A Good Conscience

Some people think of a good conscience as a luxury they cannot afford —but actually it's within the reach of all and it's a bargain at any price. A good conscience is an aid to health and happiness. It guarantees a

better night's rest than a dose of sleeping pills.

According to a press release, the Internal Revenue Service of the U. S. Government receives \$700 to \$800 every day which it calls "conscience money." People send it as restitution for real or fancied debts. The individual remittances range from one dollar to four thousand (which was the amount an anonymous person in Chicago sent in recently) and last year these contributions came to the astounding total of \$283,473.16. During the previous year the "conscience fund" received only \$88,014.76 so the 1959 total was more than three times as great. Either the consciences of men have grown more tender or else the public has grown more dishonest and therefore has more restitution to make.

You can save yourself a great deal of future remorse by filing an honest report of your income with the Government. It's income tax that causes most cramps of conscience. But not all. A government worker in Boston enclosed \$25 with a nice letter explaining that he had used government stationery for his private correspondence and he wanted to settle the debt. Unfortunately, however, he had not yet forsaken the sin he was confessing, for he penned his plea for pardon on a government letterhead!

Ex-soldiers or their mothers or wives send many a ten-dollar bill to the Government's "conscience fund" to cover foot lockers, bug bombs, blankets, and other items carted home from army camps. If the Lord reminds you of some dishonest deed, big or little, you will be wise to make it right. You may elude the Government but you can't elude God.

Some day you will have to answer for every sin.

An anonymous correspondent from Birmingham, Alabama, recently sent \$250 to Washington with this comment: "I got saved and I feel I must do this. How is it with your soul?" That's a good question. How is it with your conscience? Is it sensitive to right and wrong? Does it trouble you when you stretch the truth a bit? Or can you listen to an off-color story without blushing? Some ignore the voice of conscience until it ceases to give a warning. The apostle Paul said that in the latter times some people would have consciences "seared with a hot iron" (1 Timothy 4:2). A tongue that is seared with hot food loses its ability to taste, and a conscience that is seared with perpetual wickedness loses its ability to register any protest. Be thankful if you have a tender conscience. Listen to it. Obey it. Paul said, "Herein do I exercise myself, to have always a conscience void of offense toward God and toward men" (Acts 24:16). He had to pay a price for that kind of conscience. It cost him submission, self-denial, suffering, service to God and men, day after day, but Paul had his eye on a crown of glory that he would not be denied. He wanted to win Christ's approval. A good conscience never comes cheap but it's worth whatever the price tag says. How is it with your conscience?

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

Midweek Meetings Are Important

In Hebrews 10:25 we read: "Not forsaking the assembling of yourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."

The lukewarm believers the writer had in mind had formed a habit of neglecting attendance at the meetings of the Christians.

We are not told why, but it is just possible that they feared personal danger in a time of persecution. After all, it could be risky, as well as unpopular, to be known as one who attended meetings of Christians. For most of us that danger simply does not exist. At the most, we are likely to be regarded as slightly different if we attend too many religious meetings, especially on week nights.

But the whole tone of the letter to the Hebrews makes it clear that the real reason for their forsaking the meetings of the saints was simply backsliding and spiritual lukewarmness. They neglected going to church through sheer lack of interest. This culpable disregard had become a fixed "manner" or habit.

Why was it a serious fault to forsake assembling themselves together until it had become a habit? Of course, we recognize that Christians can make constant church attendance a substitute for a personal walk with God. It is possible almost to live at meetings, and then to live by meetings. This is a real, though subtle, danger. But now we are seriously considering the opposite peril-that of neglecting meetings. The writer to the Hebrews must have considered this a serious matter since he linked his exhortation to be faithful in attending the services with the approach of "The Day" Christ's return).

While it is perfectly true that we can pray alone, and praise alone, and

can read the Word of God alone—and ought so to do—it is also profoundly true that our souls receive much added strength by doing all these things in company with others. Paul wanted to be "comforted together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me" (Romans 1:12). When personal faith is struggling for victory—almost for survival—there is tremendous comfort in meeting others who are in the same good fight.

A Pentecostal prayer meeting is a good place to pray. The early Christians were refilled with the Holy Spirit where they were assembled together (Acts 4:31). In the Book of Acts all the local "Pentecosts" seemed to happen in meetings. If the Third Person of the Trinity thus honors our assembling together we shall be wise to do the same. It is a tragic loss to be absent when the Lord of glory deigns to come among His people and manifest His power. We can easily miss a most glorious occasion.

To sing praise to God all alone is delightful. To join in the praises of a great congregation is thrilling and a foretaste of heaven for pure emotion. But we are exhorted to teach and ad-


monish one another in "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" and it is hard to escape the conclusion that the reference is to singing in the ordinary meetings of the local assembly. Such humble occasions carry their own sweet happiness.

Most of all, the assembly, for us, is the place where we enjoy the ministry of the Word, especially on week nights. It is in such meetings that gifted brethren can best exercise their Godgiven ministries. Lonely reading of the Bible can sometimes leave us as perplexed as the Ethiopian eunuch was before Philip showed him the key. Individualistic Bible study brings subtle temptations to pride, and we need to be guided in paths of sound doctrine by the judgment of others. More and more companies of believers are finding the joys of group study, as well as listening to more formal sermons, though these must always be given an honored place.

The delights and spiritual benefits of good services seem almost endless. To forsake assembling ourselves together is evidence that our whole spiritual life has sunk to a low ebb. We have plainly left our first love and need to repent. "The lusts of other things" have entered in (Mark 4:19) and our true life in Christ is being stifled. We can remedy this by returning to the house of God and seeking Him regularly in company with other believers.

That every Christian should gather with others on the first day of the week goes without saying. No sane Christian will dispute the duty and privilege of attending divine worship on Sundays. But what about this disputed matter of week-night meetings? I am told there is a regrettable tendency in America, as there is here in England, to leave these meetings to the "faithful few." This is a sad com-

"Begin at My Sanctuary"

A ND HE CALLED TO THE MAN clothed with linen, which had the writer's inkhorn by his side; and the Lord said unto him, Go through the midst of the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and set a mark upon the foreheads of the men that sigh and that cry for all the abominations that be done in the midst thereof" (Ezekiel 9:3, 4).

Who is this mysterious person with the inkhorn, clothed with the linen garments of the high priest? It is none other than the Lord of glory. He sighs over the abomination of the people He has redeemed by His precious blood. He sighs over their barren spiritual condition.

He sighs because he cannot deny His holiness and shut His eyes to their sins. "Son of man, these men have set up their idols in their heart, and put the stumbling block of their iniquity before their face: should I be enquired of at all by them?" (Ezekiel 14:3) God cannot answer their prayers. They are an abomination to Him. The mighty arm of Jehovah is paralyzed in the midst of such awful conditions (Isaiah 59:1, 2).

SEPARATION BEFORE JUDGMENT

We are living in a day when iniquity abounds and the love of many is waxed cold. Compromise and callousness are among the crying evils of the present age. The Son of God is looking for Gethsemane companions. Has He found one in you?

As He has gone through your assembly, how many has He marked? Has He marked your forehead with His sacred sign of fellowship and identification? Does He find you among the godly remnant in these last dark days of a dying dispensation of grace, sighing for the abominations and sins of the Church? Are you among the believers to whom God has become a "little sanctuary" (Ezekiel 11:16)?

THE MARKED ONES

The "marked ones" are those who have claimed their "Magna Charta" of liberty from Romans eight, and have a heart free to enter into fellowship with Christ for others. Alas! Many Christians have to spend their time crying and sighing over their own sins and failures so that they have no authority to exercise their priestly function for others.

True intercession is the costliest of all Christian service. It is no mere lip service. It is the heart-agony of the Father expressed through us by the Holy Spirit, as He makes intercession through us (Romans 8:26). We never

really pray until our hearts and minds become the praying ground of the Spir-

What does this mark involve? In Ezekiel's case this mark of intercession meant full identification with the sufferings of God on behalf of His backslidden people, and full identification with the people in their idolatry.

In the plans and purposes of God we are to be instruments of the Spirit's intercession. When we seek the gifts and graces of this high and holy ministry, and allow our great High Priest and Saviour Jesus Christ, to put His secret sign upon our forehead, we bear the burden in true identification for the condition of the Church and the world.

The moment we give ourselves to the Lord to be marked with the secret sign, that moment we must lay all on the altar of sacrifice and ourselves become "living sacrifices" (Rom. 12:1).

"BEGIN AT MY SANCTUARY"

It is imperative that God's ministers and people recognize that revival begins when the inner temple of God is cleansed from the abominations of the saints. Revival is not believers going down the street beating big drums, but saints with broken hearts sobbing their way to Calvary. Revival is not so much the drunkard being saved—as deliverance in God's people from their abominations.

