MINUTES OF THE SEVENTH GENERAL COUNCIL MEETING Held at THE STONE CHURCH IN CHICAGO, Sept. 25 to Sept. 30, 1919. PREAMBLE AND RESOLUTION OF CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, God, our Heavenly Father, sent His only begotten Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, into the world, Who purchased and redeemed fallen man with His own precious blood, and called out of the world and saved a people, of whom He built and established His Church (Assembly of God. Matt. 16:18), upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the Head and Chief Corner-stone (Eph. 2:20), and organized and baptized it with the Holy Spirit, with its government upon His shoulders (Isaiah 9:6-7), said: "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matt. 16:18); and

WHEREAS, He gave the Holy Inspired Scriptures, (both old and new covenants, Heb. 8: 6-13) as the all-sufficient rule for faith and practice (2 Tim. 3:16), as follows: "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works," we therefore shall not add to nor take from it (Rev. 22:18); and

WHEREAS, He commanded that there should be no schism (division, sectarianism) in His Body, the GEN-ERAL ASSEMBLY (Church) of the first born, which are written in heaven, Heb. 12:23; and

WHEREAS, We recognize ourselves as members of said GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GOD, (which is God's organism), and do not believe in identifying ourselves as,

or establishing ourselves into, a sect, that is a human organization that legislates or forms laws and articles of faith and has unscriptural jurisdiction over its members and creates unscriptural lines of fellowship and disfellowship and which separates itself from other members of the General Assembly (Church) of the first born, which is contrary to Christ's prayer in St. John 17, and Paul's teaching in Eph. 4:1-16, which we heartily endorse:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FIRST, That we recognize ourselves as a GENERAL COUNCIL of Pentecostal (Spirit Baptized) saints from local Churches of God in Christ, Assemblies of God, and various Apostolic Faith Missions and Churches, and Full Gospel Pentecostal Missions and Assemblies of like faith in the United States of America, Canada and Foreign Lands, whose purpose is neither to legislate laws of government, nor usurp authority over said various Assemblies of God. nor deprive them of their Scriptural and local rights and privileges, but to recognize Scriptural methods and order for worship, unity, fellowship, work and business for God, and to disapprove of all unscriptural methods, doctrines and conduct, and approve of all Scriptural truth and conduct, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace, until we all come into the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God. unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ, and to walk accordingly, as recorded in Eph. 4:17-32.

RESOLVED, SECOND. That we recognize all the above said Assemblies of various names, and when speaking of them refer to them by the general Scriptural name "Assemblies of God;" and recommend that they all recognize themselves by the same name, that is, "Assembly of God" and adopt it as soon as practicable for the purpose of being more Scriptural and also legal in transacting

business, owning property, and executing missionary work in home and foreign lands, and for general convenience, unity and fellowship.

OPENING MEETING, SEPT. 25th, 1919.

The seventh session of the General Council of the Assemblies of God commenced at 2:00 p. m. on September the 25th, by the whole assembly uniting in the singing of "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty." This was followed by a season of adoration and praise to the Triune God.

The Chairman, Brother J. W. Welch, welcomed the members of the Council and the delegates in a few preliminary words and handed over the meeting to Pastor R. A. Brown, of New York, who conducted the first devotional service. Brother Brown read the 12th chapter of Romans and commented on the same, and the whole company present joined in a special season of prayer.

Chairman's Report.

The Chairman, Brother J. W. Welch, asked that all the brethren would co-operate by keeping in touch with God during the Council meeting. No one who was in touch with God need fear to make any interruption that would be to the glory of God. He said that there was no bad news to bring and no evil reports, but there were

many things to praise the Lord for.

He rejoiced that there was a steady and wholesome development in the fellowship. During the past year there had been a steady natural growth. At the 1018 Council he had reported 700 names on the list of ordained ministers. There are now 831 ordained ministers in the fellowship. Last year there were 120 missionaries on our list; at the present time there are 195. Fifty-two of these are in America, some of them are prospective missionaries and some are missionaries returned on furlough.

