

MINUTES OF THE SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD Held at

Springfield, Mo., September 4th to 11th, 1918.

OPENING MEETING, SEPT. 4th, 1918.

At 9 a. m. on September 4th, the Diemer Theater on Commercial Street, Springfield, Mo., resounded with the praises of God as many ministers and delegates from different parts of the country assembled for the Sixth Annual Session of the General Council. Elder J. W. Welch gave a short preliminary message of welcome to the brethren, directing their hearts and minds towards the Lord, and then handed the devotional exercises over

to Pastor Joseph Tunmore of Pittsburg, Pa.

Brother Tunmore spoke from Deut. 6:4, 5, "Hear, O Israel; the Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord with all thine heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy might." He gave us the keynote for the session; for the whole meeting from the first day until the last was marked for its worship and adoration of Him who is worthy of all our love. Brother Tunmore appealed for a definite appropriation of the Lord Jesus Christ for all the needs of the Council. There was a long season of most earnest, fervent prayer, and there was an appropriation of Him who alone is our wisdom, and an expression from many hearts and lips that in all things He might have the pre-eminence.

ROSTER COMMITTEE

Before the first session closed, the Chairman, Elder J. W. Welch, appointed the Roster Committee, naming the following brethren: Fred Lohmann, Malvern, Ark., E. L. Banta, Puxico, Mo., and John T. Wilson, Thayer, Missouri.

AFTERNOON SESSION, SEPT. 4th, 1918.

After a rousing song service led by Brother Walter Higgins of West Plains, Mo., there was a blessed season of fellowship, as the different brethren from many different States told of the presence and power of God at their respective assemblies, and testified of the goodness of God manifested in their individual lives. Pastor R. A. Brown gave a strong appeal for a greater spirit of sacrifice in the ministry. He praised God for the General

Council with its unselfish spirit of co-operative fellowship, and urged all present who were not in line to join this voluntary co-operative association that was based entirely on the principles of unity and love.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

The Chairman appointed the following brethren as a Resolution Committee: E. N. Bell, Springfield, Mo., Chairman; D. W. Kerr, Cleveland, Ohio, and John T. Boddy, Youngstown, Ohio.

COMMITTEE ON SERVICES

The Chair also appointed the following brethren as a Committee on Services: Joseph Tunmore, Pittsburg, Pa., Chairman; S. A. Jamieson, Tulsa, Okla.; J. R. Jamieson, New York.

Pastor R. A. Brown preached at the evening evangelistic service, and few who heard it are likely to forget

that very powerful message.

THURSDAY, SEPT. 5th, 1918.

At 8.30 a. m. there was a special devotional service held to pray for the Lord to guide in the deliberations of the day.

At 9 a. m. the Roster Committee made its report

which, on motion, was adopted.

THE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Brother J. W. Welch said that he was glad of this opportunity of again meeting the brethren in Council. He sounded a note of praise for the goodness of the Lord during the past twelve months. He reported a good normal increase in the growth of the fellowship, over one hundred new ministers having joined the Council during the past year. The Council now has 728 ministers on the field, 91 of whom are missionaries either in the regions beyond or going there.

He reported sufficient funds had come in to the General Council office to meet the immediate needs of the past year. The ministers had sent during the past year an average of \$1.75 each. That the General Council office might have a larger force of workers and a greater efficiency in pressing the battle in the future, he recommended a further development of the plan of co-oper-

ative support during the coming year.

During the past year a gift of Three Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars was received from a dear friend of the work. The condition attached to this gift was that

the Council pay to the giver the sum of \$60.00 per quarter until the death of the donor. The gift was thankfully accepted, and the quarterly returns are being made. A further sum of three thousand dollars had been received as a loan. This loan was made without interest. To protect the brother who made this loan, three notes had been given to him for one thousand dollars each, payable one on January 1st, 1919, another January 1, 1920 and one payable January 1, 1921. With these sums the new building in Springfield had been purchased as headquarters for the General Council, and as permanent quarters for the Gospel Publishing House. A part of this sum had been reserved for paying the annuities on the first mentioned gift, and for the payment of the first thousand dollars of the three thousand dollar loan.

The last part of the morning was given to an interesting discussion on the question of "deacons" and "elders". Brother E. N. Bell proved from the Word that the appelation "elder" is equal to that of a bishop, and showed that in the early church that they were appointed to have charge of large companies of saints. One qualification of an elder was that he must be "apt to teach". He strongly deprecated the practice of selecting men qualified only for "deacons" and then calling them "elders", and not having any deacons at all. This practice, he said, was unscriptural and also led to confusion as to authority when these men had exactly the same title as that of the preacher. The preachers are the elders.

