Partaking of the Resurrection Life of Christ

In the days of Elisha there was a woman at Shunem who was kindly disposed towards him and provided him a prophet's chamber. Though hitherto barren, this woman was given a child by the Lord. Then came a day when the child now grown, sickened and died. The woman, who had faith in the prophet and the prophet's God, laid the dead boy on the prophet's bed in that special chamber. Then she hastened for the prophet, and as she set forth she declared in faith, "It shall be well!"

The prophet made his way to chamber and there he prayed unto the Lord. It was written in the law, "Command the children of Israel, that they put out of the camp every leper . . . and whosoever is defiled by the dead" (Num. 5:2); but notwithstanding the fact that he would be counted defiled by touching that dead body, the prophet put his mouth down on the dead child's mouth, his eyes upon the dead child's eyes, his hands upon the dead child's hands, and stretched himself upon the child. The cold flesh of the child waxed warm. He opened his eyes and was given alive unto his mother

Elihu, describing one whose "soul draweth near unto the grave, and his life to the destroyers," says: "Lo, all these things worketh God oftentimes with man." Children of God, born of a supernatural birth, are brought near to the grave. Said the apostle Paul, "For we which live are alway delivered unto death." But there is a Prophet, a greater than Elisha, to whom appeal can be made with the assurance, "It shall

be well." He has no fear of being cast "without the camp," although that was His lot when He became a curse for those for whom He died. He imparts His resurrection life, breathing His breath into our mouths, putting His light into our eyes, causing His life to come into our hands, imparting the fire of His holy presence, "that the life also of Jesus"—the Prophet greater than Elisha—"might be made manifest in our mortal flesh." 2 Cor. 4:11. What is our experience? "Always delivered unto death"? Yes. "Always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus"?

Easter

'Tis the spring of souls today;
Christ hath burst his prison.
And from three days' sleep in death
As a sun hath risen;
All the winter of our sins,
Long and dark, is flying
From his light, to whom we give
Laud and praise undying.

Yes. Letting the old life—the old Adam life—go down to death, in order that a new life, the life of the resurrected Lord, might be imparted instead—"that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body." 2 Cor. 4:10.

King Hezekiah was sick and received the sentence of death. "Thus saith the Lord, Set thine house in order; for thou shalt die, and not live." The king declared, "I am deprived of the residue of my years . . . O Lord, I am oppressed; undertake for me . . . but thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption."

Had the king been meditating on the gospel that Elihu brought to Job? "Deliver him from going down to the pit: I have found a ransom!" Job 33:24. The word of the Lord came to the prophet Isaiah, "Thus saith the Lord, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold, I will heal thee: on the third day (the day of resurrection, Matt. 16:21) thou shalt go up unto the house of the Lord."

The sentence of death on the old life, but a new life imparted! This was also the experience of the apostle Paul who declared, "We had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves (no confidence in the flesh, the life of the old Adam), but in God which raiseth the dead." If the Spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal body by His Spirit that dwelleth in you!

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How a Jew Found Christ on Easter Sunday

When Evangelist Watson Argue was holding a campaign in Tulsa, Okla., he preached on Easter Sunday on the Resurrection. The power of God fell while he was preaching, and that sermon was never finished. In the audience was a Jew, a newspaper photographer, the authorized representative of the biggest newspaper syndicate in America, who yielded his life to the Lord Jesus. He sends us his story which we print in an abridged form. The full story appeared in two issues of The Latter Rain Evangel (12 cents per copy), 18 West 74th St., Chicago, Ill.



My dear mother and father, who have both passed away, were well learned in the Orthodox Jewish faith. They were deeply religious, tried to keep all the commandments and taught their children to live as Orthodox Jews. We observed all the big Jewish holidays, and were taught not to write, ride on the street car or even touch money on Saturdays, but to go to the synagogue. We were also limited to certain foods on the Jewish Sabbath.

I truly loved my parents and was very proud of them, but I could not enjoy these religious observances in which they asked me to participate. As a boy I was taught the Jewish language by a Rabbi; my parents spent many dollars on me for this purpose.

At the age of thirteen I became a fullfledged Jew. I had a wonderful Balmitz-va in a large synagogue. A great crowd was present and father spent hundreds of dollars on a big feast. The years passed by. Once I went to a dance and met a beautiful girl who later became my wife. She was a Gentile and for a year I was deathly afraid to let my father know I had married a Gentile. One day, with trembling fingers I summoned courage to write him, but I knew, beyond words to express that my father was broken-hearted because I did not marry a Jewess. When we became the happy parents of a baby girl I wrote my father again, but did not hear from him until our baby was three years old. Finally he wrote me saying he could stay away no longer, and came to Tulsa, Oklahoma, from St. Louis, Mo., to see our little family. Although his heart was torn, he came, and as he held the little baby in his arms there was a sad expression on his face.

As we sat at the table to partake of the food, our baby daughter asked the blessing over the food, and he cried like a baby when he heard this child ask God to bless the food. He could scarcely believe his ears to hear her, and he wept for joy to hear his very own grand-child, who had a Gentile mother, thanking God for the food. At night when the baby was ready for bed, she would get upon her knees and bow her head and ask God to watch over her. It made my

father very happy to realize that this Gentile girl was doing all this. He knew I had drifted away from God and even though he believed it was wrong for me to marry a Gentile girl, he learned to love her.

For three years my wife attended the big Christian churches without me, and when she would discuss Christ to me I would become very furious. I called my little baby aside and told her not to say "Jesus Christ" but to say "God." If we invited Jewish people to dinner I would be deathly afraid that she might use the word "Christ" in her prayer.

I had many friends in the business world through the fact that I was the official representative of two of the largest news syndicates in America, and I was also the manager of the photographic department of *The Tulsa Daily World*. Realizing that it was necessary to keep up with the people with whom I did business, I decided that I had better start going to church, which I did, attending one of the big, influential churches. I went every Sunday, but I never got any more out of going to the big churches than I did going to a Jewish synagogue.

