word from God is void of power, and when He gives you a word, how it goes to the very core of you, as real bread from heaven.

"Through faith!" "Subdued kingdoms!" Let us look back through this chapter together. "Faith is the substance (assurance, marg.) of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the Word of God." "By faith Abel offered a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he had witness borne to him that he was righteous," and so, though dead, he "yet speaketh," teaching us that the only way of approach to a holy God is by the blood of a Substitute. "By faith Enoch was translated, that he should not see death, for before his translation he had this testimony—this witness borne to him—that he pleased God."

What was it in Enoch that pleased God? Faith! "Without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is." That is the first condition—faith that God *is*, when you are coming to Him. Secondly, that He is "a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." That is access to God. Faith that diligently seeks Him, faith that grips God, faith that proves Him through everything, faith that comes to God believing that He will answer —God is a rewarder of all who thus seek Him. He bears witness to, confirms, responds to such faith as this.

In your warfare against sin and Satan, do you find access to God? Do you go to God, or do you go to other people? Do you "diligently seek Him"? We can pray our way through the most impossible things with this kind of faith. Say to yourself continually, "One thing I am sure of—God *is*, Christ *is*. He knows the way, and He will bring us through." You must keep this strong grip of faith in God, holding to the fact that Christ, as Conqueror, is at the right hand of God, your Advocate. The enemy will try to wrench it from you and to submerge you in perplexities, darkness, and overwhelming circumstances, but if you will hold on to this tenacious faith in the Living God, it will be an anchor within the veil that will pull you through.

"By faith Noah, being warned of God, prepared an ark . . . By faith Abraham, when he was called . . . obeyed, and he went out not knowing whither he went.' "By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac . . . accounting that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead." All this through faith in a Living God! Noah's faith caused him to build an ark which was to save his house, though he probably did not know that when he was building it in obedience to God. Faith in the existence of a Living God gave Enoch faith to be translated. Do you know God as the Living God? Do you know that you have access to Him, so that you could stand like Abraham, and see all your hopes slain, and account that God was able to bring all to resurrection? Have you a faith that makes you to know God, and have such access to Him that you can stand with Him against the whole world, without reliance upon another human being?

In verse 25 we find Moses "choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he had respect unto the recompense of the reward"—his faith looked forward to ful surface things, beneath which there is no real work of God. Behind everything, and everybody, there is one of two invisible powers—the power of God or the power of Satan—and if you are seeing the invisible working of God, you will also see the invisible working of Satan, and will not be deceived by him.

Moses endured, seeing the invisible. His innermost spiritual vision could see the ultimate issue of things. He saw that it was better to choose to suffer with the people of God, than to enjoy the visible pleasures of Pharaoh's court. The powers of darkness watch the children of God, seeking to trip them up and ensnare them through the *visible*, and they have to be making their choice all the time. Moses chose to go along with a nation of slaves, because he saw that those slaves were God's chosen people. So it is to-day. If you have eyes to see where God is, you will see the issue of things, and will have faith to lay hold of the invisible God, believing that He *is*, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

"And what more shall I say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gideon, and of Barak, and of Samson, and of Jephthae; of David also, and Samuel, and of the prophets; who through faith subdued kingdoms . . ." ver. 32. Faith in God enabled these ordinary, weak men to "subdue kingdoms," and we are called to take our place in this roll of faith heroes. The kingdom of the "god of this world" is all around us. What needs to be subdued in your home? What about the kingdom in your church? It is an invisible war, in an invisible realm, with invisible weapons, against invisible foes, but with visible consequences. How do you conquer? By faith laying hold of God and saying, "In the name of Jesus

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Prayer-the Fighting Force

Prayer is work. The thoroughness with which we do that work is the measure of the thoroughness with which God will be able to do His work through us. Prayer, as a work, and a warfare, is very much a destructive work in a most real war. In Paul's description of God's armor for the Christian, it is one of the two offensive weapons which he mentions. Eph. 6:18. As we are joined to the living Christ through Calvary, we find this weapon of prayer is given to us to use in aggressive warfare against the methods and plans of Satan and his agents, the weapon which more than any other is "mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds.

In undertaking this work of victorious prayer, we can always be certain of two things: (1) that it will have to be carried through in the face of determined opposition, for Satan uses every possible means to keep us from prayer. He burdens the spirit, and makes us unable to pray: he creates apathy of mind, until there is no desire for prayer, and very often sends interruptions when we have begun to pray. But we can be equally certain (2) of the power of the Blood shed on Calvary and of the presence within the veil of Him who is the Victor of Satan, and who bestows on us the grace of the Holy Spirit.

Focus Prayer on the need of the moment.

Turn to Luke 18. The point of this parable is not that men should pray, but that they should learn how to concentrate prayer on a special need, and hold on until the prayer has been answered.

In the spiritual fight with evil, one great secret of victory is to focus our prayer forces on the point or points where obstruction is manifested, and the enemy is revealed in some attitude of resistance. Every battlefield of earth illustrates the value of a *focal point* and the necessity of *persistent concentration* of men and guns upon it until the hoped-for result has been obtained. The spiritual conflict will reveal something equally true. In every work we do, in every life for which we pray, there is a "key-position" which the enemy holds with all his subtle cleverness and power of persistence. On that position prayer requires to be focussed.

How then is the enemy to be met?

(1) Find out the point of obstruction, and hold on there. Bring all your prayer, your faith and power to bear upon that. Face the evil where its concentration is revealed to you, and force the fight there, not with carnal methods, but with the spiritual weapons provided for you by the Lord.

Here is the case of one, born of godly parents, herself an earnest Christian, who became utterly demon-possessed. Friends sent her to an asylum, with no result. Taken to her home, the demon power ofttimes manifested itself in vehement antagonism to everything of a religious nature. Prayer was steadily made for her liberation and complete deliverance. As needs were revealed, upon these prayer was focussed in the victorious name of the Lord Jesus. Gordon Watt

Gradually the demon power was broken. The evil spirits were dispossessed, and perfect freedom was graciously given. Today she is back at duty, once again following the Lord.

In a church some men were a distinct hindrance to its spiritual life. Against that key-position prayer was focussed. Some years passed before the enemy's front line was pierced. The testing was very severe, but greatly needed. Then came the act of full yielding of all to God, and the line



broke. With marvelous rapidity the whole situation was transformed. The attitude of many to the gospel changed. The spirit of dead resistance to the truth weakened. The congregation increased. Wonderful cases of conversion were recorded, and God was glorified. Prayer, when put into operation as a fighting force, as a *power focussed on points of obstruction* proves to be a blessed reality.

(2) Pray round the matter that concerns you. Get to know all you can about that which claims your prayer, and turn it into fuel for intercession. Find out the tactics of the adversary. Be on the outlook for signs of his working. These will be revealed to you by the Holy Spirit as you quietly pray over matters. Then concentrate your prayer force upon each fact on which you receive light.

