# The Coming of Christ

#### Christ's Return to Earth

When Christ comes as the Saviour of Israel in their hour of coming distress, "His feet shall stand in that day upon the Mount of Olives." He will, at that time, literally come to the earth. He will not come alone, but "all the saints (will come) with him." Zech. 14:4, 5. This coming will fulfill Rev. 19:11-21, where "heaven is opened and one on a white horse" comes forth, identified as "The Word of God," and "King of kings, and Lord of lords." He will be "crowned with many crowns," and "in righteousness he doth judge and make war." The Beast, frequently spoken of as Antichrist, and the false prophet will be taken, and both will be "cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone."

It will be a memorable day when Jesus takes to Himself His power and comes to destroy lawlessness. Following Him will be "the armies which were in heaven, upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean."

#### The Church With Him

Who may these armies be? Their apparel identifies them as the Church, the Lamb's wife. When His wife had made herself ready, to her was granted that "she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white." Now, after the marriage supper of the Lamb, the Church which has followed the lowly suffering Saviour becomes militant in its following Him, still clothed in "fine linen, white and clean." Since the armies mentioned are the Church, there seems to be no other than the Church that can fulfill the description given in Zechariah—"all the saints with Thee."

After the marriage supper, the time comes for fulfillment of the many promises of government given to the overcomer. We have briefly considered the reward for careful trading, and the promise given to the twelve apostles. Other promises are, "And he that overcometh, and keepeth my works unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron; as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers: even as I received of my Father." Rev. 2:26, 27. This promise appears ruthless. But God through His Word is faithful to show us the severity of the overthrow of the Beast and the false prophet, together with those who array themselves with them to make war with our Christ when He comes to reign.

#### Treading the Winepress

Let us never forget that our meek and lowly Jesus is also a Man of war. When the cup of iniquity of this world is completely filled, the nations will be likened to "the clusters of the vine of the earth," and will be cast into the great winepress of the wrath of God. Rev. 14:18, 19. The day of the destruction of the forces of evil is described in Isaiah 63. "Who is this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? This that is glorious in His apparel, traveling in the greatness

of His strength? I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save. Wherefore art Thou red in Thine apparel, and Thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat? I have trodden the winepress alone . . . for I will tread them in Mine anger, and trample them in My fury. . . . For the day of vengeance is in Mine heart, and the year of My redeemed is come." redeemed mentioned here? Who are His redeemed mentioned here? They are the Jews. When will He tread down the wicked in His anger? When He comes to fight for Israel, to consign Antichrist to the lake of fire, and to reign in righteousness. It is the time when He comes and all His saints with Him to the Mount of Olives.

#### Kingdom and Dominion

This time is described in Daniel seven. First we are shown the great imperial world empires from Babylon to the close of the age. Their last form is shown to be dominion by "a little horn," which comes into power after the Roman Empire is revived under a ten kingdom confederacy, spoken of as "ten horns." The Beast, the little horn, will be slain "and his body destroyed, and given to the burning flame."

Then we see our Lord Jesus, "like the Son of man, come to the Ancient of Days" —"and there was given Him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve Him: His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom that which shall not be destroyed." "And the kingdom and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey Him."

Consider this promise of "kingdom and dominion," which "shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High," as a promise either to Israel or to the Church and it fits in well with the events to take place when Jesus comes to reign. The Church will rule from the heavenlies, Israel will rule from Jerusalem. To the Church the promise is given, "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with Me in My throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with My Father in His throne." Great are the events, marvelous the changes, and glorious the promises to the faithful.

#### NINETEENTH GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD

The Civic Auditorium at Minneapolis, Minnesota, has been secured for the 1941 General Council. The General Presbyters will meet, the Lord willing, on September 3 and 4. The General Council will open on Thursday evening, September 4, with a Rally at the Civic Auditorium, and business will be opened in the same building on Friday morning, September 5, at 9:30 a. m. It is expected that the General Council will continue until September 11. Pray much for this gathering.

#### First the Rapture

But before the saints, as "the armies of heaven," accompany Christ in His conquest against Antichrist and lawlessness, and for the deliverance of Israel, they will have shared in that glorious promise to the Church often spoken of as "the Rapture." Before the marriage of the Lamb takes place, the Church, as the Lamb's wife, must be "caught up to meet the Lord in the air."

We regret that controversies have arisen as to when our Lord will come. Some affirm that He will not come for the Church until after the great tribulation. Others believe His coming for "those who love His appearing," will take place three and one half years before the battle of Armageddon. Those who take this latter view believe that the catching away of the man child spoken of in Revelation 12, represents the catching away of the Church. Such able exponents as Seiss and Stevens feel there will be different catchings away. They believe the elders mentioned in Rev. 4:4 represent a group of overcomers; that the great multitude which "come up out of the great tribulation," is another group; that possibly the hundred, forty and four thousand sealed from the tribes of Israel, later seen upon the Mount Zion, are an election from Israel; and that the man child represents a further and perhaps larger company than any of the others.

Since, in the study of prophecy "we see through a glass, darkly," it seems unwise for anyone to be too dogmatic as to his absolute rightness. We may mistake as to details. It becomes specially unfortunate when the glorious message of Christ's coming becomes, instead of a word of comfort, a theme of controversy.

Since Christ is coming for the Church before He comes with the Church, there must be two purposes connected with what we often call His second coming. National Israel has no promise of being "caught up to meet the Lord in the air." The Church has. "For the Lord Himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." 1 Thess. 4: 16, 17.

It is evident that the marriage supper does not take place on the earth, for, after the supper, our Lord Jesus as King of kings descends to the earth to execute vengeance on Antichrist and lawlessness. And when He comes to do so the Church, the armies of heaven, wearing their fine linen garments, will accompany Him. He cannot come "and all the saints with" Him until after He has come to gather them to Him. The Church must therefore be caught away to meet the Lord in the air before the marriage of the Lamb is come.

#### The Trumpet Mysteries

Claiming that the mystery that is to be fulfilled during the sounding of the seventh angel (Rev. 10:7) to be the fulfillment of the mystery of the change that is to take place in the redeemed when Christ comes for His own (1 Cor. 15:51), may not be correct. In fact some things indicate that it is not correct. In the first place the trumpet connected with the mystery in

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Rev. 10:7 is the sounding of a judgment angel, while the trump that calls the redeemed to immortality is "the trump of God." Moreover, the sounding of the judgment angel covers a period of time while the trump of God brings immediate fulfillment, "changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye at the last trump." Then the judgment trumpet has to do with the mystery that God had declared to His servants the prophets concerning Christ and His earthly government. "And the seventh angel sounded; and there were great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ; and He shall reign forever and ever." Rev. 11:15. In contrast, the trump of God, mentioned in connection with immortality, is associated with the time when "the dead in Christ shall rise first, then we which are alive and remain, shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air.'

