:23-30. God is looking for men and women. The situation in the world and the Church today is critical. If you are a pastor, preacher, or a man or woman whose heart is right with God, it matters not, who you are or where, if you have power in prayer the greatest thing you can do is to begin at once and keep at it until like Jacob you prevail with God.

Some years ago a church in England began to experience a mighty work of God. Ministers of other denominations desiring a similar awakening in their churches became interested and upon inquiry the following testimony was given by one of the saints:

"Ours was one of many small churches in a small town with a sparse struggling community. We did not have a summer slump for ours was a year-around slump. How we worked for that Church! The world offered many inducements to our young people. There were Sunday ball games, card parties, auto rides; tennis in summer, skating in winter. Satan's emissaries seemed so numerous while our little band seemed so weak and small. We became discouraged and in our lack of faith and consecration tried to fight the devil with carnal weapons. We invited special singers to sing in our services. We urged our old pastor to preach on modern topics. He was bewildered but he was like clay in our energetic hands. We advertised in every possible way. We introduced the motion picture brand of evangelism into our services. We invited a young evangelist to hold a campaign for us. We pleaded with our young people in public and in private. And yet our services continued to dwindle and lose ground Sunday after Sunday until it seemed we would have to give up.

"We blamed the minister. He was a godly man and would have given his life for the Master. We blamed the lure of the world. We blamed the young people. Some almost blamed God Himself. About this time a quiet, middle-aged woman moved into town. She was not clever nor handsome nor rich nor in any way a striking personality. But we never knew a person that lived so near to the Lord. His love, His goodness, His power fairly radiated from her. Her faith was boundless. She knew the Bible from cover to cover. Her quiet unassuming, yet wholly trusting manner in quoting His promises put to shame many of us older in the faith than she.

"The sight of our unfilled pews and our almost empty Sunday School left her undismayed. 'God wants His house filled,' she said. 'He wants the young people saved and the older ones reclaimed. He wants men and women delivered from Satan's power. We must unite in prayer for them.' Encouraged by her quiet, insistent, unfaltering faith, we made a list of the names of those for whose soul we were burdened. When our lists were complete they embraced the whole town and countryside. When someone exclaimed over the length of

the lists she said, 'But why should we not pray for all the Lord puts on our hearts?' "We began, a little band of eight per-

"We began, a little band of eight persons. Every day at eleven and again at four we prayed privately for the souls of those whose names God seemed to have laid on our hearts. Every evening an hour before services we met in a room in the Church and prayed unitedly, earnestly. All talking was forbidden. Prayer was our business. We did not proclaim it abroad. We simply prayed without ceasing and when for some reason one of us could not join the others at church, we prayed at home. Others attracted by our earnestness began to join us in prayer at the church.

"Soon the attendance at church and Sunday School began to increase. We gave up all advertising and discarded all worldly means or methods. We had no method but prayer.

"Our minister caught the fire. His sermons became just like talks on God's love and man's lost condition without Him. The little church became holy ground. Notwithstanding all the enticements of Satan and he worked hard in those days—first one, then another for whom we were uniting in prayer, confessed their sins and yielded their lives to Christ. Before the town realized it, the Church services were crowded, every class in Sunday School was filled, and new classes started. The picture houses and dance halls were almost deserted and the spirit of revival radiated through the whole town and countryside.

"It is now some years since that quiet little woman entered our midst and united us in prayer. Satan has assailed us fiercely but our prayer band has increased in power and in faith. We have been made to know that nothing can long resist the power of united, persistent prayer. Many of our young people have gone out into the world carrying with them the vision of united intercession, and uniting God's people wherever found into praying bands." Does not this incident challenge the pres-

Does not this incident challenge the present Church situation in your town and mine? As the desperate spiritual needs of America unfold themselves cannot God find in every community men and women who will take the lead in seeking His face for a revitilization of religion through a return to the old-time cottage and church prayer meetings?

Christian! The responsibility of a spiritual awakening in the community in which we live is yours and mine. God is calling His people to prayer. Prayer is the only real battle ground in the world today. Let us resolve by His infinite grace to stand in the battle and PRAY THROUGH.

# God Still Dives

## A True Story by Emma F. Meigs, Elka Park, N. Y.

J WAS the usual run of church member, Sunday School teacher, and church worker, but I was not satisfied. I was a seeker but did not know for what. The winter of 1937-38 a full-gospel preacher was in our community. For two months I listened to every word and sought God diligently. January 23 the subject was "Peter's Wife's Mother's Fevered Brow."

