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There is Safety in Counsel.

Editor E. N. Bell tells why He was baptized in the Name of Jesus Christ, and shows the Necessity for the Brethren to meet together in General Council.

As a personal privilege to satisfy my own conscience towards God, I was, sometime ago, baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus according to the uniform practice and teaching of the apostles. Some have thought that I meant by this far more than I did, and by their permission I feel it only justice to the dear brethren to explain what I did not mean and what I did mean by my action.

Did Not Mean

I did not mean to join any party or faction, nor to cause division or strife. I am today more than ever for love, harmony. peace and cooperation among all the Pentecostal or Apostolic Faith people in all missions or assemblies of God of every name. I am absolutely opposed to all bitterness and strife over this or any other subject.

I did not mean to sit in judgment on the consciences of my brothers and sisters n Christ. Baptism is the answer of a good conscience towards God-not the preacher's conscience who performs it, but the candidate's conscience. I did not mean, by my act, that I would accept no one as having Christian baptism except those baptized just exactly as I was. Not a bit of it! I have not repudiated, in either advice or teaching, the baptism of any other brother who, in good faith, was buried with Christ through baptism. I have urged no one to be bapuzed, nor adv sed any one to be rebaptized. I consider this a matter for each soul to decide for himself after he has all the truth of God on the subject before him. If, according to all the facts in his case, and all light on the subject from the Word, he does not believe he has been scripturally and satisfactorily baptized, then, I believe we should cooperate w'th the soul in its desire to obey the Lord, so long as that desire does not lead us outside of the Bible. At the same time, we should be careful not to create false dissatisfaction with former baptisms.

No Issue

I had no desire for any issue to be forced upon our people, to fight or divide over. If all will be as liberal as I am, there will be no trouble between us on this. I ask nothing that I will not give. I grant all, without strife or condemnation from me, the privilege of being baptized with any formula found in the New Testament on baptism. I ask only the same privilege for myself without condemnation from the brethren. I expect all liberty loving, broad minded brethren to heartily endorse this stand. Those who want liberty but will not grant it to others, those who stmply contend for their own way and try to force it on others, will have to be loved and endured, taught and prayed for until Jesus comes. We always had some such and always will have, I suppose.

Do Not Endorse Errors

Nor did I mean, by exercising my own liberty of conscience in obeying God, to accept the many errors stalking throughout the land. Not a bit of it! The Bible nowhere says that to be "born of water" is to be "baptized in water." No example of baptism in water is ever so called in Scripture. Baptism in water is never called "true Christian circumcision." It is mere dogmatizing without direct authority 'n the Word by either precept or example, then, for men to assert and insist on such. I demand a "thus saith the Lord" before I can accept such.

I totally reject the teaching that no man is converted before he speaks in tongues as the Holy Ghost gives the utterance. know, beyond all doubt, my sins were taken away, that I had spiritual life and the witness of the Spirit with my spirit, that I was

a child of God, before I ever spoke in tongues. I thank God for these tongues let down from heaven through the Holy Ghost, but I cannot make tongues my Savior to save my soul. God forbid! Jesus said. the world (the unconverted) cannot receive the Comforter, for it knoweth Him not (John 14:17), and so say I. Christ is for the sinner, and the Holy Ghost for the believer.

No Pure Spirits

I do not accept the doctrine that pure. fermented spirits is necessary to the ob-

us for this, but such an opportunity to do it may not be ours again before Jesus comes. the very devil, himself, is against God's people standing together in love and frecdom. Like a wise general, he knows if he can divide our army, he can easily whip one little crowd at a time until he has cleaned up the movement. May God wake up His sleeping host of saints to see this very situation now confronts the Pentecostal people. The biggest self-seeker and would be boss in the land is the very one who w'll shout loudest for freedom and the leadership of the Holy Ghost. Watch and you will see it so. Why? Because he knows he must deceive and mislead you by appealing to what you count dear to you, and by putting fear of true brethren in your heart. Be not afraid nor deceived. At Hot Springs it was forever settled that we would write no creed to bind on free saints, that local freedom would not be hindered but rather strengthened and helped. We have the loosest. freest way for co-operation I know of in the world today. Many Pentecostal people have formed much stronger ways. We In . Corner.

The providence of God also drove me to act in being baptized when I was and as I was. I had a blessed anointing of God on my soul when God convicted me of this truth, and I did not desire to preach it or to act on it at the time I did, but God took away every other message until I would obey, and refused the anointing of His Spirit on all other subjects until I obeyed. I had on hand a great camp meeting and I had prayed three weeks for help from God without obeying and God would not give it. All who think they can pray the power down while refusing to obey the voice of God are welcome to try it. I have tr'ed it enough to know it won't work.

It is not the water that gives power, it is obedience, for God giveth the Holy Ghost to them that obey Him. Acts 5:32. It matters not whether obedience leads us to the water, to own His name, to preach some truth, to make some confession, or what. It is the yielding to God that brings His approval and blessing. It would be wide the mark to think I was so ignorant of divine things as to expect the water would bring the power. Power comes from God only as we obey Him. He had me in a corner where I had to act or consciously disobey Him, and if I ever get in another corner like that and feel as I did then, by His grace I will obey Him again, if I lose every friend I have in the world. God must be before all men with me. But God may deal very differently with you and you be very sincere and honest and not do what I did. My conscience is no guide for you. and yours is none for me either.

Apostles Did It.

them. They are not my judges either.