#### Preaching the Second Coming

Those who teach that the Church must go through the Tribulation cannot successfully preach present expectation of Christ's coming. "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh," and, "Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." If anything is put between our present situation and His coming, naturally one looks for that something between to take place before the coming of the Lord can be expected. Let those who believe in the post-tribulation argue as they will, they are looking for the tribulation, and not for the coming of our Lord Jesus. The tribulation stands between them and "the blessed hope."

#### Daniel's Seventieth Week

It is generally believed that the seventieth week spoken of in Dan. 9:27 will be the last week of years of the present age, coming to its close in the Battle of Armageddon, the sixty-nine weeks of years having been fulfilled at the time that "Messiah was cut off." After cutting off of Messiah "the people of the prince that shall come," the Romans, should "destroy the city," Jerusalem, "and the sanctuary." The prince is to make a covenant with many for one week, or seven years, and in the midst of the week of years break that covenant. "And he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease."

We have read certain translations that have tried to make the prince mentioned here to be Messiah and we have read writings of certain commentators who have tried to do likewise. To interpret this Scripture as teaching that Jesus would, through His sacrifice, make the sacrifice and oblation to cease does not harmonize with this writer's understanding. When Jesus finished His ministry by dying on the cross. He did not make the Jewish sacrifice and oblation to cease. They were continued until A. D. 70 when "the people of the prince," the Romans, came and destroyed the city and the sanctuary. Neither did Jesus ever enter into a seven-year covenant. His was "the everlasting covenant." His blood is as effective now as when it was shed upon the cross.

We must therefore believe that the covenant under consideration has another than Jesus in mind. How easily it is simplified by seeing that the prince whose peo-

ple destroyed the city, is the same prince who will make a covenant with the Jews whereby they will again have access to the temple site at Jerusalem, re-establish offering their sacrifices, which they have been deprived of since Jerusalem was destroyed, and that after they have enjoyed this privilege for three and a half years the prince will break the covenant and "cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease."

This is in harmony with Revelation eleven where "the holy city shall they (the gentiles) tread under foot forty and two months," or three and a half years. It is during this time that God gives power unto His two witnesses who will finally be killed by the Beast, to be raised from the dead after three days and a half, and caught up to heaven in a cloud.

#### A New Testament Mystery

Believing that we are on Jewish ground when we consider the seventy weeks, since the seventy weeks "are determined upon Daniel's people, the Jews, and upon the holy city," we need to look to the New Testament for the relation of the Church to these events. When God deals with Israel He uses time. We prefer saying He uses time, to saying He sets dates. Seven weeks, or forty-nine years, should be oc-cupied with the rebuilding of the temple and city after the Babylonian exile. Then there should be sixty-two weeks from the end of that period before Messiah should be cut off, or Jesus sacrificed. If the seventieth week, or seven years, has not yet been fulfilled, and it seems it has not, then something has been taking place during all this period since the crucifixion of Christ and the present. We believe it is the time of the Church age in which God has been choosing a heavenly people.

While God set dates in relation to Israel, He has not set dates in relation to the The Church is distinctly a New Church. Testament mystery, "which in other ages was not made known unto the sons of men." Eph. 3:5. If the sixty-nine weeks of Daniel nine have been finished, and if the seventieth week has not yet begun, then the mystery of the Church must have been in the mind of God to be fulfilled between the sixty-ninth and the seventieth week. How long the Church age was to be, God has not told us. He has told us to "watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." The coming of Christ is the "blessed hope" of the Church, and His coming is for those "who love His appearing." We are not to try to determine dates, "but know this that if the good man of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up."

We are living in perilous times. The spirit of Antichrist is working with vigor. The age must be near its close, world events tell us so. It is time for those of the Church to "take heed—lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch therefore, and pray always that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the son of man." Luke 21:36. "Because thou hast kept the word of my patience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth. Behold I come quickly: hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown." Rev. 3:10, 11.

The Church may study "the signs of the times" to see how world events are fitting in with Biblical prophecy, but it need not look for Antichrist before our Lord comes for His own. At least the last half of the seventieth week of Daniel will be a time of wrath when judgment angels will pour out the vials of the wrath of Almighty God. The Church has "not been appointed unto wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ." Instead of looking for Antichrist, we are to look for "that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us that He might redeem us from all iniquity and purify unto Himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works." "Even so come, Lord Jesus."

Israel has a great future to be ushered in by the coming of Christ as their king to the Mount of Olives. The Church has a great future through the coming of Christ with the voice of the archangel and the trump of God to catch the Church away to meet the Lord in the air.

#### "On the Verge of an Apocalypse"

A few years ago the great Jewish leader, Israel Zangwill, died. He was called by his people the Voice of Israel. Among his many writings is a poem entitled "Blind Children" which is indeed prophetic of his own race. In it he describes the contentment of blind boys and girls happy at their play, with no knowledge in their blindness of the world's true beauty. As if, in a spirit of understanding and comradeship, he asks,

#### "How would they know or feel They are in darkness?"

and then as he visualizes the wonder of possible sight coming to them, he exclaims:

"But—O the miracle! If a Redeemer came, Laid finger on their eyes— One touch and what a world Newborn in loveliness.

"Spaces of green and sky, Hulls of white cloud adrift, Ivy-grown college walls, Shining loved faces.

"What a dark world—who knows? Ours to inhabit is! One touch, and what a strange Glory might burst on us. What a hid universe!

"Do we sport carelessly, Blindly upon the verge Of an Apocalypse?"

The last three lines are sadly true of poor blinded Israel. May their "unveiling" come soon!

### Our God Still Lives

**H**AVE you considered the nature of the enemy that pursued the children of


Israel out of Egypt? Pharaoh's hosts were following hard after the Israelites to swallow them up and take them back into captivity. They were thirsting for revenge, because they had lost their firstborn. They were taskmasters deprived of their slaves. Then they had suffered under the ten plagues, and they were anxious to vent their rage, to satisfy their lust on the children of God.

God's people were in a very tight place. Egypt behind and the sea in front! To advance by their own power was impossible, and to retreat was equally impossible. But God cared for His own. Every one was blood-bought. They were not bought by Pharaoh's taskmasters. They belonged to God, and not to Pharaoh. Jehovah could be trusted to preserve His own from all evil.

evil. Moses said to the people, "Fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord." The hardest part of the whole thing was to stand still when the enemy was rushing up behind. They would hear the noise of the enemy's chariots, but Jehovah's leader instructed them, "Stand still." And the louder the enemy's chariot wheels rumbled, the stiller they stood. Learn to enter into the stillness of faith.

into the stillness of faith. Then the Lord said unto Moses, "Speak unto the children of Israel that they go forward. Lift thou up thy rod and stretch out thine hand over the sea, and divide it: and the children of Israel shall go on dry land through the midst of the sea." There was a miracle, and the dry ground in the midst of the sea gave to Jehovah's people a sure footing. All went over. Not a baby lost to the enemy! Not a hoof left behind for Pharaoh and his host!