My wife and I went to shows, dances, night clubs, horse-races, and the like. We bet on horse-races and also bet on dogs at the dog-races. We attended card parties and also went to plays at the big churches, as well as banquets and dances. We got along fine—were good scouts among our church friends. My wife still said her prayers, and I didn't quarrel with her because her actions in going to church were no different from going to worldly amusements.

When our daughter was old enough to start to school we moved to an apartment that was just a half block from the school, and next to our apartment lived a woman who attended a Pentecostal Church. One day on invitation my wife went to church with her. A very short time after that I noticed a great change come over her. Never in my life did I see such a change in anyone. She was as different as night is from day. She had no desire to attend shows, dances, wrestling matches, or anything of the kind, and to top it all

she discontinued wearing any make-up on her face. Finally I asked her what this all meant and she told me that she had truly found God at that Pentecostal church, that the things she had been doing were sinful in the sight of God, and that she now realized that true love for Jesus had to do with the heart and not with outward actions only, and that she was determined to please God and not men.

One night my wife went to church and I stayed home with the baby. At 9:30 she had not yet come home. So I lay down on the bed and fell asleep. I awoke and found it was 12:30 a. m., and my wife still not at home. I called up the church on the phone and asked for Mrs. Lee Krupnick. They called her to the phone and she talked to me in a peculiar tongue. I could not understand what she was saying. I screamed out, "What is the matter with you? Are you crazy? Get on home as quickly as you can. If I have to come down there I'll split that preacher's head in two. I'll bust that church to pieces." My wife came home in a few minutes and said she had received the Baptism with the Holy Ghost. I said, "What in the world are you talking about?" She didn't answer, but went to bed.

Matters became pretty bad at our home. I didn't know what to do. My wife wouldn't go anywhere with me. I went to a show or a dance and she went to church. She said, "Honey, you can go to the shows, the dances and the ball games if you want to, although I wish you wouldn't, but I shall continue to go to church. I would not give up Jesus for all the worldly pleasures and all the world's riches." I told her I would go to any church she would name excepting "that kind (Pentecostal) of church," but she said she would never go to any other church.

I asked advice of my friends at the newspaper office and they told me I should watch out, for my wife was getting "too much religion." I was frantic and knew not which way to turn. I hated that Pentecostal church with a furious hatred. One night when I went home I started quarreling with

my wife and told her that my friends said her church was fanatical, and that I would leave her and take the baby with me. She said, "Honey, I love you dearly, but I love Jesus more than I love you. He is first in my heart." I said, "Well, let Jesus support you from now on." She said, "He is able to do so and will take care of me. Jesus never fails." So I packed up and left, thinking my wife would run after me, but to my surprise she didn't. I returned because I loved her and the baby. I could not stay away from them.

A few nights later my little girl said, "Daddy, mother had the people pray for you to be saved." I flared up again at my wife, saying, "What do you mean by 'saved'? There isn't anything wrong with me. I pay my bills. I don't talk about anyone. I attend to my own You had better get some of business. those people at that church saved, and tell them to quit worrying about me." And so I raved on. She said, "Honey, you've got to be saved—you must be born again." That was too much for me. I yelled, "Bonnie Jean, you've gone crazy. Anyone so silly as to tell me to be born again! How can I be born again?" She said, "By giving your heart to Jesus and confessing your sins to Him. Jesus will cleanse you of your sins with His precious blood. He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life." I said to her, "You want me to give my heart to a dead Jew? That man has been dead for 1900 years." Then she said, "Jesus arose from the dead and is alive forevermore, and sits on the right hand of God. The only way you can enter heaven is through the Lord Jesus Christ." I screamed out, "Don't you dare to mention the word 'Jesus' to me again," and with that I left the house.

One Sunday morning we were in the car driving down town. Noticing that it was time for Sunday School I asked her to go to an influential church with me but she refused, saying, "No church but the Pentecostal Church for me." I became so angry because she refused to go to any other church that I stopped my car right down town, got out and left. My fury knew no bounds.

About midnight I made up my mind I would not let those fanatical, religious people at that Pentecostal Church destroy my home, and I went home, finding my wife and baby there. The first thing I did was to start persecuting my wife. I hollowed so loud it woke the baby, and my wife asked me to lower my voice so as not to disturb the neighbors. I yelled out, "D—— the neighbors and everybody that goes to your crazy church. You are crazy yourself. You are losing your mind. Do you think I want my friends to tell me that my wife has gone crazy? Do you think for one minute that God put us to live

on this earth and not to go to shows, dances, ball-games, or have any good times together? Why Bonnie Jean, you know you are losing your mind! God doesn't mean us to stay on this earth and never have any pleasure."

Never a word from my wife during all this explosion. I was like a raving maniac, walking from one room to another yelling louder and louder, not caring who heard me. I felt I was about to explode. I was determined to stop her from going to that church by some means or other, but the thing that angered me more than anything else was the fact that my wife would not say a word. I would have given anything had she talked back, but she only wept. When I finally quieted down and she could endure no more she said, "Honey, go ahead and condemn me, persecute me and say what you want about me. My Lord Jesus Christ stood persecution far more severe than this, and if Jesus could stand it I surely can.'

Something seemed to have touched the very depth of my heart with that statement, made from a heart that was broken with grief. I shall never, never forget the look in her tear-streamed eyes as she looked at me, and I could not help but notice a wonderful light on her face, and she looked more beautiful than I had ever seen anyone look in my life. I left the house and walked around, but the words spoken by my wife kept ringing over and over again in my heart, "If Jesus could stand it, surely I can." When I returned to the house I found that that awful hatred had left me. The baby was still awake and I asked her where mother was. She replied, "Mother's in the bath-room praying for you, Daddy dear." I went to bed.