I felt I *must* have Him touch me; but I dared not ask Him, the One without spot and blemeless, to touch unclean me. My soul agony was excruciating, and I went home from church knowing I was full of sin. All night I prayed, not daring to ask Him to touch me, yet wanting Him to do so more than life. Toward morning such a wind roared in my head! I told my husband I was afraid our roof would blow off. He told me there was no wind. I waited until daylight, continuing to pray. After breakfast I spoke of the wind

After breakfast I spoke of the wind again, saying I was afraid the clothes would be whipped to pieces if I washed. He said there was no wind and asked me to go outside and see for myself. I did, and there was no sign of wind, only in my head. So I started to wash, but felt I must in some way get in touch with Christ. I went to the Scripture Calendar, but instead of reading the verse, it came out at me—"Be of good cheer, your sins are forgiven."

good cheer, your sins are forgiven." I was alone. I dropped to my knees praising and thanking the Lord. His cross appeared before me, and He on it. Nothing else was ever so cruel. I feel the agony of it yet. I begged Him to come down. I felt a drop on my head, and thought the roof was leaking, but I could not move. I told Him I would not leave until He came down. The agony seemed to change to love, life, and everything good for me. As with bowed head I adored Him, the warm flood enveloped every inch of me. He told me it had to be, as it was His blood, and He was cleansing me. O Precious One! I shall never forget!

Then when I looked up, the cross was gone, and He alone was there, and such glory shone around Him. I asked Him what I was to do next, and He said, "Follow Me." Then He started off, leaving a narrow path in which by His grace I have been willing to follow. That was my birth into the kingdom.

I was permitted to attend the Bible School in Green Lane, Pa., for two weeks. I received my Baptism after five days, and for the remainder of the two weeks I spent in the clouds.

Returning home the tests began—boils and carbuncles, twenty in all. I trusted the great Physician. The last one was in my breast and had seven draining holes. My husband insisted that I see a doctor, as the breast was extremely swollen. I said if they would let me pray I would do whatever God said. While I was praying a voice said: "Thou shalt have no healing medicines. I will heal thee of thy wounds."

I had read the Bible through between the date of my new birth and April 1, but I had no idea where those words were. I came from my room and told what God had said. They wanted to know if it was in the Bible. I was afraid I could not find the words but the voice spoke again, "Open the Word." I did, and as the Bible lay open on my lap the words were there before me. Jer. 30:13, 17. The next morning my wound was closed and healing took place. These boils and carbuncles had dragged on from July until December.

When this healing took place, we felt sure the testing was over. But in January I was taken with the "flu," and for eleven weeks could not sing or even talk above a whisper. My body became weakened, and fourteen ulcers broke out on my leg and foot below the knee. The leg was badly swollen and the sores were ugly, to say the least. We finally asked a doctor his opinion. He said he would not dare to touch them; but for me to go home and go to bed for two weeks, when he would graft skin, but he said he feared they never would heal.

That night the friends came in to pray, and I saw a fence all around me, each post being a letter. It spelled, "I AM THE LORD THAT HEALETH THEE." Saturday we unbond the leg and it was healed! That was May 1939. Now, March 5, 1940, whooping cough is raging in our school, and we are standing on Psalm 91:10.

#### Frayed Wings

Many these days may be feeling like a bee with frayed wings. Turmoil, tension, anxiety, sorrow can fray the wings. And yet it is possible to go on flying.

yet it is possible to go on flying. Says one writer: "In any case the bee flies in defiance of the laws of gravity. According to experts she ought not to be able to fly at all: her wing-area is too small. But she does and, furthermore, is one of the swiftest flyers we know. Her 'lungs' permeate her whole body, supplying oxygen to every part, and in the thorax are two huge pipes which can supply unlimited oxygen direct to the wing-muscles. So, small as they are, she can move these wings at incredible speed without fatigue. And when the wings become frayed, she has only to move them a little faster to fly as quickly as she did before. Perhaps my bee, when heavily laden, finds the return journey more laborious than it used to be, that is all."

What if one's flight be a little more



laborious than it used to be because of frayed wings? What does it matter after all? New wings are waiting. They are fashioned already. New powers, vigor, and joy unimaginable today—all this may be ours tomorrow. We shall speed "through new uncharted skies," and till then there is, thank God, that which we see in a figure of the true in the story of the bee: "unlimited oxygen" for the wing-muscles, and for every part of our being.

Breathe on me, Breath of God. Breathe in me. Be power in me, and life, and love, and fortitude, and steadfastness, that I may carry on even with frayed wings. # Latin America, the Land of Missionary Opportunity

(Continued from Page One)

Thank God for this remedy. No matter where it is applied, whether in Alaska or Africa, China or Japan, India or South America, it is all-powerful. "Behold the Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world." Aren't you glad for this glorious message? Have you asked Him to take away the sin of your life?

But notice the whole message. "Taketh away the sin of the world." He died to take away not just your sin and my sin, but the sin of every human being throughout the world.