The Chairman said that he recognized in the Council there was an intensified and ever increasing true sentiment of fellowship. He felt from the beginning that God was in the Council fellowship, and he felt that God was still with us, and that He would continue to be with us in so far as we conformed to His plans. And truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son, Jesus Christ. He felt that the desire of every one of us was that God should be first in everything. As long as the true spirit of fellowship remained with us God would

prove Himself a real Father-God.

On the business side it is our purpose to keep things open to heaven and to earth too. We purpose to keep all the affairs of the Kingdom on a cash basis. At the beginning of the Council year there was in the General Council office a cash balance in the bank of \$261.12. The total receipts for the year were \$3,151.69. There were two distinct lines of income in the General Council office. The sum of \$680.94 had come in for credentials and the renewal of certificates. The balance had come in by offerings, and represented the practical co-operation of the ministers. At the last Council meeting none of the certificates were renewed. The fellowship certificates had been renewed immediately after the last Council meeting, but on the instruction of the brethren, these certificates had been renewed during the past month. This accounted for the fact that at the present time there was a substantial balance in the Council treasury. In the ordinary way, after this season of renewing fellowship certificates a season of drought might be expected, but he hoped that there would be a shower occasionally. He reported that the present balance amounted to \$1,365.87.

The Chairman praised God for the blessings of the past year and looked forward in a spirit of praise to the

anticipated blessings of the coming year.

On motion, the Chairman's report was adopted and recommended to become a part of the Minutes.

Roster Committee.

On motion, the Chair appointed the following brethren as a Committee of Roster: J. R. Evans, R. A. Brown, and David McDowell.

The Chairman explained that the privilege of voting belonged to all male ministers who held credentials and were in good standing, together with delegates of assemblies associated with the Council, who have a right to vote. All others, including women, who were accepted by the Roster Committee, would have the privileges of the floor.

Election of Officers Deferred.

Elder John Coxe, of Wilmington, Del., moved that the election of officers be deferred until Saturday morning, Sept. 27th and that the present officers serve until their successors were elected. Adopted.

Committee on Program.

The Chairman was requested, by motion, to nominate a Committee on Program and nominated the following brethren: Jos. Tunmore, of Pittsburg, Pa.; S. A. Jamieson, of Tulsa, Okla.; C. A. McKinney, of Akron, O., and Hardy Mitchell, of Chicago, Ill.

Committee on Resolutions.

On motion the Chair was directed to appoint a Committee on Resolutions, and appointed the following brethren: E. N. Bell, J. R. Kline, F. A. Hale, J. R. Flower, and F. Gray.

Missionary Treasurer's Report.

The Missionary Treasurer, Stanley H. Frodsham, reported that there had been a steady increase in missionary funds during the past four years. In 1916 the sum of \$4,879.50 had been received; in 1917 \$10,223.98; in 1918, \$29,630.51; but in the past Council year the sum

of \$63,548.59 had been received and sent to the field.

On hearing these last figures the whole Council arose

to their feet and praised the Lord.

During the past twelve months \$4,407.00 had been sent to India to help take care of the famine sufferers. This was in addition to large sums that had been specially designated to Brothers James Harvey and Will Norton, who were known to be doing all in their power to relieve the sufferers. In addition to the sum that had been designated for the Indian famine fund, in one month alone \$700.00 had been sent to these two brethren.

To help Brother Geo. Kelley build his Receiving Home in Sainam, So. China, during the past year the sum of \$4,961.37 had been forwarded. The home was now finished and occupied and was almost paid for.

There was great need for better homes for our missionaries in Liberia, most of whom were living in insanitary houses with mud floors, and as there is an abundance of timber in West Africa, the missionaries had asked whether we could secure for them a saw mill which would enable them to get out all the lumber they needed to build satisfactory and sanitary houses. Two appeals had been made in the Christian Evangel, and in response there had come into the Missionary Treasury for this, the sum of \$1,465.00. The mill was paid for, with 200 gallons of kerosene and gasoline to run it and the same was about to be shipped from New York.

