

These signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues ... they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover. Mark 16:17, 18.

 AS I TRAVEL throughout the United States, speaking in a different church almost every night, our pastors say to me, "Brother Fierro, we are on the threshold of a great outpouring of God's Spirit. Our people are seeking God as they never did before." It is an indication of the soon coming of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. There is a going in the tops of the mulberry trees; the Spirit is preparing the way for the coming of King Jesus. One of these days that trumpet is going to sound, heaven will open, and Jesus will appear in the clouds. We are going home, friends, and God is getting His church ready. I believe that before Jesus comes we are to have a great spiritual awakening. not only in the United States but throughout the whole world, and there are many signs that this awakening has already begun.

The people of many different denominations are praying and seeking God as they never have sought Him before. The other day while in my home town, San Jose, California, I had a phone call from a Methodist woman. She said, "Brother Fierro, I went to hear you the other night; you will be glad to learn that some of our Methodist people are receiving the Baptism of the Holy Spirit the way you Pentecostals preach it." She said, "Come over and pray for me that I will receive that precious Pentecostal experience."

Come with me to the Republic of Mexico. Ask the brethren there which is the fastest growing denomination. A prominent preacher of a large denomination held a great evangelistic campaign for Dr. Eleazar Perez, in the large Presbyterian Church in Mexico City. When this prominent preacher got back to the United States, they asked him, "How is Protestantism getting along in Mexico?" This great man of God answered, "Wonderful! The Lord is blessing the people in a

"What denomination seems to be growing the most?" they asked. He scratched his head and said, "Those Pentecostal people are going places. They seem to have the zeal and the enthusiasm that the Mexicans like." Call it zeal, call it enthusiasm, call it Southern emotionalism,

mighty way."

call it what you may. I say it is the moving of the Holy Spirit that the Mexican people like. They are tired of formality. are tired of lifeless religion. They want the real knowledge of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, that can get down in the deep of their hearts and transform their lives; that can help them overthrow the yoke of illiteracy and superstition, and give them joy and peace.

Come with me to Central America and you will find the same thing. Come with me to South America, and you will hear of the great Holy Ghost revivals that are taking place in Brazil and other countries. The people of Latin America believe the Word when it is preached to them. When I tell them that my God can save, they answer, "Sure He can save." When I tell them, "Jesus heals, my friends," they answer, "Sure, He heals. Hurry up and get through talking, so you can pray for me, and I will get healed." I may have some persecutions in Latin America-I may have some stones thrown at me in some places-but I can always get a crowd of folk who are anxious to listen to the preaching of the gospel.

A few weeks ago I was in meetings in Puerto Rico and God healed the sick. I have never professed to have the gift of healing, and I am not going to claim it now; but in Puerto Rico I saw many miracles as we prayed for the sick in Jesus' name. The blind received their sight -not one or two or three, but literally hundreds. The paralytics walked. I hardly had to pray for them. I just laid my hands on their heads and anointed them with oil in the name of Jesus. Those old crutches slipped out from under those paralytics and they left the platform praising God.

ans, Nazarenes, Christian and Missionary Alliance members, all came in to our meeting. God would come down on the scene and people would receive the Baptism, and those Methodists and Baptists would stand with tears streaming down their cheeks. Up would go their hands until God gave them the Baptism. When we would get through praying for the sick, these brethren would come up and say, "Brother Fierro, I have never believed in Divine Healing, but I believe it now." When we prayed for those sick people there wasn't a doubt in their hearts that they would get healed. Here in the United States we are inclined to be suspicious of the miraculous. We need our faith stirred once again that we might have faith in the supernatural, faith in God for healing, faith in the soon returning of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

When I was saved out of Roman Catholicism seventeen years ago, that Spiritfilled Spanish Assembly of God minister preached that Jesus saves, Jesus heals, Jesus baptizes with the Holy Spirit. The next night he preached the same thing only backward. That man did not have much education, but he had the anointing of the Holy Spirit. He would get down on his knees and seek God for two or three hours before he would ever preach. As he stood behind that sacred desk, wave after wave of glory came upon him. God filled him with the power of His Spirit. and that is what brought me into Pentecost. Whenever I would meet a paralytic or blind person on the street in those days, I would say, "Come to my church. These people pray for the sick and you will get well." It grieves my heart as I hear of people today traveling 500 or 1000 miles to the meetings of some dear brother that has dared to preach healing, when they ought to get their healing in the Pentecostal church right in their home town Why is it so? Are we afraid to preach it because a few have taken advantage of these precious doctrines and have overemphasized them or have exaggerated some miracles that have taken place? I'm not going to stop preaching the truth on that account. I'm going to keep preaching the Word.

I do not intend to go around the country having divine healing campaigns. I'm going to hold evangelistic campaigns, and healing and the Baptism of the Holy Spirit automatically come in when I preach the gospel. I do not want the people to get their eyes on me. That is what they were beginning to do in Puerto Rico, so night after night I stood behind the sacred desk and I drilled it into their heads, "I am not the one that heals you; it is the God that I represent." And God thought it well to honor the preaching of His Word in Puerto Rico with the signs following You don't buy a pair of shoes and say, "Well, I'll buy the shoes here; I'll go

down a half block and buy the shoe laces; and then go across the street and buy the tongues for the shoes." No, when you buy the shoes, the laces and the tongues come with them!

The signs follow as we believe God and obey His Word. I preached in a tent meeting last summer and a woman who was a paralytic came in a wheel chair. She didn't get up when I prayed for her, and they wheeled her out of the tent. But after she was outside, she got up and ran around the ten-acre parking lot. She wrote and said, "Brother Fierro, vou will be glad and surprised to know that after you prayed for me, your God healed me." I sent back an air mail letter by special delivery and said, "I'm not surprised; that is what I expected." There is no use praying some weak prayer and then saying, "Well, let's hope you will be better now." The old devil looks at us and says, "That is just what I wanted." We need to stand up on our two feet and claim the promises of God and say, "I'm a representative of the Lord Jesus Christ. In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, I rebuke this affliction. Brother, sister, take your healing." The devil will say, "These people mean business," and he will leave. I sincerely believe that is what we need today. Oh, may God give us more apostolic power!

