

Delivered From Chinese Bandits



OD'S people are not always delivered out of the jaws of death. Although Peter was miraculously liberated from prison while the Christians were praying earnestly, James

was beheaded. Doubtless the Church was praying just as earnestly in the case of James as in that of Peter. Sometimes God chooses to be glorified in the martyrdom of His saints and at other times by their deliverance from death. This is made clear in the eleventh chapter of Hebrews.

The following incidents happened during a raid in Anhwei Province and are only a few of many similar deliverances in answer to prayer experienced by Chinese Christians during the months when the Red Terror

spread through so many parts of China. The case of the faithful Bible woman who was so cruelly tortured by bandits, her flesh being seared with burning paper until a large part of her body was burned over, in an effort to force her to tell where money was supposed to be hidden, and who died after fourteen days of suffering bravely borne, giving a glorious testimony to the sustaining grace of the Lord to the last, is a contrast to the following experiences.

A young man, member of the Pocket Testament League, was in the hands of the bandits. At the time when he was to be shot along with a number of other captives, he was forced to kneel down with the others, he being the last one in the line. One after another was shot by the executioner. His eyes were closed. He heard the click of the pistol but was astonished to feel no pain! As he fell over, the

bandits all turned and walked away. He opened his eyes and found that he was alone. Reaching out his hand to the blood of the victim next to him, he smeared some of it upon his face and hands, to make his escape easier. He then got up and escaped to his home in the city, and upon his arrival, he told the praying Christians of his remarkable deliverance. Evidently the magazine of the automatic pistol was exhausted and the bandit had failed to count accurately, but the Lord had not!

The postmaster, also a member of the Pocket Testament League, was captured by the bandits, after they had secured the \$300 in the postoffice safe. They demanded of him another \$1,000,

They strung him up by the wrists and beat him mercilessly, also used burning paper torches to burn his flesh. Finally they took him away to the mountains. Some other postmasters made up the \$1,000 and paid it, but then the bandits would not release him because they feared he would reveal their identity. Much prayer was offered on his behalf. At last it was decided by the bandits that all their captives should be shot. They compelled them to lie down on the ground in groups of five, as the pistol held five shots in its magazine.

One of the bandits had become attached to the postmaster, probably because of his kindness of heart and his

unusual behavior, and he asked the executioner to spare him, which he agreed to do. However, it was agreed that he should lie down with four others, he being the fourth in the group, and the executioner agreed to shoot into the ground above his head and pretend that he had been killed. Later, after the other bandits had gone, the one who had spared his life came to him and gave him \$3 to pay for a sedan chair in which to go back to his home.

Another young man, the son of a Christian family, fearing that he might be kidnaped in his home village, came to the city for refuge. Soon after he reached there, the bandits came to the city also, and, as he was wearing a long gown, they supposed he was the son of some wealthy man and they seized him and demanded \$10,000 ransom. They forced him to go with them and to do coolie work, carrying heavy loads of loot. The

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ESUS entered Jerusalem on a colt, "whereon yet nev-er man sat." Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God did not own the donkey on which He rode. He had to borrow it.

He had no home on earth, He had to borrow even the tomb in which He lay. When I speak of taking a donkey ride

Some cried out, "Who is this?" Do you think the disciples of Jesus said that? Do you think it was those who were acquainted with Him? No! It was the scribes, and the Phariseesthose who did not know Him. Those who were singing, "Hosanna in the highest," glorifying God, knew who it was. The praises of God were in their hearts. Some of the old Pharisees cried, "Keep them quiet. They make too much noise." And you don't have to go among the Pharisees to hear that. Brother maybe you don't have it, that is why you do not make any noise. If you can get salvation and not know it, you can lose it and not miss it. You know when this peace comes in your heart.

The sight of the Saviour on that donkey set their hearts ablaze with adoration. That little ride typified the great ride when He shall come in power and great glory.

Let us go back to Bethlehem, and see Mary sitting with the Babe in her arms. When the wise men saw Mary and Jesus the Saviour held close to her bosom, they fell in adoration. They presented unto Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. When they returned, they were glorifying God. You will return glorifying God when you have presented everything to Jesus. But Herod tried to kill Him. He slew thousands of innocent children trying to get Him.

It meant something to Joseph to believe God and to take Mary to be his wife. But he believed God. Herod said, "I will kill Him! He will not be king! He said, "It is written again Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God." So He rode on a little bit farther towards the glory.

Next He was taken to the mountain side. Here the devil spread out before His mind's eye a beautiful scene of the mountains, valleys, cities, king-doms, etc. "All these things will I give thee if thou wilt fall down and worship me." But He said, "It is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God and Him only shalt thou serve." He came out without a scar, a conquering Christ, victorious over the tests and temptations in the wilderness. From then on, the life of Jesus was one of testing and trial.

Scribes and Pharisees ran around accusing Him of breaking the Sabbath; they tried to catch Him in His words hoping to make Him a liar. They called Him the prince of devils. But He stayed on the donkey. They blasphemed Him, but Jesus Christ was victorious through it all. As He rode to Jerusalem on that donkey on which never man sat before, He rode in the midst of sorrow, pain, and grief, assailed by criticism from the world and from the professors of religion.

Some of us get off the donkey. Some of us if we cannot play the piano in the mission, if we have not been asked to sing, fall off the donkey. But Jesus did not let the common temptations and

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A Blameless Ministry

source of strength, or equipment for service. If we want a perfect equipment we find it here.

(a) By the Holy Ghost. We cannot be efficient apart from the mighty Baptism and infilling of the Holy Spirit. In Paul the Spirit worked mightily. He was able to write confidently to the church at Rome (Rom. 15:18, 19), "For I will not dare to speak of any of those things which Christ hath not wrought by me to make the Gentiles obedient by word and deed, through mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God; so that from Jerusalem and round about Illyricum I have fully preached the gospel of Christ.'

It will be utterly impossible for us to be blameless and efficient without the mighty anointing of the Holy Spirit. In all our services and in all our work for God, let us not fail to honor the Holy Ghost.

I am reminded just now of the young preacher who in one of his earlier efforts preached what he thought was "quite a sermon," but was somewhat startled as he walked down the aisle at the close of the service to have a dear mother in Israel say somewhat pungently to him: "Young man, the next time you preach, honor the Holy Ghost."

