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## Have Ye Received the Holy Ghost Since Ye Believed?



ND it came to pass, that while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples, he said unto them, Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said

unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost" (Acts 19:1,2).

These were disciples and believers, but badly instructed, insufficiently taught, and their experience was in default. The Word says they were disciples and believers, but without the Holy Spirit.

Ignorant teachers have ignorant scholars. Defective electric wiring gives defective light. Unilluminated pastors have unilluminated people. Blind leaders of the blind!

These disciples were honest. They did not turn around and try to teach Paul. They did not argue that they had received the Baptism. They did not try to convince Paul that what he had was from the devil. They were convinced that they had not received the Holy Ghost. When Paul asked them, "Unto what then were ve baptized?" they said, "Unto John's baptism." Then said Paul, "John verily baptized with the baptism of repentance, saying unto the people that they should believe on Him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus." He did not belittle their first experience. He showed them that it was preparatory, pointing to the goal. Sanctification is not the goal, but preparatory for it.

They were teachable people. They never argued, they never disputed, and were willing to submit to immersion in the name of the Lord Jesus. Would that every disciple, every believer, would be as ready to submit to the teachings of Paul, who was instructed by the Holy Spirit. And when Paul had laid his hands upon

And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied.

It was not taking it by faith. The Holy Ghost was anxious, willing to communicate Himself, to fill those hungry hearts, but He could not come when He was not known about, to those who had never been instructed about Him, to those who had not as much as heard His name. There had to be a channel. Paul was a channel. God has His channels today. Sometimes it is a group of people, an assembly, or a camp meeting. Sometimes the Spirit is imparted by the laying on of hands of elders or pastors or Spirit-filled saints. After the Day of Pentecost God always used a channel.

The Holy Ghost was no "influence," intermittently permeating the air, but a distinct Person coming through a person on to persons. A channel may be unconscious that he or she is a channel, but the receiver always is conscious. The faith by which they sought brought an experience that was very real to the senses. The Holy Ghost manifested His presence in

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The Dove had found a willing home and the cooing of the Dove was heard. The Holy Ghost spoke through the newly filled temples, and these twelve disciples spoke in tongues and prophesied. Paul, in definite act, expected a definite result, and was not disappointed. Neither were the recipients. Twelve men received. A new church was formed then and there.

"Oh," but you say, "there is no word in the epistle to the Ephesians about being baptized in the Holy Ghost and speak-ing with tongues." They did not want a letter explaining or expounding it. They had the living letter. They had twelve living epistles who carried the truth to the Ephesians. All that Paul had to do in the epistle was to tell them to be continually filled with the Spirit, to have an overflowing experience, to follow the experience of heavy drinkers of wine, and be heavy drinkers of the Spirit (Eph. 5:18). He had no need to teach them about the Baptism in the Spirit. All he had to teach them was to go on seeking for more of the Spirit.

Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? "I have joined such and such a church. I have been baptized in the church-ordained manner, and we very seldom hear there is such a thing as the Holy Ghost. And when we do, it is sometimes a tirade against those who say they are filled with the Spirit. It is not encouragement to seek, it is discouragetteat, and a warning to shun."

If you want to be warmed, go in the sun. Don't stay in the shade. Don't stay in the cellar. If you want to be filled with the Spirit, go where the Spirit is honored, spoken about, and has the opportunity of coming into and upon those who are waiting to give Him a welcome. "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call" (Acts 2:39).

If the Lord has called you, listen to His call. Amen.

# The Bible Evidence of the Baptism with the Holy Ghost

As a Pentecostal people, we hold that the Bible evidence of the Baptism with the Holy Ghost, which is promised by the Lord Jesus Christ to His disciples, and to all them that are afar off, and as many as the Lord our God shall call, is speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance. We have found that whenever we, as a people, begin to let down on this particular point, the fire dies out, the ardor and fervor begin to wane, the glory departs. We have found where this position is held and wherever it is proclaimed, the Lord is working.

Luke gives us an account of some of the facts which took place in connection with the ministry of our Lord, in his gospel. In that first letter which he wrote to his friend, Theophilus-that is, "the gospel of Luke"-he records some of the facts connected with the ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ upon the earth, but later on, he wrote a second letter to his friend called "the Acts of the Apostles," in which he records some of the things which took place after our Lord ascended to heaventhat is, he records some of the things which Jesus did after He went to heaven, just as he records some things which Jesus did while on earth. There is no difference at all as to the manifestations of His power during His earthly ministry and His heavenly ministry in casting out devils, healing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing the leper, causing the lame to walk, the blind to see, the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak. When Jesus Christ was upon the earth, He wrought miracles by the power of the Spirit, when He returned to heaven He continued to work by the same power. He is still in the same business as He was when He began. He has not changed His plan nor His program. He is doing the same things today as He did when He was upon this earth. He is doing the same thing today as He began to do on the day of Pentecost. Jesus Christ is responsible for all the supernatural manifestations that occurred as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. We read in the sec-ond chapter of Acts, "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come the disciples were all together with one accord in one place, and suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Jesus Christ was responsible for what occurred here. And when in the 8th chapter of Acts, we read that Peter and John went down to Samaria and laid their hands upon believers, the Holy Ghost came upon them. Jesus Christ is responsible for what took place that time.

Later on, about eight years from the Pentecostal outpouring in the upper room, Peter went to Caesarea and preached the gospel to Cornelius and his friends, and while he was yet speaking, the Holy Ghost fell on all of them that heard, and they began to speak in tongues and magnify God. Jesus Christ is responsible for what occurred, for it was He that did it.

Paul went to Ephesus and found certain disciples, and after questioning them a little, he laid hands upon them and they received the Holy Ghost and began to speak in tongues and prophecy. Jesus Christ is responsible for what occurred there. For Luke tells us that in his former treatise he made a record of all that Jesus began both to do and to teach until He was taken up; and, after He was taken up, He continued to do and to teach, and He is still doing and teaching tonight. We do most steadfastly believe this. God raised His Son Jesus Christ from the dead, and, having exalted Him by His right hand, and having given to Him the promise of the Spirit, He sheds forth this which we now see and hear. He is still pouring out the Holy Ghost, and when the Holy Ghost comes, the Baptism can be seen and heard and we, as Pentecostal people, hold that a Baptism which cannot be seen and heard is not according to the pattern Baptism on the day of Pentecost, at Caesarea, at Ephesus and at Damascus-for there is where Paul undoubtedly received his Baptism, with the sign of tongues following. For, Paul says, "I give thanks to God, speaking in tongues more than you all."

When the Lord Jesus has performed His office work in baptizing those that obey God according to the Scriptures, the finished product can be seen and heard.