(3) Get *behind* the trouble in work, and the need in lives to the adversary himself! Behind all hardness in Christian work there is a malignant power responsible for it. Stand in co-operation with the Holy Spirit against it, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and claim the victory of Calvary over the interference of that power in the work, and over all Satanic influences and methods and wiles. Behind the sin of a man there is an evil force gripping him. Focus your prayer power on Satan's hold of the man's will, on his desires and his faith. That is the focal point. Let it be repeated that in every work, in each life there is a key-position, which the devil holds until through the victory of Calvary, by the mighty power of the Cross, he is evicted from it and put to flight. *Remember that*

the power of the Cross is irresistible.

Pray through all the obstacles by which the adversary is blocking the path. Get into communication with the throne of God, and *hold on* for the special need of work or life, though it be for days or months, until the victory is won.

(4) Bear in mind that for this victory you must stand on the ground of the victory already won for you at Calvary. In that victory there is everything to defeat the power of evil, and to gain the fight. To focus prayer on a need is to hold up steadfastly and persistently the victory of Christ on the Cross over Satan, just as Moses' hands were lifted up until the Amalekites were routed. On that ground you must claim, as you have a right to claim, that the interference of the enemy in your God-appointed work shall be stopped, and justice done you in your own life against him, and in the lives for which you are praying.

The work of prayer warfare must always be undertaken in co-operation with the Holy Spirit. In this conflict He never loses sight of the Cross as the one place from which victory springs. His first work with a prayer warrior is to bring him to Calvary, that he may there, by faith, and the deliberate choice of his own will, take his place with Christ on that Cross. It is there you and I must come for the power that wins the victory

over *self*, and the further victory over Satan. What is that power? On His side it is His death. On ours it is our yieldedness to the Holy Spirit.

In His death there is complete power to meet every assault of sin, and complete victory over Satan. It is to the Cross that you and I are to bring self in all its manifestations, and on every occasion when these are apparent. Self is the workshop of the devil, and each display of the self-life, such as pride, prejudice, pettiness of spirit, temper, self-pity, self-love, self-praise, and self-congratulation, is the material through which Satan works, and carries out his plans to the hindrance of the purposes of the Lord. Each uprising of self is the call of the Holy Spirit to make our faith in the atoning sacrifice of the Son of God practical, and thus to give Him the opportunity of bringing the power of that death to bear upon the self-life wherever Satan is assailing it.

"Here is thirteen hundred and fifty dollars in gold," the stranger said, as he took that amount from his belt and laid it down in shining coins before the astonished widow. True, she had prayed. For months she had cried to God to provide some way for her to keep her roof over her head; but there had been no answer. The days had followed one another relentlessly until at length with that very morning's dawning had come the due date of the mortgage that was to take her farm home from her.

The story was told by Eiven Bjornstad upon the recent occasion of his singing at the Central Assembly of God in Springfield,

Missouri. The story is so amazing that he told the writer privately of a verification of it which had made him sure of its authenticity. He said he was telling it one day to a congregation in the State of Washington, when a man arose in the congregation and said, "I know that story to be true, for I was that widow's next door neighbor and knew the facts at the time of their occurrence.'

Eiven Bjornstad, according to many music critics, ranks next to Caruso as a tenor singer. He has sung grand opera in German, French, Italian, English, and Scandinavian; but having been converted he refused an offer of seven hundred and fifty dollars a week to continue singing in grand opera, choosing rather to go about the country singing for Christ in various denominations including the Assemblies of God.

One day he sang in one of the great rich Presbyterian churches of New York City, giving forth the simple gospel in a straightforward way. Although he knew the church was formal, and surmised that it was spiritually cold he did not mince words before them. In fact he spoke so plainly that he felt a little misgiving lest his hearers should resent his plainness of speech, but he knew he must please God rather than man.

A few days later he received an invitation from two men, saying, "We should like to meet you at the Bankers' Club. We heard you sing at the Presbyterian church and should like to inquire further concerning your religious faith." As soon as he saw the names signed to this note of invitation he knew them to be multimillionaries. When he arrived at the club he was required to remain in the lobby, not being a member; but when his hosts arrived they took him upstairs into this exclusive and wealthy club.

Both of the men were Christians, and one of them after listening to Bjornstad's faith-

ful witnessing, said, "You know, that is the kind of religion I was taught when I was a child. My mother gathered us around her and prayed with us every day. God's Strength for His Little Ones

L ET US have a Bible study about the Touch of Strength that God wants to give us. He desires that we shall be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might, not weak or infirm. We may be weak naturally, but He desires to impart to us His own strength so that when we follow His leadings we shall be able to say, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Phil. 4:13. If we follow our own natural leadings He can not give us His strength, but as we obey Him in every detail we shall continually be empowered to do all He leads us to do.

Let us turn to Psalm 84:5-7. "Blessed is the man whose strength is in Thee; in whose heart are the ways of them. Who passing through the valley of Baca make it a well; the rain also filleth the pools. They go from strength to strength, every one of them in Zion appeareth before God." The valley of Baca means the valley of trouble, or as the passage is translated in the Revised Version, "passing through the val-ley of Weeping, they make it a place of springs." In the place of trouble, trial, and weeping, we may trust the Holy Spirit to cause a well of joy to spring up in our hearts. "They go from strength to strength"; each day we may grow stronger in our blessed Lord, as we depend more fully upon Him and do not in any sense trust our own strength.

Notice the third verse: "Yea, the sparrow hath found an house, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, even thine altars, O Lord of hosts, my King, and my God." This is such a wonderful verse for parents, as they realize what this means, that they may lay their children in full consecration upon the altar of God, and so commit them to the blessed Saviour that they may know by faith that they are safe in His keeping. This attitude does indeed help to strengthen our hearts, for it is grief over straying children that often makes the heart fail. Beloved, as you commit your dear ones to the Lord and trust in Him, He will work upon their hearts and draw them to Himself.

God wants to make us so strong that we shall be pillars in the temple of our God. Everywhere we go we see a great many "leaners" and not many "lifters." Sometimes we see strong ones who have so cast their own burdens on the Lord that they are always helping to bear the burdens of others. Beloved, do not ask God to make you a pillar unless you are willing to let people lean upon you, and not be disturbed or distressed over the weak ones who are constantly bringing their troubles to you. It is so sweet to be comforted of God so that we may comfort others with that same comfort. Oh, the hungry hearts we find everywhere! But unless we are strong in the Lord we might have the spirit that the disciples did of old when they said, about the Syrophenician woman, "Lord, send her away; she crieth after us." But our blessed Lord had no intention of sending her away, although He tested her faith. She was a Gentile, and had no covenant right to approach the Lord Jesus in the

way she did, yet her faith was marvelous, and she would not accept what seemed like a rebuke, but pressed close to Jesus, believing there was enough for her and her daughter in the crumbs the children of Israel were wasting. Praise God He does not merely give us the crumbs today, but the full loaf, and we may have all we will take for spirit, soul, and body.