(b) By love unfeigned-love that is pure and true, and not hypocritical. The exhortation of Rom. 12:9, "Let love be without dissimulation," (Margin, hypocrisy) is a much needed exhortation today. Nothing is more nauseating than an affected insincere love-a love that apes reality but lacks the divine essence. Real sincere love has wonderful drawing power and we cannot have a blameless ministry with-out it. Oh, that the love of Christ may constrain, overmaster, control us!

The terms "unfeigned faith" and "unfeigned love" are each found twice in the Epistles, the former in 1 Tim. 1:5, and 2 Tim. 1:5, and the latter in our text and in 1 Peter 1:22. Faith and love dwell together in the Spiritfilled heart, and it is the faith that works by love that alone can move God to work mightily on our behalf.

(c) By the word of truth. Paul, both in his writings and preaching, could boldly say, "I tell you the truth." All preaching that is not of the truth

3. Now we come to the seven-fold is a stench in God's nostrils. In these days of error and false teaching, we need to know and proclaim the *truth*. That means that we must preach *Christ*, for He said (John 14:6), "I am the truth"; and again (John 8:32), "Ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free."

> (d) By the power of God. Paul tells us in 1 Cor. 1:24 that "Christ is the power of God." Then in Romans 1:16 we are told that the gospel of Christ is "the power of God unto salvation." And what is the gospel, but the good news that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He arose again the third day according to the Scriptures? 1 Cor. 15:3, 4.

The gospel message is summed up in the twofold statement-"Christ died for me," and "I died in Him." We cannot separate "Christ and the Truth," from "the Word of truth." Let us then fearlessly preach Christ, for He is the power of God-that heavenly dynamite that can "break the power of cancelled sin and set the prisoner free.'

(e) By the armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left; or as Weymouth puts it, "By the weapons of righteousness on the right hand and on the left." Moffatt's translation is equally striking. "With the weapons of integrity for attack or for defense." It is no use our battling with the weapons of unrighteousness. When in Acts 6 seven deacons were chosen, the instruction was "look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom," and we are told in 1 Tim. 3:7 that a bishop or overseer "must have a good report of them which are without."

(f) By honor and dishonor. God honored and magnified his servant Paul. Men dishonored him. In fact he graphically pictures for us in 1 Cor. 4:9-15 the dishonors which were heaped upon him in all of which he sees God's hand, "for I think that God hath set forth us the apostles last as it were appointed to death; for we are made a spectacle unto the world, and to angels and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake . . . we are weak . . . despised . . . we hunger and thirst and are naked and buffeted, and have no certain dwelling place . . . being reviled, we bless, being persecuted,

we suffer it; being defamed, we intreat: we are made as the filth of the world, and are the offspring of all things unto this day." And yet Paul stood high in the counsels of God, and was "led in triumph in every place in Christ Jesus." Again I pray that God may help us to "follow in His train."

(g) By evil report and good report. Paul was slandered by the ungodly and was betrayed by false brethren, but he stood in well with Jesus and with those "kindred spirits" who were to him companions in tribulation. If we would have "a blameless ministry" we also will have to go through evil report and good report, and "know both how to be abased and how to abound." We must be willing to " go to Christ without the camp bearing His reproach," and with our eyes fixed on Jesus turn neither to the right hand nor to the left.

4. The sevenfold result. Here we have the world's estimate of the blameless servant of God contrasted with God's estimate.

(a) As deceivers and yet true. The world looks upon an earnest Christian as a deceiver; for he is altogether beyond their understanding-a strong proof that the true Christian's life is "hid with Christ in God."

(b) As unknown yet well known. From the worldling's standpoint the true Christian does not count in the daily aggregate. He is not reckoned in the world's forces, and is to the world as though he did not exist. To use an arithmetical term he is a minus quantity. Regarding the sons of God the Apostle John tells us (1 John 3:1), "Therefore . . . because we are sons of God . . . the world knoweth us not." Unknown on earth, but well known in heaven.

(c) As dying and behold we live. The world thinks that we might as well be dead as to miss all the joy and pleasure that it has to offer. They forget that "she that liveth in pleasure is dead while she liveth." 1 Tim. 5:6. The Christian is the only one who truly lives-those out of Christ only exist.

Paul once said, "I die daily." 1 Cor. 5:31. He simply meant-as the context shows-that he was constantly living in the presence of death, or as he expresses it, "in jeopardy every hour." This bears out the truth Rom. 8:36, "For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter."

"As dying, but behold we live." This thought is wonderfully illumined by the statement that follows:

War Clouds

The Psalmist complained, "I am for peace; but when I speak, they are for war." Psalm 120:7. There are many like the Psalmist who stand for peace, but in contrast to these peacemakers are those described as "evil" and "violent," who "imagine mischiefs in their heart" and who "continually are gathered together for war." Psalm 140: 1, 2. The nations of the world have been making preparations for a great Disarmament Conference-or perhaps it would be more correct to call it a Limitation-of-arms Conference-to be held in Geneva in February, 1932. Statesmen and men of affairs have been telling us that the one way to world peace is through the limitation of armaments (the nations are spending upwards of \$4,158,000,000 annually on their national defence programs), but while they are arranging this Conference for international peace and safety, they are disturbed by the discovery that in contrast to their stand for peace many in the world are for war, and that right at this time, away in Manchuria, large armies of Chinese and Japanese are facing one another.

League of Nations Helpless

The League of Nations has been considering the dispute between Japan and China and has taken the side of China, ordering the Japanese to evacuate Manchuria. Their word has had just about as much weight as the counsel of Eli to his ungodly sons when he said to them, "Why do you do these things?" Aristide Briand, the French Foreign Minister and President of the League of Nations Council, is calling for a special League of Nations Council in Paris on Nov. 17, to further discuss the trouble between China and Japan; but we fear the peaceful words of Europe will have little effect on the ears of the militarists of Japan, who, under the guise of protecting Japanese citizens in Manchuria, are committing acts of war there every day, incidentally killing hundreds of

Chinese soldiers. Japan is controlled by the military party. The more peaceful men in the Japanese government are helpless to stop the militarists in their ambitions for the complete conquest of Manchuria. These men argue that the territory Japan now owns is altogether inadequate for its nearly ninety million people, increasing daily by twenty-five hundred, and here is a good opportunity to get extra terri-They argue that they have an tory. excellent excuse for their fighting since General Ma Chen-shan, the North Manchuria Chinese war lord, acting independently of the Chinese government in Nanking, has declared his intention to "fight Japan to the very last man."