There are multiplied thousands upon thousands in the world today who know nothing of this remedy. They would gladly give all they possess if they could but find this happiness which we enjoy. The remedy is for all **the world**. So the Lord has commanded us, "Go ye into all **the world** and preach the gospel to every creature." Have we obeyed this command? Let us look into the conditions in the countries of Latin America as they exist today.

In **Mexico**, our nearest neighbor, the need for the gospel is great. Although we thank God for the work that has been done there, statistics show there is only one evangelical believer to every 1,000 of the population. There have been many restrictions against the preaching of the gospel in Mexico, but the present Government is making many changes, and legislation concerning gospel work is going to be debated in the immediate future. Let us pray that more liberty will be given to the gospel in Mexico.

In **Venezuela** one half of the population is really beyond the reach of the present evangelical forces.

**Colombia** has 9,000,000 population and only 2,000 evangelical communicants, after eighty years of missionary effort. About three quarters of the people have no chance of hearing the gospel at present.

**Ecuador,** with over 2,000,000 population, has 750,000 who have no real opportunity of hearing the gospel story. We have no Pentecostal work whatsoever in that country.

**Brazil**, a country larger than the U. S. A., has hundreds of thousands of Christians. The gospel work has met with real success in that land. We find about 50,000 Pentecostal believers there. However, there are still 15,000,000 souls (one third of the total population) living in municipal districts in which there is no evangelical church of any denomination.

**Peru**, the land in which I have just completed my second missionary term, is a great and needy field. The country is larger than Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Arkansas, and Louisiana combined. Roughly speaking, the population is 6,000,000. Half of the population are Spanish-speaking and the other half are Indians.

It is not easy to reach the Indians of Peru. They dwell mostly in the mountains, at altitudes varying from 5,000 to 13,000 feet above sea level. We find their primitive huts grouped in little villages, many times close up to the perpetual snow line—for even at a latitude only ten degrees from the equator, the extreme heights of the mountains which reach as high as 22,000 feet causes them to be snow-covered all year round. Not only is it hard to reach the Indians in the mountains, but there has been the problem of their unwritten language. However, the language has now been reduced to writing, and it is expected that in the near future the gospel will be published in the native Indian tongue.

Among the Spanish-speaking people there has been a good response to the message, and we feel that right now Peru is on the verge of revival. Recent developments in the work have been very encouraging. In one place a man who was saved built a chapel in his own village at his own expense in order to have gospel services. New groups of believers are springing up in many places and calling for someone to help them. We are asking God to raise up many more native workers to answer these calls.

Throughout the republic a number have been baptized in the holy Spirit, but we feel that a mighty outpouring of the Spirit upon the believers is one of the outstanding needs in Peru. Pray with us that it will come very soon.

While Peru was our main field of endeavor,

Mail should be directed to them as follows: Caixa Postal 86, Joinvile, Santa Catarina, Brazil. the Lord has enabled us to travel quite extensively in recent months, visiting eight other South American republics as well. Last August we completed a trip through five countries. Accompanied by Brother Julio Mateluma I covered a total distance of 10,500 miles over all kinds of roads, in a Ford car that was new ten or twelve years ago.

Our primary purpose in setting out upon this tour was to present the gospel to as many people as possible in a way that would impress them most and to leave in their hands the printed Word of God. We decided that the most effective method would be to use lantern slides. So we set out with a set depicting the birth, life, and passion of Christ. We found this a successful method in reaching the largest number of people and breaking down the prejudice created my Roman Catholicism. As we went from place to place showing the slides in the open air, seldom did we address less than 500 people and sometimes the crowds numbered 1,500 to 2,000. After showing a certain number of slides we would stop, ostensibly to let the projector cool, and offer the story of the life of Christ in printed form, which was nothing else than the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, and Proverbs in combined form.

We traveled first from the north of Peru southward to **Chile**, and through Chile to the capital. In this land, though there is no American Assembly of God work, we found a native Pentecostal church which is truly remarkable. The Pentecostal work in Chile is one of the best examples of indigenous work in the history of world missions. From the beginning it has been entirely independent of all other organizations. It has received no financial help from foreign countries, yet the work has gone forward by leaps and bounds until now the Pentecostal is by far the largest evangelical church in Chile. We enjoyed precious fellowship with the brethren there, who in turn seemed to appreciate our visit to the full. However, it would be good for the work in Chile to have the help of some good Bible teacher.

The zeal and boldness of these Chilean believers would put most of us to shame. They form bands of "volunteers" which go from town to town preaching, distributing gospel literature, and doing personal work at every opportunity. Sometimes as many as sixty to eighty men, women, and children will go on one of these extended evangelization trips. They pool their resources, eat from the common pot, and sleep like soldiers wherever night overtakes them. This they do for Jesus' sake.

