cATURE is full of spiritual parables, with none lovelier perhaps than the heaven-soaring eagle-the golden and imperial eagles are the two species most abundant in the Holy Land-as an emblem of the redeemed soul.

The eagle is built for flight, and supremely for upward flight. "An eagle," says Solomon, "flieth TOWARD HEAVEN." Prov. $23: 5$, R.V. Its anatomy combines strength, lightness and power. The cylindrical structure of the bones and feathers gives a balloonlike effect, so that when the wings are spread in flight, the tendency is upward instead of downward, and the body is buoyed up in air: It is so constructed as to overcome hostile forces and currents in the heavenly places.

Built for heaven, and far outstripping every other bird in ascending power, the eagle will continue soaring in tireless flight where none can see it but God. "God, being rich in mercy . . . raised us up with Him (Christ), and made us to sit with Him in the heavenly places." Eph. 2:4-6, R.V. Purer air ; clearer vision; untroubled quiet; rare landscape; cloudless sunshine-what a home!
"I have watched an eagle," says Seton Gordon, an authority on eagles, "commence to mount when just above the tree tops, and with never a movement of the wings reach a height so great as to be invisible to the eyeand for an eagle to be invisible it must be, at a conservative estimate, at least eight thousand feet in the air.'

The Christian is not only one who seeks the highest ideals, but who has the power to reach them put into his very bones. Far above every other terrestrial creature, he is so a sharer of the divine nature that he is capable of a life which, in all but infinity of scope, is the life of God.

Solomon said: "There be three things which are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not: the way of an eagle in the air." Prov. 30: 18. How much more wonderful, the way of a Christian in the heavenly places!

The eagle is a solitary bird. Other birds go in flocks; the eagle, never. If two are seen together, they are mates. He is lonely because he is lofty. He is remote from other birds, because no other bird can live where

which belongs (we believe) to no other creature. It is furnished with a double eyelid, the inner one transparent and always drawn over the eye; so that while other birds see in the light of the sun, the eagle SEES the sun. It lives so much in the land of light that God has made it, alone among creatures, to be undazzled, unblinded, by the fount of day. Satan's design is to keep an unsaved soul a hooded, blinded eagle - "in whom the god of this age hath blinded the minds of the unbelieving" to rob them of "the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." 2 Cor. $4: 4,6$. What makes us God's eagles is that we see Christ, the Sun of Righteousness, as $H e$ is.

God is careful in the training of His eagles. The eyrie, or eagle's nest, is generally on the jagged edges of a precipice. The nest of the sea eagle is enormous, sometimes with a diameter of six or eight feet. So Jehovah says: "As an eagle that stirreth up her nest"-pulling the twigs awry and thus irritating the nestlings with the sharp points, and exposing the thorns, or even thrusting the eaglets out of the nest-"that fluttereth over her young, He spread abroad His wings, He took them, He bare them on His pinions." Deut. 32:11. Only by a broken nest, and the apparently heartless precipitation over the precipice, together with the actual testing of the divine power to uphold, can God make strong and developed eagles. And as the mother eagle entices the nestlings outward and upward, or catches them if they flutter dangerously, and spreads her pinions between them and any possible enemy, so God does with His own. Between the arrow and the eaglet is God. Earth is its greatest danger.

But there are times when we shall find a sad, tired, drooping eagle. The bird's power to soar is gone. It is the moulting season. But what does the eagle do? It basks quietly in the sunshine; slowly the plumage returns. And then she "mounts up with wings as eagles," and the extraordinary rapidity of flight and power of ascent comes back. "They shall put forth"says the Greek version of Isaiah 40: 31 - "fresh feathers as the moulting eagle." "Who satisfieth thy mouth

# Not this Worlal's EKind of Peace

Jesus said: "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." John 14:28.
Strange words these, to be spoken under such circumstances and at such a time! How could Christ have peace on that night when He knew that the next day He was to die? He is with His disciples in an upper room in the city of Jerusalem, but through the shuttered windows comes the sound of the restless city. Jerusalem was always restless at the time of the Passover. Multitudes of people flocked there from all the provinces, and in the huge ferment of that gathering the passions of the oppressed and discontented people seethed. There was always the possibility of an outbreak, and the Romans knew it. The soldiers of the Roman procurator patrolled the streets of the city.
A few days before, the multitude had shouted hosanna as Jesus came riding upon an ass into the city. But now the popular mood had turned against Him, since they saw He would not be the kind of king that they desired. The chief priests were plotting His death. In a little while Judas would go out of that upper room to sell his Master to them. In a few hours He would be arrested, tried, mocked, scourged, spit upon, and crucified. With the cross already shadowing Him, how could He be at peace? Yet He was. In Him was quietness and confidence and rest, like the peace of deep waters unstirred by the surface storm.

That night in the upper room was not the first time those who were near Him had been conscious of His great peace and repose. They had been with Him on the lake of Galilee when the great storm broke. They were in desperate peril. and when they turned to the Lord for advice and help. to their amazement He was asleet in the stern of the boat. In their consternation they cried. "Master, carest Thou not that we perish?" When He awoke He was as calm as when He slept. What were they afraid of? Had they already forgotten God, that thev should tremble from the danger? The next thing they knew, the storm was gone. In response to His "Peace, be still," the verv waves quieted down like a babe on its mother's bosom.

They were that night to see Him in Gethsemane when the soldiers of the high priest, with their torches and their swords. burst through the garden gate. He stood there steady and serene, an untroubled figure, and they recoiled as if thev had seen something unearthly. "They went backward," said the evangelist. "and fell to the ground." From the incredible calm of Him who was none other than the Prince of peace standing there, they were flung down as a man is flung back when running in the dark he collides with a mountain face of rock.

Alreadv the disciples had begun to be secretly frightened by the dangers which
were creeping closer to them. Already they were having vague fears of something very terrible about to happen. Jesus knew their thoughts. He knew their need and so He said to them, "My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you."

What is this world's peace which is different from the peace that Christ gives? It is the effort of our own contrivings to adjust our outward circumstances for our protection. If we can only get the things about us adjusted to our advantage, we imagine that we can be contentedly secure.