A brother from Bakersfield, California, Mr. Bryan S. Smith, called me up and said, "Brother Fierro, I feel that God wants us to go to Puerto Rico, and God has laid it on my heart that you are to be the evangelist."

I replied, "Is that right? God hasn't told me that."

"Well," he said, "you had better pray about it."

I prayed about it; then I called him up and said, "All right, I will go."

I wrote to the superintendent of our Puerto Rico Assemblies of God, saying: "Brother Alvarado, rent the biggest building you can get in Puerto Rico." I just felt that God was in it and God was going to bless. He answered me. "The largest buildings in Puerto Rico are theater buildings. Our Pentecostal churches can accommodate as many people as the theaters, so if it is agreeable with you, we will hold the meeting in one of our own churches."

My first meeting was in San Juan, Puerto Rico. I preached a simple gospel message in Spanish and asked, "How many men and women will take Jesus tonight?" The pastor counted about 240 hands. We prayed for them. After we prayed a blind man came up to me. A little boy led him by the hand and said, "Here he is." This blind man faced me and said, "God showed me that when you came to Puerto Rico, the first night you were to lay your hands on me and I was to receive my sight." I said, "Who

told you that?" He said, "God told me."

I felt the Spirit of the Lord come upon me. I reached up and laid my hand on his forehead, and prayed in Spanish, "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth receive thy sight." That blind man received his sight. He screamed in Spanish, "I want to see my wife. I want to see my children. I want to see my pastor." And they brought his wife and children that he had never seen before in his life.

You can imagine what that did to the congregation-not only to the congregation, but to Brother Fierro too! Pretty soon the church was packed out and the street was blocked off. There was a long line of sick people to be prayed for. I took off my coat and began to pray for them. It was the most marvelous thing I have ever seen, my friends. The crutches began slipping out. The blind would scream, "I see! I see! I see!" The newspaper photographers were called. The newspaper reporters came. The next day there appeared in the newspaper of San Juan, Puerto Rico (El Imparcial): "Evangelist performs cures in San Juan." I took this newspaper before the congregation and

said, "The newspaper reporters made a mistake. They left something out. They should have said, 'Evangelist's God performs cures in San Juan.'" Then I used that as my text and spoke about the power of the lovely name of Jesus. From then on, every night the newspaper reporters were there. What was so wonderful about this whole thing to me was that God wanted to give Puerto Rico a Holy Ghost revival. It wasn't because Robert F. Fierro went. Someone else might have gone and seen the same results. It was just God's time for Puerto Rico, and God thought it well to have me go there and have the privilege of seeing Him work in these marvelous ways.

We didn't put out one leaflet of publicity. We didn't make one announcement over the radio. There is no greater attraction today than the power of the Holy Spirit! But we had to move out of our Assembly of God church into the largest and most beautiful park in San Juan. We roped off an altar space a quarter of a block long, thirty feet wide. The policemen estimated that 10,000 people gathered

A Narrow Escape

• IT WAS Friday the 13th. The day would have been disastrous for me but for the intervention of God.

On my return home from Bible Class in Spokane, Wash. a telegram was waiting for me which stated that Mother was very ill in Los Angeles and wished me to come at once. I hastily caught the evening train.

When we were delayed at Ashland, Ore., I was in great suspense over the delay and enquired of the porter the reason for it. "A freight train was wrecked a mile and a half down the track and they have sent for a wrecker to clear the track," he said. After hours of further delay I enquired again and was told that the wrecker itself had also been wrecked and they had to send to Dunsmuir for another wrecker to clear both the wrecker and the demolished freight. When we finally reached the scene of the wreck and saw the debris strewn along the repaired track, I thanked God that He had kept us out of this tragic destruction.

We arrived in San Francisco early in the morning and I had breakfast; then I hastened out to the track at Third and Townsend station to take the train for Los Angeles. The conductor called, "All aboard!" but I stood there holding my suitcase as if rooted to the pavement.

"All aboard! he called again. He waited for me, but I could not move. He swung on to the platform, and the train moved out and left me. There was no other train until evening.

I decided to go out to Golden Gate Park and spend the day. I asked myself over and over, "Why did I act as I did?" After being in such a hurry to reach my mother's bedside, here I was wasting a precious day in San Francisco! I prayed long and earnestly for guidance. God gave me great peace, though I could not understand the strange compulsion.

I had supper, and boarded the evening train for Los Angeles very much blessed and refreshed, but still marveling over my inability to board the morning train.

When we reached Glendale the following morning I found my answer. The morning train which I had planned to take was lying at the foot of a steep embankment, wheels upturned, completely wrecked. Thirteen people had been killed and many were injured. Friday the 13th could have been disastrous for me, but God had graciously spared me.

As the closing days of this dispensation come upon us with disasters in various elements and places, we shall need to pay careful attention to the leading of our gracious and loving Lord in order to escape them. My anxiety about my mother was unfounded, for she was greatly improved and waved at me from the front porch as I came through the gate.

The Possibilities in Television

Television is here to stay, and it is destined to influence the habits and thinking of young and old as no other invention -not even radio-has done.

In his book entitled Television-Servant or Master? Edward J. Carnell writes: "In the long and glorious history of scientific labor no more powerful, no more efficient means to relay ideas to the masses of the people has been devised.'

The author neither condemns nor commends the new invention as such. Like radio, like money, like the automobile, the good or evil resulting from its use depends upon the character of the men using it. In the measure that it is directed by godly men, the American people "can bow in prayer for thankfulness that this mighty force-equal to that of atomic power-has fallen into the hands of godly spirits." If, on the other hand, it falls into the hands of men and women who care not for the law of God, "TV may undermine those pillars upon which the nation's heritage in righteousness rests."