We read in John 20:30, "And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that ye might believe that Jesus is the son of God, and that believing ye the son of God, and that believing ye ve might believe that Jesus is the Christ, might have life through his name." John 21:15, we read, "And there are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written." The outstanding point here is this, that John in writing his gospel made a selection from the great mass of material that was so voluminous that had everything been written that Jesus did, the world itself could not contain the books. This is the principle we want to lay down, that John made a SELECTION of just such materials as served his purpose, and that is, to confirm believers in the faith concerning Jesus Christ the Son of God.

Luke wrote the Acts of the Apostles about 65 A. D., thirty years after Jesus ascended to the Father. Do you suppose that Luke put on record everything that Jesus did during that period. I think not. I believe that Luke held to the same principle of selection as John. For those disciples had a wider ministry than the Lord Jesus had when on earth, for Jesus was sent to the lost sheep of the house of Is-rael. But He said, "Tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem until ye be endued with power from on high." "And ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem and in all Judea and in Samaria and unto the uttermost part of the earth." At that time Luke was Paul's traveling companion. Paul had already gone as far as Corinth, Ephesus, Thessalonica and Philippi; he had already completed his third missionary journey, and, wherever they went, they preached the gospel, "the Lord working with them confirming the word with signs following." And what are the signs? In Mark 16:17, we read, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; in my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; they shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover." We have here five signs that are mentioned. These signs are what I call physical signs, signs that take place on the physical side, and every one of them can be seen.

Mark tells us explicitly that the disciples went forth everywhere preaching the word, the Lord working with them, confirming the word with signs following.

The word "follow" is a peculiar word in the Greek and means to follow so closely as never to be absent. The five signs followed the disciples in their ministry of the Word so closely that THEY WERE NEVER ABSENT. They were always present when they preached the gospel with the power of the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven.

Jesus Christ prophesied that they which believed on Him should "speak in new tongues." This prophecy was literally fulfilled on the day of Pentecost, for "they were all filled with the Holy Ghost and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." But were there not other of the five signs that occurred just then? No. Were there not some devils to be cast out? I think not. If those disciples needed anything done in that line I believe that Jesus would have done that before they went into the upper room. They were all blood-washed men, all justified and sanctified, and they were all waiting for one thing and that was the fulfillment of the promise of the Father which Jesus had given unto them: "And behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you; but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem until ye be endued with power from on high." We have the five physical signs, and Luke uniformly selects the one of speaking in tongues, in connection with the Baptism with His Spirit. Is it not marvelous? Is this not an altogether striking characteristic of the book of Acts?

When he speaks of the Baptism which came upon Cornelius and his friends, he says, "While he was yet speaking these

words, the Holy Ghost fell on all them that heard, and they began to speak in tongues, and magnify God." When we come to Ephesus, we find the same thing again. We ask the question, Why does Luke select the sign of tongues, when there was such a great mass of material from which he could have selected? There were other signs, and later on still others. Why did Luke select this one sign and make it so prominent? Some say you make this sign too prominent. Speaking by comparison, or comparing this one sign that was singled out from all the other signs, there is no question that it was intended to stand with the Baptism of the Holy Ghost. Take Paul's experience, which is recorded in the Book of Acts and in the 14th chapter of 1 Corinthians; take every experience with the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, and the speaking in tongues is clearly the accompanying sign. Although not actually mentioned in Acts 8, it is plainly inferred.

Speaking in tongues is the work of the Holy Ghost by Jesus Christ. It is the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, performing this miracle by the Holy Ghost. Or, to make the statement complete, it is God the Father on the throne through Jesus Christ the Lord, by the Holy Ghost, with whom He fills the believers, causing them to speak in other tongues.

Some one may say, "I believe you are right, but I do not believe in railroading folks into this experience." We do not, either. We believe that God the Son, or the Father through the Lord Jesus Christ, by the Holy Ghost, can do that business Himself. We believe that Jesus Christ is the Baptizer with the Holy Ghost.

Luke, writing the Acts of the Apostles, about 65 A. D., thirty-one years after Jesus had ascended, selects from a voluminous mass of material just such facts and just such manifestations of the power of God as served his purpose. What is his purpose? No doubt, his purpose is to show that what Jesus promised He hath so fulfilled. He says, "they that believe shall speak in other tongues." The 120 believed and, therefore, they spake in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. We also believe, and we speak in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance.

In the 10th chapter of the Book of the Acts, we read, "While Peter yet spake these words, the Holy Ghost fell on all them which heard the word. And they of the circumcision were astonished, as many as came with Peter because that on the Gentiles also was poured out the gift of the Holy Ghost. For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God."

We read in the 11th chapter these words, "And he shewed us how he had seen an angel in his house, which stood and said unto him, Send men to Joppa, and call for Simon, whose surname is Peter; who shall tell thee words, whereby thou and all thy house shall be saved. And as I began to speak, the Holy Ghost fell on them, AS ON US AT THE BE-GINNING. Then remembered I the word of the Lord, how that he said, John indeed baptized with water, but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost. For as much then as God gave them LIKE GIFT AS HE DID UNTO US, who believed on the

Lord Jesus Christ; what was I that I could withstand God?"

Here we meet with that fixed law in the universe so manifest everywhere, and that is the law of the relation of CAUSE and EFFECT. Like causes produce like effects. Peter does not say this in so many words, but it is included in the expression, "AS ON US AT THE BEGINNING." We see the cause of them speaking in tongues, "They were all filled with the Holy Ghost and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." What was the cause of them speaking in tongues at Caesarea? In the beginning, the Holy Ghost was the cause; eight years later, the Holy Ghost was the cause. In the beginning, the effect was speaking in tongues; eight years later, the effect was speaking in tongues. Like causes produce like effects. But that is not all that Peter said. Listen: "Forasmuch as God gave them the like gift"-like means equalso like or equal causes produce equal effects.

Like causes produce like effects. Equal causes produce equal effects. You can not escape the force of this argument. You cannot get around it. It is written

Would a signless Baptism have convinced those Jews? It took a sign Baptism to convince them beyond the shadow of a doubt that God had filled those Gentiles. And Peter said, "What was I that I could withstand God?" How did they know? "They heard them speak with tongues, and magnify God." Why were they astonished? They were not astonished to hear them speak in tongues, for they were perfectly familiar with that manifestation of the Spirit. What were they astonished at? "They of the circumcision were astonished BECAUSE THAT ON THE GENTILES ALSO WAS POURED OUT THE GIFT OF THE HOLY GHOST. FOR THEY HEARD THEM SPEAK WITH TONGUES AND MAGNIFY GOD."