Possible Complications

Washington is alarmed, knowing what extraordinary international complications are likely to arise; and Mr. Stimson, the Secretary of State, is doing all in his power to influence Japan to make a peaceful settlement of matters under dispute. The Russians have many interests in Manchuria and they are bringing large numbers of Red soldiers to the border. The Japanese complain that carloads of field guns and ammunition are being supplied by the Russians, coming in from Siberia, to aid the Chinese, and that the Russian authorities are holding one hundred and fifty railway cars on the border in readiness for military use. Russia has had a large part in Chinese affairs during the past twelve or more years, and the Soviets can be counted to do anything at this time that they may consider an aid to their plans for world revolution.

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"Days Big With Destiny"

The New York Times of Nov. 7 published an interview with United States Senator Burton K. Wheeler of Montana, who has just returned from Europe. Senator Wheeler declared, "Europe is today an armed camp, fifteen years after the war to end war

-and in my judgment war would break out again if some of the nations in Europe felt they could finance it." And what will happen if during the next few months warfare continues in Manchuria, and America, British, or French citizens are killed? Because Germany refused to have respect for the lives of Americans during the last war, the United States government declared war on her. Will the nations do less to safeguard the lives of their citizens at this time? In the recent General Election in Great Britain the British populace turned out the Labor men, who stood to a man for a peace program, and elected to their parliament a Major General, five Brigadier Generals, twenty-two Lieutenant Colonels, and altogether more than one hundred and twenty-five members with military or naval rank above a Captain or Commander. This gives to the government of Great Britain a decidedly "military cast of mind." These men will not hesitate to back British prestige with British bullets. The situation is grave.

Divine Interference

When the last great war was waging, a dear old saint said to the writer, "I don't know exactly how to pray. I suppose in every country there are people who are praying for the success of the arms of their own nation, but there must be considerable praying that is certainly not directed by the Holy Ghost. How shall I pray?" I said to her, "There is a prayer given by the Holy Ghost in Psalm 68, and you will be absolutely safe in praying that prayer: 'Scatter thou the people that delight in war.'" James shows us plainly from whence come warsthey come from human lusts. The trouble is that no peace program goes far enough; they don't go down to the lusts that war in the members of men, and the promoters of these programs do not realize that only those who are in Christ Jesus, who walk in the Spirit, are freed from the lusts that bring about these wars. See Gal. 5:22-24. Agreeing to limitation of armaments and sinking a few battleships is not the

God, a day is coming when the Holy Ghost prayer, "Scatter thou the people that delight in war" will prevail. The Lord will make "wars to cease unto the end of the earth." Psalm 46:9. Then will He bring in His kingdom, and "nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more." Isa. 2:4. When Isaiah foretold this he cried, "O house of Jacob, come ye, let us walk in the light of the Lord"-in the light of Him who is the Prince of Peace.

* The Words of Christ

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When Great Britain declared war on Germany, Evangelist Smith Wigglesworth said, "There is no war between the British Pentecostal people and the German Pentecostal brethren; we love each other with all our hearts. And if it had been left to us, neither of our nations would have been at war." Our Lord and Master meant exactly what He said when He de-clared, "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, and pray for them that despitefully use you and persecute you, that ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven." Matt. 5:44, 45. During the war military authorities refused to allow the words given by the Prince of Peace in what is known as the Sermon on the Mount, to be printed for circulation, as they counted them "pacifist propaganda." But these blessed words of peace will remain when all militarists have perished, and they will eternally condemn all those who delight in war.

The Way of Escape

There will be wars and rumors of wars unto the end, for these the Master foretold. But He has a special word for His own, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you; not as the world giveth (it has no per-manent peace) give I unto you. . . . These things I have spoken unto you that in Me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." He has made "peace through the blood of His cross." And as Paul tells us in Eph. 2:14, "He is our peace." When the nations at the close of the last war made their peace contract, the Treaty of Versailles, they made no mention of the Lord. They preferred to be independent of Him. One of these days He will act independently of them. In the time of trouble and tribulation that he who has eves to see must see is coming rapidly on the earth, He will hide His own in His pavilion-"In the secret of His tabernacle will He hide them." Psalm 27:5. He will keep His own from

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that hour of tribulation that is coming on the earth. They will be caught up to Him, but they will return with Him. And He has promised them, "The meek shall inherit the earth and shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace." Psalm 37:11. Lord, speed the day of this gracious deliverance and this delightsome peace! In the meantime He reminds us, "Watch ye therefore and pray always, that ye may be counted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man.'

A Backward Movement

An old fashioned Methodist, A. J. Moore, commenting on the various "forward movements" of today has suggested that it might be a good thing to have a backward movement, back to the Bible as the inspired Word of God, "the only infallible rule of faith and practice," back to the Lord Jesus Christ without any question as to His deity, back to the Cross as the only deliverance from sin.

He then asked the boy who he was and was told that he was the son of a farmer in that district. When it was decided that all of the more than fifty captives should be shot, including the above mentioned batch, they were all lined up. The captain, noticing the boy among them, called him and said, "You stand by my side and don't leave me." After the others were all shot, the captain turned to the boy and said, "You may go home now."

So the faith of the relatives and friends, who had continued hoping and praying, against hope, was rewarded by seeing these three come back from what seemed certain death .-- Sunday School Times.

It was not the first time we had heard this Voice. It had spoken in the little country church choir over thirty years ago. It had said, "As my Father in heaven hath sent me, even so SEND I YOU." we? Did we love Him more than Grace, more than the twins, Mary and Martha, more than Paul and Baby Ruth? We had answered "Yes," and the Voice had bidden us lay them on His altar, and the command had followed, "Feed my sheep!"

Was I glad we had obeyed? Glad? When Daddy was stricken down with smallpox within a year after our return to India, and I was left alone with six little ones now, alone in the jungles, forty miles from any white person? Glad? Yes glad, for His will is good and perfect and acceptable.