At present there is a deplorably low moral standard in much of the telecasting. Mr. Carnell reminds us that the taverns were the first to make use of TV, suggesting that "the very fact that television is in harmony with the tavern's philosophy is enough to stir up thoughtful citizens. He insists, however, that "a healthy-minded Christian will evaluate television as part of the mixed order of the world's light and darkness, being careful to remove the good from the new medium, using it to the glory of God, while rejecting the unclean.'

The Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, Mr. Wayne Coy, recognizes the need of higher moral standards in the television industry. Speaking at the University of Oklahoma recently he expressed his convictions concerning certain ways in which televised performances need to be corrected and cleaned up.

The National Religious Broadcasters, a group affiliated with the N.A.E., have written to Mr. Coy commending him for the courageous stand he has taken. "We wholeheartedly agree with you," said the National Religious Broadcasters, "for we are confident that the time has arrived for such action by the Federal Communications Commission in order that the morals of our homes and children be protected and television remain a moral force for the upbuilding of our nation.'

Whether Christians ought to have anything to do with television is a subject on which there are differing views. Many

godly people are convinced that television has no place in a Christian home. They point to the fact that most of the programs are theatrical performances or sports events. If it is wrong to attend the theatre and the wrestling matches in person, it surely is wrong to watch such programs on television. It is a fact to be regretted that news and educational features are in the minority in most cities, at the present time, and religious programs are quite

There are a few gospel programs on television, however. Percy Crawford was the first to launch a gospel telecast on a nation-wide scale. His is a half-hour program named, "Youth on the March." Chaplain Dave Martin, an ordained minister in the Assemblies of God, has been directing a half-hour telecast called "Crusade for Christ" at Detroit, Mich., each Saturday at 7 p.m. for the past six months. The Lutheran Laymen's League recently laid plans for televising its gospel program, beginning in October of this year.

Television courses are being offered by at least one Christian university to prepare youth for this vital ministry, and it is to be hoped that many more soon will seize the opportunity to use this marvelous new medium for the propagation of the gospel. Thousands of people are buying TV sets every month. More and more are switching from radio to television for entertainment, and a great number may never hear the message of salvation unless it comes to them through their TV set.

Profit Gained in Prayer

The supreme triumph of the praying soul is not found in supplication to God, but in revelation of God.

This explains our Lord's all-night prayers-not so much all-night asking or interceding, as a spreading out of His whole spirit before the Father. The closet is not an oratory only, but observatory-a place of vision. The first lesson in prayer is that we shut ourselves in with God alone in order to have a vision of God. The greatest necessity of the spiritual life is to "believe that He is, and that He is a Rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." In the secret chamber the believer learns to know God. Prayer is therefore more than asking; it is receiving; it is learning of God-a converse and communion in which He has much to say, and we have much to hear and learn.

Prayer is the most effectual way to flood the Word of God with light. Prayer is the most effectual way to cultivate personal acquaintance with God, and to enter upon a holy walk with Him; and to deliver one from the foes of the spiritual life, as well as to achieve the highest spiritual attainments.—A. T. Pierson.

THE PENTECOSTAL EVANGEL

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RUSSIA IN PROPHECY

• THERE CAN BE no question, in the mind of anyone who keeps himself informed concerning present-day events, of the prominent place which the great nation of Russia is playing in international developments. What the Russian leaders say, what actions they take, what propaganda lines are pursued by them in their great newspapers Tass, Pravda, or Izvestia make a resounding impact on world consciousness. Do you know that Scripture has some very specific predictions to make about that great modern nation, symbolized by the bear, and often referred to as "the bear that walks like a man"?

Ezekiel refers, in chapters 38 and 39 of his prophecy, to a great military power from the "uttermost north" which will invade the land of Palestine in "the latter years," in order to despoil that land, a country described as unfortified. (Read Ezekiel 38, verses 4, 11, 12, 16.)

Let us examine the prophecy more in detail. This message was definitely "the word of the Lord" given to the great prophet of the exile, while he and his Hebrew compatriots were in Babylonian captivity. The land concerned is described by Ezekiel in the Revised Version of the Scriptures as the land of Magog, and its ruler as "the prince of Rosh, Meshech and Tubal." v. 1. In verse 2 the prophet voices God's opposition to that ruler—"Behold I am against thee, O Gog, prince of Rosh, Meshech, and Tubal."

Now what is the identity of the nation described in this language? If you will refer back to Genesis 10:2; you will find, among others, the names Gomer, Magog, Tubal and Meshech—all sons of Japheth, son of Noah, born after the flood. Students of ethnology (the science of the origins of nations) say that the descendants of Magog, Meshech and Tubal were "the ancient Scythians, who occupied the region around the Black and Caspian seas and were the forefathers of the present Russian people."

Gesenius, one of the greatest authorities on Hebrew definition, states concerning the word: "Rosh, a proper noun, name of a northern nation mentioned with Tubal and Meshech, undoubtedly the Russians, who are mentioned by Byzantine writers of the 10th Century under the name of 'Oi Ros,' (meaning 'the Rosh')

dwelling to the north of the Taurus Mountains, and described by Ibn Fosslan, an Arabic writer of the same age, as dwelling on the river Rha (the Volga)." We know that the Volga is the great river of modern Russia and are all familiar with the famous Russian song—"The Song of the Volga Boatman."

A rather up-to-date touch helps to further identify this people. Just before the war, we are told that the Soviets made an enormous shipment of lead pencils to Great Britain with the word "Gog" stamped on them, with the symbol of a horse.

Meshech and Tubal have been indentified by ethnologists with Moscow, the present capital of Russia, and with Tobolsk, the ancient Siberian capital. Moscow is on the Moskva river and Tobolsk on the Tobol river. So here we have the same names given to a people, a river, and a town. "Under the wellknown laws of toponymy (the study of the place names of a region or language), there can be no doubt that the tribes with these names came and settled in the valleys that still bear their names." The modern forms of these names can easily be explained by the transition from one language to another. For example, the Greek version of the Old Testament, the Septuagint, has for Meshech and Tubal, "Mesoch" and "Thobel."