A third reason for so acting is that I saw that all Scriptures on the subject represent the apostles as teaching and commanding baptism in the name of the Lord Jasey 5: 7 - 2,29: 0.16: 10:18: 19:5 etc. I consider the Apostles to be the best interpreters on earth of what Jesus meant by Matt. 28.19. All who today feel they understand Jesus better than the inspired apostles did have full liberty to follow their convictions. I expect to be charitable towards them and not tell them they must be baptized in a way to su't me, but rather to suit themselves and God, and this will be all right with me in their cases. I do not expect to unchristianize them on the subject. They are responsible to their own Lord, not to me. I am not their judge. I only ask the same for myself as I grant

Fair to See.

Now what could be more fair? This gives and receives liberty! The very spirit of cooperation demands this. The man who cannot cooperate except by demanding that you see and preach as he does don't know his A. B. C's. in the principles of cooperation.

Not a Hobby.

I do not believe in making a hobby out of any phase of water baptism, whether it be the mode, such as immersion, or the name to be used, or the formula in general. I do not believe the New Testament gives evidence that there was a fixed, invariable formula that must be said over the person just exactly that way and no other, to make the baptism valid. The first essential is a converted soul that wants to obey God. the next is a burial in water in the likeness of Christ's burial and resurrection, by one who is acting on the behalf of Christ, or in Christ's name. Forty burials, by immersion even, would not be Christian baptism if Jesus Christ is left out of it. It is Christ in it that makes it Christian. But Christ can be put in it in many ways, by the intent of the heart, by previous explanation, by many formulas, long or short. Praise His name!

I love every blood-washed soul and believe all the brethren love me. We have no fight against each other and are dwelling together in unity and fellowship. shall expect to see you at the General Council in St. Louis, Mo. from October 1st. to 10th.-E. N. Bell.

Why will some men presume to add to God's Word, and why will others drink it down like mocking birds without one clear "thus saith the Lord?" All can take real wine at the "Table" who want to, and I will not distellowship them for it, but fresh "fruit of the vine" is the best in my judgment, and cannot imagine a better emblem of the fresh shed blood of Jesus who saw no corruption, no fermentation, than the fresh blood of the grape. Praise God!

Now is the Time.

There never was such a tremendous need in this movement for all lovers of the truth to come up to the coming St. Louis Council to stand together in love for truth against error, for love against harshness, for the written Word of God against all private revelations that do not agree with the same, for loving, free cooperation as against wildcat fanaticism and individual bossism. What I Did Mean.

No House, divided against itself, can stand. No body, in which the members are warring one against the other, can thrive. There must be unity of purpose, similarity of teaching, and consideration of the brethren for any movement to live and prosper. It should be to the interest of every bapt'zed saint in the world to do all in his or her power to further the mesage of Pentecost which God has granted unto us. Striving about words and forms will hinder instead of help the work of God, no matter how sincere we are in our contention and no matter how much we think we are right in our attitude towards what we consider to be truth.

The Pentecostal Movement is now facing a crisis, probably the greatest crisis which has ever been and which will ever be in its lifetime before the Lord shall come. Doctrines of demons and of men are being circulated all over the land. There is the greatest necessity of the children of God gathering together in counsel, not that we may all speak exactly the same thing, forming creeds which bind the soul and hinder further light from the Word of God from being accepted by us, but of cooperation, truth being compared with truth, until the brethren can go out from the council with confidence in one another, knowing that, in general, efforts are being made by a large majority of the brethren towards sound scriptural teaching and practice, looking unto the coming of the Lord.

This need is imperative. There is no need of multiplying words. Every pastor knows the condition of things. Every shepherd knows that he must safeguard the flock. The wolves are seeking to prey upon the sheep, and the pastor knows that something must be done and done speedly to raise a wall against them, saving the

sheep from destruction. We have it in our power to do this. We can do it and we must do it if the work of God is to go forward. NOW IS THE TIME. A council has been called to meet in St. Louis, Mo. from October 1st. to 10th. Our Heavenly Citizenship

In a recent issue of the Evangel it was emphasised that the children of God should preserve an attitude of strict neutrality to the warring nations in Europe. But it seems to the writer that the Word of God teaches something deeper than that. We frequently sing, "This world, this world is not my home, this world is not my resting place." This is true. The salvation of Jesus is a deliverance from "this present evil world." (Gal. 1:4.) It is a translation into the Kingdom of God's dear Son. (Col. 1:13.) The Cross of Jesus Christ is the place where the saint and the world separate forever. (Gal. 6:14.)

When any foreigner comes to the United States and seeks to be a citizen, he has to renounce his loyalty to his former king, so when one comes into that higher kingdom and becomes a citizen of that "holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9.), the things that pertain to earth should forever lose their hold, even that natural love for the nation where one happened to be born, and loyalty to the new King should swallow up all other loyalties. Our attitude to all the nations of this earth should be that of Ruth to Moab when she told Naomi, "Where thou goest, I will go: and where thou lodgest I will lodge: thy people sha!! be my people, and thy God my God." The new birth makes one become a true Jew, for the Word of God declares that he is not a Jew which is one outwardly, but he is a Jew which is one inwardly. (Rom. 2:29.)

The Heavenly Lover of the Canticles invites His spouse to the heights of Lebanon and Amana and Hermon, and there tells her to "look from the top." How different everything of earth looks when viewed from the place where one is seated with Christ in the heavenlies. "Behold, the nations are as a drop of a bucket, and are counted as the small dust of the balance. All nations before Him are as nothing, and they are counted to Him as less than nothing and vanity." When God says "all nations," He omits none. The school children of every nation are nurtured in national pride from the day they begin to read their history books; but national pride, like every other form of pride, is abomination in the sight of God. And pride of race must be one of the all things that pass away when one becomes a new creature in Christ Jesus.