"That statement says to me that the SIGN OF TONGUES WAS THE AC-CEPTED EVIDENCE OF THE BAP-TISM, among all the disciples and apostles up to that time; that they were EN-TIRELY FAMILIAR WITH THAT SIGN; that it was always present; that they were not astonished when they heard anybody speaking in tongues, but they vere astonished that God had poured out the gift of the Holy Ghost on the Gentiles. And they knew that, because they heard them speak in tongues. This Caesarean case is an outstanding witness that the Bible evidence of the Scriptural Baptism; the apostolic Baptism; the Baptism which Jesus Christ gives when He has a chance, is speaking in tongues as the Spirit gives utterance. We therefore take Acts 2:4 as the sample, or pattern Baptism.

Let us move up to God who is calling us to wait on Him until He baptizes with the Holy Ghost. God is still saving "by the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Ghost, which He shed upon us richly" with the sign of tongues following the Baptism with the Spirit.

When you are baptized in the Holy Ghost you know it, and need no one to acquaint you with the fact; bless God, you will soon be acquainting them. When you are baptized in the Holy Ghost, God touches you, and forever after in your life you know God touched you, and that He lives. In the final analysis, the Baptism in the Spirit is not a doctrine, but an experience, and the test of whether I have received is not a cleverly woven doctrine that will include me within its borders, but whether I know the experience in burning fact in heart and life .--Donald Gee.

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## -:- FROM PRIZE RING TO PULPIT -:-By Evangelist Eddie Young

God first spoke to my heart when I was yet a seven-year-old child. At that time my people were living in Santa Rosa, Calif. I had just started to school, and coming home one day, I said to my dear mother, "Mother, when I become a man I am going to be preacher."

Mother's heart was made glad at that time, though for years afterwards it was broken and sad because of the awful sins of her wayward boy, who had been called of God to tell the old, old story, but would not yield.

Soon after this first experience with God, some sporting men who were interested in prize fighting got hold of me, for already I had quite a reputation as a boy fighter, having whipped every boy anywhere near my size in my school and neighborhood.

They matched me with another boy, offering the winner five dollars. We met in an old barn one afternoon after school, and fought for one hour and fifteen minutes, at which time I knocked the other lad out, and out to stay. The men gave me the five dollars, patting me on the shoulders and telling me that some day I would be a great fighter, thus sowing the seed in my young heart that in after years did bring forth fruit unto sin in the prize ring.

This afternoon I returned home to my dear, precious mother and said, "Oh, Mother, I have changed my mind. I don't think I want to preach, but I have decided to be a prize fighter when I grow up,"

Needless to say, Mother was shocked and heart-broken, and did all in her power to change my mind and my way of living. But the devil had entered in, the seed was sown, and I went forth to sow my wild oats.

I continued fighting around my home town, and when only twelve years of age I left home to roam and tramp as a hobo over the Pacific northwest. Finally I tired of this life and came home to mother and father, and was fairly well satisfied for a season. But finally the old spirit returned, and I began to drink and fight.

At this time father was working in a rough, wild mining camp, and the life there appealed to my wild, adventurous nature. I went the limit drinking, gambling, and fighting with the miners and others.

Finally I drifted to the city and into the prize ring, beginning as a Bantam Weight at 115 pounds. I was very successful here and so was encouraged by my friends to go on. I became heavier and so entered the Featherweight class, 122 pounds ring side.

I became popular in my home town of San Jose, and was called "The Pride of San Jose." But my dear mother was anything but proud of me. I well remember one night when I fought Willie Conroy, a Lightweight from San Francisco. This fight was in San Jose.

I was badly battered as he outweighed me 18 pounds, but I succeeded in holding him to a draw. But on returning home at midnight my mother called me to her room, and when she saw my blackened eyes, my torn lips and bruised face, she began to weep as only a broken-hearted mother can.

She said to me, "Oh, Eddie, my boy, my boy! Don't you know you are killing your mother. My boy a prize fighter! You said you would be a preacher and here you are a fighter, broken and blinded by sin. Oh, my boy! I remember when you were an innocent little baby in your cradle, and we were all so happy then. But I would have gladly followed you to your grave and buried your dead body rather than to have had you spared to me to become a prize fighter. I am ashamed to go out on the street because I hear people say, "There goes Mrs. Young, the mother of Eddie Young, the fighter!"

So, praise God, He was speaking to me through my dear mother. I remember another night when I was leaving home for a fight, she kissed me and with tears in her eyes she said, "My boy, you are breaking my heart. I have lost all faith in you, but I haven't lost faith in God."

And, oh! today as a minister of the Gospel of Grace, I do thank God for such a wonderful, true mother. Surely I can sing with all my heart, "Mother's Prayers Have Followed Me."

I continued fighting for some time after this, but mother was praying for me, and would often speak to me about the dear Lord Jesus. Finally, conviction set in, and though I was winning fight after fight, and fast climbing to the top, I became very miserable. Sometimes in the midst of a fight the Spirit would speak to me and remind me that mother was praying for me, and that He, God, had called me to preach the Gospel.

At this time I began to steal away from the bunch on a Sunday, and would go to some church to see if I couldn't learn the way of life. Sometimes I would stagger in drunk, but in spite of this, the Spirit would strive with my soul, and I would long to do better. But very seldom, if ever, did I hear a plain, simple Gospel sermon, and I would go away empty and hungry, and back to the saloon or dance hall.

But praise the Lord, mother and others kept praying for me, and in July, 1911, while sitting at the dinner table with mother, father and one brother, the Spirit of God knocked me over, a good deal as He did Saul on the Damascus road. I felt a heavy blow on my breast, and almost knocked the dinner table over as the Spirit came on me so heavily.

Then there was a wonderful change, and oh, I seemed to actually be in the glory world and could hear wonderful music. Mother was watching me; and finally I spoke and asked her what had happened, and told her how I felt. She

screamed out, and with tears running down her face, said that God had answered her prayers and I was converted.

And then she told me how that she had prayed that if I would not yield up to God that He would force me and knock me over. And praise the Lord, He did that very thing. For from that minute at the dinner table I have had a new heart, and have been looking to Jesus and going on with Him. And though as a babe I often stumbled and fell, and was ignorant of the deep things of God and the teaching of the Word, I was His child and He has been so loving and patient with me and led me on from victory to victory.

My people, for generations back, have been members of the Christian, or Disciple Church. So naturally I joined with them, and my name was put on the church roll of said church. But I could find no reality there, nothing but husks, a Christ that had been dead for nigh on to 2,000 years, no thrill of the Holy Spirit in His power, no healing for the body.

So after two years, I left this church and joined with the Baptist. I found more life and Spirit there, but still was hungry for a real, living reality, a Christ that was the same as the Christ of the Gospels, one that could fill your very being with His presence, heal your body and work signs and wonders.

For years I went to minister after minister and asked where the promise of the Father was, as recorded in Matt. 3:11; Mark 1:8; John 7:37-39; Acts 1:4, 5. And man after man discouraged me by stating that this was only for the apostles and the early church age.