Caiaphas, the high priest, believed in this world's kind of peace. He was disturbed by the threat of change in the existing conditions which he believed the influence of Christ would bring. If Christ went on teaching the way He did, there might be all sorts of unrest. Caiaphas had no intention of letting that happen. He considered that it was expedient that one man should die rather than that the whole nation should perish. With Christ at liberty disturbances might arise. The Romans would intervene and displace Caiaphas because he had let these disturbances occur. If Christ were put to death, that would be the end to that danger. So Caiaphas reasoned. And in cold blood he set out to make sure that Christ would be crucified. He felt that then there would be peace in Jerusalem.
Pilate desired this world's kind of peace. His peace was to stand on good terms with Caesar. As long as the relationship did not dissolve, and Rome was placid and undisturbed by criticism and complaints against him, he had what he most wanted. When Christ stood before him he knew that there was no fault in Him, but he could not afford to have these Jewish authorities sending a protest against him to the Emperor. So to keep peace, he gave Christ up to be crucified. He washed his hands of the whole business and thought that with this unpleasant problem somehow gotten rid of, he could be secure and in peace.

The rich young ruler who had come to Christ in an earlier day wanted this world's kind of peace. What he really desired when he came to Jesus was to have Him tell him that his life, selfish and unconsecrated as it was, was good enough.

When it comes to a good life, read the 10th chapter of Acts about a good man

named Cornelius. He was a devout man, one that feared God with all his house. He gave much alms. He prayed to God always. He was a just man, one that feared God, and was of good report among all the nation of the Jews. Will not all these things be sufficient? No. He was told by an angel to send for Peter, who "shall tell thee words whereby thou and all thy house shalt be saved.'
Listen! Our goodness, our reputation, our praying, our giving alms, our attending church, will not in themselves give us an entrance into God's kingdom. There is only one way and that is Christ. And that is the way Peter made known unto Cornelius. His message at Caesarea was one of "preaching peace by Jesus Christ." Acts $10: 36$. "He is our peace." Eph. 2:14. Cornelius and his household received Jesus and the peace that He brings; and when they received this free gift from God there was poured upon them the gift of the Holy Ghost.
Returning to this rich young ruler, we find that he did not follow Christ ; he turned away. He was not obedient to the words of Christ and did not follow Him. He doubtless thought that peace could be bought by his wealth. No, a thousand times no, you cannot buy this peace, it is the gift of God. "By grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." Eph. 2:8, 9.
Christ spoke of a rich man who purposed to pull down his barns, rebuild them, and fill them with his crops. That man thought he had everything he needed, and that he could take his ease, eat, drink, and be merry; then surely, he would have an enjoyable peace. But he forgot he had a soul. God spoke to him, "Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee." That kind of false peace will be shockingly disturbed at the coming of the death angel.

There are many today who think it is possible to buy the world's peace if they can be sufficiently shrewd and successful. For awhile they may prosper like the men described in the 73rd Psalm: "They have more than heart could wish." They "prosper in the world and increase in riches." But their false peace is shortlived. The Psalmst sees their end. They are cast down to desolation and destruction in a moment. Psalm 73:18-19.
A man may think, as Pilate did, that he can gain this world's peace if he can keep himself personally in favor. He holds a political office, or a good position in an industrial corporation. Or he may be a minister, holding convictions which he knows are not in accordance with the prevailing point of view in his church, but which in the depths of his soul he knows to be an echo of the voice of God. But he must please his superiors to make sure that no damaging protest is lodged against himself. His temptation is to keep silent when he knows he ought to speak. He argues that after all, it is better to avoid
fomenting unpleasant controversy. Men do not like disturbers of their peace. And so in order to maintain the kind of peace that the world gives, there is compromise, and the holder of the political office or executive position will compromise with evil or the minister will compromise in his convictions.

The trouble is, there is a point at which this world's peace fails. There are some contingencies against which it has no defense. If a man for the sake of his own position or professional interest has been guilty of what he knows to be a sordid thing, he cannot guarantee peace in his own private conscience. If a man has stifled his own conscience in order not to disturb his standing with those whose favor he needs, there comes into his heart a deep sense of unrest. His heart is like a troubled sea.
'Not as the world giveth, give I unto you." The world's gifts are always uncertain. Beneath the bright alluring surface which time may soon wear off, are the ashes of disappointment. The world can give smooth appearances; it can give superficial and temporal achievements; but it cannot give a dependable and settled peace. Nothing that this world has to offer can satisfy like the peace of God. That can only come through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Lord says in Ezekiel 18:4, "All souls are Mine." Money, mansions, magnificent cars, or anything else that this world has to offer cannot and will not ever satisfy the hungry souls of men. Some think that by traveling to some other locality they can get peace and satisfaction. Some try to get delight in amusements. Before I was saved I would go to as many as three shows in one day, trying to find the satisfaction that my hungry soul was starving for, but I could not find it there. God said, "All souls are Mine." And because all souls belong to God, nothing that the world has to offer can satisfy the hungry soul but God alone. He alone through His Son Jesus Christ can satisfy the longing heart.

Over against this "world's kind of peace" there stands THE PEACE which the Lord Jesus Christ promised. That peace must begin with an inner experience. A wheel cannot turn steadily if the axle is loose. A man's life can never be right until in very truth Christ is dwelling in that heart. When trials come, and hardships, and misunderstandings, when it seems as though all the world is against you and the tumult in your heart seems unbearable, then it is that the living Christ within "stilleth the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves. and the tumult." Psalm $65: 7$.

There is no torment equal to the torment of inner unrest. A man can be in a room all alone. It may be very quiet, but the restless, wretched, miserable condition within his soul causes him to become utterly miserable. The noise within is worse than if a group of children were pounding on drums. Oh, if he only knew Jesus Christ, who alone can satisfy and bring a deep settled peace. In Him alone is peace. If we keep our minds stayed on Him, He will keep us in perfect peace. If we make known our needs to Him with thanksgiving, His peace, which passeth all understanding, will garrison our hearts and minds.