When seen from the heavenly viewpoint, how the present conflict is illumined. The policy of our God is plainly declared in the Word. "Peace on earth, good will toward men." The nations who have drawn the sword to kill those of the same blood in other nations, for God "hath made of one blood all nations of men," are not merely fighting against one another, but with their policy of "War on earth and illwill toward men," they are, without knowing it, again fulfilling the Scripture. "The Kings of the earth set themselves and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His anointed." Is any child of God going to side with these belligerent kings? Will he not rather side with the Prince of Peace under whose banner of love he has chosen to serve? The Kings of the earth strive for mastery and dominion, whilst He who sets in the heavens laughs and declares, "Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of Zion." The Lord reigneth, though few have eyes to see Him. "The heavens do rule." (Dan. 4.26.) If these kings only had anointed eyes, they would cease their bloody conflict, and kneel in reverence to the King of kings who has given them a little power for a little space on earth, until He comes and takes the nations for His inheritance remains under the skin more or less, but and the uttermost parts of the earth for

The nations of the earth have chosen the sword, and they who take the sword shall perish by the sword, even by the sword of Him who will come forth upon a white horse, clothed with a vesture dipped in blood, and His Name is called the Word of God. (Rev. 19:11-21.) The world, especially the religious world, has no use for the children of God, but the Lord taketh pleasure in His people," and will let them share in His triumph over the nations. "Let the saints be joyful in glory * * * let the high praises of God he in their mouth and a two edged sword in

their hands; to execute vengeance upon the nations and punishment upon the people; to bind their kings with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron; to execute upon them the judgment written: this honor have all His saints." Psa. 149:4-9.

It is important for the saint of God to realise that his citizenship is in heaven, and that here he has no continuing city. The writer of Ecclesiastes sampled everything "under the sun" and he found it all "vanity and vexation of spirit." That is why the Apostle exhorts us to "seek those things that are above" and to set our affections on those things, and not on things of the earth. We are told to bank our treasure in heaven, where thieves do not break through and steal, and rust and moth do not corrupt. Paul tells us that those "who mind earthly things" are enemies of the Cross of Christ. For himself, he declared to the Corinthians, "I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ and Him crucified."

There is a very practical side to this question also. I have noticed that many employers of labor in this country who have come from the old countries, choose for their employees men of their own nationality. Even though they become naturalized Americans, their love for their race predominates when it comes to preference in the matter of employing help in their various businesses. In these last days, the children of God are being crowded out from employment owing to their finding it impossible to become partakers of other men's sins, they cannot be party to evil business methods the world is adopting, many cannot conscientiously work seven days a week as many in the world want them to do, others again feel they cannot become members of trade unions, for they believe these to be a part of the organism of Anti-Christ. If employers of various nationalities give preference to their own fellow-countrymen, should not Christian employers give preference in the same way to those who are not only of the same "holy nation," but also sons of the same Heavenly Father? I know it is argued that the children of God are not usually so wise as the children

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of this world, and it does not pay to employ them. Yes, it may mean a few dollars less income but what after all pays best, a few extra dollars down here, or obedience to Him who tells us to do good to all men, especially to the household of faith. These are days when the children of God need to stand by one another in a very practical way. Having the same Father, are we not one family? Closer still, are we not members of the same body? Beloved, let us not love in word only, but in deed and in truth.

A KING WITH MANY TITLES.

Most kings and rulers have different titles, but the King of Italy possesses more than any other living monarch. Many of them are derived from the older kingdom of Sardinia. Besides being the King of Italy and Sardina he has the following titles: King of France, Spain and England, King of Jerusalem, Greece, Alexandria and Hamburg, Ruler of the Midway Sea, Master of the Deep, King of the Earth.

And are these titles not most significant? Italy is the center of the old Roman empire. When that empire comes into a historical existence once more, as it is predicted, Italy and Rome must needs be the center again. Then there will arise out of that empire a King, who will claim the supreme place over the nations and domineer over them. He is the little horn of Daniel 7. The many and arrogant titles of the King of Italy will all be claimed by the prince that shall come. He will be the false king and will claim kingship over Jerusalem and over the earth, till He comes who is the only rightful King .- from "Our Hope."

A STATEMENT BY THE PRESBYTERS.

By a remarkable moving of Providence, a number of the presbyters (seven in all) met together in the State Camp Meeting and Council held in Little Rock, Ark. from Sept. 2nd to 12th. At once they took up the matter of forms of words to be used in baptizing converts, and the statement which appears elsewhere in this paper is the result of their prayerful consideration of this and kindred matters.

These brethren hereby make a statement of their personal attitude toward the present issues agitating the movement. They are not speaking for the council, as the council has not yet met or looked into these matters, they are speaking for themselves and to let the rest of the brethren know assuredly how they feel about the present issues in the light of the Word as revealed to them. We feel, however, that had all the brethren been present, they would have added their names to the list of signatures, affixed by the seven presbyters. The office editor is so pleased with the spirit and scripturalness of this statement, that he desires that his name go down on the list as endorsing this statement.

Do not stop with a casual reading. Read it over and over and be sure that you understand exactly every word of it before passing your judgment on it. This statement does not prohibit anyone from preaching the truth as God has revealed it to them on these questions, but it does state that these brethren are not in sympathy with anyone who preaches either side of this question to the point of strife and division. We are for peace, and if they are for war, let them fight, but we will not have any part with them in this matter. As the brethren come up to the council leave your war paint at home and come up in the fullness of the blessing of Christ. We can counsel together in the fear of the Lord in a perfectly dispassionate spirit, and we all are open to all the light that God wants to give us, but we will not tolerate a contentious spirit that wants to rule or ruin. No man must lord it over God's heritage, but we must consider one another and endeavor to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace " " until we all come to the unity of the faith, cooperating together for the salvation of souls and the edification of believers, that He may be glorified.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

For the Benefit of our readers we print below a Declaration of the Attitude of a number of Presbyters in regard to some matters which will come up for consideration at the approaching Council to be held in St. Louis, Mo., October 1st to 10th.