Often I felt like giving up the ministry —for I had started to preach the Gospel as I was so empty and hungry, my heart panting after a living Christ instead of a dead one, a present Saviour from sin, sickness and defeat. But all I could find was "A Great I Was" instead of "THE GREAT I AM."

I heard of "Pentecost" and from time to time would investigate, but somehow I was blinded and could not see God in it. Then the dear Lord took a hand and permitted sickness of the worst kind to come on me. In 1918 I developed a bad cough. I went to doctors, took lots of dope, but the cough grew worse. Then I noticed a pain in my lungs, and my heart grew sick as I thought of the possibility of my having TB.

I tried not to listen to the suggestion, but the cough continued with me. The pains in my lungs increased, and finally I began to lose weight and to run a temperature. Then I grew so weak I had to give up preaching, and finally was driven to acknowledge that I did have consumption.

When I went to one of the finest lung specialists in Los Angeles, he took six plates of my lungs, also a blood test and other tests. And after a week turned in the report which said I was a consumptive. He stated that there was nothing for me to do but quit work, take a serum treatment that he was giving, and trust to luck. He encouraged me by stating that at least there was a fighting chance. Also at this time I was a slave to glasses, wearing them constantly. So I was broken in body and spirit, and about ready to quit when I heard of a wonderful Pentecostal Revival at San Jose, my old home town. Mother encouraged me, and though I was under the constant care of three physicians, I left them all and went to San Jose.

As I entered the large tent I could feel a peculiar thrill and power, and I knew it was of God. As I listened to the gifted evangelist, Aimee Semple McPherson, tell the wonderful story of Jesus and His love; not only for the sinner but for the sick in body as well, I began to take hope.

Then I heard for the first time about the wonderful Baptism of the Holy Spirit. I listened for several services, read my Bible, prayed over the matter, and was soon convinced that "Pentecost" was of God, and so I plunged right into the meetings, taking my place on the platform, helping to pray for the sick even though I was a TB. myself and in a bad way.

Well, praise God, one night in my hotel I was talking to God in prayer, when like a voice the Spirit spoke to the "man inside," the inner man, saying, "Take off your glasses and throw them away." I reached up, took them off, breaking them across my hands. And oh, glory to God! I felt a thrill run through my body and I was wonderfully healed, not only of my eye trouble, but best of all, the TB., the lungs cleared up instantly. On returning to the tent next morning my dear mother said to me, "Why, Eddie, what has happened? You look so different!" And I told her how the blessed Lord had visited me during the night, praise His holy, blessed Name.

Then I became more interested in the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. I was just a little afraid of tongues at first, and rather hoped that maybe the Lord Jesus would give me the Baptism without tongues and all the noise that goes with it. But no answer came from the glory world until one night I said, "Praise the Lord, I am going to have it all. Whatever the Lord has is good for me, and He won't put anything on me that is of the devil."

Before this, friends and ministers had been coming to me, telling me that this was of the devil, that I would lose my mind, etc. Well, thank God, that night I did lose my own mind, and the mind of the Lord came in. Oh glory! I tarried until, and with me it was 2:15 in the morning of Sept. 6, 1921, when it seemed to me as though an awful electric storm had broken loose and I was hit by all God's lightning, for when the fire fell I saw it, and it hit me and knocked me over on my back and I burst out speaking in tongues, praise the Lord, as He gave utterance. For two hours I was under the power, praising the Lord in a new tongue.

After this I went into the wilderness, hardly knowing what to do with the wonderful gift and power the Lord had given me. I thought at first that maybe I could stay right on in the church and sort of be conservative and please both them and the Lord. But I soon lost my experience and was so sad and sick of heart. This went on for some months until at last I said, "I am going to preach 'Pentecost!" The devil told me I would lose all my old friends if I did, that the church would close to me, and that I would go into fanaticism and ruin my usefulness. But the Lord told me otherwise, and at last I decided to follow HIM and preach the "FULL" Gospel at any cost.

But, praise the Lord, there has been no cost but rather gain. I have gone all the way in this matter, taking out papers with the General Council, Assemblies of God, and the Lord is wonderfully blessing my soul. Instead of losing work I now have more calls for meetings than I can fill, and the dear, blessed Lord is wonderfully blessing my ministry.

At the present time I am in the third week of a revival campaign at Glad Tidings Tabernacle in San Francisco. The Lord is doing a great work here through Brother Robert J. Craig and wife, and they have been a help and blessing to my soul.

It is my intention, the Lord willing, to make this Assembly and Bible Institute my permanent headquarters, working out of San Francisco, my address being 1536 Ellis .St.

I do want to praise the dear Lord again for all the ways He has led me, and especially for leading me into the Full Pentecostal blessing and experience. Also that He has spared my blessed mother, whose heart I made sad for so long that she could hear and see me preach. She used to see me a prize fighter, broken, bleeding and bruised, but now she often sits in the audience praising the Lord for saving her boy. And I am so glad that I don't have to say, "Oh, angels, tell my mother I'll be there." Praise the Lord!

An Answer to the Critics of the Latter Rain

When Christ healed the man that was born blind the Pharisees complained, "This man is not of God, because He keepeth not the Sabbath day." This is man's wisdom, man's summing up of God's Son. In the eyes of the Pharisees, Christ went about in an unorthodox way to do an act of mercy. They magnified the letter at the expense of the spirit.

An act of blessing, an act of mercy, was made a stone of stumbling, and that which was to bring glory to Christ and establish His Messiahship they tried to minimize, In fact they practically called Christ a sinner. The whole thing was perverted. Why? Because perverted men were dealing with the situation.

Religious men discounted and minimized the work of grace performed by Him who was full of grace, and they even tried to persuade the man who was born blind and saw, that he had not been born blind; and the man gave a terse reply, "One thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see."

The natural man hates the supernatural. He will either try to explain it away or speak evil against it. Exactly the same thing is happening today. God is pouring out His Spirit and men are trying to explain away the ph\_nomenon, the supernaturalness of the Spirit in the unknown tongue.

The Pharisees called the parents of the blind man. If these parents had been living today they probably would have "Let him speak for himself. Our said, standing in church is such that we cannot afford to offend the minister. If he speaks against this thing, we cannot af-ford to speak in favor." And so the Pharisees came to the man who had been blessed. If he were here today and witnessing to the supernatural he would say, "One thing I do know, that, whereas I was down, now I am up. Whereas I was natural, now I am spiritual." Modern critics would say to him, "Now then, denounce the whole thing. We know this thing is of sin. It was spiritual in the early

days, but today this thing is of the devil." You can't persuade a Spirit-filled individual, one who has been baptized in the Holy Spirit and fire, that God has put the wrong spirit within him. The devil, backed up by his human agents in clerical garb, may try to persuade him that this is the case, but the reply will always be, "Whereas I was blind, now I see."

