BROKEN ARM HEALED.

"What shall we do to these men, for that indeed a notable miracle hath been done by them is manifest to all them that dwell in Jerusalem; and we cannot deny it. Acts 4:16.

As in the days of Peter when the lame man was healed at the gate of the temple, even so in these last days the hand of God is stretched forth to heal, save, and do mighty miracles, signs and wonders through the precious name of Jesus the Christ. Jesus said "And greater works than these shall ye do, because I go unto my Father. John 14:12. What! Greater works than Jesus did? Raising the dead, giving the sight to the blind; causing the lame to walk. Jesus has said it. It is enough. Oh Hallelujah! Jesus is making it more real to us every day and yet, we rejoice not that devils are subject unto us, but rather that our names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life. Following is the sister's glorious testimony.

I felt it would be to the glory of God to write my testimony as to the wonderful way in which God has healed my body.

On June 9th my arm was broken. Dr. C. E. Thomas, of this city, was called and he set the arm in a plaster of Paris cast and I wore that until June 12th. That was removed and another cast put on which reached to the elbow and was twice as thick.

With all my suffering I was determined to go to the camp meeting at Anderson, Ind., and so went, in faith believing, that Jesus would heal me, and He never disappoints His children. He wonderfully touched me by His power. A Brother took off the bandages and praise His holy name the work was

completed. I shook hands with hundreds of people, also wrote my name with the healed arm at least one hundred times.

The doctor, when he put on this cast, told me to wear it three weeks and then call at the office and he would put on another, and he did not know how long I would have to wear it, and was not sure that I would ever use my arm again. But praise His holy name Jesus did the work in about five minutes.

On Tuesday June 16th I called at

his office to show him my arm and told him that Jesus had healed me where he could not. I shook hands with him to his amazement. It so enraged him that he took my arm in both his hands and gave it a jerk to test it. He wrenched it so badly that it popped just like a pistol, and then he said "it is not well yet," I said "why, doctor Thomas!" I left the office suffering intense agony from the new break and my fever was raging. In the evening about eight o'clock I arrived at the Apos-

tolic Faith Mission suffering such intense pain I could do nothing but walk the floor, crying to God to increase my faith. The saints prayed for me and laid their hands on me. The bone had not been set from 12 noon to 8:00 that evening. My fingers and wrist were black with clotted blood.

When the saints prayed for me I felt the power of God as a ball of fire strike my shoulder, run down the arm and set the bones in place, and I cried "Glory to God the work is done. Hallelujah!"

I immediately shook hands with every one present and we all had a hallelujah time.

I praise God from the bottom of my heart for what He has done for me. He is no respecter of persons. He is my Saviour, my healer and my keeper. Oh I do praise Him that he is just the same yesterday, today and forever. If He had not been the same I would still have my arm in a plaster cast and suffering pain. Oh praise His holy name forever and ever.

Thomas, and he said she would have to keep it in a cast for at least nine weeks. But praise God her arm was instantly healed Saturday June 13th a little after twelve o'clock at the Gospel Trumpet Camp Meeting held at Anderson, Ind. There were hundreds of people saw the arm after the cast was taken off.

We returned home Sunday evening and went to the doctor's office

Tuesday the 16th. When she showed him her arm he fell back in his chair and he looked at it and said: "Well, if anything gets wrong with that arm, don't blame me." But thank God the arm was all right. Then he took hold of it and twisted and turned it until you could hear the bone crack anywhere in the room. After he broke it again he said "Its not healed now." Sister did not say much to him. Before we got home it was swollen so badly and the pain was so great she could hardly stand it. Her arm kept getting worse, so we took two shingles and cotton and wrapped her arm up until we could get to the mission where she could be prayed for.

Last February at the close of the Missionary Convention in Indianapolis a number of God's children announced that God had called them to Johannesburg, South Africa, and that He told them they would leave for that dark land about the first of April. To the question "Have you your fare?" they replied: "No, not yet, but Jesus will take care of that. He has called us and He will open the way." Many wagged their heads in a knowing way, but the little missionary band just smiled; they knew the mind of God in the matter. The manner in which God opened the way for them to go, supplying their fares, guiding them to the right steamboat company, and of His loving care over them on their journey is nothing less than marvelous. From the time they left Indianapolis till their arrival in Johannesburg as you will see by the letters that follow, the hand of the Lord has been upon them, and the marvelous way that they have been used in that dark land of heathendom has proven beyond a doubt that God has gone before them. The following letters speak for themselves:

The party consisted of "Bro. Tom" Hezmalhalch and wife; Sister Ida Sackett, Bro. J. O. Lehman who has already spent five years of his life in service for Christ at Johannesburg, and Bro. Lake and family, making thirteen in all. They were accompanied as far as London by Bro. Louie Schneiderman and family, a converted Jew, who

is called to the Jews in London. God has been mightily using him there as you will see. Praise God for victory. These letters do make our hearts rejoice.

