

A Suicide's Story

HROUGH bitter experience I learned what salvation by the blood of Jesus means. God brought home to me in a very forceful way the price my Saviour had to pay for the salvation of my soul when He shed His blood on Calvary's cross.

Brought up in the Unitarian church, I did not believe in a personal God; I thought that Jesus was just a great moral teacher; I thought I was not a sinner; and I laughed at every men-tion of the devil, thinking he was just a creature of somebody's imagination. Because I denied the blood of Jesus and wondered why anyone would ever talk or sing about it, God finally allowed me to be so desperate for sal-vation that I was willing to pay for it with my own blood.

I married a Methodist, but he could not make me understand the gospel. I attended church only occasionally because we were near no "liberal" church. My husband attended the Methodist church alone for a while, but finally because my health became so poor, he too stayed at home on Sunday to help me. We even neglected to ask God's blessing on our meals. At last my health became so bad that I went to a well known dietitian, after medicine had failed. The diet seemed to help me for a few months, until suddenly I collapsed when my third baby was about two months old. Then I called one more medical doctor, with no help. I was then at the end of human resources. Everything seemed to turn against us financially. My baby had fainting spells. I became so nervous that I lived in fear and trembling all the time, as told in Deut. 28:66-67. At last I gave up struggling, and resigned myself to the thought that I. would die soon. Not knowing I was

unprepared to face eternity, I thought everything would be all right, but had not the slightest idea what was ahead of me. We telegraphed for my mother, as I felt I had not long to live.

Then, one night, I saw a vision of Jesus suffering on the cross, and all the next day I kept saying, "He died for me; would I be willing to do that much for Him?" The Holy Spirit had convinced me "of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment." John 16: 8. I went about saying how great a sinner I was. I knew now I was not prepared to die and meet God, and feared that I might die before I was ready. The Holy Spirit also convinced me that the Bible was true and consistent, facts that I had been taught to deny. Then I started reading my Bible day and night to find how to atone for my sins and get right with God. I could hardly sleep or eat. I wanted to get saved right away before I should die. Not knowing of the devil, nor that one of his works is to deceive those who are turning to the true God, and to pervert the Scriptures (Matt. 13:19; 2 Cor. 4:4), I was easily led astray.

A voice kept telling me that my own life had to pay for my sins, which voice I thought was the Holy Spirit. Being ignorant of the Bible, I did not know how to understand the scriptures I read, such^bas "they that are in the flesh cannot please God." I did not know it was wicked to take my own life. ("Thou shalt not kill." Ex. 20: 13.")

I told God one night to take my life, thinking that the faith to overcome fear of death might atone for my sins. I knew He could do it. The effort of really yielding my physical life to Him was such that the sweat poured out all over me. The scripture came to

me of Jesus praying in the garden, "and His sweat was as it were great drops of blood." Luke 22:44. How I could appreciate His agony there.] did not know how to pray, so repeated the Lord's prayer three times. Every time I came to the word "power," my body was shaken as if by a big hand, but I did not die. Such an experience for one who had not believed in a personal God!

I went to the altar for prayer at a well known evangelist's meeting, hoping to get closer to God, but somehow was still blinded to the sufficiency of Jesus' blood as the atonement for my sins. Satan told me, "That is too easy a way; you have to take your life vourself." I tried to argue out of it, but thought of Abraham and the sacrifice God required of him to show his faith in God. I thought God would stop me too as He did him. I went to the altar for prayer at another meeting, hoping to be freed from what I thought God required of me.

One day I saw the scripture, "Without shedding of blood is no remis-sion." Heb. 9:22. I thought that meant my own blood. I said to God, "I'll do it if You show me the way. Immediately I thought of the army pistol. I did not know where it was, but something led me to the trunk in the garage, and I put my hand right on it. I said again, "I'll do it if You will show me the bullets." The next morning something led me to a little box in the chiffonier, and there they were. I thought if I did not obey right away I might have to do something worse to get right with God later. I kept seeing such cases in the newspapers, and in my belief that we were all children of God, I thought He had made them do those things too.

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Does Science Affect Personal Worship?

There are those who tell us that worship is a lost art in these materialistic days, and that the more scientific a man becomes-in other words the more knowledge he acquires-the less will be his instinct of worship and the greater his sense of independence, self-sufficiency, and neglect of God. This, I believe, is a misleading statement, because it is based upon a wrong conception of what science (or certain knowledge) is; and I submit that true science invariably conduces to a spirit of reverence, dependence, and recognition of God in the works of His hands.

First a few words as to what worship is. Derived from the Anglo-Saxon worthship or worthiness, it denotes the courtesy or reverence paid to merit or worth, and seems to have been originally applied to man as well as God. As an example of this use of the word we may quote the King James Version (A. D. 1611) of Luke 14:10, "Thou shalt have worship in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee." It is plain that the word here means simply honor, glory, or recognition, and does not imply any act of adoration. In Rev. 19:10; 22:8 however, when John fell down with reverence to worship an angel, he was reproved with the command: "See thou do it not: worship God."

The very word itself seems to carry the key to its application: for worthship or worthiness must mean the rendering to each one his due-that which he is worth or worthy of-and hence it leads our thoughts up to the highest reverence and those acts of adoration which we could not render to any created being, for we feel instinctively that no one but the Creator is worthy of them. "Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power: for Thou hast created all things, and for Thy pleasure they are, and were created." Rev. 4:11. Thus we read in Psalm 29:2, "Give unto the Lord the glory due unto His Name; worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

Not only as Creator, but even more as *Redeemer* does our Triune God merit the worship of His children. "Thou art worthy to take the book and to open the seals thereof: for Thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by Thy blood out of every kindred and tongue and people and nation: and hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth. Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing. And every creature which is in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, heard I saying: Blessing and honor and glory and power be unto Him that sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb for ever and ever. And the four living creatures said, Amen. And the elders fell down and worshipped." Rev. 5:9-14.