The question before us this day in the little Rest Home was this-would He call me back again? Four of the children had come to America. And yet He had not allowed us to make them an excuse thirteen years before. Would He now? Billows of fear, doubt and uncertainty dashed against my soul. Suddenly the Voice spoke the little chorus written above, "Forward still, 'tis Jehovah's will . . . He'll roll the sea away."

I am writing today on the steamer on my way back to India. We are on the Red Sea—the very sea that rolled away when the hosts of Israel moved forward. My Red Sea too has rolled away, or shall I more literally say that I am sailing on it? I am on my way back to India and can see yet the smiles on four pale faces and hear yet the words from four pairs of tightly pressed lips, "God bless you, Mother! We too are coming just as soon as we can get ready."

We are going back to a new India. It has changed much in the year and a half since we left. While in America, I was given a book entitled, "It is sunrise in India." I devoured its contents eagerly with the hope that I too might catch some of its morning beams, but alas, I found none. I wonder if at present it is sunrise anywhere on this old earth? Rather, is it not twilight? Are the evening shadows not settling down around us? If so, should we not with Him say, "I must work the works of Him that hath sent me while it is yet day, the NIGHT COMETH when no man can work"?

We want to be in India on duty at our post when the night falls. How long will India's doors be open to the gospel? Gandhi says, "Of course, when we get self-government in India, we shall expect the missionaries to withdraw from India. Every country thinks its own religion is the best and surely the great faiths of India are good enough for India. India does not need to be converted to another.' If we agree with Gandhi, we are not going to care much if India's door seems to be slowly closing to the gospel. But if we believe that India needs Christ, we shall make every effort to press in while we may. We shall move forward in spite of the dashing and the foaming of angry seas of opposition and hatred.

I am going back to the great Saran District of North India with its two and a half million souls. The great billows of caste, women seclusion, ignorance, idolatry, hatred for the white man and his religion, and commercial strife are dashing there in wild fury. But we are going forward. We want to put Indian preachers and Bible women in this great district. With our present force of workers, we shall never be able to make an impression on the enemy's front. Back of that front are souls of men, women, and little children for whom the Son of God died-souls with but one hope and that that the gospel will reach them in their lifetime. On the dark clouds

above, we read these words in flaming letters of fire, "All things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them." Brother, sister, do you believe the golden rule? Are you keeping it? Try to place yourself for a moment in one of the thousands of villages in this district. You struggle, you grope in the darkness, you stagger and fall. God meant you to have the "lamp of life" to lighten your way, but it has been denied you by those who profess to be walking in the light. If you were they, what "would you that men would do unto you"? . . . "Do ye even so to them."

We should like to put a dozen Indian preachers out in these villages at once. These can be supported for from fifteen to twenty dollars monthly. Bible women can be secured for from five to ten dollars a month. How many of these will YOU support? Write and let us know.

We need suitable houses for these preachers. Just now, one occupied by one of our most successful preachers is for sale. The Arya Samaj is influencing the owner to sell it, so that we cannot rent it—the only house for rent in the village. We have had a number of souls from this village the past year, and we feel it would be a great mistake to close our work there at present. We can buy it, I think, for \$300.00. We need houses for our other preachers. We have closed work in a large village a few miles away because no suitable house could be rented. Brethren, we are looking to you for help. "Speak unto the children of Israel that they go FORWARD." We must advance or fall. We must move FORWARD in this great work of a world's evangelization or be consumed by the hosts that follow us. Some of us have done nobly-others have acted cowardly-all of us can do better. We love to sing, "Love found a way to redeem my soul," and we forget that the same love-His love in uswould find a way to redeem them also. "Speak unto the children of Israel that they go FORWARD."

A Blameless Ministry

(d) As chastened and not killed. The word chastened here means disciplined. Weymouth translates these words, "As under God's discipline, and yet we are not deprived of life."

Paul appeared to be having a hard time, and was severely disciplined; but he always came out on top, better and stronger for the battle. The world does not understand the reserve strength and life we have in Christ. In all the varied modes and stages of discipline through which God leads us, His one purpose is to conform us to the image of His Son, to fill us with resurrection life and power, and better fit us for the great conflicts that are yet ahead.

(e) As sorrowful yet always rejoicing

Like his Master, Paul was "a man of sorrows." In Rom. 9:12 he says: "I say the truth in Christ. I lie not, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Ghost that I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart."

The Christian life is full of paradoxes, and here is one—"sorrowful yet always rejoicing," though it is ofttimes the joy of agony. In Phil. 3:10 Paul links "the power of His resurrection" with "the fellowship of His sufferings." Both have a prominent part in a blameless life and ministry.

(f) As poor, yet making many rich. "As poor"—that is the world's estimate. "Making many rich,"—that is God's estimate.

Paul had no resources in himself. He had to draw his riches from Christ, and the *overflow* enriched other lives. We may be poor in this world's goods yet in Christ we are heirs of all things, and expect to reign with Him one thousand years.

As for poverty of spirit, that is one of the marks of a full overcomer, and the first beatitude declares, "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." The aristocracy of heaven is composed of the *foolish*, *weak*, *base*, *despised nobodies* (See 1 Cor. 1:16-28), and these are they who glorify God and enrich the earth.

(g) As having nothing, and yet possessing all things.

Paul had "no certain dwelling place," but having food and raiment he was content. The world thinks we have nothing and are without resources, but God says, "All things are yours."

When the atheistic self-conceited squire taunted Billy Bray about his poor crop of potatoes Billy looked up at him with a merry twinkle in his eye, and said, "Who do you think I

am?" "Why," answered the squire, "you are Billy Bray, the poor Cornish miner." "Ah," said Billy, "you don't know me. I am a King's son." We ought to praise God that we have royal blood in our veins, and that we are the King's sons and daughters.

Let us be true to God and we shall one day see "the King in his beauty," and shall sit down with Christ on His throne.

In view of all that has gone before and of very much more that could be said, are we able to commend ourselves as ministers of God

1. By a sevenfold (perfect) passive suffering.

2. By a sevenfold (perfect) active self-denial.

3. By a sevenfold (perfect) equipment for service.

4. By God's *perfect estimate* of our life and service.

If we *are*, then we can lay claim to "a blameless ministry," and a glad looking forward to the time when we shall hear the commendation from our Master's lips, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant . . . enter thou into the joy of thy Lord." For this glad consummation we earnestly pray.

