Deliverance to the Captives

Evangelist P. C. Nelson at the Springfield Assembly

In Luke 4:18 we are told how Jesus came back to Nazareth and opened the Scriptures and read, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the broken-hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, to preach the acceptable year of the Lord." What a wonderful objective our Lord had. What a tremendous purpose gripped His life! He found that purpose written in Isaiah 61, and He said, "This is being fulfilled in your ears this day."

Our Lord had walked from Galilee to Nazareth, down to the river Jordan, a distance of some seventy miles, to be baptized by John in the Jordan. And as He came up out of the water the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God descended like a dove and lighted upon Him. And lo, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." I wonder if there is anybody here who has heard arguments to attempt to prove that our Lord Jesus Christ was Himself the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. While Jesus was here on earth, there came a voice from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." And Jesus, in the power of the Holy Ghost, was driven into the wilderness to be tempted of the devil. He was first to fight a real battle with the devil, and then He was coming forth as victor to drive the devil out. After He had been weakened by forty days and nights of fasting, and the devil had been using his strongest temptations and weapons, our Lord came forth more than conquerer; He came out in the power of the Holy Ghost and went into all the synagogues of Galilee teaching and preaching, and healing all that were sick.

There were three elements in our Lord's ministry—a teaching element, a preaching element, and a healing ministry. I am sure we need those three elements in our work to-day. We need the teaching element lest we be light as chaff and blow away,

not being grounded in the Word of God. Terrible things can happen when we get away from the Word of God. to preach the message of full salvation. And we need the healing ministry just as at the beginning. Our Lord went everywhere throughout all Galilee, and when He came home they said, "We want to see what you can do. We've heard much talk about you. Now we want a demonstration. We remember you when you were only a young carpenter around here, going around waiting on Joseph, and we know you are no prophet. You have no supernatural power, you have fooled the people in some way. We don't take any stock in your miracles, but if you have any power, here is a good place to demonstrate it." Our Lord "could do no mighty works there because of their unbelief." By their unbelief they crippled His power so that He could not do the mighty works He had done elsewhere. He just laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them. If you want to see mighty works from God, you must bring real New Testament faith and you

"Nevertheless, when the Son of man cometh shall he find faith on the earth?" He did not say He would not find faith when He comes, but He implied it would be scarce. Some people say, "I have all the faith in the world." I don't belong in that company, for I don't have all the faith in the world. Sometimes I'm afraid I have none. When those who claim so much faith ask me to pray for their healing, as they often do, I am scared. For if they have all the faith in the world and yet are not healed. what will my poor prayers do? Some people don't know what faith is. Faith is not such a cheap thing that you can have it in unlimited abundance. When I was in Battle Creek I heard a lecture on radium. The lecturer had just returned from Europe where he had bought ten thousand dollars' worth of radium. He did not have several trunks to carry it home, nor any extra baggage along. He had a little tube made of lead and slipped this with ten thousand dollars' worth of the radium in his vest pocket. If you had as much faith as he had radium it would be worth millions to you.

Jesus said, "I counsel thee to buy gold tried in the fire," the real gold that will stand the test. There is a lot of sentiment that is called faith that will not stand the first touch of fire. When it is touched it all goes to pieces. Real faith can stand anything. It balks at nothing. It says, "It can be done," and it is done. It does not know any im-

"The Lord's Doings—Marvelous in our Eyes" D. H. McDowell

A remark was made to the writer by a minister of a full gospel assembly in 1907, saying that the Pentecostal manifestation would soon blow over and come to nought owing to the fact, according to his idea, that it was unscriptural and not founded on any stable or trustworthy experience. He warned me that I had better watch and not be caught drifting with some unworthy movement and become entangled in the meshes of false doctrine of the last days.

I do not recall just what reply I made at the time, but one thing I said was that if this experience of Pentecost-I meant the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, evidenced by the speaking in tongues,-was wrong and false and unfounded on any scriptural teaching, then I would be ready to say there was nothing real or dependable and that I would be fully warranted in rejecting the whole Bible as a "jumble of religious ramblings." It seemed to me at the time, in spite of what the devil was trying to do to intimidate God's hungry people, that this work came from God and had the seal of God upon it and had all the earmarks of a genuine and authentic scriptural experience. I recall some of the truths taught and the experiences through which we passed in those days which were remarkable in many respects. I will recount some of these.

1. A greater revelation of the truth and power of the cross of Calvary and the necessity of insisting as never before on the vicarious death of the Lord Jesus.

2. A clear and unmistakable revelation of the person and deity of Christ. How clear and definite the Holy Spirit made the Godhood of the Lord Jesus to the simple heart of faith and trust. There could be no mistaking that Christ had risen indeed and was at the right hand of God in the glory of the Father. One could better doubt his own existence than this wonderful fact. It stood out clear, shining as the sun in the heavens, and was just as real to the spiritual perceptions as the sun is to the natural. No mistaking this. No cunningly devised fable here. If this were a hallucination, then there is nothing real.

3. A missionary cry went up everywhere and there was a definite longing and yearning for the spread of the gospel to the ends of the earth-the gospel in all its power and fullness-a longing to tell the nations the glad tidings of Christ's death and resurrection. This could not be the ravings of a false experience. This universal desire, springing almost simultaneously in the hearts of God's people everywhere could not be the work of Satan. There was a certain constraining inward heart appeal amounting almost to an overwhelming, consuming desire that would brook no interference. This could not be other than the yearning of a God of love for a lost world being transmitted to the hearts of His saints through the mighty Baptism of the Holy Spirit. The devil is not an advocate of missions desiring to publish the "glad tidings of great joy to all peoples."