In addition to the above needs being met, it had been necessary to bring several of our sick missionaries home on furlough. The sum of \$600.00 had been sent to Hong Kong to bring home Brother and Sister John D. James. The sum of \$450.00 had been sent to Sister Cora Fisher, in Cape Palmas, W. Africa, and \$200.00 had been cabled to Brother Harry Bowley to help bring him home

from W. Africa.

At the last Council meeting the brethren had been requested to contribute to a new fund for missionary expenses and publicity. A substantial sum was pledged at that meeting, and during the twelve months the sum of \$438.95 had been contributed. This had enabled this department to publish and circulate 80,000 missionary tracts. These tracts had gone a long way to stimulate missionary enthusiasm. At one time 10,000 of these tracts were sent out to the subscribers of the Christian Evangel, and the increase in missionary offerings during the two months that followed were most marked. The cost of publishing and mailing these tracts had been \$157.44.

During the past year a number of Liberty Bonds have been contributed to the Missionary Treasury and the face value of every bond had gone to the missionaries without deducting a cent for discounting the bonds. The actual cost of discounting these bonds was \$161.88, and the whole of this sum had been taken out of the funds designated for missionary expenses. Every month 100% of all funds received had been sent to the missionaries, and not even the cost of a single postage stamp had been

deducted from these funds.

The past year had been a year of progress amongst our Pentecostal workers on the field. From Japan came news of great blessing, and whereas a year ago not one single native Japanese had received his Pentecostal baptism, the missionaries now reported 50 had received, which included practically all the native evangelists employed. News came of real blessing in S. China, and from W. China our Brother, W. W. Simpson, reported a blessed work for the Lord. Our missionaries in N. China also reported a substantial increase in their work. In India the suffering and the poor were hearing the Gospel preached to them, and our missionaries were sending good reports. From S. Africa came the news of Pente-

costal revival, and from Porto Rico and the West Indies news was continually coming of great blessing on the Pentecostal work. Our workers who were laboring among the Mexicans also reported substantial progress.

It was moved that this report be accepted and that

it should become a part of the Minutes.

Report of Publishing House Management.

Brother E. N. Bell, Manager of the Gospel Publishing House, reported that during the past year the gross sum of \$30,373.00 had come in from every source to the Publishing House. This was an increase business of \$6,000.00 over the previous year. In most business houses, because of the great increase in expenses, the whole of this increase would have been absorbed. He was glad to report, however, that this was not the case in the Publishing House, and that practically the whole of this increase was on hand in equipment. This was largely due to the spirit of self-sacrifice of the members of the staff at the Publishing House who were willing to work for the Lord at a much less figure than they would receive if they worked outside for the world. The assets of the Publishing House a year ago in the machinery, furniture and stock in hand amounted to \$8,000.00, but this year the assets in the same items had increased to \$12,000.00. A balance in cash of \$2,000.00 had been set aside to pay back a loan that had been made by one of the brethren to help purchase the present premises of the Publishing House. A further sum of \$600.00 in hand had been set aside to pay for Bibles. News had come that the Bible Houses were likely to make 30% increase in the price of Bibles in October, and in order to enable our patrons to secure Bibles at the old prices, large orders had been sent to the different Bible Houses in order to get in a good stock of Bibles for the Christmas trade. This left the Publishing House with a clean sheet, no cash -10ahead, but not owing anyone a dollar in the world, and the prospects the best for the glory of God we have ever seen.

The Pentecostal Evangel.

Brother Bell pointed out that the Pentecostal Evangel lies at the base of all the work of God in the General Council. Without it, the Chairman would be tremendously handicapped, for this paper is the organ through which he reaches the greater part of his constituency. The same thing could be said of the missionary work. Without the Evangel it would be impossible for the Missionary Treasurer to keep the missionary enthusiasm at boiling point. It is because of the continual publishing of the needs of the missionaries that he is enabled to make such a good report. No material advance can be made in any direction without the Evangel. In all our planning we must plan to increase the circulation and usefulness of the organ of the Council fellowship.