The Way of Peace

" 'The Lord shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your peace.' Ex. 14:14. Precious assurance! The Lord not only places Himself between us and our sins, but also between us and our circumstances. By doing the former, He gives us peace of conscience; by doing the latter, He gives us peace of heart. That the two things are perfectly distinct every experienced Christian knows. Very many have peace of conscience, who have not peace of heart. They have, through grace and by faith, found Christ, in the divine efficacy of His blood, between them and all their sins; but they are not able, in the same simple way, to realize Him as standing, in His divine wisdom, love, and power, between them and their circumstances.

"This makes a material difference in the practical condition of the soul, as well as in the character of one's testimony. Nothing tends more to glorify the name of Jesus than that quiet repose of spirit which results from having Him between us and everything that could be a matter of anxiety to our hearts. "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee." "--C. H. M.

A Warning

It has been reported to us that offerings have been sent from some sources direct to native workers in India and Africa, and in some case the amount sent has reached several hundred dollars. We wish to advise all who are sending funds in this way, that this is an unwise practice inasmuch as there are unfortunately those in foreign lands who are using religion as a cloak and having obtained the addresses of people in the homeland will often give a very glowing report of the work they are doing and also a pitiful account of their own needs, which would not stand the light of investigation. In one case we learned of a lady in the United States who had sent money to a native whom our missionaries tell us is still a Mohammedan although he professes the name of Christ in order to obtain financial help. We would strongly recommend that funds for native workers should always be sent to the missionary who is supervising the work, or if the worker is independent then we would recommend that the money be sent through someone who may be in a position to investigate the case. There are many deceivers teaching for filthy lucre's sake who should not be encouraged. Let us use wisdom in our stewardship for God. Missionary Secretary

Let Go the Ropes

HEN Christ healed the palsied man He was in a home, and that home was crowded even to the door. In the crowd scribes and Pharisees who had come to watch and find fault if possible. The Word tells us that "the power of the Lord was present to heal." Christ had been praying beforehand, in the wilderness. Luke 5:16. Some people maintain that they cannot get healings in their meetings because of contrary spirits. Would it not be well to follow Christ's example of spending much time in praying beforehand?

Four men started to bring their friend to Christ for healing. On arriving at the house they found the found the place crowded to the door. They decided that the only way was to get the poor man up on the roof, remove the tiling, and let him down in front of Jesus with ropes tied to the mattress. It must have been a solid roof to hold up five men. These four men must have come to a point of agreement concerning how to act after the man was let down, for that was the real test of faith. The three Gospels record the fact that Christ saw their faith, the faith of the four bearers; there may have been very little faith in the man with the palsy.

Sometimes the person who prays for the sick has more faith than the patient. The writer remembers just such a case. In a morning meeting one time, at his request hands were being raised by those who were desiring healing, but questions were being asked and answered before the sick were told to come forward. One of those who raised her hand was a woman who was in great distress, and who had to be home by noon. It was then eleven o'clock. The woman urgently requested that she be prayed for right away, but I replied, "Sister, you will be prayed for soon; you will be healed, and you will be able to reach home by noon !"

At the healing service shortly afterwards, this woman was the first to be prayed for. She started to give a list of her ailments—high blood pressure, heart trouble, stomach trouble but I stopped her, for I felt that if she went on with her list I would have little faith for her healing. The power of God came upon her; she jumped up, and with raised hands and with tears streaming down her cheeks she praised the Lord for the healing. She came back to the afternoon meeting and it was difficult to keep her still, she wanted to testify again and again to her healing. She stayed a week longer, and testified to the completeness of her healing, and she looked like a different woman. That was an instance where faith was given to the preacher for the sick one.

These four men who brought the paralytic to Jesus-what did they do that showed the Lord they had faith? Was it taking the man on to the roof? No. Taking the tiles off? No. Letting the man down right in front of Jesus without a plea for help? No. When the man was let down, each of the four men would have hold of a rope attached to the mattress. No doubt there was a discussion beforehand concerning how to act, and they had decided they would all let go the ropes after the man was let down. But what if he were not healed? How could they get him up again? The Pharisees would not help the poor man, for they would have had to give way to make room for him, otherwise he would have been let down on the top of their heads.

They let go the ropes. Ah, that is it! It was as though they said, "We have done our part, now we have faith that You will do yours." The Lord saw their faith. We are quite sure they let go the ropes for the Lord told the sick man to take up his bed and go home. If the four had been holding the ropes He would have told them to let go.

Today people who are seeking healing often hang on to the ropes. There is an Emergency rope, a Doubting rope, a Wait and See rope, and a Seeing is Believing rope. Those who hang on to the Emergency rope say, "Well I am going up to be prayed for, but if I am not healed I still have the pills to fall back on." Those who hold the Doubting rope say, "I really wonder if Christ can heal my serious and complicated case. I have been prayed for in the past, and of course mine is a very peculiar case." Let go the Doubting rope!

The Wait and See rope people say, "Yes, I have been prayed for and feel a little better, but I am going to see if it lasts." Many are holding on to this rope. And those who cling to the Seeing is Believing rope say, "I felt no better after I was prayed for. The symptoms are all there. If I only saw

a manifestation of healing I could believe." When Christ cursed the fig tree it showed no immediate sign of withering. The disciples saw no difference as they left it, the leaves were as green as ever, and moving in the wind. But when the word went forth, immediately the life of the tree left, though the manifestation was not seen by the disciples until the next day. If you are wanting healing or any other thing from the Lord, let go that rope. Mother, are you wanting your husband saved, your children saved? Possibly you have been holding to one of the ropes. Let them all go at the same time you lay your loved ones at the feet of Jesus. That is faith. And Jesus, seeing your faith, will at once begin to work.

It took *four* men to lay the paralytic at the feet of Jesus. But we have the promise that if *two* of us agree on earth as touching any thing that we shall ask, it shall be done. Matt. 18:19. Nay, one is sufficient, for He has said, "What things soever ye desire when ye pray believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." Mark 11:24.

Christ always taught lessons through His miracles. In this case the sin question was dealt with. Why bring that up? Why not just heal the man, and then there would have been no trouble, for it was not the Sabbath day. Today we hear men say, "Yes, I believe in the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, but why do you want to bring in the statement that the evidence of the same is that the recipient will speak with tongues."