Go out and look into the sky at night time and what do you see? Quiet. There

us take time to linger in His presence, and we shall find that we too have received the contagion of His triumphant spirit. He will give us a peace which the world cannot give, a peace within and without.

## Connection with the Source of Power

"Pray without ceasing." 1 Thess. 5:17. clEBUCHADNEZZAR was given a dream, a dream which he forgot. None of his wise men could tell him the dream nor interpret it. But Daniel and his companions prayed, and the dream and interpretation were given to Daniel in a night vision. When we give ourselves to prayer we may be assured that the promise of Christ concerning the Holy Spirit will be fulfilled. "He will show you things to come." John 16:13.
Daniel told the king the dream and the interpretation. The image he had seen in his dream represented the kingdoms of the world from his day until the ushering in of the kingdom of God.

In the latter days the image was so deteriorated that the feet were but iron and clay, though the head was gold. Evolution from the lower to the higher is not taught here. That erroneous doctrine is not taught in the Scriptures of truth. The Word of God shows evil men and seducers waxing worse and worse.

The ten toes were to be of iron and clay. It was miry clay! Slippery clay! And this great image was supported by this deteriorated foundation!

When was it to be? In the latter days. Men do not see it. Why? Because they do not believe the Word, and they will not take the trouble to inquire of it. Men take infinite pains to find out the secrets in the air, on the earth, in the sea, and under the earth, but as to the times and seasons in God's plan for the world, they do not take the trouble to study these things. They are interested to learn about the construction of the earth, but not interested to find out what God says about the destruction of the earth and of the kingdoms of the world.

him through to the mission station, where he lay sick for some time. The blood congealed and caused great pain until, in answer to prayer, the wound burst, the blood shot out, and a lump of rotten, stinking stuff came away.

For a long time Filemone lay ill and weak. The people of the village where he was working said he was dead. Rumor even had it that he was buried! But the Christians were praying him back to life. Away there at N - the Maleka leader publicly announced that he had killed the evangelist by his spells, that he was dead and buried, and that the people need not worry any more about the gospel but had better all join his evil society. He ended by saying, somewhat dramatically. "If there be a God, may He strike me dead."
Against the strong protestations of his family, the evangelist, when well enough to travel, insisted on making straight back to his field of labor. He called all the people together and told them of the power of God. The people at first thought they saw a ghost, and hardly dared to come near till they realized he was actually flesh and blood. Then they crowded round to hear his wonderful story of God's power and deliverance.

The next thing he did was to go and see the Maleka man again, and sat and talked to him of the things of God. The man was somewhat discomfited after all his empty threats and boastings. A crowd gathered round at the astonishing sight of the evangelist pleading in love with the man who had admitted making murderous spells and charms. Any one of them in similar circumstances would not have hesitated to let fly a poisoned arrow or two.

Shortly afterwards the man who had defied God and threatened his servant fell suddenly sick. At once Filemone went to visit him and pray with him. Again he talked with him about his soul, and at last the man listened. Again and again the evangelist went to visit him and talked and prayed with him, and pleaded with him to get saved. The man admitted his sin and said he would believe-but didn't. Time slipped by and the poor creature wasted away and died miserably, unsaved and unhappy. Filemone went to mourn and to sympathize with the relatives, and used the occasion as an opportunity to witness and drive home the message of the gospel.

ARE YOU TIRED OF THAT BURDEN?


The people were so struck with the fact that the man who said he would kill the other was the one who died, and that the threatened and persecuted man returned no vengeance but love and sympathy, that they flocked to hear the gospel. One after another got saved till the place was in revival. Meetings were crowded; the church was too small. Four meetings were held nightly in different parts of the village. Other villages were opened by consecrated young fellows, and revival fires burned with exceptional brightness for two or three years and a large harvest of souls was gathered in.

## The Faithful Shepherd

Christ the Shepherd knows each individual sheep. Horace Bushnell says that Jesus is not the keeper of a hive of bees, knowing well the hive but not knowing any particular bee in it; but He is the keeper of a flock of sheep, knowing not only the flock, but every sheep in it.
Mr. Moody used to have a suggestive word, which he was fond of repeating, as to how the shepherd knows the sheep. Someone asked a shepherd that question, and he laughed as he answered. "You see that sheep has a bit out of its ear, and that sheep walks a little lame, and that sheep has lost a patch of wool: I know them by their defects."
Even after our most rapturous experience is it not true that the Lord will know us by our defects? At best we are a lame lot. But it is good to think that He knows us by our graces too-the graces He Himself has bestowed upon us.
I was in a business meeting a few months ago where in a pause for praise and prayer a man sang with rapture in his face, eyes shut, and the glory shining through. He was quite unconscious of it, but I shall always remember that man in future by the transfiguring light of that moment. I think the Lord knows us too by the graces that He bestows upon us.-W. Y. "Lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." Matt. 28:20.

Who is this that thus speaks? Who is he that can make such a claim? As we look at the preceding verse we read, Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth." Oh, who is speaking-declaring himself omnipotent and always present? This is the One whom these eleven listening disciples had seen mocked and scourged and crucified as a weak man in the hands of rough, cruel enemies. This is He whose wounded, dead body had lain three days in the tomb. But this is He who had risen from the tomb, whom no power of earth or hell could hold in death. This is He whom we love and worship-this is Jesus, Son of God, who calmly and positively declares His omnipotence, and His constant, abiding presence to that worshiping, some-doubting group. v. 17. And reader, to which part of that group do you be-long-the worshipers or the doubters?

Jesus had made Himself of no reputation (He had emptied Himself, R. V.) had taken upon Himself the form of a servant, was made in the likeness of men; and being found in fashion as a man, He humbled Himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted Him and given Him a name which is above every name; that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven and things in earth and things under the earth; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Phil. 2:7-11.

Ah yes, without a shadow of doubt He could stand forth in His resurrected body and say, "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth," and, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the age." The devil could not come to Him with an, "If thou be the Son of God." He was proven to be the Son of God by His resurrection from the dead, and every claim He makes is a true claim.