A few days later my wife told me there was an evangelist named Watson Argue who, with his wife, was about to hold a revival at their church. She asked me if I would go. I don't know why, but



I went and sat on the very last row. This evangelist made a pretty good talk about Jesus, and from then on whenever I heard the word "Jesus" the words my wife uttered kept coming to me, "If Jesus could stand persecution surely I can."

I went a few more times and everybody at the church seemed so kind and congenial. The more I went the closer to the front I sat. I noticed after the altar call the people went to the front and knelt down, some praying in a loud voice. They seemed to pray with such feeling and while to me they didn't have much for which to thank God, they praised Him with great sincerity.

One day I was in town and I passed by an art store that had the most beautiful picture of Jesus with some children. I went in to buy the picture and happened on to a Jewish friend of mine who was making a purchase of some scenic picture. When I saw him I became embarrassed, for I didn't want him to know that I wanted a picture of Jesus. Then, too, it came to me, "How can you bring a picture of Jesus into your house?"

A few days later I passed by that art store again, and there was the picture of Jesus still in the window. I could not take my eyes from it, and when I tried to move I could not. There was something in that face, the light around His head, that held me spellbound. Suddenly walked straight into the store and bought it. I wanted to surprise my wife and called up the house. Finding her out I took the picture and riding out to the home I hung it in the living room. Just as I finished hanging it I heard her coming in. When I opened the door she couldn't help but see that wonderful picture of Jesus hanging on the wall. She stood there speechless; then she started laughing and crying, threw her arms around me and wept for joy, that I, of all people in the world, should bring Jesus' picture into the home!

I went to church every night, but I told the pastor and people that I didn't want anyone to "sell me religion." When I was ready I would give my heart to the Lord. The revival meeting was drawing to a close and I was almost on the front row, and by Easter Sunday I was sitting on the very front row. The Evangelist preached on the Resurrection. Suddenly I seemed to be getting what I thought was a terrific chill, yet it was very hot outside. It was a beautiful Easter morning. While the Evangelist was talking I began to quiver and cry, and the words kept ringing in my heart, "If Jesus could stand it, sure-ly I can." Suddenly someone touched me on the shoulder, the dear pastor of the church, Brother Owens, who said, "Won't you come?"

It was in a little wood in early morning. The sun was climbing behind a steep cliff in the east, and its light was flooding nearer and nearer and then making pools among the trees. Suddenly, from a dark corner of purple brown stems and tawny moss, there shone out a great golden star. It was just a dandelion, and half withered—but it was full face to the sun, and had caught into its heart all the glory it could hold, and was shining so radiantly that the dew that lay on it still made a perfect aureole round its head. And it seemed to talk, standing there—to talk about the possibility of making the very best of these lives of ours.

For if the Sun of Righteousness has risen upon our hearts, there is an ocean of grace and love and power lying all around us, an ocean to which all earthly light is but a drop, and it is ready to transfigure us, as the sunshine transfigured the dandelion, and on the same condition—that we stand full face to God

Gathered up, focussed lives, intent on one aim—Christ—these are the lives on which God can concentrate blessedness. It is "all for all" by a law as unvarying as any law that governs the material universe.

We see the principle shadowed in the trend of science; the telephone and the wireless in the realm of sound, the use of radium and the ultra violet rays in the realm of light. All these work by gathering into focus currents and waves that, dispersed, cannot serve us. In every branch of learning and workmanship the tendency of these days is to specialize—to take up one point and follow it to the uttermost.

And Satan knows well the power of concentration; if a soul is likely to get under the sway of the inspiration, "this one thing I do," he will turn all his energies to bring in side-interests that will shatter the gathering intensity.

And they lie all around, these interests. Never has it been so easy to live in half a dozen worlds at onceart, music, social science, games, motoring, the following of some profession, and so on. And between them we run the risk of drifting about, the "good" hiding the "best" even more effectually than it could be hidden by downright frivolity with its smothered heartache at its own emptiness.

It is easy to find out whether our lives are focussed, and if so, where the focus lies. Where do our thoughts settle when consciousness comes back in the morning? Where do they swing back when the pressure is off during the day? Does this test not give the clue? Then dare to have it out with God—and after all, that is the shortest way. Dare to lay bare your whole life and being before Him, and ask Him to show you whether or not all is focussed on Christ and His glory. Dare to face the fact that unfocussed, good and useful as it may seem, it will prove to have failed of its purpose.

What does this focussing mean? Study the matter and you will see that it means two things—gathering in all that can be gathered, and letting the rest drop. The working of any lens—microscope, telescope, camera—will show you this; the lens of your own eye, in the room where you are sitting, as clearly as any other. Look at the window bars, and the beyond is only a shadow; look through at the distance, and it is the bars that turn into ghosts. You have to choose which you will fix your gaze upon and let the other go.

Are we ready for a cleavage to be wrought through the whole range of our lives, like the division long ago at the taking of Jericho, the division between things that could be passed through the fire of consecration into "the treasury of the Lord," and the things that, unable to "abide the fire," must be destroyed? All aims, all amibitions, all desires, all pursuits—shall we dare to drop them if they cannot be gathered sharply and clearly into the focus of "this one thing I do"?

Will it not make life narrow, this focussing? In a sense, it will—just as the mountain path grows narrower, for it matters more and more, the higher we go, where we set our feet—but there is always, as it narrows, a wider and wider outlook, and purer, clearer air. Narrow as Christ's life was narrow, this is our aim; narrow as regards self-seeking, broad as the love of God to all around. Is there anything to fear in that?

And in the narrowing and focussing, the channel will be prepared for God's power—like the stream hemmed between the rock-beds, that wells up in a spring—like the burning glass that gathers the rays into an intensity that will kindle fire. It is worth while to let God see what He can do with these lives of ours, when "to live is Christ."