On Board Empress of Ireland, }
April 3, 1908. }

Dear saints of God in Indianapolis:

Glory to God! Hallelujah! Well, we are really sailing for South Africa. We pulled in right alongside the boat at about 2 p. m. St. John's time and set sail a little before 3 p. m. God works things around to His own glory.

We had a very nice journey here from Indianapolis. At Hamilton, Ohio, we made very good connection, only a few minutes wait. At Detroit, Mich., we had about three hours wait but none of us went to the Mission as all our time was needed to see after our luggage and lunches, and then Bro. Lake's folks were there to see and bid them a final farewell. Also Sister Winnie left for her destination thirty minutes after our arrival. She seemed to be anxious to get to her destination.

During that night on the train little Johnny took seriously ill, but prayer was made and the answer was given. In the morning when we looked out the window we found the ground covered in snow, and all the way from that on to St. John's a white sheet covered the ground.

Last night about 9 p. m. we arrived at Montreal where we changed cars, and on boarding the train we found it packed to its utmost capacity, so another train was made up and we followed in about twenty minutes. I was met by Bro. Louie Schneiderman as I endeavored to board the train; so Louie and family were on the first train from Montreal and we on the second.

April 4th.—Well, hallelujah, here we are at Halifax. Arrived this morning at 6 o'clock. Will be here till 5 p. m. I shall be able to get my express here today. Glory be to Jesus. He knows how to bring things to pass. Had a very nice voyage thus far. Bro. Tom's wife was a little sea sick last night, and Bro. Lake thought he had to be

sick, so as a natural result was seasick. The two girls, Horace and Allie, were also sick. Sister Ida Sackett is enjoying herself immensely; also Sister Lake is getting stronger. We are expecting a good voyage all the way. Hallelujah.

I had intended to mail this yesterday at St. John's, but owing to my being so extremely busy with my express it was impossible.

The thermometer registers very low here. It is so very cold but as we get away from here tomorrow it will be warmer. I would not have missed this trip across Canada for anything. This will be a very interesting voyage to all of us. We ought to have a good stenographer in our company. I wish Roswell could be with us.

This boat encountered the hardest storm since it was built the last voyage from England, but she came out all right. We have quite a crowded boat, especially our class. Third-class on this boat is quite satisfactory—better than expected.

Remember me to all the saints. Much love to all. All join in sending regards.

Dear Bro:—

We are now 500 miles from Liverpool and we will be there tomorrow and I will mail this letter from there.

We had a service Sunday night. Tom and I spoke and were very kindly received. On Monday a number of young men came and asked me for an interview, so I met them in the dining room and talked to them for an hour and a half. They were mostly Englishmen. One of them was a man by the name of Roberts from the London Stock Exchange. At the close of the service four people stood up saying they wanted to be christians. When I talked with two of them I found their name was Jennings, and the husband had been an employee in the Atkins Saw Works, Indianapolis, and was going to work in a Saw Works somewhere in Eu-

rope. Well it is strange how people live right where the gospel is and never find it, and run off somewhere else and receive it.

We had an outdoor service on deck last night. These Englishmen are fine singers, and some are very nice people. God bless you.

Dearly beloved in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ:—

We have decided to write you a party letter, so I will tell you of my impressions of England: In most things in my judgment America is a full century ahead of England. Religious life is if anything dead, and with less power than even the denominational churches in America. I attended Wesley Chapel down town (Liverpool) last night. A largely middle-class congregation with splendid congregational singing, but without spiritual power. Very, very formal. When I said "amen" out loud the congregation was shocked. They had a Men's Lodging House service, a real Jerry McCauley South Water St., New York, Bum congregation, but the preacher advised all to sign the pledge and quit drinking and brace up, saying the Christian life is a very hard way, but it is the best way. I prayed "O Jesus, do let me have five minutes to tell them there is power in the blood to deliver from the curse of appetite," and He did. The audience straightened up at the first sentence and twenty-five or thirty came up to sign the pledge, and that gave Louie and Lehman and I a chance to talk personally with a good many about Jesus and His redemption,