ON BAPTISM.

1. That the essential thing in Christian baptism is the burial, in obedience to the command of Christ, through baptism, of a person who has repented and believed, in water with Christ in the likeness of His death and resurrection (Acts 2.38; Rom. 6:3, 4); and that its validity should not be repudiated solely because of some slight variation in the formula repeated over him in the act; that the use, in connection with baptism, of any of the following passages of Scripture should be accepted: Matt. 28:19; Acts 2:38; 8:16; 10:48; or 19:5.

2. That the Scriptures give no example of any one who has once had Christian baptism ever being re-baptized.

3. That, therefore, re-baptizing of converts who have been once buried with Christ in baptism should be discouraged, and that ministers should respect, as a rule, such baptisms performed by their fellow ministers.

4. That in the case of individual conscience, each minister or candidate should have the full liberty to be personally baptized with any words he prefers, so long as he stays within the Scriptures on the subject; and it is hereby understood that nothing herein said shall hinder any minister from dealing, as he sees best, with cases whose consciences are not satisfied with their former baptism, only he should not go into any congregation not under his care, except at the invitation of its pastor or those in rightful authority to extend such invitation, and that even when so invited it would be wrong to so emphasize any one scriptural phrase on baptism above another scriptural phrase on the same subject as to lead saints, by the wholesale, to believe any one set phrase to be repeated over the candidate is essential to Christian baptism. All division or strife over mere phrases, as that there should be a fixed or invariable formula, is wrong on both sides of the question; but this does not prevent anyone from setting forth his own conviction on this matter in the proper spirit and where authorized so to do.

FERMENTED WINE.

While we do not hold that the use of fermented wine at the Lord's table would destroy the validity of the observance of the Lord's Supper, yet, since no Scripture says the "fruit of the vine" so used by Christ was wine, or fermented wine, it is therefore very unscriptural to insist on the absolute necessity of fermented wine at the Supper, and mere sweet fruit of the vine should, by all means, be much preferred everywhere at the Lord's table. All strife over this matter would tend to destroy, as at Corinth, the proper spirit necessary for the partaking of the Supper.

THE NEW BIRTH.

We reject, as totally unscriptural, the teaching that being born anew is the same as the baptism with the Holy Ghost. One may be born of the Spirit and baptized in the Spirit very nearly at the same time, and we would only rejoice at such an occurance; but one must, if only a moment before, first yield to Christ and become a child of God by faith in Jesus before he can receive the abiding gift of the Holy Spirit, for Christ taught clearly that the world cannot receive the Holy Ghost, saying, "whom the world cannot receive." John 14:17.

THE SPIRIT AND THE BLOOD.

The Scriptures nowhere declare that the blood of Christ is the Holy Ghost, and we most emphatically disown and reject all such statements. The blood is the blood, and the Holy Ghost is the Holy Ghost, not the blood. The Bible nowhere speaks of the spiritual blood of Jesus.

THE FATHER AND THE SON.

We hold that Jesus is the Son of the living God and that the living God is the Father of Jesus, and we are opposed to all such unscriptural teaching as that the Son is his own Father. This would be an absurdity. In Isaiah 9:6 the Son is called the Everlasting Father. This Everlasting Father is, in the Hebrew, the Father of Eternity, not the Father of Jesus. We believe God was in Christ (2 Cor. 5:19), and that God was not merely concealed in Christ, but that he was manifested or revealed in him (1 Tim. 3:16). He is now at God's right hand as our great High Priest in heaven (Mark 16:19).

CHRIST AND THE HOLY GHOST.

Nothing is more unscriptural than that the word "Christ" means the Holy Ghost. Jesus stood in the Jordan at his baptism praying, and the Spirit descended in the form of a dove and abode upon him. God, the Father, spoke out of heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son, hear ye him." (Matt. 3:16, 17.) We believe it all just as given. God is a Spirit, or the Lord is the Spirit; but the word Christ means anointed—anointed, of course, with the Holy Ghost; and we also are anointed with the Holy Ghost, but that does not make us the Holy Ghost. Jesus was God in the flesh before the Holy Ghost fell on him in the Jordan.

FACTIOUS PERSONS.

There are growing up about us some unruly, unteachable and factious men wno profess to be true ministers of Jesus Christ, but who misrepresent Him both in not having a Christ-like spirit and in not living sober, Godly, straight and truthful lives. They do not show a proper Christian courtesy towards other ministers and their work. They are contentious and factious, causing here and there both strife and division. Now it is with great grief and sorrow of heart that these wrongs drive us to say that we must refuse to fellowship such conduct or to approve any such with papers of recommendation. We love every child of God and will fellowship such as one of His little ones, so long as they show signs of being a child of God; but it is not every child of God whose conduct is such that he can be recognized as a worthy minister of Jesus Christ. Paul says, "Mark them that cause divisions * * * and avoid them." Rom. 16:17

DIVINE HEALING

Divine healing is nearly as old as creation. The first surgical operation was performed by God Himself, who in the garden of Eden, caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and took from him a rib of which he formed Eve. "I am the Lord that healeth thee," said Jehovah to Israel of old. Whenever she was sick from any cause she called upon the prophets who prayed, and her sick were healed. Abraham prayed for Abimelech, king of Gerar, who was healed in answer to prayer. Gen. 20:17. Asa, King of Israel, was a good king, but in the last of his reign he fell away. "In the thirty and ninth year of his reign he was d'seased in his feet, until his disease was exceedingly great, yet in his disease he sought not to the Lord, but to the physicians, and Asa slept with his fathers and died in the thirty and ninth year of his reign." Instead of trusting in the Lord, he sought the physicians, and he "slept with his fathers." Showing God was not pleased with his trust in earthly help. 2 Chron. 16: 12-13.