"Begin at my sanctuary," says the Holy One to all that seek revival and renewal (Ezekiel 9:6). "Begin at my sanctuary" is the first lesson in the school of God concerning the theme of revival. The Church and the world are sleeping. Where shall we blow the trumpet? The answer is always the same; "Begin at my sanctuary!" "Blow the trumpet in Zion" (Joel 2:15).

"Judgment must begin at the house of God... and if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?" (1 Peter 4:17-18)

This sanctuary lesson is a hard one for the Church to learn, as the leaders have given a new rendering of 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If the people of the devil, who are called by his name, shall humble themselves and pray and seek God's face and turn from their wicked ways, then we will have a glorious revival!" God's revival challenge is still "If my people..." The "if" of revival rests upon the obedience of the saints.

"And I will sanctify my great name which was profaned among the heathen, which ye have profaned in the midst of them; and the heathen shall know that I am the Lord, saith the Lord God, when I shall be sanctified in you before their eyes." (Ezekiel 36:23). When will God do these great and mighty things in revival? When He is sanctified among the saints! "Begin at my sanctuary!"

THE GODLY REMNANT

There has always been the godly remnant which has kept the spirit of purity and power in the Church throughout the ages. "Except the Lord of hosts had left unto us a very small remnant, we should have been as Sodom, and we should have been like unto Gomorrah" (Isaiah 1:9). In the messages of the Risen Lord to the seven churches, we see this little band of overcomers standing red-hot and true for God amidst the compromise and abominations around them (Revelation, chapters 2 and 3).

It has been men and women like Tersteegen, Hans Hauge, Thomas Boston, F. B. Meyer, and Catherine Booth, in their "watch towers," with deep spiritual perception, that have helped to keep the Church burning bright and pure for God (Habakkuk 2:1). Oh, for a host of men and women to sigh and groan over these things that grieve

the heart of our blessed Lord, and hinder the preparation of the Bride for His coming! (Ephesians 5:27)

Are you yourself among the number who are weeping and broken down before God because of the spiritual adultery and coldness of the saints? Says William Bramwell in his diary, "I have seen nearly twenty believers set at liberty. I believe I should have seen many more, but I cannot yet find one pleading man. There are many good people, but I have found no wrestlers with God."

How comforting to know that the very same eye of God that saw the secret sins of His people also saw the secret groanings of His separated ones! How few there are who have the signmarks in their forehead because of their holy concern for the deplorable condi-

tion of Zion! If "the effectual fervent prayer" of one righteous man availed much with God, how much more the united prayers of your entire church! (James 5:16)

"If one sigh of a true Christian," says an old divine, "wafts the bark to the desired haven, or stirreth Zion's ship, how much more a gale of sighs, breathed by hundreds of believers! If one trumpet sounds so loud in the ears of God, how much more the concert of all the silver trumpets in Zion sounding together! Where so many hands are lifted up, how many blessings may they not pull down from heaven!"

Oh! that all Christians may be candidates for the sign-mark of holy agonizing intercession in this critical hour of the Church's history!

What Does the Bible Teach About Church Membership?

A RECORD OF THE FIRST ALTAR CALL of the early church is found in Acts 2:41, "And the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls." Thank God for this record!

Our Bible is a great collection of inspired records without which we would be ignorant concerning the creation of the universe, the first man, the calling of Israel, the plan of redemption, and the formation of the Church. Without the record of God's Word we would be at the mercy of speculation.

Evidently God considers records to be important. He has been careful to preserve the Scripture records for us and we ought to be careful to keep church records. Let us study this matter of recording Christian allegiance and church membership.

There are times when church membership is wrong; for example, when it is a substitute for salvation. Ephesians 2:8, 9 plainly states, "For by grace are ye saved, through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." Jesus speaks to unregenerate church members as well as to "dyed in the wool" sinners when he says, "Ye must be born again."

When the disciples returned with joy that devils were subject unto them, Jesus said, "...in this rejoice not... but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20)—not on the church roll, but written in heaven. Church membership is no substitute for salvation.

On the other hand, let us observe when church membership is right. Study the accuracy of Old Testament records. Numbers 1:2 says, "Take ye the sum of all the congregation of the children of Israel, after their families, by the house of their fathers, with the

number of their names...." Every man, woman, boy, and girl had his name registered in the book of records. Vital issues were solved with these records. Nehemiah expelled men from the priesthood when their record was not found as legitimate successors to the priestly ministry (Nehemiah 7:64). Genealogies were traced by these records. The ancestral line of our Saviour was traced in Matthew. What an inspiration to read of Ruth's choice, placing her in the ancestral line of the Messiah.

Since the apostles were so used to their Jewish custom of keeping accurate records of names and genealogies, as in the Old Testament, it would be unthinkable that no records were kept of the precious souls added to the church from Pentecost on. When my text says, "... the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls," we can feel sure their names were recorded by some ready scribe, and the records were kept.

At salvation the recording angel enters our name in the Book of Life. Revelation 21:27 states, "Whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life." I marvel at the thought of the repentant sinner on earth coming to Christ, while the angel records his name in heaven. Since we are enrolled already in the Book of heaven, how fitting that we also should be enrolled in the records of the church on earth.

Luke tells how Joseph and Mary journeyed to Bethlehem to be taxed, or *enrolled*, as the word is more accurately rendered. They traveled eighty miles over rough roads to swear allegiance to the Roman Emperor. No doubt they were questioned as to their name and birthplace, and then commanded to pay allegiance to Caesar

Augustus. The Emperor wanted to learn the potential strength of his empire.

How tragic that today so many are unwilling to stand up in the church and be counted. They refuse to give their names, so no record can be kept of them. Future generations will find no record because they refused to be enrolled. Stand by the church of your choice. Support it, stand up and be counted. Every child of God has a Biblical warrant for belonging to a church. It is part of his public confession to stand before men and affiliate himself with the Church of the living God.

It costs something to belong to the Church. James was beheaded. Stephen was stoned. Paul was executed. These men were among that noble band whose names were enrolled on the register of the early church. Five martyrs in Ecuador, 700 in one week in Red China, and many more in Colombia remind us that "belonging" is still costly. While here in America we are less likely to suffer shame or martyrdom, yet there still is a price to pay. God commands that we be a separate people—that we do not conform to this world. A life of holiness still draws the devil's fire.

Far greater than the cost to us is the price paid by the Head of the Church for us to belong. The Church —the Bride of Christ—owes her life to her Lord. He died to win us. How a Christian should prize his membership in the Church of Jesus Christ!

Also, there are joys in belonging to the Church. Jesus said, "...rejoice that your names are written in heaven." The angels rejoice over every sinner that repents and there is an echo of that joy in our hearts as we take our place among the Redeemed down here. The Lord said, "Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven" (Matthew 10:32).

A friend of mine in the ministry told this heart-touching story of his boyhood. Born and reared in abject poverty, he recalled the day he walked barefooted over the dusty country road by his father's side to the beautiful big brick home of the senator of his state. My friend remembered the awe he felt as a small boy sitting on the upholstered chair in the luxurious living room while his father conversed in the inner office with the senator.

After what seemed an eternity, the two men stepped from the office and parted, the father saying, "Senator, I'll let you know."

Walking homeward on the dusty road the father said, "Son, you have a big decision to make. The senator wants to adopt you as his own boy. If you feel you would like to be his son, then some day that big brick home will be yours. You can have a college education. You will have everything that I have been unable to give you. Son, I'll leave it to you to make your own decision."

As he walked in silent thought there swept over the boy's heart a wave of feeling. Turning to his father he said, "No, Dad, I'm your boy. I belong to you."

Reaching into his worn pocket the father pulled out his greatest treasure—an Elgin watch—and presented it to his son, saying, "Son, you will never know how happy you have made me today."


That boy belonged. He was proud to belong. Oh, I am glad I belong to Jesus Christ. I am thankful I belong to His Church. I am happy for the day I said "Yes" to God and turned from a cold, modernistic church to a humble Spirit-filled group of Assembly people—a part of His blood-bought company.

Souls Are Like Diamonds

HILE ATTENDING NORTH CENTRAL Bible College in Minneapolis I worked in one of the leading jewelry stores in that city. One day after school I walked to my job with the discussion of the last class still vivid in my mind. It had been about winning souls. I went to the place in the store where a craftsman I'll call George was polishing and setting precious stones. As I watched him work I became aware that here was an object lesson in soul winning.

George's fingers were marked by large lumps. When I asked the reason, he said, "We have so constantly to press the diamond in polishing it that these lumps are forced out upon our fingers. They are the result of years of patient pressure upon many a diamond."

I thought how we Christians who work on the diamonds that are human souls, bear in our bodies and spirits the marks of our labor. We have scars of the conflict through which we have gone in trying to prepare these jewels for the Master.

When asked where the diamonds are found, George said, "In Africa, deep down in the mines, in a certain kind

of clay or mud. They are found by those who seek them on their knees. When they are brought up out of the mines they are placed in the sun which dries the mud, and then they are washed and carefully preserved."

How important it is that we humble ourselves if we would lift men up to God. Think how far Jesus stooped—all the way from heaven to Calvary—to save us!