4. Miracles of healings were manifested, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Of course one might say that this feature was not new and that others had believed and experienced healings also. Truth, verily, but there can be no gainsaying that there was an increasing manifestation in this respect and that the spread of the truth of "Christ for the body" was on the increase and was definitely associated with the mighty activities of the Holy Spirit in this revival.

Testimonies by the score could be recounted here of healings of all manner of sicknesses and diseases but so much has been written that I will reserve these testimonies for a further article.

5. Emphasis was laid upon the premillennial return of Christ to the earth. The prophecies of the Bible were unfolded and emphasized in a wonderful way to an ever-increasing number of those who were being brought into the fold.

6. The opposition of the devil. It is certain that the devil would not oppose anything coming from himself or with which he has anything to do, but he would rather stimulate and encourage it. He understands also that the most potent weapon with which to fight this work is a counterfeit experience, and so it is not to be wondered at that he sent about his emissaries to represent this work and testify to the experience, while carrying on anything but a godly and Christlike walk.

In the newness of this revelation, the people of God were reluctant to put their hands upon anything or to reprove any manifestation for fear they might be quenching the Holy Spirit.

But as the work progressed and men equipped with a knowledge of the Scriptures and an understanding of the truth of God relative to this work were raised up there was a change brought about. Through the instruction of the Word of God, the saints rallied to the truth and the work took on definite progress. As at the beginning "the Word of God increased and multiplied." Men were raised up to distinguish between the true and the false and the standards were raised and the work established throughout so that instead of the prophecy that "it would soon die out and pass away," being fulfilled, it has increased and multiplied greatly so that it is to-day become one of the greatest factors in the support of belief in the fundamentals of the Scrip-Indeed the Pentecostal revival be termed, "Fundamentalism might Plus," that is, a movement standing solidly for the plenary and verbal inspiration of the Scriptures as the Living Word of God; and standing for all the fundamental teachings of this sacred and Holy Book, plus the personal heart experience, vouchsafed to every believer as his sole possession and inheritance attained by passing from a mere intellectual knowledge of truth which is very commeadable, to a realization of these sacred truths as the experiences of the heart in daily practice.

In a word, the Christ of the Bible is not only a person who trod this earth and taught precepts and principles, but He is One who lives in the heart of the believer in a practical and wonderful way. It is the **plus** that the devil hates. Learn all you desire to know about the Bible, study the truths all your life, but for the devil's sake, don't ever permit these truths to become real in your heart and life. Don't ever attempt to yield yourself in surrender to the Master, for if you do it will hinder the purposes of God's enemy, the devil. That is Satan's way.

God's way is, to study the Scriptures, know all you can about the truth, then by faith and consecration let the Holy Spirit come in and make Christ a real factor. This is the greatest need of man to-day. The Holy Spirit insists on positive heart experience and personal fellowship and communion with Christ Jesus. When you take this fact out of the Bible and out of Christian experience, you have nothing left but an empty shell. Jesus is the foundation, the center, the circumference. He is the heart and life of Christianity. When you take Christ out you have nothing left. Therefore Pente-cost stands for reality in the life. Otherwise it would join the ranks of those having mere outward religion, known in the observing of precepts and dogmas, and of such folks we have quite a plenty in the world. The great need of the world to-day is Jesus Christ, the Person, enthroned in the heart and life by the Holy Spirit. Jesus, the object and love of the heart! Praise His matchless name! "My soul doth magnify the Lord and my spirit

hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. He hath filled the hungry with good things and the rich (self satisfied in personal attainments) he hath sent empty away."

7. A love for Christ. This is to me one of the greatest and most wonderful of thoughts. This Pentecostal blessing has brought a deep, tender love for the Lord Jesus into the heart. He is so real to the heart and life. Jesus, oh, how sweet the name. How it thrills the whole being with tender devotion and expectation. Not a phantom vision of a principle, not an ideal, not a religious theory, not merely a name to think about and chant in hymns and psalms, nay verily, A PERSON, the only begotten Son of God, crucified, risen, ascended, glorified, who received the gift of the Holy Spirit at the hand of the father and poured HIM forth into the hearts of the believers to manifest His presence in the heart. Hallelujah! How amazing! Jesus, glorious Lord of lords deigns to call me Hjs beloved, shelters me beneath His wings.

8. This thought then naturally leads to the inevitable, viz., prayer, communion, and a love for the Scriptures. One cannot love Christ without desiring to commune with Him and this includes a love for His precious Word. Thank God we are not devoted to a mere religion of words and dogmas, but to fellowship with the real person of Christ. How real it is! How wonderful! And it is the privilege of every person who will forsake sin, and turn to Christ in repentance and faith in His vicarious death and resurrection. Because He lives, thou shalt live also.

Everywhere all over the world churches and missions have sprung up and this work is progressing. Hundreds and thousands of souls have been saved and are still being saved. Instead of the work dying out it is on the increase, because it is founded upon a Rock. It reminds one of the words of Gamaliel, "If this work be of men it will come to nought, but if it be of God, we cannot overthrow it, lest haply ye be found even to fight against God."