When Jesus spoke these words He was speaking to those who were living at the beginning of this age-this age of grace; but looking down through the centuries of
this age He said, "I am with you even unto the end of the age." That is where we are today, close to the very end of the age. And what a time it is! We are aware of end conditions-the apostasy, the fierce struggling of the nations, the unrest of individuals, the breaking down of morals, lack of conscience, etc., etc. Put in all the awful things you can think of, make it as black as you will, Jesus says, even then, even unto the end of the age I am with you.

All through the Old Testament we find the Lord promised especially to be with those to whom He gave difficult tasks. To Moses He said, "Certainly I will be with thee." Ex. 3:12. And we notice Moses, faithful, old Moses, 120 years old, talking to Joshua in the sight of all Israel, telling him with that assurance that comes to those who walk long with God, that in the stupendous task which is before him of leading the children of Israel across Jordan into the promised land, "The Lord thy God, He it is that doth go with thee; He will not fail thee nor forsake thee." Deut. 31:6-8. And later, when Moses was gone, the Lord says to Joshua, "As I was with Moses so will I be with thee." Josh. 1:5. Joshua knew full well how God had been with Moses. What a promise now for him to receive from his God!

Through Isaiah we read, "I will be with thee." "I will not forsake thee." "I will be with thee when thou passest through the waters, and through the rivers they shall not overflow thee; when thou walkest through the fire thou shalt not be burned, neither shall the flame kindle upon thee." "What!" you say, "Waters and fire, if God is really with us?" Yes, but He hath said, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee, so that we may boldly say, The Lord is my Helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me." Heb. 13:5, 6.

But in these words of Jesus, "Lo, I am with you alway," there is a deeper meaning, a more intimate, vital connection with our inner life. It means more than guidance and protection. What is He saying? How much may we Scripturally claim in this promise? He is saying, I am with you as the living, all-powerful Christ, having gone down into death for you, having met the enemy of your souls, the old master who had the power over your lives. I am the slain Lamb of God for you, but I am alive now, full of power, to be connected always with your life. The "with you" here, in the light of New Testament teaching, means "within you."
"I am with you," then, the Redeemer Saviour, the One who has dealt with your sin, taking it away by the cross (Col. 1:14); purchasing you by My own shed blood. 1 Peter 1:18-19. "You are mine, I am with you always as your complete Saviour from $\sin$. I am with you, within you, the Conqueror, the great Victor, the One who overcame the devil, that determined foe of all mankind." Not only as the One who did conquer is He with us, but as the One who daily conquers in us. He is our conquering
life. As such He is our Lord, the One who dominates and controls our lives. Self has to move and give Him the inner throne of our life. Then we can speak the words of Rom. 8:37, "We are more than conquerors through Him that loved us.'

We are not fighting the enemy in our puny strength. We have the Conqueror of the ages within us. One day I saw some boys getting ready to torment a smaller boy. a frail boy. The enemy boys had stones to throw and were running in a threatening way to attack. Not as the one to condemn us, to pick flaws and misunderstand us; but as the One who truly loves us, who lifts us up above the shadows; with whom we may constantly commune. "I will sup with Him and He with me," is the promise He makes to anyone who will ler Him have this "within always" relation.
I am within you as your strength, your health. I am the life. John 14:6. If He has all power in heaven and in earth, He has power over disease. We may count on Him as our Healer and our daily strength. He has compassion today, as He is within us, life for spirit, mind and body, the mighty Enabler ior every task. Phil. 4: 13. He is within us always as our peace, our righteousness, our wisdom, our sanctification, patience, courage, love-everything holy and victorious that we need. 1 Cor. 1: $30 ;$ Col. 2:9, 10.
He is within us, our hope of glory. Col. $1: 27$. What is your hope of glory? Is it your holiness, your self-sacrifice, your anything? No! It is this all-powerful, allpresent Christ. He is not within you silent, indifferent, asleep; but active, loving, potent -the most real One in life.
How does all this become actual? By the power of the Holy Spirit and by faith. It is not merely theory-it may become fact. Jesus meant it to be fact when He spoke His promises. As we read the Acts and see the Apostles, these men who heard these marvelous words of Jesus, after the Holy Ghost was poured out upon them, they were not grieving for the physical presence of Jesus. They knew He was alive; they knew He was with them, in them by His Spirit, and they moved out in happy, confident, fruitful service, and joyous certainty. They had Jesus in His heavenly presence in a far deeper sense than they had ever known Him in His physical presence. He was so real and powerful to them they could tell all sinners there was remission of sins in His Name. They could tell the lame to rise and walk in His Name. They knew He was with them every moment, with His allpower in heaven and earth. And so may we know the same today. Jesus' words have lost none of their meaning. The Holy Spirit has the same blessed ministry, making Jesus Christ real to hearts that believe and count on Him, and yield to Him in heart and life. Always, always He is with us-and will be even unto the end.

Dr. Arthur Hunter, actuary of the New York Life Insurance Co., says Bible News Flashes, after studying the records of sixty large companies involving over two million persons, finds that even moderate drinkers of alcoholic liquors reduce life's expectancy from four to six years. Dr. Hunter figures that every drink, no matter how moderate, costs the drinker, not only the price on the counter, but twenty-five minutes of life.

## RATHER STARTLING

Herbert Lockyer says the people of England pay more for dog licenses $(\$ 15,000,000)$ than they do for the evangelization of the heathen. The year the war broke out Britain spent $\$ 1,200,000,000$ on strong drink, and only $\$ 10,000,0000$ on Christian missions. But is America any better? The people of the U. S. spend $\$ 20,000,000,000$ a year for such things as gambling, liquor, tobacco, cosmetics, chewing gum, playing cards, and motion pictures, all of which people would be better off without. The sad part of the whole picture is that a lot of this wasted money is spent by people professing to be Christians.

## MISSIONARIES IN ASIA

According to some recent figures there are still 1,700 American missionaries in Christian service in the war areas of Asia. But in China alone there are $250,0000,000$ who have never heard the gospel. If all of these 1,700 missionaries were concentrated among the unreached of China there would only be one missionary for about every 150,000 . And if each of these missionaries explained the gospel to ten Chinese a day (a stupendous undertaking considering they have never heard before) it would take a little over forty-one years to cover the unreached of China. Do we need to pray? Do we need to give? Do we need to go?