During the past year the average contribution towards missions of the Evangel readers was \$5.00 each. If you want to make a good investment for missions, labor to secure new subscriptions for the Evangel, and you may logically expect that five thousand new subscribers will mean an additional \$25,000.00 for the missionaries. During the past year the Publishing House has lent its workers, cashier, stenographers, office editor and printers to the missionary work and borne the entire expense. Largely through its influence a total of \$96,973.59 for all purposes has been raised during the year, for the glory of God and the benefit of His cause. No individual received one dollar in profits from the same. All went to God's cause.

It will be seen, therefore, that the Gospel Publishing House and the Pentecostal Evangel should receive every possible encouragement from all Pentecostal people.

Another thing, he was sure that the brethren in the

ministry would find that the Evangel was the best assistant they could have in their particular fields. Every minister should see that every member of his flock subscribes for the Evangel, and he was certain that this paper would prove the most effective assistant pastor he could employ.

On motion, the report was adopted, and requested

printed in the Minutes of the Council.

On motion, the Council adjourned until 9:30 the following morning.

FRIDAY MORNING, SEPTEMBER 26, 1919.

The morning session commenced with a season of devotion and prayer, after which the business session was commenced. On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Establishment of a Missionary Department.

Resolved, That we hereby establish a distinct Missionary Department under the supervision of the Executive Presbytery, and direct that all of the Missionary Interests of the General Council be coordinated into it, and that a fund be provided to meet the expenses of such department.

Missionary Rest Home.

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That this Council hereby approves and ratifies the action of the General Presbytery in accepting through the officers of the General Council a free lease for five years on a property in Evanston, Ill., for the purposes of a Missionary Rest Home, and that we provide for the election of a Committee of Management as called for in the contract,

And further, That the Chairman of the Council be authorized to appoint another Committee to formulate a general policy for the government of the Rest Home, this policy to be subject to the approval of the Council.

On motion, the following resolutions were adopted: Ratification of Missionary Policy.

Whereas, the Lord has been pleased to abundantly bless the policy of the Missionary Committee in sending to the missionaries 100 per cent of funds received for them,

Resolved, That this Council hereby directs the con-

tinuance of this policy.

Further, Recognizing the many expenses entailed in the maintenance of a forward missionary policy, that this Council recommends that all assemblies and individuals, when sending in missionary offerings, send additional contributions for the support of the Missionary Department.

Maintenance of Missionary Stations.

Resolved, That all missionaries planning to return to the home field co-operate with the Missionary Department, where there is not a District Council on their field, in making arrangements for a supply to take charge of their work or station, and that they co-operate with the Missionary Department to secure and forward funds for the maintenance of such work or station during their absence.

Missionary Itineraries.

Whereas, Promiscuous and independent itineraries by returned or prospective missionaries often take them over the same ground and to the same assemblies at close intervals, thus burdening some and neglecting others, and

Whereas, We desire the development of every place in the entire home field on missionary lines, therefore be it

Resolved, That we discourage these promiscuous and independent itineraries, and that we recommend co-operation with the Missionary Department in *systematic* itineraries through the District Councils where such exist, otherwise through various representative men on the field.

(The idea is that the Missionary Secretary aid the mis-

sionaries in such arrangements.)

The Chair was requested to appoint an Ordination Committee to inquire into the suitability of some who were candidates for the ministry. The following brethren were appointed: A. P. Collins, of Denver, Colo.; Ellis Banta, of Lockwood, Mo., and John Coxe, of Wilmington, Del.

On motion the Council adjourned until the after-

noon.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

In the first part of the afternoon, Brother D. W. Kerr brought to the Council a very blessed message, at the close of which business was again resumed.

On motion, the following resolutions were adopted:

A Missionary Deputation.

Whereas, There is, and has been for some time, a great demand from the missionaries for a deputation from the home land to visit the various mission fields, and

Whereas, We recognize this as a real need in order to a fuller understanding of missionary conditions and problems, and for the encouragement and assistance of

missionaries on the field, therefore be it

Resolved, That we authorize the Executive Presbytery, as soon as practicable, to arrange such deputation, consisting of one or two suitable men for this work, and that when such men are appointed the expenses of their trip be met out of such funds as are designated for the purpose.

