

She Found Something BETTER THAN FAME and FORTUNE

"Where will you go? what will you do? how can you leave the public that has loved you so long?"

Friends asked these questions in surprise and amazement at Teresita Arce's decision to give up a brilliant career in the entertainment world.

Her answer was simple. "I am going the way of God. From now on I am no longer Teresita the actress, but shall be known as Teresita the handmaiden of the Lord."

Teresita had been recognized as the foremost star of radio, television, and screen in her native land of Peru. Three times she had won first-place honors for her talent. Then in one dramatic moment she met Jesus Christ. All the sham and pride fell away like a discarded garment.

Perhaps few women in history have used T.V., radio, and the screen to crusade so strongly for the underprivileged as Teresita did prior to her conversion to Christ. She crusaded on her radio and T. V. shows to raise money to help tubercular children. She went on the air nationwide to campaign for better conditions for men in prison. Because of her successful efforts the prisoners name her the "angel of the prisons." She even persuaded the President of Peru to release one prisoner each year!

She fought for and secured better working conditions for Peru's taxi drivers, won another campaign to secure more pay for schoolteachers, and crusaded to win better protection for the women news vendors on city streets.

The dynamic Teresita is unquestionably a woman of amazing talents and versatility. She sometimes sang and played in as many as 20 different voices and characters in the same drama.

THE ACHE WITHIN

I spoke with this astonishing woman and her husband as we sat at dinner in a downtown hotel in Lima, Peru, together with missionary Walter Erickson and his wife. "How did you find the Lord?" I asked her. "What caused you to abandon your career at the height of stardom and fame?"

"I spent most of my life making other people laugh and cry in different plays," she replied. "They loved me! But they did not know that even with all that adulation, I was not happy. Deep down inside of me I had no peace."

Teresita's husband, Guillermo Mesinas, who served as an official in the Peruvian army, gave me his side of the story. "I got tired of war and revolution," he said. "One day I said to a friend, 'I'd like to find a weapon that will give life instead of destroying it.'

"My friend replied, 'I have just such a weapon.' And he began to tell me of Jesus Christ, and of His love and power to help all who look to Him in simple faith. He took me to a church where they gave me a New Testament. As I read the Scriptures the Holy Spirit illuminated my mind. Faith came. Right there I accepted Christ as my own Saviour. I felt the presence of the Lord."

A HAPPY HUSBAND

His face radiant with the joy of his newfound salvation, the husband hurried home to testify to his wife.

"She would not even listen to me," he said. "She told me, 'You've lost your mind, talking about the Bible and God. There are two ladders and both reach up to heaven. I'll climb one way and you the other. We'll see who will get there first!"

Praying for God to open his wife's heart to the truth, the husband kept right on testifying. He spoke to government officials and other prominent men. Some accepted the Saviour. When he refused all intoxicating drinks and took milk instead, his wife was amazed.

One night after she had been awarded another gold medal during a radio program, Teresita went looking for her husband. She found him at a church rally. She was furious. All decked out in her party gown, painted lips, and showy jewelry, she strode down the aisle of the very humble church and took a seat.


There were gospel songs and some testimonies. A woman got up and told how her dying daughter was healed through prayer. The preacher spoke on "The Prodigal Son." The message of God's wonderful love touched her lonely heart.

When the preacher gave the altar call, Teresita raised her hand. To the astonishment of the crowd, Peru's most famous actress arose with all her glittering finery and walked down the aisle to drop upon her knees and surrender her life to Christ. Emotion surged within her. She had a deep personal experience with the living Saviour. The Holy Spirit rested upon her. At last she had found peace!

FAREWELL TO FAME

After her conversion, Teresita's first thought was to break all her radio and television contracts. But she could

THIRTY-FIVE HUNDRED AMERICANS WILL RETIRE TODAY! Yes, every day of the year 3,500 of us reach the retirement age of 65.

More than 15,000,000 people in the United States have now reached or passed the 65th anniversary of their birth. And this vast army is increasing rapidly.

U. S. Department of Health figures reveal that the average 65-year-old can expect to reach age 78, thanks to modern medicine. And the one who reaches 75 stands a good chance of living another eight years.

Happily, most of our senior citizens draw regular checks from such sources as Social Security, endowment policies, or pension plans set up to care for them in their twilight years. Many carry hospitalization insurance too. The American Medical Association's council of medical service recently reported that more than 10,000,000 Americans over 65 have hospital expense protection.

Wise indeed are people who look ahead and plan financially to enjoy the evening of their lives in comfort, peace, and dignity. God bless them! Doubly wise are they who carry soul insurance, whose plans project beyond the convalescent hospital and the old people's home, right into heaven.