Though the paralytic did not ask for healing, Christ saw his need of it; but He also saw a deeper need—the need of his sins being forgiven. You get saved, and the Lord will do the other things that you need. When Christ said, "Thy sins are forgiven thee," the Pharisees began to cavil. But the Lord, with the spirit of discernment, saw right into the hearts of these men.

The Pharisees did not doubt that He had the power to heal; but when He told the man his sins were forgiven, the Pharisees said He blasphemed. Today many preachers have great faith that Christ can forgive sin, but they do not believe He heals bodies. Christ showed that it was as easy for Him to do one as to do the other, or to do both. If. He can create a clean heart, He also can heal a diseased heart. The man walking home, carrying his mattress, was a proof not only that he was healed but that "the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins."

Let go the ropes, and thereby the Lord will see your faith and will begin

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. Wonderfully Healed

Until my healing, March 5, 1931, I was a constant sufferer from childhood. Naturally very frail and easily injured I have been afflicted and hurt in many ways. I accepted Jesus as my Saviour when I was five. My first healing was at the age of six, when I was healed of bronchial pneumonia after my mother dedicated her baby to God. Soon after entering school I became blind and could not see for over a year. In answer to prayer my sight was restored. My timidity at school kept me from stepping out as I should have for God, notwithstanding my mother's constantly renewed vows and prayers for me.

I had a siege of seventy-nine carbuncles, lasting five months. Seventyfive of them were so serious that they had to be cored out and the bone scraped. Some were in my ear, and the ear drum was punctured in the operation, causing deafness. I lost my voice from bronchial pneumonia, several times, so that had to write most of what I wished to say. I have suf-fered broken wrists and ankles and had ligaments torn from ankles and hips in various accidents. Five months ago my ankle was broken and the ligament was visible. This was healed through prayer. The ligaments torn from my hip resulted in six weeks in the Dallas hospital, six months in bed, and a year on crutches.

In 1920 I had typhoid fever resulting in so closing the bowels that for almost twelve years I lived on liquids and strained foods. When my mother died a rainbow, seen by myself and several others shone around her head, and I knew she had an abundant entrance into the other world, but I rebelled and for three months refused to pray. Then I had a dream of her and in this dream I was reminded of her vows about me and of my promises to keep those vows. Again I stepped out to do personal work as before.

After my father's sudden death rebellion again seized me, and soon I was on my death bed. For about five months I had hemorrhage from the stomach following abscess of the intestines which burst, causing the loss of the lining of the stomach and intestines, the doctors said. The doctors said there was no hope at all for me. I had all preparations made to die, except my soul preparations. I had told my husband good by; my shroud hung in the closet of the room where I lay. At this time a text, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you," appeared on the wall of my room. Prayer for me was offered and I was raised up.

At this time I began having the light on the Holy Ghost Baptism, but I rejected it. In a desolate condition I went to a cottage prayer meeting. told the sister leading the meeting that I could never keep a promise to God, although I meant to; that I didn't have any courage. She explained that I needed the Holy Spirit in my heart and life. However I refused her advice until I and my only sister were both brought to death's door. This sister who had given me the instruction about the Baptism prayed and fasted for me three and a half days. God heard her prayers and broke my stubborn will. I yielded up everything to Him and when I accepted the Baptism with the Holy Spirit I was instantly healed. I felt a strangling in my throat and a green fluid gushed from my mouth and later from my ears, accompanied by a terrible odor. Thus the poison was eliminated from my system. Since then I have been eating anything I care for. My evesight, voice, and hearing are perfectly normal and I am well. I am now twenty-nine years old. (Mrs.) F. N. (Continued from Page Two) trials of life floor Him. And even though the donkey was never ridden before, Jesus sat as a King, unmoved, riding toward the city; for He was near the end of His journey.

Temptations, trials, burdens floor us many times, and we do not stay on the donkey. Some people say that they do not want to ride on an old shaggy donkey (or Pentecost and speaking in tongues, shaking, falling under the power, etc), they want a white horse of popularity, and want the cross out of their lives. We are not white-horse riders. We are donkey riders. We must learn to ride the donkey if we want later to ride a white horse. When I was the pastor in a church, we were having special meetings. I wanted to sing my testimony one night, but the evangelist said it would keep. Well, I got off the donkey. The brother was right. I was wrong. I was off the donkey for half an hour. I have learned that one is safer on the donkey's back than just hanging on to him. There are many more perils when you hang on than when you stay on—getting kicked for example. So folk who are out of victory get kicked the most often—they are always having trouble. The fact is they have taken the wrong position—they hang on instead of riding on. So may God help!

O yes, Jesus stayed right on. He was determined He would not fall off. They tried to make Him king once, but He slipped away from them. It was not His time. He rode on. I read of His being tempted, depressed, desbised, persecuted, smitten, scourged, crucified, forsaken of God and men. The life of Jesus was a life of crosses, a life filled with sorrow and tears. He said, "The foxes have holes, the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of man hath not where to lay His head." He was driven from pillar to post. Oh, what He went through on this earth! His face was marred. He was the man of sorrows, acquainted with grief, but Brother, He was never floored by common circumstances. He lived on top. When He came from the bosom of the Father, He came to this world to be the Redeemer.

It seemed as though the devil got Him down in Gethsemane's garden, when the very life of Jesus seemed to be crushed. No painter can paint that picture of Christ in the agony of Gethsemane, as He wrestles in prayer for a lost and dying world. Already the weight of a hundred thousand million souls was coming down on the breast of the Saviour. He cried, "O God, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me."

Brethren, if ever the devil tried to shake Him, it was then. I do not believe Jesus wanted to be rid of Cal-vary. Some say Jesus was all but ready to give up. Never! When He left the bosom of the Father, He had Calvary as His vision. From His boyhood days to the day He was in Gethsemane with the weight of a thousand million souls pressed upon Him, the vision had not left Him. He sweat as it were great drops of blood. I believe the devil was trying to give Him hemorrhage and tried to bleed Him to death. That would have spent the life. God sent Jesus as a sacrifice for sin. When you or I make a sacrifice, or the priest makes a sacrifice, he does not take his own life, but the life of another. If Jesus' blood was

to be spilt, then Jesus had to be offered at the hands of someone else. If Jesus had died in Gethsemane, hell would have had a jubilee. All the demons in hell would have rejoiced. Thank God Jesus kept His seat! Jesus did not let go. And when His life seemed to be ebbing away, angels came and ministered to Him.