The most terrible thing here is drunken women. A bloated-faced, red-nosed woman sat in the meeting with not a stitch on the baby but a little cotton dress that came to the baby's bare knees, ragged and dirty beyond what the vilest American slums produce. Oh, it was hard to see. But Oh dear ones, the message of the Apostolic Chris-

And his brethren said to him, 'Shalt thou indeed reign over us? or shalt thou indeed have

You know the Lord gave us our tickets to Johannesburg before we left. I also had \$3.50 in my pocket when I left Indianapolis. When we got to Detroit I needed Winnie's fare to the Soo. Jesus gave me that \$10.00, and I went straight to the depot and bought her ticket and she went right straight through to the Soo to my father's home that same night. When I got to Liverpool my pennies were all gone. We had to have our underclothing all cleaned at the laundry, and so we prayed about it and sent our bundle to the laundry, and not until an hour before we were ready to leave Liverpool did the Lord send me the price of the bill, some two or three shillings, and I had a shilling left over. We did not need any more money until we arrived at Capetown, as our party was in the hands of the ship company, but I knew that just as soon as we arrived at Capetown there would be dock fees and transfer accounts and hotel bills, etc., right away. Mrs. Lake and I held the matter steadfast before the Lord, and before we left the ship, while it was yet at the docks at Capetown, before the gang planks were put down, a passenger touched me on the shoulder and called me to one side. He handed me an American Express Order for 40£, saying, "Boy, the Lord told me to give you that, and He has been telling me that for the last two and a half weeks." It paid all my expenses and landed us in Johannesburg.

To show you how wonderfully God works: You know we were landing in a new country without a single acquaintance, but while we were on ship board we made it a special matter of prayer that God would provide us a home when we got here. Rents here are desperate in comparison to what we are accustomed to in America. The houses on the street where we live are a good deal like people's wood-sheds at home. The studding in the walls are four feet apart, and the roof and the outer wall consists of galvanized iron with no sheeting. The inside downstairs is coarsely

plastered, The attic (there being no upstairs) is nothing but the galvanized iron overhead. When the sun shines on this it is something like the Babylonian furnace, and when the sun goes down it gets very chilly, much like a November night at home. People do not have fires in their houses here as we have been accustomed to. How I have longed for a good American stove that would warm the marrow in a fellow's shins at once.

But to return: as we stepped off the train at Johannesburg a little bustling lady whom I at once recognized as an American stepped up to me and said: "Are you a missionary?" I replied yes." She said "the Lord told me to come down here, that I would find a family on this train who were missionaries. I have a house for you furnished in real missionary style. You can have the house." But, I said "Sister, the Lord has not given me any money to pay rent." "And the Lord told me not to accept any rent," she replied. So we are here in a little crowded home all furnished.

My heart was drawn out toward the native work very intensely and the Lord at once opened a native tabernacle, the property of the Congregational American Mission where we have held services twice a day. Last Sabbath afternoon the house was packed with natives, some with clothes on, one or two dressed in green table-cloths with a flashy-colored border, some with loin-cloths on, half of them barefooted, many with painted legs, etc., as is customary here. As the service proceeded the spirit of God fell upon the house in prayer. The natives recognized it just as quickly as we did, and without suggestion fell on their knees to pray as all natives here do, being exceedingly devout. They didn't wait for one another to pray. Out of the five hundred present two hundred and fifty broke out in prayer aloud at one time. The missionaries who were with us, as observers, of the starchy churchy order, were amazed and astounded because we did not stop the noise.

But, Brother, we have seen the Lord anoint the house with prayer before, especially once at Zion City, when the powers of hell were prayed out of presence as I believe I have often told you. They prayed continuously for three-quarters of an hour. They wept tears, confessed their sins, took off their idolatrous charms, etc., and when the service was over "they of the circumcision" were astonished and said after questioning the natives: "We believe that at least sixty of these persons have entered into a real and positive experience of salvation."

We hold noon-day services frequently at the Young Men's Christian Association. Precious hungry missionaries from all about attend these meetings. We also have had invitations from the Baptist church and have conducted several services at the Bethel Mission, a working men's mission here, where they feed the poor who are out of work. A dreadful financial stringency rests over Africa, much worse than anything we have ever known in America, and so far as I am able to see there is no hope of immediate relief.

We must rely on God for our existence here in a measure that we have not before known. The children are in school and we are living a normal life, and as the weeks go by we will keep you informed of what the Lord is doing.