How do we bring things to a focus in the world of optics? Not by looking at the things to be dropped, but by looking at the one point that is to be brought

Turn full your soul's vision to Jesus, and look and look at Him, and a strange dimness will come over all that is apart from Him. For "He is worthy" to have all there is to be had in the heart that He has died to win.

All I could see, all I could feel in my heart was Jesus, taking me The most wonderful into His bosom. love that a human being could ever have was the wonderful love that Jesus gave to me when He came into my heart that Easter morning as I knelt at the altar in that Pentecostal church! I was truly born again and so full of joy and love I could not contain myself. I then realized why my wife went to the Pente-costal Church at Fifth and Peoria, in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

A few weeks after I was saved I had a great desire to read the Bible, in order to know more about Jesus. I read as I never had read before and I learned to love the Author of the Book. I read every chance I had, morning, noon

to suffer persecution, because the way is a narrow way, but thank God they have power with Him.

A Christian worker who knows a good deal of the inworking of the resurrection life of the Lord became sick. The next day I went to my desk quite fresh in mind and body, and God began to pour His life through."

And just as Ezekiel saw the river of the Spirit flowing forth from the sanctuary in an ever deepening flow, so John saw a like stream, "a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb." He heard the word go forth, the same word practically as he heard Jesus give to the thirsty ones on that last day of the feast of the tabernacles (John 7:37-39), "Let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely." Even now we can come and partake of this wonderful water of the Spirit, the Spirit of the resurrected Lamb, and receiving of this wonderful stream we shall have new life, new strength, new inspiration. As we drink we shall be enabled to walk in newness of life. This wonderful water of life is available even now, without money and without price, and it is free to "every one that thirsteth." Let us come and drink and drink and drink, drinking constantly and deeply of the blessed Spirit of God. It is the Master Himself who bids us, "Take!"

THE BIBLE IN SIBERIA

Alliance Weekly informs us that "the National Bible Society of Scotland circulated last year 27,452 Bibles, Testaments, and portions among the Russians in the far east of China. Five thousand of these have been passed over the frontier into Soviet Siberia, where they were being eagerly read by many Russians who had hitherto been deprived of all Scriptures. The Society reports that there are definite signs that great numbers of Russians are increasingly anxious to read the Word of God, and there are movements in the direction of a spiritual revival among thousands."

AT WIT'S END CORNER

Writes Arthur Brisbane, noted journalist: "After the Convention, another election, then what? Suppose November, 1936, finds us still in the doldrums. Millions idle, billions of dollars pouring out, the dollar growing thinner and thinner, 'share-the-wealth' yelling louder and louder, and the poor 'best minds,' knocked off their security pedestal in 1929, still asking 'What did happen to us?' If you cannot restore prosperity or provide work for the idle by running up a national debt of thirty-five billions, financing with limitless billions every new theory, how can you restore it?"

PALESTINE INDUSTRY

Says The Jewish Hope: "The remarkable increase in the number of industrial undertakings which now number 3,132, and the sharp rise in exports of Jewish products are the best indices of the healthy growth of Jewish industry in Palestine. The recent Jewish industry in Palestine. Tel Aviv Fair demonstrated that Palestine is becoming an outstanding factor in the commerce of the Near East, producing practically everything that was formerly sold by Western nations. Whether it be wine, cement, stockings, envelopes, iron, or cotton goods, all are found on the list of exports. The Dead Sea enterprise now in its third year, is already shipping 10,000 tons of potash products, in addition to other by-products."

AN INEVITABLE CONFLICT

The following news item gives a foregleam of the coming clash between church and state. "For forbidding his confirmation class to make the Hitler salute in his presence, and for ending a prayer with the words, 'God protect the poor persecuted people of the Jews,' George Alttheus, an Evangelical pastor, has been sentenced by the Brunswick Special Tribunal to six months' imprisonment."

"THE LANGUAGE OF CANAAN." (Is. 19:18)

Revelation informs us that "In the year 1935, which was the year 5695 of the Jewish calendar, 800 volumes were printer in the Hebrew tongue, 501 in Palestine and 299 out of Palestine. Of these, 190 were school books, 104 works on science, 145 on religion, 140 books for children and young people, 9 works of biography, only 31 novels and but 36 translations from other languages; 71 works were on literary criticism, and 74 on miscellaneous subjects."



Is it Scriptural to pray for the healing of unsaved persons?

We believe so. There is no record that Jesus prayed only for those who were saved. Also healing is given as one of the signs that shall follow them that believe. This would indicate that healing might be a convincing testimony to Christ. It is said concerning Philip's ministry at Samaria that the people gave heed unto those things which Philip spake, "hearing and seeing the miracles which he did." Acts 8:6. Also in the ministry of Paul God wrought special miracles so that from his body were taken handkerchiefs and aprons and sicknesses left and evil spirits were cast out. Acts 19:11, 12. Among those who received these benefits there must have been many who before had known nothing about Christ. Signs to confirm the Word may bring healing to saved or unsaved. The ordinary method recommended by God for the Church is found in James 5: 14-16.

Is there any Scripture for teaching that the Roman Empire will be restored?

The Scriptures picture the Roman Empire under the symbol of ten toes (Dan. 2:33, 42), and under the symbol of ten horns. Dan. 7:7. These verses indicate that the territory of the ancient Roman Empire will be united into a ten kingdom confederacy. Then there will arise a "little horn" (Dan. 7:8), which is generally believed to be the Beast or Antichrist. This person is also spoken of as "the Prince," (Dan. 9:26) who will make a covenant with Israel which will be broken bringing on "the great tribulation." The Scriptures indicate that the Antichrist and the Great Tribulation will not come until after the ten nation confederacy, embracing the territory formerly occupied by the Roman Empire, is re-established .- E. S. W.