The churches have gradually been returning to the world since the Reformation. But God is raising up a witness, strong and powerful, that is going to the ends of the earth amidst much opposition. Let the love of Christ constrain us to hold fast and press on into deeper depths and higher heights of His bounty and matchless grace.

Jesus is soon coming and the Holy Spirit is yearning to prepare your life for that gladsome event. Lay this article down, go off somewhere alone with God, and there before Him with an open Bible, turn your life inside out. Do it in faith; do it in confidence; make much of the Blood of Christ for your entire cleansing and sanctification; yield and consecrate your all to Him, and the Holy Spirit will come into your life as He did into the church on the day of Pentecost and as He is coming into the lives of hundreds and thousands over the world this very day. Come, believe, pray, yield, and be filled, and then go forth and be waiting for the coming of the living, loving Bridegroom of your heart, Amen.

WISE TEAM WORK A Parable

Hear the parable of the lukewarm church. A certain great man had very many office employees who loved him much and served him earnestly. It came to pass that by accident the great man's fine, large car left the highway and ran into a ditch where it stood helpless. The great man's servants were very sorry to see the fine car in the ditch and greatly desired to see it again on the highway. In the evening they gathered about the car in great numbers. They came in their office apparel for they did not expect to get the car out, but they did want to please the great man by appearing to try to get it out. One of them sang a fine heartening song of how splendid it would be when the car was again rolling along the highway, and the servants of the great man all joined heartily in the chorus. Considerable was said about its pleasing the great man for them to come together to try to get the car out of the ditch.

Then they all began to try to get it out. Some pushed north, while others pushed south; some pushed east and others pushed west. Presently all but one stopped pushing to admire the heroic efforts one of the largest servants was making. They didn't start the motor, neither did the car move at all. When the time appointed had passed they all gathered on the highway, greatly pleased with themselves for having left their homes to come together to try to get the great man's car out of the ditch, and then went their various ways to their homes. The car was left in the ditch.

As a group of them walked along one of them said, "Let us go back and put that car on the highway. There are twelve of us and if we will put on clothes proper for the work and then go back to where the car stands we can put it on the highway. So it was done. in appropriate garb they returned to the car, with a set purpose to "tarry" at the task until the car was out of the ditch. They didn't sing and they didn't talk about how pleased the great man would be to have the big car back on the highway, but they set to work with a will and a fixed purpose of heart to put it there. The motor was started and the twelve men, disregarding every personal consideration, pushed and heaved with might and main, every one pushing in the direction the motor was pulling, all under one leadership and all in rythmic, pulsing union of effort. The car moved; the spinning drivers gripped a firmer footing and, sooner than any one had really thought, the car was out of the ditch. The twelve men climbed into and upon it and went gliding down the highway.

The meaning of the parable? Oh, that is plain. The dear Lord has a church which greatly needs a revival. It is grown cold and formal and helpless. Thinking to please the Lord His servants gather in large numbers in prayer meetings to try to bring on a revival in the church. However they have no idea of being successful. They merely meet to please the Lord. They sing and talk about the things of God and then they go to prayer. There is no plan of prayer; no determination to

bring on a revival; but there is an expectation that when the usual time of prayer meeting has expired they will rise and go to their homes, glad that they have met and prayed.

But if a group of them will determine to bring about a revival, put on the robes of prayer which are robes entirely covered with the red blood of Calvary and meet with set purpose to pray until a revival comes, under one leadership and in perfect unison and rythm of effort, calling upon God for a revival, getting connected with the mighty dynamo of the skies, and depending upon the wheels of God soon getting out of the mire and slime of lukewarmness onto the solid footing of Christian zeal and fervor, the revival will be on hand almost before any one is ready to guide and care for it.—C. THE PROTECTING POWER OF THE BLOOD

Job knew it, and Satan knew it, for he said to God about Job, "Hast thou not made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side?" Attacking the Pentecostal Movement

During the past month or two we have been struck with the number of articles appearing in

different papers attacking our Pente-Some of the articles costal testimony. contain statements that are positively ridiculous and utterly untrue. In reading these attacks we were reminded of a certain traveler who went to Central Africa and after two or three weeks wrote a very strong article against the natives of that country. But that old, experienced missionary, Dan Crawford, who for forty years had studied the natives very closely and knew them well, sat down and wrote the newcomer a post card in which he told this wouldbe critic he was all wrong, and he added, "I prefer to trust my knowledge of the natives, however limited, to your ignorance of them, however colossal." We have felt tempted to write similar cards to these critics of the Pentecostal outpouring whose writings, to say the least, are very misleading and uncharitable.

A Judge's Wise Comment

At one time we lived two doors away from a judge, a very godly man, who was devoting the last years of

his life to the ministry. At one time he was marvelously healed through the prayer of faith. He attended our Pentecostal meetings and put himself on record as a candidate for the Baptism. As we walked home from a Pentecostal meeting one night he said to the writer, "Some years ago I learned a great lesson. It was this, that most people are right in what they affirm and most of them are wrong in what they deny. For instance, there are a great many who affirm the truth of salvation through Christ's atoning work, but they deny the truth of His premillennial coming; they are right in what they affirm, they are wrong in what they deny. Again, I have seen people who have taught salvation through the blood of Jesus and have believed in His soon premillennial coming, but when you speak of divine healing they will not accept this truth at all. They are right in what they affirm but wrong in what they deny. Again, I have seen many who are scriptural in their affirmation of the truths concerning salvation, the return of Christ, and divine healing, but when you speak to them about receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost just as the disciples received on the Day of Pentecost, they will deny this truth and will state with vehemence that the speaking with other tongues is of the devil; they are right in what they affirm, they are wrong in what they deny. It was because I learned this lesson a few years ago that I refused to close my heart to the truths of the premillennial coming of Christ, divine healing, and the

Baptism of the Holy Ghost with the accompanying sign of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance. Would that leaders of religious thought everywhere could learn this lesson!