In some places there are "volunteer cyclists" who go from town to town on bicycles preaching the Word. Their bicycles are dedicated to the Lord, and some refuse to use them for any other purpose than strictly gospel work. When we arrived in Chile one such group of

cyclists had just returned from a preaching trip across the Andes to Argentina. Recently a friend wrote to me telling of a group which made a tour in Argentina, covering some 1,000 miles on bicycles.

Leaving Chile, we crossed the great Andes Mountains into **Argentina**, traveling right across the country to Buenos Aires. We found Argentina a land of great spaces, great cities, and great opportunities. Its area is twice that of Peru, its population more than twice as great. Unlike other Latin-American countries, the people are not fanatically Catholic, but instead they generally assume an attitude of indifference to religion.

Argentina has not responded to the gospel as readily as Brazil, nevertheless there are many good evangelical churches and some well established Pentecostal assemblies. But we found there are cities with populations of 150,000, 140,000, 100,000, 60,000, and many of 40,000 and 30,000 that have no Pentecostal work whatever. Avellanada, a city of over half a million people, has no resident Pentecostal missionary. Argentina is, to my mind, one of the great challenges of Latin America. In one section there is just one Pentecostal missionary among 3,000,000 people. In the interior there are vast fields practically untouched by the gospel. One missionary leader says that in some eight provinces of the interior where the population is nearly 300,000 there is virtually no evangelical work of any denomination.

On a brief visit to **Uruguay** we found in Montevideo a live Pentecostal assembly, though it is only about two years old. There are also several works in the interior. Pentecostal work in Uruguay, as in Paraguay, is new and needs much prayer. In these two countries there are real opportunities to prove that the gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation. A missionary who recently visited Paraguay told me of moral conditions that I cannot describe.

We traveled through northern Argentina into **Bolivia**, the mountain republic. Like Argentina, it is a field that has been very unresponsive to the gospel. This is not due to a lack of missionaries, however, for there are many laboring in Bolivia. The Bolivian Indian Mission is doing good work. Our Scandinavian Pentecostal brethren who have a center in Santa Cruz in the eastern lowlands are also doing wonderful work.

In the interior of Bolivia a very interesting Pentecostal work is being carried on among the native Indians. There is an encampment to which natives are brought from the jungles and provided with clothing, food, plots of ground to cultivate, and schooling for the children. Above all, the Word of God is taught. It is touching to hear these native Indians praying fervently, with tears streaming down their faces, and to realize what the grace of God has done for them. Some of them have received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

In San Andres, Bolivia, as at other places on our trip, we encountered opposition from the Roman Catholic church. A priest who had been drinking tried to hinder us from showing our slides. Finding he could not interrupt the meeting, he ordered dirt thrown on the motor to stop it. This cut off our light. So Brother Mateluma went back to the motor to see what he could do to fix it, while I stayed by the things at the table.

I was not concerned for Brother Mateluma's personal safety for he was an ex-boxer and well able to take care of himself. But he had a quick temper and had often been heard to say: "There is one thing I cannot do—if anyone ever hits me on one cheek, I will not turn the other; I will hit him back." So I was praying silently, "Lord, help Brother Mateluma; give him patience."

#### Healing of Arturo Espinoza, Native Chilean Pastor

Arturo Espinoza weighed less than 100 pounds. The doctors had pronounced him in the last stages of tuberculosis, with only a piece of one lung left, and had told him he could not live more than five days. Instead of going right to bed as most of us might have done to conserve the remaining spark of life and perhaps live six days instead of five, Arturo immediately went to an open-air meeting and preached on the street corner. He then returned to the mission, knelt at the altar and told the Lord he was not going to give up till God healed him.

Some visiting brethren at the church that night had a vision. They saw an angel with a basin in one hand and a surgical instrument in the other who approached Arturo as he knelt at the altar, opened up his back, took out the piece of a lung and put in two new lungs. When Arturo arose from his knees he was completely healed.

About two days later he went back to the doctor who had previously examined him. The doctor was astonished to see a man walk in whom he expected to be in a dying condition by this time, and still more astonished to find after examining him that the lungs were perfectly well, with no trace of tuberculosis. The astonished physician called in ten other doctors who also examined Arturo and pronounced him absolutely well.

Today that same man weighs over two hundred pounds. He is in perfect health, but the best part is that the Lord has used him to raise up an assembly in Chile which has about six hundred members.

As they were arguing and the priest was trying to send us away, one man gave the motor a kick and knocked it over. Brother Mateluma stooped to pick it up. As he did so, the priest gave him a resounding blow on the cheek. He straightened up, turned to the priest, and said: "Thank you. Now you may have the other cheek." Then addressing the priest further he said: "With that same hand with which you bless your parishioners you are wounding your neighbor. God will hold you responsible for this." The priest turned pale and commenced to tremble. The people began to take Brother Mateluma's side, and the priest was forced to leave. The service continued without interruption. We celebrated a double victory that night.