As I was looking at the uncut and unpolished gem, George told me that those who removed the diamonds from the mud rarely if ever used a pick or other sharp instrument, for fear of injuring the precious gem. And I prayed, "O Lord, let me never use a sharp word, or be hard in dealing with precious souls, and please forgive me for the mistakes and thoughtless treatment of some in the past."

"Handle with care" is the label God places on every soul.

George began to polish a stone, and I asked, "What material is that wheel made of?"

"Diamond dust," was his reply, and he went on to say, "A diamond can only be polished by another; there is no other material that can have any effect upon it."

And I thought, Only the human heart can deal with another human heart; only one subject to the same passions and temptations is able to understand fully and deal wisely with his fallen yet precious brother. Even Jesus humbled Himself to become a man that He might know our limitations by experience. And how He can deal with the human heart!

As I looked at George, hunched uncomfortably over the wheel while polishing that stone, I asked, "How long will it take?"

"Sometimes weeks," he replied. And after a pause he added, "No work in the world demands more patience, keener sight, and better judgment than dealing with these gems."

Why should I ever tire of dealing with a human soul? That on which this craftsman works will perish, but the souls we win for Jesus will live forever.

George spoke again. "But when I see one of these diamonds, after weeks of labor, with its many sides polished, and each reflecting in a different way the rays of the sun, I forget all my labor, my trial of patience, and the weary hours I spent, in the joy of seeing the result of that labor."

But there is no joy on earth that can compare to the joy of seeing a soul come to the Lord as a result of our faithful witnessing and prayer!

Then I asked a question that had long puzzled me. "Just how do you place a price on the finished gem?" George explained that a diamond's value is determined by four things: color, cut, clarity, and carat weight.

The certified gemologist uses a diamond scope for this process. This is a box with a brilliant light focused on the stone, and a magnifying glass through which to examine the stone while it is under the light. In this manner he can see if there are any flaws or imperfections. The eyes of our Saviour are as a flaming fire, searching the souls of men.

I learned that diamonds vary in color. They may be canary yellow, a deep brown coffee color, some shade of blue, or they may be red or some shade of orange. Some of the colored stones have a greater value than the "white" variety. Stones of sapphire blue command the highest prices.

Some diamonds are of great value commercially, but have no value on the gem market.

This spoke to me of the different places of service in which a redeemed soul can be used by the Master. Who are we to determine our places of service? We must leave it to the divine Gemologist to determine our sphere of usefulness.

The cut is the shape of the diamond after it has been polished. There is the brilliant cut which has fifty-eight facets or sides, each of which reflects the light. There are also the emerald, pendant, marquise, and other cuts. Each stone is cut so that the greatest beauty can be utilized from the rough stone. The craftsman must judge how to cut the stone. And the Master Craftsman decides where we may serve the best. Oh, to be surrendered to His plan for our lives.

The clarity of a diamond, the freedom from imperfections in the finished product, also helps determine its value. Is it clear as crystal, or can you see the spots under the test of the light?

Christ longs to present us to Himself "a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing." He wants us without blemish.

I was surprised to learn that carat weight is the least important of the items in pricing a stone. A gem may

Mostly, though, the smiling chaplain may be seen distributing literature. On the Alaskan run he is known for placing the "Grace Cards" aboard the MATS aircraft. These cards contain a sentence or two so that all may say "grace" before partaking of meals served en route.

Many hours of the chaplain's time are devoted to such organizations as the Washington State Association for Retarded Children, the children's wards at Western State Hospital, and a number of local charitable organizations.

Chaplain McElyea received his Bachelor of Science degree from Southwestern Bible Institute, Waxahachie, Texas, and the Bachelor of Divinity from the Phillips University Seminary.

Brother McElyea is one of 18 Assemblies of God ministers on active duty in the military chaplaincy. Six of these men serve with the Air Force, nine are with the Army, while three are with the Navy. These chaplains, as well as chaplains and servicemen of all faiths, are serviced through literature, correspondence, and in other ways without charge by the Servicemen's Division. be large and flashy, but full of imperfections that reduce its value. George showed me a stone that he said was a full carat in weight, but it could be purchased for \$100. Then he showed me a half-carat stone which would cost a customer \$250. He pointed out that the large stone had a spot of imperfection in it while the smaller one was flawless.

The lesson was evident. Who are we to judge a soul by outwar! appearances? Every soul is one for whom Christ died; every life is very precious

in His sight. Only the Master can place the correct value on each one.

As I left the shop that day, I knew God had spoken to me. I realized that I must never take lightly my responsibility as a "diamond worker" in partnership with the Master Craftsman. The seeking and finding and care of precious souls is hard and particular work, but it is infinitely rewarding too. Let us thank God for choosing us to have a part in it, and ask Him to make us obedient, skillful, and effective workers.

Television

BAPTISTS BURN THEIR TV SETS

Three members of the Mount Zion Baptist Church near Webster, Florida, recently burned their T V sets in protest against beer and cigarette commercials. Two other members returned their sets to dealers.

The pastor said, "The Holy Spirit put the members under conviction and, praise God, they got rid of them." The burning occurred near the church grounds on Sunday, January 17, immediately after the morning worship service. The church has 140 members.

Temperance

CHURCHES OPPOSE MOVE TO SILENCE TEACHERS ON LIQUOR EVILS

Churches in New York are mustering opposition to a measure introduced by Senator Dominick in the state legislature which, they say, would forbid teachers to mention the effects of liquor in physiology and hygiene classes in public schools.

GOVERNMENT ISSUES NEW RULE ON AIRLINE LIQUOR

Commercial airlines are prohibited from serving alcoholic beverages to any person "who appears to be intoxicated," under a new regulation of the Federal Aviation Agency which will become effective March 10. The new rule also imposes a fine of up to \$1,000 on any passenger who insists on drinking from his own bottle while aloft.

The FAA (successor to Civil Aeronautics Administration) said passengers who bring their own liquor aboard will have to give the bottles to the airline hostesses, who will pour it for them on request. The government agency said the new regulation is aimed at preventing intoxication among airline passengers, for safety's sake.

Church and temperance leaders are insisting that the government ought to go much further than this and prohibit all liquor drinking on passenger flights.

Radio

TANGIER GOSPEL BROADCASTS HALTED

An announcement from Stockholm informs us that the IBRA radio ministry in Tangier, sponsored by the Pentecostal churches of Sweden, has been halted by the Moroccan government. As of January 1, 1960, the Morrocan government has monopolized all radio activity in the country.

However, the IBRA board of directors has not given up hope of resuming this European radio ministry. Various stations around the world will be utilized. IBRA is already broadcasting over stations in Bolivia, Belgian Congo, and Japan.

NEW FEBC STATION DEDICATED

KSDX, the twelfth station of the Far East Broadcasting Company network in Asia, was formally dedicated on Okinawa February 7. The new station, broadcasting entirely in Japanese for the Ryukyuan population of Okinawa, has been on the air since January.

The inauguration of this new 1,000-watt transmitter has made it possible for KSAB, the other FEBC station on Okinawa, to switch entirely to English for the benefit of the many American servicemen and their dependents on the island. A third transmitter, to broadcast almost entirely in Chinese, is now being installed with 100,000 watts of power. It will be beamed toward Red China.

The Far East Broadcasting Company is dedicated to making known the gospel of Christ. It operates two mediumwave and eight short-wave stations in Manila, Philippines, one of which reaches as far as India and Ceylon.

Israel

JEWS PLAN TO SET UP MISSION CENTER IN JERUSALEM

An organization known as the Association for the Propagation of Judaism has announced plans for setting up a center in Jerusalem, at which missionaries will be trained, as well as a hostel to house prospective converts

coming to Israel. The organization has about 250 active members.

According to Jewish sources, the project lacks widespread support. Jewish religious leaders generally are opposed to attempts to convert non-Jews through evangelistic methods. Last year the Chief Rabbinate in Israel accepted only 200 of the 1,000 candidates for conversion to Judaism. Many of these were Christian wives of Jewish immigrants to Israel from eastern Europe.

Russia

CHRISTIANS IN RUSSIA FACE DILEMMA

On his return from a visit to Russia, where Christians may attend church but are not allowed to take the gospel to others, Tom Allan asked in Glasgow, "Can the Church live in a vacuum and still be true to Jesus Christ? Is this non-political, non-missionary church really a reflection of what the Church of Christ was meant to be? Has the Church in Russia compromised its conscience?"

At the same time, the Church of Scotland clergyman warned his hearers: "It is only those Christians who are living on the razor's edge who have a right to speak. We can neither criticize nor condemn. Our most urgent need in the West is the discovery of a new moral dynamic, a new sense of our involvement in history, a new commitment to the real issues of living. We have become sated with things, and yet can see nothing better in life than to possess more of the things which we no longer know how to use."