Mountain climbers in India tell us that viewed from one side Mount Everest, the highest mountain of the great Himalayan range, takes the form of an old man with hands uplifted and clasped in prayer. It is a beau-tiful thought that earth's highest peak thus represents the spirit of worshipher sense of dependence, her reverence, and her adoration of her Creator. It is a fact which has often been commented on that dwellers in mountainous regions where they are in constant contact with the majestic works of God are in general more reverent and worshipful in their attitude towards Him, than the more materialistic inhabitants of plains and cities. But this does not mean that the city dwellers are in reality the more scientific. They may think they are, and may boast of their superior civilization; but the true knowledge always lies with the less boastful and the more reverent souls.

"Fools rush in where angels fear to tread"; and never is man's foolishness more apparent than when he tries to become independent of the God who made him. "The God in whose hand thy breath is, and whose are all thy ways, hast thou not glorified" might be said with truth to many a modern Belshazzar. They are the fools, the small men, the ignoramuses, who "did not like to retain God in their knowledge" and whose boasted science the apostle speaks of as "science falsely so called." 1 Tim. 6:20. The truth is that man is a being who was made to worship -a "religious animal" as some philosophers have called him-and in all tribes and nations, even among the most degraded savages, we find this instinct of worship. It is an instinct which cannot be eradicated from the human race. The modern atheists who think they have stifled it have only changed the object of their worship.

They have dethroned God, and in His place they are enthroning money, fame, intellect, and other gods of their own making. To them may well be applied the word of Jesus in John 4:22, "Ye worship ye know not what." Their science is not the right brand, because it has taken away their bread and given them husks.

This brings us to the consideration of what true science is. The word is defined as "Knowledge gained and verified by exact observation and correct thinking." Also, "The sum of universal knowledge." We cannot apply the word science to the knowledge of one single fact or of many unrelated ones, but it is always used of knowledge reduced to law and embodied in system. Webster defines it as "Accumulated and accepted knowledge which has been systematized and formulated with reference to the discovery of general truths or the operation of general laws; knowledge classified and made available in work, life, or the search for truth; comprehensive, profound, or philosophical knowledge.

"By science we mean a systematic arrangement of the laws which God has established, so far as they have been discovered, of any department of human knowledge."—Wayland and Chapin. "Modern science may be regarded as one vast miracle, whether we view it in relation to the Almighty Being by whom its objects and its laws were formed, or to the feeble intellect of man, by which its depths have been sounded and its mysteries explored.—Brewster.

The sciences have been divided into (1) the mathematical, (2) the physical, (3) the biological, (4) the anthropological, and (5) the theological. These last two, embracing what man knows about himself and about God, are specially conducive to worship; although in all the other branches of science the reverent student is often constrained to stop and exclaim: "O Lord, how manifold are thy works! in wisdom hast thou made them all; the earth is full of thy riches." Psa. 104:24.

Science proper embraces (a) exact knowledge of *facts;* (b) exact knowledge of *laws;* and (c) exact knowledge of *proximate causes.* We may illustrate this by the science of astronomy. "In the progress of human knowledge a science in its earliest and simplest form is usually a mere collection of observed *facts,* like the knowledge of the movements of the heavenly bodies possessed by the ancient Egyptians. The next step is to correlate or generalize these facts, forming a *system,* like that of Ptolemy or Copernicus; the next step is to formulate these generalizations into laws, as was done by Kepler; the final step is to proceed to some principle or force accounting for these laws, usually by the aid of mathematical analysis, as was done by Newton in his theory of universal gravitation."

Is it conceivable that the study of the works of God's hands, and this close application of man's reasoning powers to finding out more about the laws which govern them, should result in driving him farther away from the Maker and Controller of those laws? Surely not! Such a result is unthinkable. The shallow contenders for "science falsely so called," as we have seen above, though they make more noise than the true scientists, are not the real exponents of what mankind has learned by honest investigation of the laws which control the universe. Sir William Ramsay, one of England's greatest scholars, recently described a Modernist as "One who knows all that I do not know, who fixes the limits of the possible, and knows exactly what is impossible. The world is not dark to him: he is born and cradled and grown to manhood in the intensity of a great light. He knows all things, and is content and happy in his utter ignorance." So we may well disregard their foolish boastings and their 'assured results" which often turn out to be mere hypotheses or guesses, and turn to the testimony of men who have thought and studied deeply and in whose writings we may place our confidence.

The Nineteenth Century Magazine of August, 1886, published an account of a debate the previous year between Gladstone and Huxley as to whether or not the creation story of the Bible was in accord with the findings of modern science. The arguments of both men were handed over to Dana, the great American geologist whom all the scientific world regarded as the highest authority then living; and his decision was worded thus: "I agree in all essential points with Mr. Gladstone, and I believe that the first chapter of Genesis and science are in accord." At another time the same great geologist wrote: "When one reads the creation story in Genesis, the first thought that strikes the scientific reader is the evidence of divinity, not merely in the first verse of the record and the successive fiats, but in the whole order of creation. There is so much that the most recent readings of science have for the first time explained, that the idea of man as the author becomes utterly incomprehensible. By proving the record true, science pronounces it divine: for who could have correctly

narrated the secrets of eternity but God Himself?"

Another great geologist (Hugh Miller) writes: "It is only as the fullness of time comes, in the brighter light of increasing scientific knowledge, that the grand old oracles of the Bible, so apparently simple but so marvelously pregnant with meaning stand forth at once cleared of all erroneous human glosses and vindicated as the inspired testimonies of Jehovah."