To this view the brethren said "Amen".

AFTERNOON SESSION, SEPT. 5th, 1918. REPORT OF GOSPEL PUBLISHING HOUSE

Brother E. N. Bell, the manager of the Gospel Publishing House, made his report. He told that during the past twelve months there had been a substantial increase in the volume of business, the books showing the volume of business or the gross receipts to have been during the year, in round figures, \$23,000.00 as compared with \$17,000.00 the previous year, an increase in business of \$6,000.00. Against this, however, the Publishing House had been to a large expense in moving, and the great increase in the price of paper, the price of books and Bibles, and other commodities used had swallowed up the increase. But for this blessed increase we would be badly in debt, whereas as it is we are not. A number of

marked improvements have been made in the equipment of the Publishing House during the past year. A balance of about \$500.00 remained on hand after the payment of all bills, but against this it would be necessary to install a heating plant immediately, the cost of which will probably be from \$1,500.00 to \$2,000.00. Pray over this need.

THE MISSIONARY TREASURER'S REPORT

The Missionary Treasurer, Brother Stanley H. Frodsham, made his report. He stated that in 1916, the sum of \$4,879.50 was the total missionary funds received. The following Council year these funds increased to \$10,223.98. He was glad to report a further encouraging increase, and that during the past year no less a sum than \$29,630.51 had been received for the missionaries, and had been distributed in the various fields. He recommended that missionary prayer meetings be started in connection with all our assemblies to bear before the Lord the immediate needs of our missionaries, and that a missionary publicity campaign, as was recommended at the last missionary conference at Chicago, be inaugurated in order to lay before the Pentecostal brethren everywhere their obligations to their representative in the regions beyond.

CONCERNING THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS

On motion the election of Chairman and Secretary

was deferred until Friday afternoon.

On motion it was decided to proceed as in 1917 in the matter of the election of Presbyters. There were a large number of nominations for General Presbyters from the floor. These names were handed to a Committee of Nomination. This Committee consisted of seven brethren who were nominated from the floor. R. A. Brown. Chairman; E. N. Bell, Jacob Miller, J. T. Boddy, Joseph Tunmore, S. A. Jamieson and Walter Jessup.

Brother Fred Lohmann of Malvern, Ark. preached with great power to a crowded building that night.

FRIDAY, SEPT. 6th, 1918. ORDINATION COMMITTEE

After the devotional exercises, the Chairman appointed an Ordination Committee for the purpose of examining candidates for the ministry. This committee consisted of the following brethren: S. A. Jamieson, J. R. Flower and J. R. Buckley.

The Roster Committee made a further report which was adopted.

ELECTION OF GENERAL PRESBYTERS

The Nomination Committee brought in their report and recommendations, and the following brethren were elected to the General Presbytery: Joseph Tunmore of Pittsburg, Pa.; John Coxe of Wilmington, Dele.; T. K. Leonard of Findlay, Ohio; J. T. Boddy of Youngstown, Ohio: J. R. Flower of Stanton, Mo.; J. S. Secrist of Olympia, Wash.; S. A. Jamieson of Tulsa, Okla.; John Goben of Lucas, Iowa; Stanley H. Frodsham of Springfield, Mo.; E. R. Fitzgerald of Russellville, Ark.; D. H. McDowell of Scranton, Pa.; G. N. Eldridge of Los Angeles, Calif.; D. W. Kerr of Cleveland, Ohio; Wm. Morwood of Houston, Texas; R. A. Brown of New York, N. Y.; E. N. Bell of Springfield, Mo.; J. W. Welch of Springfield, Mo.; J. R. Evans of Toronto, Canada; O. P. Brann of Westernport, Md. and R. J. Craig of San Francisco. Calif.

All the Chairmen of District Councils are also Associate General Presbyters by virtue of their office. Their names were read out as follows: F. A. Hale, San Antonio, Texas; W. B. Jessup, Enterprise, Ala.; E. L. Banta, Puxico, Mo.; H. J. Richardson, Denver Colo.; J. R. Kline, Detroit, Mich.; W. J. Walthall, Carthage, Ark.; Willie T. Millsaps, Topeka, Kans.