Sometimes the Lord tries our faith as He did that of the Syrophenician woman. Sometimes we are in great trial, and it seems as though we could not wait an hour or a moment for the answer, and still the trial goes on and on. Beloved, He is only getting us ready to receive the answer. In this very time of waiting He is increasing our faith. He is bringing us on from strength to strength. He is preparing us to receive a glorious answer. "Shall He not avenge His own elect, which cry day and night unto Him?" We are so foolish and slow of heart to believe, and He has to "bear long" with us until He can draw us so close to Himself that we will really cry in faith to Him, and then we shall receive a speedy answer.

Let us turn now to Psalm 73:26, "My flesh and my heart faileth; but God is the strength of my heart, and my portion for ever." Dear one, you may feel as though your flesh and heart were failing today. The trial has been so great that even your physical heart seems to fail under the awful strain. Will you not take this text and stand upon it? Will you not take God to be the strength of your heart, and take Him for your portion? The Psalmist said, "I had fainted unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and He shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the Lord." Psalm 27:13, 14. What kept David from fainting? Not seeing the answer to his prayer at once, but believing to see. As you wait upon the Lord and feed upon His Word, He will give you the assurance of faith, and He will give you His own courage, even before the visible answer to prayer has been granted.



Again we have a precious passage in Isa. 25:4, "For Thou hast been a strength to the needy in his distress, a refuge from the storm, a shadow from the heat, when the blast of the terrible ones is as a storm against the wall. If we are hidden away in Christ the storm cannot touch us, for Christ is a wall for us. He is "a strength to the poor, a strength to the needy in his distress." The Lord is strong to sustain us in the trial, and strong to deliver us from the trial. Oh, that His words of comfort may so enter our hearts today that we shall be able to praise Him by faith before the victory is made manifest.

I suppose you have all heard the sweet story of the missionary in Persia who sat on the floor with the natives in their meetings, and having no support for her back, she would get very weary. One day a dear native woman came close to her and asked her to lean against her as her support. She accepted this help, but only leaned lightly upon the kind friend, so the native woman whispered to her, "If you love me, lean hard." Someone wrote a little poem about this incident, named, "Lean Hard," referring to our leaning upon our blessed Lord, and showing us how His love is satisfied only as we lean hard upon Him.

We find another very comforting passage in Isa. 40:29-31. "He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might He increaseth strength." Do you feel ready to faint and give up the battle, weak and powerless, without strength even to pray? We see from this text that His power is for the faint ones, and that the weaker we are the more He will increase His strength unto us if we will only drop into His arms in all our weakness and nothingness.

"Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall: but they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk and not faint." The strength of youths and young men is the best natural strength, but here we see this put in contrast with the Lord's strength which He will give to those that wait upon Him. Beloved, if you will take time to wait upon the Lord, He will re-new or "change" (literal) your strength. You will find the eagle wings and mount up above all earthly trials. If you have not known this wing-life of full redemption for spirit, soul and body, continue to wait upon Him until you find the wings which the Lord has provided for you.

I like to think of these wings as the faith of the Son of God, and His own never failing love. He is longing to give us these wings far more than we are longing to receive them, but we must drop all self-effort and depend wholly upon Him. Perhaps you have been depending too much upon the prayers of others. It is precious to have the help of God's children, but if they help us in the right way it will only be to make us feel our utter dependence upon the Lord Himself. Press past every one and touch Jesus. Get face to face with Him, then your heart will be fully satisfied with His glorious salvation. Oh, there is such a victorious life for God's little ones! The Holy Spirit is the One who will make real to us Christ's wonderful and full redemption. Dear ones, ask the Holy Spirit to minister to you all that Christ has wrought out for you on His cross.

Now let us look at that wonderful promise in Deut. 33:25, "Thy shoes shall be iron and brass; and as thy days, so shall thy strength be." In connection with this let us read the 24th verse, "And of Asher he said, Let him be blessed with children; let him be acceptable to his brethren, and let him dip his foot in oil." First of all we must be blessed with spiritual children. We must be used in saving souls or our life will be in vain. Jesus said, "Here-in is My Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit." Then there must be the unity between us and others of God's children, indicated by the words, "let him be acceptable to his brethren." Again, "let him dip his foot in oil." Oil is always a symbol of the blessed Holy Spirit, and as we are led by the Spirit of God we shall have a blessed walk with Jesus.

I had a remarkable experience on another line, through depending on this text, once when I was in Chicago. The pavements seemed as hot as a furnace and the heat came through the soles of my shoes in such a way as to make me most uncomfortable. The Lord reminded me of this text: "Let him dip his foot in oil." I took it literally for both of my feet and they became perfectly cool; but sweeter than that, I had the feeling of real heavenly oil upon my feet, and oh, how I could walk and not faint, in the strength of my Lord! We never exhaust any of God's promises, and He will show us how to apply them in just the way we need at the moment.

All of these other sweet thoughts bring us to that marvelous promise, "As thy days, so shall thy strength be." Not one day, but all the days of our life, we may take this strength of Jesus, and we shall find it all-sufficient.

"Through Faith, Subdued Kingdoms!"

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Christ the Conqueror, I put my foot down to subdue that working of Satan." The same spirit of faith that enabled Moses to endure, and Gideon to become a "mighty man of valor," will enable you—and you can have it. You can take from God that spirit of faith which He desires to see in you, which will enable you to subdue and conquer the kingdom of Satan in your environment.

"Who through faith . . . wrought righteousness." Faith is needed to work righteousness, and there is no true faith in God alongside of unrighteousness. The mighty faith in God that will "subdue kingdoms" is only possible in a life governed by righteousness, doing what is righteous in every detail of life, whether it "pays" or not. If you want the power of God in your life, you must see to it that everything in your life is brought into accord with His righteousness. How can the Holy Spirit manifest Himself in power where there is anything out of line with the righteousness of

the God of power? The children of God are not so concerned about this as they ought to be.

How to deal with gossip!

"Through faith . . . stopped the mouths of lions." "The devil, as a roaring lion, goeth about seeking whom he may devour.' He roars against you, perhaps using the mouth of another Christian. Are you terribly upset because of something someone is saying about you? Do you not know the way to stop the mouths of lions? First of all, certainly not by being upset. So long as you fret and fume, and are disturbed, you will have no power over the roaring lion. He will only roar the more, because that is just what he wanted-to upset you! This is the special way in which the enemy seems to work in the Church to-day, through misunderstandings and misjudgments between children of God; and with great success, because they do not know how to stop the mouths of lions. that diligently seek Him." Will you take that promise? Are you being misjudged, talked about, misinterpreted, and suffering under it? "Through faith stop the mouths of lions." "My God hath sent His angel," said Daniel, "and shut the lions' mouths, that they have not hurt me, forasmuch as innocency was found in me." God can shut the lion's mouth. The Church of God could be cleansed from much poison that is in it, if each believer would only do that one thing—learn how, by faith, to "shut the mouths of lions."

"Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong"-made strong through faith! "Waxed valiant in fight." That is not the fight of the flesh! If there is no answer to your "fight of faith," when you are diligently seeking God, and resisting the enemy, ask whether-unknown to yourself-there has come in anything of the earthly fight. This warfare is a spirit warfare, in the spirit realm, against a spirit foe, "we wrestle not against flesh and blood." Go direct to God, and in the power of God subdue the enemy. You become a very silent Christian if this warfare is going on in the spirit realm. It is not talking about it. It is going home and setting ourselves to deal with God diligently, and through faith bringing these things to pass. "Through faith obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions . . . waxed valiant in fight." You will be stronger, spiritually, if you were driven to God alone.

"Through faith . . . turned to flight the armies of the aliens." What a sight for the angelic powers, to see the Church of God turning to flight the principalities and powers in the heavenly places! Take your stand on these verses, and say, "Lord, I have no faith, this looks absolutely beyond me! But I do choose to have faith, I choose to take faith from Thee to shut the mouths of lions, to wax valiant in fight. I choose to take faith from Thee, out of my utter weakness to become strong, that I may turn to flight the armies of the adversary."

"Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection." All these things they endured by faith! "The trial of your faith being much more precious" to God "than gold that perisheth." Are you concerned to let God bring the faith that is in you to its fullest development, that you may be "mighty through faith," empowered by faith, so that you "stagger not at the promise of God through unbelief?" Have you faith to live through persecution? "They wandered about"-are you willing to be homeless? Can you part with your earthly goods? By faith Moses "endured, as seeing Him who is invisible"-do you think he ever longed for the court of Pharaoh, with its ease and plenty? No, he looked for a better country than Egypt (ver. 16). Do you think our 20th century Christianity would be able to endure the persecution of Nero's days? Not that we shall necessarily go through such things, but God wants that true faith in Him that holds on to nothing, clasps nothing, not even its money. This is one aspect of the walk "after the Spirit," for "if ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?" Take care that the devil does not rob you of your heavenly treasure. Walk carefully, that he does not come to you through lawful things and rob you of your spiritual victory. Be willing to live for the things invisible, and do not invest too much in the visible.

All these heroes of faith "had witness borne to them through their faith" (R. V.). Their faith was to them the "assurance, the "proving" of things not seen. They lived and endured "as seeing Him who is invisible," not asking for present relief, but living for future gain. "Wherefore, seeing we are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the Beginner and Finisher of our faith"; He who also endured present suffering (the Cross) for future gain ("the joy that was set before Him"). Consider Him, "lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds." Cease to be moved or diverted by the visible; choose to believe God, and there will come into your spirit the energizing power of God, as it did to Abraham: "being infilled with faith he waxed strong through faith, giving glory to God, being fully persuaded that what He had promised He was able also to perform." Some of God's promises are not dated, but they are nevertheless sure. Those who "through faith" subdue the kingdom of darkness here according to their "measure of faith," shall receive a "king-dom which cannot be moved." Heb. 12:28. "Have the faith of God."

The Morning Watch

"And Abraham rose up early in the morning." Gen. 21:14 and Gen. 22:3.

Twice we find this said of Abraham, both times in reference to what was painful to him. The first time it was to send away his son Ishmael from his home (21:14), and the second time to face the still harder task of offering up Isaac. His early rising was the token of his whole-hearted willingness to do the will of God.

How glorious was the reward of his early rising which Abraham received. It brought him on the third day to the mountains where the Lord appeared unto him—and favor followed upon his obedience. He gave him back his son as from the dead. He confirmed to him the promise of blessing: "In blessing I will bless thee, and in multi-

plying I will multiply thy seed." Abraham learns to know his God as the worker of wonders of whom he could say, "The Lord will provide."

My brother! if ever a day comes when you are called upon to do what seems to you hard and difficult, do as Abraham did. Arise in the morning hour to meet your God in a spirit of willingness to accomplish only His will. If you desire to walk in Abraham's footsteps, and to sacrifice all to God, yea, even what is dearest, then go to meet God in the early morning hour. To you, too, on rising early, He will reveal Himself as the Lord and will provide. To you, too, will He confirm it by an oath, saying, "In blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed." Thus was Abraham rewarded for that early rising.

Prayer—The Fighting Force (Continued from Page Two)

Every time we tread the path to Calvary in honest confession of sin, and of the ways in which self works so subtly, very real will be our victory over all the forces of evil. The more fully we yield ourselves to the Holy Spirit, the deeper will be our death union with Christ, through whom we are made alive unto God, and find our place in the heavenlies.

In earthly warfare there is a variety of weapons for the soldiers, and where one fails, another succeeds. In the spiritual warfare, to be ignorant of the devices of the enemy, and not to be, as the Apostle urged the early Christian Church, "alert" to the call of the hour, not to have spiritual insight and foresight as to the methods necessary to meet the enemy, is to court defeat. There is an aspect of prayer with which, perhaps, some are not so familiar, but which is absolutely necessary if in this spiritual warfare we are to occupy that position of strength and understanding which is essential to victory. That aspect is *prayer as* a *fighting force*. Prayer is the climax of Paul's revelation of our equipment for the fight. It is the bit of the armor which makes the other bits of the armor effective, and without which we fail to experience the fullness of their power.

When our Lord said of His Church, "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it," He did not mean that the Church was to sit down and wait for the attack of the powers of evil, but that she was to assail them, and find that they would not stand before her. His words show that He expects His Church to be *unconquerable when she attac**s, and if she will enter upon this fight in the strength of God, realizing her position of victory in Christ she will soon see the principalities of evil and the powers of darkness beaten down and put to flight.

Prayer is not pleading for something that God is unwilling to give. It is not always a mere petition for something we feel we, or others, need. Prayer is warfare. Prayer is fighting. It is co-operation with the Holy Spirit in His attitude of judgment on sin and in His antagonism to Satan. Prayer, intelligent, ceaseless prayer, in the Spirit, used as the Bible instructs us to use it, is the most aggressive weapon we can employ in the spiritual fight, and the only weapon by which we can keep the enemy at bay. It is gathering up all the forces of will and mind and spirit, and, linked in an unbreakable union with the living victorious Lamb of God, driving in upon the position of the devil, and through faith bringing the power of the Cross to bear against him and all his hosts of darkness.

"Prayer," writes one, "involves a fight. There is a real spiritual force of evil to be conquered; the powers of darkness to be met. It is vital to ask whether our prayers possess the mark of *earnestness* or not." Now, that is exactly what the Scriptures say to us. Eph. 6:12 shows the principle on which we are to work; "we wrestle," says the apostle. It is a word taken from the old games, when each wrestler sought to lay his antagonist on the ground and put his foot upon his neck. Col. 4:12 is an illustration of this principle at work in life. Epaphras spent himself in "laboring fervently in prayer." The word in the Greek is our English word "agonize," which is also taken from the old games.

Now, there are three facts in this warfare, which we must keep continually before us.

1.—We have a real foe at the head of a well organized, disciplined, and obedient host.