Soul insurance—what's that? Well, insurance comes from enseurer, an old French word meaning to make sure. Prudent men carry insurance on real estate and valuables to make sure they suffer no loss in case of fire, theft, or accident. Prudent men also make sure their souls are

safe, by carrying a contract with the Lord Jesus Christ that protects them against spiritual loss.

How can we make sure of salvation?

Jesus declared emphatically: "Verily, verily, I say unto you: he that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life" (John 5:24).

An old man was trying his best to explain to a puzzled friend God's plan of salvation. "Bill, it took me 40 years to learn three simple things," he said.

"First, that all have sinned. Second, that a man can't do anything to save himself. Third, that Christ has done it all, and a man simply has to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ to be saved."

The Bible plainly says we can *know* we are saved. "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may *know* that ye have eternal life" (1 John 5:13)

It is truly thrilling to talk with elderly Christians, and to hear them express their deep faith in Christ and their assurance of heaven. They are not frightened when they learn that 110,000 souls leave this life every day, over 40 million in the course of a year. To them, death is a glorious home going.

An octogenarian who was not a Christian asked a minister, rather flippantly, "Tell me, Reverend—when is a good time to prepare for death?"

"Five minutes before you die," came the unexpected reply.

"But surely you don't mean-?"

"I don't mean, Sir, that anyone can know in advance the precise moment when he will die. Neither do I mean that you should keep on postponing preparations for meeting your Maker. Last year 43,000 Americans were killed in traffic accidents. Not one of them expected to die. So the Bible says, with a note of urgency, 'Now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation' (2 Corinthians 6:2)."

A mother was explaining to little Dorothy about the passing of her daddy. She said, "God sent for your father. He will send for you and me, too. But I do not know exactly when, Dear."



PREMIER NIKITA KHRUSHCHEV OF THE U.S.S.R. OFTEN mentions God and the Bible in his speeches. Last June, during his official visit to Sweden, he did it again.

While touring the Graengesberg steel works at Oxeloesund, an industrial town about 75 miles from Stockholm, he told plant officials he was "invoking the aid of the Lord" to help Swedish mills make more gas pipelines for Russia.

First noting that "I am a Communist and an atheist," the premier said: "In spite of this I am invoking the aid of the Lord.... If the Lord will help you, and if you can guarantee good quality, and if the price is right, you will be able to make deliveries for a long time."

The reason Mr. K. mentions God and the Bible so often, in spite of his boasted atheism, may be found in a statement he made, as quoted by Edmund Stevens in the Chicago *Daily News* (May 21, 1964). Said Mr. K.: "The only school I finished before the revolution, was the (Eastern Orthodox) church parish school. The priest drilled me thoroughly in the Gospel, and I was a model student. And for this reason I still often quote Bible tales from memory."

In the light of this fact we would address an open letter to the Soviet Premier, as follows.

MR. K .--

If, as you say, you were "thoroughly drilled in the Gospel," you know that Jesus taught us to love our enemies. He taught us to bless them that curse us, to do good to them that hate us, and to pray for those who persecute us.

Many Christians therefore are praying that God will have mercy on you and your fellow communists, as well as on all non-Christians everywhere, and that your heart may be changed.

Since you have a considerable knowledge of the Bible you must realize that, in God's sight, the two important classes of people on earth are not communists and capitalists, but believers and unbelievers.

Furthermore you must know that according to the Bible the eventual ruler of the earth will not be a communist, nor will he be a capitalist, but he will be Christ Himself. He will take this rulership from the violent and give it to the meek.

Christ will be King and only those who enter His kingdom in this life will be privileged to participate in His kingdom in the life to come. According to the Gospel of John, chapter 3, a person cannot enter unless he is "born again."

No doubt you will recognize the scene that is pictured on the cover of this little magazine. It shows Jesus being interviewed by the Jewish leader, Nicodemus. Although Nicodemus was a very religious man, yet he needed the New Birth.

As the picture suggests, ALL men must be born of the Spirit. Whether by natural birth they be Americans or Africans, Finns or Frenchmen, Latins or Latvians, Roumanians or Russians, ALL men must be "born again" or they cannot participate in God's eternal kingdom. ALL men of ALL races and ALL ages must receive this new life by spiritual regeneration or they cannot live eternally with God.

This is the real revolution that the world needs—not a mass revolution by some kind of organized force such as a military, political, or even a religious organization, but a revolution of the individual in which he or she becomes a new person by faith in Christ as taught by the Gospel which you learned as a youth.

Last year, Mr. K., the Chinese called you a "Bible-reading buffoon" but we admire any man who reads the Bible. Reading it, however, is not enough: a man has to believe what he reads in the Bible. As you know, Jesus told His disciples, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned" (Mark 16:16).