Of course excommunication will follow the bold declaration, but it will be followed by a divine ministration. Jesus said, "For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not may see; and that they which see might be made blind." Every Spirit-baptized soul is given sight, but to those who think and boast that they see there will come blindness.

The Pharisees were lifted out. They had no revelation from Christ of His divine Sonship. But the blind man had double sight. He saw Jesus of Nazareth, he saw the Son of God.

Excommunication brings a revelation. They put him out of the synagogue, and Christ took him into His heart.

The Pharisees were left out. They had al synagogue; the blind man worshipped a living Christ. God is doing the same today. You may argue, reason explain away, vilify, and do anything else in order to undo the supernatural, detract from Christ's Godhead and underestimate what He does-the same thing identically as was done by these Pharisees of old is being done today. They had a fine review, doubtless, of the whole situation in the synagogue-parents cautioned, and the blind man's name removed from the rolls. The same day his name was trans-ferred to the Lamb's book of life. The Pharisees were satisfied with their action, and the blind man was satisfied with Christ's action. The same Pharisees who could see became blind, and the blind man had double sight. Their arguing only solidified him in his opinion.

Would that all God's people were as firm, as solid, as sure in their standing for "the Latter Rain as this man was for the heavenly visitation. Page Six

## What Is the Use of Speaking in Tongues? Arthur W. Frodsham, Fredonia, N. Y.

Some years ago I was living in Transvaal, and there was quite a sensation through the discovery of the famous Cullinan diamond. I was staying in the house of a friend who was acquainted with the manager of the Premier mine from which this diamond came. They had been sinking a shaft and going deeper and deeper after diamonds. They cut the shaft through clay and the manager saw what he thought was a stone embedded in the side of the shaft. The experienced miners had passed it by and never thought for one moment that it was a diamond; it was so large and so rough. The manager looked at it, and began to pick at it with his penknife; and he could hardly believe his eyes when he discovered that it was a jewel of fabulous value. That diamond was purchased by the people of South Africa and presented to King Edward. Part of it has been set in the crown worn by King George of England, and the other part is in a pedant worn by Queen Mary.

The 14th chapter of 1 Cor. is a wonderful diamond that has been overlooked by a great many in the church. People have thought that it was a valueless stone, but it has turned out to be a precious diamond. There are many people who would rather this important chapter of forty verses was not in the Bible. They say they do not understand it, and they do not want to. We read in the 37th verse, "If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge the things I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord." So this is not Paul's opinion, it is not something that he has written by permission but something that he wrote at the direct commandment of the Lord.

Some ask, "Does not the Bible state that tongues shall cease?" Suppose you have a son in the foreign land and get letters from him. How you value those letters. You read them over and over again. But by and by the son comes home and you do not read the letters. Why? Because your son has come and he speaks face to face with you. We speak in another tongue now to our Father; we have wonderful communication with Him, but the time is coming when we shall speak face to face with Him, and then tongues will vanish away. And knowledge shall vanish away also. Why? Because we shall have such wonderful supernatural knowledge we will not need earthly knowledge.

There are three statements of Paul's in this chapter that I would like to emphasize. (1) "I would that ye all spake with tongues." (2) "I thank my God I speak in tongues more than ye all." (3) "Wherefore brethren, covet to prophesy, and forbid not to speak with tongues."

This chapter was written with two objects in view, the first to regulate the gifts of speaking in tongues and prophesying; and the second, to teach them

unselfishness, not to have a good time themselves at the expense of other people in the church.

(1) Paul expresses a distinct wish, "I would that ye all spake with tongues." He knew the value of such speaking

He knew the value of such speaking. (2) He further says, "I thank my God I speak in tongues more than you all.' Paul knew what he was saying. He was not given to extravagance. He says in another place, "I glory in the cross" (Gal. 6:14). What was the cross? In some parts of this country felons are executed in the electric chair. In other parts they use the hangman's rope. If any friend of ours is put in the electric chair or goes to the hangman's rope we are not inclined to boast about it. We feel it is a disgrace. Felons were crucified in the days of Paul. It was the lowest, the meanest form of death. Christ suffered a felon's death. When Paul said, "I glory in the cross," he took upon himself the shame of the cross in a measure. He knew that the preaching of the cross to many was just foolish-ness; but he says "To us which are saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor. 1:18). And so he gloried in that which was a great reproach.

Now he goes a step further. He thanks God he speaks in tongues more than them all. He glories in the stigma of speaking in an unknown tongue. A preacher told me that when he first went to a Pentecostal meeting he would look up and down the road to see if there was anyone watching him. He felt ashamed of associating with such despised people. But I do not see any need of apologizing when we are in the same order as people like Paul, and Peter, and John, and Mary the mother of Jesus. There were some Roman Catholic Sisters attending a meeting that I was in sometime ago, and I told them that every Roman Catholic should seek and receive the Baptism in the Holy Spirit; that Mary was in the upper room tarrying for this experience and they should do likewise. I noticed that they were tarrying at the aftermeeting.

When Paul says that he thanks God that he speaks in tongues more than all, I do not think that we should be ashamed if we are doing the same thing he did.

(3) "Forbid not to speak in tongues." We Pentecostal people are the only body that forbid not to speak with tongues in our assemblies. In every other place they will turn you out if you start to speak in tongues.

What are the advantages of speaking in tongues?

(1) "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God: for no man understandeth him; howbeit in the Spirit he speaketh mysteries." If you were invited to go to Washington to confer with Mr. Harding, you would consider it a great honor to have an interview with the President of the greatest republic in the world. You

may not be invited to Washington. But it is your privilege to have an interview with and speak unto God. What are we to talk about? We have it here, "In the Spirit he speaketh mysteries," or, as Rotherham translates this, "he is speak-ing sacred secrets." In Hebrews 10:19 we read, "Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus," or, as Rotherham trans-lates it, "Having boldness of speech in the holiest place by the blood of Jesus." We have here two ideas, knit them together, and you will see it is our privilege to speak sacred mysteries, with freedom of speech to utter them, in the holiest place. We speak not unto men but unto God. What are we speaking? We are speaking sacred secrets with an absent Lover that our natural mind or understanding is not allowed to enter into or grasp.

The idea conveyed here is that it is a language used in initiation into a secret society, a spiritual language for a spiritual purpose. I belonged to the Free Masons at one time; but I wrote a letter and gave up all connection with them, and the Lord filled me with the Holv Ghost in the evening of that same day. I am not telling you any secrets of Masonry, but I will tell you this: In the lodge there is a language used called religious language that a man may not tell outside the lodge, not even to his wife. It is a language used and preserved entirely for the lodge, for the service connected with Free Masonry. It is a secret sacred to them. The same thought is conveyed here, that when God gives a man a new tongue He gives him something that the natural man cannot fathom. It is just wonderful. Have you experienced it? Do you know what it means to speak to God of the things of God? God has put His Spirit within, and the Spirit is craving and longing to answer back to God in a language fit for God and fit for heaven, and God in His wonderful condescension comes upon one by the Holy Spirit and takes out that which He puts in.