REDUCTION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECU-TIVE PRESBYTERY

On motion the following resolution was adopted, Resolved that the Executive Presbytery shall consist of

five members instead of seven as heretofore.

It was further directed that the Secretary, in conjunction with the Council Committee, should reconcile the resolution of rotating the previous seven members to the present number of five members. There are five members of the Executive Presbytery whose terms of office are unexpired, and they constitute the present executive Presbytery. They are J. W. Welch, Stanley H. Frodsham, E. N. Bell, J. T. Boddy and S. A. Jamieson. MISSIONARY APPOINTMENT CERTIFICATES

On motion the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the Credential Committee be instructed to renew the Fellowship Certificates of all foreign missionaries on the field in good standing on or before the first of each year without cost to the missionaries.

CHANGE OF HEADQUARTERS

A resolution was presented as follows:

Resolved, That this body now in session hereby confirms the removal of the headquarters of the General Council from St. Louis, Mo. to Springfield, Mo.

On motion the resolution was adopted.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON, SEPT. 6th, 1918. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY

On motion it was agreed that the election of officers should proceed as formerly, the nominations for these brethren being made from the floor. Two nominations were made for Chairman, Brother D. W. Kerr of Cleveland, Ohio and Brother J. W. Welch, the retiring Chairman. Brother Kerr's name was withdrawn when it was understood that the retiring Chairman was willing to serve a further term if the brethren so wished it. Brother Kerr also said it was impossible for him to accept the office. Brother J. W. Welch was then re-elected by acclamation as Chairman and received a great ovation as he entered into his office for the fourth term in succession.

Brother John Coxe and the retiring Secretary, Stanley H. Frodsham, were nominated for the office of Secretary and Missionary Treasurer. The name of Brother Coxe was withdrawn, and the retiring Secretary was also

re-elected by acclamation.

There was some discussion on the Statement of Fun-

damentals during the afternoon.

CHANGES IN MISSIONARY RESOLUTIONS

At the General Missionary Conference held in Chicago in May, certain recommendations were made to the General Council suggesting two changes in the missionary resolutions that were adopted by the Council in 1917. So, on motion, Item No. 6 of the Missionary Resolutions was revised to read as follows:

Resolved, That in order to facilitate the equitable distribution of funds, each missionary be requested to furnish such quarterly financial reports as will enable the Foreign Missions' Committee to understand the needs of their respective stations with a view to intelligent and hearty co-operation.

Item No. 9 was revised to read as follows:

Resolved, That all missionary property purchased with

missionary funds be transferred, where legally possible, to the General Council; and when not legally possible, a local corporation be formed in affiliation with the General Council, in accordance with the laws of the country in question, to hold said property in perpetual trust for missionary purposes.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 7th, 1918.

After the morning devotional session, Brother Joseph Tunmore gave a message that will long be remembered on the subject of entire sanctification.

SUPPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL OFFICE

After an informal discussion, the following resolution

was adopted:

Whereas the work of the General Council in its definite program of development of the spirit of co-operation and fellowship in home and foreign fields will incur considerable expense during the coming year, including financial support of the Chairman and such help as he will need, maintaining headquarters, stationery, postage,

traveling expenses, etc.;

Resolved, That every minister in the fellowship be requested to contribute from his tithes or as an offering, or through his influence, the sum of one dollar per month. And further, looking towards the increased efficiency of the General Council throughout the entire field, all who can contribute more, personally or through their assemblies, than the suggested amount, are hereby strongly urged to do so. If practicable, let each assembly take one offering each year for the upkeep of the General Council office.

During this morning session there was a discussion

on missionary matters.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON, SEPT. 7th, 1918.

The afternoon session was taken up with an animated discussion on the importance of a united stand in the ministry on the truth that the full consummation of the baptism of believers in the Holy Ghost is invariably accompanied with the initial, physical sign of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit of God gives utterance, (Acts 2:4).

Brothers R. A. Brown, Joseph Tunmore, J. T. Boddy, D. W. Kerr, T. K. Leonard, W. H. Pope, J. Rosselli, F. F.

Bosworth, W. T. Gaston and many others took part, and there was the utmost enthusiasm as message after message went forth in defense of what has always been considered the distinctive testimony of the Pentecostal people.

On motion, the resolution was adopted as follows:
Resolved, That this Council considers it a serious disagreement with the Fundamentals for any minister among us to teach contrary to our distinctive testimony that the baptism of the Holy Spirit is regularly accompanied by the initial physical sign of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit of God gives the utterance, and that we consider it inconsistent and unscriptural for any minister to hold credentials with us who thus attacks as error our distinctive testimony.