Let us hear the testimony of Sir Wm. Dawson who is considered by many to be the greatest scholar of Canada, and who has written: "The order of creation as stated in Genesis is faultless in the light of modern science, and many of the details present the most remarkable agreement with the results of sciences born only in our own day."

Professor Arnold H. Guyot is another great scientist who has expressed his findings thus: "To a sincere and unsophisticated mind it must be evident that the grand outlines sketched by Moses are the same as those which modern science enables us to trace, however imperfect and unsettled the details furnished by scientific inquirers may appear on many points. The same divine hand which lifted up before the eyes of Daniel and of Isaiah the veil which covered the tableau of the time to come, unveiled before the eves of the author of Genesis the earliest ages of the creation; and Moses was the prophet of the past, as Daniel and Isaiah and many others were the prophets of the future."

In 1865 the six hundred and seventeen members of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, including the very greatest scientists of the British Empire, drew up a document setting forth their views on the relation between science and the Bible. This remarkable document with its 617 signatures may be seen by anyone in the Bodleian Library in Oxford, England. These are the first three paragraphs:

"We the undersigned students of the natural sciences, desire to express our sincere regret that researches into scientific truth are perverted by some in our times into occasions for casting doubt upon the truth and authenticity of the Holy Scriptures.

"We conceive that it is impossible for the Word of God as written in the Book of Nature, and God's Word as written in the Holy Scripture, to contradict one another, however much they may appear to differ.

"We are not forgetful that physical science is not complete, but is only in a condition of progress, and that at present our finite reason enables us

only to see as through a glass darkly; and we confidently believe that a time will come when the two records will be seen to agree in every particular."

These scientists and many others who might be quoted—such as G. F. Wright, Sir Henry Howarth, Wincheel, Isaac Newton, Cuvier, Leibnitz, Lavoisier, Liebig, Secchi, Faraday, Agassiz, Sir Wm. and Sir John Herschel—were men who "digged deep" and were not content with merely scratching the surface of scientific knowledge; and the more they knew the more they worshiped. The Modernists who sneer at "the unscientific trash of Genesis" are the small men who have studied only enough to inflate their own heads and fill themselves with an overweening sense of their own importance. Well did the poet write:

"A little knowledge is a dangerous thing:

Drink deep, or taste not the Pierian spring;

There shallow draughts intoxicate the brain,

And drinking largely sobers us again."

If our young people in high school and college today only know in what good company they are when they believe the Bible from cover to cover, they would pay less heed to the Modernistic teachings which surround them. May God grant that they may have courage to think for themselves, to read the books of our best scientists, and to acquire knowledge with such a humble, reverent spirit that it may lead them to an ever-increasing sense of dependence upon our Triune God and to a worship of the Father in the Spirit and in the Truth, even in His Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

At the Feet of Jesus

Baron von Webz, who renounced his title and estates and went as a missionary to Dutch Guiana, where he filled a lonely grave, said as he gave up his title: "What to me is the title 'well-born' when I am born again in Christ? What to me is the title 'lord' when I desire to be a servant of Christ? What is it to me to be called 'Your Grace' when I have need of God's grace, help, and succor? All these vanities I will away with, and all else I will lay at the feet of Jesus, my dearest Lord, that I may have no hindrance in serving Him aright."

"As the stars are beyond the reach of the watering pot of man and cannot be quenched by the ocean spray, so is God's Word established in Heaven, far beyond the reach of all disturbing causes."

Rifts in Zionism

A converted Jew said to the writer, "I have not much faith in Zionism, its program is largely political; what Jewry needs is a spiritual revival." Today there is a lamentable lack of accord in the ranks of Zionism. The party who call themselves "Revision-' bitterly criticize the action of ists' Dr. Weizmann, the retiring president of the World Zionist Organization, and claim he has led them a false way. They are not satisfied with Palestine merely becoming a home for Jews who want to return, but demand the establishment of a Jewish state. They believe that Palestine should become as much a possession of the Jews as the United States is the land of the Americans. When the people returned from the Babylonian captivity in the days of Zerubbabel and Joshua, it is quite clear from the prophecies of Haggai and Zechariah that God was much more concerned with their spiritual condition than with their political prospects. His message, twice repeated through the prophet Haggai, was, "Thus saith the Lord of hosts, Con-sider your ways."

Restored to God

A careful examination of the prophetic writings of Haggai and Zechariah prove clearly that they go bevond the restoration of their day to the latter-day regathering of Israel. The Lord said through Zechariah, "Behold, I will save My people from the east country, and from the west country; and I will bring them, and they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem; and they shall be My people, and I will be their God, in truth and in righteousness." Zech. 8:7, 8. In the days of Zechariah they were simply being delivered from the captivity in the eastern lands of Persia and Babylon, and not from the west at all. This indicates that the prophet is here speaking of that greater regathering of Israel in the latter days, of which

Isaiah foretold, "And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall set His hand again the second time to recover the remnant of His people, which shall be left . . . and He shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth." Isa. 14:11, 12. This will be more than a restoration to the landit will be a restoration to God. As David Baron puts it, "The restoration of Israel to their own land after the many centuries of dispersion and wanderings, will be a great mercy and a wonderful event in the world's history; but a still greater mercy and a still more wonderful thing will be the restoration of the long-interrupted covenant relationship and communion between them and their God.'

Through the prophet Hosea God says to Israel, "I will betroth thee unto Me forever; yea, I will betroth thee unto Me in righteousness, and in judgment, and lovingkindness, and in mercy. will even betroth thee unto Me in faithfulness; and thou shalt know the Lord." Hos. 2:19, 20.