(2) "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself," or builds up himself. He gets a spiritual tonic. Certain folks go to a doctor and pay him \$3.00 and get a bottle of tonic, and after they have drunk it they are frequently rather worse than better. I know a real tonic for the body. It is to take the life of the Lord for your body. We need a spiritual tonic and the Lord has provided this means, that as we speak in the unknown tongue to God we are built up in our spiritual life. This is a means of making us strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.

(3) When interpretation accompanies the speaking in tongues it edifies the church. It provides building material, the gold and silver and precious stones referred to in 1 Cor. 3:12.

(4) "Wherefore tongues are for a sign, not to them that believe, but to them that believe not" (V. 22). Tongues are a sign to the unbeliever. There are many unbelievers about; you have seen them, I dare say. Time and again when God by His mighty Spirit comes upon an individual in an assembly, perhaps speaking in tones of pathos, or anguish, or of sympathy, or it may be, in the voice of the thunderings of Sinai, the unsaved man trembles. Men have been brought to repentance through a message in a tongue which they have been able to recognize.

I was at a convention not long ago and "I had a a Baptist minister said to me, wonderful Baptism down in Chicago, but I did not speak in tongues." I said to him, "Praise God for what you have, but you will find the Lord has more for you.' I was speaking at that convention and used an illustration. I said that water boils at a temperature of 212 degrees Fahrenheit. You may put a kettle on to boil. The temperature may go up to 210 and the kettle is singing, but the water is not boiling. You may get the temperature to 2113/4 and the water is still not boiling. The kettle is singing away all right, but you have to wait till the water gets to 212 and then it is boiling. Then there is a mighty movement and the lid begins to lift. I told the folks it was like that with the Baptism in the Holy Ghost. As we wait before God we become warmed by the fire within. As the power becomes stronger, we feel that pressure must go off in steam, and we have the speaking to the Lord in another tongue.

This simple illustration seemed to go home to our Baptist friend and he went home and locked himself in his room. He tarried before the Lord. As he tarried before God the temperature went up to 212. We were tarrying with some of the folks at the convention when at 2 o'clock he joined us and said, "I have the Baptism now." The power of the Spirit of God had become so great upon him that his only vent wa, in speaking in tongues as the Spirit gave utterance. If you are seeking the fulness of the Spirit, if you are up to 2113/4, don't stop, but tarry till you get to 212. Open your whole being to the Lord and He will flood you with His power.

The Lord showed me a little while ago a simple illustration about pop-corn. You have all seen it put on the fire and subjected to heat. The heat penetrates right to the heart of the pop-corn and as it becomes hotter and hotter a change takes place within which causes it to burst and go up, and what happens? On its way up it is turned inside out; it is transformed into a beautiful, glorious white-The fire of the Holy Ghost is inness. tended to work a great change in you and me (2 Cor. 3:18), and by and by, when the change is perfected, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, we shall burst forth, the glory will be manifested, and we shall be caught up, clothed with a robe of glistening whiteness. But as in the case of the pop-corn, some do not respond to the fire and rise, but remain below brown and scorched. So there are those who will not be caught up but remain on the earth when the Lord comes.

When I received the Baptism I wondered that I so often said, "Glory!" We say glory because He is in glory, and the "Spirit of glory and of God resteth upon us." Have you the Spirit of glory? Be filled with the Spirit and you will be changed and surcharged with the power of glory.

## Are You a Temple or Upper-Room Christian?

The disciples returned to Jerusalem with great joy: and were continually in the temple, praising and blessing God (Luke 24:52, 53). The point of contact between the branches and the Vine was completed at the resurrection. With great joy! Continually in the temple praising and blessing God! What a wonderful advance on their previous experience. They all forsook Him and fled a few days before. And, after His crucifixion, darkness, despondency and despair was upon them. "We trusted that it had been He which should have redeemed Israel!" But after the resurrection and ascension the whole thing was changed. Great joy! Praising and blessing God! After knowing that He was risen, after seeing Him ascend, after receiving His benediction, they were filled with rejoicing.

What need have we of anything more? We really have the joy of the Lord now. Peter, are you fully satisfied? You heard the angels speak. You have had a vision of them. Surely this is sufficient. "No," says Peter. What was the difference?

The disciples were conscious that they were part of the Vine. "I in them and Thou in Me," "that they also may be one in us" (John 17:23, 21). The branches were pruned. What was lacking? Surely, everything was complete. He said, "I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to My God and your God." "My Father is the Husbandman." They knew that. What was lacking? To the outside appearance there was nothing lacking. Nothing that could be seen was lacking.

Yet there was a great lack. The inward sap had not begun to flow. The point of contact, the union was complete, but the vine had not begun to give sap.

They were continually in the temple, praising and blessing God. They continued in that attitude and they received more. They continued in expectation of getting more. Many Christians today have great joy, are worshipping and praising God in the temple; the point of contact is complete, they realize that their Father is the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. They are satisfied with their experience in the temple, and they won't change the temple for the upper room.

Many preferred the temple with a patched rent veil to a despised upper room. The sap flowed to the upper room but not to the temple. And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

This outpouring was hidden and unseen from the outside. No astronomer's telescope could detect it. It passed by the temple. It did not visit the high priest's home. The Holy Spirit knew where to descend. The Lord had been there before in His resurrection body. He now comes in the person of His Spirit. The temple was to be destroyed—not one stone was to be left upon another—but He was starting to build another temple, and in a few hours three thousand new stones were added to it.

Praises precede building. They were the first fruits of salvation. The praises in the upper room were the first fruits from the flow of the sap of the vine. They were the grapes of Eschol in the new Canaan. Magnifying God! Lauding God! The sap materialized. The tongues of fire were seen upon their heads and also the fruits of their lips were forthcoming as they gave praise unto God.

The stupendous work of salvation, its magnificent, its glorious consummation was being celebrated in heaven, and it had to be celebrated on earth, and only in the heavenly way could it be adequately celebrated on earth. Therefore the Holy Spirit was given.

The residue of the overflow from the hundred and twenty was understood by a small percentage represented by people of about sixteen different languages who heard it. And then when the praises subsided, when the earth had finished uniting with heaven in its artillery of praise, then the inspired disciples interpreted the Spirit-inspired prophesies concerning the long-promised Messiah. And then the stones which had been hewn had to be dressed and dealt with (baptized in water) and put into place, and three thousand souls were added to the church.

The joy, the praising and blessing God in the temple after the ascension was blessed as far as it went, but by grace the hundred and twenty went further. Five hundred saw the Lord at one time. Some of them may have been in the temple praising God at the time that the Spirit fell in the upper room. One was a natural praise out of a full heart, the other was a supernatural praise, out of hearts supernaturally filled by a supernatural power, by the Spirit of the glorified Jesus.