You may say that the wisest plan is to ignore the devil and his powers. But you will find that to be disastrous in spiritual things. You can, you ought to, face the facts which Christ has revealed, which Paul met in his own life, and which he has interpreted to us in his epistles; the facts of an implacable, though not invincible foe, with a terrible personality, with unnumbered legions of evil spirits at his beck and call ever on the offensive, ever ready through wiles and lies, deceits and stratagems, to force himself in upon your mind and spirit, and take your life and its powers captive. As you read your Bible you can see how this great and evil personality has challenged God at every step.

What is that challenge? He challenges the right of God to the obedience of the will of man, and the right of the Lord Jesus Christ to the throne of the world, and you can see the black trail of the serpent throughout the Bible, in sin and rebellion, in ruin and disaster; in Eden, in the age before the Flood; in the bondage of Egypt; in Israel's history of failure and captivity; and in the rejection of the Son of God. Then you see it in the history of the Church. In Revelation 2 and 3 there is the prophetic picture of the devil dragging her from her high place in Ephesus down to that point in the present Laodicean age when the Lord will have to say to her, "I will spue thee out of My mouth."

And today you cannot be blind to his power at work in seven great facts, which show how he is controlling the wills of men; God's day desecrated, God's house forsaken, God's Book neglected, God's commandments broken, God's warnings disregarded, God's promises scorned, and God's Son despised and rejected. All along the way we are up against the challenge of the devil. But, God is not passive in the face of that challenge. See how He picks it up in Eden with the promise of a Redeemer; in the deliverance of Israel from Egypt; in mercy during the captivities; in the gift of His Son, the founding of His Church, the translation of the Scriptures; in reformations and Revivals, and missionary enterprize: and today in the deepening interest in the return of the Lord. And you and I must take up this challenge, too, in co-operation with God. Are you standing with God in wrestling with the enemy in your life with all the opportunities, in your home with its tests and trials, in your church with its measure of indifference and spiritual deadness, in the nation with its manifest demon possession in many forms, in the world with so many open exhibitions of Satanic power and fury?



2.—If we recognize the first fact of a real foe to fight, we shall soon also recognize that we are engaged in no sham fight.

We are not at parade on a drill ground, but on a battlefield. We are not taking part in holiday maneuvers, but in a real conflict in which we need every power God has given us and can yet give us; a conflict in which there will be, as in the case of Epaphras, an expenditure of brain and blood; in which there will need to be clearness of mind, strength of nerve, determination of will to get through, and a perfect and complete union with Christ for life and victory. The conflict is only to be won as we take up our right position with Christ, and hold that position of victory in Him until the powers of darkness are beaten down.

3.—And so God reveals to us the way to make prayer the power of greatest value. Isa. 59:16.

"And He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor." The word "intercessor" means much more than we usually attribute to it, more than entering a plea on behalf of another. Literally, it means to strike upon or against, to assail anyone with prayer, to bring to bear upon evil and the evil one the full force of prayer. And you will see in this chapter of Isaiah how God, failing to find such a fighting man, Himself becomes a man of war, and enters into the conflict. He is looking today for intercessors, for men and women who use prayer as a mighty offensive weapon, who will get to grips with the powers of darkness as the wrestler holds his opponent, who will enter into such cooperation with the Holy Spirit that they will learn the value and power of counter-attacking the enemy, and bringing to bear upon him and all his forces the full meaning and significance of the Cross—of the victory won on Calvary in the death of Christ.

Now, what does the counter-attack mean? (1) It means full surrender to God for the work of prayer. Romans 6 is the basis of victorious prayer, as it is the ground of triumphant living. The measure in which the Cross is at work in our lives, bringing us, not only forgiveness of sin, but freedom from the dominion of sin and the domination of the self-life, is the measure of our power to make prayer a fighting force. If the Cross is at work in us, then we shall be able to stand with God in a more definite, aggressive attitude of spirit against the devil. "Resist the devil" with holy indignation of spirit.

(2) It means to accept every bit of the armor, and then to take up the position which Christ invites us to take up, and which we are entitled to take up: that because of His victory on Calvary He gives us "power over all the power of the enemy." Calvary stands for the complete defeat of Satan by Christ, and complete victory for us over Satan through Christ.

(3) It means to claim in the name and on the authority of the Lord Jesus that the power of the devil shall be destroyed. Hold unceasingly the fact and power of "the finished work of Christ" over Satan, his hosts, and methods and works, until the victory has been won. Wherever you see his power at work in your own life, in the lives of others, in your church or nation, assail it in your prayers, claim, on the ground of the Blood shed, the loosening of the devil's grip, the beating back of the devil's forces, and the success of righteousness and truth and Christ.

Do not only pray for the blessing of God, but pray against the blight of the devil. Pray out his lies: Pray in the truth of God. Pray out his forces of deception and destruction: pray in the life and light and power of the Lord. Dislodge Satan from any ground in a life, or church, or work, which he has gained, by wielding the victory of Calvary against him, and all evil known to you. Do not only stand your ground against evil, but strike out against evil. Passivity of mind and will in prayer is fatal. There must be strenuous activity of all God-given powers in and through prayer. Learn to attack the foe behind the evils which are visible to you; behind the drunkenness, and impurity, the malice and hypocrisy, the indifference and resistance to the truth and to God.

Concentrate your faith and prayer power in determined aggressiveness on that foe, the devil and his forces, and claim the victory in the name of the Lord Jesus, and you will find that nothing stands before you. Be wrestlers like Paul. Be agonizers like Epaphras. Be the intercessors that God is longing for, the men and women who will be alert and awake to the devices of the devil, and who will be ready, in union with the living Christ, to attack him, and pull down his strongholds, and give deliverance to many captives.

THE PENTECOSTAL EVANGEL

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Simeon and Anna See the Christ Lesson for January 14. Lesson Text: Luke 2:25-38

We shall never know this side of heaven how much we owe to the blessed Holy Spirit. Through His personal ministry in our lives as sinners we were led to Christ. Through His ministry in our lives as Christians our knowledge of Christ is deepened and we experience numberless blessings of every kind. Today we shall see the part this precious Spirit played in bringing an aged saint into the greatest experience of his lifetime. Our lesson may be divided as follows:

SIMEON LIVING IN THE SPIRIT Luke 2:25 "And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him." There

it is, a short, concise biography written by the Spirit Himself. Beloved, if our biography recorded in heaven reads like that, it will be sufficient to bring us an inheritance incorruptible, undefiled, and eternal. The Spirit did not say, "Behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was King Herod." No. He said, "Behold a man whose name was Simeon." And what was there outstanding about Simeon?

1. Simeon was "just," that is, Godlike, for God is just. To be just means to be righteous in word, thought and deed; it means to be holy and blameless in conduct; it means to be fair and square, impartial, "doing nothing by partiality," without respect of persons; it means to be uncompromising and loyal in regard to God, to self, and to man.