LAODICEAN CONDITIONS (Rev. 3:17)

When a church grows strong politically she weakens spiritually. Writes one Roman Catholic: "Never have I felt so disappointed with the great Church to which I belong as during the past few months. Italy, home of the Catholic religion, has launched a fiendish attack upon Ethiopia, has broken the peace of the world, and violated all the laws of war. Yet Roman Catholicism makes no protest. Our Church has lost heavily in prestige. She is enormously rich and powerful; she is the only Yet she is afraid to protest. Afraid of what? Persecution? Then why put the Cross at the center of her standard?"

MAKING A GOD OF GOVERNMENT

According to the Manchester Guardian German law will be administered not only according to generally accepted standards, but according as to whether a person's conduct is for or against the ideals of the German State. In other words, a person may be guiltless according to the written law, but if the judge decides that his conduct is contrary to the spirit of the present German government, then the man is condemned. In other words the State is making itself a god and woe to him who offends this national god! That will be the political doctrine of Antichrist. (2 Thess. 2:4; Rev. 13:4) who will claim worship as the symbol and embodiment of the State.

BELIEF IN A LIE

"The belief in a lie can be not only passionately intense, but it will be the actual punishment for the awful crime of the refusal of God's truth (2 Thess. 2:11)," comments Panton in the Sunday School Times. "'Present-day Russia,' writes an authority on the subject, W. H. Chamberlin, 'can never be understood, except on the ground that its rulers are dominated by an intense, burning faith in the rightness of their ultimate goal which gives them a feeling of entire selfrighteousness in applying any means, however ruthless, in order to reach this goal. It is just in Russia, which rejects and condemns all the familiar forms of religion, that one finds one of the strongest organized faiths in the world' (Russia's Iron Age, p. 16). It is estimated that the Soviets have put to death 11,726,746, or two million more than the total killed in the World War."

NO RELIGIOUS HUNGER

Jewish Missionary Intelligencer informs us that "The type of Jewish inhabitants is rapidly changing. In olden days most Jews in Palestine were religiously orthodox, poor in this world's goods, only slightly educated according to western standards. Today the Jewish immigrants have largely thrown over the observances of external Judaism. They are self-reliant and pride themselves on being self-supporting and independent, and their emotional nature finds at any rate a temporary satisfaction in the nationalistic ideals of Zionism, and feels little need of religious observances. During the last two years a different type of Jewish immigrant has been entering the land from Germany, and includes a large proportion of professional men, and some even of the very greatest leaders of the world's thought. Indeed, the staff of the Jewish University at Jerusalem can quite hold its own in comparison with the staff of any university in the world."

The Sinday School Tesson

Jesus Triumphs Over Death (Easter Lesson)

Lesson for April 12. Lesson Text: Luke 24:1-35.

I. CHRIST IS RISEN

The Early Visitors. The women came very early in the morning to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus, but they were too late. However there had been one woman who was not too late. That was Mary of Bethany, and wherever the gospel is preached we tell of her loving act in anointing the body of Jesus before His burial. Mary had taken time to sit at the feet of Jesus to learn of Him. Time spent sitting at His feet and learning of Him is never wasted time. Mary seems to have been the only one who fully realized beforehand the death that Jesus was about to die. They carried their heavy burden of spices to the tomb, but all in vain. What fruitless and vain tasks we may give ourselves if we are lacking in understanding of the will of God. How we need to pray the petition that is repeated five times in Psalm 119, "Give me understanding!"

The Removed Stone. On the road they had questioned. "Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulchre? -For it was "very great." But they found there had been a very great earthquake and an angel of the Lord had descended from heaven and rolled back the stonenot to let Jesus out, but to let the women and the disciples into the empty tomb. We are often troubled with the thought of what is ahead, but our God has millions of angels in His service to remove all the great stones before we get to them. Many can testify, "My worst troubles were the ones that never came!" And even if there are troubles ahead, "He goeth before" and by His grace will turn every trial into a triumph.


The Empty Tomb. They entered the sepulchre only to find it empty. Then came the word of the two men from the heavenly world, "Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen!" Thank God, we have a living Saviour, one who can declare, "I am he that liveth, and was dead; and behold I am alive for evermore." He lives! Let this glorious truth sink deep into your heart. In the early church they greeted one another with the words, "Christ is risen indeed!" In the early days of Pentecost I was much associated with one who later laid down his life for the Master in China who would always greet me with the words, "Jesus lives!" and my response would be "Jesus reigns!" We can all know the joyous reality of His living and reigning in our hearts.

A Living Guide. Said a missionary in Turkey to some Mohammedans, "When traveling, I find a road branching into two ways; I find two guides, one a live one and one dead. To whom shall I look for direction?" "To the living," was the reply. "Then," said the missionary, "why look to Mohammed who is dead, instead of to Christ who is alive?"

II. CHRIST IS RISEN INDEED

The Call to Remembrance. The celestial visitors reminded the women of the words of the Master: "The Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected of the elders and chief piests and scribes, and be slain, and be raised the third day." Luke 9:22. And it was only then that "they remembered his words." How well we deserve the rebuke that Jesus gave to the two on the road to Emmaus who seemed loth to believe the testimony of the women who told them that they had seen a vision of angels who said He was alive, "O fools, and slow of heart to believe!" Handel's "Messiah" was being rehearsed, and the soloist sang "I know that my Redeemer liveth" with perfect technique but with little expression. The conductor asked, "Do you really believe that?" "Yes," said the solo-"Then sing it so that those who hear can know the joy and power of it," said the conductor. Let us tell out the truth that Jesus lives so that others may know the blessedness and power of it.