Brother W. B. Jessup preached that evening to a

crowded house.

SUNDAY, SEPT. 8th, 1918.

Sunday was a never-to-be-forgotten day. From the early prayer service to the final altar call at night, it was a day spent in the presence of God, a day of prayer, a day of praise, a day of power, in short a veritable day of Pentecost. In the morning service Brother E. A. Barnes told us of his work in Nicaragua. He will shortly be returning to that land again, and expects to go on laboring there until Jesus comes, and never expects to have another furlough. Many were melted to tears at the recital of the many hardships and victories in that dark land of apostasy and idolatry. Brother D. W. Kerr followed with a truly Pentecostal message on our Distinctive Testimony.

In the afternoon, Brother J. R. Buckley spoke on missionary work in British East Africa and Sister Ada Buckwalter told of her call to China. Brother A. P. Collins then preached on the Second Coming of Jesus. Again and again the preacher was stopped by the unbounded enthusiasm of his audience, and again and again the whole company of saints arose, and with holy hands upraised,

worshipped and praised the Lord.

A Missionary Offering had been announced for the afternoon session, and Brother D. W. Kerr introduced, with a short talk, the pledge card system. Cards were distributed on which the brethren were able to state how much they purposed to contribute, by the help of the Lord, to the cause of the evangelization of the world during the

coming Council year. It was explained later that this pledge offering was not meant in any way to interfere with the efforts of local assemblies in raising missionary offerings, and that these pledges should be paid through the local assemblies, and where such is not the case, they should be sent direct to the Missionary Treasurer, Stanley H. Frodsham, at 336 W. Pacific St., Springfield, Mo. The Missionary offering amounted to \$2,000.00 in cash and pledges, \$750.00 of which was given in cash.

At the evening session, Brother Raymond Richev. of the United Prayer and Workers League, Houston, Texas, gave a stirring message on the work of the League among the soldier boys, and Brother R. A. Brown followed with a strong gospel appeal which drew a number to the altar

MONDAY, SEPT. 9th, 1918.

After the devotional service, the following resolutions were adopted:

BUSINESS REGULATIONS

Resolved, That a Committee of the General Presbytery be appointed to draft Business Regulations for the guidance of the Officials of the General Council in their cooperative relations, and to revise the terminologies to fit the functions being performed, and that this Committee proceed to formulate the same as speedily as possible, so that their use may be adopted during this year.

Brother D. W. Kerr and Brother E. N. Bell were

asked to act as this committee.

EXPRESSION OF LOYALTY TO THE GOVERN-MENT.

Resolved, That the General Council hereby declares its unswerving loyalty to our Government and to its Chief Executive, President Wilson, and that we hereby restate our fixed purpose to assist in every way morally possible, consistent with our faith, in bringing the present "World War" to a successful conclusion.

During the morning session there was a further dis-

cussion on the Fundamentals.

In the afternoon session, Brother S. A. Jamieson of Tulsa, Okla. preached on "What it Means to Preach the Word", and Brother E. R. Fitzgerald of Russellville, Ark. gave the evangelistic message at night.

TUESDAY, SEPT. 10th, 1918.

In the morning session the following resolutions were adopted.

FOREIGN MISSIONS COMMITTEE

Resolved, That the Executive Presbytery shall constitute the Foreign Missions' Committee.

DELEGATES FROM LOCAL ASSEMBLIES

Resolved, That each assembly in co-operation with the Council is entitled to send at least one delegate each year, and that the assembly is especially invited to send its Pastor or some other representative, chosen by the assembly, as a delegate to each meeting of the General Council.

FELLOWSHIP AND CO-OPERATION

Resolved, That we again declare our Christian fellowship with every true child of God, and that we stand ready also to co-operate with all Christians who stand for our Fundamental teachings.

Resolved, further, that the officers of this Council and of our Publishing House are hereby directed to heartily co-operate with all such who will also really co-operate with us.

FUNDAMENTALS REAFFIRMED

The following resolution was adopted after discussion:
Whereas our distinctive testimony, expressed in the
Fundamentals as to the speaking in tongues as the Spirit
gives utterance being the sign of the baptism with the
Spirit, has recently been seriously called in question and
characterized as error, therefore be it

Resolved, That we hereby most heartily re-assert our position on all the Fundamentals, and especially on the point that the speaking in tongues as the *Spirit of God* gives the utterance is the initial physical sign of the full consummation of the baptism with the Holy Spirit, as herein revised, which revision was adopted by the Council.