You will note that this nation invades the Holy Land from its place out of "the north parts" (Ezekiel 38:15 and 39:2), literally the "uttermost north." Can there be any other nation occupying the "uttermost north," and with direct access to Palestine as the prophecy indicates, than Russia?

When one realizes the greatness and extent of the former Russian Empire, now known as the Union of Socialistic Soviet

Republics, it is not strange that Scripture should prophesy—just as it did concerning great nations of the past, Assyria, Babylon, Egypt, Persia, Rome—concerning this great modern country, especially since she looks with covetous eyes toward Palestine, the "glory of all lands" as God views that country. Ezek. 20:6.

As to her greatness, Russia would cover the United States twice, plus all west of the Mississippi three times, plus Texas. The vast virgin forests of Russia would cover all the United States. It produces nearly every known mineral. Such a land has not remained alone and today is the focal point of all eyes, a land of potential danger, a land of mystery.

The prophetic "Rosh" or Russia is viewed in verse 4 as a great military power with a vast army, horses and horsemen in full armor, with bucklers and shields, all of them handling swords. Of course, and ancient prophecy could not use terms for modern tanks, jeeps, airplanes, etc., because there was no such war material, nor words in the Hebrew language to describe them. However, the reference to "horses" is particularly applicable to Russia. She has been noted for her great numbers of these animals, and her horsemen, the Cossacks, and their feats of horsemanship, have been famous for centuries.

Even before the outbreak of World War II, at the end of each year, she had a million and a quarter men trained and under arms, with equipment in abundance. She has emerged from the war a great military power still, and such a cloud of mystery pervades her designedly secret movements that suspicion must be aroused as to her intentions. On February 9, 1946, Premier Stalin announced the new Soviet "Five-Year Plan," which purposes to make Russia's production as great as that of the United States. Scientific research is being encouraged also (and Russian scientists are second to none in some fileds). Numbers of famous German military scientists fell into the hands of the Russians and are doubtless forced to contribute their knowledge to the military preparedness of the Soviets. All of this, so that Russia shall be guaranteed against any eventuality.

Her great emperor, Peter the Great, who reigned 1682-1725 A.D., instilled into his people an intense nationalistic spirit which has never died. This nationalism has had added impulse from her present "man of steel." The ambition of Peter was to rule the world. He defeated both the Swedes and the Turks and pushed his way to the Baltic Sea and the Black Sea. But even today Russia has no allyear warm water port-outlet to the great oceans. Even Vladivostok on the Pacific is ice-bound in winter. So Stalin, as we know, is desirous of breaking through the

Sunday School Lesson

DAVID AT ZIKLAG

Lesson for June 18

1 Samuel 30:1-18

Again we meet the Amalekites, which well represent the flesh life or carnal nature. The Amalekites had attacked Israel, first in their feeblest members, when they came out of Egypt. Exodus 17:8. Knowing their enmity (which represents the carnal mind, which is "enmity against God") God ordered Saul to exterminate them. This he failed to do to his own undoing. ch. 15. Now we find the Amalekites pouncing on David who is already severely persecuted by Saul. "The Amalekites had invaded the south and Ziklag." v. 1. If we sympathize with the flesh, as Saul did, all that we reap is disappointment. If we pet self in ourselves, we are doomed to loss of victory. Our proper attitude is to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof." Rom. 13:14. "They that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts." Gal. 5:24.

I. The Turn in People

When things were going well with David, his followers praised him, but when reverses came they were ready to stone him. They represent the natural heart of man. David's followers were not persons of the highest type. One has said, "Had Saul's government been just and upright David would have had no followers. Many in the land were impoverished by Saul's own exactions, and made bitter of soul by his injustice." Those willing to follow David in his wanderings were "everyone that was in distress, and everyone that was in debt, and everyone that was discontented." 1 Sam. 22:2. The time of David's wanderings, being pursued by Saul, is used as a type of our Lord Jesus in this time of His rejection. Unloved by the carnal world. He is nevertheless gathering His Church. In it "not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called." But God hath chosen "the foolish things, the weak things, the base things, the things that are despised." 1 Cor. 1:26-28. Why has God done this? "That no flesh should glory in His presence."

2. Fruit of Defeatism

Deep was the grief when David and his men returned to Ziklag to find the city burned and their wives and children, their flocks and herds all taken away by the Amalekites. It was enough to crush the hearts of the stoutest of men. David joined with the people that were with him in their grief. They "lifted up their voice and wept until they had no more power to weep." 1 Sam. 30:4. The followers of David had not yet arrived at that place in spiritual life where they could "take joyfully the spoiling of their goods." Heb. 10:34. I wonder how near such a spiritual state we have arrived? Only the testings can prove the fulness of our consecration and devotion. I think there is no wrong in feeling keenly when sorrows and

reverses come. Jesus was a "Man of Sorrows." His heart bled over and over. The test of our sorrows is how we react after the first jar

David united with his men in their expression of great grief. Then came the reaction. His followers, who had been happy in going with him when he started out to battle, now wished to stone him. 1 Sam. 30:6. They accused him of being responsible for all their miseries. God help us that bitterness and unreasonableness may not possess us as the result of our disappointment and inward pain. Many can stand a first shock, who succumb later. The followers of David went down in complete inward defeat. Spiritually they were whipped.

3. The Encouragement of David

Everything was swept away from David. It would seem enough that he had to be hounded by Saul-he who had done no wrong. What could be worse on top of this than being deprived of his all, his wives and children being in the hands of murderous men! Imagination could call up anything. Then to have the further crushing when the men with whom, and for whom, he had been fighting turned on him in desperate inconsistency. Who, we may well ask, could stand all of this? It was shock after shock after shock.

Dare we unite with this sad lesson the thought of Jesus? In His lifetime He gave

Himself for the distressed. He saw men as wandering sheep "having no shepherd," no spiritual guide that could lead and feed them. He looked on the needs of humanity and saw their crying poverty. He beheld the physical bondage in which many were held. Then He set about to "bind up the broken hearted, and to let the oppressed go free." Luke 4:18. What did He receive in return? Rejection, false accusation-and finally His own disciples denied their knowledge of Him as He was led to judgment and to death. Can we wonder that, in His agony. He "sweat as it were great drops of blood"? Then, like David, He "encouraged Himself in the Lord His God." Crushed and bleeding He would still hope in God.