This terrible thought of being damned eternally—shut out of heaven and sentenced to live forever in "outer darkness," as Jesus said, where there shall be "weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matthew 22:13)—ought to make a man think, especially if he is over 70 years of age.

Having been a model Bible student you must be aware of the fact that Jesus repeatedly talked about hell and warned people about it. He urged them to repent, saying, "Except ye repent ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3).

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "He that believeth on him is not condemned; but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God" (John 3:18). Instead of living with this sentence of judgment hanging over one's head, it is wise to repent of all sin while there is opportunity.

Let us remind you—and anyone else who reads this "open letter"—of the Saviour's wonderful promise, recorded in John 6:37—"Him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." Today anyone who will admit he is a sinner, and who will pray for divine forgiveness, may call upon Christ and be saved. Happy is he who not only knows the gospel but also takes advantage of its offer of pardon and peace before it is too late.

The congregation was singing the third or fourth hymn, and was just about to unite in prayer, when a man past middle age entered, wearing a cowboy shirt and broadbrim hat. It was Tommy Johnson. He seated himself in the back.

When the pastor asked the congregation for prayer requests, Tommy stood and said, "Pastor, I have one thing to say."

Everyone turned to look. They saw his flushed face and bleary eyes. They heard him say: "If ever I become a Christian, I will not be a hypocrite. But I can't be a Christian, Pastor, because there's something I would have to tell, and that's the one thing in my life I can't confess."

Tears were falling from the man's eyes, and whispered prayers were rising from many of the people. Tommy, fairly reeking with liquor, slowly walked to the front and faced the congregation. He looked over the crowd. His eyes caught mine. As they did, a sudden boldness came over me. I suppose it looked strange for a young woman to speak out as I did, but I felt I had to.

"Do you really want to be a Christian, Tommy?" I said.

"Yes, but I can't. God has already told me that I can't be saved until I confess one thing, and I can't do it."

"Tommy, you can do anything if you want to do it strongly enough."

"I can do anything else, but not that," he sobbed. At this point Pastor Burnett invited all the people to bow their heads and pray, and he stepped to Tommy's side.

"Tommy," said the pastor, "do you want to go to hell?" Startled, the man replied, "Who does? Who wants to go to hell, Pastor?"



"You must want to, if you cannot do what the Lord has asked you to do."

"Pastor, I want you to go behind that pulpit and preach on John 3:16. I know what the Bible says, and I know I am going to hell, but would you please preach from John 3:16, just for me?"

Tommy sat down and listened to the sermon on the text he had chosen. "God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

I was going with his sister, you see, and we got to gambling. It was my one big hand. I tossed this card, and I won. I cleaned him out. But before that evening was over, he was dead. Someone killed him and I've always felt responsible for his soul."



Sound of the Trumpet

A happy sound to Christians— But to others just a noise!

On one occasion, shortly before Jesus was crucified, God the Father spoke to Him from heaven. Do you remember the story?

Jesus had just prayed, "Father, glorify thy name," when suddenly there came an answering voice out of heaven which said, "I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again" (John 12:28).

Oddly enough, the people who were standing nearby

had various reactions to the sound they heard. Some said, "It thundered." Others said, "An angel hath spoken to him."

The Bible clearly says it was the voice of God, but some people were unwilling to admit it.

What do you hear in these days when current events signal the fact that the Lord Jesus Christ is about to return from heaven? God is speaking to men once again. He is speaking through the Bible. He is speaking through Christian workers such as pastors and evangelists. He is also speaking through current events but to some people the fulfilment of Bible prophecies is just "thunder."

Do you hear only thunder when Hugh L. Dryden, deputy administrator of our National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), states that "by the end of this century the conquest of the moon may seem only a modest first step along the spaceways to still other worlds.... It is very likely that men will reach Mars and Venus within the next 25 years. Before the year 2000, unmanned probes will have scouted all the planets of the solar system."

Is it just "thunder" when an eminent physicist estimates that the United States has enough nuclear explosives already stockpiled to annihilate the Soviet Union—not once, but 25 times? (And when the Soviet Union tells us it is prepared to drop nuclear warheads on any spot in the world?)

With 90 per cent of all the scientists who have ever lived alive today, and with men probing the secrets of the universe and of life itself, the Christian who looks for an explanation remembers God's Word to Daniel concerning the end time, "Many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased" (Daniel 12:4).

What do you hear in these days in which there is "upon earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken" (Luke 21:25, 26)?

Some men hear and fear these things, but do not comprehend their prophetic overtones. A writer in the New York *Times* stated recently: "So terribly much has happened, so terribly much is happening, and all at such terrible speed that it is difficult to foresee where we are heading. The men who fancy themselves in control of events are no longer really in control."