That which was life and safety for the Israelites was made death and destruction to the Egyptians. God was biding His time, harkening and listening, and in due season brought His judgment on Israel's persecutors. God had His Moses on hand to say the right word at the right moment, and to do the right thing at the right time.



And at the time of a greater exodus, when God's spiritual Israel shall be caught away from the clutch of a greater than Pharaoh, He will have a greater leader than Moses to guide His people. Pharaoh is dead, but the spirit that animated Pharaoh is not dead. Moses died, but the Spirit that animated Moses is not dead. The victory that is ahead for the children of God in the next and greater exodus—the Rapture—will be just as perfect and complete.

Don't be afraid of the Red Sea. Thereby you will see God's power manifested the more. Our God is the God of miracles still. God will vindicate Himself, and if He cannot do so through the people He has now chosen, He will choose others. Those who went through the Red Sea failed Him, and He had to raise up another generation. Those who failed to enter in, failed because of unbelief. They passed the Red Sea, but they turned back in their hearts to Egypt. They were not weaned from the things of Egypt. They preferred the garlic of Egypt to the grapes of Eschol. The spies feared because they saw the giants. They should have remembered the dead bodies on the shores of the Red Sea. The giants of Canaan were no greater foes than the armed soldiers and iron chariots of Pharaoh.

David had no fear of giants, and declared, "The Lord that delivered me out of the paw of the lion and out of the paw of the bear, He will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine." David had faith that the Lord who had delivered him from two beasts would deliver him from the Philistine giant. And the Lord will likewise give you power over all the power of the enemy if you will have a living faith in Him. We should not trust in ourselves, but in God "which raiseth the dead: who hath delivered us, and doth deliver; in whom we trust that He will yet deliver."


Just as those who were led and encouraged by Joshua were able to put their feet on the necks of the kings of Canaan, so will the saints tread on the necks of the kings of Satan. The God of the children of Israel is still alive. The God who heard David's expression of faith is still alive. The God who heard the prayers of Daniel in the lions' den is still alive. The God of the three Hebrew children is still alive. And He is more than a match for Pharaoh, and the Philistine and Nebuchadnezzar.

Those who believe in God and His power, in Christ the Son, and in the Holy Ghost, are more than a match for the trinity of hell. Happy are those people whose God is the Lord. We may not experimentally have entered into all this; but this is the ideal, and by faith we should move on up to the actual inheritance of these promises of the living God.

# The Need for Spiritual Rain

News has just reached us of the home going of the writer of this article, our beloved Albert Weaver of Springfield, Mass. For many years he was associated with A. B. Simpson in the Christian and Missionary Alliance; but later, having received the Baptism in the Spirit, with Pentecostal work. He was a prolific tract writer. He especially loved to labor among Jewish people, and made no less than twenty missionary trips to the Orient.

Brother Weaver had reached the ripe age of 76. His funeral service was conducted by Robert A. Brown of New York. We desire to express our sympathy to his only son, Howard Weaver of Springfield, Mass.

Before leaving the Holy Land in April, 1927, there had been a drought. All vegetation was drooping for lack of rain. Much of the grain was well advanced, but at yet, not headed. Finally rain came. Everything took on a new appearance. Vegetation seemed to go forward to maturity by leaps and bounds. This gladdened all hearts, especially the tillers of the soil. I said as I saw what had taken place, "Is this not beautiful? Now I understand what is meant in the Scripture by 'the latter rain,' its necessity, and its place in the physical world."

This rain comes in the Holy Land just at the end of the season, at the time when the grain most needs rain, to cause it to develop or head up and ripen for harvest. If it were not so, much of the grain would wither and be good for nothing. The more I thought about this, the more I was impressed, and finally I saw its analogy in the spiritual world, its significance and application to the present-day situation.

Was there ever a time when spiritual rain was more needed, when more was said about the need of a revival (or better, the outpouring of the Spirit of God), and of the coming of Christ?

If there is to be an outpouring of the Holy Spirit, there must first be not only the need, but it must be a recognized need. We, His people, must see and feel our own need as well as the universal need. Then we must seek to prepare the way for its supply.

Revivals are *always* in order if conditions are right. We who have lived through some of the past revivals cannot forget



them. What an impetus to faith they have been to God's people! What a blessing in the ingathering of souls. The downpour of the Spirit that awaits us now and is so much needed, we believe is for the development and ripening of God's spiritual grain, His own people. It will be in power, blessing, and manifestation, surpassing all previous revivals and outpourings of the Spirit, but probably of short duration.

Will this not have a tremendous effect upon the unsaved, and result in a great ingathering of souls, as at Pentecost? The world at large has lost sight of God, and, to a great extent, has become materialistic and atheistic, with very little conviction concerning God's claims. Indifference, a letting down in Christian fundamentals and morals, lawlessness—these largely prevail.

Often, too, has it been said of late by individuals: "We love your Christ as portrayed in the New Testament, but we have no use for your Christianity." This is no doubt due to the low standard of Christian life, due to conformity to the world, due to a lack of transformation to the will of God on the part of those who profess to follow Him and who are representatives of the cross of Christ.

What a wonderful effect the "former rain" or outpouring of the Spirit on the day of Pentecost had upon the world! His followers prepared the way for it by heeding His command to *tarry before Him*. Its effect was tremendous upon saint and sinner, and we feel its power today. Can it not be so again? If so, we, His people, must see the need individually, desire it, and prepare the way. The experience of the one hundred and twenty in the upper room in Jerusalem is for us. And also that which followed—great power and great grace. Acts 4:33.

Some one may ask: "What preparation is necessary?" The Spirit of God alone can reveal this to each one. As Christ humbled Himself, so must we if we are to know His mind, and if we are to know our own condition. God will be enquired of. It is true that He knows and understands our needs before we ask Him, but that we should inquire of Him seems to be one of His irrevocable laws.

The need now for an outpouring of the Spirit upon His people, God's spiritual grain, is not only a necessity, but it is urgent. We are in the great apostasy, and spiritual drought is visible everywhere. If we are to have this blessed manifestation of the Spirit upon the Church, we must admit our failure to come up to God's standards and to our privileges in the gospel. Is not the need, then, that we, His people, be much in prayer, individually and collectively, in private and in public, humble ourselves—fasting if necessary—until God hears and answers? He has given us clear instructions: "Ask ye of the Lord rain in the time of the latter rain." Zech. 10:1.

Said Elijah after believing prayer: "There is a sound of abundance of rain." God grant that it may be so now.