Ahaziah, another k'ng in Israel, "fell down through a lattice in his upper chamber that was in Samaria, and was sick; and he sent messengers, and said unto them. "Go enquire of Baalzebub the god of Ekron whether I shall recover of this disease. But the angel of the Lord said to Elijah the Tishbite, Arise go up to meet the messengers of the king of Samaria and say unto them, Is it not because there is not a god in Israel, that ye go up to enquire of Baalzebub the god of Ekron? Now therefore, thus saith the Lord, Thou shalt not come down from that bed on which thou art gone up, but shall surely die." 'So he died according to the word of the Lord which Elijah had spoken."2 Kings 1: 1-4, 17.

Ekron was the little heathen town in which the ark rested, before its return by the Philistines. God was angry with its people, on account of their great idolatry. And as Ahaziah put his trust in the heathen god, Baalzebub, instead of God, the sentence of death was passed upon him.

Miriam, sister of Moses and Aaron, sinned in speaking against Moses, and as a punishment, became leprous. She was healed through Moses prayers alone. Numbers 12: 1, 2, 14, 15.

When, during their entire wanderings through the wilderness, Israel sinned, she was punished, sometimes by sickness. In every case, prayer was offered by Moses or Aaron before the people recovered. When bitten by fiery serpents, they were healed, not through medicine, but a look at the brazen serpent, which represented a Savior, who would one day be offered up on the cross, not only for the sins but also for the healing of all his people. "Himself took our infirmities and bare our sicknesses." Matt. 8: 17. Num. 21: 6 - 9.

Hezikiah was sick, and the death sentence passed. "Set thine house in order for thou shalt die and not live." But he prayed, "I beseech thee, Lord remember now how I have walked before thee in truth and with a perfect heart, and have done that which is good in thy sight." And the word of the Lord came, "Turn again, and tell Hezik'ah, the captain of my people, Thus saith the Lord, the God of Jacob, thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears; behold I will heal thee." In answer to his own prayer, Hezekian was delivered. 2 Kings 20: 1-7.

There is not an incident given in the entire Bible where physicians were called in to God's children except in case of death. As we pass into the New Testament, we find the same conditions. Jesus came preaching the gospel to the poor, and healing the sick. Luke 7:12. He called twelve disciples, with the commission: "Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils," as well as to preach. Matt. 10: 8. Afterward he sent out seventy others with the same instructions: "Heal the s'ck." And we read that they returned with joy. Saying, 'Lord, even devils are subject to us through thy name. Luke 10: 9-17.

Our Lord's last words to His disciples were: "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel, to every creature, he that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. And these signs shall follow them-that believe. In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues. They shall take up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them. They shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover." Mark 16: 15-20.

It is strange how man fixes up God's Word to fit his individual case. Most ministers of the gospel, believe they must go into all the world and preach, but they ignore entirely the rest of the commission to lay their hands upon the sick for their recovery, saying that was for the early apostles. If God's ministers were to preach the gospel to every creature as long as time lasts, they are also bound to "cast out demons." and "lay hands upon the sick." and must answer to God should they neglect to obey his command in th's respect also. Who are we who can change God's Word to please ourselves.

In James 5:14 we have these words. "Is any sick among you, let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up, and if he has committed sins, they shall be forgiven him." No physician or medicine is allowed here. which may be all right for the world but not for God's children.

It is said that drugs kill more people than they cure. Why will those who profess to know God tamper with them? Our Lord has placed herbs in the earth that are harmless. These are, no doubt, put there for the world and those who have no faith in our Heavenly Father for their bodies. But even these are not intended for the Christian who has Jesus for their physician. Isaiah says, "With His stripes we are healed," therefore the atonement has provided for us a full remedy for all disease and sickness. For several hundred years after Christ's death, the church practiced d'vine healing alone. Luther, Wesley, as well as other devout men, prayed for the sick. Wesley's journals contain many incidents of God's healing touch. The Salvation Army, under Rules and Regulations, Ch. IV. Sec. 2, p. 51, commands officers to pray for the sick. Some fifty years ago, Charles Cullis of Boston, Mass. opened a faith home and chapel where he prayed for the sick, also writing several books on the subject. A. B. S'mpson, of the Missionary Alliance, followed him; also many others, among whom were Eva Baker of Rochester, N. Y., Sister Woodworth Etter, Carrie Judd Montgomery of Oakland, Calif. At the present time there are, perhaps, hundreds of thousands of people in the United States alone, who are trusting God only for the'r bodies as well as their souls.

Diseases of all kinds including consumption, cancers, tumors and leprosy are being healed. Blind eyes are opened. The deaf receive their hearing and the dumb speak. Within the last few years, more dead people have been raised than is recorded w'thin the lids of the entire Bible. What are we going to do with these things? They are facts and must be accepted by every thinking person.

Having proven that Divine Healing is structions from the Word to help the seeker after Truth:

faith.. "The prayer of faith shall save the toms instead of trusting Christ. s'ck." This may be offered by one or more individuals. Some, whose faith has like Bartimeus of old, cast aside their old been great, have been healed through their garments of prejudice, teaching, doubt and own prayers. "If ye abide in me and my unbelief and come to Jesus, knowing He words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will and it shall be done unto you." John 15:7. "Hitherto ye have asked nothing in my name, ask and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full. John 16:23,24.