Adlai Stevenson wrote in March 1962: "Every month that goes by without restriction on the testing, production, and transfer of nuclear weapons brings closer the moment when the genie will escape from the bottle. When a dozen or more states have their fingers on the nuclear triggers, the possibility of their irresponsible release by someone, somewhere, will be multiplied."

Long ago a nation heard the listing of its sins from the lips of Jeremiah the prophet. Smugly they turned away and refused to listen, for they thought it was only "thunder." And the prophet would have kept still, but he could not, for he knew the end of their evil course. "I cannot hold my peace," he cried, "because thou hast heard, O my soul, the sound of the trumpet, the alarm of war" (Jeremiah 4:19).

Deep within the soul of every child of God in the world today there is the beginning of the sound of a trumpet. Its tones are the tones of the Master who said,

"When these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh" (Luke 21:28).

When what things begin to come to pass? Any day's newspaper contains enough violence, enough war and rumors of war, enough evidence of moral collapse to distress thinking men. These are the things Jesus said would come to pass in the last days before His return.

The Christian need not be confused or alarmed or fearful when he sees "these things" begin to come to pass. Turning to the Bible, God's blueprint of the ages, we see that all this heralds the return of our Lord. The signs of His coming as outlined in His Word correspond to what is happening in the world today.

As the signs are fulfilled, Christians listen joyfully for the plainer notes of the trumpet of God, "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord" (2 Thessalonians 4:16, 17).

But what then? With the Church removed from the earth, evil will quicken its pace. The Antichrist, a power-

ful world figure whose character and activities are described in detail in Daniel 11:21-45 and in Revelation 13, will rise to prominence after the rapture of the Church. Exalting himself above all that is right, he will gain a stranglehold on world economy by compelling men to take the mark that damms a man in order to buy or sell.

But God is not yet through with the earth. Christ will return with His saints to make war against the Antichrist in the battle of battles, the battle of Armageddon, and to rule over this planet.

Already military men speak of the next world war as Armageddon, and to some of them the thunder they hear is the thunder of marching feet toward the valley of Megiddo. The outcome of this fearful battle is already foretold in God's Word. The last trumpet that sounds over that battlefield will sound a note of victory, "for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth."

It is no uncertain sound that the Christian hears within his soul today. It is the signal of the end of this age and the beginning of a new and better order—a new heaven and earth "wherein dwelleth righteousness."

We who are now ready should keep within earshot of the trumpet sound by staying close to the Master. (If you are not ready, there is still time to prepare to share in the glorious unfolding of God's plan for His redeemed.)

Have You Found the Way?

If you have been going to church for years, yet are not any better or different because of it, something is wrong. If your spiritual condition has reached a point of stagnation and you are complacent about it, you are in danger.

You may be a good person as far as most people know, but still be dead in trespasses and sins. For church attendance alone never saved anyone. No church has the power to deliver anyone from the pangs of a guilty conscience or from eternal death.

And no man, be he minister, priest, rabbi, evangelist, prophet, or anyone else, can ever give you a passport into heaven. There is only one way. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6). "Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

Jesus warned of the danger of clinging to traditions instead of seeking the true Way of life. He said: "In vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men... Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition" (Mark 7:7-9).

Men still cling to tradition at the cost of rejecting God. They find it easier to accept beliefs, practices, and teachings which are handed down to them from their parents and grandparents than to examine and evaluate them in the light of God's Word.

Tradition and conformity are subtle enemies of the soul, for by "having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof," we become a slave to a dead religion. We miss the Way.

Blessed is the man who has found within the framework of the church he attends the living Christ who is the only Way. But if the church you attend has not introduced Jesus Christ as living Lord and Saviour, why not seek Him elsewhere? The name on the door of the church you attend is not as important as what you find inside. Do you find a dead religion, steeped in tradition, or do you find a living Christ shining out through the messages from God's Word and the lives of those who worship there?

No denomination can save you. No religion can save you. Only Christ can make the vital difference in your life. Jesus said, "If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his innermost being shall flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37, 38).


He said, "I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst" (John 6:35). He said, "I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life" (John 8:12).

"Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled" (Matthew 5:6). The spiritually hungry and thirsty soul can be satisfied in the Lord Jesus Christ. Go directly to Him in prayer. You do not need any human mediator. Christ is the great high priest, seated at the right hand of the throne of God. "There is one God, and one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus," the Bible says (1 Timothy 2:5).


Christ died for you on the cross. There He was crucified for your sins. He rose again for your justification. Do you believe it?

Golden Anniversary



The fellowship of churches known as the assemblies of God is now 50 years old. The 50th anniversary convention held in the headquarters city of Springfield, Missouri, had more than 11,000 in attendance.