2. Simeon was "devout." Devotion has to do with the inner life of the spirit. Simeon was one who worshiped God in spirit and truth, who lived in the presence of God whom He loved and worshiped.

3. Simeon was "waiting for the consolation of Israel." He was one of those in Jerusalem who for long years had looked for the coming of the Messiah, the anointed One spoken of by the prophets, Israel's Redeemer who should save her from her sins, from the bondage of political oppression, and exalt her again as a nation.

4. "And the Holy Ghost was upon him." For the Holy Ghost will always be upon the man who lives as Simeon lived. He was a man who lived in the Spirit!

SIMEON INSTRUCTED BY THE SPIRIT Luke 2:26

Those who live in the Spirit are in a position to be taught by the Spirit. And to Simeon was given a precious revelation. "It was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ." Wouldst thou hear divine secrets? Wouldst thou have wisdom, knowledge, and understanding? Wouldst thou be taught "all things (John 14:26; 16:13)"? Wouldst thou see the Lord? Then *live* in the Spirit!

SIMEON LED BY THE SPIRIT Luke 2:27-28

"And he came by the Spirit into the temple." It was not by chance that Simeon happened into the temple just at the time that Jesus was brought there to be dedicated! For "the steps of a good man are ordered of the Lord." How many of the so-called coincidences of our lives are arranged by providence and are nothing less than the leading of the Spirit! But suppose Simeon had not been walking with God that day? Suppose he had been "out of touch"? He would have missed the greatest opportunity of his lifetime! Beloved, if we would enjoy God's best, we must hear His voice. And to hear His voice we must live within calling distance!

SIMEON SPEAKING BY THE SPIRIT Luke 2:29-35

As the aged man stood holding in his feeble arms the Saviour of the world, the same Spirit who had spoken to him and led him to the Christ, now gave him a wonderful prophetic message.

"Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, . . . for mine eyes have seen thy salvation." Observe that Simeon knew that the Babe he held in his arms was the Christ. How did he know this? By the Holy Ghost. Observe that having seen Christ, Simeon was ready to die in peace; his cherished ambition had been fulfilled. To see Christ with the eye of the spirit, to know Him as Saviour from sin—this is the



object of existence. Only the man who has seen Him is ready to die in peace.

"A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of my people Israel." To Simeon it was clearly revealed that Jesus was Saviour of the Gentiles as well as the One who should restore the glory to Israel—a revelation which was not understood by even Christ's own followers many years later! "And Joseph and his mother marvelled at those things which were spoken of Him," for they could not grasp the full significance of Simeon's supernatural utterance.

"And Simeon blessed them, and said unto Mary his mother, Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel." To those who would believe, the Christ would be a stone most precious. To those who refused Him, He would become a stone of stumbling and a rock of offence. 1 Peter 2:8.

"And for a sign which shall be spoken against." The Cross of Christ—the sign of God's love, the sign of salvation to those who would love Him, would be to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness. 1 Cor. 1:23-24.

"Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul a'so." Years later when Mary saw her son scourged, insulted, and finally crucified, Simeon's words were fulfilled. Verily, a sword of intense suffering pierced Mary's heart.

As Simeon spoke there entered the temple a godly old prophetess. She too, was among the faithfull of her day. She too, recognized the Babe as the Christ and prophesied concerning Him to all in Jerusalem who had looked for His coming.

So endeth a happy story. Beloved, let us be instructed! Blessed are they who live in the Spirit, who listen for His voice, who are sensitive to His leadership; for wonderful and thrilling shall they find life on earth, great shall be the blessing they bring to others, and great shall be the delight they bring to the heart of God I— J. Bashford Bishop

A CHILD MARTYR

A poor little African, only ten years of age, went to hear the preaching of one of the missionaries, and became through his instrumentality a convert to the Christian religion. His master (an inveterate enemy to missions), hearing of it, commanded him never to go again, and declared he would have him whipped to death if he

did. The poor little boy, in consequence of this mandate, was very miserable. He could scarcely refrain from going, yet knew his death was inevitable if he did. In this critical situation, he sought direction and assistance at the throne of Grace, and after having done this, he felt convinced that it was still his duty to attend, but to be careful that he should never interfere with his master's business, and, for the rest, to leave himself in the hands of God.

He went therefore, and on his return was summoned to his master's presence; and after much violent and abusive received five-and-twenty language, lashes, and then, in a sarcastic tone of blasphemous ridicule, his master exclaimed, "What can Jesus Christ do for you now?" "He enables me to bear it patiently," said the poor lad. "Give him five-and-twenty lashes more," said the inhuman wretch. He was obeyed. DYING WORLD AND LIVING WO

JEWS AND COMMUNISM

Congressman Martin Dies declared that Jews are not linked to Communism. One proof of this was Earl Browder's testimony before the Dies Committee that only 2,500 Jews belong to the U. S. Communist Party, says the Contemporary Jewish Record. This is only 21/2% of the Party's members.

THE PACIFYING POWER

Distribution of Bibles among the Japanese soldiers in China has had an interesting effect, says J. J. Cooksey. One commanding officer said to a colporteur: "Do not distribute any more Bibles to my men; they do not want to fight. We are here to fight, and the Bible tells them they must not fight."

A FAMINE OF THE WORD

At the conference of the Netherlands Bible Society this year it was reported, states Christian Observer, that less than one-fifth of the people of the world actually possess the Scriptures, although the Bible has been translated, in whole or in part, in more than one thousand languages spoken by nine-tenths of the world's population.

THE BIBLE AND FREEDOM

Earl Baldwin, in an address in Toronto recently, expressed his belief that Britain's disposition to attempt the solution of the international problems by honest deliberation and conference roots back into generation upon generation of Bible reading by the people of England. Certain it is, comments Alliance Weekly, that wherever the Bible has been thoughtfully read, human freedom has been assured.

ASTRONOMERS AND GOD

According to Dr. C. A. Chant, Professor of astrophysics in Toronto University, ninety per cent of today's astronomers have reached the conclusion that the universe is not the result of blind law but is regulated by a great Intelligence. In other words, scientists admit that the sun, moon, and stars are not governed by an unchangeable destiny but by a personal God. When He sees fit, a third part of them shall be darkened as written in Rev. 8:12.

THEY NEED OUR PRAYERS

Writes Paul B. Peterson, President of the Russian and Eastern European Mission: "Before Poland was invaded in September, we had received a partial list of baptisms in that country during the early part of the summer, which showed 676 new converts had entered the waters of baptism and in so doing became unmistakably marked as followers of God. All but 13 of these saints were immersed in what is now Russian Poland, and who knows how many of them already have had to pay for their faith with their lives?"

TURKEY IN PROPHECY

The mutual assistance pact which Turkey has signed with Britain and France is of great significance in the light of Bible prophecy, which indicates that the ancient Roman Empire will be revived. Instead of responding to the wooings of Germany and Russia, Turkey has agreed to be the ally of Britain and France in event of aggression leading to war in the Mediterranean area, and thus Turkey takes its place with Britain, France, Italy, Spain, and the other nations of the old Roman Empire which shall in some way be united in the end-time. Furthermore Turkey condemns as barbarous the anti-Semitic policies of Germany and Russia. The Turkish Prime Minister said not long ago: "There is not and never will be a Jewish question in Turkey." The 85,000 Jews in Turkey are dwelling among the 16,000,000 Turks in all security and are happy and prosperous.