We are told by an editorial in "Our Hope" that the Pentecostal people "fall down in fits, have trances,

shake all over, and often remain in that state for hours." In our nearly twenty years' experience with the Pentecostal people we have yet to see one in a fit, and we have made inquiries of many others who have had long experience and not one of them has ever seen any one of them having a fit in a Pentecostal meeting. True, we have known of several having trances, but these are perfectly scriptural for both Peter and Paul testified to having them. Acts 11:5; 22: 17. We have known of shaking, and this also is quite scriptural for Moses declared when in the presence of God, "I exceedingly fear and quake." Heb. 12:21. And Jeremiah stated, "All my bones shake." Jer. 23:9.

A recent book entitled "The Leaven of the Sadducees" depicts the corruption of an atheistic Modernism that denies all the miraculous in Scripture, but surely another book needs to be written warning against the leaven of the Pharisees. Christ warned us, "Take heed of the leaven of the Pharisees and of the Sadducees" (Matt. 16:6); and the spirit of the Pharisees who criticized Christ when He healed a dumb man, and declared "He casteth out devils through the prince of devils," is still abroad in the land. And since the display of the scripturally miraculous produced the censure of the Pharisees in our Lord's day, we should not expect when the Lord does the miraculous to-day, that modern Pharisees will give their unqualified endorsement. Judging by the Scriptures

We believe it is well for every one to be guarded against error and to weigh all things in the light of the sanctuary. In the early days when

we remember how cautious we were. A friend gave us a book warning us against this new movement and we read it carefully. praise that was present and noticed how much the Lord Jesus Christ was exalted and extolled. We witnessed the instantaneous healing of a young South African brother who was suffering from a rupture, and noticed how the minister who prayed for him (Pastor A. A. Boddy) pleaded the merits of the blood of Christ and the power of the name of Christ when he anointed with oil and prayed the prayer of faith. Talking with one of the workers there we learned they were always most careful to test the spirits. He told us, 'We are young in this way and we had an experience that has taught us a great lesson. One young man in our midst had some strange messages which seemed not to be of God, and so he came and told us he felt he had a wrong spirit. He asked us to pray with him, and should we be assured that he had a wrong spirit he asked us to cast it out of him. We prayed and soon Brother Boddy put the test of 1 Cor. 12:3, asking, 'Is Jesus Lord?' Immediately the spirit within the brother answered, 'Jesus is accursed.' Of course we knew that this was a wrong spirit and it was cast out in the name of Jesus, and that young man was filled with the Spirit of God, and when we later put the scripture test to him, all proved satisfactory. From this time forth we have never failed to test the spirits here.' The writer received the Baptism at Sunderland and was quite happy when the scriptural test was put to him and it was proved that what he had received was truly of God. And for nineteen years since he has been careful to try the spirits wherever he has been. He wrote an article on this subject for the Evange! six years ago, entitled, "Try the Spirits," which was reproduced by Brother Otis in "Word and Work" and subsequently printed in tract form. This tract is still in circulation and can be obtained from the Word and Work Publishing House, 7 Auburn St., Framingham, Mass.

An Absurd In view of this we were Indictment somewhat surprised to read an editorial in "Dawn" in which the editor stated that the tests of 1 John 4:1, 3, had never been put in the Pentecostal movement. The principal reason for this sweeping statement arose from a misinterpretation of an article on the subject of "Trying the Spirits" written by Brother Donald Gee. Brother Gee has sent us a copy of the letter written to the editor of the "Dawn" in which he states that he believes that the scriptural method of applying the test of 1 John 4:1 is not by "challenging" an "isolated" spirit with the test question, but by careful observation of its confession. He points out that the Greek word for "try" is "dokimazo," which means to make trial of, to put to the proof, to examine. This word is used twentythree times in the New Testament and translated twice "allow," three times "approve," twice "discern," once "examine," once "like," ten times "prove," and four times "try." times "try."

Applying Brother Gee gives six ilthe Tests lustrations to prove that almost invariably the meaning of "dokimazo" is "test by observation or examination." In Luke 12:56 it is used of observing the signs of the weather. In Luke 14:19 where the purchaser goes to prove his oxen (by observing how they work). See also 1 Cor. 11:28; 2 Cor. 13:5; 2 Cor. 8:22; and 1 Tim. 3:10 where this word is also used. For many years we have observed the method suggested by Brother Gee in the article on the subject, which our readers will remember appeared in the Evangel a few months ago. We

have knelt near the one who is newly baptized when they have begun to speak in tongues and have quietly asked the Lord to show that what had been received was truly of Himself. Almost invariably when this prayer is offered the one who has just been filled with the Spirit will immediately begin to praise and magnify the Lord Jesus Christ, and we are satisfied. In nineteen years of testing the spirits in this Pentecostal movement, only once were we convinced that the seeker was possessed of a wrong spirit. We challenged this spirit according to 1 Cor. 12: 3 and 1 John 4:1, putting both tests, and it was proven by strong negative answers that a wrong spirit was manifesting itself through the seeker. But this wrong spirit was cast out and within an hour the seeker was filled with the Holy Ghost. This was proved by putting the two scriptural tests again and receiving a positive affirmative that Jesus was Lord and that He had come in the flesh. On two occasions our conviction that certain errorists had wrong spirits was confirmed by these tests. On both occasions they refused to acknowledge Jesus as Lord or to confess Him. A certain and sure test was also given by our Lord by which false prophets can be discerned, "By their fruits ye shall know them."