This evangelical missionary fellowship of 8,409 U.S. churches had its source in a mighty Pentecostal revival that swept across America at the beginning of this century. Christian people who were hungry for God and thirsty for the Water of Life were coming together for prayer meetings. God was pouring out His Spirit upon them and churches were springing up all over the land.

A call was issued to the leaders of these churches to attend a General Council of the Assemblies of God at Hot Springs, Arkansas, the object of which was to form a cooperative fellowship for the following purposes: (1) to establish unity in doctrine; (2) to charter under a scriptural name; (3) to conserve God's work; (4) to promote world missions; (5) to provide Biblical and literary training; (6) to produce printed materials. About 300 ministers and lay delegates attended this founding convention in 1914.

From this small beginning the Assemblies of God fellowship has grown steadily. Today in addition to 8,409 churches in the U.S. there are 16,418 churches in foreign lands and world membership has passed the two million mark.

Fervent spiritual worship and sound Biblical preaching characterize the services in Assemblies of God churches. Evangelism is emphasized very strongly and much prominence is given to missions, as well as Sunday school and youth programs. The result is that the Assemblies of God ranks 11th among all U.S. religious bodies in Sunday school enrollment, and sixth in the number of foreign missionaries.

Assemblies of God members, endeavoring to conform to the original teachings and practices of the Christian church as described in the New Testament, agree with the following statement of faith:

We believe the Bible to be the inspired and only infallible and authoritative Word of God. We believe that

there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal future return to this earth in power and glory to rule a thousand years. We believe in the Blessed Hope, which is the Rapture of the Church at Christ's coming. We believe that the only means of being cleansed from sin is through repentance and faith in the precious blood of Christ. We believe that regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential for personal salvation. We believe that the redemptive work of Christ on the cross provides healing of the human body in answer to believing prayer. We believe that the baptism of the Holy Spirit, according to Acts 2:4, is given to believers who ask for it. We believe in the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a holy life. We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost, the one to everlasting life and the other to everlasting damnation.

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Opposed but Overcoming

Next Week's Sunday School Lesson
READ NEHEMIAH 4:1-23; ROMANS 8:31, 32

Satan and his emissaries have arrayed themselves for a desperate, last-hour stand against the Church of Christ. Political chaos, economic upheaval and distress, moral declension and degeneracy, spiritual indifference and apostasy, international hatred and mistrust—these grim conditions would, if possible, take the fight out of all-Christians and cause them to faint in the service of God.

Therefore we go to the Bible for help. There we read how Nehemiah, in his work of rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem, met with the bitterest of opposition; yet he finished the work and proved himself to be more than a conqueror through his God! Let us observe the opposition he faced and the manner in which he overcame it:

I. RIDICULE (4:1-9)

"But it came to pass, that when Sanballat heard that we builded the wall, he ... mocked ... and said, What do these feeble Jews?" There are plenty of Sanballats and Tobiahs in the world today, who mock and ridicule those who work for God. Weak characters, including socalled Christians who do not have much of God's grace, wilt under ridicule. But godly persons like Nehemiah will not throw to the winds their God-given convictions and ambitions because of derisive jibes from the opposition. Many folk laughed at Christopher Columbus, but he went on and discovered America anyway. They said Alexander Bell was a madman, but he went on to invent the telephone. They said the Wright brothers were fools, but they built an airplane in spite of ridicule. All who would accomplish much need a faith in God which lifts them above ridicule and enables them to press unswervingly on toward the goal they have set for themselves. Nehemiah met ridicule with-

- (1) Prayer. "Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God, and set a watch against them day and night." Nehemiah was a balanced believer. He prayed as if everything depended upon God; yet he worked as if everything depended upon him! Spiritual victory is a cooperative project. Some things only God can do; therefore we must pray! Some things we can do for ourselves; therefore we must work, and not expect God to do them for us.
- (2) Redoubled Efforts. "So we built the wall...for the people had a mind to work." Their efforts were not frantic endeavors of unbelieving desperation. They worked

in faith; they were trusting in God and so there was assurance as well as determination in their manner. So it must be with us.

II. DISCOURAGEMENT (4:10)


"And Judah said...there is much rubbish; so that we are not able to build the wall." There will always be rubbish—hypocrites, disagreeable people, unpleasant conditions—wherever there is any building. But no builder ever stops building because there is rubbish around! If we look at our circumstances we may be discouraged. If we keep our eyes on God we shall be encouraged.

III. THREATS (4:11, 12)

Threatening words also failed to intimidate or deter Nehemiah. He met them by—

- (1) Securing Unity and Cooperation (4:13, 16-19). Study these verses thoughtfully. The people worked together. While half of them worked, the other half stood guard. The unity of any church is its power. "United we stand, divided we fall," applies to spiritual work as well as to national strength.
- (2) Maintaining Confidence in God (4:14, 20). "Be not ye afraid of them: remember the Lord, which is great and terrible." "Our God shall fight for us." Thus spoke Nehemiah to the people. And this was the secret of Nehemiah's success—he had a deep consciousness that he was in God's will, that he was doing God's work, and that therefore God was on his side! "If God be for us, who can be against us?" inquired Paul, the great New Testament builder of the Church. "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?"