Universal Unemployment Foretold

In the 7th chapter of his prophecy, Zechariah calls the people to repentance, and in the 8th chapter tells of the Lord's coming to make Jerusalem a city of truth. He states, "And before these days there was no hire for man, nor any hire for beast." Verse 10. The millions unemployed in these days, for whom there is no hire, are surely a notable sign of the times. Men have looked in vain to political leaders for help in the present universal depression and general unemployment, but these leaders have no solution. Thank God, He has. It is good to turn from the newspapers with their daily stories of world-wide unrest to the "good words and com-fortable words" (Zech. 1:13) of the prophecies. With the coming of the King will come prosperity. He says, "For the seed shall prosper; the vine shall give her fruit, and the ground shall give her increase, and the heavens shall give their dew, and I will cause the remnant of their people to possess all these things. And it shall come to pass that as ye were a curse among the heathen, O house of Judah and house of Israel; so will I save you, and ye shall be a blessing." Zech. 8:12, 13. And Romans 11:15 shows that the whole world will share in Israel's blessing.

When Israel Is Changed

People seem to be reluctant to pray these days. A petition has been drawn up by the Business Men's Council of the Pocket Testament League asking the President to appoint a day of prayer to ask for divine favor on the nation at this time. We do not know whether the President will grant this request, or how much of a response there would be if such a day of prayer were appointed. But a day is coming when men will be eager to pray. Zechariah tells us, "And the inhabitants of one city shall go to another, saving, Let us go speedily to pray before the Lord, let us seek the Lord of hosts; I will go also. Yea, many people and strong nations shall come to seek the Lord of hosts in Jerusalem, and to pray before the Lord." Zech. 8:21, 22. People have despised the Jew in the past, but in his coming day he will be highly esteemed and sought for. "Thus saith the Lord of hosts, In those days it shall come to pass that ten men shall take hold out of all languages of the nations, even shall take hold of the skirt of him that is a Jew, saying, We will go with you: for we have heard that God is with you." Zech. 8:23. But first there must come on the part of the house of Judah and the house of Israel a getting right with God. But He who revealed Himself to Saul of Tarsus on the road to Damascus and changed him from a bigoted zealot of Judaism to a humble follower of Him who was crucified at Calvary, will in like manner reveal Himself to His own and turn away ungodliness from Jacob.

Our Business of Evangelization

We believe the Lord is coming back very soon, but we know not the day "occupy" until He comes. "Preach the gospel to every creature" is His marching order to His saints. In writing to the Romans Paul expressed his desire to preach the gospel in Spain. Rom. 15:24, 28. Although we do not read in the Scriptures of Paul's getting to this land we gather from the writings of Clement of Rome that God gave the apostle the desire of his heart in allowing him to preach in the extreme western part of Europe. Spain today presents a unique oppor-tunity for the gospel. The principal hindrances to the spread of the truth have been removed since King Alfonso has been deposed and the land has become a republic. The people have awakened to the fact that the worst enemy to their country has been the Catholic priesthood. In Current History we read that on May 11 rioting took place in Madrid with a general "looting and burning of churches, monasteries, and other ecclesiastical buildings, especially those belonging to the Jesuits, including their national headquarters." At Malaga no less than thirty ecclesiastical buildings were despoiled between midnight on Monday, May 11, and Tuesday evening. "The radicals in Spain demand the expulsion of the religious orders, especially the Jesuits, the confiscation of their property, and division of the land. On May 30 the Municipal Council of Barcelona, after a stormy debate, overwhelmingly voted for their expulsion," states July Current History. Rome is beginning to reap what she has sown in Spain.

* Persecutions of Saints

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We read in the Churchman's Magazine concerning the situation in Spain, "No other nation has so persecuted the saints of God with an organization so devilish and so complete. The groans of the poor victims from the dens of the Inquisition resound in many hearts, yet the persecutions are not merely of ancient date; many have been under the regime of the expelled king. Pablo Fernandez Garcia, a young naval conscript, in 1912 refused to bow before the uplifted Host. He was commanded to kneel, but refused, and was arrested and cast into prison. In 1913, Colonel Labrador of the Spanish Marine Artillery refused to go to mass as contravening his Protestant convictions. He was courtmartialed and sentenced to a lengthy term of imprisonment. Again in 1928, Dona Carman Padin was condemned to two years of imprisonment for having declared to a few neighbors that the blessed virgin Mary had other children subsequent to the birth of our Saviour, a belief fully confirmed by the Roman Catholic Bible itself. These are but samples. How many colporteurs carrying the Word of God, and how many evangelists proclaiming it in the fastnesses of Spanish Romanism, have been the victims in recent days of terrifying persecution. Thank God that now the new Spanish government has given to everyone the right "to worship in peace under whatever faith he wishes.

* Spanish Protestants Jubilant

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The Sunday School Times gives part of a sermon preached by Pastor Cabrera, a Protestant minister in Spain. He said, "You recall all the abuses committed upon the Spanish evangel-icals in the villages. How many persons, weary of superstition and church tyranny, have shown their sympathy for our religious ideas, yet in spite of their love for the gospel of Christ, they have been unable to take the decisive step because of the 'what would they say?' of parents and relatives. And those who have had the courage to lift high the flag of the gospel, how much bitterness have they had to undergo, and how many tears to shed! What could we hope from a monarchy in submission to the Jesuits, the real rulers of Spain? What would we expect from the monarch who offered his sword to the pope for the exter-mination of heresy? It is the monarch who made us republicans. Those who have established the republic can count on our constant prayers. We must work to make a greater Spain from the spiritual point of view. Our war cry must be, 'Spain for Christ.'"

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A New Day for Spain

John Kensit, a militant Protestant, has just visited Spain and writes in the London Christian Herald concerning his visit. He inspected the ruins of burned out churches and convents. On a large school that was run by nuns a notice was put up after the destruction, "Burned because thieves." He states that the crowd that was burning down convents and other religious buildings in Madrid stopped before the Fleidner mission, but recognizing it was a Portestant building, raised the shout, "Up with the Prot-estants; down with the priests!" He tells of many happy gospel services

he attended. In one place they sang gospel hymns and choruses in the street. He says, "Under the dictatorship Protestants had been persecuted for singing hymns in their houses." He states, "Our conviction is there is no more fruitful field for the gospel in Europe than in Spain today."