4. A Turn in Events

David's crushings must not remain forever. The crushings of Christ came to an end. If your heart is crushed, look to God. He knows all about it. He can comfort you in your present discomfort and puts before you a heavenly city. Paul suffered greatly, but considered his sufferings a means to "a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." 2 Cor. 4:17.

With nothing about to encourage, David "encouraged himself in the Lord. Ch. 30:6." By sight all was gone; by faith he saw victory and renewed his strength. Remembering God by whose help he had slain a lion and a bear in his youth, and by whom he had triumphed over Goliath, he believed God would, in some way, snatch victory from defeat now. Instead of brooding over circumstances, he remembered God and went to the faithful priest Abiathar Together they sought guidance from God, who said, "Pursue, for thou shalt surely overtake them, and without fail recover all." vv. 8, 9.


David's faith rallied the spirits of his followers. Instead of stoning him as they threatened, they gladly resumed loyalty. Faith inspires. It turns defeat into victory.

5. If There Be a Willing Mind

David started in pursuit of the Amalekites with six hundred men. Every one was willing Some lacked the physical stamina of others, and because of faintness of body could go no farther than the brook Besor. v. 10. Not all can press equally in physical exertion. The Lord knows it. If your heart is in the work of God, do not belabor yourself if others have more physical endurance than you. David appreciated the willingness of those who had to be left behind, and when the victory was won he insisted that they share equally with those that had gone to the battle. vv. 21, 24. If we cannot throw ourselves as vigorously into the work as some others, we can stand with them in faith and our faith will be rewarded.

The first part of March, William Stepp and I were in Valencia for the dedication of their new temple—a lovely fireproof structure which will seat 150 downstairs with an equally large space upstairs for Sunday School classes. In the State of Falcon, where the late Adolph Blattner labored, the national brethren are carrying on with unflagging zeal—evangelistic campaigns, personal work and house meetings. The reports are good. Souls are being saved, churches organized and chapels built. Over





Joy in Service in El Salvador

• TWO YEARS of labor have now been completed for the Master in this part of His vineyard. These have been two of the happiest years of our lives. There have been sicknesses, problems, trials and difficulties, but He has been our Leader and Guide.

In the January 7 issue of the Pentecostal Evangel Ralph Williams told of his hazardous trip to San Ignacio. The believers had paid 100 pesos for a year's advance rent on a building for services in San Ignacio. The owner, fearing the displeasure of the townsmen, returned the money a week later and refused to rent the building. A few weeks later Ralph Williams visited San Ignacio and was greeted with a shower of stones which broke the windshield of his car.

But God. Now the believers in San Ignacio have received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. All four of the grown children of one of the enemies of the work have received the Holy Spirit and the father consented to sell a house he owned in the central part of the town to the believers for services. You can imagine the rejoicing of the believers. Already several Campos Blancos have been established for preaching the gospel. God is still on the throne!

Two weeks ago we participated in our third conference with the Asambleas de Dios in El Salvador. This Twenty-first Annual Conference was the largest and best attended thus far. In the Saturday night Christ's Ambassador service over 1,000 persons were present. As the pastors and delegates of the sixty-six churches counseled together for the advancement of the

work of God one could sense the desire on the part of everyone for a greater outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

The seventy-three national workers in the sixty-six churches reported a total membership of 3,268. In addition to these licensed workers there are some 163 local preachers who minister regularly in 171 Campos Blancos or preaching

Our work still only covers less than onefourth of the republic of El Salvador. The other three-fourths remains to be occupied. In view of the tremendous needs and the great opportunities on every hand for preaching the gospel, only a Holy Ghost ministry will avail. Pray with us that we may reach out to the unoccupied territory and that laborers will be raised up to meet the need.

Recently the way has been opened to have radio broadcasts which reach the entire republic and into other adjacent countries by long and short wave. By radio we reach people and interest them in the gospel who would never come to our churches to hear preaching. The best way to reach them is by radio.

We now have two minutes of Scripture reading at 6:30 p.m. daily just before the news broadcast. This costs us \$6 a month. We also have a half-hour broadcast every Tuesday at 8:30 p.m. which costs \$6 a month. Although these costs are very small we cannot meet them ourselves. We need your help. Offerings for these broadcasts should be designated "Radio, El Salvador" and sent to the Foreign Missions Department, 434 West Pacific Street, Springfield 1, Missouri.

THE GOSPEL DID THIS

Chaplain King tells a touching story of one of his experiences in the Bridewell House of

Correction, in Chicago:

"As I went about distributing tracts and witnessing to the women inmates, a tall heavy-set woman asked to talk with me. As we sat on a bench, she disclosed that for five years she had been living in sin, in a house of ill-repute, and now finding herself in prison, her desire was to die. She offered to pay me if I would bring her a razor blade. She said it was bad enough to be living in sin, but finding herself in prison was too much.

"This woman, looking like fifty—toothless, graying, with deep, dark circles around her eyes

-is only twenty-four.

"With my heart aching for this lost soul, I pleaded, and I said, 'Look how wonderful our Lord Jesus Christ is. You offer me money so I might bring you something whereby you might take and destroy your life. Praise the Lord, He loved you so that He paid it all with His life so that you should not perish but have everlasting life, and all you have to do is receive Him into your heart, and believe on Him, and thou shalt be saved.'

"I could see from that moment on her eyes becoming brighter as I opened the Scriptures further. It wasn't very many moments later that she repented and was graciously saved. She attends the Bible class faithfully, reads her Bible regularly, and is looking forward to the day when she will be released and return to her home in Pennsylvania to settle down and live for Jesus. Praise the Lord!"

THE REGATHERING CONTINUES

The United States of Indonesia, the newest country on the globe, has requested Israel and the Jewish Agency to assign representatives to that government in order to expedite the immigration of some of the 1200 Jews living there who have requested visas for Israel.