HEALED OF BRAIN INJURY

I received a brain concussion in an automobile accident in 1955, and doctors warned that I would have trouble from the injury in later years.

While I was in the Air Force in 1959 this prediction came true. I started "passing out" periodically and as months went by I became worse. I would remain unconscious for several hours, and when revived I would be very weak.

Doctors in several hospitals said that nothing could be done for me. There was scar tissue on the temporal lobe of the brain, they said, and surgery might only worsen the condition. Finally I was discharged by the Air Force as a disabled veteran.

I was so discouraged I did not care whether I lived or died. I was not a Christian at this time. Once I had been, but I was unwilling to give up worldly pleasures and so I had gone back into sin.

At present I am a student at West Texas State College and between semesters last winter I went to visit my parents at Wellington, Tex. Evangelist John Bryant was preaching a revival at the Assembly of God there.

On January 23, 1964, I attended his meeting and it resulted in a revival in my own soul and body.

Although I was a sinner I felt the presence of God that night and it seemed I must go to the altar or I would not live. I felt that God was calling me and would make me whole in both body and mind. So I knelt at the altar and gave my life to Christ.

When I arose from my knees I was a new person, both spiritually and physically. I have not taken medicine since that day and I have not had any blackouts. Formerly, for three years, I had taken several drugs to control the "blackouts." If I missed more than a day taking medicine, I would invariably have one. Doctors told me I would have to take the medicine for the rest of my life. But when I arose from the altar, a new person by the grace of God, I believed in Jesus as my Healer, as well as my Saviour, and He rewarded my faith by supplying the need in my body as well as my soul, Truly God performed a double miracle in my life.—Don Branch, Canyon, Tex.

Pastor's Sight Restored After Prayer Offered



GOD PERFORMED A WONDERFUL MIRACLE IN MY BODY IN 1955. Why I have waited so long to write about it I do not know, unless the Lord delayed it purposely for the benefit of someone who is reading these lines.

My eye went blind, and when sight was restored to it the eye specialist in Battle Creek, Mich., said he had no explanation. It was just a miracle of God.

The trouble began when I was driving home to Battle Creek from Albion, Mich., where I had attended a Christian youth rally. I felt no pain—no discomfort in any way-but suddenly I noticed I had no vision in my left eye. But I could see with my right eye the same

The next morning I visited my optometrist, thinking the lenses of my glasses probably needed changing. He gave me a thorough checkup and then told me what had occurred. The blood vessel to the retina, he said, had ruptured flooding the back area of my eye with blood, and the blood had clotted and cut off my vision.

He advised me to see a specialist, which I did. How-

ever, I had to wait a week for an appointment. In the meantime we had our midweek service at the church and I told the congregation about my condition, I explained the seriousness of the situation and requested that they pray for me.

Our deacons came forward, laid their hands on me as the Bible directs (Mark 16:18) and prayed while the whole church earnestly looked to God in faith on my behalf. While they were praying, something happened to my eye.

Before they prayed I could not see a thing with my left eye; everything simply was a blank. But as they prayed I kept the bad eye open, and gradually the forms of people began to take shape. First I saw the outline of people near me, then of those farther back, and finally I could see even the mortar seams in the masonry wall at the back of the church auditorium a distance of about 50 feet away!

What happy people we were as we thanked God together for the miracle! I could see with that "blind" eye just as clearly as I ever had!

I kept my appointment with the eye specialist, when the time came, for I wanted to know what he would say. He examined me for about two hours. Finally he


"Reverend Simmons, we have checked and doublechecked your eye, and all I can say is that you are a very fortunate man. In my practice both as a civilian and in the service I have seen literally thousands of such cases, but never have I seen one where the sight has been restored!

"Normally, you would have surgery. The eyeball would be removed and, if you so desired, a plastic eve would be inserted.

"We find evidence of blood which is still there, but it is breaking up and soon will be gone. You have suffered a rupture of the retina vein which caused the back area of the eye to be flooded with blood, which caused you to have a failure of vision in your left eye."

I left the office of Dr. Colgonhoun in Battle Creek that day filled with gratitude to a God who still hears and answers prayer. I can report today that after over nine years the vision of my left eye is just as good as it ever has been. I praise the Lord, the Miracle Worker, who still heals today as He did when He walked the roads of Galilee 1,900 years ago!-Ross P. Simmons, Pastor, First Assembly of God, South Haven, Michigan.