Another An article which recently appeared in the "Sunday School Times" entitled

"My Experience of Speaking in Tongues," we have seen copied in two other papers. The article is anonymous and as such would be ruled out of any court as worthless. Our waste paper basket is kept well supplied with attacks on us as Pentecostal people written by various anonymous heroes and heroines, but we have not lost a night's sleep over any of them as yet. The woman who wrote this anonymous article met with some things that not one of us would endorse; for instance, one attempted to get her to say one word again and again "until she spoke in tongues," a thing which we have more than once warned against as unscriptural. This woman was opposed tremendously by her husband and she yielded to his opposition. She seems to have been with a people who were constantly seeking personal messages - a most unhealthy thing which no spiritual Pentecostal leader can endorse, for the Holy Spirit is given to make us witnesses unto Christ and not to make His people degenerate into spiritualistic mediums. However, this Pentecostal revival does not rest on one person's approval or disapproval. It rests on God's Word. His Word tells us that in the last days He will pour out of His Spirit on all flesh. When His Spirit was first outpoured on the Day of Pentecost the prophecy of Isa. 28:11, 12 was fulfilled, "For with stammering lips and another tongue will I speak to this people. To whom he said, This is the rest wherewith ye may cause the weary to rest: and this is the refreshing; yet they would not hear." This same evidence of God's presence is being manifested to-day as on the Day of Pentecost. And having personally tested this movement thousands of times by the scriptural tests of 1 Cor. 12:3 and 1 John 4:1, 3, we are satisfied it is of God.

Cry For When Wesley was old he Rain was questioned concerning the great revival he had witnessed in his day, in which God had used him as a humble instrument, and he made an admission. "Yes, there has been some fanaticism, I admit it. If I had my time over again I would naturally prefer to have a revival completely void of every element of fanaticism. But if you ask me whether I would prefer a revival with fanaticism to no revival, I would say emphatically, Give me the revival even with its fanaticism." We too have seen some untutored and unteachable people who have attached themselves to this Pentecostal revival, whose conduct could not be endorsed either by God or man, and we somehow think the devil has pitchforked them into our midst in his attempt to destroy this work of God. But in spite of this, when we apply the scriptural tests we cannot but be assured that this revival is from God, and we cannot but praise Him for this Pentecostal outpouring of the twentieth century. We would say most emphatically that even though we have witnessed a few things which could not be endorsed, yet we prefer this revival in preference to the awful formalism we once had in the denominational churches we attended. There should not be the slightest wonder or vexation at such things in the church. The Master warned us that when the Son of man sowed good seed, the enemy would sow tares. He showed us that the kingdom of heaven is like unto a net that was cast into the sea, and gathered "of every kind." The good is to be "gathered" and the bad "cast away." In the early church they caught some fine fish, but Ananias and Sapphira, Simon the sorcerer, Demas and Alexander the coppersmith got into the net. But is that any reason for discontinuing fishing? Not at all. Our cry is: "Lord, give us more revivals and greater. Send us a yet greater Pentecost, a mightier manifestation of Thy power and glory, and fulfill all the purposes of Thine own great heart of love by pouring out of Thy Spirit upon all flesh according to Thy promise."-S. H. F.

"God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world." Gal. 6:14. The story of the cross has always been a blessing to millions of hearts as well as an offense to other millions. The Christian church in general needs a renewed vision of Calvary and what was accomplished there. We need to know more about Calvary. There is a lack in the hearts and lives of thousands; but a closer vision of Calvary where our Lord Jesus bore our sins, and where our old man, our old carnal nature, was crucified with Him, would be a solution to this lack.

The cross of Calvary reveals to us the holiness of God. If we want to know what God thinks of sin, take a look at Calvary as it is given in the preview in Psalm 22, where Jesus cried, "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me, why art thou so far from helping me?" The answer is given in the third verse of this Psalm, "But thou art holy." The holiness of God caused Him to turn His back on His Son when His Son was bearing upon Him the sins of this whole world, yea, when He who knew no sin became sin for us. Many think lightly of sin, but God did not so think or He never would have allowed Jesus Christ to die on Cal-The character and justice and equity of God is plainly seen at Calvary and it is there we see His holiness.

possibilities. It does not know any discouragement. It is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Some people cannot understand it when we tell them to praise the Lord for their healing. "Praise the Lord for my healing? Why, that cancer is still there, how can I praise God for healing Praise Him by faith. Don't you believe God hears prayer? If you believe God hears prayer, when you comply with His Word and ask Him in faith to do that thing, you ought to praise Him for it and expect it will come to pass. If my mother promised me anything when I was a boy, I was pretty sure to get it and I could thank her for it in advance, because I just believed that since she promised it I would get it. But when we don't know whether God is going to hear prayer, then we cannot praise Him. The Lord has always been hindered by unbelief.