Out of 20,000 Jews who lived in China in 1945, only 5,000 remain. The Jewish Agency organized an immigration of more than 3,500 of China's Jews to Israel in less than four months.

CIGARETTE CONSUMPTION

Last year 60 million Americans consumed 400 billion cigarettes, according to *Reader's Digest*. "Every year," the report said, "some 800,000 nonsmokers join the smoking ranks. Two out of every three men, two out of every five women, one out of every seven boys of 14, smoke cigarettes. The average consumption is 19 a day. We spend some four billion dollars a year on tobacco products and supplies—twice as much as we pay all the public school teachers in the United States."

SYRIA'S NEW CONSTITUTION

Article Three in the projected new Constitution for Syria would make Islam the state religion. Mohammedan officials insist that this clause will not deprive other faiths of their religious liberty; nevertheless Christians and other non-Mohammedans are alarmed, as well they might be, and are opposing the adoption of this Article.

ARABS RECEIVING ARMS

Israel newspapers are expressing alarm over the continued shipment of British arms to the Arab States. Though Secretary of State Acheson has declared that it is "desirable for the Arab States to obtain from friendly reliable sources such arms as they may need for their legitimate security requirements," Israel spokesmen are pointing out that the Egyptian Government has been receiving destroyers, bombers, jet planes, heavy tanks and other weapons of offensive action.

If the Arabs were wise they would pursue a policy of genuine friendliness toward the Jews. The prophecy of Obadiah gives a solemn warning of divine judgment against Edom (the Arabs) for mistreatment of the chosen people.

ISRAEL'S NEW COINS

In Israel's new coins, the unit "milleme" has been changed to "pruta" (plural, "prutot") and the name "shekel" has been adopted instead of the "pound." There are 1000 prutot to a shekel, which is comparable to the British pound sterling.

The new series contains one-pruta and two-prutot coins minted of duraluminium, five- and ten-prutot coins of brass, 25-, 50-, and 100-prutot coins made of copper nickel. An eighth coin is yet to be minted. An experiment in minting the coins in Tel Aviv was not successful and so the first lot of coins was made in England.

Two of the coins (front and back) are shown below. The designs are based on those of Israel's ancient coins. They represent typical Israel fruits and objects such as olives, grapes, and ancient jars. The coins remind us of the time when Jesus said, "Show me the tribute money," and asked, "Whose is this image and superscription?" They answered, "Caesar's." In those days the Romans ruled the Jews and exacted taxes from them, but today the Jews do not pay tribute to any other state. They are a free nation—the prophecies of the Bible are being fulfilled—and so they have coins with their own images and superscriptions upon them.



INVESTMENTS IN ISRAEL

During 1949, a total of \$241,000,000 was invested in Israel. During the year, 250 new industrial enterprises were established, and 204 additional enterprises are today in process of establishment.

TAPPING DEAD SEA'S WEALTH

A pipe line has been injected into the Dead Sea 200 feet below the surface. It is 30 inches in diameter and 2800 feet long. Through this pipe, with the aid of enormous pumps, the Dead Sea is giving thousands of tons of useful chemicals.

A THREAT TO LIBERTY

What may happen when the Roman Catholic hierarchy is in full control of a nation was clearly revealed in the Assembly of the United Nations by the Polish delegate. As reported in the New York Times, this delegate quoted the following from the Bolivian legal code: "All who conspire directly to establish another religion in Bolivia, or to cause the Republic of Bolivia to cease professing the Roman Catholic apostolic religion, are traitors, and will suffer the penalty of death."

The Missionary Worker comments: "This is a law which is on the statute books; it could be legally enforced at any time. It may be that the church in Bolivia is only doing what she would do in the United States or in Canada did she have the opportunity and the power. Protestants are still heretics in the eyes of Rome, and will be treated as such wherever

Rome rules."

A LETTER FROM TRIESTE

Trieste has been in the news lately. Russia has demanded that America withdraw her troops from Trieste, but the Americans are remaining; and one of our Assemblies of God Army Chaplains, J. W. Hulme, Jr., is stationed at that point. Recently Brother Hulme wrote to the General Secretary in Springfield, and in the course of the letter he said:

"The work here progresses with God's blessing on us, and for that we give Him the honor and the glory. We recently had as our guest the Chief of Chaplains, General Parker, and his wife, during their tour of the European installations. He spoke for us in our Sunday morning service the week-end they were in Trieste, and it was a joy to have them with us. It made our hearts rejoice once again just yesterday when one of the Battalion men, a big, strong football player, came into the office to ask just what we meant on Sunday when we spoke of 'being a Christian.' Then, as we made the Old Story clear to him, to see the tears flow down his cheeks, in submission to his newly-found Master!

the first night we moved into the park. The altar space was packed out. They raised their hands heavenward and prayed, "God be merciful to me a sinner." You can imagine how I felt when I saw over 2000 men and women praying there at the altar, tears streaming down their cheeks. It thrills my heart when some of our pastors write and tell me how many of these people today are so faithful, going on serving the Lord Jesus Christ.


Every night the congregation grew—17,000, 20,000, 25,000. These are not my figures but are what the policemen reported. Then the professors of psychology of the University of Puerto Rico came out and said, "That is just mass psychology." I challenged the professors of psychology. I said, "Come here friends. I will get the people 'worked up' the way you say I work them up. After I have them all 'worked up' with the choir and the music and my sermon and everything else, I will line up the sick and then let you come up to the platform and use this 'mass psychology' that I have already built for you. You may lay your hands on the blind and on the paralytic and see if this 'mass psychology' will open the eyes of the blind and make the paralytic walk."

One day there appeared in the headlines of the newspapers of Puerto Rico this announcement: "Anyone that attends Evangelist Fierro's meetings will be excommunicated by the bishop of the Roman Catholic Church in Puerto Rico." That was my text for that night. I preached a salvation message. "Friends, they excommunicated me eighteen years ago," I said, "but Jesus took me in. I have never had so much peace and happiness in my life as I have today here in San Juan." I got warmed up and the glory of God came down. In the middle of my sermon I felt led to stop. I said, "How many of you will take my Jesus?" Over 2000 hands went up again.