Witnesses. The women departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy. And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, "All hail" (or literally, Oh, joy!). "And they came and held Him by the feet, and worshipped Him." They told the disciples what they had seen and heard, but their story seemed only as "idle tales," and they "believed them Does this attitude of heart please the dear Lord? No. We learn from Mark's Gospel that it must have grieved Him, for He "upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they believed not them which had seen him after he was risen." At times we make excuses for our unbelief. Back of this unbelief there may be "hardness of heart," and we need to come to God for deliverance from what the Holy Spirit calls "an evil heart of unbelief."




Thank God, one of the New Covenant promises is that He will take the stony heart out of us and give us a heart of flesh. Eze, 36:26.

An Apostolic Race. We read, "Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre." John, or as he modestly puts it, "the other disciple, whom Jesus loved," and Peter ran both together, and "the other disciple did outrun Peter." "And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying... and the napkin... and he saw, and believed." What did he see? The risen Lord had left the things of earth behind, and there was something in those linen clothes "wrapped together" that spoke eloquently the fact that no thief had broken through and stolen the body, but that God had raised Him from the dead, that He was "clothed upon" with the heavenly apparel such as John later saw upon Him in glory. The living Christ needs no graveclothes of earth.

The Message to Us. We see in Paul's epistles that the death of Christ was our death too; that our "old man" was crucifield with Him. We are told to reckon it so. Rom. 6:11. His burial was our burial, and when we go through the waters of baptism it is just the picture of our having been buried with Him. His resurrection was our resurrection, and "like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Paul tells us, and we should testify just the same as he did, "I am (literally, have been) crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."

The secret of a victorious Christian life. The risen, living Son of God dwelling in our hearts will be unto us all that we can ever require. Say it again and again, "Yet not Yet not I! Yet not I! That sinful 'I' was crucified at Calvary. Forever I am through with that hateful, vile wretch. But now Christ liveth in me! Christ lives in me! Christ lives in me! From now on, for me to live is Christ, Christ! Henceforth not my will, not my way, not my works, not my words, not my thoughts, but His!' Thus will His word of promise be fulfilled in our lives, "I will come to you. . . . If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.' Branches dwelling in this heavenly Vine. His the life! When we abide in Him, and He in us, we shall-we cannot but-bear much fruit for the glory of the Father. —S. H. F.

"Death is swallowed up in victory." 1 Cor. 15:54.

Next to our Lord Jesus Christ probably no man who walked this earth knew the secret of victory better than the Apostle Paul. He knew the way of death, through union with his Lord Jesus Christ. He knew the way of life, for the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus thrilled and pulsed through his whole being, physical, mental, and spiritual. He knew, too, the way of consecration, for he was Jesus Christ's bondslave in an utter abandonment of devotion and obedience. He knew, too, the way of practical cleansing from the daily practice of sin, for the vision of the risen Christ in all His holiness was like a consuming fire in the purging of sin from his walk and life. But as he reaches this mountain peak of the resurrection victory he is like a man who has scaled the loftiest summit of vision, and whose face is radiant with the fore-gleams of coming glory. For with all his wondrous experience of victory, yet the sentence upon his mortal body is "the body is dead be-cause of sin." But now he sees the coming triumph over the death itself which is stamped upon these mortal bodies. It is the resurrection vision which now enthralls him. It is the resurrection shout of victory which breaks from his jubilant lips as he cries out, "Death is swallowed up in

The Pledge of the Resurrection

Many years ago we were traveling through a Southern State. Our train pulled by a great peach orchard. In it were one hundred thousand trees. Each individual tree was robed in the glory and splendor of its pink and white bloom. As the train slowly wheeled past the great orchard the south wind which blew into the car windows was heavily laden with the rich perfume of the vast orchard of peach trees. Suppose you had stood at the same spot in the dead of winter, a couple of months before. Those peach trees were all there in the same place, but how different. There was not a sign of life, nor bloom, nor beauty. There they were stretching their dead, bare, leafless limbs toward the winter sky as though in mute appeal for the life, beauty, and blossom to come, of which

there was yet no sign. Suppose as you bent over those peach trees you were to whisper to them, "Peach trees, as you stand there so dead, and dry, and bloomless, what is your hope that you will some bright day be clothed with the splendor and glory of the spring blossom time?" If those peach trees could answer you, they would call as with one voice, "The peach life in us is our hope of glory.'

Just so Paul tells the Colossians he has wonderful mystery to reveal to them. It is a mystery which God had never before revealed; a mystery which was not made known to the prophets of old; a mystery which was the most wondrous truth that the great apostle could pass on to these children of God; it was Christ in you the hope of Glory." Col. 1:27.

That Christ who had come into them at regeneration; that same Christ would in the resurrection moment be their glorification. For He Himself had said it while He walked the earth. Not "I will some day bring you the resurrection"; not "I am the power of that resurrection"; but "I Am the Resurrection and the Life."

And that same life of Christ within us will, in the striking figure of the prophetic Word, "swallow up" death. 1 Cor. 15:54. As the swift-advancing prairie fire swallows up every tiny pool of water which lies in the fiery path of its advance; as the beauteous dawn of the breaking day swallows up every den and cavern of darkness before its swift march; so Christ within us shall some day swallow up these dead bodies of His own in one marvellous moment of miracle and glory.

In these bodies which bear even now the hidden seeds of death there is also dwelling the hidden life of the resurrection, Christ

"He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by His Spirit that dwelleth in you." Rom. 8:11. Wherefore the pledge and the power

of the coming resurrection of God's own children is the life of His own resurrected Son within them.