Rome

ROME OPENS PERMANENT EXHIBITION OF WORLD INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS

Rome is making its bid for prominence as a world trading center. A permanent market for the exhibition and sale of industrial products recently opened in the ancient city. "Permindex," as the new world market is called, is housed in four huge marble-faced buildings erected for Mussolini's 1942

Universal Exhibition which was cancelled owing to the war.

Industrial products from all the countries of the world will be displayed at the new "permanent industrial exhibition," which (according to Prophetic News) is sponsored by an organization based in Switzerland.

PRIEST SAYS ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH IS LOSING LATIN AMERICA

A Roman Catholic priest has warned that the Catholic Church is losing Latin America, and with it-to use his words -"practically one-half the Catholics in the world."

The Rev. Roger Vekemans is director of the School of Sociology at the Catholic Pontifical University of Chile. He wrote in a national Catholic magazine that the cause of the defection from the church is "just plain secularism." He declared that Latin America cannot save itself—that "a big movement of the Catholic countries all over the world is the only solution."

ROMAN CATHOLICS PREPARE ENCYCLOPEDIA OF SIN

A 928-page encyclopedia of sin has been published by a group of Catholic scholars in Rome. Its purpose, as explained in the preface, is to remind men of the traditional concept of sin "because one cannot otherwise explain history nor give an orientation to life." The preface also cites Pope Pius XII's statement that "the greatest sin of the world today is that men have started to lose the sense of sin."

The book reportedly seeks to apply ancient Catholic teachings to such modern problems as traffic-law violation and communism.

ANGLICANS SEEN TO BE DRIFTING TOWARD CATHOLIC PRACTICES

Five hundred clergymen belonging to what is generally known as the evangelical wing of the Church of England (Anglican) recently signed a protest against a trend they see. They warned of a drifting away from "the benefits to religion gained at the Reformation" toward Roman Catholic practices.

Specifically, they recommended that vestments be abandoned, that canons of the Church of England be revised, and that the Bible should again be established in fact as well as in theory "as the final and supreme authority in all matters of faith and doctrine." They sent their protest to the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, appealing for a return to the simplicity of worship and scriptural doctrine followed in former days.

EVANGEL DEADLINE

. . . LATE NEWS AT PRESS TIME

STUDENTS AT CENTRAL BIBLE INSTITUTE in Springfield, Missouri, participated in a spontaneous 100-hour prayer marathon in the Institute chapel last month. The nonstop chapel service began Thursday, February 4, during a week of special services conducted by Evangelist Warren Litzman who was assisted by the CBI campus pastor, Glenn Reed.

MORE THAN HALF OF CENTRAL'S 390 students prayed for 24 hours or longer without stopping for food or sleep, and showed no evidence of fatigue. Nearly 100 of the young men and women remained in the chapel 60 hours or more praying continuously, pausing only to read their Bibles, confess their faults, or listen while someone gave a brief message of exhortation now and then as moved upon by the Holy Spirit.

NUMBERS OF STUDENTS WERE FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT, re-filled, healed, or otherwise blessed during the Spirit's visitation. At two o'clock on Monday morning, after 90 hours of continuous praying, Brother Litzman advised the students to go to their dormitories and get some rest, but even then some remained in the chapel until time to go to classes at 7:30 a.m. Although classes reconvened that morning, they proved to be prayer meetings rather than lecture sessions.

FOR TEN DAYS FOLLOWING THE OUTBREAK OF REVIVAL the students did little else but attend classes and frequent chapel services, except to eat, sleep, and take care of necessary duties. The campus snack shop, which is usually a-buzz with conversation as students visit together and sip sodas in their spare time, was practically deserted for over two weeks.

THE STUDENTS ARE NOW ENGAGED in a continuous round-the-clock prayer meeting in the Revivaltime broadcasting studio which is located on the CBI campus, each attending by turn. Prayers are being offered for a spiritual awakening throughout all the world.

THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE predicts that over a billion dollars' worth of new church buildings will be erected in 1960. It predicts a record year also for the building of non-public schools and colleges, private hospitals, and other church-related institutions.

THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.A. plans to build a new National Presbyterian Church and Center in Washington, D.C., costing more than ten million dollars. It will have a 2,400-seat sanctuary and 3,000-seat auditorium. When completed it will be the fifth largest religious edifice in the nation, exceeded only by New York's Cathedral of St. John the Divine (Episcopal), St. Patrick's Cathedral (Roman Catholic), and two churches in Washington: the Episcopal Cathedral and the new Roman Catholic National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.

POSTMASTER GENERAL ARTHUR E. SUMMERFIELD has announced that the U.S. will issue a commemorative 4-cent postage stamp on April 7 to mark American participation in the World Refugee Year.

Be Glad You Can Blush

SIN WILL MAKE US SO CALLOUSED THAT WE LOSE THE CAPACITY OF BLUSHING. THIS IS A MORAL CALAMITY.

In Jeremiah 6:15 we read, "Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore they shall fall among them that fall; at the time that I visit them they shall be cast down, saith the Lord."

Jeremiah ministered in a day of great wickedness. There was corruption at all levels of national life in Israel. This was true politically, socially, and religiously.

The prophet was a man of a tender, sensitive nature. He was naturally reticent and shunned the limelight. However, God gave him a keen compassion for his wicked generation. A holy zeal burned within his bones that made him bold to denounce the sins of his countrymen. It was a special cause of grief to Jeremiah that people had come to practice sin without shame. Many people had lost the capacity for blushing. Sin has the power to make one so calloused that blushing no longer occurs. This is a moral calamity! It is everywhere evident in our own day.

It is an axiom that shame precedes shamelessness. Before one becomes utterly shameless and blushing ceases, he has previously experienced the feeling of shame. It is one of God's ways of checking further sin. We have all experienced shame, perhaps through the voice of conscience, or from the fact that our neighbor knows about our sin! Most serious of all, shame comes through the realization that God knows about our delinquency. It is the office of the Holy Spirit both to

convict us of our sin, and to shame us for it.

Shame is the fruit of sin. When Adam and Eve were in the state of innocence they knew nothing of shame. After their transgression, however, they became ashamed and hid because they were painfully aware of their failure. If one continues stubbornly to practice sin, willfully disregarding the feeling of shame, he will eventually become a victim of shamelessness.

There are perhaps three kinds of shamelessness. There is the shamelessness of *innocence*. Small children will often do and say things that embarrass their parents in front of strangers. If older people did these things it would be deplorable, but little children do not realize the significance of much they do or say. Consequently their uninhibited mistakes may be amusing.

Second, there is the shamelessness of ignorance. This may explain the conduct of the uncivilized and unevangelized heathen. These people have not been exposed to the lofty ideals of Christianity. They have known only the influence and example of evil environment. So, knowing no other way of life, they practice sinfulness without shame.

Finally, there is the shamelessness that results from *persisting* in the willful, knowledgeable practice of sin. It is this that Jeremiah deplored. This should also engage the most serious thinking of all who live sinfully today. You may practice sin and still be conscious of shame, but shamelessness is down the road. You may blush to-

day; but if you persist in sin, you may cease to be ashamed.

We have heard people apologize for their blushing. Don't do it; rather, pity the one who has become hard and brazen. Would to God there were many more who could blush! Blushing may not be a sign of virtue in every instance, but its absence is real cause for concern. It may be that, by the harshest kind of self-discipline, one may control his emotions so completely as to avoid blushing. But it is when there is no *capacity* for blushing or embarrassment that we should take stock of our sense of values.

That sin produces shamelessness is proved by experience. Consider the boy who uses profanity for the first time. He shocks himself, and feels very much ashamed. He continues to swear until the day comes when he curses unabashedly and is completely unconcerned about the reactions of others.

There is the man who does a fraudulent deed. Perhaps he rigs his income tax return for the first time. He puts the dishonest report in the mail, addressed to the nearest District Director of Internal Revenue. He can't sleep that night, and he tosses in his bed. Eventually the guilt-feeling wears off. He continues in his dishonesty, and ultimately can defraud without compunction.

There is the girl who makes a mistake. She suffers the tortures of a lashing conscience. She hangs her head, and hardly dares to look certain people in the face. She continues in sin, and like thousands of others finally "hits the skids" and sinks fast. Ultimately, she loses her shame and plies her trade openly and brazenly on the streets.

There is the man who comes home intoxicated for the first time. He has enough presence of mind to try to conceal his folly, so he chews some strong candy mints. His wife is not deceived, however, and she bursts into tears at his condition. He feels so small about

it, and the next morning vows never to repeat his folly. He continues to imbibe liquor, and one day becomes a shameless inebriate.

Scores of other cases could be cited. We think of Zephaniah's comment—
"The unjust knoweth no shame." Oh, the shamelessness of sin! People who cannot blush! Reaping always follows sowing, and one form of reaping from sin is shamelessness.