Passing through Bolivia we returned to Peru. We had been gone nine and a half months, during which time we had preached almost every night. We had reached many thousands who had never heard the gospel before, and had sold altogether about 36,000 Scripture portions, including Bibles and Testaments.

In addition to the results of our gospel ministry, I believe that this extended tour has been of real value in giving as somewhat of an insight into the work that is being done in these various Latin-American countries and an acquaintance with the need of the field as a whole.

The need is great. There remaineth yet much ground to be possessed. What are we going to do about it? Jesus has died that all the people of Latin America might have everlasting life. He has also given us commandment to go into all the world and preach the good news to every creature. And the Scripture says, "To him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin."

The need of Latin America right now is for men. Courageous, consecrated, Spirit-filled men are needed, who will go into these whitened harvest fields. Why aren't there more men who will go to South America for Christ? They will go there for oil. They will go there for gold. They will go there for research. They will go there for the sake of aviation. Why don't more men go for Christ?

After reading certain books by missionary leaders and in the light of my own observations, I have come to the conclusion that Latin America needs men and women filled with the Spirit who are successful in raising up worthy works for God in this country or whatever they may be. Latin America does not need workers who will barely be able to pastor some little primitive church. They don't send workers of that quality down there for oil, or gold, or research, or aviation. They send only experts. Latin America needs expert workers for Christ. It needs qualified men who will go down there and build for God. I spoke to one of our well-known Pente-

I spoke to one of our well-known Pentecostal missionaries recently about this and he agreed with me. "That is just what we need qualified workers," he said, "but they won't pay the price." Our most successful pastors and evangelists won't pay the price to take the gospel to the mission field! Shame!

For the sake of example, I want to mention the believers that are in the land of Korea. It is one of the most remarkable works in the history of foreign missions. It is completely self-supporting. At one place they have 6,000 in the Sunday School; at another they have 4,000; at four or five others they have 900. All in all, they have over 200,000 in Sunday school in Korea every Sunday. Although the people are very poor, they send out gospel missionaries to other countries. Every minister is a volunteer for foreign service. Whenever the missionary committee wants a missionary, it looks over the field and selects the minister who is most suitable for the particular need and asks him to leave for missionary work. Not one minister has ever refused to (Continued on Page Twelve)

#### IN HOLLAND

If they had used it for God, they would have had "treasures in heaven . . where thieves do not break through nor steal," but now their money has gone into the Nazi war chest!

#### CHRISTIAN JEWS IN EUROPE

According to a report which a writer in the *Evangelical Christian*, on returning from Europe, vouches for as authentic, more than a million and a quarter Jews in Europe have accepted Christ during the past twenty years. Since the beginning of the war 24,000 Jews in Hungary have genuinely been converted; in Poland, 22,000. He states that these have not become Christians in order to escape persecution. These are genuine conversions, and their ranks are constantly growing.

#### BIBLES FOR TURKEY

Turkey today is vastly different from the Turkey of a generation ago. Its laws, its customs, its educational system, the status of its women all these have been Westernized. The one condition which has not changed is the grip of Mohammedanism upon its people. But God's Word can free them. Recently a radical change in the Turkish alphabet was suddenly ordered by the government. This requires a new revision of the Turkish Bible and the American Bible Society is working now to meet this need of the modern Turks.

#### CHAPELS FOR THE ARMY

The War Department has just announced that 604 new chapels will be built in military posts and camps throughout the country at a cost of \$12,-816,880. Twenty-six such chapels are already in use, supervised by chaplains. Twenty-seven of the country's 261 denominations are already represented by chaplains, and by June of this year 1,500 chaplains will be in service. Preachers of any denomination who can qualify according to the Government's high standards may become chaplains. The larger the denomination, the more chaplains it will be allowed.

#### AMERICA AT THE CROSSROADS

"The need of the hour is not more factories or materials, not more railroads or steamships, not more armies or more navies, but rather more education based on the teaching of Jesus," says Roger Babson. "The prosperity of our country depends on the motives and purposes of the people. These motives and purposes are directed in the right course only through religion.

"We stand at the crossroads. We must choose between God and Mammon. Materialism is undermining our civilization as it has undermined other civilizations. Unless we heed the warning in time and get back to the real fundamentals, we must fall even as the civilizations of Egypt, Greece, and Rome fell—and for the same reason.

"Statistics of every nation indicate that true religion is the power necessary for the development of its resources, and for its successful continuation. The challenge goes out to every man to support his church, to take an active part in the religious life of his community, to live according to the simple principles upon which this, the greatest country in the world, was founded three hundred years ago."