## ASTROLOGY EXPOSED

Astrology has swept over England during this war, until English newspapers are full of the occult predictions and even Christian people are believing in them. Anxious souls are looking to the stars instead of the Scriptures to light up the darkened future. It is refreshing to read a statement by the Bishop of Winchester on the subject. Writing in his Diocesan Leaflet, he said:
"Astrology is one of the oldest of superstitions. In the old pagan world it was the cause of intense depression, as men felt they were powerless under the grip of influences due to the planets. Christianity did far more than the scoffing of the skeptic to deliver men from the cruel creed that they were iron-bound because they were born at the time when certain planets were in the ascendancy.... The names and qualities attached to the planets are of human invention.... There is no proof, and never has been, that the planets and stars influence men and affairs.... Sometimes the astrologer makes a lucky guess, and this is remembered while his errors are forgotten. More often his predictions are so vague and ambiguous that they give no definite guidance and are open to different interpretations."

Astrology is an ancient art. The heathen round about Israel practiced it. Not only did they study the sun, moon, and stars but they even worshiped them. They worshiped the sun as the "king of heaven" the moon as the "queen of heaven." The Israelites copied the practice, and God sent judgment upon them. 2 Kings 23:5. God called it an abomination. Ezek. 8:16.

## CALL FOR THE PASTOR!

When you have a toothache you go to your dentist. When you have a pain you go to your doctor. When you need a pair of shoes you go to a store. When you have any important affair, you upset your routine and go to your banker, lawyer, notary, government office, or the principal of your children's school. But when you have something wrong with your soul you stop going to church, stay at home full of bitterness and wait for years for your pastor to call on you. When he arrives you heap reproaches upon him. Is it normal? Your pastor has office hours, and a telephone. What are you waiting for?-La Vie Protestante.

## THE WAR AND ZIONISM

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, leader of the World Zionist Movement, said recently: "Speaking of the wave of totalitarian aggression which may soon reach Palestine, I have great confidence in the heroism and capacity of the British forces in the Middle East. But assuming the worst, what then? Is it the end of Zionism and of the Jewish National Home? My answer is emphatically, No. The fate of Zionism does not depend on the changing fortunes of war. War may destroy much that we have built with so much pain and love, but it cannot destroy that which is indestructible. It is not too bold to think that just as the country in times gone by has given a message to the cherished possession of civilized humanity, a day may come when we may be privileged to give a new message of faith in those moral values which are being trampled down today by the invader in every civilized country."
God's message shall indeed go forth from Jerusalem, but it shall be during Christ's millennial reign. The prophet has said to Israel: "Ye shall be named the priests of the Lord: men shall call you the ministers of our God: ye shall eat the riches of the Gentiles, and in their glory shall ye boast yourselves." Isa. 61. 6.

## "ADOLPH HISTER"

"We are to enter in 1940 a catastrophic period which will last until 1944. This period will spell ruin to many governments and specifically to the form of government in France. In the year 1940 Europe will be up in arms. Dictators will be conquered and overrun." So, according to a South African correspondent of the Prophetic Neros, runs one of the amazing prophecies of Michael de Nostredame who published his book The Centuries and True Prophecies of Michael de Nostredame in 1555 . He successfully foretold the destruction of the Spanish Armada in 1588 and the execution of England's Charles I.
Nostredame made mistakes, as shown in his prognostication that the 1940 invasion of France would be through Switzerland, and he called the future German dictator who was to plunge Europe into another bloody massacre "Hister."
According to this man the present war will end in 1944, only to break out again in 1945 with France attacking Italy. Under the leadership of a new king, France will conquer Italy, restore her boundary on the Rhine, and rule over Spain.
We print this prediction as one of general interest, but desire to give warning that it is not a Biblical prophecy. Like many of its kind, it will doubtless fail.
Michael Baxter, in his Forty Coming Wonders, prophesied of many things that have come to pass. He foretold of a last-day outpouring of the Spirit and many speaking with other tongues. He believed that another Napoleon would arise in France, who would prove to be the Antichrist. But a great many of his prophecies and dates have proved false.

We do well to stay with the "more sure word of prophecy" (2 Peter 1:19) of the Bible.

JEWS KILLED IN UKRAINE
Fifty-two thousand Jews, including men, women and children, were systematically and methodically put to death in Kiev, following the Nazi occupation of the Ukrainian capital, according to information received by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. All indications are that the Kiev massacre was not an isolated incident, it is stated; similar measures, though on a smaller scale, have been taken in other conquered towns.

## STRATEGIC PALESTINE

A National Conference for Palestine was held in January in Cleveland, Ohio by the Jewish Zionist Movement. The Secretary of the Navy, Frank Knox, sent a message to the conference which shows that he expects things to happen right along the line of Bible prophecy, though perhaps his viewpoint is political and not based on propecy. Col. Knox said:
"The National Conference for Palestine can be held at no more propitious hour. The land of Palestine looms large on the immediate horizon as a strategic key to the control of the Middie East. Hitler must capture it if he is to reach Iran and the Mosul oil fields he needs. We in the United States must help strengthen Palestine against that aggression.
"In this critical hour every last measure of help must be given Palestine for yet another reason. Once again a would-be world conqueror finds this little country in his path. Japan hopes at the same time to capture Singapore and move westward toward India thus closing in on that storehouse of allied resources in a gigantic pincer movement. But Hitler dares not march through Turkey while Syria and Palestine thwart his lines of communication.
"Palestine is a tiny country on the map of the world but it is shaped like a thorn. It is a thorn indeed in the flank of Hitler. We must strengthen that thorn until it becomes a sword that will halt the tyrant's eastward march."
In God's prophetic plan, all the events and developments of the end time are related to Palestine, the Chosen Land for the Chosen People.