## How to Pray for a Revival

Last September I was given a most precious lesson how to pray for, and how to wait for, The Revival. It shone out from the story of the woman of Samaria, John 4:5-30. The lesson began with the tenth verse: "If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith unto thee, Give me to drink, thou wouldst have asked of Him and He would have given thee living water."

In this verse I saw two things, first, Jesus Himself gave her a prayer. Second, He gave her His promise that if she presented that prayer, He would give her the thing she asked for. In verse 15 I got the third step. She presented that prayer He had put into her mouth. She did so in utter sinfulness and ignorance. She had not the faintest idea of what she was asking, but she presented the prayer, "Sir, give me this water that I thirst not, neither come here to draw." Fourth step, now the Lord stood bound to fulfill His own promise and give her this "living water."

But it was an utter impossibility to give her that living water at once. There were impossibilities in her own soul that must be dealt with before even the Lord Himself could give her what He had promised. But He had promised, therefore these impossibilities were His—it was on Him to meet and conquer whatever obstacles stood in the way between that prayer and the promised answer. This was the fifth step of my lesson—the obstacles were His.

And how He did meet and conquer them! He laid His hand upon her sins, even "all things that ever she did." He showed her that her religiousness was all wrong, He brought her in helpless bewilderment and sin to cry out, "I know that Messias cometh; when He is come, He will tell us all things." This was step six. Then came the glorious fulfillment of the promise, He gave her the "living water" in one breath, "I that speak unto thee am He." And what an ample answer it was! Not only a well of water in her, springing up into everlasting life, it became at once a river of living water flowing out to the

The great American nation has today, as repeatedly through her history, a President who recognizes God, and who recently stated, "This nation will continue through the will of God." From American shores have

whole city. This ample answer is the seventh step of my lesson.

Now for the parallel, Luke 11:2-13. The same Lord has given me a prayer, and told me to pray it, "When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven." He has in the verses following given me a sevenfold reiterated promise that, if I present that prayer, it shall be answered, even to the giving of the "All power in heaven and in earth." I am presenting this prayer with its three petitions for the "friend who has come unto me in his journey, and I cannot meet his need." These three petitions are the three loaves that will meet his every need. I am presenting it for my fam-ily, for our congregation, for our missionaries, for the whole body of Christ now on earth, for the whole world, that "the earth may be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea."

The prayer is mine, for He gave it. The answer is mine, for He has promised it seven times over; and I hallow His name by taking His promise at par. The impossibilities that lie between the prayer and the answer-these are His, not mine, and He is able to deal with them. My part is now to wait for the answers "as they that watch for the morning, I say more than they that watch for the morning." Psalm 130:1-6. They that watch for the morning are never troubled with the fear that the morning will fail to come. It often seems very long in coming; but there is no anxiety that it will not come, or that it will be one half minute behind time either. So I can watch for these answers.

While waiting for these answers that are coming on with the "zeal of the Lord" behind them, I will sing out as the Psalmist does, "Let God's people hope in the Lord, for with the Lord there *is* mercy, and with Him is *plenteous* redemption, even *complete* redemption, for He shall redeem Israel from the *all* his iniquities." There is a wonterful Revival ahead.—Anna Ross.

gone missionaries to the ends of the earth, and through the American Bible Society, Bibles in many tongues. Revivals, campmeetings, street preaching, radio preaching have brought the gospel to the attention of every section of the nation. For all this we are profoundly thankful. This great nation also has befriended the Jew, and the present favorite national song, "God Bless America," was written by a Jewish music writer, Irving Berlin.

Are there ominous rumbles along the horizon? The current issue of *Reader's Digest* contains a thought-provoking article, "Uncle Sam Arms Alaska," which tells of the intensive program now under way, 24 hours a day, and seven days a week, for Alaskan defense. At the Anchorage air base some 6500 soldiers are facing their first winter in the north . . . from Texas, Carolina, and Alabama. Between Alaska and Soviet Russia are only 56 miles of

open water, this states, and islands between bring the distance down to almost nothing. To quote, "Southeastern Alaska is only 700 miles from Seattle, little more than the distance from London to Berlin, three hours easy bomber flight. The whole Pacific Coast, and even parts of the Middle West would be within range of long distance bombers based in Alaska. . . Perhaps the Japanese-Nazi pact holds no threat for our Pacific Northwest. Perhaps there is no menace in the fact that the new Great Northern Sea Route, and Stalin Air Route, whose commercial plans fly daily within 60 miles of the United States, makes Russia the most important military power at the top of the world. But our Army and Navy are taking no chances."

The article speaks of Japanese fishing in "odd places, the natives say, using curious tackle consisting of a long line, and a sounding lead," and of the "well-liked little Japanese laundryman at Sitka who died recently and was buried, to the surprise of the authorities, in the official uniform of a commander of the Japanese navy. ... Obviously the only way to defend a country like this is by a series of navy, air, and submarine bases ... and planes, planes, planes."

But the saint knows a better weapon than "planes, planes, planes;" it is "prayer, prayer, prayer." Let us pray constantly for America and her rulers.

We believe that every Christian in America should also supplicate for divine assistance for Great Britain in this hour of extremity that religious liberty may con-tinue? We remember that Wyclif's Bible was published in England in 1380, Tyndale's in 1525, Coverdale's in 1535, and the accepted English Bible, the King James Version, in 1611, has been Britain's gift to the world for over 300 years. She gave the Wesleys, Whitefield, Spurgeon, Booth, and the Salvation Army. She gave Sunday Schools through Robert Raikes. She gave missions to the heathen, in their pioneer stages. She gave David Livingstone to Africa, Robert Morrison to China, and Wm. Carey to India. Millions of Bibles, in a thousand tongues, have gone to the heathen from her shores, through the British and Foreign Bible Society, and other agencies. Great Christian hymns like "Rock of Ages," "Jesus Lover of My Soul," "Abide with Me," and thousands of others, have come from her.

The American nation recognizes that when the tyranny of an ignorant and bigoted Anglican priesthood caused a godly section of the nation to flee the tyranny of Church and State in the "Mayflower," Britain then gave of her best.

It is admitted that gospel testimony in England of late years has been at a low ebb, the public at large no longer frequenting church and gospel halls. Tract publishers acknowledge tract distribution has been on the wane. Open-air meetings which were formerly to be seen in every town on Sunday nights are infrequently met, and the average working man has no contact with gospel preaching. Yet now, in the day of judgment, may come the revival much prayed for, and a rare day of opportunity for the gospel there. For war has come, sorrow, fear, separation, death. Homes have been broken up, and there has been a shaking everywhere, so it may be that "the things

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which have happened . . . have fallen out rather unto the furtherance of the gospel."

As we pray for divine intervention in the hour of dire need, and for supernatural assistance, we are encouraged by the remembrance of the miracle of Dunkirk, fol-lowing the day of prayer, May 26, 1940, and the equally remarkable storm sent upon the English channel, following the second day of prayer, September 8, 1940. Many witnesses tell of angelic help during the last war, in times of utter extremity, and who has not heard the story of the Angel of Mons? Shall we, like the Sadducees, be too ready to discount such stories, or ask again for divine help?