The Instantaneousness of the Resurrection

"Do you remember our Lord's wondrous statement about these resurrection bodies when the Sadducees tried to entrap Him by one of their foolish questions? They had supposed the case of a woman having seven husbands in succession, and then sought to bring Him to confusion before the multitude by asking Him whose wife she would be in the resurrection. Back came His marvellous teaching that in heaven there would be neither marrying nor giving in marriage, but that all of God's children would be 'children of the resurrection.' Do you note that striking phrase and its significance? Plainly it is this: Marriage was given by God for the per-petuation of the race. Through its holy relationship children are born into the world with their natural bodies. The pangs of birth and the long, slow years of growth fashion these natural bodies of ours. But neither marriage, nor natural birth, nor the long progress of years will be needed to fashion the new, glorified bodies of His redeemed children. That body is fashioned in an instant, the glory-instant of the

est joy of the heart finds utterance in the fewest words? When that boy came home from the suffering, struggle, and death of that awful world-conflict, was your joy a voluble one, of much speaking and many sentences? Nay, you could only throw your arms about him and cry out with quivering heart, "Oh, my boy!" And your strong-armed, stout-hearted lad could only take you in his arms, and with tearful voice and glad heart cry out, "Mother!" The deepest emotions of a true heart find vent in the fewest words. Is not this why we have failed to see the well-springs of joy in the resurrection during forty days of Christ's presence with His own? Think of that morning when He stood in the garden in the dimness of dawn.

When the weeping Mary began to speak to Him, how did He reveal Himself? a single word. It was the word by which love most richly and deeply expresses its joy toward a loved one—the name of the loved one. "Mary!" That seems terse, and barrenly brief to us. But the thrill of resurrection joy and glory back of it must have been such as never vibrated through that single mention of Mary's name in all the years of her earthly life. And then, when doubting Thomas reached forth his hand and touched the scarred side, how much did he say? Only, "My Lord and My God!" But can any human imagination picture the joy that must have flooded Thomas' heart as he realized that Jesus Christ was really risen from the dead and that he was touching Him with his own hand! And when John, with spiritual instinct, was the first to recognize the risen Lord upon the lake-shore in the faint light of that momentous morning, what did he say? Only "It is the Lord!" Yet that little sentence sent headlong into the waiting sea the man whose heart had been broken by his denial of his Master and opened the flood-gates of a joy so boundless and ecstatic that no human being could possibly pic-

And so may it be some glad, golden day with us. If, suddenly, radiant faces should swarm into our astounded presence; sweet familiar voices of long ago whisper our name as our Lord spoke Mary's; the thrill, uplift, and splendor of glorification sweep through our whole being in one jubilee instant of time; and then we should be "caught up together with them to meet the Lord in the air," resurrection joy would be no mere dream as it seems now to many, but the same marvellous, thrilling reality of bliss and glory that it was twenty centuries ago there on the quiet shore of Galilee.

Only then it was "Christ the first fruits," but for us it would be "they that are Christ's at His coming."

The Reunion of the Resurrection

"The dead in Christ shall rise first; then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air." 1 Thess. 4:16, 17.

Here is the inspired picture of the marvellous reunion of the Resurrection. The dead in Christ are raised first. Then the living in Christ are instantly "changed," that is, glorified. And thus re-united the glorified living are caught up "together with them," that is, together with the glorified resurrected ones, and so shall they "ever be with the Lord." Whether we are dead or alive when Jesus comes, we must all be changed, for flesh and blood cannot inherit the Kingdom of God. Not carnal, natural bodies, out only glorified, spiritual ones, shall enter there. With but a breathless instant intervening, the glorification of God's living children shall accompany that of His dead ones. The corrupted ones will

put on incorruption, but the mortal ones shall immediately put on immortality without ever seeing corruption, and then, with this wondrous reunion brought to pass, as if by a rushing mighty wind, in one outflashing of supernatural glory, living, working, waiting men and women shall be whirled up to meet the Lord in the air. So sublime is the simple statement, "Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them to meet the Lord in the air," that our feeble human imagination, striving to soar to this lofty height, falls back like a spent bird, gasping and breathless with its failure of the wing to reach the dazzling summit which the eye has scanned. Caught up! Who can picture it? While men and women walk the busy streets they shall be caught up! While they bow in the secret chamber of prayer they shall be caught up! While with burning hearts they ponder the Word that tells of His coming they shall be caught up! While patient, suffering ones lie in beds of pain they shall be caught up! While the living stand by the open graves of the dead they shall be caught up!-and as the startled world wonders, the only record left shall be that of Enoch's—"And they walked with God, and were not, for God took them!"

A stricken father was riding in the funeral train behind the body of his dead boy. From behind the curtains of the chair in which he was being borne by the natives he heard the voice of a woman weeping. Presently the voice of another Korean woman spoke up and said, "Why are you weeping?" The sorrowing woman answered, "I am weeping for the foreigner who has lost his little boy." "Don't weep for the foreigner; weep for yourself, wom-an," came the answer. "You have lost a little girl, and you will never get her back. I have lost a little boy, and I shall never get him back. But let me tell you some-thing. These foreigners have a strange way of getting back their dead!" And then as the stricken father laid the white lily upon the coffin of his little one, he bowed his head before his Lord and gave himself anew to Him to preach to these heathen people that blessed Gospel of Jesus Christ which would give back their dead to all who believed in Him as Saviour and Lord of the glory that is one day to come with

These bodies were the bodies of the sons of God, yet they went down into the dust like the beasts of the field. These bodies, laid away in the darkness and night of the tomb, crumbling to dust and ashes, shall some day, changed, sit down with Him on His throne. These bodies, the prey of corruption and decay, shall live on, changed, through all the ages of eternity in deathlessness and incorruption. These bodies, now chained to the narrow limits of a grave, shall some day, changed, sweep in an instant of time through the boundless

AN APPEAL FROM THE CONGO

The work of our Assemblies of God fellowship in the Belgian Congo is at present enjoying quite a revival spirit with the result that many of the native Christians are earnestly seeking God for the fullness of the Holy Spirit. Our missionaries on this field have had some difficult situations to contend with but now feel encouraged that God is indicating it is time to advance.