A Great Opportunity

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Mr. Kensit further writes, "We found all the evangelicals in Madrid alive with new hope for the future. That liberty had come seemed almost too good to be true, but it was an actuality already realized. 'Only last Sunday I addressed a gathering of over a thousand persons in the plaza at Castrogenzalo' said the Bible So-ciety representative, 'and I am proceeding to a section where a number of open air meetings as well as other preaching engagements are planned. There has never before been such a day in Spain." Let us pray that the Lord of the harvest will thrust forth many laborers into this widely open door. And let us unite in prayer that the Lord will open the way for a band of our Pentecostal Spanish-speaking ministers to go and give this dark land the full gospel message.

The Importance of Divine Revelation

"We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place until the day dawn and the day star arise in your hearts." 2 Peter 1:19.

The need of an aggressive, offensive warfare in the Christian Church is quite apparent. The army that takes the offensive has the decided advantage. The best means of defense is a strong and vigorous offensive. We have been too long using defensive measures in trying to defend our positions. The Christian Church needs to take the field in a definite offensive.

The days are upon us and the call is to every man to stand by the guns. Throughout the world the battle is raging between the forces of right and wrong; the armies of Christ against the hoards of Satan. The lines are being clearly drawn through every walk of life and decisions are being made that are fixing destinies for eternity. Amidst the noise and fury of battle, through the poisonous fumes of hell's gas attacks and the blinding smoke screens thrown out to deceive, if possible, the very elect, comes the call of the Holy Ghost to every Christloving saint to stand loyally by the revelation of Holy Writ, and in the boldness and power of a risen Christ press the battle out into the open and on to certain victory. This is no time for bickering and fussing with one another over matters of minor importance. We must stand together on the main fundamentals of God's revelation. Every child of God should be diligent to provide himself with a knowledge of God's Word and to become skilled in its use and to learn how to wholly depend upon its unfailing truths and then in the fullness of a genuine Pentecostal Baptism of the Holy Ghost press on and out into the enemy's camp and take prisoners and bond slaves for Christ.

With all the developments in modern infidelity and the skill with which the enemies of Christ are equiping themselves against the truth of God's Word, it is high time for believers everywhere to bestir themselves to a definite purpose and arm themselves with a fighting knowledge of the sword of the Spirit against the great conflict of the days that are just ahead. We must not be caught unprepared. God is counting on us and we will be held accountable in that day for the

privileges we are now enjoying and for the manner in which we are treating our responsibilities as witnesses to a lost world.

Concerning the Word of God there are two important things connected with its form:

1st. Inclusive. We need no more than is revealed in the Bible.

2nd. Exclusive. We can do with no less than is written therein.

In these days of new things the devil is also busy with new revelations and a strong endeavor to get the saints off into bypaths in spectacular visions, messages and prophetic ventures without the least regard as to their harmony with the Word of God as written, just so it is something new, fascinating, thrilling, flesh-exalting. Like a rocket shot into the dark, it is illuminating, entrancing and glorious to the senses. But it is short-lived. They flare, flicker and die and the darkness becomes more intense and dreadful than before. In the mad rush for power and leadership many are being led away by the subtle tactics of the "angel of light" into an abyss of disappointment and gloom.

God's divine revelation brings to us only those things that are absolutely necessary and that we could not get in any other way. Nature tells us of God's omnipotence and omniscience, but only the Word of God tells of His love for a ruined world and of the supreme sacrifice He offered to save us from eternal doom.

"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by EVERY word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God" is a statement given by the Master Teacher and the generations that have followed since then have had ample time and experience to prove the truth of that word.

The mountain peaks in the earthly ministry of Jesus are expressive of His absolute reverence as well as loyalty to the Divine revelation. He could have enjoyed and no doubt did enjoy many hours of communion with His Father in which special and direct revelation was granted Him, but His ministry was never garnished with spectacular thrills of religious fancy. His sermons were always packed full of the Word of God. In the crisis hours of His great conflict with Satan, He relied wholly on the power of the written revelation and used it freely against every attack of His

arch enemy and drove him from the field of battle in complete confusion. The devil jumped into the battle putting Christ on the defensive but the fearless undaunted Captain of our salvation used the same word of God and taking the offensive drove the devil down to absolute defeat. To His matchless and wonderful Name be honor and power and dominion and glory and majesty forever. Five high points might be noted as follows:

1st. His presentation in the Temple at the age of twelve. That was the age when, according to Jewish custom, He was compelled to come up to this feast and as a son of the Law he would be permitted to incur legal obligations, learn a trade and take up some course of training. It was at this feast He met the doctors of the Law and it was here He made the statement that was the key stone of His whole ministry. "Wist ye not that I must be about My Father's business?" His Father's business took precedence over every other thing throughout His career.

2nd. His Baptism in water and Anointing of the Holy Spirit at Jordan. "Suffer it to be so now for thus it BECOMETH US to fulfill all righteousness." God's prophet had spoken centuries before and now the minute fulfillment of every detail must be enacted. God had given the revelation. "Holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." God directed the fulfillment. Holy men of God moved as they were directed by the Holy Ghost.

3rd. His temptation in the wilderness. After a stormy battle with the king of night for forty days and nights in which His Sonship and Saviourhood were threatened, He emerges victorious after a threefold attack in which His only weapon was "It is avritten." That was sufficient. He would use no less. He needed no more. From here He came forth to present Himself to man as the Saviour, a victor over the world, the flesh, and the devil.