By that time Judas had left Him to Pilate. He was smitten, spat upon. His visage was marred with the spittle and by the blows of those godless, Christless men upon Him. But He kept His seat. One of the soldiers thrust a spear in His side. But the saddest thing of all is when God turns His back on His Son. Why? Because Jesus has taken the sinners' place. He has paid the redemption price of man's soul. Brother, you were so sinful that you could not come to God. God could not look upon sin with the least bit of allowance. There was no daysman, no one to come between you and God. He was angry with sin every day. But Christ with one hand took hold of you and lifted you up and with the other reached up to God and united us and we are reconciled to God by the death of His Son. Thank God that Jesus

went all the way. My Brother, didn't Jesus say, "Follow Me"? Then you will have your trials. "If you suffer with Him you shall also reign with Him." Are you suffering with Him? You say, "I don't like the little animal with the long ears." I know that many people do not like Pentecost. But I want to say that man looks on the outward appearance, but God looks on the heart. When you see people clapping their hands you think something has gone wrong. You ask, "What has gone wrong with them?" Did you ever listen to them from the outside? It does sound funny, but when you come in it sounds different.

The Tabernacle in the wilderness was not beautiful, covered with the ugly badger skin. If you had been a traveler and had just looked upon the outside it would not have interested you greatly. But if you had stopped and had gone up to the tabernacle, and pulled aside the curtain you would have found it beautiful inside. Brother, the religion of Jesus Christ may look "donkeyfied," may look shaggy, but underneath you can discern that Jehovah dwells there; there dwells the

Shekinah and that makes up for the outside. You may not come into Pentecost because of the noises, etc., but I want to tell you that Jesus rode the donkey. You say, "I would rather ride a white horse than a donkey." Sure. I believe there are folks here who would not ride a donkey even if you paid them \$50.00 or \$1 00.00. No, we do not like to have people laugh and make fun of us.

You cannot get rid of humility and the cross life in the religion of Jesus Christ. You may try to become like the nations about you. The Philistines tried to make Samson like other men, and they did, because he told God's secret and so lost his great strength. This made him like other men. When Pentecost becomes like the other churches, she will lose her power. One of these days things will change. We shall not always have people poking fun at us. We'll not always ride the donkey, but a white horse.

Some of our children come home from school and play crying because some of the girls and boys had found that their fathers and mothers went to the Pentecostal church. When I was holding a meeting once in Pennsylvania, someone pointed out a girl to me saying, "Do you see that sixteenyear-old girl?" She was pale and weak looking. "Every time that girl goes home, she gets whipped for coming to church." I exclaimed, "Never!" But she was true to God. The next time I heard about her, she was leading her loved ones to Christ.

Some people say, "I would seek the Baptism, but my wife doesn't like it." What kind of a man are you anyway? You must have a jellyfish backbone. One woman whose husband persecuted her so terribly upon being dragged away from the altar by him, went home and received the Baptism of the Spirit while in bed. We might as well try to hold back the Niagara Falls with a toothpick as to keep the Baptism from falling on a hungry soul.

Things will not always be so! There will be a great change soon. One of these days we shall sing, "I'll exchange my donkey for a white horse." If we know how to ride the donkey down here, we shall be able to say, "Give me grace," and later will be able to ride the "white horse."

"I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True." Who is this man? It is the same Man that rode the donkey. "His eyes were as a flame of fire," (He does not have doves' eyes here; not the eyes that filled with tears over the death of Mary and Martha's brother; the eves that wept over Jerusalem. No. His eyes were not doves' eyes, they are not marked with sadness, they are

eyes of fire.) "And on his head were many crowns,"—not a thorny crown, but many crowns. Thank God. "And He had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself." He is not now rejected as a bastard; no longer is He ridiculed as being a friend of publicans and sinners. No, thank God; never again is He to suffer as the Lamb of God, He is the Lion of the Tribe of Judah now. King of kings, Lord of lords! He is clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and His name is called The Word of God. And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses (no donkeys) clothed in fine linen (not badger skins), white and clean."

O brother, I am glad I am in the donkey train; glad I am taking the reproach connected with Pentecost; glad I have my share of the burdens and trials that come in this life. Why? Because those who followed Him by riding the donkey, will ride white horses. If you cannot ride a donkey, pray tell me how will you ride a nice, big white horse? Learn to ride the donkey first, then you will ride the white horse. If they made the hills ring with their shouts of Hosannas when He rode in the city on a donkey, what will it be when He comes in power and glory with ten thousand of His saints (Oh! the shouts! Oh! the rejoicing?) riding upon white horses? Praise God I want to be there, don't you?

O my friend without God and Christ, get into this train tonight. There is a donkey for you to ride. What is it? The donkey of experience. Experience of the Christian life. God wants you to follow Him. You may not have the friends you have now, but God will give you better friends. I used to have two or three friends, now I have thousands of friends all over the country. Jesus is coming one of these days and you will be glad that you suffered these persecutions and trials. Then He will not be buffeted or spat upon, for He is coming to reign in glory. He is coming to reign over the nations and all will have to confess that He is Christ, to the honor and glory of the Father.

The Testimony of a Russian Jew

By A. R. Kuldell

The writer knew a good deal of the Old Testament in the original by heart before he knew Christ, but because he did not know anything of the New Testament nor of the Christ who is the heart and the light of the Scripture, he had nothing to experience; he had no divine life nor divine light. He had a lantern for his dark path, but no light in it. According to the light that came in later with the Christ, he had to say that if he had died before he knew Christ he would not have felt comfortable in heaven, and he would not have landed there, for he did not want to be where Christ was.

I would never have found Him if He had not found me. Thus the glory is all His. What means did He use? Did He use my experience? I had none to use. I was worse off than a pagan in the jungles of Africa. The latter has no knowledge of Christ at all, nothing good and nothing bad; while my knowledge of Christ was nothing good and all bad. But Christ Himself, through the Holy Spirit in the New Testament, convicted me of sin and of the dire need of a Saviour. Through the same Spirit and the Word of both the New and the Old Testament He convinced me that He is the Saviour I needed, and that by faith in Him I would be a new creation and have the smile of the Omnipotent upon my heart and life. I obeyed; that is, I believed; for faith without works or without obedience is dead, and I experienced a most wonderful conversion, a turning away from the old life to a life hid with Christ in God.