An angel was present in Paul's hour of peril upon the sea. "There stood by me this night the angel of the Lord, whose I am and whom I serve, saying, Fear not, Paul, thou must be brought before Caesar." His life's work would yet see completion.

An angel came to timorous Gideon, as he threshed wheat to hide it from the Mid-ianites. "The Lord is with thee thou mighty man of valor," was the angel's cry, and Gideon was enabled to fight the battles of the Lord.

An angel with his sword drawn in his hand appeared to Joshua as he was by Jericho, the formidable walled city. "Art thou for us, or for our adversaries?" asked Joshua. "Nay but as Captain of the host of the Lord am I now come," was the reply. No doubt this was the Angel of the Covenant.

Angelic hosts were made visible at the prayer of Elisha, when, at sight of the attacking forces of the Syrians, his servant cried, "Alas my master! how shall we do?" Elisha cried: "Lord, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see!" And he saw, and behold the mountain was full of horses and chariots, round about Elisha." Still, the "chariots of God are twenty thousand." He is able to deliver!

Two angels were sent at the time of the destruction of Sodom to hasten Lot from the doomed city. Angels had previously warned faithful Abraham of its impending doom, commissioning him to pray. How often angels are connected with times" of prayer!

Angels were present in Jacob's hour of danger, as he went to meet Esau. "Jacob went on his way, and the angels of God met him."

An angel was sent to minister to the exhausted Elijah. Who is more open to danger than a servant of God following such valiant victories as the courageous Elijah had had upon Mount Carmel, praying down fire from heaven and then rain?

Angels were present at the death of poverty-stricken Lazarus. No commission had been vouchsafed him to alter his condition in life, but when he breathed his last, they were present with their tender ministry, and "carried him to Abraham's bosom." Many times no earthly deliverance may be apparent, yet the angels may not

be far away. "The angel of the Lord by night opened the prison doors" (Acts 5:19), and brought forth the apostles who had been put in the common prison, following a period of great power in their ministry, when, "by the hands of the apostles were many signs and wonders wrought among the people." They did not escape persecution, for they obeyed

the angel's commission to "Go and stand in

the temple and speak." v. 24. An angel came when "prayer was made without ceasing of the church" and brought Peter, whose execution was set for the following morning, out of prison. Times of extremity, in Scriptural accounts, repeatedly called forth the ministry of angels. In connection with Acts 12:7, "the angel of the Lord came . . . smote Peter, saying, Arise up quickly . . . " C. H. Spurgeon has said, "If we fear the Lord, we may look for timely interposition when our case is at its worst. Angels are not kept from us by storms, nor hindered by darkness. Seraphs think it no humiliation to visit the poorest of the heavenly family. If angels' visits are few and far between at ordinary times, they shall be present in our nights of tempest and tossing. Is this an hour of dis-tress with you? Then ask for peculiar help. Jesus is the Angel of the Covenant, and if His presence be now earnestly sought it will not be denied. What that presence brings is heart cheer." "Be of good cheer; it is I. Be not afraid," cried Christ to the troubled and storm-tossed disciples, as He came to them walking upon the sea.

The current copy of Reader's Digest carries an article entitled, "Fear Over Holly-wood." This calls to our mind the remarkable prophecy of Zeph. 1:14, "The mighty man shall cry there bitterly." This entire chapter appears closely related to conditions today: "The great day of the Lord is near, it is near and hasteth greatly. . . . That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of wasteness and desolation, a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick darkness, a day of the trumpet and alarm against the fenced cities and against the high towers. And I will bring distress upon men that they shall walk like blind men, because they have sinned against the Lord. . . . Neither their silver nor their gold shall be able to deliver them in the day of the Lord's wrath."

The newspapers with their modern terms telling of sirens, air alarms, blackouts, smoke screens, rapidity of motion, wasteness and desolation upon many cities and countries, and toppling church steeples, and laws that no money may be removed from participating countries, could not picture today more clearly. "Men's hearts failing them for fear," said Jesus, and heart failure was never before as common as today. For the rejector of the Lord has no ground for confidence. "I will mock when your fear cometh," is God's statement. No angelic ministry promised there.

Throughout the Book of Revelation the increasing activity of angelic beings as we approach the end of the age, is clearly indicated. As an angel brought the annunciation to Mary, and angelic hosts sang at Christ's birth; as angelic beings ministered to Him at the conclusion of His fast in the wilderness, and ministered to Him in Gethsemane; and as twelve legions were ready to answer His summons should He call at Calvary, so the Revelation that concerns His return is full of mention of angels. "Four angels standing on the four corners of the earth holding the four winds of the earth." "I saw the seven angels . . . to them were given seven trumpets." "And the first angel sounded . . . and the second angel sounded . . . and the seventh angel sounded; and there were voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are be-

come the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ; and He shall reign for ever and ever.

Meantime whatever be our lot, we are not alone, for He still "gives His angels charge over us to keep us in all our ways. Wisdom above our own intellect may still be imparted. "Shall I hide from Abraham that thing which I do?" Daniel said, "I alone saw the vision."

Many remember with melted hearts experiences of which they seldom speak, experiences which can be accounted for only on the assumption of the power and intervention of the Lord Himself. Within the last few days I heard such an experience related by a Canadian Spirit-filled business man. His position is one of great responsibility. On one occasion he was called to the capital city, along with representatives of another similar firm, both to be questioned by clever lawyers from each of the provinces of the Dominion. He alone represented his large company, and feeling the need of help, he knelt in his hotel room to pray. It came to him to ask the Lord to send His angel to help him. All through the severe questioning, he was conscious of supernatural help, though he stood alone. After it was all over the judge remarked how well he had done. He says he was all the time conscious that the Lord had sent His angel who had brought him safely through.

Sometimes the knife is poised, as it was above Isaac, before the angel cries, "Stay thine hand." With Christ in the wilderness, the enemy quoted the scripture, "He shall give his angels charge over thee," in order to tempt Him to cast Himself down. This He would not do, tempting God, yet the angels were not far away, for when it was all over, "the angels came and ministered unto him."

Soon the Angel of the Covenant shall stand with one foot upon the land, and one foot upon the sea, declaring that "delay shall *be no longer.*" As observing men say, "The lamps are going out around the world," let us cherish the Holy Word of God, a lamp unto our feet, and a light unto our path, trusting God to make a way for us all, as long at it is for His glory for our witness to continue upon this earth. And when many who were set in pleasant little grooves find their comforts gone, their confidence gone, and a shaking everywhere, let us be ready to seize each opportunity to present to them the Rock of Ages, our only Hiding place!