## WEAPONS FOR WAR

The production program outlined by President Roosevelt before Congress staggers the imagination. He called for 60,000 war planes in 1942 and 125,000 more in 1943; for 45,000 tanks in 1942 and 75,000 more in 1943; for 20,000 antiaircraft guns in 1942 and 35,000 more in 1943; for $8,000,000$ tons of merchant shipping this year and $10,000,000$ more tons in 1943. The program involves the greatest expenditure of money in the history of any nation for a similar time. It is a goal almost beyond comprehension. And yet, manufacturers say it can be reached and will be reached.

In the light of such a program, we no longer need wonder at the figures given in the Scriptures regarding the size of the armies which will engage in the last great battle of the age, and their equipment. The force which will come against Palestine is described in Ezekiel 38 as "all of them riding upon horses, a great company, and a mighty army." At present only parts of the armies are mechanized, but perhaps so many infernal machines will have been made by that time that all the vast army will ride.
An army of $200,000,000$ is described in Rev. $9: 16$. That will be twenty times as large as the army of $10,000,000$ which is visualized for America. And all these 200 millions are said to be "horsemen." This does not mean they shall ride four-legged beasts such as the horses that we know. The "horses" which they shall ride are described in Rev. 9:17-19 as having heads issuing forth "fire and smoke and brimstone." The description sounds very much like modern tanks and planes. It is little wonder that by so vast a mechanized army one third of the world's population shall be killed, as Rev. 9:18 declares.

Some months ago an educated native about twenty-seven years old, by the name of Nontoma, gave his heart to the Lord. The first test of his faith came when his mother died. Because he was a member of the chief's family, the native funeral was a large one. To our joy, Nontoma seized his opportunity and before his reproachful Mohammedan and pagan relatives and acquaintances read a portion from the Bible, witnessing to his faith. Some were appreciative, some were critical, but all were impressed, for a Bible reading and a testimony about Jesus Christ at a native funeral was a startling innovation-enough to start everyone wondering and talking. Nontoma later testified that as he spoke God took all the sorrow out of his heart, giving him instead a joy he could not describe.

## Opponents Silenced

After the funeral some of the Mohammedans started arguing with Nontoma. Not knowing exactly how to answer them he opened his Bible. His eyes fell upon a question Jesus had asked. To ask an opponent a question which he cannot answer is the strongest form of native argument. When Nontoma repeated
the question of Jesus, the Mohammedans had no answer. Nontoma's older brother, a man of influence, concluded the discussion by asking the Mohammedans, "If the Bible can ask a question you cannot answer, is not the Bible greater than you, and should you not then follow the Bible?"

This young man is progressing noticeably in Christian character. He testified that God had freed him from tobacco, drink, witcheraft, and the desire to take a second wife. "Since I began to follow God," he says, "I am happier than ever before. My home life is better. The district commissioner offered me work but I have refused because I want to be free so that God can use me."

## Native Psychology

Two boys who had worked for us a couple of days cutting the tall grass had received their pay, and you could never guess how they spent their money. Tucker, who are located at Nobe station in the Congo, tell of a trip into Azandi Land: "We surely enjoyed being in the bush once more, though we had quite a time getting there since it meant vading through mud and water at the head of the Obe River. In places we had to pick our way carefully over the slick, muddy ground, while at other times we were forced to step from one clump of grass to another. Some of the clumps were far apart but we always managed to make it, thus saving ourselves the discomfort of landing up to the knees in mud and water. Finally

we reached Bangala Pata, tired, but happy that we were again in the bush.
"The next day we pushed on to Ezu's village, where we learned that Ezu was away as he had been called to his paramount chief's village to act as a judge in deciding lawsuits. His son whom he had left in clarge was very polite and nice to us, and we stayed there for three nights, working out in various directions each day. In spite of strong Catholic opposition there are many hearts hungry for the true gospel. We long to see the Word bringing forth fruit in that place.
"When we reached the head of the Obe River on our return trip, we found workmen busy making a new path across but it was not yet ready. We laughingly remarked that if we had two "tepois" (hammocks) it would be a simple matter to get across this bad place To our surprise the workmen immediately acted upon our remark and rapidly improvised two "tepois," cutting small poles and tying them together with vines. Willingly they took us across and we do thank God for the help they gave.
"We keep busy at Nobe; there is always plenty to do. We feel the responsibility resting upon our shoulders and appreciate your prayers."

## TURNING FROM WITCHCRAFT

On account of the responsibility of the work at Gombari Station (Congo), Gladys Taylor and Gail Winters have found it best when planning bush trips that one arrange to remain at the station while the other travels in company with a Christian worker and his wife.
Concerning one of these trips, Gail Winters tells of a visit to a leper camp, where they gained consent to show the picture scroll of the life of Christ. Several had sat in rapt attention as they saw what God had done for them, but at the close all except two slipped away, fearful of this strange new teaching. The two who remained were an aged couple. "What are the things God will kill me for if I do them after I give Him my heart?" asked the old man. The missionary hastened to assure him that God would not kill him for anything but at the same time explained those things God asks us to give up if we are willing to follow Him. As the way of life was unfolded they expressed their desire to believe, and declare their readiness to give up witchcraft. After burning their fetishes, they offered their first prayer to the true God. Their bodies were pain-racked and disfigured with leprosy but now their faces shone with a new peace and hope within.

## "I Will Change My Heart"

Gladys Taylor writes of another conversion and deliverance from witchcraft: "We were holding service in a little mud chapel which had been erected in the village of a Christian, when an elderly man came and announced his desire to be saved. He was asked to wait until the service was over. When the benediction was pronounced a young man arose and began scolding the elder, telling him he had no business to come to be saved for he was the Big Chief's Mbili man. He went on to say that if he deserted his witcheraft he would bring trouble to the village, incurring the displeasure of the chief. But the elder constantly affirmed, 'This morning before I arose from my bed God spoke to me and told me this was the day to change my heart, and today I WILL
change my heart.' We taught him the way of eternal life and he found this truly was the day when God gave him a new heart."

## THE UNREACHED NOMADS OF MOSSILAND <br> John Hall

One of the most numerous people in all West Africa is the Fulani tribe. They are a nomadic herdspeople who make their living by selling milk and butter to the tribes among whom they move. They are exceedingly clever in most things and learn very readily. Most of them are Moslems, and the few who did profess Christ failed to stand the terrible persecution that was showered on them by relatives.