4th. His introduction to His Life's Ministry. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has sent Me to heal the broken hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives"; "Go and tell John . . . that the poor have the gospel preached unto them." "I must preach the kingdom of God to other cities also: for therefore am I sent." This thought is amplified on the Emmaus road after His resurrection. "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets He expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning Himself." Here Christ taught them to believe that it was so (from

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the beginning) before he revealed to them that it is so. Christ could have satisfied the two by a special revelation and thus reached them at the outset, but the Lord desires that we have our bearings and faith as to the facts, resting securely in the divine revelation rather than have us depend upon special mental infusions by other means.

Such times of illumination and mental exhilaration are perfectly scriptural and granted to us by God as we wait on Him but it is necessary to have a firm footing of faith in God's Word first as a background and safeguard to all other methods and means of communications. "A wicked and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign, but there shall be no sign given except the sign of the prophet Jonah." "Send Lazarus to my father's house: for I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. Abraham said unto him, they have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.

Signs should follow every ministry for it is the will of God and ordained by Christ. The more faithful we are in standing by God's Book and resting our every claim on its promise, the more we will see of the real manifestation and work of the Holy Ghost in our midst. God is bound to honor His Word, not our theories about His Word. "Preach the Word" and God will stretch forth His hand to heal and signs and wonders shall be wrought in the Name of Jesus."

5th. His last utterance on the cross. "It is finished." What a wonderful life of faithfulness and devotion to the word of God. He knew it; He loved it; He preached it: He taught us to do likewise. "Go ye therefore and teach all nations."

How the Baptism Came to Me

I have always had to get along with a one-track mind; so, when at sixteen years of age I was soundly converted I entered at once on such work of the church as a boy could do, with the most unfaltering zeal. Almost at once I was put in charge of the County Sunday School Association, and drove that summer about a thousand miles, visiting Sunday schools and inducing them to enter the Association. My pastor warned me that I must not associate with unsaved people so, as there was no boy that I ever ran with who was trying to be a Christian, I went The only company I had was alone. saved girls and the older people of the church. I attended everything about the church that I could get into, not even missing the meetings the women held to arrange for fairs, suppers, and so on. A good old friend of mine, Sister Tanner once said, "Charlie is always under foot." Still I had to confess sin every night, and did so with the knowledge that I would do the same things again the next day. I was in the seventh of Romans.

While in the seventh of Romans, but serving God in a way that reminds me now of the fiery zeal of Saul of Tarsus, I was called to preach. The same week I secured exhorter's license and the ensuing Sunday I preached my first sermon.

The next year while reading Dr. Keen's Pentecostal Papers, I came upon the statement that whatever is put on the altar is sanctified, for the altar sanctifies the gift. Rushing into the house from the porch where I had been reading, fell on my knees and placed my entire self on the altar. There and then, by faith, I received what the Methodists call the gift of perfect love. A vast change took place in my life. I was no more zealous, no more conscientious, tried no harder to do right than before, but I had victory over the temptations that hitherto had always defeated me. It was a wonderful and delightful experience. It greatly changed my life.

A few months after this I read a paper that was sent to me by someone and from it learned that God is unchanged, and will heal His people today just as He did in Bible days. I read this as I walked from the post office to my home, and by the time I got home I was a full fledged believer in divine healing. My wife was sick of a lingering illness, and the doctor

held out no hope for her recovery. I was able to persuade her, though it took a few weeks, that Jesus is the Healer, and we cleared the house of everything from the drugstore, discharged the doctor, and committed her to the Lord. God wonderfully healed her. In the meantime I was preaching in my Methodist pulpit that people should not send for the doctor but send for me when they got sick, assuring them that God would heal them.

After this for twenty years I pushed ahead, preaching holiness of life and divine healing. God graciously blessed my ministry and healed a large number of people. After twenty years then, in 1914, a minister called on me saying that the unchanging God is baptizing people today in the Holy Ghost, just as He did in Bible times, and they speak in tongues just as they did then. I had always shaped my course by the Bible, without regard to what anyone might say or think and so, at vast expense of influence and prestige, I began seeking the Baptism with the Holy Ghost. In my single-track-mind way I made a real business of seeking the Baptism, but it eluded me. I thought I had to "get" it and I just could not do so. Months passed but my energetic pounding at the door of heaven asking for the Baptism did not grow a whit less earnest or persistent.

Finally I went to Memphis, Tenn., and while listening to a sermon by L. P. Adams, I realized that a difference between me and my wife must be surrendered. It was so trifling a matter that I am unable now to recall what the nature of it was, and it in no way affected the peace and quietude of our living together, but still there was that difference, and sometimes when we would be praying together I would think of it and find my mind wandering from God on account of it. As the preacher preached I realized that this must be surrendered, and when the altar call was given I rushed to the altar to tell God that it was given up. With my head in the sawdust I confessed the thing to God, and obtained forgiveness. Then I began to speak in tongues. I was tremendously elated but as much surprised as joyful. Surprised, because in all my seeking I had failed, and now when I was not seeking I had received.

That is all. It was just as simple as that. When I obeyed Him He gave me the Holy Ghost.

The Testimony of a Converted Greek

For 27 years I was employed by the street car company of Athens as a conductor and up until the time I found Christ I lived a worldly life. I was brought up in the Greek Orthodox religion, but in the year 1912 someone told me that the Bible was the only book in which I could find the way of salvation. However, when I read the Bible and it condemned my sinful ways, I tore it up and continued my worldly life as before. Still my heart was longing and looking for something which inwardly I knew the Bible contained and I needed. I could not get away from this feeling, and at length bought another copy of the Bible and again began reading it. Once more the devil, to whom I was a captive, aroused me against the book, and I tore up this second copy and determined never again to read such a book. But God in His mercy was working in my heart, and I bought a third copy. This time things were dif-ferent, and somehow I liked it, but I did not find salvation until a little over five years ago when God allowed me to meet our dear brother Harry Mamalis, who came from far away America to preach to us the gospel of deliverance.