Restrictions deemed necessary for these adverse days, are being more and more placed upon the liberty known not long ago; such as world travel, and freedom to send money anywhere. These restrictions may necessarily be increased more and more, but in the will of God we may count upon His assistance to fulfill whatever His will may be for us.

"Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses; let us lay aside every weight?" "Ye are come unto mount Zion . . . to an innumerable company of angels, to the general assembly and church of the firstborn . . . to the spirits of just men made perfect, and to Jesus, the Mediator of the new covenant."

# Hardoi Bible School

We have an enrolment of thirty-one in our Bible Training School at Hardoi, North India. It is our earnest prayer that all may become faithful soul winners for God in this land where the powers of darkness still rule. A good numof the girls have been filled with the ber Spirit; four have received since school opened, and others are seeking earnestly. We shall appreciate your prayers that they too may be filled for they do need the power in their lives to become fearless witnesses for the Master.

#### At the Temple Grounds

God is blessing our second and third year students as they go out in turn with the older Bible women. Two weeks ago they went to a mela held at the outskirts of the city near a large temple. For two days the people passed our house in a steady stream from morning until night, all dressed in clean clothes and carrying their little bundles with offerings for the gods. When they reached the temple grounds they would take the offerings into the temple and then as each one came out he would ring a large bell, perhaps to awaken the gods.

At this place our workers had a splendid opportunity to present the gospel message. Close to a hundred Gospels as well as tracts were sold in one day and many heard the story of salvation for the first time.

#### Heathen Bondage

This is the month for special puja (worship) in India. The Hindus are worshiping their many gods, while the Mohammedans are fasting each day for forty days. They may eat no food nor drink water from sunrise to sunset. I spoke to one of the men who was so weak from fasting and told him God never expected him to keep such a fast. I suggested that he go home and eat but he refused emphatically, stating that such a sin would be so great that forty camels could not carry away its load. The love of God is something they cannot understand. How our hearts ache to see the bondage that has been brought about by years and years of such teaching-but we can pray, and God can set them free as He already has done for many in our midst.

#### Support Needed

We do thank God for our three faithful Bible women. The woman on the left in the picture, Phulgenda David, is still unsupported. Years ago she came to our Bettiah home as a little Hindu orphan girl. After finishing school she felt definitely called to work for God and came to us for Bible training. She is filled with the Spirit and has a love for souls. For four years she has worked faithfully for the Lord. Miss David takes our girls out to the zenanas and villages for their practical training, and now that we have no missionary to help in this work is doing it very efficiently alone. Five dollars a month at present exchange will cover her support.

There are also nine girls in Bible school for whom help is needed. Five have no support and four are only partially cared for. We are grateful for the kind interest and co-operation of friends in our work in the past and would sincerely appreciate your assistance in these present needs. #### Expectations for the Future



W. Lloyd Shirer, Tamale, N. T., Gold Coast, West Africa, Brother Shirer has agreed to forward the mail to the Ivory Coast field.

While most of the mail is getting through, there are of course some letters which go astray. We suggest therefore for the safeguarding of your interest that the remitting of money to our missionaries should be done through the Foreign Missions Department. We are in touch with the best, safest, and most prompt methods of transferring funds to the various fields, and we are glad to be able to offer you the services of our office in this regard.

## Among the American Indians in Washington

Since 1934 Mr. and Mrs. N. Sivonen have labored faithfully among the Indians in the State of Washington, visiting numerous reservations as well as ministering to the many Indians living along the highways and rivers. They have found terrible conditions of poverty and disease existing on the reservations.

"We find the only way to reach the Indians," they say, "is to go right to them in their homes and much of our time is spent thus in personal work. Often we find several families living under the same roof so that we are able to conduct a gospel service right in the home. We distribute clothing, bedding, and do what we can to win the confidence of the Indian people.

#### Fruit

"It is a joy to report that many have accepted Christ as their Saviour, and some have received the Holy Ghost. At one reservation the revival fire is burning among the children. Over twenty have been saved and as a result of their earnest prayers the parents are coming to the Lord.

"We are only able to reach a few reservations compared to the many where there are no workers and where no gospel services have been held for years. It is our earnest desire to be used of God in winning souls from among these precious people who have received from civilization much that is of questionable value we want to share with them the best we have, the gospel of Christ."

Because they have felt misused and misunderstood, and have been left to their own devices, immorality of every kind is practised and sin in its most rancid state is the common thing.

"Our services are quite well attended as the young people living on the reservation have no other diversion without going into other near-by towns. However, church attendance does not tend necessarily to make them spiritual. How desperately we realize the great need of the Holy Spirit to be present in our gatherings, to speak to hearts and make them tender. The people are slow to act upon their convictions, but praise God, with Him 'ALL things are possible.' We sincerely ask you to take these brown-skinned people upon your hearts in prayer. In His glad service—Bessie Guy, Maurine Moss, Dorothy Amundsen."

#### INTOLERANCE IN RUMANIA

"The new pro-Nazi government in Rumania has not been satisfied to reverse the more liberal religious policy of the Tatarescu administration," wrote Dr. J. H. Rushbrooke in the *Baptist Times*. "It has suppressed Baptists and other Dissenters and confiscated all their church property."

#### MUSSOLINI AND THE ARABS

The Arabs in Palestine and Syria are bitterly opposed to Mussolini's reported plan for Palestine, says *Alliance Weekly*. It has been reported that if the Axis Powers win the war Palestine will be turned over to the Vatican. This conflicts with the plans for an Arab national state, so it appears that Mussolini has bungled in his efforts to arouse the Arabs to oust the Jews from the land God has promised them.

#### EARTHQUAKES

A Pentecostal missionary reports that at Mengtsi and Shih P'ing in China there has been a terrible earthquake, with some 2,000 either killed or injured and many homeless. The news of such earthquakes is crowded out, amid all the war news of the day, but they have become more and more frequent of recent years, in various parts of the earth. According to the Bible, they are "the beginning of sorrows," and a sign of the times. Matt. 24:7.

#### STALIN'S POLICY

"Actually, Stalin does not want the fall of the British Empire unless Germany and Italy fall with it," states Roger Babson. "What he wants is a Europe so weakened that Russia can communize it all without fighting. He fears Germany's rise to power and may take all of Finland as further protection in the Baltic. This program was fully outlined to me when I was last in Europe." For some months Russia has not been mentioned often in the war news but she will fit into the prophetic picture when God's time arrives.

#### LAWLESS DICTATORS

An outstanding characteristic of the modern dictators is their lawlesness. According to *Dawn*, Stalin says: "We communists do not admit of any ethics which shall control the actions of a revolutionary body." Dr. Rauschning writes: "Hitler on one occasion said to me: 'Where should we be if we had formal scruples? I simply disregard these things. I am prepared to commit perjury half a dozen times a day." In this respect these men show an alarming similarity to that great dictator who is to come, for in 2 Thess. 2:8 he (the Antichrist) is referred to as "that Wicked," or "the Lawless One."