Safeguarding Missionary Properties.

Resolved, That in the matter of providing funds for missionary homes, stations, schools, and such like, adequate and proper safeguards, such as complying with the laws of the respective countries for the legal holding of property, and such as establishing and maintaining a

proper relationship between these missionary projects and the General Council, be first made before Council funds are made available for same.

On motion the Council adjourned until the following morning.

SATURDAY MORNING, SEPTEMBER 27, 1919.

The Council was called to order by the Chairman at 10:00 a.m. At the request of Elder David McDowell there was a special session of prayer for India.

Relative to a Council Secretary.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the Council elect a General Council Secretary who shall give his entire time to the general work.

Election of Officers.

Brother D. W. Kerr was chosen as temporary chairman, pending the election of a permanent chairman.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the nomination for officers of the Council be made from the floor, and that these nominations be submitted to a committee following the rule set by preceding Councils.

It was moved and seconded that Brother J. W. Welch be re-elected as Chairman of the Council. On motion, nominations closed, and Bro. J. W. Welch was unanimously re-elected to the Chairmanship of the General Council. The whole Council arose and sang, "Blesshim Lord, and make him a blessing."

On motion, the Chair selected a Nomination Committee, Brothers E. N. Bell, John Coxe, D. W. Kerr, R. A. Brown, J. N. Gortner, S. A. Jamieson and Fred Lohman.

Nominations for General Secretary, Missionary

Secretary, and Presbyters were made, and referred to the Nomination Committee.

On motion, the session was adjourned until the afternoon.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON, SEPTEMBER 27, 1919.

Elder D. W. Kerr brought to the Council a further helpful message, and at 3:00 o'clock the Chairman called a further Council session and the election of officers was resumed.

General Council Presbyters.

The following brethren were then elected as the new Presbytery of the General Council: G. N. Eldridge, Los Angeles, Calif.; E. N. Richey, Houston, Tex:; John Goben, Lucas, Iowa; D. W. Kerr, Cleveland, O.; R. A. Brown, New York City; S. A. Jamieson, Tulsa, Okla.; J. R. Kline, Detroit, Mich.; A. P. Collins, Denver, Colo.; John Coxe, Wilmington, Del.; E. R. Fitzgerald, Malvern, Ark.; O. P. Brann, Westernport, Md.; F. A. Hale, San Antonio, Tex.: D. H. McDowell, Scranton, Pa.: T. K. Leonard, Findlay, O.; J. R. Flower, Stanton, Mo.; Hardy W. Mitchell, Chicago, Ill.; W. B. Jessup, Gulfport, Miss.; C. O. Benham, Winnipeg, Man., Canada; J. T. Boddy, Youngstown, O.; W. Jethro Walthall, El Dolorado, Ark.; E. N. Bell, Springfield, Mo.; Stanley H. Frodsham, Springfield, Mo.: Jos. Tunmore, Pittsburg, Pa.; R. J. Craig, San Francisco, Calif.; J. W. Welch, Springfield, Mo. Later in the Council the following brethren were elected to the Presbytery: Frank Gray, Tacoma, Wash.; and J. R. Evans, Portland, Ore.

The Nomination Committee recommended that E. N. Bell be Secretary of the General Council. Brother

Bell was unanimously elected.

The Nomination Committee recommended that J. T. Boddy be Editor of the Evangel and that Stanley H.

Frodsham be Assistant Editor. These brethren were elected to these offices.

Enlargement of the Executive Presbytery.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That in view of the increased interests of the Council, and to shun any aspect of centralization, that we increase the number of the Executive Presbytery from five to seven.

A number of nominations were made for the Executive Presbytery, and the following brethren were elected: J. W. Welch, for three years; S. A. Jamieson and J. T. Boddy for a similar period; D. W. Kerr and Jos. Tunmore for two years. (The terms of E. N. Bell and Stanley H. Frodsham do not expire until 1920.)

Auditing the Accounts.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That we hereby direct the Executive Presbytery to have the books of the General Council office, Missionary Department and Publishing House audited each year.