Others were healed through the prayers and faith of one or more believers. "If two And now, by faith, He healeth me." of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven. For where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them. Matth. 18:19-20.

Others, by the anointing of oil by an elder or elders. James 5:14. Also thru the laying on of hands by a believer, or believers. Mark 16.

One must be sure first that he is right with God before seeking healing, but God does frequently heal the sinner for His own glory. He, however, nowhere promises to do this. The Psalmist says, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord

will not hear me." Psa. 66:18. As sickness 's often the cause of disease, when the cause is removed we may expect health.

Sickness may be caused by sin, either on the part of the diseased one or by inheritance. Some diseases, such as Tuberculosis, Scrofula, Cancer, etc., may be inherited generations back. By wilful sin we may bring d'sease upon our bodies. either breaking a natural or spiritual law. If I allow my tongue too great freedom, as in the case of Miriam, God may punish me for it and I may not get deliverance until I confess and make restitution. "Confess your faults one to the other, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. James 5.16.

Should I wilfully h't my head against a stone wall, it will hurt my head, not the wall. I have disobeyed nature's laws and must pay the penalty of a sore head until I learn my lesson. There are sins of omission as well as commission and God may see fit in either case to punish the offender with s'ckness. Read Deut. 7.15; Ex. 9:14; Deut. 28:60, 61; II Chron. 12: 19.

However, sin is not always the cause of sickness. It may be sent for a test as in the case of Job. In a case of this kind, I do not suppose any amount of prayer would bring deliverance immediately, and God's servants should be so close in touch with Him that they can detect every cause of disease. When one 's passing through this test, faith sufficient for healing will not be given to the sick one, or those praying for his recovery, until the test, or God's lesson is learned. So, do not let Satan use the thought that it is your testing time dear ones who are afflicted, for it is not the will of God that any of His children shall be long bound by sicknes or any oppression of the devil, for Jesus came to set us free from every bondage. So learn your lesson quickly and seek deliverance.

Sickness may be caused by over work, either mental or physical, even in God's service, and it may not always be a sin, for it 's hard often to tell just how much our bodies will endure and not fail us. Phil. 2:16, 17. After yielding oneself to Jesus as his physician, use no remedy, even the simpliest, neither hot water, alcohol plasters or lemonade, as the use of the natural interferes with the supernatural always.

Above all, learn to conquer the tongue. Talk health, and health alone. Never talk over your aches and bad feelings with others. Every one has troubles enough of their own, and in rehearsing to our neighbors our many ailments we not only cause doubt in his mind and our own, but rob him of the sweet peace other words might bring. Always allow your thoughts to rest upon health and your tongue to tell the glad news of health through a risen Lord who died to purchase it for you.

Notice your actions and words, making them all true. Never notice symptoms. Often, after one is prayed for, he will feel and look worse than before. This is the Lord's way of testing your faith, and if we look above symptoms to Christ, the aches and pains will soon pass away; but if one remarks, as is often the case, "Oh dear, I am not healed at all, I feel worse than ever," and forget that faith is not feeling, he need not expect healing for "As from and of God, I will give a few in- your faith is, so shall it be done unto you."

I wish to correct this statement. We have not left and have no intention of leaving, especially as we are the only Pentecostal missionar es left to carry on the work.

Brother Post has charge of the Apostolic Mission at Alexandria and I have little stronger, and I ask all the dear Saints charge of the mission at Cairo. Besides this, we have oversight of all the Pentecostal work in Egypt, and the native min-'stry look to us for their support in the work. However, since this mysterious letter was sent, nearly all our support has been cut off and we have received none for some time. We are, in no way, discouraged as we know that our Lord will never fail us. We rest upon His promise. "My God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus the Lord." and we have learned to trust Him. In many respects, the work is going on well in Egypt. Several have been saved in Cairo recently. Pray for us.

MRS. D. L. McCARTY. India.

It is with grateful heart that I write of the Lord's blessing and working in our midst. I came to this village three and a half years ago and opened up the work. had a man and wife who had God's love in their hearts for the heathen. Our trials were many as I had no money and my little home mission only sent me a small offering every three months. I paid no salary and what they ate I ate. God was with us and many healings held the attention of the people. I did not ask for land as I could not build. So for over three years I I'ved in a native mud house. The work increased and new workers came without being asked. I had testings with workers also. When war came my heathen enemies gave me much trouble and at the same time I received a letter from a missionary informing me to leave th's district as it belonged to them, and also stated that as I was not English and was doing things contrary to law I might soon find myself in the hands of the law. It was reported that I was German. Our Consul, Mr. Baker, in Bombay advised me to put the matter hefore my district Magistrate. This I d'd and he notified the officers and four different ones from different places called in one day. In a few weeks the Magistrate kimself came. He quieted my fears and, after hearing my story and seeing how I was living, ordered the estate to give me land to bu'ld on. I selected a desirable spot but so very small. People wondered what I would do with so small a piece, but He knew. I did not know at the time that the revenue was fixed at 10 cts. a year. Then, as if by understanding, (in answer to much prayer) money came and I went right to work building, and when it was finished it was all paid for (\$300), and I had \$26.00 left. This has been spent for dental work. Then, just as before, when I had nothing on hand, the door was again opened. A man from a near village (surrounded by the villages where a year or so ago many were asking for baptism) came and offered me land free and to help to build if I would put a preacher in his v'llage. I have promised if money came by October when the rains are over, I would do so. This will cost \$100.00. Following that one week the old man died, leaving no heirs who owned the land of which this l'ttle piece is a corner. I at once wrote the magistrate asking for one acre (the other is farther away), and he promptly wrote the special manager of the estate. He came, took the land back into the estate and then gave me the acre. So I have now a nice big place and the revenue is \$4.00 a year. It is wonderful how God has been turning things for

me. Now I have need for worker's houses on the compound, and thus stop the rent in the village. This I feel sure He w'll supply in good time. Pray for us.