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Hungry for God

IF A MAN GOES WITHOUT FOOD LONG ENOUGH HE GROWS hungry—really hungry. He becomes desperate and will do almost anything to satisfy his hunger. Perhaps the Lord Jesus Christ had this fact in mind when He said, "Happy are those who are hungry and thirsty for goodness, for they will be fully satisfied" (Matthew 5:6, Phillips Modern English New Testament).

No doubt the reason many people are not happy today is that they are hungry and thirsty for the wrong things in life. Their desires are for the material things and earthly pleasures which merely gratify the physical, sensual, and soulish appetites. God is looking for people who hunger for His goodness. He is a Spirit and He desires to dwell in the human spirit and the human body.

God does not dwell in cathedrals, mosques, or temples made by men, the Bible says (Acts 7:48). He resides in human lives. The experience by which a person becomes filled with the Spirit of God is called, "The Baptism of the Holy Spirit."

Does the Spirit of God dwell in you? If you have accepted Christ as your personal Saviour you have received a portion of His Spirit. God wants to give you a greater portion. He wants to fill you. Before you can be filled, however, you must have a hunger for this experience. The Spirit of God will not come upon a person in the overwhelming, overflowing measure known as "the Baptism of the Holy Spirit" against that person's will. There first must be a hunger, a deep desire. It is those who "are hungry and thirsty for goodness" who will be "fully satisfied."

God gives the Holy Spirit to them who ask Him for the Spirit, Jesus said (Luke 11:13). Have you asked? Have you said to God, "Fill me with the Holy Spirit in the same way You filled the first Christians on the Day of Pentecost and on subsequent occasions"? (Read accounts of these incidents in Acts 2:1-4; 10:44-46; 19:5, 6.)

God is hungry for your love. He wants to reside in you and that is why the Bible says, "Be filled with the Spirit." Will you respond to God's hunger for you by showing that you are hungry for Him—hungry enough to seek His face in prayer until you have been baptized with His blessed Spirit?

THE VALUE OF LITTLE THINGS

A holy life is made up of a number of small things. Little words, not eloquent speeches or sermons; the little constant sunbeam, not the lightning; the waters of Shiloah "that go softly" (Isaiah 8:6), in the meek mission of refreshment, not the "waters of the river, great and many," rushing down in noisy torrents; these are the true symbols of a holy life.

Little evils, little inconsistencies, little weaknesses, little foibles, little indulgences of the flesh—the avoidance of such little things as these goes far to make up the negative beauty, at least, of a holy life.

Your Questions

Why was the man cast out who did not have the wedding garment, after he had responded to the invitation to the marriage feast (Matthew 22:11, 12)?

The lesson of the parable is that we are to preach the gospel to every creature, telling men they may be saved, and thus clothed with the righteousness of Christ. It is this righteousness that constitutes the wedding garment. If any hear the gospel and still think their own righteousness is sufficient, such will be cast out. "Ye must be born again." Profession alone will not do.

When do we enter the kingdom of heaven; and when do we enter the kingdom of God?

Personally, I do not believe there is any difference between the kingdom of heaven and the kingdom of God. Some believe the kingdom of heaven is the sphere of God's rulership over the earth; and the kingdom of God is His universal rulership. But the same parables given in Matthew showing what the kingdom of heaven is like, are recorded in other Gospels as showing what the kingdom of God is like. The kingdom is spiritual. We enter this kingdom when we are saved (John 3:3; Romans 14:17).

Some say that sickness is evidence that a person is walking in darkness, and poverty is evidence of a lack of faith. Is this true?


We now have the salvation of our souls; we do not have the redemption of our bodies (Romans 8:22, 23). Paul spoke of our present bodies as "these vile bodies," meaning bodies of humiliation. All will die if Jesus tarries (Hebrews 9:27). Even if a person were to enjoy health to the end, he would still have to submit to death, for our bodies are mortal and subject to decay.

The Bible does not judge a man by his financial success, but by the qualities of his moral and spiritual life. "Hath not God chosen the poor of this world, rich in faith, and heirs to the kingdom which he hath promised to them that love him?" (James 2:5). God can help us financially, but wealth is not necessarily an evidence of divine favor.

When we get to heaven will our loved ones who are there mean any more to us than others? Will we be able to talk with them?

"Now we see through a glass darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known" (1 Corinthians 13:12). I am of the opinion that we will intuitively know each other, as Peter, James, and John recognized Moses and Elijah on the Mount of Transfiguration.

But our relationships will be entirely changed. "For in the resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage" (Matthew 22:30). We will be one great family of God, not little groups of families such as we are here.

anywhere although I was qualified to handle various jobs. Drinking became a very important part of my daily life as I sought an escape from pressures that closed in from all sides.