LENGTHENING SHADOWS

Said H. R. Knickerbocker, outstanding I. N. S. correspondent, upon his return from Europe a few days ago: The present war will last for "six years or so . . . after that the real war be-gins. . . . None of us will ever live to see peace again. . . . There'll be bloodshed, and enough to go around to satisfy everybody." Surely such a picture as Knickerbocker paints will be nothing short of Armageddon.

THE SPIRIT OF ANTICHRIST

Writes Arthur McCormick in The Presbyterian: "If ever in the history of mankind the spirit of Antichrist has been manifest, that time is now. The disregard for solemn treaties, the ease with which pledges are broken, the brutal grabbing of what one wants, regardless of the suffering entailed, the lying on Brobdingnagian scale, the absence of all pity and mercy, the open denial of God and Christ, to say nothing of honor and brotherhood-all these set forth in lurid light from hell the glaring hypocrisies of humanity and the flight from Christ.'

JACOB'S WOES

According to Jewish Chronicle, the position of German Jews has undergone a sudden change for the worse. There have been street attacks on them, and they are everywhere discriminated against. Although, like the "Aryans," they get ration cards, it is difficult for them to obtain food or other commodities. They are allowed to shop only between midday and 2 p. m .- when many shops are closed for lunch. Every shopkeeper is entitled to refuse to serve Jews on the ground that his "Aryan" customers are not yet supplied. Further reports, adds Jewish Missionary Magazine, indicate that Jews have been ordered to surrender bed linen, underwear, and clothing on the ground that they were needed by the German army.

PENTECOST IN ROUMANIA

There are many thousands of Pentecostal believers in Roumania. Paul B. Peterson reports that during the summer months many Roumanian brethren because of their testimony for Christ had to appear before a military tribunal in Cernauti. The priests of the state church are in league with the gendarmes (military police), and in the smaller villages especially the believers have been ferreted out and arrested. In some instances the verdict at the trials was "Not guilty," in others fines were imposed, and in still others the meek and lowly saints were sentenced to prison. Quietly, bravely, these men with the Lamb spirit listen to their false accusers, and when sent to prison submit with a resignation that is supernatural, while their wives unflinchingly carry on at home. And in spite of persecution, the witness to the Full Gospel goes on.

THE RUSSIAN MENACE

Roger Babson says, "Russia is the controlling factor in the world today. Stalin is the greatest statesman. The whole world is hungry for peace with the possible exception of Russia. If the war becomes world-wide, Germany and Japan are likely to be lined up with England and France against her. Its duration will be determined not by navy, army, or air force, but by revolutions at home." Mr. Babson is right in ascribing such importance to Russia, the land of "Gog," for according to Ezekiel 38 and 39 it will dominate northeastern Europe and northern Asia. Whatever trend events may take, we know that God is working out His purposes in the international situation, and the swiftly approaching reign of Antichrist and the horrors of Armageddon, while painful to con-template, herald the glad day when our Lord shall return to destroy His enemies and rule the earth in righteousness.

The action of a Swiss firm, reported in The Religious Telescope, would be a good example for more of our business firms. This well known firm of Honegger undertook an extremely hazardous wrecking job. During the work the lives of the employees were constantly in danger. Upon its completion without mishap, the firm arranged for a simple thanksgiving celebration. It did not consist in feasting, music, and merrymaking, but in an address based on the Bible and given by a minister, and a prayer of thanksgiving for God's protection. "It is a matter of course," the head of the firm declared, "that we pray for our employees every morning. To God's help alone we attribute it that no accident has occurred during the dangerous undertaking."

Tulsa Workers in Training

Fourteen Assembly of God churches in Tulsa have organized a Teacher Training School, which will run for three weeks on Tuesday and Friday nights. They will complete two lessons or chapters each night. An attendance of five hundred workers is expected. The churches are dismissing their regular week night services in order to attend these special classes. There will be one class organized especially for laymen who are not connected with the Sunday School. The first session of the School was on January 2. The best and most experienced teachers to be had, have been secured to minister to these classes.

Letter from Brother Bang

"Greetings in the Name of our Lord from Bethel Home, Ningpo, China. About two months ago I was invited to have meetings for the Christian workers in Pin-yang, about three hundred miles away from Ningpo.

"Owing to war conditions, travel is very difficult these days. My assistant pastor and a student went with me, using a bamboo raft, the jinrikisha, sampan boat, motor-boat, trucks and bus as means of travel! Because of the few cars available, baggage and people were packed tightly together in the same truck like sardines in a tin-can. Once we had to get out and push! And thus we learn the lesson of patience in China.

"Air raids and highway robbers forced us to be cautious but our Lord kept His hand over us and we came through safely. Once there were so many travelers that we could not get on the bus. Later we heard that this same bus met an air raid on the way, so we praised our Lord for His wonderful care.

"At Pin-yang there were about one hundred Christian workers representing over seventy self-supporting churches. Even here in China the curse of Babel has made so many dialects and tongues that I, a Chinese, was forced to use two interpreters to speak to the gathered workers!

A New Leader Called

"These hungry ones rejoiced in opportunity to hear the Pentecostal message, and the Lord did a deeper work in their hearts. One man, a famous lawyer, came under deep conviction, made public confession, and wept through to Calvary. He decided to have a house-cleaning and got rid of several hundred dollars' worth of wines. He also made public announcement in the local newspaper that he was called to do the Lord's work! "One of our duties during these meetings was the burial service of Pastor Ling, the founder and leader of these seventy self-supporting Chinese churches. The people hardly knew what to do after the loss of their leader but God was faithful and called this lawyer to take up the work of Pastor Ling. He sold his law office and was appointed to supervise these churches. Please remember him in prayer that he may be kept true and faithful in this great responsibility.

"The Lord blessed as we continued our ministry in another place called Fong-ling. On the last day we held a healing service and about one hundred poor souls with disease and sickness came for prayer. Among them were four very serious cases carried to the church from other places, but nothing is impossible with Him, praise His Name! All four were immediately healed in answer to prayer.

"Fifty-five new converts were baptized in water in the month of August. Among them were my own two daughters, Martha and Mary. Our Bible school was opened in the middle of October. Owing to the war, most of our students could not come, yet a group of over forty fine young people are in attendance. Please pray that these young folk may grow deeper in the Lord and wiser in His ways and that we may serve our Lord acceptably while there is yet time to work."

"-AND THEY SHALL BE HEALED"

"I know God loves me; He stays beside me always!" Thus testifies Reuben Kapa, native worker in Liberia. Lois Shelton forwards to us Reuben's own story of God's mighty working in healing power in his church at Cavalla. A woman in the town had been critically ill

for three weeks, unable to leave her mat.