When Brother Mamalis explained to me the truths of the Bible, I accepted Christ and the truth hath set me free. I invited Brother Mamalis to my home in Athens and gave him freedom to hold meetings there. Through these meetings my family of four were also saved, besides many other precious souls.

The time of my retirement from the street car company has now arrived, and since I shall have a small pension, I have resigned my work in order to give my whole life to the ministry of the gospel. I do, however, need the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, and I ask you to pray for me that God may baptize me in His Spirit and use me for His glory.—John Anagnostu.

A Trip to a Cannibal Tribe J. M. Perkins

We call Dorobo the Cannibal Tribe because they used to be cannibals, and because that just before we arrived in this part of Liberia about twenty-three years ago, they had eaten a man. I shall not soon forget my first trip there. Jasper Toe and I had preached the gospel in several towns and had stopped in one of them for breakfast. I do not remember now what kind of meat the woman put in the palm butter whether it was dried rat, snake, or monkey, but I do remember quite distinctly what she said about me. While I was eating, the woman said to Jasper, "This white man does not open his mouth wide and show his teeth when he eats as we do." After looking at me eat for some time, she came to where I was and stroking the back of my hand with her black fingers said, "His hand is nice and white and soft." Knowing their fondness for human flesh, I just wondered what the woman was thinking about, but they did me no harm then nor the many times I have been over there since.

I left Newaka Mission Station at 6 A. M. April the 11th with two boys and three girls who were going along to help sing and preach and to carry some few things we needed to take along. One took a tin trunk with a change of clothing, as we almost al-ways get wet with the heavy dew on the grass and bushes, and often by a sudden downpour of rain. Another carried a lunch box with some bread and milk in it, so that I could have a bite before eleven o'clock when they usually cook breakfast. Another took a cot for me to sleep on, and still another took about twenty-five pounds of Portland cement, as I was to make two headstones for two graves there. One grave was that of a Miss Maria Tee, from Scotland, who died there about 18 years ago, and the other was that of Bennie, our native worker from this same tribe.

In about three hours we reached the mission station, held now by a native Christian, and at once sent for sand and began operations. By one o'clock we had the stones made. Then we had breakfast, rested a little, and started for the big king's town about two miles farther on. We reached there just before a shower of rain. The king was on his farm and had to be called. One of his wives opened up his house for us, and while we were

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waiting for him, I counted the furnishings of his house. There were over a hundred earthen and enamel plates hanging on the wall for decoration and for use in an emergency; ten iron pots, some hanging up and others being used; a number of earthen water pots, several rice fanners; and three or four white man's chairs.

I went over to arrange about placing a native worker in the tribe, as they had been begging for one for a long, long time. Then I wanted to talk to them about building a small chapel in each of their towns where they could meet to hear God's Word through the native worker or from any missionary who might visit them. The big king sent and called all the other kings, and the next day we talked the palaver.

They seemed pleased at the thought of having these chapels in their towns, and said they were willing to build them. They were pleased too to know that the native preacher could teach their children to read and write. Before dismissing, they thanked me for the interest I was taking in them and for the native worker I was giving them. They asked me to pray especially for them and also asked that I write to our friends at home to pray that God will send them a white missionary. Please remember this request.

Since returning from Dorobo, a chief man has been here from a tribe some three days away from here to beg for a native worker or a missionary if it is possible for us to send them one. Ethiopia is surely stretching out her hands to God.

It might be of interest to you to know what kind of food they gave me at Dorobo. Of course, we had palm butter and rice. As the light was not very good one evening, I could not see clearly what kind of meat was in the palm butter, but began to eat what was set before me. At first I dipped up some very small fish about three fourths of an inch long. I believe they cook them just as they catch them in their baskets. They tasted fairly good. Then I got hold of a white grub with a red head. It was hard and tough and did not taste good, so I concluded I had had enough palm butter and meat for that time and gave the remainder to the boys and girls. Of course, I did not tell them why I had had enough. Well, I reached home alive, and was so thankful to sit down to a real table, covered with a clean tablecloth where I was not afraid of finding undressed fish and white grubs with red heads.

Blessings in South India Mrs. Lillie D. Maltby

We praise God for blessing and for His presence with us through the severest financial test we have ever had,

and for His keeping power, enabling us to keep on amid the heat of these months. It is now eight months since we came to labor in Palamcottah. It has been amid stout opposition of the Modernistic church that we worked. This place is the center of the Tamil speaking people. It is spoken most purely in this section.

The Lord has given a little band of true disciples (Tamils) who are standing and having to withstand much against them. God is able to keep us all. Hallelujah!

Modernism has wrought great havoc among so-called Christians, so much so that some who had come out of Hinduism and joined them are returning to Hinduism. The moral state is on a very low plane indeed. The Hindus are quite willing to hear and to be led to Christ as yet. The time seems very short, however, that this shall last, so we have to labor constantly as far as possible ere the door of entrance among them will close.

Since we came here eight months ago, twenty-three have received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. Praise God! Twelve of these received during the two conventions we held at Courtallam, five at Trichionopoly, and six at Palamcottah. We held three meetings at Trichionopoly, a large railway center, with marked results. A missionary couple should be stationed there as it is a day's journey by rail from us and a real field in itself. But there is as yet no one for that work. Of those baptized in the Holy Spirit, some were out of heathenism but a year, other a few years, and some from Catholicism. Again others were unsaved church members. We do not count the number saved as one cannot be certain of their stand until lives are cleaned up and restitution made. We encourage native workers to step out and open work themselves. Although they are slow about this, there is encouragement there too, through these conventions we have held for them.