Minutes of Past Councils.

On motion the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the Chairman appoint a committee of three to examine the Minutes of all Past Councils—that all non-essential resolutions may be brought before this Council and rescinded, and that all essential resolutions be combined in logical order and published by the Executive Presbytery.

The following brethren were appointed as Committee: Andrew Fraser, Ellis Banta, and D. H. McDowell.

All Ministers to Have Minutes.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the Secretary of the General Council send a copy of the revised General Council Combined Minutes to every one of the ministers of the General

Council, making provisions from the General Council funds to cover cost of same.

Co-Operative Relationships.

Resolved, That this General Council recommend to the Executive Presbytery that they proceed to formulate suggestive plans to be presented to the officers of the various District Councils and General Presbyters, where District Councils do not exist, clearly defining co-operative relationships, that there may be a uniformity in the matter of setting churches in order, and an understanding of the relationships that exist in the local assembly, its officers and pastor, and between the local assemblies and District and General Councils.

On motion the Council adjourned until the follow-

ing Monday morning.

Three services were held Sunday, and God gave a blessed day. In the Special Missionary meeting Sunday afternoon in the high school auditorium, amid shouts of praise, over a thousand dollars in cash and pledges was laid on the table for missions.

MONDAY MORNING, SEPTEMBER 29, 1919.

The Council was called to order by the Chairman at 10:00 a.m., after the usual devotional hour.

On motion the following resolution was adopted: Resolution on Requirements for Ordination.

Whereas, It is the desire of the General Council to maintain a high standard of efficiency in the ministry, therefore be it

Resolved, That a committee be appointed by the Chairman to prepare a manual, outlining a common standard of requirement of the ministry for the guidance of various District Councils and ordaining committees, and that co-operation be consistently maintained between various District Councils and Ordaining Committees in

these matters, and that the committee's report be available and reported.

Missionary Secretary Elected.

The Nomination Committee recommended that a ballot be taken for the office of Missionary Secretary-Treasurer. They recommended the following three brethren: A. P. Collins, J. R. Evans, and J. R. Flower. The result of the ballot was that J. R. Flower was chosen, and on motion the election was made unanimous.

On motion the session was adjourned until the after-

noon.

MONDAY AFTERNOON, SEPTEMBER 29, 1919. Permanent Missionary Work.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That we, as representatives of the Assemblies of God and of the saints in the home-land, hereby disapprove of all floating missionary efforts, of all aimless traveling from place to place, and from station to station, instead of settling down to learn the language and opening up stations and doing permanent missionary work.

Resolved, further, That in fields where there are already Pentecostal missionaries on stations, that consultation be had with the brethren on the field and the Missionary Department, and a satisfactory place be agreed on before opening up new stations in those regions.

Resolved, further, That hereafter women missionaries be advised not to travel alone in going to or from the field; and when going out for the first time, that they and their work be under the supervision of the older and experienced missionaries on the field.

On motion, it was agreed that the resolution on the work of the Presbytery in the 1914 Chicago Minutes be amended to read as follows:

Work of the Presbytery.

Resolved, First, that the General Presbytery is especially charged with the duty of administering the obligations of the General Council to the young converts, young preachers, and young assemblies in unity with us, and we express the prayerful hope that the ordained ministers everywhere will co-operate with, and render all the assistance in their power to the Presbyters in the discharge of these arduous labors.

Second: That among other things enjoined by the word of God upon such officers as our General Presbyters, they be expected to travel over the field, at home and abroad, as the Lord may lead, with the view to acquainting themselves and the General Council with conditions

everywhere.

Third: That after consultation with the pastors and officers of the local assemblies, the Presbyters, or officers of the District Council, where such exist, recommend to the General Council, which of the local assemblies in unity with us are scripturally set in order, and which also of said assemblies are not yet so qualified, in order that the General Council, through the Presbytery and the District Councils, may assist in the development of the latter in the will of God.

Fourth: We recognize the right of any Assembly of God, scripturally set in order, to conduct all its congregational affairs without interference from any outside source, and we express the prayerful hope that all such local bodies will continue in unity with the General Council, send messengers to its sessions and co-operate in all of its work.