Many Christians are living today in the temple experience and they won't give up that experience by humbling themselves, leaving the temple for the upper room. Go where the Spirit falls, and never mind the place where He falls. If you want God's best, you must go in God's appointed way to God's appointed place in God's appointed time.

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SPEAKING UNTO GOD

"He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God" (1 Cor. 14:2). That is the inspired word of God, and he who says contrary denies God's word.

"He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God." Then do you mean to say that no one is able to speak to God unless he speaks in tongues? We say nothing. The Word says there is praying in the understanding, and praying in the Spirit. Paul says, "I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also." There is also a communion of the Holy Spirit. But here it clearly states in the Word that he who speaks in an unknown tongue, his conversation is not earthward but heavenward, not to men but to God.

You say, "I don't understand it." You are not meant to. But you are meant to experience it. People cannot understand salvation. They can experience it, and they won't fully know what salvation means until they hear that song. "Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God."

Speaks unto God! Converses! Not in thought, not in mind, but in actual voice. The God-given language. The God-inspired tongue speaks to God Himself and He listens.

What about all the saints who have gone before who have not had this gift, mighty saints, mighty men of God? If they were mighty saints, mighty men of God, God made them mighty, and they knew God who made them mighty. That in itself was their reward. Your question in no wise nullifies the statement that he that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaks to God. "But," you say, "I don't like to hear it. It is a jabber, it is a babbling. I don't understand it."

Nor do the matter-of-fact, old-fashioned, stereotyped bachelors understand the prattling of the babe. Ask the father what he thinks of his first born's prattle. He will close the Victrola door and open the nursery door in preference. Caruso takes a back seat, and the baby takes the front seat.

By and by the baby grows older and can converse with its father. There are babes in the spiritual, yes, and in their experience of the Baptism in the Spirit, and there are those who by exercise have become strong.

Speaks unto God! Argue against it, under-rate it, explain it away, villify it, say it is from below, criticize the class who have the experience, and empty the dictionary of abusive adjectives, and yet the inspired Word of God still holds good: "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God." Sin broke the converse between God and Adam. God came down in the cool of the evening to speak with Adam. Adam had hid. But the last Adam restored the communication, the conversation. He said, "I thank Thee that Thou hast heard Me, and I knew that Thou hearest Me always;" and He it was who also said that believers should speak in nev tongues. The new creation entitles you to the new tongue. And the Holy Spirit supplies the need.

Speaks to God! Converses' What on? Mysterics. Sacred secrets. He takes the man, the child of God, into the holy of FGies. "And there I will meet with thee, and I will commune with thee from above the mercy seat" (Exodus 25:22). Sacred secrets, mysterious thungs, concerning the kingdom.

This gift brings the soul so near to God that he is made a confidant of, though the natural of the man may not understand. A spiritual language to the Father of spirits, inspired by the Spirit, pertaining to things in the spirit world. No wonder the apostle was inspired to write the words, "Forbid not to speak with tongues" (1 Cor. 14:39).

Every soul that forbids another speaking in tongues is going contrary to the Word of God and will suffer accordingly for breaking God's command. These who knew the Lord's will and did it not will be beaten with many stripes, and those who knew it not and did it not will be beaten with few stripes.

Don't be a candidate for the many stripes by forbidding to speak with tongues, but rather drop the fighting and seek to be brought by the Spirit into that secret place where you can SPEAK to God of mysteries, of sacred secrets. Amen.

#### A MARVELOUS HEALING

Dear Christian friends, I have a testimony for everyone who is suffering. It is this — Jesus is the great Physician. Bless His name. I have been a sufferer for many years from tubercular kidneys, and have been given up to die several times. Sometimes I would have convulsions for a period of two weeks, the doctor visiting me every day and sometimes twice a day.

They took X-ray pictures of my kidneys, and these pictures showed the kidneys to be full of pus, also that the intestines had fallen and the bladder was in an awful condition. Dr. Clay, our family physician, told me that he had done all he could do for me. Twelve other doctors examined me and said that the removal of the worst kidney was the only relief, also saying frankly that I might live after the operation a few months, but would never rise from my bed again.

I was turned over to a specialist then, who gave me irrigations for the kidneys and bladder. It seemed as if I would die from these treatments, the pain being almost unbearable.

I was in the hospital from May 10 to July 9, and had to be taken back seven times afterwards, staying from four days to two weeks at a time. I was so sick and suffered so much that I decided to take my life. I was not saved, but **Jesus**, bless His name, spoke so sweetly to me and said, "Life IS worth while. Don't do it." Little simple words; but ah, His voice! "Sweet as rushing waters!" Its music filled my soul.

On the 15th of April, 1921, I heard of a revival meeting being held in the Pentecostal Gospel Tabernacle, Fourth and Grand Avenue, Dallas, Texas. My kidneys were almost killing me at this time. A great ridge as large as my arm was swollen across my back and side. I couldn't breathe without pain, sharp and keen as a thrust of a knife, but I got to the meetings. Praise God! I listened to the preaching, but was in such agony, that I thought several times I must ask my husband to take me home; but he said to me, "Don't you believe the Lord can heal you? You know the doctors have failed." I said, "Yes, I do believe Jesus can heal me." After the service was over we fairly ran to the platform where Sister Alford was standing. #### AFFAIRS IN PALESTINE

At the present time the population of Palestine consist of "590,000 Arabs, 75,-000 Christians, and 84,000 Jews." All Europeans and Americans are put down as Christians. An election was recently held to form a legislative council, but the Arabs did not vote. It was clear that a government from which the Arabs were absent would represent less than onefourth of the people and would not be workable. The British acting under the power given them by a mandate, have set aside the election and have chosen for immediate purposes, an advisory council, whose members will be nominated by the High Commissioner in Palestine. This council will consist of 12 members, 7 chosen from the chief Mohammedan families, 1 of the Bedouin chiefs, 2 "Christians," and 2 Jews. In that way all sections of the population will be represented, but not by election. The Arabs, who are very much opposed to the plans of the Zionist Jews, do not seem to be inclined to cooperate even in this.

## A HEARTBREAKING SITUATION

When missionaries have the work of the Lord on their hearts, and they are laboring and sacrificing to the limit and then find that the needs of the work are not being met, we can hardly blame them if they should feel a little discouraged, sometimes.