There will be a dramatic resurrection of shame in the hearts of the shameless at God's White Throne judgment. Imagine that tremendous scene! File upon file, row upon row, rank upon rank, line upon line, tier upon tier, gallery upon gallery, multitudes of those who are eternally lost. See them gathered before the great Judge of the universe. Seated on that White Throne is the "holy, undefiled Son of God." It is unthinkable that there shall be indifference and unconcern in the immediate presence of Christ. The utter contrast between this Judge and the condemned ones will be such as to produce keenest shame. Think of it! Men's hearts will be transparent before the gaze of Him whose "eyes are as a flame of fire." They will be ashamed then—but too late.

There is another cure which involves the present. Those who have touched the depths of sin can be lifted by the grace of God. God's salvation can transform a sinner into a saint. There are many who once lived shamelessly in sin but now do the blessed will of God. The writer, when pastoring a certain church, had a deacon who once was a drunkard and bootlegger. Sin had hardened him, but one day he was gloriously saved. Now he frequently blushes in the face of evil and injustice. May God give us all a holy sensitivity toward evil.

Perhaps you are unashamed of your sin, but recognize your need of a Saviour. Take a few moments to think back over the years to the time when you were sensitive to right and wrong. As you realize how far you have gone on the road to eternal judgment, thank God that He has caused you to stop and think on your ways before it is too late. Bow your head this moment and pray, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." He will answer.

Being in Christ it is possible to forget the past; to be sure of the future; and to be diligent in the present.

ANSWERED BY ERNEST S. WILLIAMS

Do such passages as Ephesians 5:22, 23 and 1 Corinthians 7:1,2 give a husband the right to own his wife, making her a mere puppet to his will and desires?

A husband should consider carefully that when he married he promised to "love and cherish" his wife supporting her in her weakness and so living with her that they may be heirs together of the grace of life. For a husband's responsibility, see Ephesians 5:25 and 1 Peter 3:7.

Does the Bible forbid the marriage of cousins?

Abraham married his half sister (Genesis 20:12), and Jacob married his cousins. Laban, father of Leah and Rachel, was brother to Rebekah, the mother of Jacob (Genesis 28:2). But when the Law was established, the marriage of near relatives was forbidden (Leviticus 18:6).

According to 2 Corinthians 5:8, those who have died in the Lord are present with the Lord. Are the wicked conscious or unconscious after death?

Jesus taught the conscious existence of the unrighteous in hades (Luke 16:19-31). Scripture indicates that, since the resurrection of Christ, believers go to paradise in the third heaven (2 Corinthians 12:4). They are "absent from the body" and "present with the Lord." At the final judgment, "death and hades," where we believe the ungodly are, will be cast into the lake of fire (Revelation 20:13, 14). There will be no more death; nor will there be an intermediate state any longer. Eternal destiny will take their place.

Is it right to sit in our seats to partake of the Lord's Supper? I have always knelt at the altar and I feel condemned when we all sit rather than kneel.

Gathering around the altar is a beautiful way of observing the Lord's Supper where the number of those partaking is small. It becomes almost impossible where a church is large because of the time it would take to have group after group come forward. This also prevents all from partaking simultaneously.


We become accustomed to certain ways of doing things, and for some it is not easy to make changes. Whether all kneel around the altar, or partake at their seats, I hope the Lord's Supper may never be so hastily observed that it becomes a mere matter of form rather than a time of heartfelt worship.

Does Isaiah's denouncing the wearing of ornaments, glasses, etc. (Isaiah 3:19-24), mean that we ought not to wear glasses, rings, or a wrist watch?

We should begin reading at verse 16: "Because the daughters of Zion are haughty, and walk with stretched forth necks and wanton eyes, walking and mincing as they go, and making a tinkling with their feet. . . ." In all this there is the thought that the women were seeking to attract attention to themselves. The Revised Version identifies the "glasses" of verse 23 as "hand mirrors" which the women carried to look into to see if their appearance needed touching up at any time.

Many of the things which Isaiah mentions we know little about, but from this passage we may draw the lesson that, as God disapproved the women making themselves up in the days of Isaiah, so He disapproves of gaudiness of dress today, or efforts to attract attention to ourselves rather than Jesus.



ister will benefit by taking advantage of their counsel and by working in close co-operation with them. Those who do not establish proper relationships with the district brethren cannot expect assistance from them.

The eastern part of the United States is desperately in need of pioneer workers. In one of the districts there is only one Assemblies of God church for every 120,000 people. There are now 60 Assemblies of God churches in the Southern New England District—20 in Connecticut, 36 in Massachusetts, and 4 in Rhode Island. But there are over 60 other cities and towns with a population of 10,000 or over in this district without an Assemblies of God voice. Also, there is only one Assemblies of God member for every 4,000

population here. The Northern New England District has possibilities for opening new churches, but no workers are available; and financial support for workers is a problem.



How Shall I Go to My Father

Without the Lad?

THESE WORDS, "How SHALL I GO unto my father... without the lad?" found in Genesis 44:34, are a ringing challenge to every parent!

Who among us does not want to go to heaven? Who among us does not long for that day when we cross the river of life and see our heavenly Father face to face? Do we not all long to dwell in that celestial city whose builder and maker is God? Do we not all wish to bask eternally in the sunshine of His presence? Such an one who does not have this desire would be unspeakably foolish. But parents! "How can we go without the lad?" In our text, Reuben was convinced he could not return to his father without his younger brother Joseph. How applicable this is to our responsibility to our children.

Fathers and mothers, do you realize that we have a five-year head start on all other influences on our child? After that period of time they are influenced by school, companions, and all the many other outside attractions.

Not too many years back, as I was driving through Tennessee, I saw a tree so misshapen that it attracted my attention. It was gnarled and twisted until it was comically grotesque. I thought, "How could a tree ever get in that shape?" As I pondered, there was but one answer, "It got that way when it was a little tree." Boys and girls are not born criminals. They become such because some adult fails in his or her responsibility to build character that will withstand temptation. It is possible to rear children in the way they should go, to keep their minds upright and erect until the laws

of soul growth impel them upward.


What can we as parents do to develop straightness in our sons and daughters? We can live the true Christian life before them. This is rather difficult in the somewhat crooked world in which we dwell. Remember it is in the early years when the child is most pliable that the character is molded. Horace Bushnell says, "Let every father and mother realize that when the child is three years of age, they have done more than half they will ever do for the character of their child." Mothers, do you teach your child to pray? Your knee should be his first altar. Your lips should be the first voice of God he will ever hear. You should be the first to tell him the most fundamental lessons contained in the Bible. In fact, unless the deep lessons are taught to children by godly parents, the church will always have to deal with saplings.

Yes, parent, you have the five most important years in which to train your lad and lead him in the right direction. In these five years he is receptive, alert, pliable, and most of all he is all yours. He has not been touched by outside influence. Look at your children! Are you leading them in the way they should go? "How shall I go unto my father without the lad?"

Thus the first responsibility rests upon the home! Look at the American home today! We not only lead the world in gifts of charity, gifts to the church, money spent on our educational system, but we also lead the world in divorce and low standards of living. The highway of America is littered with the debris of homes that were not built upon the Rock Christ Jesus. When the winds blew and the rains fell, that home broke never to be repaired again. As a result, we have over 37,000,000 young people in America that receive no religious instruction whatsoever; over 37,000,000 citizens of tomorrow receiving no instruction in the Word of God to create spiritual and moral convictions in their lives.

The over-production of spiritual pygmies today is traceable to the absence of great homes. Great homes are necessary to produce great men. We have education today, but education has not eliminated crime even though our great educational leaders of the last century promised the abolishment of crime if only we would educate; build schools, support them, and pass compulsory attendance for children. These well-intentioned men said that in a generation crime would be a thing of the past. We did all this, but crime is still with

Read: Philippians 1:1-11

Learn: "Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6).

For the Parent: From this passage point out: (1) the apostolic greeting, vv. 1, 2; (2) the apostle's appreciation of this church, vv. 3-5; (3) his confidence in God's power to work in a Christian's life, vv. 6, 7; (4) his desire that they would grow in the Lord—in love, knowledge, correct judgment, and the fruits of right-eousness. Christ is the source of these graces, v. 11.

Question Time: Who wrote this letter? (v. 1) To whom was it written? (v. 1) How can a Christian "stay saved"? (v. 6) Who gives us "fruits of righteousness?" (v. 11)

Tuesday, March 8

Read: Philippians 1:12-21

Learn: "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21).

For the Parent: To understand this passage we must remember that Paul was a prisoner—probably a prisoner of Nero. In his imprisonment Paul sees that all that happens to him is for a purpose and that God is guiding his life, vv. 11-14. But Paul's bonds have also given opportunity for enemies to make their voices heard. Even in this Paul sees God's hand, v. 18. He is determined that, whether he lives or dies, Christ will be glorified in him, v. 20. This should be the determination of every Christian.

Question Time: Where was Paul at this time? (See above) Why?

Wednesday, March 9

Read: Philippians 1:21-30

Learn: "For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake" (Philippians 1:29).