Jesus said, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor.' It is one of the most amazing things in the whole gospel story that our Lord Jesus Christ, both divine and human, needed any anointing at all to do His work, that He should depend upon the power of the Holy Ghost. And yet He never attempted to preach a sermon or work a miracle before He had been anointed with the mighty power of the Holy Ghost. He did not even attempt to go up against the power of darkness and resist the devil in deadly conflict until He had been endued with the power of the Holy Ghost. Some people think we are fanatical because we lay some emphasis upon the Baptism in the Holy Ghost. We cannot put to much stress upon it and we don't go deep enough in the experience. It would be great if we might take some more degrees in Pentecost. We take the first degree and get so far that we can say some sentences and words that are taught us by the Holy Spirit, and then we stop. Instead of stopping there we might take some more degrees and go on to the gifts; and then not stop with the gifts, but go on to the fruits of the Holy Spirit and have the love, joy, peace, the long-suffering, and the other fruit of the

I wish we could get a group of Christian workers that would undertake to evangelize a certain section, and would meet together one day each week especially to pray for our own edification, to go deeper with God, to get more of God in our souls, more of His Spirit, more of His humility, more of His gifts. Then when we had conferred together and read the Word of God together and prayed together until we ourselves were shaken by the power of God, just go out like firebrands and proclaim the unsearchable riches of Jesus Christ. That may be just a dream. I am getting old enough now, according to Joel, to be entitled to have a dream once in awhile. I would like to be one of a company that could throw myself into the work for six days

and then meet together and pray and pray and pray till the old power of Pentecost would be repeated.

A brother who has been in Pentecost long before myself said there was a big difference between the way services were conducted then and the way they are now conducted. In the early days when they got together for a conference they did not have any printed program. They did not know who was going to preach or pray. But they just came together and prayed, and the Holy Spirit directed who was to render some service. One Sunday afternoon a large audience had come together. They looked at one another and no one had the message. They said, "Let us pray." And while they prayed a young man who did have the message but did not have courage to deliver it and so had crawled under the platform, crawled out, and he gave the message in the power of the Holy Ghost. Do you think that fanatical?

If Jesus needed to be anointed with the Holy Ghost for service, then certainly we need the anointing. And no amount of learning or scholarship or training or experience can ever take the place of the mighty power of the Holy Ghost. The Lord is not using learning very much, nor eloquence, nor human sagacity; He is using consecration, and the power of the Holy Ghost. Even the most unlearned and most ungodly can tell the difference between a preacher who is speaking under the anointing of the Holy Ghost and one who only has a story to tell from his lips out. I think that one of the secrets of the marvelous success of Dwight L. Moody was that the message seemed to come right from his heart and it went right down into our hearts. When I was in the seminary the students were studying the secret of Moody's power. Some thought it was the illustrations he used, some thought it was his ability as a salesman, but the real secret was not in Moody himself but in the Holy Ghost who used him. God spoke through that man.

Jesus went out and preached the gospel to the poor. The poor are not so hard to find, and they are more easily persuaded to come. The Lord knows no difference between Henry Ford and the poorest man that works in the factory. God can make the poorest man in Springfield richer than the richest man will ever be unless he lets the Lord save him.

"Heal the broken hearted." Do you know any broken hearted people in the world? Don't you think there is need of that kind of a ministry now? If you have a warm, sympathetic heart and enough sweetness and humility in your nature so that people in trouble won't be afraid of you, you will find out there are some aching, breaking hearts in the world. When I was just a young fellow in the ministry I got inspired with the thought that I ought to call on the poor people, and so I got on my long-tailed coat and white vest and high silk hat. And off I went. Well, they were glad enough when I was gone. That is not what they want. They want somebody with a loving heart, somebody with the Spirit of Jesus, somebody that can be sympathetic with them, somebody that knows the way out—not somebody fishing with a pole and a long line, airaid they will come near him.

"Recovering of sight to the blind." Do you believe Jesus can give sight to-day to people stone blind? I believe it. I believe He can give spiritual sight, and that He is just as good at giving natural sight as He ever was. Last night I was preaching at Pittsburg, Kans., and was asked to pray for a lady who had dim eyesight, and she immediately received I have seen a good many good sight. with totally blind eyes receive their sight. In our meeting in Woodrow, Okla., a year ago the Lord instantly opened the eye of one whose right eye had never seen, and he was twenty-five years of Also a sister who had an eye totally blind for forty-seven years and the Lord instantly opened it. An American Indian whose right eye was put out by a spark from an engine forty-two years ago, was prayed for and the Lord gave him sight in that eye. He testified to having received his sight in that eve, and at the boarding house where he stayed they said, "You have said something now you will have a chance to prove." slipped up behind him, covered his good eye, placed a book before his once sightless eye, and told him to read it. And thank God he could do it.

Last night a brother said to me, "This is the arm that was stiff; now look at it," and he waved it around to show me how supple it was. I said, "What happened to it?" "Oh," he said, "the Lord answered prayer."


Just recently, when coming from California with my family, we stopped and held an eight days' meeting at Phoenix, and there we found a man with a wonderful testimony. As I remember it he said:

"June 10th, 1915, I was thrown from a building when the scaffold gave way and was terribly injured by the fall and was crushed under two tons and a half of structural steel and planks. My right shoulder blade was broken and the muscles of my right arm were crushed and rendered useless till the Lord healed me. My left ankle was crushed and the ligaments in my left leg so lacerated and my spine so injured that I was unable to use my left leg at all for years. It was so drawn that I could not get my foot down to the floor, when standing on my right leg, nearer than seven inches and a half from the toe to the floor. For four years I was under the constant care of physicians, but they left me a hopeless cripple. I used all kinds of medicines and liniments, but without avail. The doctors told me I would never be able to walk again on my left foot. I therefore secured a wooden leg on which my left knee rested, the foot sticking out behind me. My foot lost all sense of feeling and looked more like an animal's foot than a human foot. I walked eight years on this wooden leg, and my right arm was drawn close to my side.