Recently we saw a letter from one of our missionaries that was written to a personal friend. Such a letter would never have been written to the Evangel nor to the Missionary Treasurer. But sometimes one will open their heart to a friend and let them know just how they feel about things. This letter fell into the hands of the Missionary Treasurer who feels that he must use it for the glory of God. The name of the missionary and her location will be withheld for a reason. Here is the letter:

"We say that we haven't the funds to support the missionaries properly, which is true. Other missionaries think we are crazy to try to get along on the little we get. I confess that sometimes the tears flow thick and fast when some of us have tried to do our best and we get so little that we run into debt. Such was the case this month, when I received a notice from the bank that \$12.50 had been deposited to my credit. I was already overdrawn at the bank and had not had any mail for more than a week, and bills were overdue. I was just home from a village. The Oriental sun was intensely hot and we sat down to a plain meal of potatoes, Chinese greens, a few tomatoes grown by a co-worker and some bread and water. This was our evening meal, which is the principal one of the day. I managed to keep back the tears until after service when the light was extingushed, then rolled into the camp cot and had a good cry. I prayed God not to let me murmur. I know that you have gone through trying experiences, far more bravely than I; but just pray for me, do. My heart is too full to write more, but for Jesus' sake and the work's sake don't let things of this nature hinder the sending forth of laborers this year; oh! so sorely needed."

And others would tell the same tale also, if we could but get them to open their hearts. How they have battled, and sacrificed and suffered that the banner of King Jesus might be placed in hostile soil. How they have ever managed to do what they have done is a mystery that cannot be solved. Surely God has watered the land with tears and is bringing forth a harvest out of the very life of his precious missionaries.

Only a few months ago we had a distribution of funds amounting to an average of \$18.00 for a month. A few received more than this, especially those who have assemblies standing back of them

with pledged support. But there are a large number who do not receive any other offerings except those which come through the hands of the Missionary Treasurer. Last month we were enabled to raise the allowance to \$25.00 for the month. This is just half the amount considered to be a fair allowance for our missionaries. May the Lord help us to get this burden on our hearts and may the missionary spirit so grip us that we shall strive together until we are able to send to our precious missionaries sufficient help to equip them for the work they are trying to do. You and I can lift the burden and save our missionaries some of the heartbreak at least.

Sister A. Ziese, Tai yuan fu, China writes: "We just had a little convention here which lasted eight days. Many of the Christians from the different stations gathered together and also some foreigners. At first there seemed great pressure as the enemy was raging, but then as we held on in faith, the Lord came forth in victory and all our hearts were blessed and refreshed. Toward the close of the meetings there were nine souls who followed the Lord in water baptism. Then one man and one woman received the Baptism in the Spirit, and others were wonderfully blessed nearly coming through speaking in tongues. Oh, how we did rejoice and praise God for, His wonderful love and works toward the children of men."

Miss Emma L. Wick, of the Apostolic Faith Mission of Johannesburg, sends a very good report of the native conference. "We have just had our annual native conference and the spirit pervading is so earnest that our European friends get richly blest in attending. We have some faithful preachers and overseers who have been with us from the beginning of this work. A white brother, 68 years old, gave a report of a total number of candidates, 591, baptized last year in his district and all of these are baptized in the Holy Spirit with the exception of about 15. For seven years this brother had been walking about this large district of the Zoutpansberg and still is not weary. He says he has kept the faith and a crown was laid up for him, but he has not finished his course!

"Brother Letwaba is a native overseer who has also been with us from the beginning of this work. He has built a large school and has certificated teachers. This insures well laid foundation for the native children and the Government helps with a certain amount. He has also been appointed marriage officer. He has a brother who is one of our old preachers. This brother was dying but the believers there held on in prayer persistently and he was raised up and was instantly healed and made well and strong.

"A born cripple was healed and the devil cast out of a woman who since she was a child was driven far away by him. Now she is in her right mind. In one place where they baptize there are many crocodiles, but they never molest those who come there for that purpose. In one church the power fell when it was dedicated and all present were baptized in the Spirit.

"Pray for me for strength. Have been here thirteen years."

#### UNITY IN SOUTH AFRICA

Brother Ernest Hooper, the superintendent of the native work in South Africa, writes, "We have just closed our missionary conference held here in Benoni and God came into our midst in much power. His blessed presence was manifest from the beginning to the end. Unity among the workers was precious, bringing into the gatherings a real taste of heaven. We were sorry when it came time to part for our various fields. But through the conference our hearts were encouraged to believe God as never before for great things for His work in this corner of the vineyard. A fresh vision of the need was given as we prayed and then faith to trust our Great Glorious Lord for the exceeding abundantly. Hallelujah!"

#### THE LORD ANSWERING PRAYER

Miss Bella Militscher writes from China, "God is so good to us here—just a little handful of missionaries compared to the great multitudes of heathen surrounding us. We are so thankful for the love and prayers of Gods little ones in the homeland who make it possible for us to live here and minister for Jesus.

"It seems as though the many years of hard labor of our senior missionaries are being reaped now. Surely prayers, tears and groans have gone up for the South China work and God is letting us hear and see the revival fires spreading. We are believing for a deluge of the Latter Rain. Good reports come from Canton, Lo Pau and Pak Nai and other stations.

"Last week Miss Finch and I had the privilege of going up country to visit one of our dear missionaries who labors alone at Sz ooi. We arrived just as they were concluding a series of revival meetings. Eighteen followed the Lord in water baptism within the past two weeks.

"I earnestly covet the prayers of all the dear ones at home that I may get this language more perfectly. I praise God for what He has done for me and gradually I am able to make known God's word to this people. A week ago Wednesday night I led the meeting and gave my first message from the Word in our regular Wednesday night prayer meeting. I am believing God for victory over every difficulty. Phil. 4:13."

#### THE MEXICAN BORDER

Brother H. C. Ball writes of further blessing on the Mexican Border, "I am back from the conference in Brownsville which was one nice place to be. Five workers attended from the Mexican side and five from the American. Our work in Tamaulipas is going ahead in a blessed way, and on the American side wonderful progress has also been made. In San Juan the assembly bought one of the soldier barracks and they have done the same in Mercedes. These two assemblies are without pastors so it is all the more marvelous. #### A PLAGUE OF LOCUSTS

Miss Hannah A. James writes from South Africa, "Since I wrote last we have been visited by locusts. The swarm did not sleep on the mission station but in the morning the fore-runners devoured our little wheat crop. Fortunately it was only a few inches high and will therefore sprout again. Here they did comparatively small damage as the Kaffir-corn and mealie crops were harvested in many cases, or too hard to attract the insects. The natives simply shouted for joy when they heard them coming, for they form a much esteemed article of food. They were out all night scooping them into large sacks, yet in the morning the remnant took two hours to fly past our house. The locusts are scalded and afterwards dried in the sun. This process enables them to be kept for months. When required as food they are fried in fat or butter. There are immense swarms of locusts all over Africa this year. The work here among the young people is encouraging so far as numbers go but the longed for break has not yet come. By ones and twos they enter into the Kingdom but we long for a mighty revival which will bring deep conviction of sin upon them."

#### THE LORD BLESSING IN PORTO RICO