Since the Fulani do not stay long in one place, and since their language varies according to location, the building up of a church among them presents a problem. From the Scripture Gift Mission, of London, England, we obtained a leaflet translated by a pastor in the Cameroons, and if the Fulani of French West Africa can understand a little of it, that will be a small wedge to commence with.
Young men of the Fulani tribe desiring marriage must take a terrible beating in order


Four of our women became burdened for the salvation of their husbands and at almost every service presented this burden as a request for prayer. In the natural the salvation of these souls seemed an impossibility, but did God answer prayer? Most certainly He did.
One woman's husband was an inveterate drunkard, had been in prison, was ousted from the Brakpan Location as an undesirable, and became quite a notorious character. He had one good point, in that he allowed his wife to come to church. Finally, after much prayer and persuasion, he attended service himself, even showing interest. Then one Sunday evening he came forward for prayer and God gave him a real old-fashioned genuine conversion, delivering him from the demon of drink. What a transformed man now sits in the services-clean, well dressed, rejoicing in the God of his salvation.
The second woman's husband was very bitterly opposed to the gospel and to us, insomuch that he forbade her to allow us to hold a service in the home. During some special evangelistic services he came to the meetings: the gospel struck home, he found peace at Calvary and now is one of our most faithful, ardent workers. He is so willing to help us that among ourselves we call him the "sexton."
The husband of the third woman became interested when our Christians held a service in their home one Saturday evening. His wife told us that he is deeply touched by the attitude of our Christians and has invited them there for a service whenever they desire to come.
The fourth woman is still asking prayer for her husband who persecutes her for coming to the meetings.
There has been a continual and steady increase in the work. Souls have been saved some Baptized in the Spirit, and the sick healed. The compound work is growing until its care and supervision presents a problem. We now have preaching places in over thirty
compounds where large numbers, varying from one to twelve thousand, of native men who work in the gold mines are living. Quite frequently we gather here and there at a small dam of water which has been pumped out of the mines and immerse those who have found Christ as their personal Saviour. The field here is large and whitened unto harvest, and there are many benighted souls to reach with the gospel. Pray! Pray! Pray!

## Nigeriat

## NEED DEMANDS ACTION

Last fall Rex Jackson after only a few months in Nigeria moved into the Anang District to give much needed help and missionary supervision. This section had been visited by revival several years before, but while many had forsaken their idols and were gathering together to worship as best they knew, they were as sheep without a shepherd-in fact very few had a real experience of salvation.
Brother Jackson found eleven churches established there and this number soon increased to fifteen. None had trained leaders. It was impossible to visit them often enough to give the help required.
Seeing an urgent need, Brother Jackson and the native leader of that district acted without delay in arranging for a short term Bible School, which opened October 6. Of the 15 students who attended, very few knew the first thing about preaching the gospel. Only two had received the Baptism, so that evening tarrying meetings were held in addition to the classes.

## Bearing Fruit

"We had some blessed times together as we began to look into the fundamental truths of the Bible," says Brother Jackson. "As a result God has been moving, and in some places a real revival has been started.
"One church especially has made progress. The native worker started with his own people and got them saved. Then they began to tell the good news abroad in neighboring towns, until as a result seven outstations have been started from this one church. The reports are so encouraging as to make me feel like shouting. One big chief and his entire family came from another town to be shown the way of salvation. They immediately invited the worker to come to their town where a gospel service was held in the chief's compound. Their plea for a worker to be sent right away had to be refused since we had no worker available.

As soon as we can get land, we plan to build a proper school with classrooms and dormitories. We badly need books and proper equipment. As I am alone in this district, it would be impossible to do all the work of training these people, and until we can get trained workers the work cannot progress as it should. From all sides are coming requests for me to visit different villages and teach the people. We realize that in the future there will be an even greater need of workers. Will you pray that God may bless His work in this section of Nigeria?"

## M SUMDQU SCHOOL LESSON

## Mordecai's Exaltation and the Nation's Deliverance

Lesson for March 15. Lesson Text Esther 8. 9, and 10.
Mrs. Housewife has something in mind. She goes to the kitchen, gets out a bowl, also some flour, some sugar, some shortening, and perhaps some eggs. These ingredients, in certain porportion and at certain times, are mixed together. The result is a lovely cake! So it is in the lives of God's people. God has a glorious plan in mind for them. In order to accomplish this plan He must allow to come into their lives, at certain times and in certain proportions, a little sorrow, a little hardship, a few things hard to understand, quite a few joys, and quite a few blessings. The result is that "all (these) things work together for good" for these people. This great truth is beautifully illustrated in the book of Esther.
I. THE EXALTATION OF MORDECAI.
Haman, enemy of the Jews, is dead. On the day he died "did the king Ahasuerus give the house of Haman unto Esther, . . . And Mordecai came before the king; for Esther had told what he was unto her. And the king took off his ring which he had taken from Haman and gave it unto Mordecai. And Esther set Mordecai over the house of Haman." Several thoughts stand out: (1) "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy." Psalm 126:5. Mordecai had been faithful to God, faithful to God's people. He had humbled himself and wept outside of the king's gate. God elevated him and caused him to go out through the same gate arrayed in kingly apparel. Let us therefore not be weary in well doing; for in due season we, too, shall reap if we faint not. (2) The vanity of laying up riches on earth. Haman's riches became the inheritance of Mordecai. The man of the world "heapeth up riches and knoweth not who shall gather them." Psalm 39:6. But those who are wise lay up treasure in heaven and will one day receive an incorruptible inheritance. Matt. 6:19, 20; cf. 1 Peter 1:3-5.