#### DANCING INSTEAD OF PREACHING

The Minneapolis Star Journal on a recent Sunday announced that a "program of modern dances" would be given that day at 3:30 p. m. in the St. Paul Y. W. C. A. under the auspices of the Y. W. C. A.'s health and recreation department.

The Pilot, Baptist journal of the same city, comments: "How are the mighty fallen! The institution that used to give Sunday afternoons to the winning of souls to Jesus Christ, now deliberately advertising their participation in Satanic service at the same hour! There isn't a living man or woman who knows anything about the modern dance who doesn't know also that it is the devil's device; and to employ the Y. W. C. A. and a Sunday afternoon for such, leaves no deeper descent to be reached."

#### REVIVAL DURING THE "BLITZ"

Pastor Brewster of Cardiff, Wales tells in *Elim Evangel* how a revival continued in spite of the recent air raid. Previously the assembly was having a Holy Ghost visitation. Scores of converts had been registered each month. Then came the "blitz," just as a mid-week service was about to commence. It was a terrible night. The whole city seemed ablaze, and when daylight came quite a number had lost their homes, including some in the assembly. However, not one of their members was killed or injured, and their place of worship escaped.

It was feared that at Cardiff, as in other towns where there has been a "blitz," people would be afraid to congregate for night services. However, the following Sunday evening 250 gathered, and when the altar call was given nine accepted Christ.

#### GIDEONS' GREAT GOAL

The Gideons are setting out to raise \$1,250,000 so that they may distribute 5,000,000 Bibles among the men of the American Army and Navy within the next four years. This is a great undertaking. Since the beginning of this Christian business men's organization many years ago the total number of Bibles it has placed in hotels, hospitals, penal institutions, and schools is but 1,823,769 (up to the end of 1940). However, multitudes of Christians will stand behind them in this splendid project, for a Bible should be the most important part of every soldier's or sailor's outfit.

#### BIBLES IN CHINA

"Almost every missionary in China," writes the British and Foreign Bible Society's secretary for China, "has been awed and impressed by the way in which, throughout the whole country, thousands of people of all classes have turned to the Bible to discover what it has to say on such questions as pain and sorrow; loving one's enemies and returning good for evil; how to find peace and security; where to discover comfort and inspiration in a world which has tumbled to pieces." Satanic forces are working throughout the world, but surely the Holy Spirit is working mightily too.

#### REASONS FOR CRIME

An investigation has been made into the crimes of the inmates of the Southern Michigan State Prison, the country's largest and most modern penal institution. It revealed that in 63 per cent of the cases the men were under the influence of liquor when they committed their crimes. Other findings were: over 90 per cent of the inmates admit the excessive use of liquor; over 68 per cent had alcoholic fathers; 82.5 per cent were not gainfully employed at the time of their crimes; and 87 per cent had unstable and abnormal home conditions. Another thing that contributed greatly to their fall is the fact that 66 per cent had no record of any church attendance whatever. The downward path seems to start at a broken home, to lead down the street of idleness, to detour around the church and into the saloons instead, and finally end at a prison gate and, what is infinitely worse, the entrance into a black eternity from which there is no release.

#### CHALLENGING FACTS

"We are told that there are 800 closed churches in New England alone, and that among the 7,000 ordained ministers of that area only 1,000 believe in an authoritative, infallible Bible and in the deity and atonement of Christ," says Paul W. Rood. "We are told that there are 10,000 villages in America without a church, and 30,-000 villages without a resident pastor.

"The city problem in our land should cause us concern. Los Angeles has 1,000,000 people untouched by any sort of religious influence. New York has 4,000,000 people who are unchurched; Pittsburgh, 250,000; Cleveland, 400,000; St. Louis, 300,000; Minneapolis, 300,000; Seattle, 250,000; San Francisco, 425,000. In San Francisco only five per cent belong to Protestant churches.

"Only eight per cent of the people of our nation attend services on Sunday morning, and two per cent Sunday evenings. About forty per cent of the American people are on church registers, but only twenty-nine per cent ever attend church at all."

### SIX HUNGRY JEWISH WOMEN

Sister Jeanette Fox, a converted Jewess who is working with the Assemblies of God Hebrew Mission in Chicago, had an encouraging experience recently. She writes: "A member of the Stone Church gave me the address of a Jewish woman who was just convalescing from a serious illness and who had submitted to the assistance of a Christian Scientist practitioner. I went to her home, praying that God might use me to establish her faith in the Word of God separate from all teachings that lead away from true salvation. She was sitting up, and a number of her friends were there. One lady was knitting, and the others were conversing together. At first I felt help-less, being a stranger, and with all these guests present. I told her of my knowledge of her sickness and my joy that she was recovering, and she expressed her gratitude and accepted my offer to return later when she did not have other visitors.