We are making every effort to secure a site on which to start a mission, and to this end found it necessary to make a trip to Mombasa to see the American Consul. Left Ogada early in July, returning the 23d. We put our camp outfit in shape and left again the 27th for a month or more of work among the Nyangori people. We are now in Camp in North Nyangori, about 10 miles from Kisumu. No regular mission work has ever been done among the people of this part of the tribe. They live in the - mountains and make small gardens whereever they can find ground suitable. They also raise cattle, sheep, and goats, but do not kill any for meat. They wait until they die, then eat them.

They offer sacrifices to the Sun, of sheep and goats, which they eat, but never kill for food only. We hope to get some p ctures of these people but they are afraid of the camera.

We praise God for health and for supplying our every need. We are today in as good health as when we left home, nearly four years ago.

The war does not affect us only that the cost of living has advanced 30 per cent, and mail is much longer reaching us. Formerly it took four or five weeks, now, six or eight. All mail for British East Afr'ca will come through safely, however.

Pray for us that we shall know the will of the Lord in these trying times.

The Key to the Scriptures

"My friends gave me a book, called the 'Key to the Scriptures.' I wondered if the Bible was locked and needed a key. But I took the key and with it entered the palace of truth in the book which men reverently call the Bible. And lo! I found that the key only unlocked certain selected chambers, and that when by the aid of the key, I entered these selected chambers. I found that they had been previously prepared with the most strange, upsidedown pictures of my Lord and Saviour, and I came away astonished at such reversals of what are the plainest portraits language can paint, as the sentences in the Bible naturally read.

"Listen to my story and see if you do not feel the same way-ashamed to deny the Bible portrayals of your Lord and Saviour, the best Friend man ever had. Let us be quite clear that we are not discussing the merits or demerits of the system (Christian Science) just now. That can come another time. Just now we are concerned with the one question whether or not we can trust this 'Key to the Scriptures,' whether 'Science and Health' teaches the same things that the Bible teaches or whether we must choose between them as a guide to truth. If people want to follow the teachings of 'Science and Health,' whether it agrees with the Bible or not, that is one whole problem by itself. But when people are asked to accept this textbook of Science as an interpretation of the Bible, that is another question, and to me, as a seeker after truth, the vital preliminary question.

"So I entered the palace of truth, with my friends having the key. Immediately I said, 'Show me the room where are the promises to those who pray.' But I was told that room was kept closed. And when I asked if the key did not unlock all the rooms I got a decided 'No.' The key bearer even said that some of the Bible was a lie. Unspeakably shocked, I asked quite pointedly if it was really true that awful word was used in connection with one single verse of the Bible. The only reply was to direct my attention to 'Science and Health,' page 524, lines 25 and 27, where this Key to the Scriptures says of that part of the Bible which contradicts the foundation teaching of Science and Health, 'It must be a lie.'

"But I was bound to investigate further, and, returning to the subject of prayer, ? asked if the advocates of this system did not believe in prayer. The answer was that they used the word but not in the sense I used it; that they did not believe in asking God for help in trouble, that it was not necessary, for all they had to de was to take. Granting no little of important truth in that teaching, which also has always been taught by students of the Bible, I asked about the additional truth taught in the promises to those who ask, repeating many of the specific directions to ask, ask, ask. But the subject was peremptorily dismissed with the positive declaration that they did not teach people to ask God for things. 'But' I said, 'we are told in the Bible to ask and we shall receive,' and you are asking me to accept your key as an explanation of the Bible. What I am trying to learn just now is, not whether your theory of prayer is true in part and woefully incomplete, but whether you are to be trusted as a teacher of the Bible. What are you going to say about those many, many sayings in the Bible about asking, and about those many examples in the Bible of people who did ask and got answers? People who in great and sore trouble called on God in just as definite petitions as any child ever addressed to a parent, and were helped?'

"But to this question there was no answer. 'We'll then' I said, 'take me into the children's room. I am greatly interested in the little ones. And there keeps ringing in my ears that old verse 'Unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder: and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.' Show me

"Then the keeper of the key smiled and said. 'We have something very beautiful in the Child Chamber of the palace of

"So we went in. But there was no child. And I asked for the child. And I was told that there was no child there, and referred to 'Science and Health,' page 583,

lines 1 and 3, where children are called 'Sensual and mortal beliefs; counterfeits of creation; material suppositions of life.' But I reminded again, 'We are not talking about your theory of children, horrible as it is. I do not wait here to remark upon it; I want to find out how far you are to be trusted as a teacher of the Bible. The Bible says, 'Unto us a Child is born.' What do you say?' Then I was referred to Science and Health,' page 109, line 24, where it is written that 'When a new spiritual idea is borne to earth, the prophetic Scripture of Isaiah is fulfilled.'

"'But,' I remonstrated 'you have taken away the child and substituted a spiritual idea, and you have introduced the word 'borne' for 'born,' an entirely different word, and you have changed a definite event, namely the birth of a child, to an indefinite series of events namely the rederstand that is your idea of interpreting the Bible?"

"The only reply was a pointing to the open page of 'Science and Health.'