Fifth: That we recommend to those assemblies which are not thus scripturally qualified that these seek the advice and service of the Presbytery, or the officers of the District Councils where such exist, and of such

brethren as may be able to help them in "setting in order

the things that are wanting," Tit. 1:5.

Sixth: That we further recommend all assemblies which have difficulties of any kind which seriously threaten to cause division in their midst, to seek the help of the Presbytery or the officers of the District Councils, where such exist, for advice before the division occurs.

Seventh, That, wherein any brother be used of God to establish an assembly in a new field, he be recognized as the logical overseer or pastor of that flock, and that he be encouraged to remain with the same assembly and feed it and care for it until the Lord shall raise up a pastor to take this responsibility and thus relieve him that he may press on to new fields; and if he shall find it needful to go before this is accomplished, let him confer with the nearest Presbyter, or the officers of the District Council, where such exist, before leaving. Thus we may avoid disaster that has come to many of the young assemblies that have been left without pastoral care.

There was a further motion to amend the resolution on examinations and time for ordinations, (Page 21 Combined Minutes), That the following words be added to the end of article 2, "where no District Councils exist."

Also to amend the resolution on standing credential committee (Page 6, Combined Minutes) to read as follows:

Resolved, That the Chairman and Secretary of the Executive Presbytery constitute a Credential Committee, and that the Council hereby authorizes them to bring out a form of credential certificate in keeping with the constitution and fundamental principles of the Council, and to issue annual certificates of fellowship to all in good standing; and further, on account of the expenditure incurred, and for the upkeep of the general office, applicants for credentials are requested to send in an offering of one

dollar with their application for ordination certificate, and that each year hereafter, an annual offering of fifty cents be asked for, to cover the cost of the fellowship certificate.

On motion, the following resolutions were adopted:

Missionary Schools.

Resolved, That the General Council hereby directs the Missionary Committee to take under advisement the establishment of schools for the education of duly accredited Native Workers, in the various fields where practicable, also schools for the education of the young children of missionaries where possible.

Missionary Resolutions.

The following resolution was recommended by the missionaries themselves, and passed by the Council at

their request:

Resolved, That funds received by prospective missionaries which are intended for outfit, passage or expenses while on the field, should be deposited with the Missionary Treasurer or other responsible agency, and should such prospective missionary be prevented from going forward to the field, for any reason, such funds shall be either returned to the parties from whom received, if desired by them, or made available for other missionary purposes.

On motion, the Council adjourned.

TUESDAY MORNING, SEPTEMBER 30, 1919.

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a. m., and on motion, the following was adopted:

Mexican Missions.

Whereas, There is already a blessed and prosperous work among the Mexican along the Mexican border, and

Whereas, There are quite a number of approved missionaries who are giving their entire time to this work, therefore be it

Resolved, That a special fund be created by appeal from the Missionary Department through the Pentecostal papers for the support of this Mexican work.

Missionary Rest Home.

Resolved, That the Executive Presbytery be delegated to appoint the local committee of management, and also be the committee to formulate a policy for this Home.

Further, That they submit this policy, when formu-

lated, to the General Council.

Resolution on Bible School.

Resolved, That the General Council hereby bids Godspeed to the Pacific Bible and Missionary Training School at San Francisco, Cal., and the efforts of Brothers Craig and Kerr in behalf of young men and women who desire to equip themselves for practical Christian work; and we further recommend that the school be made a District Council proposition.

Extension Work.

Resolved, That the matter of carrying the Pentecostal Message into the neglected districts of this country, where it is practically unknown, be referred to the various District Councils and that these Councils be encouraged to press this work; and in sections where there are no District Councils, that brethren who feel led to enter said sections, be encouraged by the assemblies, through their prayers and co-operation, to press out into these fields; also that the General Council and Executive Committee lend its support to this Extension Work, and that they consider some evangelists on the field and take them into consultation about pushing out into new fields, and also pressing the campaign through the Evangel.

Motion to adjourn.