"In the natural there was nothing to do but simply leave. But thank God for the wonderful Helper He has sent to us! I turned to the other women, and just gave them my name. Soon I was being introduced to each of them. One of them asked me the purpose of my visit. I told her that the world was filled with the questions of why there are such conditions, and when they would end, and I believed I had found the answer to that question. "What is the answer?" she asked. I replied, 'That God will soon send the Messiah, and that this Messiah is the very same Jesus who was here before.'

"To my glad surprise, all the women began to exchange favorable opinions, saying, 'See, haven't I told you?' 'How do we know but that Jesus is our Messiah?' etc. It was at the end of my day and I had only one New Testament left, but upon telling them I could secure more for them, they each requested one, and I left with the marvel in my soul at the goodness of the Lord in leading me to six receptive, hungry souls, on my way to find one!"

# SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

#### Seven-Year Whole-Bible Course

#### Jesus and His Mother

Lesson for May 11, 1941. Lesson Text: Luke 1: 26-33; 2:41-51; John 2:1-4; 19:25-37; Mark 3:31-35.

There could not be a sweeter or more profitable study for Mother's Day than the life of the mother of Jesus, the way He treated her, and the lessons she brings to us. The church of Rome has placed her in a wrong position as mediator between Christ and us; and our recoil against Mariolatry (the worship of Mary) has made most of us Protestants forget the honor and respect we owe her. The one and only command she has left us is, "Whatsoever HE saith unto you, do it." Let us see to it that we obey her.

#### THE MOTHER CHOSEN

God had promised in Gen. 3:15 that the coming

Redeemer (seed of a woman) should conquer Satan; and from that time the devil's enmity was specially directed against all women, because in each one of them he saw the potential mother of his Conqueror. When the fulness of the time was come, after the saints of four thousand years had prayed and waited for His Coming (Gen. 49:18; Luke 2:25, 38), God entrusted to Gabriel the high honor of announcing His birth. The chosen woman was a pure, simple maiden of Nazareth, a picturesque village in Galilee. Her name was Mary (a lineal descendant of the royal house of David), and she was betrothed to a God-fearing carpenter named Joseph, who seems to have been much older than she was. The archangel addressed her as "highly favored" or graciously accepted-a word which disclaims all worthiness on her part and emphasizes God's grace which chose her. She was told that by the Holy Spirit's power overshadowing her she would have a son whose name would be Jesus (Saviour), who would save from sin all who came to Him.


#### HER FAITH TESTED

Up to the age of twelve Jesus lived with His mother, her husband Joseph, and the younger children (Mark 6:3) in the carpenter's shop at Nazareth. We are told that the example He set to His brothers and sisters was that of constant obedience. He would be the first to learn Joseph's trade; and we

can imagine His joy when He succeeded in making His first article of furniture, perhaps something His mother needed for their little home. He was the one Son who never gave His parents an anxious moment, and who never failed in His gratitude, obedience, and devotion to them. But at the age of twelve a change came. He went to the Passover feast at Jerusalem, and was left behind by His mother, who on returning to the capital found Him still in the Temple, attending the classes of the rabbis, who were astonished at His understanding and knowledge of the Bible. When she gave Him a mild reproof, He asked: "Wist (Knew) ye not that I must be about My Father's business?" Mary had spoken of Joseph as His father-but He had to make clear to them both that God, His Father in heaven, was to guide and control His life, and that He could no longer be wholly taken up with the carpenter work. This must have been a real test to Mary; but she accepted it, and little by little the ministry of her divine Son and the purpose for which He had come to this world dawned upon her. As she meditated and prayed, her faith in His Messiahship grew.

#### HER FAITH STRENGTHENED

When Jesus was thirty years old He went out from the home and began His public ministry. Joseph had probably passed away, and the younger sons had grown up; but as the latter did not believe in Jesus and were resisting the pleading of God's Spirit, (Psalm 69:8) it is evident that His mother would be happier with Him, even in His wanderings and persecutions, than living with any of them. The first miracle (John 2:1-11) gives us another glimpse of His mother. It was probably the wedding of one of her close relatives, as she was helping to prepare the feast. She had not as yet seen her Son perform any miracles, but as her faith in Him grew she quietly made known to Him the need, and then saw how abundantly He supplied it. Jesus is



still the same miracle-worker. Bring all your family problems to Him, all the joys and all the sorrows. He can turn the water of earth into the wine of heaven, the tears of sorrow into the shouts of joy.

#### HER FAILURE REPROVED

Only on one occasion do we find Mary on the wrong side, hindering instead of helping her Son. We can well understand how the natural, mother love would make her worry over His tireless labors, watchings, fastings, and long journeys on foot. So she joined His younger brothers and went after Him to call Him home. All His life He had been obedient to her and had never failed to care for her and serve her in every way; but now He had to show her (even as He did at the age of twelve) that His duty to His heavenly Father must come first. So He looked around on the group of believers seated beside Him, and said, "These are My mother and My brethren." Those who obey Him are the closest to Him. Paul expressed our duty to earthly parents thus: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord." Fathers and mothers are to be given honor and obedience in everything that does not conflict with our

duty to our Father in heaven. Mary learned this lesson-that she could not control her divine Son in the fulfilment of His heavenly mission, even though He was wearing Himself out and her mother heart could not but suffer with Him.