For the Parent: Review the material studied yesterday. Then discuss the alternatives suggested by Paul: to live and work for Christ, or to die and be with Christ. Show Paul's reaction to each and his conclusion, vv. 24-26. He then admonishes the Christians: (1) to watch their lives carefully, v. 27; (2) to be united so the gospel may go forth, v. 27; (3) not to fear their enemy, v. 28; (4) to believe on Christ and suffer for Him, v. 29.

Question Time: What does Paul admonish Christians to do? (See above)

Thursday, March 10

Read: Luke 18:9-14; Matthew 6:5-13 Learn: "God be merciful to me a sinner" (Luke 18:13).

For the Parent: (Additional material on "Christ and Prayer" will be found on Sunday's Lesson page.) Have the group review the story of the Pharisee and the publican. Emphasize the motives of eac, showing that God is not as concerned with our works as He is with the attitudes of our hearts. A humble, contrite prayer will reach the heart of God. Then, from the passage in Matthew, discuss the pointers Jesus gave about prayer and the model prayer He gave for us to use.

Question Time: What was the real difference between the Pharisee and the publican?

Read: 2 Kings 17:4-8; 25:1-13 (Sunday's Lesson for Juniors)

Learn: "Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34).

For the Parent: These two passages relate two distinct incidents, but they have this in common: they record the fall of two important kingdoms—Israel and Judah. And the fall of each came about because the people forgot that their first purpose was to serve the Lord. Discuss the events surrounding the fall of Israel and the fall of Judah. Emphasize the importance of keeping our lives lined up with God and His program lest we lose God from our lives.

Question Time: Why, do you think, did Israel and Judah fall?

Saturday, March 12

Read: Luke 22:39-53 (Sunday's Lesson for Primaries)

Learn: "Not my will, but thine be done" (Luke 22:42).

For the Parent: Following the events of the Last Supper (last week's lesson), Jesus and His disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane. Discuss His time of prayer and His complete submission to His Father's will. Also discuss the betrayal and arrest of Jesus, emphasizing that Jesus was betrayed by one of His own disciples. We must be careful that by our actions we are not betraying Jesus! Let us also seek and sulfill God's will in our lives.

Question Time: What two important things happened in the Garden of Gethsemane? (See above)


Pray that the Lord will intervene in the matter of land grants needed on several Indian reservations for the purpose of building churches.

Tanganyika Bible Institute

The second graduating class of the Tanganyika Bible Institute stood in white caps and gowns. Expressions of deep resolution marked their faces as Principal Wes Hurst gave the charge "to preach the gospel to every tribe and village." The day of victory was climaxed by the dedication of the new classroom-administration building and principal's residence which were built during the year.

Rev. Norman Correll was in charge of the service with Rev. H. B. Garlock, superintendent of East Africa, delivering the commencement message. Four missionary representatives of the Southern Baptist Mission of East Africa were also present. Other Assemblies of God missionaries present were: Morris Williams, and Ragnar Udd, of Nyasaland; C. C. Harris, Paul Bruton, and Stephen Vandermerwe, of Tanganyika. Term certifications were given to 38 students. Following the presentation of diplomas to the seven graduates of 1959, an English Bible was awarded the honor student, Asangalwisye Kandukungonde, who had the highest average—96%.

When he received the award, Asangalwisye did a little African dance and trilled in his tongue the special call that is used to honor a visiting chief. This spontaneous response added just the right touch to the wonderful occasion.

The total enrollment this year was 53 men. During the school term a number were filled with the Holy Spirit. Many had come from rawest hea-

then circumstances. In the first few days three boys, who had just been saved from heathendom, were heard praying to their dead forefathers, asking them not to be angry with them for coming to Bible school to learn of the white man's God. How thrilling it was to hear one of them, a few weeks later, preach a challenging message on leaving "this Jerusalem" to go out to tell the lost house of Israel—"their house"—of true salvation. Seven different tribes were represented in the student body this past term.

Assisting Brother Hurst as instructors were Norman Correll, assistant principal, Ragnar Udd, and Delmar Kingsriter. Four African pastors assisted in teaching and leading the school.

Tanganyika Bible Institute was founded by Wes Hurst in 1954 and has completed its sixth term. Scores of men who have come for training during this time are now among their

own tribes preaching the gospel.

The most recent addition to the facilities is the new administration-class-room building which has two adequate classrooms, an office, and storerooms. Electricity has been added to all school buildings from the main power line one mile away.

Tanganyika Bible Institute is in need of a dormitory building for married couples. Additional funds are needed to liquidate the indebtedness on the new administration building just completed. Recently, the school terms were lengthened to accelerate the training of African ministers. This has increased the cost to \$100 per student for three terms. Emergency Relief Report

We wish to express our sincerest appreciation to the many friends who so faithfully responded to our appeal for funds. In a land of plenty where surplus food commodities must be stored or given away to avoid paying storage charges, it is difficult to understand why people should suffer want elsewhere. Yet, it is true, that in countries with a lower standard of income, a different form of government, and a lack of mechanization, large segments of the population go hungry.

This is one of the main reasons the Foreign Missions Department takes advantage of the offer made by the United States government to provide surplus food commodities to welfare and religious agencies for free distribution to

needy people abroad.

During the past two fiscal years the Foreign Missions Department, through its Foreign Service Committee, has distributed a total of 1,276,657 pounds of milk, flour, cornmeal, and rice, valued at \$97,931.00. The ocean freight to ship these commodities amounted to \$25,817.51—all paid by the United States government. The Foreign Missions Department paid \$2,883.61 for the actual cost of handling the food in this country. It is necessary, however, that this amount be doubled to cover the cost of distribution in the foreign countries and to provide the clerical work necessary for ordering these commodities.



CHRIST AND PRAYER

Sunday School Lesson for March 13, 1960 LUKE 18:9-14; MATTHEW 6:5-13

ATTITUDES IN PRAYER (Luke 18:9-14)

Luke eighteen begins with a parable which encourages us to be persistent in our praying. However, unless our heart attitudes are right, our persistence will be in vain. As we pray, one of two things will happen: either sincere persistence in prayer will lead us to correct any wrong heart-attitudes which may be revealed to us as we pray; or, else wrong heart attitudes persisted in will cause us to stop praying or render our praying impotent.

THE ATTITUDE OF THE PHARISEE Vv. 9-12

(1) The Pharisee felt that he was more righteous than other men in general, and better than the publican in particular. He described himself favorably against the dark background of what he supposed other men to be.

(2) The Pharisee thought the publican was worse than he was. His judgment was bound to be faulty, for how could he rightly estimate the character and inner life of another? He failed to realize that "man looketh on the outward appearance," while "the Lord looketh on the heart."

(3) The Pharisee had a mistaken idea concerning the way of salvation. Like others of the sect to which he belonged, he claimed salvation on two grounds: first, because he belonged to the chosen race; and second, because he rigidly lived up to a code of laws, many of which were made by man. Not only so, but he condemned all men who failed to observe all the laws which he observed.

We too may fall into the attitude of the Pharisee. For example, some of us almost unconsciously seek to commend ourselves to God on the basis of our good works, forgetting that the only basis of approach to God is through the Blood of Jesus Christ! Again, we may be guilty of the detestable spirit of sectarianism which refuses to recognize other children of God as such because they do not measure up to our own set of standards!

(4) The Pharisee was outwardly correct, but inwardly "full of dead men's bones." He was one who should have heeded Christ's scathing denunciation of his sect, as recorded in Matthew 23. It appears from his words that the Pharisee was moral, honest, fair in business; he fasted much; and he was a faithful tither. Yet for all this he was entirely lacking in the essence of true religion-he had neither love for God, nor love for his fellow man, but only a consuming love for self!

THE ATTITUDE OF THE PUBLICAN Vv. 13, 14

What a contrast between the two worshipers! The "holierthan-thou" Pharisee separated himself from other men because he thought he was better than they; the publican separated himself because he felt he was worse than others. The Pharisee went to the temple to pray, but was so full of himself that he only carried on a soliloquy. The publican

went to pray and was as full of humility, self-loathing, and godly sorrow, as the Pharisee was full of self-congratulation.


Whereas the Pharisee illustrates attitudes which make answers to prayer impossible, the publican illustrates those attitudes to which God always responds! (1) The publican confessed himself a sinner by nature and by practice, and guilty before God. (2) He depended entirely upon the mercy of God and claimed no merit of his own. (3) He earnestly prayed for forgiveness—the benefit of God's mercy.

THE PATTERN PRAYER (Matthew 6:9-13)

According to Luke's version (11:1-4) the so-called "Lord's Prayer" was given in response to the disciples' request, "Lord, teach us to pray." In reality, then, this is a pattern-prayer for all believers, dealing in principles which affect every aspect of human life. It can be divided into two four-part divisions: (1) Adjusting our lives to God—God's fatherhood, character, kingdom, and will; (2) Benefits of adjustment to God-provision, forgiveness, overcoming grace, and deliverance.