What proved to be the source of my newly found faith and life?

Certainly not my experience, but the Bible. Mark you here, it was the whole Bible, not the Old Testament alone, for I had had that before, and I had got nowhere with it; because, like the Ethiopian eunuch, I had nobody to teach me. The teachers I had from childhood had covered it with lies and human commandments until I, in disgust, left not only the Old Testament, but God Himself as unworthy of the "modern mind." But through the New and the Old Testament I found the Christ, God manifest in the flesh, as my personal Saviour from the guilt of sin, from the penalty of sin, and from the power of sin. Then the face of the Omnipotent did surely shine upon my heart and life. All nature was suffused with glory. My heart was too little to contain all that

my Lord was pouring in, "but I will soon need it," I thought. I knew what was before me. This was fifty years ago in the darkest Russia. My step was, humanly speaking, suicidal. But there was the word of the Saviour: "He that loveth father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me."

Here is another that I soon had a chance to test: "Every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life." The Lord made this promise true in my experience after I followed His directions as Abram of old. He gave me in Germany a hundredfold more than I expected.

This measure of His love has been continued to me for over fifty years. Here are a few points to be better remembered in connection with this testimony.

1. The witness has not this testimony from heresay, but acquired it at the risk of his very life.

2. His testimony is this, that the Bible of the Old and New Testaments is the very Word of God and that Christ is the very Son of God. Through the Bible of both Testaments I learned to know and passionately to love the Christ, and through Christ I learned to know and love the Bible as a divine revelation of my own poor heart and of the precious, loving heart of the Triune God in Heaven.

3. I have found that my wonderful experiences of His grace and help and power in half a century would never have been possible if I had not accepted the Bible as a divinely inspired Book, and Christ as my precious Saviour, who through the Holy Spirit saves, and keeps, and sanctifies, and comforts, and enables us to do and to suffer and to triumph in "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us."

A living faith is bound to have a glorious experience. A dead faith or no faith will have no experience. A blessed experience, then, has for its foundation a divinely inspired Bible and a Christ accepted as a personal Saviour from sin and shame.

Pronounced Dead but Healed

After working hard all day January 4, 1930, I took violently ill. We called the doctor, and the next morning another doctor was called in consulation. They agreed that there must be an operation but we would not consent to that. On March 8 I got much worse and again called the doctor who said I had pneumonia. They took me to the hospital and put a drain tube in my side to draw off the pus that was on my lungs. That night the tube came out and the pus ran over my heart. I became unconscious and when my husband arrived they were trying to bring me to with artificial air. My husband called Brother Earl E. Bond, the pastor of the Assembly of God in Ashland, Ohio. He stood at the foot of my bed calling on God to undertake for me. The nurse pulled the sheet up over my head and called my husband out to tell him that he had as well pay the expenses and send for the the undertaker as I had been dead for practically two hours. But God heard Brother Bond's prayers and raised me up right there in the hospital. Eight days later my husband took me home in an ambulance. I was still confined to my bed. On March 28 I gave birth to a stillborn child. On May 29 the doctor made his last call and again gave me up to die, saying there was no use of his trying fur-ther as he could do no more. That That made eight doctors who had given me up to die. On May 30 I got up for a little while, trusting and looking to Jesus for full deliverance. By July I was able to ride in a car and got weighed. I weighed only 130 pounds although before I took sick I weighed 238 pounds. I continued to trust God, improving steadily until I was sound and well. May 16, 1931, I weighed 236 pounds. Mrs. Ralph Stoler, Route 9, Ashland, Ohio.

"And When They Had Prayed"

Arthur H. Graves

Most of the people described in the John, how they want a place ahead of Bible as getting things from the Lord did so while they were praying or because they prayed. It is true that the Lord appeared to Moses as he was on his way to work one morning, and that He called Samuel after he had gone to bed, and that He appeared to Saul of Tarsus at noon on the road to Damascus, but we can add up such a large number of cases of people who got what they got from the Lord while they prayed or because they prayed, that we may accept that way as the rule. And perhaps an examination of the cases where the Lord appeared or spoke to people voluntarily (outside of the Word of God which they had in common with others) will show that these people were not in a position to get these things from God through prayer, for one reason or another

And the matter of getting God's will done for us does not depend entirely upon our ability to know what to pray for. That is, we need not wait for a complete knowledge of God's will in order to get what we need. Paul acknowledged that we know not what to pray for as we ought (that word "ought" is interesting here), and that the Spirit helps our infirmities along this line, making intercession for us according to the will of God, far beyond our understanding or conception of that will. A risk we run of not having our prayers answered is the why of our praying, that is the use we will make of the answer we get. See James on this point.

With these thoughts in mind notice the strange contents of the Lord's Prayer. It does not contain a specific word about others, except that we are entitled to state that they have transgressed against us, but we then have to state that we have forgiven them for it. The only part of the Lord's Prayer that includes others is the re-quest, "Thy will be done." And pos-sibly, "Thy kingdom come." We can be very specific in going after the supply of our own needs. We need daily bread, forgiveness, shielding from temptation, deliverance from evil; but no provision is made for explaining to the Lord, the other man's condition and shortcomings. According to the way we often feel, the disciples would have prayed:

"Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done. But, O Lord, Thou seest Brother James and Brother everybody else, and Thou seest what a wrong spirit they have in wanting to call down fire from heaven upon people. And there is Brother Thomas who will not believe as he should. And there is Brother Peter who always has so much to say but who fails when the real test comes. And there is Brother Judas who is dishonest with the Lord's money and is thinking of betraying Jesus into the hands of His enemies. O Lord, how can Thy kingdom come, how can Thy will be done with things as they are? Those are some of the outstanding cases right on the inside."

But the only thing we may pray about the whole situation is "Thy will be done." And when God's will was done in the lives of the disciples, every one of these "awful conditions" was taken care of. The one who would not yield to God was taken out of the way. And all the rest were filled with the Holy Ghost and made all over new. But the job of the true disciple is to get busy on every detail of his own need before the Lord. No comb has teeth too fine to be used here.