As both Mr. Maltby and myself have labored incessantly these months, we found we must get a change by all means during the very hot season. Mr. Maltby's time is much taken up with the getting out of the little paper, "The Full Gospel Messenger," as he attends to proofreading, etc. We are glad to say that although the publishing of this little paper costs what one evangelist would need for his support, yet we are reaching many well educated Tamils, Telugus, and others through it with good results.

We have come to a little cottage on the mountain side, nine miles below Kodaikanal. Here it is cool and quiet and a place to be alone with God.

WHO'S TO BLAME?

His mother was heartbroken, of course. She had just overheard an argument between Mildred and Ralph. She had listened with interest as Mildred tried to tell her brother, that of course the Bible is the inspired Word of God, but her heart sunk as she heard him retort, "Well, believe it if you want to, but I'm through with the whole business. You can't tell why you believe it, and when I try to get an intelligent answer to some of the questions that I ask those who believe as you do, all I get is a scolding because I'm too 'full of questions.'"

His mother tried to tell herself that she couldn't help it because he was skeptical, but down in her heart was a sense of condemnation, for she remembered how many times when he had asked her simple questions about the Bible she had had to evade him, or put him off till some other time. A Suicide's Story

(Continued from Page One) Something kept urging me on, showing scriptures that "if a man vow a vow unto the Lord . . . he shall not break his word." Num. 30:2. I wanted to ask human advice, but feared to, thinking that would be trusting man instead of God, and that God would be displeased. In my ignorance I allowed Satan to put all kinds of false beliefs into my head, such as reincarnation.

My mother had to leave about Sept. 26, 1925, and two nights later my husband was away on business, so I was alone with my three small children. At about 8 o'clock I did what I thought God wanted me to do—went to the garage and shot myself with my husband's 45 calibre army pistol. I prayed just before doing it, "If this is just to show my faith, I know you can raise me up again." I was unconscious for a time after being shot, and then came to, and walked into the house and lay down on the floor. I

kept expecting Jesus to reveal Himself to me, but all was as dark as ever. The pain was very great with every breath I took, and my breath was short. I thought of Jesus suffering on the cross for six hours, feeling that God had forsaken Him.

At about 11 o'clock my husband returned, lifted me into bed, and started to pray to the Lord to heal me. I had lost a great deal of blood by this time, and I felt very weak. I asked him to send for the pastor of the Gospel Tabernacle in the next town where we had attended some services, so that he could pray for the salvation of my I surely thought I would soon soul. be out of this world. Through a mistake of the taxi driver he was not reached until 6 A. M. Meanwhile, at about 3 A. M., my husband received the assurance that I would be healed. When the pastor came and heard what had happened, he said, "Don't you know the devil told you to do that?" I answered, "No." He said, "You ask God to forgive you." He showed me I had sinned, so I did so. Then he anoint-ed me with oil (Jas. 5:14), and prayed for my healing. I fell asleep for the first time in 24 hours.

A few hours later, two of the sisters from the tabernacle came and washed my wounds in plain water, pouring in oil as they too prayed for my recovery. The bullet had entered my left breast and left my body just above my left hip in the back, breaking a rib in my chest. As I had no doctor I never knew what other damage was done, but Jesus healed it all, praise His Name. The two sisters stayed all day and prayed and praised the Lord, and fasted. They talked to me of Jesus and of His love and power. I could not hear enough. One scripture that helped me especially was Jer. 32:27: "Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh; is there any thing too hard for I never had any fever nor inme?' fection from the powder smoke. The wound in my back was scarred over the third day, and about the eighth day I was out of bed. I feel that the Lord allowed me to stay in bed, receiving visits from the saints who testified to me and taught me, until I learned fully how Jesus' blood "cleanseth us from all sin."

I shall never forget the joy in my heart when at last I really could believe without any more doubts that Jesus paid all for me, and I could do nothing to gain my salvation. I was accepted of God as soon as I repented and believed in the blood of Jesus and confessed Him before men. Rom. 10: 10. We were never so happy as in those days we lived so fully in the love of Jesus.

The tenth day I went to the tabernacle and testified to my healing. The wound in my breast had not entirely scarred over, but it was healed. I learned that day what it meant to overcome Satan "by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony." Rev. 12:11. Satan tried to keep me back by making me suffer such pain all morning that I could not help crying, and every time I stood on my feet everything would become black. When the pastor showed me it was due to Satan, and told me to keep praising the Lord, I did so all afternoon and, with the prayers of others upholding me, I managed to get to the evening service, but was so weak I doubted if I could speak. When the songs of praise started I found truly that "the joy of the Lord is your strength" (Neh. 8:10), for I could feel strength flowing into my body. I made my first public testimony, and came home happy. Satan fled, for I never had that pain nor dizziness after.

A week later I was baptized in water, and about a month after that, God gave me the wonderful Baptism with the Holy Spirit, with the evidence of speaking in another tongue as in Acts 2:4. My husband received the same gift the same day.

For a few days after my healing, whenever I would think of my experience I would live over that terrible darkness I had been in, and smell again the powder smoke. One day when this sickening feeling came on me, I instinctively appealed to Jesus, and it seemed as if two big, strong, tender hands reached down from heaven and, taking mine, lifted me up so that I stepped up on something solid, and I was free from all the horror of it and have been ever since. "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." John 8:36. Over five years have passed since

Over five years have passed since then, and the Lord has blessed us with three more strong healthy children, and with all kinds of material and spiritual blessings too. Jesus has healed all of our diseases and has kept us rejoicing in Him. I am looking forward to the glad day when He will come to receive His own out of this world, and I shall see Him face to face—"Jesus Christ, who loved me so."