My last night in San Juan I preached to 25,000 men and women, and saw over 3000 hands go up meaning, "I want Jesus. I want Jesus." Then I stood in that great park before the microphones and said, "Repeat this prayer after me." And they prayed in Spanish, "O God, be merciful unto me, a sinner, and save me right now in Jesus' name." Our personal workers dealt with the people as carefully as they could. I had never seen anything like it before and it humbled me.

The newspapers in Puerto Rico, like those in all of Latin America, are practically owned and controlled by our Roman Catholic friends. Yet they gave publicity to our campaign on a greater scale than any revival meeting ever received before, they say. I thought it was very kind of them. I quote from an article written by a Roman Catholic correspondent in El Mundo, Tuesday, February 28, 1950: "Multitude hears Evangelist Robert Fierro. It is calculated that nearly 200,000 persons heard Evangelist Fierro in his meetings in San Juan, Puerto Rico in ten days and witnessed his divine healing miracles. Daily he speaks more than twice and usually over the radio, and sometimes over a network of twenty stations. Last Sunday he talked and cured over a broadcast on this network for three hours."

You say, "Brother Fierro, where did you get the money to pay for a network in Puerto Rico and to broadcast for three hours so that you

The Assembly of God Church in Port Huron, Mich., dedicated this new place of worship on Nov. 6, 1949. The District Superintendent, Chas. W. H. Scott, brought the dedicatory message.

This Assembly was formed in the fall of 1939 when two small groups were brought together under the auspices of the Home Missions Committee of the District Council. Donald G. Foote became the first pastor and served for $3\frac{1}{2}$ years during which a solid foundation was laid and a substantial growth was enjoyed. When he left, Gene S. Hogan and Glenn M. Horst each served as pastor for a brief time.

About five years ago Orie L. Robinson became pastor. A building fund was opened with \$500 contributed by the Sunday School, as a step toward the building of a new church with adequate facilities to minister to the city and expand the kingdom of God. In July 1946 a

full city block was purchased in the heart of Port Huron. Ground was broken in March, 1949, for the new brick building, size 84 x 42. Eight months later it was ready to be dedicated.

About ten men in the church consistently donated many hours of labor, working on the church building after hours. The ladies helped by serving lunches to the workers. As a result of this sacrificial effort, the building was erected and completely equipped for only \$30,000. The main floor has an auditorium which seats close to 400, and a nursery, church office, and Sunday school office. The basement has nine Sunday School rooms as well as a small auditorium.

Brother Robinson recently resigned from the church in order to enter the evangelistic field, and Paul A. Evans, formerly pastor in Terre Haute. Ind., is the new pastor at Port Huron.

could be heard in Cuba, the Dominican Republic, the Virgin Islands, and the St. Thomas Islands?" I didn't have to pay five cents for it. They gave me the time. God moved in such a mighty way that wherever I went they cancelled other programs and gave me practically any hour I wanted. Every one of my divine healing meetings that went over the air was broadcast from the Nazarene Church that is pastored by the superintendent of the Nazarene Church in Puerto Rico, Lebon J. Velasquez, a great minister of the gospel. Brother Velasquez held a little pot of oil as I dipped my finger and anointed the people for whom I prayed. A minister of the Disciples of Christ would say, in describing the meetings: "Here comes an elderly paralytic woman. Now Brother Fierro dips his finger in oil. He puts his finger on her forehead. Friends, the paralytic is walking. The crowd is excited." It touched my heart to watch the dear Disciples of Christ minister going through that. The way the Methodist brethren, the Baptist brethren, and the ministers of other denominations, as well as our own Assembly of God brethren, backed me up just thrilled me through and through. Everywhere I went they would block off the streets for blocks around. I had never been treated so royally and I didn't know how to behave.

My wife and children, as well as Brother Velasquez, the superintendent of the Nazarene Church, and Luis C. Otero, the editor of our official Assemblies of God organ in Puerto Rico, went with me every place I went.

I arrived in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico. The Knights of Columbus had already sent word by an important attorney, saying, "If Fierro doesn't leave the country pretty soon, we'll get rid of him." I said, "It is all right; I don't know of a place where I would rather die than here in Puerto Rico." Unsaved people (not our Christian people) began to gather outside the hotel, saying, "If they kill Fierro there will be a revolution in Puerto Rico." I said, "I don't need anybody to defend me—God is with me"; but the Police Department put a policeman in my room with my wife and children to see that no one was molested.

A man came to the lobby where I was having breakfast with Brother Velasquez. The man was blind, and a little boy was leading him. He said, "Be merciful to me; ask your God to heal me." Right there before the room clerk and the superintendent of the Nazarene Church, I reached over and prayed for the man, and said, "Receive thy sight." The man opened his eyes and saw. The room clerk, an unsaved man, raised his hands and said, "God be praised."

The district attorney came to the meetings because the Knights of Columbus had said, "This is a fraud." He stood close by, looking for something by which to pin me down. Here came a little deaf and dumb lad, brought by his father, an unsaved Roman Catholic man. We prayed for the deaf and dumb boy. He heard and he spoke. The district attorney asked him some questions and the boy answered him. Then we prayed for a paralytic, and she walked. The district attorney tapped me on the back and said, "Do what you want to do in Puerto Rico. I'll back you up."

A man wrote to me, saying, "Brother Fierro, I was a paralytic for seventeen years. You said on the broadcast to lay my hand over the radio and take my healing. There was nobody at home to assist me, so I threw myself off the bed and dragged myself to the radio. I laid my hand over the radio in faith, and your God healed me." That man ran all over Bayamon, Puerto Rico, saying to the people, "Remember me? I'm the paralytic that was bedridden seventeen years. Hallelujah! God healed me over the radio, and that evangelist is coming tonight to Bayamon." It was the best advertising we could have. When I got to Bayamon that night, there were 30,000 men and women in the park. They had commenced to gather at 7:00 in the morning, though we had announced the meeting for 7:30 p.m. The government of Puerto Rico furnished ambulances for the sick to come in. They brought the people to the platform on stretchers and we prayed for them. My Jesus healed the sick, and the ambulance drivers went back with empty stretchers.