"About two years ago I began to hear of a tent meeting in Phoenix, where the sick were healed. I went to the services and was first soundly converted, and then asked prayer for my healing. My foot began to come down, and I kept going to the altar till it became a joke in Phoenix. The people would not believe that God could heal a cripple like me, and thought I was weak minded for expecting it. Many tried to discourage me, but I was determined to press on for my healing. A little later while I was at work and praying, the power of the Lord went through me, and my foot came down to the floor as the other, and my arm was loosed and my back was healed, and I was made perfectly whole." He demonstrated that he had been made as supple in every limb as a young man. Witnesses who had known this man for years, and were present when he was healed verified this testimony. That is what my Lord can do! This brother's name is James Hanson, and Pastor Berryhill told me his testimony was true in every respect.

"Preach the acceptable year of the Lord." What year was that? I think the acceptable year of the Lord, the year of His good pleasure, is the year that began with the preaching of the gospel by our Lord Jesus Christ and reaches up till this hour and we don't know how much longer. In his marvelous story of the conversion of the New Hebrides from this terrible cannibalism, John G. Paton relates many remarkable answers to prayer. Indeed, the whole work, was a divine answer, first, last, and all the way through.

He tells of the raising to health of one of the chiefs who was very near the gates of death; one who afterward became a most reliable helper in the salvation of his people.

Ruwawa was ill of a disease that seemed altogether incurable. He could not get his breath; so he directed his men to carry him out to a rise of ground that was fallow where he could get plenty of room and air. They drove sticks slanting into the soil and made cushions of banana leaves, so that he could lean back while he gasped for breath.

Mr. Paton says:

"After the church services, I visited him, and found half the people of that side of the island sitting around him in silence. Though suffering sorely, his eye and face had the look of ecstasy.

"'Missy,' he said, 'I could not breathe in the village, so I got them to carry me here where there is room for all. They are silent, and they weep because they think I am dying. If it were God's will, I would like to live, and to help you in His work. I am in the hands of our dear Lord. If He takes me, it is good; if He spares me, it is good. Pray, and tell our Saviour all about it.'

"I prayed, and the place became a very Bochim. When I left him he exclaimed, 'Farewell, Missi; if I go first I will welcome you to Glory; if I am spared, I will work with you for Jesus; so all is

"One of the young Christians followed me, and said: 'Missi, our hearts are very sore. If Ruwawa dies, we have no chief to take his place in the church; and it will be a heavy blow against Jehovah's worship on Aniwa.'

"I answered, 'Let us tell our Lord and Father all that we feel, and all that we fear; and leave Ruwawa and our work in His holy hands.'

"We did so with earnest and unceasing cry; and when all hope had died out of every heart, the Lord began to answer us. The disease relaxed its hold, and the beloved chief was restored to health. As soon as he was able, he made his way to the church, and we all offered special thanksgiving to God. He wanted to say a few words, and though still very weak, spoke with great pathos. 'Dear friends. God has given me back to you all. I rejoice to come here, and praise the great Father who made us all, and knows how to make and keep us well. I want you all to work hard for Jesus. and to lose no opportunity of trying to do good, and to please Him. In my deep journey away, near to the grave, it was the memory of what I had done in love to Jesus, that made my heart sing. I am not afraid of pain; my dear Lord Jesus suffered far more for me, and teaches me how to bear it. I am not afraid of war, or famine, or death; my dear Lord Jesus died for me, and, in dying I shall live with Him in Glory. I fear and love my dear Lord Jesus because He loved me, and gave Himself for me.'

"Then he raised his right hand and cried in a soft, full hearted voice, 'My own, my dear Lord Jesus!' and stood for a moment looking joyfully upward, as if gazing into the Saviour's face. When he sat down there was a long hush, broken here and there by a smothered sob and Ruwawa's words produced an impression that is remembered to this day."

STAYING AT HIS POST

One of the most silent men I have ever met is John Semenina, who studied in the Russian Bible Institute at Philadelphia, and then with his family returned to his own people, working in the district of Galicia, Poland. The work prospered and a number of souls were saved. Then the Roman and Greek orthodox churches became alarmed at the inroads that were being made upon their flocks, and the priests approached the police and asked them to help close the meeting hall of the Christian believers.

In the town where Brother Semenina was working, the meeting hall was closed and no meetings were allowed. Private prayer meetings were held in some of the believers' homes, but Brother Semenina was not permitted to take any part in these services. One morning upon awakening he found a great pile of stones against his door. Another morning he found stones and large rocks had been strewn over his garden. One night while he slept a large rock was thrown through the bedroom window, and a moment later he and his wife heard a crash in the next room as a rock was flung through the window of the room where his children were sleeping. God wonderfully protected them so that none were injured. Stones were thrown at Brother Semenina and other believers and their lives were threatened.