The emphasis is on the side of adjustment, for the more completely we allow our lives to be adjusted to God's Spirit and purposes, the more surely shall we derive the benefits of adjustment. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." If our ruling passion is to "hallow" or glorify God's name, to devote ourselves to the establishment of His Kingdom upon earth and in the hearts of men, to execute His will in our lives, then we may be sure that God will grant the remaining petitions in -J. Bashford Bishop this prayer!

mentary on the significance of the glowing statistics we see concerning church attendance. One cannot dispute that interest in the week-night meetings is an indication of the depth of the spiritual life of a church.

We need prayer meetings. We also need Bible study. It may be easier for those without the responsibilities of domestic life to attend all the services than for those with families to do so, but families likewise need to give priority to church meetings. When there are special meetings, such as those with an evangelist or a visiting missionary, all members of an assembly should make an effort to be present.

Of course, week-night meetings should be made worth going to. A good pastor will not concentrate everything on his Sunday night effort, and regard the rest as unimportant. If he did he would reap what he sowed in uninterested members during the week. But, attractive or otherwise, there is a place for personal discipline in making attendance at week-night meetings a matter of duty. Good interest soon makes them attractive.

Writing of the present Pentecostal move in Pakistan, one missionary says, "The people live for the meetings and for the Lord.... If I do not have a meeting arranged, then they are away on their own, holding meetings in other parts of the town. Homes are not neglected, but rather made clean and pure. The testimony of their homes is one of the most powerful appeals they have."

Such words may well provoke nostalgia among some of us for the "good old days" of our own early Pentecostal experience. But the year is not always at the spring, nor the morning at seven. The era of pioneer enthusiasm and the excitement of sheer novelty cannot, in the nature of the case, be permanent. We need to get into our regular stride for the steady race that leads to the crown of life. Better than going from an extreme of meetings every night in the week to an opposite extreme of no week-night meetings, is the middle course of faithfully assembling ourselves together within a wisely organized schedule of regular meetings until the Lord comes and finds us "so doing" on that Day.

It was one of those days. There were extra things to be done in preparation for Mary's birthday the following day. I plunged into the day's schedule of dishes, beds and ironing, only to be interrupted at frequent intervals by Baby Jimmy who was teething and who found nothing really comforting except Mommie and rocking. To add

to my frustration several little worries kept nagging me—worries which I had meant to leave with the Lord but which wouldn't stay left. I felt like a most insignificant cog in a big machine—a cog that was slipping most of the time. Surely anyone could do more and do it better than I was doing.

Then toward suppertime as I sat cuddling my poor fussy baby I glanced through the workbooks my first and second graders had brought home, and there was my reward—not only in one workbook but in two: "Write the grownup person you like best." And after it in a laborious scrawl: "Mommie." A child's love is a wonderful thing, particularly if the child be your own. I felt warmed and comforted as one is comforted by a fire on a cold day.

God must feel something like this when one of His children shows his love to Him. Do many of us, I wonder, give Him the joy of knowing that He is absolutely first in our hearts? "He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me" (Matthew 10:37).

us. It is continually on the increase! Lawlessness in the nation gets its start by the fireside; the child that does not learn to obey his parents there respects neither the authority of God nor "the powers that be" when he comes to manhood. Many children are ruined by the overindulgence of a pair of easy-going church-complacent parents. God said about Abraham, "For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the Lord." Today parental authority, as some wit has said, has not disappeared, but has only changed hands. Children

have taken over, he says.

Spiritually dark homes make bad boys and bad girls which turn into bad men and bad women. If doctors were as careless in their practice of medicine as many of us are in our manifestations of a Christlike spirit in the home, there would be large additions to our cemeteries. I believe every child may be led in the ways of godliness and high character, if we only begin young enough.

The school is a builder of the intellect; the church is the way-shower of moral and spiritual nature; but the home makes or mars the destiny by the start it gives the child. Will you determine in your heart, parent, to make your home what it should be?

Next, you are responsible to see that your child attends public school. Why? Because it is a law; every boy and girl must attend school. The blame for the present lamentable condition in our country cannot be laid upon the public school system. It is not the business of the state to provide char-



acter. This all-important element for the success of a republic must be supplied by the *homes and the church*.

The framers of the Constitution of the United States wished to guarantee to the American people religious liberty as well as political freedom. At the price of their religious liberty they committed themselves to a dual system of schools. A system of public schools under state control which would guarantee the *intelligence* of the people and a system of religious schools under church control which would guarantee the *character* of the people.

Therefore parents, you are responsible to see that your child attends church and Sunday school. There is no law in your state that says he must but there is a law written in God's Word that says, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6). You are responsible to see that your child has the best spiritual training possible to equip him in this world in which he lives. Where else can you go but to the house of God? In the church you find the Sunday school which is the teaching arm of the church. Here, under trained leadership, your child is led, step by step, to make a personal decision for the Lord Jesus Christ as his Saviour. Here he is taught the Word of God; not only portions of it but all of it; here he will find the answer to every problem of his life because the Sunday school lessons are geared to meet him at every age level of his life; here he will receive moral stamina to withstand temptation in the crucial years of his life because he has learned the true principles which will guide each step of his life.

"How shall I go unto my father without the lad?" Yes parents, our responsibility is great but what joy can be ours if we are faithful to the children God has so lovingly entrusted to our care.

PEARL HARBOR RAIDER STARTS CHURCH IN **CALIFORNIA**

Captain Mitsuo Fuchida, leader of the Japanese air attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, recently arrived in Berkeley, Calif. to establish a Japanese-American Protestant church. The former war pilot is now a minister of the gospel, having been converted from heathenism ten years ago.

Fuchida was a prisoner of the Americans following World War II. In 1949 he was acquitted as a war criminal and found himself disillusioned, discouraged, a man without faith but filled with hatred of the Americans.

Then he met an old friend who had just returned to Japan after spending years in a prisoner-of-war camp in the U.S. Fuchida asked if the Americans had mistreated him. No, his friend replied; on the contrary, the daughter of two American missionaries whom the Japanese had murdered in the Philippines had overcome her own hate and had ministered to the needs of the Japanese prisoners in Arizona.

This story of hate transformed into deeds of love shook Fuchida. Three months later he was shaken again when he heard the story of Jacob DeShazer, a member of General Jimmy Doolittle's raiders on Tokyo. DeShazer likewise had hated the Japanese because they had mistreated him while he was their prisoner, but through reading the Bible his hatred had been replaced by love. Later DeShazer had become a missionary to tell his former enemies about the grace of God.

Fuchida started reading the Bible to

see if it would change him the way it had changed DeShazer. It did. The former Japanese war hero then dedicated his life to the gospel ministry, received seminary training, and now he has come to America to tell his story.

The 57-year-old pilot says: "My heart was filled with hate and revenge when I led the attack, but Christianity has opened my eyes and I hope through Christ to help the people of Japan know God's great love.'

BUDDHISTS CLAIM LINCOLN AND LONGFELLOW AS CONVERTS

Abraham Lincoln and Henry W. Longfellow were Buddhists! So reason Buddhist leaders in Taiwan, who base their unreasonable claim on the reports that Lincoln once saved a pig's life, and that Longfellow was so remorseful after shooting a bird that he never again carried a gun. Too bad the two distinguished gentlemen were unable to speak up and refute the

These and similar assertions are currently being given wide circulation in Free China. Buddhist leaders have launched a sweeping propaganda campaign in thirteen monthly publications, in an effort to recapture the hearts and imagination of Buddhist followers, and to gain new converts. Far East News Service reports they are using a "gospel truck," a correspondence course, and a team of itinerant preachers to win converts to Buddhism. They are doing their best to discredit Christianity. This aggressive program of the Buddhists is challenging church leaders in Formosa to new evangelistic efforts.

THE GREAT PRESENT WANT OF THE CHURCH

The reception of the Holy Ghost is a baptism of holiness. He is, by way of eminence, the Holy Ghost, as the sanctifier of believers, as the great source and efficient agent of holiness in the church. He alone can give the light which reveals the necessity of purification. He alone can move the great deep of the heart to abhor sin and pant for holiness. He alone can excite that abandonment of self, that complete reliance upon Christ, which consecration implies.

His power can cleanse and renovate the soul; can fill it with "perfect love." It is the Church, the whole Church, that needs this purification. Its worldly tendencies mar its distinctive character. Its corruption cripples its energies. Its imperfections make it fearful, where the boldest courage is demanded. Inasmuch as the vision of the Church is obscure, the life of the Church feeble, the holiness of the Church deficient, and the power of the Church inadequate; and as the special gift of the Holy Ghost, promised in the Gospel, is alone a baptism of light, a baptism, of life, a baptism of holiness, and a baptism of power, it follows conclusively that the baptism of the Holy Ghost is the great present want of the Church.

Teen-Age Evangelism

EVANGELIST DAVID WILKERSON SPEARHEADS YOUTH RALLIES IN EIGHT METROPOLITAN SECTIONS OF NEW YORK CITY

THE TELEPHONE RANG LESS THAN an hour and a half after we had been on the streets passing out literature for teen-agers. As I picked up the receiver I was pleasantly surprised to find our effort had brought such a quick response.