#### DUTY FIRST

Said Dr. R. H. Glover, North American Home Director of the China Inland Mission in com-menting on the U. S. Government's recall of their citizens from the Far East: "Had our missionaries been disposed to withdraw every time an alarm has been sounded, little work would ever have been accomplished. Had they done this at the outbreak of war over three years ago the greatest harvest of souls and the finest opportunity to impress and serve China in the entire history of the Mission would have been lost. 'Duty first,' rather than 'Safety first,' has been our motto, and God has honored it and wonderfully protected and blessed His faithful servants. Yet the Mission pursues no reckless policy of disregard for its workers' reasonable safety, and if and when conditions should become really menacing suitable action will promptly be taken. But there seems as yet no evidence of such an emergency's being imminent, and so our missionaries, like Nehemiah of old, continue building undaunted, with unceasing prayer to God.'

#### JEWS AND CRIME

According to *Jewish Missionary Magazine*, the percentage of admission of Jews to penal institutions in the United States is only half their proportion to the population."

#### AN ANSWER TO PRAYER

For many days in September there was a continuous terror over London, and a correspondent in the New York P. M. asserts that in the closing part of that month the German air force had won a victory over the city when suddenly they abandoned their persistent daily attacks, perhaps because of losses. The reason Hitler stopped his heavy mass bombing attacks, during which he used up to five hundred planes at one time, is not known. It is asserted by responsible British officers who fought through this terror, that had it continued another five days nothing could have saved London. But just when victory was near, the mass bombing with its deadly fires, destructive fury, and demoralizing terror ceased. What was the cause? Alliance Weekly asserts that on September 25 another day of prayer was held in England. The people prayed, and God answered. If God's people would pray more, God would turn back more of their enemies-enemies both physical and spiritual, for God answers prayer.

#### SHELTER EVANGELISM

Gospel work is going on under difficulties in England today. Blackouts keep the people from gathering for worship, and services are held on Sunday afternoons instead of Sunday nights. Sunday School scholars are evacuated from the cities and much of the population is shifted. Many meeting places have been lost. For example, in the city of Coventry, one of the places hardest hit by the aerial "blitz," only nine of the city's thirty churches remain undamaged from Nazi bombs (according to The Christian of London). But God's people are adapting themselves to the difficult circumstances. One of the outstanding developments is a work known as "shelter evangelism." Hundreds of people crowd into many of the large air-raid shelters to spend the night. Christian workers are organizing groups to visit these and hold gospel services. Results so far have been encouraging. Most of the people welcome the services, especially enjoying the singing, and workers thus are finding a way into many hearts who need the Saviour as their eternal Refuge.

#### LORD HALIFAX ON MISSIONS

The Evangelical Christian reports that Dr. Paton of the Church Missionary Society in England received a letter from Lord Halifax in August, 1940 saying: "I have received your letter of July 29 in which you say that some of those who regularly support the work of foreign missions are in doubt whether it is right in time of war to send money out of the country, and also whether war charities and war work ought not to take precedence over everything else. As you know, action already taken by several Government Departments has shown the desire of the British Government that the services rendered by Christian missions should continue. I am myself quite clear that the support of foreign missionary work in time of war is an essential part of the Church's witness. I should much regret if the responsibility which Christian people rightly feel towards the special needs and charities that press upon us in war time should lead them to desert this permanent and universal Christian obligation.'

This is the view of an outstanding Christian statesman who ranks high in the British Government, being Foreign Secretary prior to his recent appointment as British Ambassador to the United States. He thinks foreign missionary work should go on, no matter how turbulent world conditions may become. Don't you agree with him? The Jews continue to build up Palestine, despite the war. According to Advent Witness, wealthy Jews in London are now raising a big fund among themselves to present Tel-Aviv with extensions to its harbor. Tel-Aviv is Palestine's all-Jewish city, a modern seaport of strategic importance in view of developments in the Near East.

#### REVIVAL AMONG THE RUSSIANS

"Probably the greatest religious revival of modern times has been taking place for the last three or four years along the Russian border," says *Christianity Today.* "Thousands of Polish Christians have been conducting the work and thousands have been brought into the kingdom of God. These Polish contributors are pathetically poor but out of their meager earnings they are financing the spread of the gospel among the Russian people."

#### JEWISH MUNITIONS

According to The Christian Herald (London), when war broke out Palestine found it impossible to ship her immense citrus crop and some seven million cases representing about a hundred million oranges and lemons were going begging. Dr. Weizmann, head of the Zionist organization and a distinguished chemist, is now providing acctone from the juice of this fruit. This is an essential constituent in the manufacture of munitions. The salts recovered from the Dead Sea are being put to a similar service. Through the Jewish Agency all the resources of Palestine Jewry have been placed at the disposal of the British Government. Both Arabs and Jews are eager to help the British forces, and many have enlisted. Through her people and her produce Palestine already is playing an important part in the war, but that land is to have a yet more prominent part in international warfare as God's prophetic program unfolds.

#### WAR IN PALESTINE?

Says Harold J. Shepstone, writing in *The Christian Herald* (London): "Is it not significant that Hitler, failing to get a quick decision in the west, should be planning to carry on the struggle in the east? It may well be that this great catastrophe will be fought out not in Europe but in the Near East. Curiously enough, it is the belief of many people in Palestine. They are convinced that a terrible struggle is about to be witnessed in this sacred land."

He continues: "They are fully prepared to meet such a conflict, realizing as they do something of the meaning of that somewhat remarkable saying of Jesus, 'When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace.' Jerusalem and the other cities of the Holy Land are blacked out at night. They have their A. R. P. and firefighting services, and every village has its firstaid post. At Haifa, Tel-Aviv, Jaffa, and other vulnerable areas both public and private air-raid shelters have been built and arrangements made to evacuate school children from the danger zones. Even in the municipality of Jerusalem men are busy preparing public shelters. Most popular are the vast underground chambers below the Temple Area and Solomon's quarries, a large subterranean area below the city, from whence Solomon obtained his stone for the erection of the Temple. They are capable of sheltering many thousands of people."

One day war *will* come to Palestine, whether it be before this war ends or later. The final battle of the age will be fought in the Plain of Esdraelon in Galilee, and the bloodshed will be terrible until Christ and His saints appear in the clouds of glory to destroy His enemies and set up His earthly kingdom. It will be the day of His wrath. Sinners rich and poor, high and low, will try to hide themselves from the wrath of the Lamb in that day. May it not be that these very shelters that are being prepared in Palestine today are those into which men will run on that day of judgment seeking refuge from His anger, but sweking in vain? # ™ SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Seven Years' Whole Bible Course

#### Gehazi's Covetousness and Its Penalty

Lesson for March 2. Lesson Text: 2 Kings 5:20-27.