"Not ready to give up, I asked, 'Take me to the room set apart for our Lord and Savior. I'm a sinner and I want to know the way of salvation, and I would see Jes-

'Then the keeper of the key said it would open that room, but warned me that I must be prepared for a heroic lesson. So we went into that room too. But I did not see Jesus. Jesus was not there. And I asked why. As nearly as I could understand the explanation, the name of Jesus stood in the way of the principle of 'Science and Health.' Being directed by the keeper of the key to 'Science and Health,' page 23, line 29, I found to my horror that the name of Jesus, and the command to believe on Him for salvation, had been stricken out; that the faith which accomplished salvation instead of being a belief in Jesus, 'demands self-reliant trustworthiness' (line 30, page 23). Where the name of Jesus is written in the Bible, 'Science and Health' substitutes little dots like these and makes one of the most precious verses in the Bible read "Believe and thou shalt be saved," with the explanatory remark that the injunction which this text demands is self-reliant trustworthiness.

"It was a heroic lesson, all right. But after I caught my breath I asked if that was not misrepresenting instead of interpreting the Bible. And then, with a most winsome smile, the keeper of the key said, 'But you don't understand. You take my key and come into this room often and by and by you will 'understand' that what you need is not to trust in Jesus, but to realize your own trustworthiness.'

"'But,' I came back, 'the Bible says that there is none other name under heaven given among men whereby we must be saved, and you have stricken that name out of the great salvation text, so pretending to explain the Bible. Let me say again, my one aim this morning is not to say anything either for or against your teaching, but to find out for myself how far I can afford to trust you as a teacher of the Bible.'

"Let us try once again. 'Take me to the Resurrection Room. I want to know about that. My dear father and mother and sister, and little boy and girl are dead. Tell me about the resurrection of Jesus.'

"And then the keeper of the key with the most ingratiating smile, said. 'Ah' that is the most beautifully fixed up room of all. We have a surprise for you here. Jesus was not dead at all. Does not that make you happy?'

" Make me happy? My father and mother and sister, and little boy and girl, whose baby smiles have been a haunting. holy memory for twenty years, have not been hiding in the grave. Why should it make me happy to be told that Jesus did not die? In His death and resurrection every grief-smitten heart has found comfort and hope in the great loss that comes to all. Surely, I must fail to 'understand' your book. Tell me plainly. I want to get exactly what you mean. This is no place for a double meaning of words. We are speaking of Jesus now, not that Christ which you differentiate from Jesus but the identical Jesus whom the disciples companied with. Am I right in understanding you to say that this same Jesus was

not dead at all, but alive and hiding in the tomb?

"For answer I was told to turn to 'Science and Health,' page 44, line 28. This is what I read there: 'The disciples believed Jesus to be dead while he was hidden in the sepuichre, whereas he was alive.

"I then crosed Science and Health' and opened the Bible, and turned to page after page where in every possible way it is asserted that Jesus died. He Himself showed the disciples how He must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things and be killed. The soldiers broke the legs of the crucified thieves and omitted that custom in the case of Jesus because they found Him already dead. And similar statements abound throughout the sacred record. All over the pages of the Bible it is written that Jesus died and rose again from the dead. In 'Science and Health' it is written as explicitly as language can say it that Jesus did not die.

"Now the practical question is not just as to what we shall believe. The issue is more searching than that. There is involved a very definite choice between these two newedly given spiritual ideas. Do I un- things; taking the Bible in its natural and necessary meaning, as the guide of life, or taking the unnatural and impossible meaning given to the Bible by 'Science and Health." "-Rev. G. N. Praise God for His faithfulness! He truly works for them that wait for Him. Some little time ago I mentioned in a letter that we had need of more houses for our native preachers, and that the cost of these houses would be from \$25 to \$35 each.

During a Convention at one of the Pentecostal centers, God put it upon the hearts of those assembled to send us \$60 toward the cost of these houses which enabled us to begin the work.

We live in a native State whose King is a young boy, but the affairs of the State are adjusted by a Manager and an Assistant Manager. The Assistant Manager is a Christian, but the Manager is a Mohammedan and therefore strongly opposed to Missions. It was to this man, however, that we had to apply (as is the custom here) for the privilege to purchase and cut the timber needed for doors windows and rafters. This we did in the formal court manner, praying God to work for us so that the Manager would let us get what we needed. When we received the official reply to our request we found our prayers had been answered and we were granted the privilege to cut and take away all needed timber free of cost. So all that the wood for these buildings cost us was for cutting and hauling. Surely God worked for us far above all we could have asked or thought, for this was by far the greater portion of the expense, as the mud is free and the mud-work is cheap. The tiles for the roofs and the wood being the main expense of these mud houses.

And now we have three nice, new, comfortable houses, with mud walls and floors, occupied by our two native preachers and their wives who are our Bible-women, and their families. The third house we expect to have occupied by another preacher after the rainy season is over.

It being made possible for us to build these houses has enabled us to have more preachers which are badly needed in this great field where there are so many villages practically untouched.

Despite the rain and the heat, these creachers and Bible-women have faithfully carried the Gospel to the villagers in all the surrounding country. We have prayers with them at six o'clock in the morning and by half past six they are on their way to preach the Gospel to those "who sit in darkness and the shadow of death." Some days they walk six or eight miles, and when they return are so happy in the service of the Lord. Perhaps they have had a few, and perhaps a score or more, among the other listeners, who have never before heard the story of salvation through Jesus' blood, and their hearts have been maile glad in telling that old, old story. Pray for these workers, they need your prayers; and, "Finally, brethren, pray for us that the Gospel may have free course and be glorified, even as it is with you."