Oh! I wish more of our people were here, you have never seen such a land of opportunity, and people's hearts are receptive—they are hungry—there has never been a really pungent revival in Africa that has at all touched the populace and our faith goes out to God, and we want your prayers to this end, that not only a little local revival but a mighty outpouring of God's spirit upon the whole land shall come.

Hold us before God; we need your prayers, we need them mightily.

Just a few lines from Johannesburg before the English mail goes today:

God is working most mightily here in Johannesburg. The Holy Spirit has fallen and numbers have been baptized with the Holy Ghost, and numbers are being baptized daily.

Saturday evening one dear man got saved, sanctified and baptized in about ten minutes, and he lay there under the power of God for several hours, praising God in tongues, speaking in German and Dutch languages he never knew before. The interpretation was given by a prominent Dutchman who is the editor of a Transvaal paper who also got saved and sanctified the other night. People are getting saved, sanctified, healed and baptized with the Holy Ghost every day.

We began our first continued meetings in the colored church, and notwithstanding the prejudice that exists with the white people against the natives, when God began to work the white people came in such crowds that the natives became timid and were crowded out. Since then we are offered the large Zion Tabernacle which seats several hundred in which to hold our meetings.

I never saw a more hungry people than these dear Zion folk. Truly God is working.

Last Sabbath we had three great meetings going on, one in Pretoria and two in Johannesburg. There is a wonderful future for South Africa. We are crying for mighty signs, wonders and miracles to follow our ministry in the name of the Holy Child Jesus.

We are greatly in need of some good reliable workers. We could make use of them now. Pray for us here mightily.

The Threefold Standard.

The scriptures hold out to the believer a threefold standard of experience. If he falls short of this he fails to be satisfied, and fails to satisfy the heart of our Lord. People profess to be contented with measuring part way up the standard and sometimes seem to be, but deep in their heart of hearts it is not so. A human soul never enjoys perfect rest and contentment until Jesus Christ is satisfied by becoming the satisfying portion of that soul.

The first step upward along this standard is found in John 13:10, "clean every whit." These gracious words fell from the tender lips of the soon departing Master. A little later in the same discourse He confirms His earnest verdict by adding: "Already are ye clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." John 15:3. Clean every whit. What a radical assertion that was. Eleven men who could be made no cleaner in God's sight. That was not flattery, neither was it deception. He who knew what was in men could not be deceived, neither would He deceive. Jesus had chosen these men and was presently to finish their equipment to start a ball which should roll down over twenty centuries. They must be true, tried and trained. And especially must they be clean and know it, and have such an unquestionable witness thereto that the shrewdest critics could never successfully gain say it. God be praised! This is very important. If there is a defect in the first section of this glorious standard, if such were possible, it might weaken and topple over. How disastrous that would be. Nevertheless we can and must be clean every whit. "If we walk in the light * * * the blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth us from all sin." "And almost all things are by the law purged with blood, and without shedding of blood is no remission." Dear reader does the blood consciously cleanse you now? Have you the joy of full salvation evidenced by the Holy Ghost through the word? You are certainly an apostolic candidate for an apostolic Pentecost.

The second section of this gospel standard is recorded in John 7:23, vis; "every whit whole," and confirmed by restoring to "perfect soundness" an impotent man. Acts 3:16. Paul also prayed, "The very God of peace sanctify you wholly," and declares that He will do it. I Thes. 5:23. The same power that lifted Jesus from the dead and set Him above the principalities in the glory is pledged to do this for all who will believe for it. The number of testimonies to these two glorious experiences is multi-legion.

The third section of this standard is every bit full. Acts 2:4. "They were all filled with the Holy Ghost." This filling meant much more than that of Elizabeth, or John the Baptist, or any before their day, for they "began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." By this manifestation, no doubt, it is known whether believers enjoy pentecostal or pre-pentecostal fullness. God's operations are dispensational. This is the dispensation of the Pentecostal fullness of the Holy Ghost, previously announced as the baptism in the Holy Ghost and Fire. No one can be fully satisfied, as God counts satisfaction, until he receives what Jesus and John promised, and that which was so abundantly shed forth upon the expectant 120. Not that tongues satisfy. No gift does. But the Giver can not satisfy us nor Himself except by imparting Himself in just that measure and manner that He designs. Hence, the absolute necessity of perfect-yieldness to and endorsement of all His will. How can people claim to have Pentecost while they mimic and resist and denounce and explain away the one distinctive pentecostal signal—new tongues?