One day the man next door (whom we later discovered to be the new Assembly of God pastor that had moved into town) asked us if he could take our children to Sunday school. We agreed immediately. Next Sunday my wife and I got up with a "hangover" and dressed the children for Sunday school.

The pastor picked them up and brought them back just after 12:00 noon. I had never seen the kids so excited about anything in their lives. They just bubbled over with the stories they had heard and the various activities they had enjoyed at Sunday school. I was glad they were happy—but neither I nor my wife Elaine had any intention of going with them.

Every Sunday morning our neighbor picked up the children, even if it meant waiting until we got them dressed and ready. Then on August 30, 1959, we made a promise we promptly regretted. I was reading the Sunday paper and just finishing my third can of beer when the children came home from church with a very urgent request. "Mom and Dad, we want you to come to Sunday school next week. We're going to be promoted into different classes and we want you to see us get our promotion certificates."

Elaine looked at me and I looked at her. "Okay," I said, "we'll go with you." After all, we didn't want to disappoint our little sweethearts. We thought this would be an important event in their lives.

The next six days were miserable. We talked it over a hundred times and tried to find some excuse that would get us off the hook. But we couldn't. When Sunday morning came we dressed and headed for the little white church up the street.

We didn't even know the name of the church, or what they taught, but the people were very friendly. In fact, they gave us so much attention I wished they would let us alone, for I was so filled with guilt and embarrassment over the life I was living that I was really uncomfortable.

The kids were so happy because we were there. We watched as they received their promotion certificates. After Sunday school the pastor led the congregation right into the morning worship service so we had to stay and listen to the sermon.

I cannot remember the sermon but I do remember the effect it had on me. It simply cut me to pieces. I tried my best to keep my mind off the preaching—I

counted the ceiling tile; I counted the window panes, and the boards in the floor—but God's Word hit me and cut me right to the core. I wanted to rush out of there.

Finally the pastor asked the congregation to stand for the closing prayer and I looked around for some way to escape. I was hemmed in on every side! He asked if anyone would like to come forward to accept Jesus Christ. Elaine started to cry. I thought, "We'll never get out of here now!"

One of the ladies near my wife invited her to come forward to the altar. My wife touched my arm. Immediately something happened inside me. Somehow I found myself set free from the power of sin. I knew the blood of Jesus cleansed me completely. Hand in hand, Elaine and I almost ran to the altar of the church where we knelt and shed tears of repentance and joy.

The pastor dropped to his knees beside us and unfolded the Scriptures before our eyes so that we might understand our spiritual position, first as a sinner, and then as one redeemed by the precious blood of Christ. God especially made real to me the promise of 1 John 1:9—"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." I have held that verse near my heart ever since that wonderful Sunday morning.

God immediately delivered me from tobacco, alcohol, and other bad habits. Within a few months both Elaine and I were baptized with the Holy Spirit and all three of the children gave their hearts to Christ. Life was so different now! The Lord supplied our material needs. He enabled us to pay all our debts at an even faster rate than we had contracted them! Two years later I entered Bible college to train myself to serve the One who has done so much for me.

not do that! She went on for one year to fulfill the contracts she had signed.

But everyone noticed a tremendous change in her personality and manner. The voice and the face on the T.V. screen were different. She often sang Christian songs.

UNDER CONTRACT TO CHRIST

At year's end she was free. The producers offered her double salary to sign a new contract for more shows. "I cannot do that," she said, "because I have a lifetime contract with my Lord Jesus Christ."

Now Teresita and her husband, Guillermo Mesinas, are full-time missionary evangelists affiliated with the Assemblies of God. During the past five years they have conducted gospel meetings in Chile, Bolivia, Uruguay, Argentina, Paraguay, and Brazil—besides their work in Peru. The former actress sings and testifies. Her husband does the preaching. The crowds come and many have been saved and healed. Teresita and Guillermo have both received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. As they pray in faith, they've seen God open blind eyes, heal lepers and cripples.

When I met Teresita in Peru she had just returned to Lima for a visit at home. Newspapers and magazines

were filled with pictures and stories of "The Actress Who Became a Missionary." Offers came for her to return to stage and television. She declined them all.

She went again to see the prisoners—this time not to entertain, but to give them Bibles and tell them of Jesus who has power to set men free!

May this true story of a famous actress who found God inspire you to pray for your missionaries and support them faithfully. Many people like Teresita have empty hearts—and they are waiting.

FRUITS AND ROOTS

Many of us would love to have sin taken away. Who loves to have a hasty temper? Who loves to have a proud disposition? Who loves to have a worldly heart? No one. You ask Christ to take it away, and He does not do it. Why does He not do it? It is because you wanted Him to take away the ugly fruits while the poisonous roots remained in you.