ARTICLE No. 6 CHANGED

The full consummation of the baptism of believers in the Holy Ghost is indicated by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives them utterance, Acts 2:4. This wonderful experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth, Acts 10:44-46; 11:14-16; 15:7-9. The speaking in tongues in this instance is the same in essence as the gift of tongues, 1 Cor. 12:4-10, 28, but different in purpose and use.

FIELD WORK

Resolved, That this Council shall encourage a series of Bible and Missionary Conferences in various centers throughout the country, and that the Chairman shall be Office Superintendent of this field work. He shall have the right to appeal to any presbyter, evangelist, teacher, missionary or other minister to aid in the conduct of such work.

SOLDIER WORK

Whereas great numbers of our young men of our country are being called to the various training camps preparatory to being sent to the battle fields of Europe, and

Whereas many of these are unsaved,

Therefore be it resolved that we take it upon our own hearts and urge all the saints to pray earnestly for their evangelization by every scriptural means, such as tract and gospel distribution, personal and evangelistic work in or near the camps.

Be it further resolved that the officers of this Council be instructed to get into communication with the British Pentecostal brethren with a view to co-operate with them in work in France in the trenches among the soldier boys.

CREDENTIAL COMMITTEE AND ITS DUTIES

Resolved, That the Credential Committee shall issue credentials to qualified ministers in accordance with recommendations already set forth in the Combined Minutes of the Council.

Resolved, further, that in the cases of serious unscriptural teaching, of ministerial discourtesy, or other conduct unbecoming to a minister of the gospel, that the matter be referred to the District Council or General Presbyter in the district where such minister may be located, and where these evils cannot be corrected by this means, that these matters be referred to the Credential Committee, which shall deal with the same in a scriptural way; and if it is found necessary, the Chairman shall, with the agreement by the rest of the Committee, call for the credentials of such offender; but such accused person shall be later granted a fair and impartial trial, if desired, by a council of ministers under the direction of a District Council or before the Executive Presbytery, or by a Council of ministers chosen by the Executive Presbytery,

and that a final disposition of the case shall be made as these direct after such scriptural trial.

SAFEGUARDING THE ASSEMBLIES

On motion, the following resolution presented by the Eastern District Council was adopted:

Whereas, it is known that many unreliable and unsafe teachers and preachers go about seeking entrance into assemblies without any recommendation, be it

Resolved, That all pastors, workers and leaders of Assemblies make proper investigation regarding such not known to them, and that the platform be denied them until

proper recommendations be forthcoming.

Furthermore, be it resolved, That the advice and counsel of the District Presbyter be sought in such cases, and in all matters of importance when at all possible, and that pastors and presbyters notify each other, reciprocally, as to the unreliability of such persons known to them when any unreliability becomes manifest.

Brother Kerr gave a further message on the Fundamentals in the afternoon session, and Brother E. L. Banta

preached at the evening evangelistic meeting.

WEDNESDAY, SEPT. 11th, 1918. HERESIES DISAPPROVED

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That this Council hereby disapproves of the "Seventh Day" teaching, also of the extreme so-called "Eternal Security" teaching, and of a teaching known as the "Fourth Blessing of Perfection".

The following resolution on Missions was also

adopted.

MONTHLY MISSIONARY OFFERINGS

Whereas our blessed Master said to His disciples, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature," we believe it is alike our privilege and our duty to assist in every practical effort to get the full Pentecostal message to the uttermost ends of the earth, therefore be it

Resolved, That this Council heartily recommends that every local Pentecostal assembly take up a monthly offering for our Pentecostal missionaries who are faithfully laboring to preach the Gospel "to every creature".

MINUTES TO BE EDITED

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That we hereby authorize the Executive Presbytery to edit, correct and revise the minutes of this session of the Council so as to make them readable and consistent, without changing the meaning of matters, and that after so corrected and approved they shall become the authorized minutes of the Council.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The Executive Presbytery is also hereby authorized to complete in behalf of the Council all unfinished business that may have been overlooked.

ADJOURNMENT.

On motion, the Council adjourned until called to meet

again by the Chairman.

Brother D. W. Kerr gave two very important messages after the adjournment of the Council to the brethren that remained, on the subject of "The Trinity versus Tri-theism and Unitarianism."