It was Dianne, a fifteen-year-old Catholic girl. She asked if I would tell her more about the way of salvation.

The next call was from a seventeenyear-old. She wanted more information about the gospel and she asked me to talk with her father also. I was very happy to witness to both of them concerning the saving grace of Christ.

Within just one week's time we had seven contacts by mail, in addition to the phone calls, directly resulting from the Teen-Age Evangelism literature we had passed out on the streets.

But let me go back to the beginning. For months we had been praying for an effective gospel program with which to confront the youth situation in our metropolitan area. Not only in New York City but also on the New Jersey side of the Hudson River, we were seeing serious complications develop among the teen-agers. Newspapers were full of their crimes and many groups were having conferences to find ways of counteracting this seemingly explosive condition. Police and municipal governments were offering all kinds of solutions, but gang activities and youthful indignities continued.

In many areas it became unsafe for

our families to be on the streets after dark. In some places, many of our members would not come to church at night for fear of being attacked.

God moved upon the heart of an Assemblies of God minister, David Wilkerson, to come into our area with a desire to help as much as possible. He was especially burdened for members of the teen-age gangs. He attended a murder trial for seven teenagers in New York City and when he attempted to speak to the Judge he was thrown out of the court room. His picture appearing in the city newspapers opened the door for him to minister to the teen-age gangs. They reasoned that if the police did not like this preacher, probably he could be their friend. On numerous occasions he witnessed to leaders of these youthful gangs and they gave their hearts to the Lord Jesus Christ.

A number of Assembly ministers in the metropolitan area felt that this was the proper time in God's program to launch a concentrated effort among the young people. Some of us met to discuss the best way to combat the wave of juvenile crime. After several conferences we determined to invite Brother Wilkerson to come into our area for the entire year of 1960 to direct the effort.

The chairman of our Teen-Age Evangelism Committee is R. Stanley Berg, assistant to the pastor of Glad Tidings Tabernacle, New York City. The Secretary-Treasurer is Paul DiLena, a lieutenant in the New York Police Department. We have adopted a budget of \$20,000 for the year to finance the work. Most of this money will be spent on literature for free distribution.

We divided the city of New York into five areas, consisting of its five boroughs, and added three areas in New Jersey; namely, Paterson, Newark-Irvington, and Elizabeth. Our plan is simple. The director comes into an area on Monday and Tuesday of the week to work with the local pastors and their young people. They pass out literature inviting the public to a youth rally to be held the following Friday night. On Wednesday and Thursday of that same week the director repeats this activity in a different area, announcing a rally for the following Saturday night. Thus the eight sections are covered once a month by having a youth rally in each section either Friday or Saturday. This simple program, which began in January, will be carried on regularly throughout the year.

Brother Wilkerson has written several miniature booklets that appeal to young people. They come in a packet called "Tiny Teen Library of Life." These packets are being distributed in quantity in connection with the weekly rallies. While directing the effort toward youth in general, Brother Wilkerson is particularly burdened for the teen-age gangs and he is personally making efforts to win these lawless gang members to Christ.

"The Death Penalty"

I find it hard to reconcile your views on capital punishment with the teachings of Christ and His apostles. Did they not teach us to forgive our enemies? Jesus said, "Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: but I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also" (Matthew 5:38, 39).

I think capital punishment is cruel. If there were more kindness in the world there would not be so much crime....

(Ed. Note: There were eight other offenses, besides murder, for which capital punishment was decreed under the Mosaic law-kidnapping, cursing one's parents, blasphemy, idolatry, spiritism, adultery, desecrating the Sabbath, and general impenitence as described in Deuteronomy 21:18-21. Christ taught that adultery and other sins should be forgiven but He did not mention murder. The policy of non-resistance to evil can be followed by individuals but it cannot be made the law of a society in which the righteous and the wicked are mixed together. Capital punishment is not any more cruel than the eternal punishment of sinners. The death penalty is necessary in order to impress upon men the high value of human life and its divine origin. God said, "Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man"-Genesis 9:6. This command has never been abrogated. In Romans 13:4 the apostle Paul said that the magistrate "beareth not the sword in vain." The sword was worn as the symbol of capital punishment. Paul clearly implied, in Acts 25:11, that there were offenses for which the appropriate penalty, in his judgment, was death, for he said, "If I be an offender, or have committed any thing worthy of death, I refuse not to die." We should be kind to

sinners—but if we love them we will warn them of the penalty of their sins.)

Capital Punishment

Just a line or so to thank you for the excellent editorial concerning capital punishment. It was free from silly sentiment -suggestive and scriptural. As long ago as when I was a Methodist pastor I was waited on by a committee of ladies and asked to sign a petition to the state legislature requesting that the death penalty be abolished in this state. I refused to sign it; and the ladies appeared to be almost horrified. They said, "You are giving the lie to your preaching. You preach that an attribute of God is mercy and that we, His children, ought to be like our Father in heaven." I replied, "That is exactly the reason why I believe in capital punishment. God decreed the death penalty for the reason that He is a God of mercy, and the penalty, decreed under law in the Old Testament, is confirmed under grace in the New. There is no evidence or intimation that God ever abrogated the death penalty for wilful murder, and so until God changes His mind concerning the matter I am going to continue to believe as He believes." And the ladies, like the accusers of our Lord, were silent....

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

THE FOUR TOTALS

W HILE WE WERE HOLDING SPECIAL SERVICES IN LIEbeck, West Germany, several years ago, I was guest in a Christian home near the iron curtain. Arising early one morning, I walked to the barbed-wire entanglement separating the two sectors where hundreds of brave men and women had lost their lives in attempted flights to freedom. I shuddered to realize that had I ventured just a few steps across the line I too would probably be felled by a barrage of gunfire.

As I watched the austere guards on the other side proudly passing before the hideous entanglement, I wondered: What is the secret of the Communists' great advances? How did they succeed in only fifty years to indoctrinate and captivate ideologically 35 per cent of the world's people?

Then I remembered the illuminating statement of a Russian emigrant who said: "The Communists are motivated by a philosophy embodied in their four totals:

- "1. Total acceptance of the cause.
- "2. Total dedication to the cause.
- "3. Total action at any cost.
- "4. Total submission to the total discipline of their authorities."

A contemplation of these four totals convinced me that they could, and should, be the motivation of every Christian. Painfully I began to search my own heart.

Have I completely accepted the cause of Christ, persuaded that it is absolutely the world's only hope?

Yes, I said to myself.

Pausing a moment, the Russian guard peered at me curiously. As I frankly studied his face, I was startled to see something more than harsh militarism. This man was utterly given to the cause whose principles had been drilled into him from his childhood: that the world can be salvaged only when dominated by Communist ideology.

As the guard continued to pace, my heart cried under the inexorable probing of the Holy Spirit: "You say you have fully accepted the cause of Christ, but have you totally dedicated yourself, as has this misdirected zealot?"

After a moment's inward struggle I replied, "I believe I have, Lord."

The sun rose higher, dispelling the early morning's mist. I heard sounds of renewed activity—mothers in their kitch-

ens, children, workers. In the distance I saw a platoon of soldiers march to some unknown destination. And I thought of the third total: Total action at any cost.

Perhaps they had been commissioned to go on a disagreeable or dangerous mission in some foreign land, to live apart from family and friends, to suffer extreme hardship unflinchingly, to labor, to sacrifice. Not for themselves were they doing this, but for the cause which their brainwashed minds believe to be a supremely worthy one.

Just as the rays of the sun penetrated into the narrow streets and glinted on the bayonet of the guard, so the illumination of the Holy Spirit struck more deeply into my soul

"Are you committed to 'total action at any cost'? Are you willing to labor unremittingly to win others, as they do? They promise men liberation but give them slavery. But Christ both *promises* and *gives* glorious freedom to the slaves of sin. How much are you willing to sacrifice for *His* cause?"

I wavered. "I have suffered for Thy sake, Lord, but not like these."

I looked again at the guard. Of course he must be human, I said to myself, loving his wife and children, enjoying the comforts of whatever he calls home. But he cannot live for himself or for them; it must be "the state."

Poor, deluded man, I thought; he knows no better. But I do. I know whom I have believed.

I thought now of the fourth total: "Total submission to the total discipline of authorities."

"O Lord," I cried as my spirit cringed, "this is the most difficult of all. For it means 'Not my will, but Thine, be done,' the utmost in commitment."

But my heart responded, "O Lord, I yield my life anew to Thee, a living sacrifice, for it is but my reasonable service. May I consider no sacrifice too great to help spread Thy gospel to all the world."

The sun had fully risen now, shedding a new radiance on the drab surroundings. There was a fresh illumination within my own heart too as I walked into the house to begin the day's work—not for myself, but for *The Cause*—the cause of Christ.—Copyright 1959 by CONQUEST