#### GEHAZI'S SIN.

1. Gehazi was insensible to spiritual motives. Why did Elisha refuse the gift proferred by Naaman? Not because he had any objection to the gift itself, for God has ordained "that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel." He refused because, (1) he thought of the honor of God. Had he accepted the gift Naaman might have assumed that the prophet claimed some of the credit for the miracle and Elisha wanted God to have all the glory; (2) he thought of the honor of his religion. He would not give

Naaman or anyone else the opportunity of saying, "These prophets of Israel are no better than the heathen priests; (3) he thought of Naaman himself, in that he would put nothing in his new convert's way that might be a stumbling block.

How different was Gehazi! Spiritual motives and principles meant nothing to him. He was a gross materialist, one of the large class "who mind earth-ly things" (Phil. 3:19), the kind of man who, though professing godliness, regarded all his life in terms of dollars and cents. So, when he saw his opportunity for material gain, he threw spiritual ideals to the winds.

And there are many Gehazis today who, for the sake of some selfish gain or advantage, will lay aside God-given convictions and principles. But there are also those who, like Elisha, are guided in all their actions by the desire to do the perfect will of God and to bring eternal glory to His name.

2. He despised spiritual privileges. Gehazi held no ordinary position. He lived in an atmosphere of deepest purity and spirituality. He was the constant companion of the greatest man of God of his day. He might have suc-ceeded Elisha in the prophetic office just as Elisha had succeeded Elijah. Instead, like Esau before him, he spurned his spiritual privileges and sold an eternal inheritance for a mess of temporal pottage!


Gehazi's case is a sad one-but not an uncom-mon one! Children brought up in godly homes are often indifferent to their spiritual advantages and become prodigals. A student spends three years in the heavenly atmosphere of a Bible institute, sits under the anointed ministry of godly teachers, becomes familiar with the great truths of God's Word, is faced with the best of opportunities for spiritual advancement, yet drifts through school, lightly regarding its precious privileges, and leaves naked in his soul when he might have gone forth to eventually become a mighty man of God! Year after year God's presence is manifested in assemblies all over the Some members eagerly respond to the Spirit's moving and advance in spiritual growth and usefulness, while others, bound to earthly things, sit in cold indifference and blind selfsatisfaction, and despise their day of visitation.

3. He went from bad to worse. Gehazi coveted the money that Naaman had offered his master, and did not hesitate to lie and deceive in order to gratify his greed. Catching up with the de-parting Naaman, he told the Syrian general that Elisha had sent him to ask for money and cloth-ing for two young men who had come to visit his master! His deception was successful and he

returned home with the money he had received under false pretenses, thus becoming guilty of theft as well as deception. So it always is. One unconfessed sin leads to other and more serious sins until a man becomes so involved in wickedness that he has neither the desire nor courage to right the accumulated wrongs.

GEHAZI FOUND OUT.

After hiding his ill-gotten wealth, Gehazi reappeared in the presence of his master. "Whence comest thou, Gehazi?" asked Elisha. "Thy servant went no whither," replied the servant, adding another lie in order to cover up the first. not mine heart with thee, when the man turned again from his chariot to meet thee?" Foolish Gehazi! He thought he could deceive his master, but he only deceived himself. God gave Elisha a



revelation of his servant's deeds. Once again the invariable truth is illustrated—"Be sure your sin will find you out."

GEHAZI'S PUNISHMENT.

"The leprosy therefore of Naaman shall cleave unto thee, and unto thy seed forever. And he went out from his presence a leper as white as snow. What an exchange Gehazi and Naaman made. Naaman came a leper, returned a disciple. Gehazi came a disciple, returned a leper. Naaman *left* both disease and money. Gehazi *took up* both disease and money. But how little would his ill-gotten wealth delight him with this loathesome disease upon him! "Take heed," said Jesus (Luke 12:15), "and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consistent not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth." And Paul the apostle adds this warning, "For this ye know, that no . . . covetous man . . . hath any part in the kingdom of Christ and of God (Eph. 5:5)." COVETOUSNESS VERSUS LEGITIMATE DESIRE.

Covetousness is no light matter. But where shall we draw the line between unlawful desire and the legitimate desire to acquire things? Is the desire to become rich necessarily a covetous desire?

There is no virtue in poverty. When a Christian can through honorable and Christian methods make money he

should, for money, rightly used is of inestimable blessing. It takes money to build churches, mission stations, or-phanages. It takes money to send out and support ministers and missionaries. It takes money, if you please, to save souls !

How shall we find the balance between covetousness and right aspira-

Let us pray: "Lord, help us, by every honorable and Christian method, to make all the money we can, to gather all the goods we can, in order that with them we may do all we can for Thy glory and the extension of Thy kingdom on earth. But with all our getting, keep us so free from covetousness that in themselves these things shall mean to us less than noth-ing !"-J. Bashford Bishop.

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

#### ARE MISSIONARIES NEEDED? Alva I. Walker

At present about one hundred and fifty natives are in jail in the Belgian Congo, and several of them will be hanged because of a dreadful traffic that has been exposed.

These natives believe that by kidnapping women, killing them, boiling their bodies, and then rubbing the human ashes into their open veins they will become very skilful in setting their traps. They believe this will increase their success in trapping. The Government has tried to do away with such

practices and it was thought that the traffic had been ended, but only recently through the disappearance of certain women these natives were found out, and after a long investigation all these men were put in jail.

The men who do such things are not primitive African natives. They are educated African natives who have good jobs. They can speak French better than the missionaries and many of them drive big trucks that operate at high speeds.

If they are so well educated and cultured why will they do such things? Because they do not know the Lord Jesus Christ. They have never been regenerated by the power of the Holy Spirit and by the Word of God.

I went to the governor of the province to see about certain concessions of property for our missionary work, and while in his office I talked to him about the high death date, due to heathenism, immorality, and wickedness, in our tribe, the Manvu tribe. He said to me: "We can pass laws against these things and we can inflict punishment upon those who violate them, but we can never change the Africans' natures. It seems to me that is a matter for you missionaries to solve,'

It is a matter for the missionaries to deal with. Only the missionaries of the gospel of Christ have the means whereby hearts and lives can be changed. Education and culture are not enough. The Africans need the regenerating power of God's Word. They need missionaries of the Cross.

#### THE BIBLE IN PORTUGAL

During the first six months of 1940, the British and Foreign Bible Society circulated 77,992 volumes of Scripture in Portugal and sent 15,474 volumes to Brazil and the Portuguese colonies. During 1939 the Society's five colporteurs cir-culated 107,963 volumes of Scripture in Portugal, reports W. H. Rainey in The Christian.

Does it pay to submit to discipline and learn to serve? A thousand times, Yes! especially since it trains us for sharing the throne with Jesus for all eternity. 2 Tim. 2:12.

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
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