## II. ESTHER'S INTERCESSION.

Read 8:3-8. Observe: (1) A man's mischief outlives him. "And Esther spake before the king and besought him to put away the mischief of Haman." Haman was dead; but the sentence of death against the Jews which he had originated was still in effect. Such is the extent of influence. Said George Muller, "My business is with all my might to serve my own generation ; in doing so I shall best serve the next generation should Jesus tarry." And though he has been dead for over forty years George Muller's mighty faith still inspires the hearts of millions. What kind of influence shall we leave after we have gone on? (2) The power of intercession. How earnestly Esther interceded for her people. She fell at the king's feet "and besought him with tears." Her praying resulted in a decree which saved her people! God has promised us mighty things in response to prayer! We live in a time of world crisis and war! Thousands of soldier boys may soon lose their lives. Who will pray for their salvation before it is too late? Can we truthfully say with Esther, "How can I endure to see the destruction of my kindred?" Let us pray!
III. THE KING'S DECREE

Read 8:9-17. In response to Esther's prayers, the king made a second decree which gave the Jews permission to defend themselves on the day that had been previously set aside for their destruc tion. Let us compare the two decrees of the king.
(1) The first message was a message of condemnation; the second message was a message of liberation made possible because of Esther's willingness to sacrifice herself. All of us at one time were under the sentence of death for breaking God's law - "the soul that sinneth; it shall die." Ezek. 18:4. Thank God we have received a second message which is one of freedom made possible by the sacrificial death of our Lord! Rom. $6: 23$; Gal. 3:13.
(2) The first message still stood, for the laws
casual meetings with strangers and friends, let us be faithful in witnessing. By prayer, by tracts, by the printed page, let us get the message to men and at least deliver our souls. To expect them to come to church will never suffice in this age. We must go out into the highways and byways and seek the lost ones.
IV. THE NATION'S DELIVERANCE

Read chapters 9 and 10 . Observe the following facts.
(1) The Jews unitedly defended themselves. Rather than remain scattered and fight individually or in small groups, they "gathered themselves together in their cities." The unity of the church is its power. We win most successful victories in spiritual warfare as we stand together in love and unity. There are spiritual conquests that cannot be won alone.
(2) Fear of Mordecai made many of the Jewes' enemies afraid to fight against them. And why did they fear Mordecai? They may not have realized it, but it was because God was with him. Likewise, fear rested upon those who observed the Spirit-filled members of the first church and all hypocrites were afraid to join themselves with them.

 themselves with them. (3) The Jezes completely overcame
their adversaries: for they slew all their adversaries; for they slew all
the members of Haman's household and 75,000 enemies. Why? Because God was on their side; because they were well armed; and because they were
well prepared. See Rom. $8: 31 ; 2$ Cor. $10: 4$; Eph. 6:10-18; Rom. 8:37 (4) The Jezes instituted a feast to commemorate their great deliverance. That feast was called the feast of Purim ("lots") because of Haman's casting of lots $(3: 7)$, and to this day it is cherished and observed by the Jews every spring just before the Passover. We Christians have a similar feast-the communion service-at which we recall the death of our adorable Lord which brought us deliverance from the thralldom of $\sin !-\mathrm{J}$. Bashford Bishop.

And what a confirmation of the worth-whileness of the arduous task of language translation on the mission fields!
(4) There was only a limit d time in which to publish abroad the king's second decree. The messengers had from the month Sivan to the month Adar, in other words, only nine months in which to promulgate the precious m-ssage. Suppose they had been dilatory and slipshod in getting it out? God stir us! We have only a limited time in which to win the souls of lost men. The night is soon coming when no man can work. In our homes, at school, at the office, in

with good things, so that thy youth"-thy spiritual prime - "is renewed LIKE THE EAGLE." Psalm 103:5.

The eagle is the only nonhuman creature on earth which God has ever chosen for the proclamation of His truth to all mankind (an ass, 2 Peter 2:16, warned a single prophet) ; just as the snake is the only nonhuman creature on earth that Satan has used for the proclamation of his falsehood. John says, in Patmos: "And I saw, and I heard an eagle, flying in midheaven, saying with a great voice, Woe, woe, woe, for them that dwell on the earth." Rev. 8:13.

We are Christ-based. "She dwelleth on the rock, and hath her lodging there." Job $39: 28$. The eagle is the greatest enemy the serpent has on earth. Some species of eagles are called "snake-eating eagles," which they disable and consume, with rapid blows from the beak. And so it is when the dragon approaches (Rev. 9:11), that God sends forth (Rev. 8:13) His warning eagle.

Eagles are also used for hunting wolves, and in Turkestan a wolf-hunting eagle will fetch as much as $\$ 250$, or six times the price of a horse. Matthew Edwards describes the combat between a wolf and two of these hunting eagles. "The wolf stood at bay, and though his eyes were gone he lashed out this way and that with flashing fangs in the hope of finding his assailants. Ballah and Naja had been taking turns in dealing sharp, quick blows with their razor-like beaks. As we watched, the wolf sank to the ground, and, as quick as a flash, Ballah seized him by the scruff of the neck with his terrible talons and swept up into the air. Up and up the big bird mounted, and at about two hundred feet he picked out a rocky spot and let his quarry drop. When we got to Mr. Wolf he was nothing but a bag of broken bones." The children of God wrestle with wolves and serpents, unafraid"for them an evident token of perdition." Phil. 1:28.

So powerful is its upward flight, and so native is it to heaven, that the eagle, alone of birds, disappears altogether from sight, "I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto Myself." Ex. 19:4. "Wheresoever the carcase is," our Saviour says, "there will the eagles be gathered together." Matt. $24: 28$. Above the carcase of a corrupting world, death-doomed, in the eyrie of the Holy City, God's eagles may be gathered at any moment; for "they shall mount up with wings as eagles." Isaiah 40:31. So Enoch "walked with God: and he was not: for God took him'" (Gen. 5:24) into heaven.

But the end of the earth-bound eagle is tragedy itself. A man one winter's day was scanning the whirl of the waters above the Niagara Falls, as they eddied and rushed around the blocks of ice, and through his telescope he saw the dead carcase of a sheen, and an eagle alighting upon it. He watched the bird as it gorged itself upon the carrion. Then suddenly it attempted to rise, as it was nearing the Falls; but its feet were imbedded in the damp flesh, and were frozen to it. In vain the eagle struggled: it was held fast by the thing it gorged, and was swept over into instant death.