Several centers are before us which could be entered and mission stations established if we had a few extra missionaries. Those who are sent must of course first be called of God and as an evidence it would be expected that they should manifest distinct qualifications for the ministry and the anointing of God upon their lives. Roman Catholic Church are extremely active in sending hundreds of missionaries into the Belgian Congo, so that it is estimated

that over five hundred reached the country within a comparatively short period of time and probably over two thousand are now on the field. Our Assemblies of God Mission in that country represents a force of eleven missionaries with two others who have been approved for service there. The missionary Field Committee estimate they will need at least three more missionary couples and could use a number more if funds are available. If any of our readers should feel the call of God upon their hearts for this work and believe that God has really qualified you to undertake such a ministry we should appreciate hearing from you. DELIVERED FROM OPIUM

One of the first native homes we visited upon our arrival in Manchuria was the home of Mrs. Kou, a little Chinese mother. We shall never forget the happy face of this mother as she praised the altogether lovely One for His marvelous grace and power she had experienced.

Before Mrs. Kou was saved her mother-inlaw, a Christian for years, used to come to the mission and request prayer for Mrs. Kou that she might be delivered from her desperate con-She was bound by the awful dope habit. When the workers went to call on her they found that she had tried to break away from this habit but had suffered agony for two days, beating her arms upon the stone kang till they were bruised, writhing in agony till at last her husband took the opium pipe and blew smoke down her throat to revive her.

The workers exhorted her to turn to the Lord and seek His power and strength to overcome the dope demon, and should she die in the attempt she would surely be saved. She finally broke down and wept and gave her consent to put her trust in the Saviour they were telling her about, Jesus Christ the almighty One. After reading the Word to her, singing and praying, they left for that day and told the mother-in-law that she must pray with the little mother every time the craving seized her. They sang and prayed all night to defeat the power of the devil the first night. The workers visited her each day, about the hour when she had been in the habit of smoking the opium, until she was completely delivered.

Just two weeks from the day of their first visit to her home, Mrs. Kou stood in the congregation, testifying to the never failing power of Christ. During the next few weeks her testimony was the means of two more turning to the Lord and obtaining deliverance from both opium-smoking and the morphine needle.

She was a real light for the Saviour up until about three months ago when she became confined to the kang with the dread disease of tuberculosis which is so prevalent here. We went often to her home to pray with her and encourage her in the Lord, but we could see that she was going down fast and soon found that in her weakness the enemy of her soul was trying to get her to go back to her old sin.

One day she called the workers and confessed some things which she had not been able to confess and asked them to help her to make restitution; then she said she felt ready for the Lord's will to be wrought out in her life and that she was ready to be taken home to be with Him. In just a week word was brought that she was gone.

The evening previously she called her three children and her husband to her and exhorted them the best she could. She told her mother-in-law that the world was empty and the room where she was lying was empty; she could see nothing in it but a great light, which filled the place and seemed to envelope her. She closed her eyes, and her lips moved in prayer as she quietly and pacefully slipped away early in the morning.

Dear reader, you may ask, "Does it pay to give the gospel to the heathen?" We say "Yes, a thousand times yes," for had this death occurred a little over one year ago, when Mrs. Kou's acquaintance was first made, we know she would have been everlastingly lost, but now she is "safe in the arms of Jesus." His dear Name!

Please pray for the work here that we may see many more of these souls now in heathen darkness come into the knowledge of the saving grace of Christ.-Mr. and Mrs. Arthur J.

QUEER CUSTOMS IN ARGENTINA

The following paragraphs are taken from a letter received from Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Dunbar, new missionaries to Argentina: "As we began the new year our hearts were filled with gratitude for the privilege of being among a people who so greatly need the gospel and the knowledge of the Saviour. The hunger they manifest is marvelous to us and we are anxious to help them on to God.

"A few days ago we visited the cemetery in 25 de Mayo. It bespeaks the darkness that is over the people without the glorious light of our gospel. Every family that is able builds a little chapel. The caskets are placed on brackets or in niches in the walls of these 'Bovedas' as they call them. There may be as many as 35 entombed in one chapel. There are many statues of saints and also candles to guide the dead in that darkness beyond. Here the people go, light candles and say prayers to bring the dead from purgatory, and as often as possible they pay the priest to go.

"The poor people must bury in the earth, which to them is a horrible thing and only adds to the misery of their poverty because of the superstitions and dread that fills every heart of the unlearned. Graves are rented for a period of five years and if at any time after that the rent is not paid, the bodies are removed and thrown over the wall or burned and the grave rerented.

"Not long ago we attended the funeral of a precious sister from the Mamaguita assembly. The casket was brought here in the morning and placed in a bare room. It was just an unlined box, made of half inch lumber and almost the shape of the body-small at the head, broader at the shoulders and narrowing down to the feet. In the afternoon it was placed in a truck and taken to the cemetery where it was carelessely placed, head down, on the pile of dirt from the grave, while a few songs were sung and the Scriptures read. each native threw in a handful of dirt as is the custom and in a few minutes they began covering the casket.

"In the death of this sister there is a consolation, for she was ready to go. She declared before leaving this world of woe that she saw the gates of a city, beautiful, clean, and pure; that the gates were open and a messenger was coming for her. Thus she slipped away in confidence after two years of happy service for the King.

"In spite of all that is difficult, working. In our meetings in Villa Leonor, God has given us precious souls. We are having our meetings in the home of a lady who has been converted but her husband is bitter. Pray for his conversion. If our crowds continue as they are now we shall have to rent a hall for our services.'

Brother Joseph Tunmore of Pittsburgh, Pa. fell asleep in Jesus on Saturday afternoon, March 21st at 5 p. m. His death followed closely upon that of his brother, A. Ernest Tunmore, of Buffalo, N. Y., who died from blood poisoning on February 27th.

He had been failing for a number of months but continued in the ministry until the end.