Friends, we have what the world needs. I sincerely believe that Pentecost is off the parking lot. Pentecost is off the shelf! Pentecost is on the march! It is time to tell the world that Jesus saves, that He heals, that He baptizes with the Holy Ghost, and that He is coming again. Since I returned from Puerto Rico, two denominations have written to ask me if I would travel for them throughout Latin America. I answered, "Thank you very much, but will you let me preach what I want to preach?" They replied, "Well, we will talk it over with you." You can be sure this smoked Irishman is not going to compromise with any of them. I'm going to preach the whole counsel of God, and if God be with me we will get the job done.

Here is another paragraph that a prominent Catholic correspondent wrote in the newspaper in Puerto Rico: "The number of 'conversions' is calculated at 13,000. He will visit the towns of Ponce, Mayaguez, and Aguadilla, and Thursday he will be preaching in the Methodist Church? You should have heard those Methodists. The Methodist preacher threw his arms around me, planted a kiss on my cheek, and said, "Brother Fierro, I need what you have." "I know it," I said, "and you will find it in Acts 2:4."

Friends, we are challenged today as never before. Men and women are sick of religion. They want God; they want reality; they want New Testament Christianity. What are you and I going to do to help spread this great Holy Ghost revival? It is wonderful that we have nearly 700 foreign missionaries, but we should have more than that. There are many Spiritfilled young men and women that my God would bless and honor with signs following in preaching the gospel in Mexico, Central America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, and the islands of the sea. They apply for missionary







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appointment, saying, "I have consecrated my life to God, and I feel His call. Will you send me?" But our Foreign Missions Department has to answer, "We can't send you. We haven't the finances to send you." Do you think God is pleased? If we are going to get this old sin-sick world evangelized, it is going to take the help of every one of us. We will have to sacrifice in order to keep the Pentecostal fires burning and spreading. The fire will only fall on the sacrifice.

When my wife and I were returning from Mexico City, right in the middle of the highway stood a little Mexican lad. "Stop! Stop!" he cried. I stopped and asked, in Spanish, "What do you want?" He said, "I am hungry. Give me bread." I looked at my wife and asked, "Do we have any bread to give this little lad?" I

took a piece of bread and gave it to him. He clasped it in both hands, and said, "Gracias, Senor. Thank you, Mister." He immediately began eating that hard bread. Tears of gratitude streamed down his little cheeks.

I shall never forget that as long as I live. "Give me bread. Give me bread." Friends, it is the spiritual cry of the whole world today. "Give us bread." Men and women are slipping through our fingers, dying without Jesus and without hope. The Roman Catholics, who have nothing to offer the world, are saying, "We are going to knock at the door of every home in the world." Oh, my friends, we have the message of Jesus; we have a mighty God who is able to supply every spiritual need. Do we have the faith to propagate the message? Are we willing to sacrifice that others may know Him?

RUSSIA IN PROPHECY

Dardanelles Strait to the Mediterranean and has made territorial demands on Turkey. Russia has proposed, at least, the internationalization of the Dardanelles, though she is opposed in this by the Western Powers. Thus she is designedly moving toward the Middle East, the great commercial crossroads of Britain and the other nations.

Now let us note who are the allies of the prophetic "Rosh" or Russia in her designs on the land of Palestine. Of what nations is she the "guard" or commander as the text in Ezekiel says? The answer is found in verses 5 and 6: "Persia, Ethiopia or Cush, and Libya or Put . . . Gomer and all his bands, the house of Togarmah of the north quarters and all his bands, and many people with thee.'

Persia is simply and easily identified. Need we recall the fact that for several decades Britain and Russia have shared spheres of interest in northern and southern Persia, based on their desire for the great oil fields of that country. Now that the great war is over, Russia, as we all well know, has been intriguing to get complete control of northern Persia and eventually, we believe, of the whole country, by creating an autonomous state in Azerbaijan, under the guise of a revolt on the part of that section of Persia against the central government at Teheran. The purpose of this is so obvious that a school boy can understand it. This Iranian problem, as we know, caused the fire to fly between the British and Russian representatives in the London sessions of the U. N. Security Council.

Another ally is "Ethiopia" or, better, Cush. This term does not refer, we believe, to the realm of Hailie Salassie, recently recovered from Italy by the war, but to a people in the country of Arabia, or else to the Kassites, who for some centuries dominated the land of Babylonia or modern Iraq.

Put, or Libya, is not so easily identified, but "Gomer" is with very little difficulty identified with Germany. Referring back to the beginnings of the nations descended from Noah in Genesis 10 we find Gomer and his son Ashkenaz mentioned in verse 2. Gomer is seen by some students of ethnology as the progenitor of the barbarians of the tribe of Germani, who in turn were the ancestors of the modern Teutonic people.

The identification of Ashkenaz, Gomer's son, is very clear. If you will ask the Jewish shopkeeper who Ashkenaz is, he will say: "Ashkenaz? Vy, dat is Ghormany." In the Encyclopedia Britannica, Elias Levita, the great Jewish grammarian, preferred to call himself "Ashkenazi," that is, the German. In the same source of information the Ashkenazi or German Jews are contrasted with the Sephardic or Spanish Jews. Thus we have Germany identified as a satellite of Russia in this end-time invasion of the Near East.

We are all familiar with the picture now before us of a defeated Germany, the eastern part of which beyond the Elbe is completely under the domination of Russia, and where the veil of secrecy has fallen, from behind which only fragments of information are coming. However, we hear enough to indicate that machinery, tools, animals, foodstuffs and everything of value

which is transportable, is being removed to Russia, to compensate her for Germany's destruction of the vast agricultural and industrial wealth of Russia's western provinces.

The stage is being set for the final acts in the great drama of God's prophetic program. The coming of the Lord must be very near. Are you ready to meet Him?


Among the Assemblies