#### HER STEADFASTNESS REWARDED

Jesus' final act of filial devotion took place while He was hanging in excruciating agony on the cross. He saw His mother standing near. She was then going through what the aged Simeon had prophesied at the presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple: "Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also." Luke 2:35. Forgetful of His own sufferings, Jesus cast a look of tender love on her, saying, "Woman (a term of respect, equivalent to our "lady"), behold thy son!" Then turning His eyes to John, His beloved disciple, He "Behold thy mother !" From that hour John took her to his own home and cared for her as a sacred charge left to him by his Lord. Mary was human like the rest of us, and she needed human help and comfort. There is, however, one remarkable thing we may note about her, which applies also to Mary of Bethany. It is that neither of them are mentioned as going

to the tomb to embalm the body of Jesus. We should have expected them to be the first to go, as they were the two who loved Him most.

If we couple this with what Jesus said about Mary's ointment of spikenard, that she had kept it for His burial, it seems that she had comprehended more of His teaching than any of the apostles. Instead of keeping that precious ointment any longer, when the glorious truth dawned on her that He would rise again from the dead, she poured it out upon Him while He still lived, and He gave her words of special commendation. May it not be that both she and Mary his mother were then *expecting* that resurrection, and so did not sorrow as the others did? They were not surprised nor incredulous, but their faith had risen to the level of expectation. So naturally they would not be found among those who went to embalm the sacred body, for they knew that it would leave the tomb.

Let us learn from these humble women to take the Bible as saying just what it means and meaning exactly what it says. It is to the childlike, simple heart that God can reveal His deepest truths. Matt. 11:25. From Mary's whole life we may draw the lesson of instant, implicit obedience to the will of God. It is summed up in her response to Gabriel's message:

"Behold the handmaid of the Lord: be it unto me according to thy word." Every mother who takes this attitude before God can claim the fulfillment of His will in the salvation of every member of her family. Although Mary's younger children did not believe on Jesus at first, after His resurrection we find them saved and seeking the Baptism with the Holy Spirit along with their mother. Acts 1:14. To every young couple starting out in their new home, let us recommend not only the honoring of mother and respectful attention to her advice, but also strict obedience to the only command left us by the mother of Jesus: "Whatsoever HE saith unto you, do it." answer the call yet. They asked a pastor who had a congregation of 1,000 people to leave and go to China as a missionary. Did he refuse? No, he wanted to go. May God give us the same spirit in our movement in America.

Isn't such a plan Biblical? Someone answers, "But I don't have a call." How is that? Don't you believe God's Word? It gives the com-mand, "Go." The question I would ask you is, Do you have a call to stay home? Since Christ has commanded you to go, you need a special call to stay home.

Is it possible that the love of fine automobiles, comfortable homes, modern conveniences, is greater than our love for Christ and our love for souls? God have mercy upon us, if that be the case.

Someone might answer, "But I might not be able to come back home." What of it? When When a soldier answers the call of his country and goes away to active service, is he given any promise about coming home? No, the command is to go; nothing is said about returning. Haven't you thrilled as you read recently of these suicide squads overseas who will hold on in the face of certain death? They voluntarily give their lives because they love their country and their cause. Is our cause less Do we love our Christ less than these worthy? soldiers love their countries? Where are the heroes of the Cross? Oh, may God stir us up.

Some refuse to leave their parents or friends. It is evident that they love them more than they love Christ, and the Lord has already given His divine sentence concerning such: "He that loveth father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after Me, is not worthy of Me."

It is said that about 60,000,000 people in Latin America, our nearest neighbors, have no fair chance of hearing the gospel. Are we going to let such conditions continue? Is it possible that we are unconcerned? May God grant that we may catch a new vision and make a new consecration and say, "Lord, if I can be fitted into your work in any of these countries, here am I, send me. I'll go where you want me to go; I'll leave what you ask me to leave; I'll be what you want me to be, and say what you want me to say. I am yours to follow wherever you may lead."

#### BEARING CHEERFULLY

The highest achievement of charity is to love our enemies; but to bear cheerfully with our neighbor's failings is scarcely an inferior grace. It is easy enough to love those who are agreeable and obliging-what fly is not attracted by sugar and honey? But to love one who is cross, perverse, tiresome, is as unpleasant a process as chewing pills. Nevertheless, this is the real touch-stone of brotherly love. 