One Sunday they carried her to the church for prayer. "They put her

down in front of the altar," said Reuben, "then I pray, pray, for about one hour. Then God's Spirit caught hold of me and I laid my hands on her. After that God's Spirit caught her too. Then while I pray she wake up. She jump up quick and begin to dance and praise God. She went out in the town and began to run around praising God!

"All the Christians and heathen people too, they praise God for they see God has power. We stay long, stay long before we leave the church that day. A few days afterwards the woman's family come from Doyea to cry for her because she would die soon. When they got there, the woman was out on the farm cutting rice!

God Has Power!

"The next Sunday another woman who had been bad sick for a long time was carried to the church. We prayed for her and she was healed the same way. I never see that thing before! "When I pray for people, then a few hours after or a few days they get better but THAT SAME HOUR God healed those two women! All the heathen people in town talk that God has power and this time the church house is

full, besides people standing on the outside." Reuben is one who does not fear man or devil. When one in his church misses the way, the erring one is admonished and prayed for and must make public confession to the church if he wishes to be restored to fellowship.

Recently he rebuked a woman who tried to expound a doctrine of rankest fanaticism in his church. She threatened that his oldest son would die if he did not allow her to give God's message. He said, "I told her the thing she talked was not in the Bible so I did not believe it. I know I have God's Spirit, so I don't fear anything she talks. God will protect my son!" Reuben is joining the Native Workers' class in the Bible school so that he may be better equipped to lead his people deeper into the things of God. We praise God for such devoted hearts as Reuben's, and pray that many more shall be raised up in Liberia to carry the Word to their people.

Two little girls to one brick! But each one doing her part! From the smallest to the oldest they have labored together, missionaries and orphans alike carrying bricks, mixing mortar, laying bricks, raising scaffolds in order that the house of the Lord might be erected.

Maynard Ketcham, missionary stationed at Purulia, writes that their labors have come to an end unless more funds come in, and the house of God is yet unfinished. Poor as they are the Indian Christians raised enough money to pay for at least half the bricks in the walls which faithful and loving labor has erected. Friends at home have supplied the rest, but now four hundred dollars is needed for the roof, floor, plaster, and benches.

This is a very real need for the Christians of Purulia have no proper place to worship. The narrow verandah which is now used is far from suitable for Pentecostal meetings. For revival services the only available space is an open field.

Won't some of the friends at home meet this need in the same sense of love and loyalty and responsibility as that with which the little orphans carried their bricks for the building of the house of God? All offerings designated for

Africa is one of our most fruitful mission fields at this time. Numbers are being saved and filled with the Holy Spirit on many of the stations, new sections are being opened up to gospel work, and heathen chiefs as well as little groups of believers are calling for workers where, in many instances, there are none to send. Our one hundred missionaries are being assisted by more than one hundred and twenty native ministers

and still the number is far too small to adequately handle the task.

Funds are needed just now for sending out native workers into new parts, for opening new fields, erecting chapels, opening Bible schools and building mission bungalows to accommodate the new recruits. Your investment in Africa will bring forth good returns in the salvation of precious souls and the establishing of the native church.

These itinerant trips are trying on the flesh cold and hunger and blisters and not very comforting! But, praise God, Jesus passed this way before for He had no place "to lay His head." AMONG FIJIAN INDIANS

"Another year," write Lawrence and Bertha Borst, "is almost gone and we seem to have accomplished so little of all that we had hoped to do! But we praise God for His grace and mercy toward us this past year.

"The Lord has enabled us to see some growth, some blossoms and even some fruit of our labors among the Indians in Fiji. Our staff of seven Sunday School teachers has nearly doubled, the increase coming mainly from converts out of homes where the relatives are still heathen. Their firm, steadfast testimony among their own people has meant a great deal to us.

> "By intensive work in the area near our meeting places, and extensive work far out into the bush, we have been able to reach many hundreds, even thousands, of souls with a clear presentation of the gospel. Hundreds of Hindi Gospels and scores of New Testaments have been sold in this work.

A Religious People

"It is comparatively easy to talk with Indian people about religion. They are religiously inclined and the mere mention of God, the hereafter, salvation, or sacrifice is sufficient to begin a conversation which will last

for hours. The difficulty is that nothing is accomplished this way. A direct, hard-hitting message of sin and atonement brings conviction but much Hindu rubbish must be cleared away before it is possible to get an assent to the need of salvation through the Lamb of God. The way to win Hindus is through Holy Ghost power, and signs—especially healing.

"In general we may rejoice in an advance over the power of Hinduism although the failure of some who have slipped into inconsistent living and even into direct opposition has brought sorrow. We can only pray that God will grant us wisdom in dealing with these few and that they will be brought back to full surrender.

"We do earnestly seek your prayers that the new year will bring to Fiji the long-awaited revival in torrents of God's blessing."

OUTSIDE THE TELEPHONE BOOTH

It was after midnight when we parked in front of a taproom. There were two of them at this busy intersection, both crowded, judging by the number of cars parked outside. All other business houses were closed. There was not even a filling station open. We did not wish to enter the place, but it was our only chance to place a long distance death message.

Inside we beheld a horrible picture. Two godless bartenders, who looked hard as steel, were pouring out liquor as rapidly as they could. The customers were not hardened criminals. They were not the old saloon crowd of thirty years ago. No, the customers were *your* sons and daughters, nephews and nieces—high school and college youth. Some of them were sick, drunken with too much liquor.

No wonder J. Edgar Hoover, head of the G-men, was compelled to tell women's clubs of Kansas City that: "There are at present in this civilized nation over three and one half times more criminals than there are students in our colleges and universities. . . . Each home is threatened by an army of four and one-half million criminals. . . . Crime is basically a youth problem. In the last year eighteen per cent of the persons arrested were under twenty-one years of age. They account for thirteen per cent of the murderers, twenty-eight per cent of the robbers, forty-two per cent of the burglars, thirty per cent of the thieves, fifty-one per cent of the car thieves, and twenty-four per cent of the rapists arrested in the United States. These youths are the living examples of neglected home training and the failure of society to properly meet its obligation to the younger generation."

Mr. Hoover declared that without the aid and backing of the mothers in the homes, the work of the enforcement officers in behalf of law and order would be very difficult, if not in vain.

"Discipline," he said, "in my opinion, is more and more the need of the modern home. Either you will teach your children discipline, or the world will teach them discipline in ways that will be destructive of their individual happiness. You have no choice—either they will learn discipline at home, or they will learn it from an antagonistic environment. Not only they and you will suffer in the latter event, but society at large will incur grievous loss."

Fathers! Mothers! Grandparents! Uncles! Aunts! Are you alarmed at this situation? Aren't some of *your* young people involved? Young people are heady; talk to them about their *danger* and they may become angry. A silent messenger, backed by earnest prayer, can accomplish much. Your silent messenger might be the *Christ's Ambassadors Herald*.