After several months things became more quiet and they were allowed to resume their meetings, and Brother Semenina was once again a respected citizen in that community. During the persecution all of the inquirers dropped off and showed no further interest in the Gospel. Some of the believers went back to the Roman Catholic church, but when the persecution ceased and they saw that God had wonderfully answered prayer, they returned to the group of believers and expressed sorrow for their conduct The Roman Catholic priests threatened them, but they replied that they had joined the Roman Catholic church because of the pressure that had been brought to bear upon them, and that they were now convinced that the religion of the Christian believers was the true religion, and that they would have nothing more to do with the Roman Catholic church.

Because Brother Semenina remained at his post even during a time of much persecution, God enabled him to win a wonderful victory.—Paul B. Peterson.

New York, June 25 .- (A-P)-"A visitation from God" caused his son Warren 19, to lay prone upon the floor of Calvary Baptist church, utter unintelligible sounds and sing beautifully in an unknown language, according to the Rev John Roach

Straton.

The pastor, who is charged with introducing "Pentecostalism" or emotionalism, into the church by five deacons who resigned Tuesday night, told of his son's "experience" in reiterating his denial of the charge.

A "marked change" in both the youth's spiritual attitude and physical well-being was noted by his parents after the "visitation," Dr. Straton said. The young man since has devoted himself more assiduously to the Bible and no longer stutters when he prays in public or at family prayer, the father added. The son was ordained last year as a Baptist minister by the father.

"It was at a Monday night meeting of the young people's class during the study period, when this experience came to Warren," Dr. Straton said.

Dr. Straton said his son was kneeling at prayer with the others when "he was overcome and fell to the floor.

"His mother and I heard him singing in a most beautiful way while this power was upon him.

"There was rythm to his singing and it was very beautiful, although he was singing in an unknown language. His face was illuminated with joy. His mother and I are one on this, that his face was overspread with a light of beauty and joy and happiness. The change that has come over him is overwhelmingly marked.' -Springfield Leader.

A WARM TIME

Pastor J. P. Thorkildson writes from Imperial, Calif.: "We are the only Council workers in the Valley, and we are pioneering. At first we had a hall in Calexico, a border town partly destroyed by an earthquake Jan. 1. We are now in Imperial where the city has given us the use of a building for our meetings. In answer to prayer we have been enabled to put in light, water, seats, etc. We work out from here in El Centro, Brawley, and other places. God has given us many souls in our meetings, even on the streets, and gives us the joy of seeing all the 110 and 115 prisoners in the Sunday jail meetings on their knees. Many have also been saved in the county hospital there. Almost all the churches are closed in the Valley for about 3 months in the hot season, but if God enables us to bear the heat, we expect to keep going. It is about 115 to 130 degrees in the shade every day."

We have received the following news concerning the work at Bara Banki, India, and pass it on to our readers that you may unite with us in prayer for the needs over there at this time. Sister Almyra Aston writes: "We do appreciate your prayers, and I hope that the Lord has laid it upon your hearts to pray for us during this month of April. We have such a trying time with so many sick, but through it all we can look up and say, 'I know that my Redeemer liveth.'

"We have had 28 cases of fever during this one month, besides three cases of whooping cough, and received one little new-born baby, afflicted with the itch, in-to the home. Five other nice, healthy babies have been received. We thank the Lord for each one of them. fourteen Christians working here with us. Some are Bible women, some preachers, some help with the babies, and one is a Christian boy that I have brought up and trained as a carpenter. I never had appreciated him so much as I have during all this sickness. He alone of all the Christian men on the place was able to take care of the others, and only one woman was left to help in the nursery. Only the Lord knows what this month has meant to us. Pray much that we may get out of this house as quickly as possible."

BIBLE SCHOOL IN TACHIKAWA Harriet Dithridge

Of all the work in Tachikawa this seems the most important, because it is mission work. It is a school for women; and how much we need women workers in Japan. We have a class of 6 women, besides those in the rest home who also come into the classes. More students are coming in with the new term.

But, dear ones, a Bible school cannot be run without money. These dear girls have left their homes and many of them have cut themselves off from their own people by the stand they have taken to become evangelists. They have no money or means of support. We teach them to look to the Lord and they are praying for their daily bread. Will you not help to answer their prayers and thus encourage Ten dollars a month will their faith? support one student; \$23.00 a month will pay the rent of their dormitory, and \$25.00 a month will pay the matron's salary.

Dear friends at home, have you ever been really hungry and had no place to turn for a bite of bread? Let me whisper in your ears, we are often very hungry here. I made a rule long ago that I would never go into debt even for food. But when I see these dear girls' faces going white and know that they haven't had any rice for a couple of days, I buy rice on credit. I wouldn't do it for myself, but who has failed God, that such conditions as this should have prevailed here in your Mission Bible School for the past three months?

Praise God, we don't need to look to folks; the way up is always open, and though our heavenly Father tests us, He never fails us. Miraculously He has fed us the last three months, altogether now a household of 22 people. And when it seemed as though natural food was not sufficient, He has given us supernatural strength. Praise His name forever. And when most in want of material things, we have had the greatest spiritual bless-

Workers

Besides one missionary we have 5 Japanese workers (4 women and 1 man). Please pray definitely for these workers. The 4 women workers have all given up good salaried positions and successful careers to give their whole time and strength to this service, and here they get practically no salary, very meager support, and are often even hungry.

I have just returned from Rejaf, Sudan, where I went to get the car. It now stands in a nice brick garage, both car and garage being witness to the fact that God answers prayer.


